SC grants 6-day custody parole to Tahir Hussain to campaign for Delhi polls

Agencies: The Supreme Court on Tuesday granted six-day custody parole to former AAP councillor and 2020 Delhi riots case accused Tahir Hussain to campaign for the February 5 Delhi Assembly elections. A three-judge Bench led by Justice Vikram Nath ordered that Hussain would be released for 12 hours during the day between January 29 and February 3 to enable him to campaign in Mustafabad constituency from where he is contesting as an AIMIM candidate. It means Hussain will be allowed to come out from jail each of the six days for 12 hours under police security and go back to jail during night. The Bench-which also included Justice Sankar Karol and Justice Sandeep Mehta-ordered Hussain to deposit Rs 2.47 lakh.

PM Modi to Visit US, Trump Seeks 'Fair Trade', More Military Deals

Agencies: A meeting between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and US President Donald Trump could happen soon as the two sides have discussed plans for a bilateral meeting, for which Modi could be visiting America. The White House, in a statement issued after Modi and Trump spoke over the phone on Monday, said, "The leaders discussed plans for Prime Minister Modi to visit the White House." The Indian statement issued late on Monday night had said, "The leaders agreed to remain in touch and meet soon at an early mutually convenient date." Modi's last bilateral meeting with a US President was in September last year when he met Joe Biden at Wilmington, Delaware, on the sidelines of the Quad summit. Meanwhile, the White House statement also mentioned two important parts of the US-India relationship—bilateral trade and defense industrial partnership. The White House said, "The President emphasised... (of) moving toward a fair bilateral trading relationship." India's impositions of tariffs on several US-made items had angered Trump during his last term (2017-2021).



Gujarat man held in 'digital custody' for 13 hours, duped of Rs 13 lakh

Agencies: A man in Gujarat's Jamnagar was digitally arrested for 13 hours by cybercriminals and duped of Rs 13 lakh. The man was identified as Mehul Ramakantbhai Panji who was tricked into the plot by a gang impersonating officials from the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) and Mumbai Crime Branch. The details reveal that Mehul was held under "digital arrest" for 13 consecutive hours. The cybercriminals coerced him by linking him to a fabricated drug-related NDPS case, threatening life imprisonment unless he paid the demanded amount. Despite repeated warnings from law enforcement agencies to remain vigilant against such schemes, cybercriminals continue to exploit unsuspecting victims. Local police have initiated an investigation into this cybercrime, reiterating their advisory to the public.

Police can't serve accused notice via WhatsApp, other electronic means: SC

Agencies: The police cannot serve notices to accused persons through WhatsApp or other electronic modes under the Criminal Procedure Code or Bhartiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), 2023, the Supreme Court has said. A Bench led by Justice MM Sundresh directed all states and union territories to issue appropriate directions to police for issuing notices under Section 41-A of the CrPC or Section 35 of the BNSS only through the mode of service permitted under the law. "All the states/UTs must issue a standing order to their respective police machinery to issue notices under Section 41-A of the CrPC/Section 35 of the BNSS only through the mode of service as prescribed under the CrPC/BNSS," it said on January 21 while dealing with a case filed by one Satender Kumar Antil. "It is made amply clear that service of notice through WhatsApp or other electronic modes cannot be considered or recognised as an alternative or substitute to the mode of service recognised and prescribed under the CrPC/BNSS," said the Bench which also included Justice Rajesh Bindal.

Daughter of former Chhattisgarh BJP MLA Bheema Mandavi commits suicide

Agencies: The 22-year-old daughter of late Chhattisgarh BJP leader Bheema Mandavi allegedly committed suicide in Dehradun, her family said here on Tuesday. She was doing a physiotherapy course in the Uttarakhand capital and was found hanging from the ceiling fan in her paying guest accommodation in Karanpur area of Dehradun on January 26, a family member said. Tragically, one of her sisters had allegedly committed suicide by jumping.

Baba Bhootnath Shivling Shringar: Special adornment of Baba Bhootnath with 21 kg butter, Mahashivratri celebration begins

Diary Times Desk: From 11 pm on Tara Raatri (Monday night) to 4 am, Baba Bhootnath was specially decorated with 21 kg of butter. As soon as the self-manifested Shivling was decorated with butter, the work of Mahashivratri has started. Now for a month, different forms will be carved on the Shivling every day. Two to two and a half quintals of butter will be offered on the Shivling during this period. On the first day on Tuesday morning, the form of Bijli Mahadev of Kullu was carved on the Shivling. Local residents Pawan Kumar and Vidya Sharma, who reached the temple, said that the tradition of applying butter paste on Baba Bhootnath temple has been going on for centuries. Saif attack: Police have 'strong evidence' against arrested

