NDIA'S SPACE ISRO AMBITIOUS PLANS FOR 2027 : CHANDRAYAAN -4, GAGANYAAN AND SAMUDRAYAAN


Diary Times Desk : India's space ambitions are reaching new heights with the Indian Space Research Organisation's (ISRO) planned missions, which include the highly anticipated Chandrayaan-4, Gaganyaan, and Samudrayaan projects. These ventures are set to make significant strides for the country in the field of space exploration, and they reflect India's commitment to scientific innovation and technological advancement. Science and Technology Minister Jitendra Singh recently laid out the ambitious plans for these space projects, which are slated to unfold over the coming years, culminating in 2027. One of the most exciting upcoming missions is the Chandrayaan-4, set to launch in 2027. After the success of Chandrayaan-1 and Chandrayaan-2, which marked India's breakthrough achievements in lunar exploration, Chandrayaan-4 will be India's most ambitious mission to date. The focus of this mission is to collect and return lunar samples, making it a significant leap for India's space program. The mission will also serve as a stepping stone for India's further endeavors in space exploration and bring India's space program to a new level of global recognition. Minister Jitendra Singh commented, "The Chandrayaan-4 mission aims to collect samples from the moon's surface and bring them back to Earth. This is a highly complex task that will not only mark a milestone for ISRO but also for the global scientific community."

Another major milestone in India's space exploration timeline is the Gaganyaan mission, India's first crewed spaceflight mission. Set to launch in 2024, the Gaganyaan mission aims to send Indian astronauts into low Earth orbit and return them safely. This mission will be a historic achievement for ISRO, positioning India alongside the United States, Russia, and China as one of the few countries to send humans into space. The first step of the Gaganyaan mission will be the uncrewed mission that will carry a robot called 'Vyommitra'.

Diary Times Desk : Defence minister Rajnath Singh on Thursday spoke to his US counterpart Pete Hegseth over phone and reviewed bilateral defence cooperation, with focus on multiple domains in land, air, maritime and space, even as the two leaders agreed to deepen collaboration in areas including technology, integration of defence industrial supply chains, interoperability, logistics and information sharing, and joint military exercises. This was their first conversation after Hegseth took over as defence secretary and came in the run-up to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to the US next week.

"The two ministers appreciated the ongoing and remarkable expansion of the bilateral defence partnership and reaffirmed their commitment to deepen the ties," the defence ministry said. They also agreed to provide enhanced support to the growing defence innovation collaboration between the governments, start-ups, businesses and academic institutions, a statement said. India and US agreed to work together to draft a comprehensive framework on defence cooperation, aimed at structuring the bilateral collaboration for 2025-2035, it added. Singh described the conversation as excellent. "We reviewed the ongoing defence cooperation and explored ways and means to expand and deepen the India-US bilateral defence relationship. We also agreed to chart out an ambitious agenda which includes operational, intelligence, logistics and defence-industrial cooperation. Looking forward to work closely with Secretary Hegseth," Singh wrote on X. Both sides have made progress under the US-India Defence Industrial Cooperation Roadmap, including ongoing collaboration to advance priority co-production arrangements for jet engines, munitions, and ground mobility systems. The roadmap, adopted in 2023, seeks to fast-track technology cooperation and co-production in critical areas including air combat and land mobility systems, intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance, munitions, and the undersea domain.

Hafiz Saeed's son issues warning for PM Modi, message for Kashmir at Lahore rally: Report



The rally, which marked Pakistan's annual observance of Kashmir Solidarity Day, was a platform for Talha to voice his staunch views on Kashmir and India. He launched a scathing personal attack on Prime Minister Narendra Modi, whom he referred to as a "shaitan" (devil). "I want to warn PM Modi that Kashmir belongs to Muslims, and we will take Kashmir from you. It will be a part of Pakistan Muslim India soon," Talha said. Talha's speech also included a firm defence of Lashkare-Taiba (LeT), the terror group founded by his father which carried out the 2008 Mumbai terror attacks.

Congress crushed freedom of speech: PM Modi brings up Emergency in Rajya Sabha

Diary Times Desk : The BJP-led Union government is working on the principle of 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas', Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on Thursday as he accused the Congress of practising appeasement politics to get votes. Replying to the debate on the Motion of Thanks to the President's address in the Rajya Sabha, the Prime Minister said the Congress' priority was "family first" and its policies had been focused around it. Modi also accused the Congress of being against the architect of India's Constitution B R Ambedkar, and recalled the Emergency of 1975-77 as well as incidents of alleged suppression of freedom of expression under the earlier regimes of Congress. He said his government has worked for upliftment of the poor, and it stands with the middle class and the "neomiddle class" in the country. "Nation first is the BJP's priority..." Modi said. "I say it with a lot of pride... For five to six decades, there was no alternative model for the people. After a long time, after 2014, the country got to witness a new model, which is not based on appeasement but 'santushtikaran' (satisfaction of all)," he said.



