Jairam Thakur: Leader of Opposition Jairam Thakur said- If there was a BJP government in Himachal Pradesh, UCC would have been implemented



Diary Times Desk: In an informal conversation with media representatives at his official residence in Shimla, Leader of Opposition Jairam Thakur said that Uttarakhand has become the first state in the country to implement the Common Civil Code (UCC). For this, the central leadership as well as the Uttarakhand government deserve congratulations. In response to media questions, he said that if the BJP government had been in power again in Himachal Pradesh, the Uniform Civil Code (UCC) would have been implemented in Himachal Pradesh as well. UCC is the demand of the country today and the Bharatiya Janata Party has also expressed its commitment to the Uniform Civil Code in its Sankalp Patra. Responding to media questions, Jairam Thakur said that the platform of Himachal Pradesh's Purna Rajtva Diwas was politically misused by the Chief Minister. Till date, no one had given such a speech from such a non-political platform. During his hour-long speech, the Chief Minister only cursed the previous Bharatiya Janata Party government and lied. Even after completing 2 years of tenure, if the government blames the opposition instead of telling one of its achievements, then it is clear that the government lacks material to speak.

India Celebrates 76th Republic Day With Military Prowess On Full Display

Agencies: India celebrated its 76th Republic Day on Sunday with a grand display of its military might that included elite marching contingents, missiles and indigenous weapon systems, with Indonesian President Prabowo Subianto gracing the occasion as the chief guest. In a first, a tri-services tableau, depicting the broader spirit of "jointness" among the armed forces, rolled down Kartavya Path, the centrepiece boulevard of the National Capital. It displayed a battlefield scenario, demonstrating a synchronised operation in land, water and air with the indigenous Arjun battle tank, Tejas fighter aircraft and Advanced Light Helicopter. The theme of the triservices tableau was "Shashakt aur Surakshit Bharat" (strong and secure India). The parade commenced with President Droupadi Murmu taking the salute shortly after she and Subianto, flanked by the Indian president's bodyguards, arrived at Kartavya Path in a "traditional buggy". Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, several other Union ministers, the country's top military brass, foreign diplomats and senior officials were among the spectators on both sides of Kartavya Path.



Country's democratic, pluralistic traditions face 'triple threat': Congress ahead of Mhow rally

Agencies: The country's democratic and pluralistic traditions face a "triple threat", the Congress said on Sunday and accused Prime Minister Narendra Modi of flouting the values anchoring the Preamble to the Constitution. The Congress will hold its 'Jai Bapu, Jai Bhim, Jai Samvidhan' rally in this Madhya Pradesh town, the birthplace of BR Ambedkar, on Monday as it aims to boost its social justice narrative and corner the BJP over alleged insult of the Constitution's chief architect. Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge, former party chief Rahul Gandhi, general secretaries Priyanka Gandhi Vadra, Jairam Ramesh and KC Venugopal, among other senior leaders, are set to attend the rally. Rahul Gandhi, who has been unwell for the past few days and could not participate in the 'Jai Bapu, Jai Bhim, Jai Samvidhan' rally in Karnataka's Belagavi last week as well as in campaigning for the Delhi Assembly.

Class 11 student asked to leave classroom after requesting sanitary pad in UP, probe ordered

Agencies: A Class 11 student of a girls' school was allegedly made to stand outside her classroom for an hour after she requested a sanitary pad during her examination, sparking outrage and prompting an official inquiry into the matter, officials said on Sunday. The incident took place on Saturday when the student who started her menstrual cycle, sought help from the principal. Instead of assistance, she was allegedly ignored and mistreated, they said. According to the complaint lodged by the girl's father, his daughter had gone to the school to appear for examination when she realised her period had started. Upon requesting a sanitary pad from the principal, she was allegedly asked to leave the classroom and was made to stand outside for nearly an hour, the complainant said.