Agencies: The Mumbai police probing the attack on film actor Saif Ali Khan said they have ample and strong evidence against the Bangladeshi national arrested in the case. Khan was attacked in the early hours of January 16 at his Bandra residence in Mumbai, where he was stabbed six times. On January 19, the police arrested Bangladeshi national Shariful Islam Shehzad Mohammad Rohilla Amin Fakir alias Vijay Das from neighbouring Thane in this connection. In a press conference, Additional Commissioner of Police (West Region) Paramjit Dahiya shared the development in the probe, and said it was an "excellent, proof-based detection" made by DCP Zone 9 team along with the crime branch. "The Mumbai police have ample and strong evidence against the accused person, including documentary, physical and technical," he said. "As for ascertaining the identity of the accused.

Himachal News: Woman professor posted at IIT Mandi dies under suspicious circumstances, suicide note also found

Diary Times Desk: A female associate professor working at the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Mandi died under suspicious circumstances. The incident took place on January 26. The police have found a suicide note in the professor's quarter. In this, she has said that she was upset and has written about not bothering anyone. The police is investigating the matter keeping every aspect in mind, considering the seriousness of the matter. According to the information, 33-year-old Maneka Ambadi, a resident of Navi Mumbai, Maharashtra, posted as an associate professor at IIT Mandi, fell in the residential colony of the institute on January 26. The institute informed the Kamand police station about this. The police reached the spot, took the body in possession and investigated. During the investigation, a suicide note was recovered from the kitchen of the quarter allotted to the woman by the institute. In this, the female professor had written about being upset. Police investigation has revealed that no one has seen the woman falling and she was found in a fallen condition. However, the police is treating this case as a suicide. The preliminary post-mortem report has revealed that the woman died due to fallina.

Offence of illegally converting someone not as serious as murder or rape: SC

Agencies: Noting that the offence of illegally converting someone from one religion to another is not as serious as murder, dacoity or rape, the Supreme Court has granted bail to a maulvi charged with converting a mentally challenged boy to Islam. While maintaining that bail was a matter of discretion, a Bench of Justice JB Pardiwala and Justice R Mahadevan said it was expected of the Allahabad High Court to "muster the courage" and exercise its discretion judiciously. "Discretion does not mean that the judge on his own whims and fancies declines bail saying conversion is something very serious...There was no good reason for the high court to decline bail. The offence alleged is not that serious or grave like murder, dacoity, rape etc.," it said in an order on Monday. One of the reasons why the high courts and now unfortunately the apex court was flooded with bail applications, it lamented. "Every year, so many conferences, seminars, workshops are held to make the trial judges understand how to exercise their discretion.

Himachal: Four nurseries of Nauni University have been recognized at the national level, plants will be prepared according to the weather

Four nurseries have been recognized. Agencies: Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday accused Arvind Kejriwal of falsely alleging that the Haryana government mixed poison in the Yamuna and dared the AAP supremo to make public the DJB report that he cited to level the charge. Addressing a public meeting in the Kalkaji assembly constituency, he also dared Kejriwal to tell the people of Delhi the name of the poison that he claimed was mixed in the Yamuna. HP High Court: Officers hearing encroachment cases have less understanding of judicial process, give five days training

Diary Times Desk: A division bench of Justice Vivek Singh Thakur and Justice Bipin Chandra Negi of the Himachal Pradesh High Court issued important directions in a public interest litigation in the encroachment case. The division bench directed the Chief Secretary to issue appropriate instructions regarding training before February 28. File an affidavit by March 15 that there should be no new encroachments. The officers who are hearing land encroachment cases should be given five days of special training at the Judicial Academy. During the training, the officers should be taught the legal nuances. The court found that due to the lack of understanding of the judicial process of the officers, the common people are not getting justice. The officers did not properly inform the facts before the court. The High Court found that while hearing a large number of cases, the rules of Section 4 of the Act of 163 and Public Premises Land Eviction and Rent Recovery Act 1971 (PP Act) are being ignored.

