

HP Assembly Winter Session: 316 questions received for Himachal Assembly Winter Session, Tapovan will heat up on the very first day



Diary Times Desk: The winter session of the Himachal Pradesh Assembly is starting from Wednesday at Tapovan campus in Dharamshala. The four-day session will continue till December 21. There are chances of uproar on the first day of the session. BJP has indicated this by staying away from the all-party meeting on Tuesday. On the other hand, the ruling party is also ready to give a strong reply to the opposition. The opposition will corner the government on the allegations of not implementing the guarantees, while the ruling party will make the Centre's neglect of Himachal its shield. BJP will adopt an aggressive stance before the first day's proceedings begin. While BJP will hold a public outrage rally against the government at Zorawar Stadium outside the House, it can also create a deadlock in the proceedings of the Question Hour starting at 11 o'clock. The opposition will target the government by calling its two-year tenure bad, while the Congress will reiterate the talk of system change by accounting for its achievements.

Himachal News: After a long leave, SP Ilma Afroz joined the police headquarters

After that, her leave was extended by one week each four times.

"54-Year-Old 'Young' Leader...": Amit Shah's Constitution Dig At Rahul Gandhi

Agencies: Taking a swipe at Leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha and Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, Union Minister Amit Shah has said that a "54-year-old masquerading as a young leader" alleges that attempts are being made to alter the Constitution without realising that provisions to do so are built into the document. Mr Shah, who was speaking in the Rajya Sabha on Tuesday during a debate to commemorate 75 years of the Constitution, was referring to Rahul Gandhi and the Congress' allegations that the BJP wants to amend the document and dilute its character - a move that paid dividends for the party and the opposition INDIA bloc during the Lok Sabha elections. Our Constitution has never been considered immutable. Article 368 has a provision to amend the Constitution. A 54-year-old leader, who calls himself 'yuva' (youth), keeps roaming around with the Constitution, claiming that we would change it. I want to say that the provision to amend the Constitution is built in," Mr Shah said.



Giving money to beggars? Police will file an FIR against you in this city from January 1

Agencies The Indore administration announced that starting January 1, 2025, individuals found giving alms to beggars in the city will face legal action, including the registration of a First Information Report (FIR). The decision aims to make Indore beggar-free as part of a broader initiative by the Union Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment. District Collector Ashish Singh stated that an awareness campaign against begging is underway and will continue until the end of December 2024. Speaking to the media, Singh urged residents to refrain from giving alms, stating, "I appeal to all residents of Indore not to become partners in the sin by giving alms to people." An order banning begging has already been issued, and enforcement will begin in January. The administration has identified organised gangs exploiting vulnerable individuals.

'BJP topples govts', says AAP's Sanjay Singh. JP Nadda replies 'Time is not far...'

Agencies: A war of words erupted between Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) MP Sanjay Singh and Union minister Jagat Prakash Nadda in the Rajya Sabha, after the former accused the Bharatiya Janata (BJP) of toppling governments in opposition-ruled states. During the discussion on "Glorious Journey of 75 Years of the Constitution of India" in the Upper House, Singh said, "They do not allow Dalits into temples. Their mentality is evident when the foundation stone for the Ayodhya temple was laid, our PM, UP CM, and Governor were present, but then-President Ram Nath Kovind was not invited." "For the temple inauguration, President Droupadi Murmu was not invited because she is from the Dalit and Adivasi community. Why has no RSS chief ever come from the Dalit or Adivasi community? They must answer this... Across the country, they topple governments through horse-trading and manipulation. This country will run according to Babasaheb's Constitution, not the diktats of (PM) Modi.


"Most Befitting Place": Army Amid Row Over 1971 Pakistan Surrender Paintina



Agencies: Responding to the row over the removal of the iconic picture depicting Pakistan's surrender after the 1971 war, the Indian Army has said the painting has been installed at its "most befitting place" -- the Manekshaw Centre named after 1971 war hero and Field Marshal SHFJ Manekshaw. This installation was done yesterday on the occasion of Vijay Diwas, which marked 43 years of India's victory over Pakistan in the 1971 war that led to the birth of Bangladesh. "On the occasion of #VijayDiwas, #GeneralUpendraDwivedi #COAS, along with the President #AWWA, Mrs Sunita Dwivedi, installed the iconic 1971 surrender painting to its most befitting place, The Manekshaw Centre, named after the Architect and the Hero of 1971 War, Field Marshal Sam Manekshaw. Senior hierarchy & serving officers #IndianArmy and #Veterans were present on this occasion," the Army said in a post on X. Earlier, Congress MP Priyanka Gandhi Vadra raised the issue in Lok Sabha. In her Zero Hour reference, Ms Gandhi Vadra remembered the role of the Indian Army in the 1971 war and noted that the iconic picture of Pakistan's surrender had been removed from the Army Headquarters. The picture, which captures the signing of the Instrument of Surrender.