BJP sweeps urban local body polls in Uttarakhand; wins 10 of 11 mayoral seats

Agencies: The BJP on Sunday swept the urban local body elections in Uttarakhand, winning 10 out of 11 mayoral seats to emerge as the dominant party in the municipal councils and nagar panchayats. While the BJP won 10 mayoral seats, an Independent candidate bagged the remaining seat, State Commissioner Sushil Kumar told PTI. However, the counting which began on Saturday is still under way and the results of all the 100 urban local bodies which went to the polls on January 23 are likely to be out by late afternoon, Kumar said. Polling to 11 municipal corporations, 43 municipal councils, and 46 nagar panchayats was held by ballot.

Agriculture News: Soil health is deteriorating due to indiscriminate use of phosphorus, Horticulture Department issued advisory

Diary Times Desk: In Himachal Pradesh, gardeners are using phosphorus indiscriminately in their gardens, which is negatively affecting gardening by disturbing the balance of the soil. Soil testing conducted by the Horticulture and Agriculture Department has revealed high amount of phosphorus in the soil. To prevent gardeners from suffering losses due to excess phosphorus, the Horticulture Department has issued an advisory regarding the use of phosphorus. Phosphorus affects the growth, flowering and fruit quality of apple plants. But it is important to use it at the right time and in the right amount. The method of adding phosphorus in the garden is also very important. The Horticulture Department has issued an advisory for gardeners and suggested the correct method of using phosphorus. Phosphorus should be used in alternate years in the month of December, 90 days before flowering. Phosphorus should be dug at a distance of one foot from the stem of the plant and phosphorus should be put in the drain. In this way, phosphorus reaches the roots of the plants and the plant can absorb it well. If phosphorus is applied near the stem or in the wrong way, it cannot reach the roots, and the plants do not benefit. Using phosphorus in the wrong way increases the level of phosphorus in the soil, which can lead to deficiency of other micronutrients like zinc and iron in the soil. It is important to do regular soil tests to monitor the amount of phosphorus in the soil. If the test shows that the amount of phosphorus in the soil is already sufficient or more, do not use additional phosphorus at all.

Navy's R-Day tableau showcases 3 newly commissioned frontline combatants

Agencies: The Indian Navy's tableau at the 76th Republic Day parade showcased its three newly commissioned frontline combatants warships INS Surat and INS Nilgiri, and submarine INS Vaghsheer. The three platforms commissioned in Mumbai on January 15, symbolises India's naval prowess and the spirit of 'Atmanirbharta' (self-reliance). A mixed marching contingent and a band from the Navy participated in the ceremonial parade. The average age of the members in the contingent is 25 years. These personnel have been carefully handpicked from all branches of the Indian Navy and have undergone specialised training of over two months for the event, officials earlier said. The commissioning of three major naval combatants marks a significant leap forward in realising India's vision of becoming a global leader in defence manufacturing and maritime security, the Defence Ministry had said earlier.

Himachal: Himachal's apple orchardist Hariman will get Padma Shri, he has prepared a variety of apple which can grow in 46 degree temperature

Diary Times Desk: The story of struggle of Hariman Sharma of Bilaspur, who was selected for Padma Shri, is long. After eight years of research, he prepared the HRMN 99 variety and made apple production successful in the scorching heat of 40 to 46 degrees. Sharma chose apple production as an alternative after mangoes were affected by fog. He started research on this in 1999. In the year 2007, he succeeded in preparing this variety. After this, he got the saplings planted by the gardeners of Bilaspur, Hamirpur, Kangra, Una, Mandi, Solan. Hariman Sharma's success attracted the attention of Himachal Pradesh and the Government of India. He was made a member of the Integrated Horticulture Development Mission of the Himachal Pradesh Government and the State Level Executive Committee of Dr. YS Parmar Forestry and Horticulture University Nauni Solan. With his inspiration, scientists of universities did research on HRMN 99. After this, the process of sending this variety abroad also started. The production of apple chosen as an alternative has brought Hariman Sharma to Padma Shri today. Today, 14 lakh saplings of HRMN 99 apple variety have been sent to all the states of the country including Germany, Bangladesh, Nepal. This variety is bearing fruit successfully abroad.