HP Police Recruitment: Schedule for ground test of Chamba and Una districts also released

Diary Times Desk: Under the recruitment process for 1088 constable posts in Himachal Pradesh Police Department, the schedule of ground test has also been released for Una and Chamba districts. The schedule was released for 10 districts on Monday. In Una district falling in North Range, Physical Standard Test and Physical Efficiency Test will be conducted from 11 to 15 February at Police Line Ground Jhalra and in Chamba from 13 to 20 March at Police Line Ground Chamba. Youth Sports and Services officials and coaches will be present on this occasion. This schedule has been released by IG Armed Police and Training and Police Recruitment Board Officer Prem Kumar Thakur. The process of Physical Standard Test and Physical Efficiency Test will be completed by 28 March in all the districts. It is worth mentioning that out of the total 1088 posts of constable in the department, 708 posts are reserved for men and 380 posts are reserved for women. The recruitment examination is going to be held through the Public Service Commission, 1,27,770 people have applied for this. The recruitment process will be held in Sirmaur from February 11 to 20, Solan from February 25 to March 6, Shimla from March 11 to March 22 and Kinnaur from March 27 to March 28. The ground test will be held at Nahan Chaugan in Sirmaur, 9275 candidates will appear in Police Line Solan for Solan, 12,795 candidates will appear in Police Line Bharari for Shimla and 1350 candidates will appear in Mini Stadium Kalpa for Kinnaur.

'India Will Do The Right Thing': Trump On Migrants Row After Call With PM Modi

Agencies: US President Donald Trump on Monday (local time) had a "productive" phone call with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, where the two leaders discussed expanding deepening bilateral cooperation and issues including security in the Indo-Pacific, the Middle East, and Europe. This was the first telephonic conversation between President Trump and Prime Minister Modi since the Republican was sworn in for a second term on January 20. Later, Mr Trump told that PM Modi scheduled to visit the United States sometime in February. "I had a long talk with him this morning (Monday). He is going to be coming to the White House, over next month, probably February. We have a very good relationship with India," he told reporters aboard Air Force One. The American leader noted he discussed the issue of immigration with the Indian Premier and said Prime Minister Modi "will do what's right" when it comes to taking back Indian immigrants who came to the US illegally. The call came against the backdrop of reports suggesting that the Indian side was working on an early meeting between the two leaders. President Trump and PM Modi enjoyed warm relations in the US president's first term, but during his campaign for re-election, the 78-year-old American leader called India a "very big abuser" of trade.

Priyanka Gandhi visits tiger attack victim's home in Wayanad

Agencies: Congress MP Priyanka Gandhi visited Wayanad, Kerala, on Tuesday to meet the family of Radha, who was killed in a recent attack in Kaniyaram, Mananthavady. Gandhi's comes amid growing concerns over human-animal conflicts in the region, which have claimed the lives of four people, including three of elephant attacks. Speaking after her visit, she said: "This morning I visited Radha's family. This man-animal issue is very critical here. We had a productive discussion, and I have put forward the points that Radha's family shared with me. I hope we can all work together." Highlighting community's suggestions, Gandhi noted the lack of adequate measures to address the issue. "There are only two watchmen, one of whom is Radha's husband. More forest watchmen need to be appointed. The local community better has a understanding of the area.

"Will Strengthen Democracy": PM Modi On Uniform Civil Code



Agencies: Underscoring that the Uniform Civil Code or UCC will strengthen the spirit of democracy, Prime Minister Narendra Modi Tuesday hailed it as "Secular Civil Code", a day after Uttarakhand became the first state to implement the law. "Yesterday, Uttarakhand became the state to implement the Uniform Civil Code...I congratulate the Uttarakhand government for this. It will strengthen the spirit of democracy and the Constitution," said the PM after inaugurating the 38th National Games in Dehradun. "UCC has same team spirit as sports, discrimination against none," said the Prime Minister. The introduction of a Uniform Civil Code to replace laws on marriage, divorce and inheritance has been a longstanding goal of PM Modi and his party, the BJP. Muslim leaders and critics say the UCC challenges Islamic laws on divorce, marriage and inheritance.

Maha Kumbh: Prayagraj Railway Division Gears Up For Mauni Amavasya Festival

Agencies: The grand Mahakumbh festival at Prayagraj's Sangam has drawn over 13 crore devotees so far. Now, preparations are in full swing for the Amrit Snan on Mauni Amavasya, January 29, 2025, when an expected 10 crore pilgrims are expected to take a holy dip at Triveni Sangam on the auspicious occasion. Anticipating a huge influx of devotees, the Prayagraj Railway Division has made elaborate special arrangements smooth arrival and departure of passengers across all stations in the city. Around 10 crore people are expected to arrive in Prayagraj for the Amrit Snan.