Dharamshala: Leader of Opposition Jairam and BJP MLA Sukhram stayed away from the all-party meeting

While Leader of Opposition Jai Ram Thakur and member Sukhram Chaudhary did not attend the meeting.



Himachal: CM Sukhu said-Constitutional values will be included in school curriculum

Diary Times Desk: Amidst the heated politics over the Constitution in the country, the Congress government of Himachal has decided to impart education based on constitutional values to the students in government schools. While reviewing the functioning of the education department in the state secretariat, the Chief Minister directed the officials to include constitutional values in the school curriculum. The Chief Minister said that 6 schools each in each assembly constituency of the state will be equipped with all the necessary facilities. These will have adequate staff, library, laboratory and other facilities. A calendar of year-round activities will be prepared for the schools. The CM said that with the aim of system transformation, work is being done on a comprehensive rationalization process in the education department. Along with the inclusion of new subjects in colleges.

Q2 GDP slowdown was temporary blip, more growth coming: FM Sitharaman

Agencies: Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman told Lok Sabha on December 17 that the government believes the GDP growth slowdown in Q2FY25 "is a temporary blip" and that an improvement will be seen in coming quarters. "Government believes that the Q2 GDP growth slowdown is a temporary blip, and we will see an improvement in the coming quarters," said Sitharaman while replying to the discussion on Supplementary Demands for Grants - First Batch 2024-25 in Lok Sabha. Sitharaman acknowledged that the second quarter of the current fiscal has been challenging for India as well as most of the economies of the world. However, India's GDP growth rate averaged 8.3 percent in last three years, there has been a steady, sustained growth, an exceptional achievement by global standards. This reinforces India's position as the fastest-growing major economy in the world, she said. "I am optimistic about an improvement in economic performance going ahead," she added. The finance minister's comments come at a time when India's GDP growth slumped more than expected to a seven-quarter low of 5.4 percent for the second quarter of FY25 compared with 6.7 percent in the first quarter. While, mining contracted by 0.1 percent in the second quarter, marking the first deceleration in two years.

"Not Your Toy": NCP's Chhagan Bhujbal To Ajit Pawar On Exclusion From Cabinet

Agencies: The row over denial of ministerial berth to Chhagan Bhujbal is escalating, with the Nationalist Congress leader leaning away from Ajit Pawar and towards the BJP. Chhagan Bhujbal is making it clear that he intends to take action, but keeps everyone guessing about what that action will be walking over to the BJP or forming a new party. That is, unless he is suitably compensated for the loss of the ministerial berth. Ajit Pawar, meanwhile, is maintaining a stony silence - not unlike the time he shifted from the Maha Viaks Aghadi to the ruling alliance. He even skipped the Day One of the Assembly session yesterday - which is usually devoted to formalities including homage to MLAs who died. He maintained silence even when Eknath Shinde and Devendra Fadnavis clarified the reason why some of their ministers were not given a chance this time. He did not attend the session today either and has been incommunicado. It is believed that he is still in his Nagpur residence. Mr Bhujbal took the opportunity to go public with his grievances, declaring that he would find out who had denied him the ministerial berth despite Mr Fadnavis being in favour.

Agniveer Bharti: If you want to become an Agniveer then get ready, recruitment will start in Hamirpur from 17th January

Diary Times Desk: There is an opportunity for the youth of three districts of Himachal Pradesh to join the army. Agniveer recruitment for the youth of Hamirpur, Una and Bilaspur will be held from 17 to 24 January. This recruitment will be held at the synthetic track of Anu and the grounds of Degree College. Colonel BS Bhandari, Director of Army Recruitment Office Hamirpur, has appealed to the eligible candidates to bring all the necessary documents with them. He informed that admit cards have been issued to the eligible candidates for physical test and medical examination on the Join Indian Army web portal. All the candidates should bring the highest quality colour print of their admit card. Colonel BS Bhandari urged the candidates to read all the instructions given on the website carefully and bring the original copies of all the necessary documents and certificates accordingly. These documents include Aadhar card, all documents related to educational qualification, Bonafide Himachali certificate, Dogra community and caste certificate, religion certificate, minority class certificate, school character certificate, photo character certificate issued by the Pradhan and unmarried certificate, child certificate of serving soldier or ex-soldier, certificate of NCC and sports activities, affidavit on the format given in the website, bank account, PAN card, character certificate issued by the police, proof of residence and 20 passport size photographs. Candidates who have studied from open school will have to submit the leaving certificate issued by their last educational institution, signed by the head of the institution and countersigned by the Block Education Officer or the competent officer of the district level of the Education Department.