Centre, Omar's credibility at stake, J-K statehood must be restored soon: ex-RAW chief AS Dulat

Agencies: Former RAW chief AS Dulat cautioned that the "happiness" of Kashmiris following the election in 2024 is "temporary", and as they await the fulfilment of the promise of Jammu and Kashmir's statehood, the credibility of both Chief Minister Omar Abdullah and the Centre is on the line. Dulat on Saturday said that Abdullah, who expressed his desire for a good relationship with the central government soon after becoming the chief minister, is not "asking for much" by seeking the restoration of Jammu and Kashmir's statehood. "What's Omar askina for? What does a Kashmiri expect? Article 370 is gone, it's not that it has gone out of Kashmiris' mind, they still think about 370. But Omar knows it is not coming back. What he craves for his self-respect, the statehood. "I think it is in the interest of both Delhi and Srinagar that the statehood is returned at the earliest. It has to be done for the credibility of both sides, otherwise Omar will lose his and so will Delhi," said Dulat who headed the external intelligence agency during 1999-2000.

Mandi News: Fire broke out in a tent house in Souli Khad of Mandi district, 2000 chairs, mats and mattresses all burnt to ashes

Diary Times Desk: Goods worth lakhs of rupees were burnt to ashes in a fire in a tent house store in Souli Khad, an industrial area of Mandi city. The fire incident took place on Saturday afternoon around 1:45 PM. In the preliminary investigation, the cause of the fire is said to be a short circuit. Two thousand plastic chairs, one lakh square feet carpet mats, mattresses, rugs, quilts, ply boards, sofas, crockery etc. kept in the store were burnt to ashes. The goods were kept in two stores. Shutters were installed from outside. The fire department was informed about the fire at 2:00 PM. At around 2:15 PM, fire department officials and employees arrived with fire fighting vehicles. Seeing the flames in the store, two other vehicles and staff were also called. The fire was brought under control after about two hours of hard work, by then everything had turned to ashes. Due to the shutters installed in the store, the fire personnel had to face some difficulty.

Drug Alert: Samples of these 38 medicines including diabetes, migraine made in Himachal failed, stock recalled

Diary Times Desk: 38 medicines including those for diabetes, migraine, high blood pressure, stomach gas, vitamin D-3 and infection manufactured in Himachal Pradesh were found to be substandard. Migraine medicines are supplied only to government hospitals. Samples of two batches of this have failed. Samples of 135 medicines across the country have been found to be substandard. Medicine samples were taken in December by Central Drugs Standard Organization and the State Drug Controller. State Drug Controller Manish Kapoor said that notices have been issued to the companies whose medicine samples have failed and their stock has been recalled. The process of cancelling the license has also been started. Two samples of Divalproex manufactured at Biodil Pharmaceutical Nalagarh have failed. At the same time, Betahistine of CMG Biotech.

Shimla News: Doctor cheated of Rs 2.7 crore in the name of online trading, 3 arrested including company's IT manager

Diary Times Desk: Police have arrested three people in connection with a cyber fraud of Rs 2.7 crore in the name of investment in online stock trading. The arrested accused include Gaurav Ahuja (42) resident of Sector-57, Amrit Das (40) resident of Sector-4, Gurgaon Harvana and Bal Mohan (40) resident of Tehsil Chinali Saur, District Uttarkashi Uttarakhand. The accused have been accused of financial fraud with a doctor. According to preliminary investigation, the amount of Rs 2,70,19,316.50 of the complainant has been transferred to 13 different bank accounts. Along with this, the accused have used different benami bank accounts to hide the cheated amount. The case is registered on 17 December 2024 at Cyber Crime Police Station, Southern Range, Shimla under Section 61 (2), 318 (4) of IPC and Section 66-D of IT Act. Complainant Dr. Ajay Goyal was trapped by luring him with high returns in online trading. Investigation revealed that the complainant's amount of Rs 2,70,19,316.50 was transferred to 13 different bank accounts. The first bank account in the name of accused Amrit Das came to light in this case.