AAP claims BJP offered ₹15 crore to 7 leaders ahead of Delhi election results



Diary Times Desk : Aam Aadmi Party leader Sanjay Singh on Thursday alleged that the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) was bribing party leaders to jump ship ahead of Delhi assembly election results. The Rajya Sabha MP claimed the BJP had called seven AAP MLAs who contested in the Delhi elections and offered them ₹15 crore each to join the BJP. "Some were even offered in face-to-face meetings," he said. "This clearly shows that the BJP has accepted its defeat before the results, and that is why it is trying something like this," he said in a press conference on Thursday. The MP said AAP has advised its candidates to record such calls and use spy cameras to document any face-to-face meetings if the offers are made. The BJP is yet to react to the allegations. Voting across Delhi's 70 constituencies took place on February 5 to decide the electoral fate of 699 candidates. The national capital recorded a voter turnout of 60.42% in the high-stakes polls, according to data from the Election Commission of India (ECI). The polls saw intense competition and active participation.

Rs 1,000 cr con citing Corporate Social Responsibility funds exposed in Kerala

Diary Times Desk : A major scam Corporate involving Social Responsibility (CSR) funds was uncovered in Kerala, with a 26-yearold man from Idukki, Anandhu Krishnan, at the centre of it. The police estimate that the fraudulent activities could surpass Rs 1,000 crore. Krishnan allegedly misled victims by offering two-wheelers at half the market price, claiming he had access to CSR funds from multiple companies. According to police reports, Krishnan created a false sense of trust by convincing individuals that the second half of the product's price would be covered by CSR funds. Initially, victims did receive their products, but later, deliveries were delayed and eventually ceased altogether. This scam targeted unsuspecting customers, with many losing their money without receiving the promised items. To bolster his credibility, Krishnan is said to have cultivated close relationships with leaders from various political parties, showcasing these connections to gain the trust of potential victims. The investigation has now expanded to include political figures. Congress leader Laly Vincent has been named as the seventh accused in the case. Vincent, however, has denied any involvement, claiming that her only connection to Krishnan was as his lawyer in a professional capacity.

Mysterious calls and fake orders? Bengaluru residents report unusual delivery 'scams'

Diary Times Desk : Bengaluru residents are reporting unusual delivery scams involving major ecommerce platforms. Two incidents shared on Reddit have sparked concerns over security breaches and fraudulent activities targeting unsuspecting users. In one case shared on the platform, a woman received a call from an individual claiming to be a Swiggy delivery agent, stating that he had a parcel for her, ordered under her boyfriend's name. However, she never received а delivery notification from her gated society's security system, which typically alerts residents before allowing entry. Adding to the suspicion, neither she nor her boyfriend had placed any orders. When she asked the caller to leave the package at the door, nothing was found upon her return. "Something doesn't feel right," the user wrote. In another incident shared by a Reddit user, a Bengaluru resident received an automated call from a number labeled as "Flipkart" on Truecaller. The voice prompt asked if they had placed an order for flip-flops.

'Congress's dislike for Ambedkar backed by documents': PM Modi in Rajya Sabha

Man Dies By Suicide, Films It, Alleges Torture By Jammu And Kashmir Cops

Diary Times Desk : A man died by suicide and filmed the act after alleging torture and harassment by police in Jammu and Kashmir's Kathua. The incident has triggered outrage among locals who are seeking justice. The police have ordered a high-level inquiry, where an officer of the Deputy Inspector General (DIG) rank has been told to submit a report within 10 days. In the video, 25-year-old Makhan Din, a tribal man from Kathua's Bilawar area, said he is dying by suicide so that no one else is subjected to torture and humiliation by the police the way he was subjected. Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah has discussed the matter with the Central government and demanded a timebound probe. He also said that the Jammu and Kashmir government would initiate its inquiry. Before his death, the man talked about his loyalty to the police and having no links with terrorists. He alleged that he was tortured during custody and forced to confess his links with terrorists.