5 Indian fishermen injured in Sri Lankan Navy firing; MEA summons envoy, lodges strong protest

Agencies: The ministry of external affairs (MEA) summoned the acting high commissioner of Sri Lanka in New Delhi and lodged a strong protest with the top diplomat on Tuesday, after five Indian fishermen sustained injuries, including two seriously, in an incident of firing by the Sri Lankan Navy in the proximity of Delft Island, news agency PTI reported. India, in its reaction, said the use of force is not "acceptable under any circumstances whatsoever. "An incident of firing by the Sri Lankan Navy during the apprehension of 13 Indian fishermen in the proximity of Delft Island was reported in the early hours of this morning," the MEA said in a statement. "Out of the 13 fishermen who were on board the fishing vessel, two have sustained serious injuries and are currently receiving treatment at the Jaffna Teaching hospital," the MEA added. Three other fishermen received minor injuries and have been treated for the same, it said.

Waqf JPC member A Raja rues 655-page report: 'Meeting at 10 am, got it now'

Agencies: Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) MP A Raja, who is a member of the Joint Parliamentary Committee on Waqf (Amendment) Bill, hit out at the panel, calling it a "farce". "The Parliamentary Committee on Waaf Bill has been reduced to a farce. We were told that the Draft Report of the Committee & its Bill will be discussed tomorrow at 10 AM. It is 655 pages and has been sent to us just now. MPs are expected to go through it and provide comments and submit dissent notes. This is simply not possible," Raja posted on X.

'Give Proof On Yamuna Poisoning By 8 pm Tomorrow': Poll Panel To AAP Chief

Agencies: Aam Aadmi Party chief Arvind Kejriwal has been asked to proof backing allegation that Yamuna water has been poisoned. The Election Commission, which asked him to produce evidence by 8 pm tomorrow following а BJP complaint, said in its letter that it was a serious allegation that could create animosity between states and carried a provision of punishment upto three years. The Commission has sought a separate report from the Haryana government regarding ammonia in Yamuna waters.



Donald Trump Fires "Tremendous Tariff-Maker" Warning At India, China

Agencies: Donald Trump on Tuesday denounced India, China, and Brazil as "tremendous tariff-maker(s)" and said his government would not allow the three to continue down this path, declaring, "... we're not going to let that happen any longer because we're going to put America first." Speaking to House Republicans at a Florida retreat, the United States President acknowledged the three countries - founding members of the increasingly influential BRICS bloc - were acting in their respective best interests, but seemed also to insist "... they mean us harm". We're going to put tariffs on outside countries and people that really mean harm to us. Well... they mean us harm, but they basically want to make their country good. China is a tremendous tariff-maker, and India, Brazil, and so many other countries. (But) we're not going to let that happen any longer... because we're going to put America first," Trump declared to cheers. The comments came shortly after it emerged Prime Minister Narendra Modi is likely to meet Trump in Washington, as early as next month. The two leaders spoke on the phone Monday night; it is unclear if tariffs were on the agenda, but New Delhi's view on 'illegal immigrants was.

Donald Trump says will build 'Iron Dome' missile shield for US: 'Need to begin immediately'

Agencies: Newly sworn in US President Donald Trump said on Monday would sign an executive order to start building 'Iron Dome', the advanced air defense system used by Israel, a promise he made during the campaign for presidential election. The Iron Dome is a mobile air defense system developed for Israel by Rafael Advanced Defense Systems and Israel Aerospace Industries to intercept and destroy short-range rockets and artillery shells that are fired towards populated areas. Iron Dome's capabilities have been demonstrated and seen in videos multiple times in the Israel-Hamas conflict that began on October 7, 2023 and other occasions as well, like the October 2024 Iranian strikes on Israel.

Bodies on streets, hospitals struggle, battles intensify in DR Congo's Goma



Agencies: Heavy battles between M23 fighters and Congolese government forces in the eastern Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) city of Goma have left many bodies on the streets, with hospitals struggling to deal with the growing number of casualties. In the capital Kinshasa, protesters criticising international inaction attacked the embassies of Rwanda, France, Belgium and the United States on Tuesday. On Monday, the rebels, which the United Nations says are backed by Rwanda, marched into Goma and declared the key city under their control, signalling a big blow to the Congolese army and a serious escalation in the years-long conflict that has killed hundreds and displaced millions in the region. DRC's Rural Development Minister Muhindo Nzangi said the Congolese army controlled 80 percent of Goma, with Rwandan troops either on the city's outskirts or back across the border. At a news briefing on Tuesday, the UN and other aid agencies warned that hospitals are overwhelmed in Goma, treating hundreds of patients with gunshot, mortar and shrapnel wounds while many bodies lie in the streets.