Himachal: 316 middle schools with less than 10 students will be merged in Himachal

Diary Times Desk: Preparations have begun to merge 316 middle schools with less than 10 students in Himachal. 813 teachers are appointed to teach 2,116 students studying in these schools. These schools will be merged with nearby schools located at a distance of two to seven kilometers. In many such middle schools, three to five teachers and three non-teachers providing services Directorate of Primary Education has prepared a proposal and sent it to the government. Last year, the government merged middle schools with five students in schools located at a radius of two to three kilometers. Departmental officials said that a decision has to be taken in this regard before the new academic session.

Kharge slams BJP on Republic Day for attacks on the adoption of the Constitution



Agencies: Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge, in his 76th Republic Day address on Sunday, accused the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) government of "attacks on our Constitution," unleashing the "degradation of our institutions," and dividing Indian society with a "vicious, hateful agenda." Speaking on the adoption of the Indian Constitution, Kharge highlighted challenges faced by the nation and urged citizens to defend its core principles of "justice, liberty, equality, and fraternity." "Every sacred tenet of the Constitution is being shredded into pieces by an authoritarian regime," he said. Kharge further attacked the BJP, stating that there has been a "systematic degradation of institutions under the current regime." He said that the ruling party has "unleashed a continuous degradation of our institutions, built carefully over decades.

Arvind Kejriwal Questions Gujarat Police Deployment In Dolhi

Agencies: Shortly after former Delhi chief minister Arvind Kejriwal claimed the Election Commission has removed Punjab Police and deployed Gujarat Police in the National Capital Territory, top sources in Delhi Police have provided a clarification. sources said 220 companies of security personnel were received in Delhi, including those from the CRPF, BSF, SSB, ITBP, CISF and RPF. Arvind Kejriwal says BJP waived off debts worth ₹10 lakh crore of '400-500 people' in 5 years

Agencies: Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) national convenor on Sunday asked people to decide which model they choose to go with in Delhi - the 'Kejriwal model' or the 'BJP model' in which he said public money goes into the "pockets of their rich friends" Arvind . Kejriwal alleged on Sunday that the BJP-led government in Centre has waived off debts totaling to ₹10 lakh crore of "of about 400-500 people" in the last five years. "The people of Delhi have two models: the first is the Kejriwal model - where the public's money is spent on the public... and the second is the BJP model - where the public's money goes into the pockets of their rich friends. Now the public has to decide which model to choose," Kejriwal said on Sunday in what he said was a press conference on a "very" Kejriwal important issue. Arvind emphasised that people of Delhi are getting benefits of up to ₹25,000 per month under the AAP-led government.

Doctors' Body Flags Saif's Mediclaim Approval, Cites "Troubling Trend"

The Republic Day Parade also witnessed a march past by the Marching Contingent of the Indonesian National Armed Forces and the Military Band of Indonesia's Military Academy.



Donald Trump urges Jordan, Egypt to 'take in' Gazans; Hamas rejects peace proposal

Agencies: United States President Donald Trump has caused a flutter in the Middle East with his idea to end Israel-Hamas hostilities in Gaza, saying he would urge the leaders of Jordan and Egypt to take in the beleaguered Gazans. After 15 months of war, Trump said Gaza had become a "demolition site". "I'd like Egypt to take people. And I'd like Jordan to take people," he told reporters. Most Gazans are Palestinian refugees or their descendants. "You're talking about probably a million and a half people, and we just clean out that whole thing," Trump said of Gaza, whose population is about 2.4 million. "I'd rather get involved with some of the Arab nations and build housing at a different location where they can maybe live in peace for a change," Trump added. Hamas, which recently entered into an uneasy ceasefire with Israel, rejected the idea. Bassem Naim, a member of Hamas's political bureau, told AFP that Palestinians would "foil such projects", as they have done to similar plans for displacement and alternative homelands over the decades".