High Court Judge Appears Before Top Court Collegium Over "Majority" Remarks

Agencies: Allahabad High Court judge Shekhar Kumar Yadav, who purportedly gave controversial statements at a Vishwa Hindu Parishad function, appeared before the Supreme Court collegium on Tuesday, sources said. According to the sources, Yadav appeared before the collegium headed by Chief Justice Sanjiv Khanna and was asked to put forth his version on the statements made. The top court on December 10 took note of news reports over the statements and sought a report from the Allahabad High Court on the issue. "The Supreme Court has taken note of newspaper reports of a speech given by Mr Justice Shekhar Kumar Yadav, a sitting judge of the High Court of Judicature at Allahabad. The details and particulars have been called from the high court and the matter is under consideration," an official statement had said. According to the established norm, a judge, against whom a report is sought by the apex court collegium on any controversial issue from the high court concerned, is given opportunity to put forth his or her version before the top court collegium headed by the

Because in a state where thousands of houses have been washed away in a natural tragedy, there has been a loss of crores and the government has promised to give Rs 7 lakh each to the disaster-affected, despite this, even the Patwari has not reached many houses yet, then how can anyone celebrate in such a situation. Jairam said that the state government has closed 1500 institutions in two years. More than 10 thousand outsourced employees have been sent home and those who are working have not received salary for four to five months.

HP Bulk Drug Park: Now 100 industrial units will be set up in the bulk drug park to be built in Haroli, Himachal

Diary Times Desk: Now 100 industrial units will be built in the Bulk Drug Park to be built in Haroli of Una district of Himachal Pradesh. Earlier 80 units were proposed to be built. The state government has sought Rs 500 crore from the Center to increase the units and level the land. At the same time, the state government has also approved an additional budget of Rs 50 crore to the Industry Department. The central government has set a target of building the Blood Drug Park in March 2026. In such a situation, it is being expedited by the state government. The central government itself is monitoring this project. Chief Minister Sukhwinder Singh Sukhu has written a DO note to Union Health Minister JP Nadda to release Rs 500 crore. It has been said that due to being a hilly area, more expenditure is being incurred in leveling the land. In such a situation, an additional Rs 500 crore has been demanded for the project in addition to the amount received from the Center. Draft tenders for the Bulk Drug Park are in the final stage. They are to be sent to the committee for approval this week.

Himachal: In the name of investment, a finance company duped 50 people of Rs 1 crore

Diary Times Desk: A private finance company in Churah of Chamba district of Himachal Pradesh duped more than 50 people of Rs one crore in the name of investment. The victims reached Teesa police station and lodged a complaint against three employees of the company. The police have registered a case against the accused and started investigation. Local people told the police that the accused started a finance company in Churah a few years ago. The accused lured them with higher interest rates than the bank. Due to this greed, many people invested money in the finance company, but now all three have absconded after closing their offices. The accused include Ranjan Mahajan, Brijendra Singh and Yusuf Mohammad. Last year also people had lodged a complaint of fraud against the three accused. Complainants Shabbir Mohammad, Siddharth Malhotra, Vinod Kumar, Reena Kumari, Devi Singh, Nanak Chand and Rahul Kumar have appealed to the police to take strict action against the three and get the back from money them Superintendent of Police Abhishek Yadav said that people have lodged a complaint against three people of the finance company. The police have registered a case. All three will be summoned to the police Teesa station questioning, only after that it will be known how much money has actually been defrauded from the

Himachal: Electricity subsidy of grade one and two officers stopped in Himachal from January 1, decision taken in the meeting of Energy Department

Diary Times Desk: Grade one and two officers in Himachal will not get electricity subsidy from January 1. These consumers will have to pay the bill according to the full rates. This decision was taken in the review meeting of the Energy Department held in the State Secretariat on Monday under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Sukhwinder Singh Sukhu. The Chief Minister directed the officials to incorporate innovative measures in the functioning of the board. It was also decided to provide an additional corpus fund of Rs 100 crore to strengthen the board. The CM said that the government is continuously reviewing strenathen the financial position of the board.