TikTok Sensation Siyah Killed In Tragic US Mall Shooting At 17

Agencies: Nahsiyah Turner, a 17-year-old TikTok sensation in the US, better known to her followers as Siyah, was fatally shot outside a southern California mall, marking a sorry end to her short but highly popular online career. The incident transpired earlier this month on January 18 at the Los Cerritos Center shopping center but her identity had been withered up until now. The police reportedly found Ms Turner unresponsive inside a vehicle, having been shot. As per a report in People, Ms Turner succumbed to a gunshot wound to the chest and was pronounced dead at the hospital. The circumstances leading to the shooting remain under investigation, with no suspects named as of yet. Tributes have poured in across social media platforms.

Bangladesh needs systemic reform to end rights abuse: HRW

Agencies: Bangladesh risks the return of the rights abuses seen under ousted Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina unless robust reform is instituted, an international NGO has warned. The interim government in Bangladesh risks losing "hard-won progress" if it does not implement reform that can withstand repression by future governments, Human Rights Watch (HRW) said in a report published on Monday. Ongoing arbitrary arrests and reprisal violence underscore the threat to "the country's once-in-a-generation opportunity to end the legal abuses" that were seen on Hasina's watch, the report said. HRW used the publication to urge Dhaka to establish legal detention practices and repeal laws used to target critics. "Reforms should be centered on separation of powers and ensuring political neutrality across institutions, including the civil service, police, military, and the judiciary," it declared.



"They Tried To Kill Putin": Tucker Carlson Blames Joe Biden's Administration

Agencies: Tucker Carlson, a prominent conservative American pundit and former Fox News anchor, unleashed a bombshell accusation against the Joe Biden administration, alleging that they attempted to assassinate Russian President Vladimir Putin. This extraordinary claim was made during the latest episode of Carlson's podcast, "The Tucker Carlson Show," where he was engaged in a conversation with American writer and journalist Matt Taibbi. Carlson's assertion is nothing short of sensational, and he quoted former US Secretary of State Tony Blinken as an example of someone who was pushing for a real war and trying to kill Putin. "The Biden administration did, they tried to kill Putin," Carlson said, adding "which is insane" and "that's demented, that you would even think of something like that. So why were they? Because chaos is a screen that protects them". It's worth noting that Carlson's claim is not backed by any concrete evidence, and statement has sparked widespread controversy. He was ousted from Fox News in 2023 during when the network was facing legal issues over its airing of inaccurate claims of electoral fraud in the 2020 U.S. presidential race.

Trump pushes to abolish income tax: Tax foreign nations, enrich our people

Agencies: US President Donald Trump on Monday proposed abolishing income tax for US citizens, aiming to boost disposable income for individuals and families, as he described the move as a step toward restoring America to the "system that made us richer". To implement the complete abolition of income tax--which currently constitutes a significant share of federal revenue--Trump reiterated his call for across-the-board import tariffs. "It's time for the United States to return to the system that made us richer and more powerful than ever before... Instead of taxing our citizens to enrich foreign nations, we should be taxing foreign nations to enrich our citizens," the US President said as he outlined his tax reform plans at a House Republican Members Conference. Trump argued that the period from 1870 to 1913 was the wealthiest in US history, when a tariff-based economic system was in place. He highlighted that the country generated "enormous" revenue through import tariffs through import tariffs during that era. The Republican leader has been advocating for multifaceted tax cuts and intends to use import tariffs to offset.

Punjab's first transgender activist, jurist Mohini Mahant honoured on Republic Day in Amritsar

Agencies: Mohini Mahant, Punjab's first transgender activist and jurist at National Lok Adalat, was honoured for her contributions to the upliftment and empowerment of transgenders at a Republic Day event in Amritsar. Mahant, a PhD doctorate and double master's degree holder, has been working tirelessly in the fields of health and educational reforms, particularly for her community. She runs a nonprofit organisation, Mansa Federation Welfare Society, which provides educational, social, and economic support to transgenders. Deputy Commissioner Sakshi Sawhney presented Mahant with an award of excellence, highlighting her efforts to provide healthcare services to the community. Mahant's non-profit has set up a 25-bed shelter home and support clinic for transgenders. "It's been a decade since we have been working to create awareness campaigns and self-help groups to support transgenders, who are denied basic rights of access to education, healthcare and protection against social stigma. We provide vocational training as well as awareness regarding HIV through members of our non-profit organisation. There is a long way to go before we attain inclusivity in the mainstream society.