Israeli forces kill one person in south Lebanon as residents try to return: Lebanese health ministry

Agencies: Israel forces killed one person and wounded 17 others trying to return to homes in south Lebanon where Israeli troops remained on the ground after a deadline for their withdrawal passed on Sunday, Lebanon's health ministry said. Israel has said it intended to keep troops in the south beyond the Sunday deadline stipulated in the U.S.-brokered ceasefire that halted last year's war with Hezbollah, and on Saturday ordered residents not to return until further notice. The deal stipulated that Israeli forces should withdraw from south Lebanon as the Iran-backed Hezbollah's weapons and fighters were removed from the area and the Lebanese army deployed, within in a 60-day period which ended on Sunday morning. Israel has however said the terms have not been fully enforced by the Lebanese state, while Lebanon's U.S.-backed military on Saturday.

Israel Shares Video Of Women Soldiers Being Kidnapped On Oct 7, 2023



Agencies: Palestine-based Hamas released four female Israeli soldiers on Saturday as part of the second hostage release of the Gaza ceasefire deal. Karina Ariev, Daniella Gilboa, Naama Levy and Liri Albag were serving as observers at the Nahal Oz army base on the border with Gaza on 7 October, 202, when Hamas attacked Israel and captured them. Hours before being released, the four women-dressed in army green-- were paraded before a crowd of thousands in Gaza City. They were then transferred to the Red Cross vans, which brought them back home to Israel. In exchange, Israel later released 200 Palestinian prisoners as part of the ceasefire agreement. Liri (19), Naama (20), Karina (20), and Daniella (20) were among the first to be abducted by Hamas-led forces, who killed around 1,200 people and dragged another 250 into the enclave. The first few hours of the assault on the army base were filmed by Hamas forces, which showed the four women in their pyjamas, covered in blood, while they were handcuffed against a wall.

South Korea's prosecutors indict President Yoon Suk Yeol for insurrection

Agencies: South Korea's prosecutors indicted President Yoon Suk Yeol on Sunday on charges of leading an insurrection with his short-lived imposition of martial law on Dec. 3, the main opposition party said. "The prosecution has decided to indict Yoon Suk Yeol, who is facing charges of being a ringleader of insurrection," Democratic Party spokesman Han Min-soo told a press conference. "The punishment of the ringleader of insurrection now begins finally." The indictment was also reported by South Korean media. Anti-corruption investigators last week recommended charging the jailed Yoon, who was impeached by parliament and suspended from his duties over the incident.

Kristi Noem Confirmed As Donald Trump's Homeland Security Secretary

Agencies: The US Senate on Saturday confirmed South Dakota governor Kristi Noem to lead the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), a key agency in President Donald Trump's push to clamp down on illegal immigration. The vote came a day after US lawmakers narrowly confirmed former Fox News co-host Pete Hegseth to be Pentagon chief, adding to previous national security posts already greenlit for Trump's cabinet, including the secretary of state and CIA director. Kristi Noem, 53, a Trump ally and second-term governor of the north central US state, takes control of the US agency overseeing border enforcement and migrant deportations, but which also leads federal efforts on cybersecurity, terrorism and emergency management. Trump on Friday said he would sign an order seeking to scrap the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), after he harshly criticized its response to two devastating hurricanes during last year's election campaign.



Ukraine's Zelenskyy on Donald Trump admin halting foreign aid: 'It's not stopped, thank god'

Agencies: Ukrainian President Zelenskyy said Volodymyr Saturday the US has not stopped military aid to Ukraine amid news the Donald Trump administration has paused foreign aid for 90 days. According to Zelenskyy, he is focused on military aid and thanked 'God' that it hasn't been stopped. "I am focused on military aid; it has not been stopped, thank God," an Associated Press quoted Zelenskyy as saying at a press conference with Moldovan President Maia Sandu. According to the report. Ukraine relies on the US for 40 per cent of its military needs. The Ukrainian leader did not specify if the humanitarian aid has been paused for the country fighting a bloody war with Russia since January 2022. The newly sworn in US secretary of state Marco Rubio announced on Saturday that he would pause foreign aid grants for 90 days, apart from ones going to Israel and Egypt. In an internal memo, Secretary of State Marco Rubio said, "No new funds shall be obligated for new awards or extensions of existing awards until each proposed new award or extension has been reviewed and approved.", AFP reported.