Bomb threats trigger evacuations in Delhi schools, no explosives found

Agencies: Several schools in Delhi were evacuated on Tuesday morning following bomb threats, marking another alarming development in a series of similar incidents. The Delhi Police confirmed that schools in both South Delhi and North West Delhi were targeted. The Indian Public School in South Delhi and a school in Saraswati Vihar, North West Delhi, were among the institutions affected. Following the threats. police, fire briaade personnel, and bomb sauads quickly reached the locations, and all premises were evacuated for safety checks. This recent wave of bomb threats follows a troubling pattern, with similar incidents occurring over the past few weeks. On December 14, at least six schools in Delhi received bomb threats, the third such occurrence in a matter of days. According to a Delhi Fire Services official, a bomb threat was reported at 6:09 am at Delhi Public School in RK Puram.

Ajit Doval, Wang Yi resume border talks after 5 years

Agencies: All the meetings between Ajit Doval and Wang Yi after December 2019 have taken place to discuss multilateral issues and not boundary resolution. After a hiatus of five years, National Security Advisor Ajit Doval will be meeting his Chinese counterpart, Wang Yi, for institutionalised Special Representative Dialogue in Beijing to move towards enhancing peace and tranquility all along the 3,488 km Line of Actual Control. All the meetings between Doval and Wang after December 2019 have taken place to discuss multilateral issues and not boundary resolution. Takina guidance from the meeting of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President Xi Jinping, Doval arrived in Beijing today for the scheduled SR talks on Wednesday. It was during the Kazan BRICS meeting on October 24, that both the top leaders achieved a breakthrough resolving the disengagement issue at Demchok and Depsang Bulge in East Ladakh, allowing both armies to fulfill their mandatory border patrolling activity in these areas. Both the Indian Army and the Chinese PLA could not patrol these areas after forces amassed on both sides post-May 2020 transgressions. It is understood that Doval and Wang will consider new steps to strengthen peace and tranquility all along the border while moving towards the next step of deescalation and relocation in the contested Fast Ladakh LAC.

BJP to send notice to 20 Lok Sabha MPs for not being present for voting on 'One Nation, One Election' bill



Agencies: The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) will send notice to 20 MPs who were absent during voting on 'One Nation, One Election' bill, which was tabled in the Lok Sabha on Tuesday. The BJP had issued a three-line whip to all its Lok Sabha MPs to be present in the House today. Two bill that pave way for simultaneous Lok Sabha and state assembly elections were introduced in the Lower House. The Constitution (129th Amendment) Bill was introduced in the Lok Sabha by Meghwal after a nearly 90-minute debate, followed by a division of votes. As many as 269 members voted in favour of the Bill and 198 against it. Meghwal also introduced The Union Territories Amendment Bill, which seeks to align elections in the Union territories of Puducherry, Delhi, and Jammu and Kashmir with the Lok Sabha polls. The bill has been sent to the Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) for detailed discussions.

"Curtailed Freedom Of Expression": Amit Shah Attacks Congress Over Constitution

Agencies: Union home minister Amit Shah today argued that if the Congress could change the constitution 77 times and even introduce a clause that curtails freedom of expression, they cannot object to the "One Nation One Election" Bill on the ground that it would require constitutional amendment. Speaking in the Rajya Sabha after the bill for the flagship project was introduced in the lower house, Mr Shah said, "Another amendment was brought by Indira Gandhi which gave Parliament the power to curtail the fundamental rights of the citizens".

Fan Murder Case: Karnataka Police To Move Top Court Against Bail To Actor Darshan

Agencies : The Karnataka Police Department has announced that it will file an appeal petition in the Supreme Court challenging the bail granted to Kannada actor Darshan in the fan murder case. Addressing a press conference in Bengaluru on Tuesday, Bengaluru Police Commissioner B. Dayanand stated, "In connection with the Renukaswamy murder case, the police department is preparing to approach the Supreme Court to challenge the bail granted to the accused by the High Court."

Lankan Prez visits Bihar's Mahabodhi Temple



Agencies: Sri Lanka President Anura Kumara Dissanavaka on last day of his three-day official visit to India on Tuesday, arrived at Bodh Gaya and paid a visit to the revered Mahabodhi Temple, a world heritage site, under high security arrangements. The temple is presently organising grand prayers for world peace and welfare. Dissanayaka began his three-day visit to India on Sunday, his maiden foreign trip after assuming the charge as the President. Bodh Gaya is considered one of the most important Buddhist pilgrimage sites. He visited Bodh Gaya a day after his wide-range talks with Prime Minister Narendra Modi in Delhi.

Priyanka Gandhi Doubles Down With 'Bangladesh' Bag, After 'Palestine' Row

Agencies: A day after her handbag featuring the word "Palestine" sparked in Parliament, controversy Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi Vadra appeared to double down, arriving with a new bag carrying a slogan on the plight of minorities in "Stand Bangladesh. Hindus Bangladeshi and Christians," the quote on her bag read, in reference to the incidents of attacks minorities in Bangladesh following the ouster of former prime minister Sheikh Hasina earlier this year.