2 operatives of US-based terrorist held for Amritsar grenade attack

Agencies: The Punjab Police on Tuesday said they had arrested two men for their alleged involvement in the hand grenade lobbying incident outside the Gumtala police post in Amritsar. Director General of Police Gaurav Yadav said the accused were operatives of US-based terrorist Harpreet Singh alias Happy Passian and US-based drug smuggler Sarwan Bhola. Yadav said those arrested had been identified as Bagga Singh of Guru Teg Bahadur Nagar in Sirsa, Haryana, and Puskaran Singh alias Sagar of Amarkot in Amritsar. Police also recovered a hand grenade and two sophisticated pistols along with ammunition from their possession. On January 9, a loud boom was heard outside the Gumtala police post. Police at that time had denied any explosion and claimed that the sound was that of a car radiator exploding. Following the incident, terrorist organisation Babbar Khalsa International had used a social media platform to claim responsibility for the terror act. Yadav said investigations revealed that accused Bagga Singh is a relative of Sarwan Bhola, who is the brother of notorious smuggler Ranjit Singh alias Cheeta, currently lodged in Bathinda jail in the 532-kg heroin recovery case.

Chandigarh sets green benchmark: 51 per cent of city under green cover, told high court

Agencies: More than half the city is under green cover, the Punjab and Haryana High Court was informed during a hearing on steps to enhance greenery in the region. A division bench of the high court was also told that the Chandigarh Administration planted 2.98 lakh saplings in the last financial year. Appearing before the bench of Chief Justice Sheel Nagu and Justice Sudhir Singh, UT Additional Standing Counsel JS Chandail and Deputy Conservator of Forests Navneet Shrivastava submitted that 51 per cent of Chandigarh's area was under green cover. "The Chandigarh Administration is sensitive about maintaining and increasing the green cover of the heritage city," the bench was told. The court, during the course of hearing, also took note of the initiatives taken by the states of Punjab and Haryana. The counsel appearing for Punjab submitted that a corpus of Rs 10 lakh had been created for "Nyay Vans" scheme for facilitating green cover within the state. The bench was also told that the state of Haryana had notified "Van Mitra" scheme -- a government initiative to encourage community participation in tree plantation activities on non-forest lands.

Yamuna river pollution dispute escalates into heated political row between BJP, AAP

Agencies: A bitter political dispute has erupted over the pollution of the Yamuna river, with BJP and AAP trading sharp accusations. The controversy began when former Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal and Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann accused the Haryana BJP government of polluting the Yamuna, claiming it could lead to a health crisis in the national capital. Haryana Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini and several Haryana MPs, including Dharambir Singh, Ram Chander Jangra, Kiran Choudhary, and Rekha Sharma, vehemently denied the allegations and threatened legal action, including a defamation suit against Kejriwal. During a press conference, Haryana MP Dharambir Singh rejected Kejriwal's statements, saying they hurt the sentiments of Haryana's people. Singh explained that Haryana releases only 300 cusecs of water into the Yamuna to prevent the river from drying up. He added that Delhi receives approximately 10,000 cusecs of drinking water, supplied through Western Yamuna Canal, which is treated at Delhi's four treatment plants before distribution.



Microsoft to get Rs 55 lakh as compensation for trademark infringement by fake call centre in Gurugram

Agencies: A local court in Gurugram has ordered Retnec Solutions Pvt Ltd to pay Microsoft Rs 55 lakh in damages for trademark infringement and operating a fake call centre using Microsoft's trademarks, including "Hotmail", "Outlook", and "Office 365". The court also awarded Microsoft an additional Rs 20.6 lakh in litigation costs. The court's decision came after Microsoft and its Indian subsidiary filed a suit against Retnec Solutions trademark infringement, passing off, unfair trade practices, dilution, and damages under the Trade Marks Act, 1999. Microsoft alleged that Retnec Solutions impersonated Microsoft personnel and used their trademarks to operate fraudulent technical support services. Investigations revealed that Retnec Solutions operated a fake call centre in Gurugram, misleading customers through pop-up messages, cold calls, and unauthorised use of Microsoft's branding. The Gurugram police raided the premises, seizing digital evidence and arresting the directors. company's Evidence included invoices falsely bearing Microsoft's logo, payment records linking the defendants and scripts found on computers. These scripts detailed steps to deceive victims, including fake pop-ups and scare tactics about malware or viruses.

Haryana BJP MPs want Kejriwal's arrest over 'poisoning Yamuna' claim

Agencies: BJP MPs from Haryana on Tuesday demanded the arrest of AAP chief Arvind Kejriwal over his claim that the state was releasing "poison" in the Yamuna river that supplies water to Delhi. Addressing a press conference, all five Haryana MPs of the BJP said it was a clear case of "criminal conspiracy" by Kejriwal who was trying to create panic among the residents of Delhi. The BJP MPs challenged the Aam Aadmi Party government to test the quality of water released from Haryana before it is supplied to households in Delhi. BJP MP Dharambir Singh said, "For some time now, Kejriwal has been making statements that are hurting the people of Haryana. They are accusing us of poisoning the water released from our state. "We provide more than 10,000 cusecs of water to Delhi, even though we also face water scarcity. But we still send water to Delhi because it is the national capital," he said. BJP MP Kiran Choudhary said the Yamuna water gets contaminated.