Trump's deportation flights burn \$852,000 each, carrying just 80 migrants: Report

Agencies: President Donald Trump has intensified his immigration crackdown by utilising Department of Defense (DOD) resources to deport migrants en masse. This includes deploying U.S. military aircraft. However, the approach has raised questions about its costeffectiveness, as military flights are expensive than chartered by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS). Reportedly military aircraft such as C-17s and $\dot{\text{C-130Es}}$ are being used for what are being called "migrant repatriation flights." For instance: C-17 Aircraft: According to the DOD comptroller via The Mirror, costs approximately \$21,000 per hour. A recent 12-hour flight from El Paso, Texas, to City carrying Guatemala migrants likely cost \$252,000. C-130E Aircraft: Costs between \$68,000 and \$71,000 per hour, resulting in an estimated cost of \$816,000 to \$852,000 for a similar trip. In contrast, a chartered flight by DHS costs only \$8,577 for the same Following declaration of a national emergency, the military has expedited its.

Farmers hold tractor marches in parts of Punjab to press for MSP guarantee

Agencies: On Republic Day, farmers in Punjab held tractor marches across the state to press the Union Government for a guaranteed MSP for crops and withdrawal of National Policy Framework on Agriculture Marketing (NPFAM). The marches, which took place in various districts, including Malerkotla and Ludhiana, were organised by farmer unions, including the Kisan Mazdoor Morcha (KMM) and Samyukt Kisan Morcha (SKM). Lok Hit Mission-Bharatiya Kisan Union (BKU) participated participated in a 5-km march with around 100 tractors on the Baroudi-Kurali-New Chandigarh-Majri block route, while protesters in Mohali held a tractor march from Dardi village to District Administrative Complex in Sector 76. The farmers are demanding a legal guarantee on MSP based on the recommendations of the Swaminathan Committee, debt waivers, and the scrapping of NPFAM. The tractor marches were held peacefully, with farmers parking their tractors outside retail outlets and malls to protest against corporate houses in Amritsar. Farmer unions have announced that they will intensify their stir, with another round of talks with the Centre scheduled for February 12.



Punjab's R-Day tableau showcases state as land of knowledge and wisdom



State among bottom 5 in NITI Aayog's fiscal health index

Agencies: Harvana has been ranked 14th in NITI Aayog's Fiscal Health Index (FHI) 2025 report, placing it among the bottom five of 18 major states. The ranking is based on five parameters: quality of expenditure, revenue mobilisation, prudence, debt index, and debt sustainability. The FHI covers 18 key states that significantly contribute to India's GDP, demography, public expenditure, revenues, and fiscal stability. The report, released on Friday, examines fiscal performance from 2014-15 to 2022-23. For 2022-23, Haryana received an overall score of 27.4, with individual scores of 24.8 in quality of expenditure, 47.8 in resource mobilisation, 26.1 in fiscal prudence, 24.1 in debt index, and 14.3 in debt sustainability. Even when considering average scores for 2014-19 and 2014-2022, the state ranked 14th. The report highlights Haryana's weak debt profile. The debt-to-GSDP ratio rose from 26% in 2018-19 to 33% in 2020-21, before falling slightly to 31.7% in 2021-22 and stabilising at 31% in 2022-23. Interest payments grew by 9.4% in 2022-23 compared to the previous year, with the interest payment-to-revenue receipt ratio at 23%. "The outstanding liability-to-GSDP ratio exceeded targets from 2018-19 to 2022-23," the report notes. "Shortto medium-term fiscal sustainability is at risk unless the state takes measures to rationalise expenditures, broaden the revenue

Villagers fear that they would have to face scarcity of water in the near future if the schemes are not restored permanently. "Water distribution lines and associated infrastructure have been damaged at 58 sites like Kamrau, Shilla, Sataun, Kafota, Shirgaon, Hevna, Pav, Chalani, etc. Apart from the hand pumps, distribution lines etc. have been damaged on which an expenditure of Rs 2.22 crore is supposed have been incurred," states the report accessed. Among the stars, only Jadeja (12 wickets, 38 runs) and Gill (second innings 102) enjoyed fruitful outings. For Kohli, 190 runs in 9 complete knocks in the Border-Gavaskar Trophy raised serious question marks about his future in international cricket. The 36-year-old has been dealing with technical issues against deliveries on and outside the off-stump channel with a similar pattern of dismissals.