'Congress promoted river water disputes between states': PM Modi in Rajasthan

Agencies: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday alleged that the Congress neither promoted farmers welfare nor let anyone do the same. He was addressing an event named "Ek Varsh-Parinaam Utkarsh" in Jaipur to mark one year of the BJP forming the government in Rajasthan. PM Modi also alleged that the Congress promoted river water disputes between states and cited the alleged delay in completing the Eastern Rajasthan Canal Project (ERCP) as the "direct proof" of the party's "intention". "The Congress never wants to reduce water problems...The water of our rivers used to flow across the borders, but our farmers did not get its benefits. Instead of finding a solution, the Congress continued to promote water disputes between states," PM Modi said while addressing a public meeting in Dadiya.



Setback For US President-Elect Donald Trump In Hush Money Case

Agencies: A New York judge ruled Monday against a bid by US President-elect Donald Trump to have his conviction for covering up hush money payments to a porn star thrown out on immunity grounds, local media reported. Judge Juan Merchan said in the ruling that a Supreme Court decision granting presidents sweeping immunity for official acts did not apply as testimony at the trial related "entirely to unofficial conduct entitled to no immunity protections," broadcaster CNN reported. The New York Times newspaper reported the same information. Monday's ruling raises the prospect that Trump could become the first president to enter the White House with a felony conviction, pending his appeal against the jury's verdict. Trump has long opposed the criminal process brought against him after he paid a porn star for her silence and then covered up the payments in an effort to boost his chances in 2016's election. The judge in the only criminal case against Trump that has gone to trial had indefinitely postponed Trump's sentencing at a hearing on November 22, given his win in the November 5 presidential election.

Punjab Man Who Choked To Death In Georgia Shifted There 6 Months Ago

Agencies: Among the 11 Indian nationals who died of carbon monoxide poisoning at a restaurant in Georgia is a young man from Punjab's Ludhiana who had moved to the country just six months back. "I appeal to the government for help in bringing Sameer's body back so that we can perform his last rites as per tradition." Gurdeep said Sameer's birthday was on Saturday. "He spoke to mother over the phone and then went to sleep. When we tried calling him again, the calls went unanswered.

India's Diplomatic Move In North Korea Marks Significant Shift In Policy

Agencies: While the world is focused on central and west Asia and the actions of the West vis-a-vis the wars in the Middle East and Europe, India has been looking and acting eastward with its Act East policy. Besides boosting its ties with Southeast Asian nations, New Delhi has been working silently and cautiously towards its policy in the Korean peninsula. North Korea functions with a great degree of opacity, which in turn, leads New Delhi to also maintain its diplomatic relations with Pyongyang in the shadows, unnoticed and silent from the rest of the world. In July 2021, India quietly shut its embassy in Pyongyang and Ambassador Atul Malhari Gotsurve along with the entire staff returned to New Delhi via Moscow. Though the Ministry of External Affairs never officially declared the embassy 'closed', when asked by journalists why the entire staff was called back, it said the step was taken due to COVID-19. Years went by with no update on the diplomatic mission in Pyongyang, and fourteen months ago.

"Preposterous": China On Spying Claims Involving UK's Prince Andrew

Agencies: China on Tuesday said claims that a businessman had used his links with Britain's Prince Andrew to spy for Beijing were "preposterous", after the UK government voiced mounting concerns over the allegations. Details emerged last week about Andrew's relationship with Yang Tengbo, a businessman and alleged spy, who had been banned from Britain. Asked about the case while on a visit to Norway, Prime Minister Keir Starmer said Britain was "concerned about the challenge that China poses" but defended his approach of "engagement" with Beijing. A spokesman for Beijing's foreign ministry said on Tuesday that the "accusations of so-called Chinese espionage are preposterous". "The development of China-UK relations is in the common interests of both countries and is also conducive to promoting world economic growth and responding to global challenges," Lin Jian said. "It is hoped that the United Kingdom will work with China to accumulate more positive factors and demonstrate the two countries' innate character of cooperation, mutual benefits and common wins," he added.