Let children own library: Edu Secy to schools

Diary Times Desk: From now onwards, schools will decline the request of students to issue them library books for reading at home. Also, the library in-charge will not be held accountable if the child loses or damages the book. These are a few major directions in the guidelines issued to schools. Accordina to department officials, nearly all schools in the state have libraries but the books remain mostly unread, gathering dust inside the almirahs. As per the feedback gathered from the field, the department found that major reason for books remaining unread was the reluctance on the part of library in-charge to issue it to the students due to the fear that he/she would have to pay from own pocket if the book was lost or damaged by the child. The focus is on keeping the books safe and in good condition, rather than giving it to the students to read." Secretary Education Rakesh Kanwar mentioned in the guidelines. Due to 'keep the books safe' approach, most schools are failing to inculcate reading habits among students and are denying young minds the opportunity to delve into the world of books.

Una's Haroli civil hospital gets digital X-ray, ultrasound machines

Bus carrying Maha Kumbh devotees from Solan overturns in UP, 31 injured



Diary Times Desk: At least 31 devotees from Solan, including six seriously injured, were hurt when their private bus overturned after being hit by a hydra machine in the Sirathu area of Kaushambi district in Uttar Pradesh. The accident occurred on Tuesday morning while the devotees were en route to participate in the Maha Kumbh festival in Prayagraj. Deputy Commissioner Solan Manmohan Sharma confirmed that 31 persons were injured, including 75-year-old Tulsi Ram Sharma, who is undergoing treatment in ICU. Fourteen injured persons are being treated at Community Health Centre Sirathu, while 10 others are receiving treatment at District Hospital Kaushambi. The district administration of Solan is working closely with the Kaushambi administration to ensure proper treatment and care for the injured. Monetary assistance is also being provided, and the devotees plan to return after the injured recover. Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu instructed the Solan administration to coordinate with the Kaushambi administration to provide timely medical assistance.

New policy to be formulated for national-level players: CM

Japanese experts inspect cracks in Pandoh-Takoli bypass tunnel

Diary Times Desk: A team of Japanese experts recently conducted an in-depth inspection of Tunnel No 2 on the Pandoh-Takoli Bypass, part of the Kiratpur-Manali four-lane project. The inspection was prompted by the cracks that appeared at the tunnel's entrance during the 2023 rain disaster, which had delayed the completion of the tunnel project. The investigation was aimed at understanding the causes behind these cracks and assess the safety of the tunnel. Accompanied by representatives from the Ministry, Public Works Department (PWD) and other officials, the Japanese experts examined both the tunnel's interior and the surrounding hillside to identify potential issues. The team studied the geological conditions of the area, including the state of the land and rocks, and proposed that a detailed report would be compiled based on these findings. According to Varun Chari, Project Director of the Kiratpur-Manali Four-Lane Project, the inspection forms a part of the ongoing efforts to ensure that the tunnel can be safely opened for traffic. He highlighted that the cracks had been a major concern ever since they appeared in 2023, prompting both the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) and the construction company involved in the project to carry out thorough assessments. The consultant, project management team and contractors have been collecting samples and conducting various tests to understand the underlying causes of the damage.



Virat Kohli reconnects with his home base after 12 years



Agencies: It had been 12 long years since Virat Kohli last turned out for Delhi in Ranji Trophy, but watching him laugh and stroll around the Arun Jaitley Stadium and play alongside his teammates here on Tuesday, it felt as though he had never left. A different kind of energy accompanied Kohli to the ground in the morning. The buzz amongst the staff at the stadium and the assembled media felt different for the long-serving officials who have been in cricket administration for a few decades. The players were supposed to assemble at 9 am and Kohli arrived on the dot, bringing with it the kind of discipline and focus the team hadn't experienced in years. The structured practice drills, the intent and intensity of the session came as a breath of fresh air for those accustomed to a mechanical routine. For a relatively young Delhi side lying sixth in the eight-team Elite Group D, their inconsequential match against Railways has suddenly acquired a lot of focus with another day of practice left before the game starts on Thursday. This heightened attention is exactly what the Delhi administration hoped would elevate the Ranji squad.