Seven rounds are still left in the first major tournament of the year. Carlsen, who was in the commentary panel for Chess24, criticised Gukesh while praising his opponent Abdusattorov. "Gukesh's strategy has been a spectacular failure," Carlsen said. Talking about Abdusattorov, Carlsen said, "As soon as he gets his chance, he's ruthless. He calculates perfectly, he feels the momentum, and mentally he's right there. It's been very, very impressive!"

Rohit didn't enjoy the best of times while returning for Mumbai in the Ranji Trophy as he managed just 3 runs in the first innings and 28 in the second one. However, the craze to get a glimpse of the Indian captain was at an alltime high, with a fan breaching security to meet Rohit on the field. The Indian skipper has now got a message from the 15-yearold Chhabria, who hailed the Indian star as the greatest batter of all time. The young fan said that he could see Rohit was on the right track.

U19 Women's T20 World Cup: Vaishnavi powers India to semis with win over Bangladesh

Agencies: India began their journey in the Super 6 of the U19 Women's T20 World Cup after beating Bangladesh by eight wickets on Sunday, January 26 at the Bayuemas Oval in Kuala Lumpur. With the win, Niki Prasad and Co. also booked their berth in the semi-final after being unbeaten in the tournament. They are placed on top of their Super 6 table with six points and a net run rate of +4.567. Vaishnavi Sharma, who became the first Indian to take a hat-trick in the history of the tournament, won her second Player of the Match award. She finished with figures of 4-0-15-3 and also became the joint-highest wicket-taker of the ongoing championship, along with South Africa's Kayla Reyneke and Nepal's Puja Mahato. In three innings, Vaishnavi has taken nine wickets at an economy rate of 1.91. After the match was delayed due to a wet outfield, the Indian bowlers took charge and restricted the Tigresses to 64 for eight in 20 overs. Shabnam Shakeel and VJ Joshitha gave India a decent start after dismissing Mosammat Eva and Fahomida Choya respectively. Thereafter, Vaishnavi joined the party and went on to get the wickets of Sumaiya Akter, Jannatul Maoua and Sadia Akter.

'ICC are not running cricket', Cricket legend Ian Chappell calls out ICC

Agencies: Former Australian captain Ian Chappell has criticized the International Cricket Council (ICC), describing it as an "event management company" that is overly influenced by financially stronger boards. According to Chappell, this has led to self-serving schedules that prioritize the financial interests of major nations while sidelining the traditional format of Test cricket. Chappell also expressed his belief that the twotier system for Test cricket, which he feels should have been established long ago, has not materialized. This lack of a cohesive approach is compounded by the fact that the ICC does not effectively govern the sport. As former West Indies pacer Michael Holding put it, "For all its faults, at least FIFA actually runs soccer. The ICC must run cricket." One of the most pressing concerns, Chappell noted, is the financial imbalance in the sport. The "Big Three" - India, Australia, and England - despite being the wealthiest cricket nations, continue to claim a larger portion of the revenue pie, even as they demand a share. Chappell acknowledged India's overwhelming influence in the ICC, given that it contributes about 70% of cricket's total income.

West Indies take control as Pakistan lose four in chase

Agencies : The Multan Test continued to move forward at fullthrottle on a treacherous pitch on Day 2 as Pakistan finished 76/4 in chase of 254 against West Indies. The visitors started Day 2 with a nine-run lead but also with the awareness that Pakistan's spinners could run riot on a spin haven of a surface. West Indies, thus, batted with counter-attacking intent and did well across a little over two sessions to post a daunting target. Pakistan lost their openers early but had Babar Azam steadying the ship, only to fall less than 10 minutes from stumps.