"Our Military Knows And Our President Knows": Trump Reacts To Mystery Drones Over New Jersey

Agencies: President-elect Donald Trump has called out President Biden and the Pentagon, accusing them of withholding information about the mysterious drones that have been spotted hovering over New Jersey and New York. Trump's concerns come as the sightings have left many wondering about the origin and purpose of these drones. "The government knows what is happening. Look, our military knows where they took off from - if it's a garage, they can go right into that garage. They know where it came from and where it went, and for some reason, they don't want to comment," Trump said during a press conference in Palm Beach. And I think they'd be better off saying what it is. Our military knows and our president knows. And for some reason, they want to keep people in suspense," he added. However, Trump sidestepped a question about whether he'd personally received an intelligence briefing on the mysterious drones spotted over New Jersey and New York. When asked, he refused to comment, leaving many wondering if he's been privy to any classified information about the drones. The presidentelect also said that he doubted that the drones were the work of a foreign enemy.

Answer to stopping tragedy is to reach ceasefire: US on Israel-Hamas

Agencies: The US reiterated its call for a ceasefire between Israel and Hamas as a solution towards ending the conflict between the two warring parties. The remarks were delivered by Matthew Miller, Spokesperson of the US Department of State during the Daily Press Briefing. Answering the questions, Miller spoke about the hostage negotiations in Gaza, civilian casualties, need for a ceasefire and aid in Gaza amongst other significant issues in other countries of West Asia too such as Syria. On being asked about the latest update on the hostage neaotiations in Gaza, Miller said that there is a "lot of optimism". "Negotiations have been productive in recent days. We have continued to try to work with the other mediators to narrow the differences. We have been down this road so many times before, though, it's hard to stand here and say we're optimistic about it, because we are very much realistic about how difficult it has been to reach a deal", he said. "There are a very small number of differences that remain between the parties.

Congress candidates being intimidated: Channi, Pargat



Agencies: Congress MP Charanjit Singh Channi and MLA Pargat Singh today alleged that the Jalandhar MC poll was being held in the most undemocratic manner. They alleged that their party candidates were being threatened so that they don't campaign or contest the election. Channi alleged that the claim of holding free and fair election was a farce. He said, "The AAP-led government is using all its departments, including labour, excise, police and the PSPCL, to intimidate Congress candidates. The candidates who have their businesses or showrooms in the city are being threatened through officials of various departments." Pargat Singh said, "Our ward No. 33 candidate Manmeet Kaur from the posh Model Town area was forced to withdraw her papers. The PSPCL staff went to the office of her husband, who runs a sports business in the city. He was threatened that his power connection would be snapped. He was forced to ask his wife to take back her papers." District Congress Committee chief Rajinder Beri said, "Four wards fall in the Rama Mandi area and police teams went to the houses of the Congress candidates to threaten them."

BJP expels ex-minister Chunni Lal, 12 others over anti-party activities

Agencies: Shortly after the BJP released its 11-point manifesto for the Jalandhar MC polls today, it expelled 13 of its leaders for antiparty activities. Prominent among those who have been expelled are senior BJP leader and former minister Chunni Lal Bhagat, who is the father of AAP Jalandhar West MLA and Cabinet Minister Mohinder Bhagat. The party has also expelled Bharatiya Janata Yuva Morcha (BJYM) leader Arjun Trehan, who has been publicly criticising the BJP, blaming its senior leadership ever since he was denied a ticket for the MC polls. This is the BJP's second list of expulsions ahead of the polls. A few days ago, the party had expelled six leaders, several of whom later bagged the AAP ticket to contest the elections. With 13 more expelled, the number of leaders shown the door has reached 19. The decision was taken by party's Punjab affairs incharge Vijay Rupani and co-incharge Narinder Raina among other leaders after a meeting of the party's core committee.

'Blast' at Islamabad police station in Amritsar leads to panic

Agencies: Panic gripped Islamabad area here during the wee hours on Tuesday after a 'blast' at Islamabad police station. According to locals, the explosion was heard at the police station at around 3 am. However, police claimed that no blast occurred on the police station premises. They said a heavy object fell on the temporary police sentry post outside the police station. Only the iron sheet on the top of the sentry post was damaged, officials said. Pawan Kumar (55), who lives near the police station, said, "A loud sound was heard around 3.15 am which created panic in the area. Residents rushed outside to see what happened." Amritsar Police Commissioner Gurpreet Singh Bhullar denied claims of a blast and said all senior police officers visited the spot. He said a policeman posted on sentry duty heard the sound around 3:15 am. "He immediately went out but found nothing.