IAF Mirage 2000 fighter jet crashes near MP's Shivpuri, pilots eject safely

Diary Times Desk : Pilots of a twin-seater Mirage 2000 fighter aircraft ejected safely before the aircraft crashed near Shivpuri in Madhya Pradesh while it was on a routine training sortie on Thursday. The accident happened near Sunari Chowki. A Court of Inquiry is being ordered to ascertain the cause of the crash, Defence officials cited by news agency ANI said. Visuals from the crash site showed the pieces of the aircraft on fire, with plumes of smoke arising from them. Indian Air Force said in a post on X, "A Mirage 2000 aircraft of the IAF crashed near Shivpuri (Gwalior), during a routine training sortie today, after encountering a system malfunction. Both the pilots ejected safely. An enquiry has been ordered by the IAF to ascertain the cause of the accident." In November 2024, a MiG-29 fighter jet crashed into a field near Uttar Pradesh's Agra during a routine training sortie due to a technical glitch. The pilot ejected himself to safety at the time of the crash.

"Whenever They Lose..": BJP Slams Akhilesh Yadav Over "Dead" Jibe At Poll Body

Diary Times Desk : BJP on Thursday strongly criticized Samajwadi Party (SP) chief Akhilesh Yadav over his remarks declaring that the Election Commission was "dead" and accused the Opposition of repeatedly attacking constitutional institutions whenever they face electoral defeats. Darien Gap: Deadly 97-Km Jungle Crossing That Migrants Brave To Reach US

Diary Times Desk : The United States recently deported 104 Indian migrants, handcuffed and shackled for a nearly 24-hour flight back to India. The deportation came after US President Donald Trump's crackdown on illegal immigration, a topic he recently discussed with Prime Minister Narendra Modi on a phone call, AP reported. The illegal journey into the US often involves dangerous crossings through multiple countries, including the treacherous Darien Gap - a vast, roadless jungle that connects Colombia and Panama. The Darien Gap is a 97-km stretch of dense rainforest, swamps, and mountains. It is the only break in the Pan-American Highway - a road system stretching from Alaska to Argentina. This impenetrable region has long been avoided due to its extreme terrain, harsh climate, and lack of infrastructure. But for migrants desperate to reach the US, it has become an unavoidable gateway. Those crossing the Darien Gap face steep mountains, muddy swamplands, fast-moving rivers, and dangerous wildlife. The jungle is home to venomous snakes, jaguars, and deadly insects. However, the most significant threats are from criminal organisations that control the route. The smuggling networks, drug cartels, and armed groups demand payments, rob migrants, or subject them to violence.

Trump trade pick says universal tariffs should be 'considered'



Diary Times Desk : Trump trade envoy nominee Jamieson Greer is being grilled by the Senate Finance Committee and has voiced openness to Trump's campaign suggestion of across-the-board tariffs on US imports. Such universal tariffs should be "studied and considered" as a potential way to reverse offshoring and trade deficits, Greer said. He added that US producers need a "level playing field" to compete globally. Trump has already threatened 25-percent tariffs on Mexico and Canada but has agreed to delay imposing the taxes for a month. Earlier this month, however, he did increase tariffs on China by 10 percent and has also warned the European Union of potential tariffs, as well. Economists have warned that tariffs could spark a trade war - with the US facing retaliatory tariffs in exchange. That would likely have blowback for US consumers, who would have to absorb the higher prices. Congressman Jim Costa has criticised Trump's plan to encourage federal employees to resian.

H-1B visa cap registration to start on March 7 with massive fee hike

Diary Times Desk : The H-1B visa cap registration period for the fiscal year 2025-26 will commence on March 7 and close on March 24. This year, employers sponsoring H-1B visa applicants will reportedly have to pay a higher fee for the E-registration process. After the hike, this year's fee is \$125 per beneficiary, which is much higher than last year's fee of \$10, according to a Times of India report. This increase in registration costs, along with the beneficiary-centric registration and selection process, is part of efforts introduced by the Biden administration. The efforts were introduced by the previous US government to enhance the integrity of the H-1B visa program. The beneficiary-centric approach, first used for the registration and lottery process in 2026, will probably be carried forward in 2026 also as per the reports. Under this system, every beneficiary is entered into the lottery only once.

Mexico deploys 10,000 troops to border amid US President Donald Trump's tariff threat

Diary Times Desk : Mexico began sending 10,000 troops to its northern border on Wednesday, with National Guard and Army trucks patrolling the area between Ciudad Juárez and El Paso, Texas, in response to President Donald Trump's tariff threat. National Guard troops, masked and armed, combed through the brush along the border near Ciudad Juárez, removing makeshift ladders and ropes from trenches and loading them onto trucks. Patrols were also spotted in other border regions near Tijuana. This follows a tense week at the border after President Trump decided to delay imposing heavy tariffs on Mexico for at least a month. In return, Mexican President Claudia Sheinbaum pledged to deploy the National Guard to strengthen border security and combat fentanyl smuggling. Trump declared a border emergency despite a significant decline in both migration and fentanyl overdoses over the past year. In response, the US pledged to take stronger action against the trafficking of American guns into Mexico.