New Zealand Star Amelia Kerr Named ICC Women's Cricketer Of The Year

Agencies: New Zealand all-rounder Amelia Kerr made history on Tuesday by becoming the first Kiwi recipient of the prestigious Rachael Heyhoe Flint Trophy, earning the title of ICC Women's Cricketer of the Year for her exceptional performances in 2024. The 24-year-old stood out among her peers, surpassing Laura Wolvaardt, Chamari Athapaththu, and Annabel Sutherland to claim the top honour in women's cricket. Kerr is not only the first New Zealander to win the Rachael Heyhoe Flint Trophy but also the first Kiwi to be recognised as ICC Women's Cricketer of the Year in any category. Throughout the year, Kerr demonstrated her prowess as a world-class all-rounder, excelling in every facet of the game. Her outstanding fielding repeatedly lifted New Zealand, while her skill as a legspinner established her as one of the most dangerous strike bowlers in the world. Kerr was often the White Ferns' go-to matchwinner with the ball. With the bat, she was a cornerstone of New Zealand's lineup, capable of playing expansive innings to capitalise on strong starts or anchoring the innings when the top order faltered.

Rohit, Jaiswal, Iyer to miss Mumbai's must-win Ranji Trophy game

Agencies: India internationals Rohit Sharma, Yashasvi Jaiswal and Shreyas Iyer are going to miss the next round of the Ranii Trophy for Mumbai in the lead up to the England ODI series that follows early next month. While the likes of Virat Kohli and KL Rahul will feature in the next round starting January 30, the Mumbai trio had already played the previous round, which Kohli and Rahul didn't, and Iyer played almost the entire domestic season, that included two white-ball tournaments too. The ODI series against England starts on February 6 in Nagpur, four days after the scheduled end of the last Ranji Trophy round. Rohit and Jaiswal - who also open together in Tests opened for Mumbai against (J&K).

Australia eye Galle redemption as spin and history loom large

Agencies: Steve Smith has seen everything there is to see at a cricket ground during his international career. Or so he'd have thought before he arrived at the Galle International Stadium on Tuesday. He can now add being serenaded by low country Sri Lankan folk dancers with a variety of masks and standing next to flame throwers to his list. It was part of the cultural welcome to the two teams that Smith had to be a part of as Australia's captain on the eve of the first Test that starts on January 29. While the 35-year-old veteran seemed to be both intrigued and fascinated with the ultraenergetic goings-on around him, you could sense that he was keener on checking out what was transpiring with the 22 yards in the middle that will have such a big say on how the next five days pan out. As is the case every time there's a Test played at this iconic venue with the old Dutch fort in the background. For, there had been a slew of activity already before Smith and the Australians got to the ground. And the returning captain's first priority was to march towards the pitch and check it out from every angle possible before playing his role at the Warne-Muralitharan Trophy unveiling ceremony.

Suryakumar Yadav's fearless batting pointed out as reason behind his slip-up:'...there're games where he won't perform'

Agencies: Team India batting coach Sitanshu Kotak has backed Suryakumar Yadav after his underwhelming start to the T20I series against England. The Indian T20I skipper has registered scores of 0 and 12 in the first two matches and is under a bit of pressure to put up a big score in Rajkot. "Surya, I think he is performing, but sometimes I feel we also expect a lot. Every game, if we think Surya will perform (that is not okay). The game has become so aggressive, there is so much intent we have to play in the T20s, there will be a time when they get out because they are playing fearless (cricket)," Kotak said in the pre-match press conference ahead of the third T201. Kotak further elaborated on India's batting approach and how Surya has been selflessly leading the pack and setting an example for the others in the team.

Travis Head set to open in first Test against Sri Lanka

Agencies: Australia have finalised Travis Head as Usman Khawaja's opening partner for the first Test against Sri Lanka in Galle. Khawaia was partnered by Nathan McSweeney first and later Sam Konstas during their most-recent Test series against India at home. But now for the subcontinent tour, they're going back to a formula that worked well when they had toured India in 2023 and adding to the idea they'd put out about being flexible with their batting order in Test cricket. "He (Head) did really nicely in India against the new ball. He put under spinners immediately and we know how well he hits the seam as well if they come with that," said Steve Smith a day ahead of the match. "It's going to be good fun watching him." Smith stopped short of naming the eleven though, preferring to wait and watch the conditions on offer. "We'll wait and see what we get, probably the morning of the game, and then go from there. But things can change pretty quickly, this part of the world, the sun hasn't been out a great deal. So we'll have another look at the wicket, and then from there, we'll name a team at toss," he said.