MPs of Punjab, Haryana should raise farmers' demands in Parliament: Giani Harpreet Singh

Agencies : Takht Damdama Sahib Jathedar Giani Harpreet Singh on Tuesday urged MPs of Punjab and Haryana to raise farmers' demands in Parliament to press the Centre to accept the same. Singh visited the Khanauri border to enquire about the health of farmer leader Jagjit Singh Dallewal whose fast-unto-death entered the 22nd day on Tuesday. Dallewal (70), a cancer patient, has been on a fast-unto-death at the Khanauri border point between Punjab and Haryana to press the Centre to accept the agitating farmers' demands, including a legal guarantee of MSP on crops. "The country is an agriculture based nation. If farming is alive, then the country is alive. If farming dies then the country will not remain alive," said Singh. "It has been 22 days since Dallewal began his fast-unto-death but the government is not listening," he said. Singh appealed to the MPs of Punjab and Haryana to raise the voice of farmers in Parliament. "MPs of Puniab and Haryana should raise the issue of farmers' demands to press the Centre to act on the same," he said. If they raise their voice then the government will be compelled to accept farmers' demands," Singh added.

Entire Dadu Majra waste to be cleared by July: Centre

Agencies: The Union Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change has stated that bio-remediation of the entire waste at the Dadu Majra dumping ground will be completed by July 2025. In response to questions raised by city MP Manish Tewari over the garbage mountain at Dadu Majra during the ongoing Parliament session, Kirti Vardhan Singh, Minister of State for Environment, Forest and Climate Change, stated that as per information provided by the Municipal Corporation (MC), 5 lakh metric tonne of legacy waste had been bio-remediated at the dump between 2019 and 2022. The work was executed by Chandigarh Smart City Limited. "The work for bioremediation of 13.3 lakh cubic metre of waste is scheduled for completion by December 2024," he said, adding that the MC has also informed the government that a large number of machines along with transportation system have been deployed for the bioremediation of the remaining waste by July 2025. Tewari had asked the minister whether the government was aware that a mega garbage dump was located in Dadu Majra, which was causing a severe air and water pollution in sectors and 22 adjoining villages.

Gunshots fired during road rage in Mohali, FIR registered

Agencies: Multiple gunshots were fired by an unidentified car driver in a case of road rage near Landran on Tuesday. Complainant Gurpreet Singh said the flare up took place on the Landran road when his vehicle touched another SUV. The accused came out of the vehicle and fired a gunshot at him, while a woman, who was sitting in the car, kept on hurling abuses at him. The duo fled the spot immediately. When the cops traced the vehicle in Kharar, the miscreant reportedly fired at the complainant Gurpreet and a police team. Both car driver and the woman fled the spot. The police have recovered two empty bullet shells from the spot and impounded the vehicle, and have constituted teams to arrest the duo. SP (City) Harbir Singh Atwal said, "The suspect fired gunshots twice, once at the complainant, then in the morning, when the police team had gone to arrest him. We will nab him soon."

'Bantoge to lutoge'; Tikait calls for unity among farm unions

Agencies: Farmer leader Rakesh Tikait gave a call for unity, and issued a warning to farmer unions, "bantoge to lutoge" (if you divide, you will lose). He emphasised that farmer unions must stand together to strengthen their protest against government policies and achieve their goals, "If we march separately, we will lose. Unity is essential. When the movement began 10 months ago, we called for everyone to join the Samyukt Kisan Morcha and act collectively. No separate calls to Delhi should be made. Until we unite, we should stay away from Delhi. This is like facing a 66,000-watt current. They will have to cross it together," said Tikait while interacting with mediapersons before going to Nanaksar Gurdwara at Singhra village to pay tribute to spiritual preacher Baba Ram Singh on his death anniversary. Baba Ram Singh had "committed suicide" over the farmers' plight at Singhu border where thousands of farmers were protesting against farm laws in December 2020. Tikait expressed concern over the deteriorating health condition of farmer leader Jagjit Singh Dallewal, who has been on indefinite fast at the Khanauri border since November 26, and urged the government to talks with farmer organisations promptly. government must take the decisions that are in the best interest of everyone. To prepare for Delhi, all farmer groups must come together.

Shimla and its suburbs remained warmer with the state capital recording a low of 7.6 degrees Celsius, Jubberhatti 8.3 degrees Celsius, and Kufri 6.9 degree Celisus.

Himachal Vidhan Sabha complex at Dharamsala to be opened for tourists



Kasauli Cantt Board serves eviction notices on villagers

Diary Times Desk : Decades after they constructed their houses, several residents of Chattiyan village, which falls on the periphery of Kasauli, have been served show-cause notices by the Cantonment Board, Kasauli, asking them to vacate their premises as parts of their houses fall on defence land. The eviction notices were issued on November 28. The villagers have been termed "unauthorised occupiers of public premises" and will be evicted from the defence land. The Cantonment Board has based its observations on the second phase of a peripheral survey carried out by it along with representatives of the Office, Defence Estate ∆mhala encroachment has been duly mapped in each case and each villager has been asked to explain his or her position by personally appearing before the board authorities. This has left the villagers in distress. Some of them contend that the mode of "drawing a straight line between Cantonment Board pillars 12 and 13", showing separation of defence and panchayat land, is incorrect and does not depict the factual position on the ground. They claim that their land is also reflected in the digital revenue record of the state.