Hamas Tortured, Executed Gay Members Who Raped Israeli Hostages

Diary Times Desk: Hamas reportedly tortured and executed its own members who allegedly had samesex relations, secret documents from the Palestinian group revealed. According to a report, several members of the Hamas group raped male Israeli victims durina the October 7, 2023, attack in which at least 1,200 people were killed. The crimes were reportedly committed with the Israeli men who were held captive by Hamas following the attack as well. Hamas had a list of recruits who failed to comply with its "morality checks" by engaging in homosexuality - for which they paid a "heavy price", reported the New York Post. According to the report, "crimes" the were alleaedly committed by 94 recruits of Hamas. These included charges of lumping together "homosexual conversations, flirting with girls without a legal relationship and sodomy". The documents also revealed allegations of child rape and torture. One of the allegations reportedly mentioned: "He (one of the Hamas members) constantly curses God". Another said, "He has romantic relationships on Facebook...He is behaviourally and morally deviant".

Video Shows Naked Iranian Woman Jumping On Police Car In Bold Protest

Diary Times Desk : A daring protest Iran's second-largest city, in Mashhad, has gone viral after a woman was filmed stripping naked and jumping onto a police car. The shocking footage, shared on social media, shows the woman yelling at armed officers as she stands on the hood of the car in the crowded streets. She then climbs onto the windshield. making a defiant aesture. Despite attempts by officers to get her down, she refuses to move, even as one officer reaches into the vehicle, reportedly for a weapon. A male officer, armed with an automatic weapon, appears to hesitate to detain the woman due to her nakedness, as reported by Furonews While the exact motivation behind her actions is unclear, reports on social media suggest that she was protesting Iran's increasingly oppressive clothing laws for women. The woman's bold protest has sparked a mix of reactions, with some speculating about her mental health and others hailing her as a symbol of resistance against the country's oppressive clothing laws for women. The incident is part of a larger movement in Iran, where women are pushing back against the strict dress code enforced by the morality.

Chandigarh MC tightens leash on dog owners, violators to face hefty fines

Diary Times Desk: Chandigarh residents, beware! Keeping a pet or feeding a community dog without following the rules could soon put a serious bite on your wallet. The draft "Municipal Corporation Chandigarh Pet and Community Dog Bye-Laws-2023" is set to bring sweeping changes to pet ownership and community doa management. Among other things, it introduces strict new regulations and penalties that go up to Rs 10,000-nearly 200 times higher than the existing fines. The rules also have provisions for open sale of a seized dog. The draft, approved by Punjab Governor and UT Administrator Gulab Chand Kataria, aims to leash the problem of irresponsible pet ownership while ensuring safety and hygiene across the city. It has been uploaded on the corporation's website and the general public can submit suggestions and objections within 30 days. The draft says the owners are required to register their pet dogs with the Municipal Corporation, pay a fee of Rs 500 per dog, and submit a prescribed undertaking. The number of dogs per household has also been capped-homes on plots up to one kanal.

Amritsar airport records an upswing in overseas, domestic passenger traffic

Diarv Times Desk : Sri Guru Ram Dass Jee International Airport in Punjab's Amritsar has reached a historic milestone, breaking multiple previous records for passenger footfall. An analysis of recent data released by the Airport Authority of India (AAI) reveals that the airport welcomed an astounding total of 3,40,408 (approximately 3.40 lakh) passengers in the month of December 2024. This includes 2.29 lakh domestic passengers and a record 1.11 lakh international passengers, marking only the second time international footfall has crossed the 1-lakh mark, surpassing the previous record of 1.06 lakh international passengers. This figure surpasses the previous record of 3,38,712 passengers set in December 2023. Sameep Singh Gumtala, global convener of FlyAmritsar Initiative, an advocacy group dedicated to promoting and enhancing connectivity at Amritsar airport, said, "The airport not only achieved its highest-ever monthly passenger footfall in December 2024 but also recorded unprecedented yearly traffic for the same year." Achieving another milestone, the calendar year 2024 became the busiest year.