A game within a game. When Ravindra Jadeja hooked Pat Cummins to deep square-leg, where he was brilliantly caught by Mitchell Marsh, India still needed 33 to avoid the follow-on as Akash Deep (Test average 6.42) walked out to join Jasprit Bumrah (Test average of 6.97). "At that stage, I was thinking more about going and padding up and trying to go back to bat, probably," KL Rahul said after play, with no disrespect meant to his two team-mates at the crease. For Australia, the follow-on was their most realistic route to victory given the amount of time lost already and more rain forecast on the final day. "There was a desperation to get that final wicket and we thought we had a really good chance when Jadeja was dismissed," assistant coach Daniel Vettori said. Bumrah hooked Cummins for six to take a useful chunk out of the runs needed, the day after he had referenced his batting ability when it was put to him that he may not be the ideal person to discuss the problems of India's top order.



Calf strain set to force Hazlewood out of the remainder of India series

Diary Times Desk: Josh Hazlewood is unlikely to feature in the remainder of the Test series against India after the paceman suffered a calf strain on the fourth day of the Brisbane Test. A Cricket Australia statement confirmed that the 33-yearold will also not take part in the remainder of the ongoing Gabba Test. Hazlewood bowled only six overs in Australia's first innings and only one on Tuesday (December 17), the fourth day of the Test. He hurt his calf during the warm-ups and only belatedly joined the play in the morning session. He appeared to move gingerly in the only over he bowled and was well down on his bowling speeds before walking off the field. Subsequent scans confirmed that he had strained his right calf. "He is likely to miss the remainder of the Test series. A squad replacement will be made in due course," a CA statement read. The development is the latest in a series of injury concerns for Hazlewood, who also missed the pink-ball Test in Adelaide last week following a recurrence of a side injury that has sidelined him over the last couple of years. Between December 2021 and June 2023, Hazlewood featured in just four Tests for Australia

Prithvi Shaw Shocked After Getting Sacked From BCCI Event, Says: "Tell Me God..."

Diary Times Desk: Prithvi Shaw has been dealt yet another blow. The star batter, who was once considered the next big thing in Indian cricket, has not been included in Mumbai's team for the Vijay Hazare Trophy - the BCCI's premier domestic competition for one-dayers. Shaw recently made headlines after going unsold in the IPL 2025 auction despite a base price of Rs 75 lakh. He could not perform consistently in the Syed Mushtaq Ali T20 Trophy too. He scored only 10 in the final which Mumbai won. Now, the latest development has dealt another blow to Shaw's career. "Tell me God, what more do I have to see..if 65 innings, 3399 runs at an average of 55.7 with a strike rate of 126, I'm not good enough...but I will keep my faith in you and hopefully people believe in me still...cause I will come back for sure..OM SAI RAM," Shaw wrote on his Instagram story. Prithvi Shaw's fall from prodigy to prodigal has been swift and seemingly irreversible, but Shreyas Iyer feels the Mumbai batter can touch the deserved heights if he "gets his work ethics right." Shaw gave glimpses of his immense talent in the Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy, which Mumbai bagged under Shreyas, while making 197 runs.

Rain likely to help India on final day in Brisbane

Diary Times Desk: India have given themselves a strong chance of emerging from the Gabba Test with a draw after the unbeaten last-wicket stand between Jasprit Bumrah and Akash Deep saved the follow-on with forecast for more showers on the final day. In a match that has had just 192 overs across four days, more interruptions appear likely on Wednesday with between 2mm and 25mm of rain forecast, which is similar to what was predicted for the fourth day when 58 overs were possible between the interruptions. "High chance of showers, most likely in the late morning and afternoon," said Australia's Bureau of Meteorology. "The chance of a thunderstorm, possibly severe." The final day will have 98 overs scheduled and Australia will need as many as possible if they are to force a result after seeing their chance of enforcing the follow-on taken away by Bumrah and Akash Deep. If an entire day's play was possible, which so far has only happened on the second day when Travis Head and Steven Smith dominated with centuries, Australia would need to quickly take India's final wicket then potentially bat for around 20 overs to set a target in the region of 300 with around 70 overs remaining, depending on how generous they wanted to be.