Rape complainant among 6 booked after singer alleges honey-trapping, 2 arrested

Diary Times Desk : In a recent development, the Panchkula police have filed charges against six individuals, including a woman who had previously accused state BJP president Mohan Lal Badoli and singer Jai Bhagwan, alias Rocky Mittal, of rape. The charges stem from allegations of orchestrating a honey trap with the intent to extort Rs 50 lakh. The police confirmed today that two of the accused-one woman and one manhave been arrested and placed under a two-day police remand. According to the complaint lodged by Mittal, a former chairman of the Haryana Government's publicity cell, the woman, along with another woman Mehak, initially contacted him on September 9, 2024. They allegedly threatened to implicate both Mittal and Badoli in a fabricated case unless their financial demands were met. Mittal reported that the accused pressured him to arrange a meeting with Badoli and demanded Rs 50 lakh. Upon his refusal, the threats intensified, leading him to file a complaint with Haryana Director-General of Police on September 14. Subsequently, on September 18, the group reportedly confronted Mittal at his residence in Panchkula.



Villagers shave head of 2 eve-teasers in Nuh

Diary Times Desk : Villagers in Nuh shaved the heads of two men from a nearby village to teach them a lesson for harassing girls. The incident occurred in Mandarka village, where men from the nearby village Chilawali had been coming every day and harassing girls. The men would write lewd comments on chits and throw them at the girls. They would also stop girls on roads, tease them outside school, and forms engage in other of harassment. Villagers claim they repeatedly warned the men, their parents, and even the village panchayat to stop the harassment. When their efforts proved futile, the villagers took matters into their own hands and "punished" the men. On Wednesday, when two men came to the village and began throwing chits, villagers captured them and shaved their heads. They also filmed the incident and posted it on social media. After doing so, they called the police. The local SHO confirmed the incident and stated that the two men had been handed over to the police. If we had called the police earlier, they would have been easily let off, but the village has taught them a lesson they will never forget. We have also asked their panchayat to punish them," said a Panchayat member from Mandarka.

Following snowfall, 275 roads closed for movement of traffic

Diary Times Desk: Light to moderate snowfall and rain has been recorded across the state since Tuesday evening. Apart from the higher reaches, light to moderate snowfall has been recorded at some places in the districts of Kullu, Lahaul and Spiti, Chamba, Kinnaur and Shimla. Tourist destinations like Manali, Narkanda and Kufri also recorded a few centimetres of snowfall. Shimla recorded intermittent rainfall and hail on Tuesday night. In most parts of the state, light to moderate rainfall has been recorded. As per the State Disaster Management Authority officials, 275 roads, including three national highways have been obstructed. Besides, 55 water schemes and 291 power distributions transformers have also been disrupted. Due to the snowfall, the roads in upper Shimla had become guite slippery and the traffic was obstructed in early hours of the morning. Later, as the snow melted, normal traffic was restored. In Kinnaur, light snowfall was recorded in Chitkul and Rakchham, but the traffic remained largely unobstructed in the district.

CM lays foundation stone of green hydrogen plant

Diary Times Desk : Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu's vision of making Himachal India's first green energy state by 2026 received a major boost as he laid the foundation of North India's first 1 MW Green Hydrogen Plant at Dabhota in Nalagarh tehsil today. This pioneering project, being developed by Himachal Pradesh Power Corporation Limited (HPPCL) in collaboration with Oil India Limited, is set to be established at a cost of Rs 9.04 crore. He directed the officials to ensure its completion within a year. Speaking on the occasion, the Chief Minister reaffirmed Himachal Pradesh's commitment to becoming India's first Green Energy State by March 2026. He emphasised that the Dabhota Green Hydrogen Plant marks a major milestone in the state's renewable energy journey. He said "This initiative is a crucial step in Himachal Pradesh's efforts to establish itself as a leader in renewable energy and sustainability." To further this vision, the state government signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Oil India Limited on April 26, 2023, focusing on the development of solar energy, green hydrogen, geothermal energy, and compressed biogas. He said that following a detailed assessment, a 4,000-square-meter land parcel in Dabhota was selected for the plant. "As the state's first largescale green hydrogen initiative, this project underscores the government's commitment to sustainable energy solutions. The plant will utilise power from renewable sources to produce hydrogen through electrolysis, using an alkaline potassium hydroxide solution as an electrolyte. This method significantly reduces greenhouse gas emissions and supports a cleaner energy ecosystem," he added.

Clinical India take early lead in ODI series



Diary Times Desk : A complete all-round performance by India, on Thursday (February 6), helped them secure a comfortable win against England in the first One-Day International in Nagpur. Half-centuries by Shubman Gill, Shreyas Iyer and Axar Patel backed up the fine effort by the bowlers and the fielders earlier in the innings as India overhauled England's total with 68 balls to spare and four wickets in hand. While India were clinical in all three departments, they were massively aided by the conditions. The pitch which was two-paced in the first half, flattened out for them in the second, making England's decision to bat first prove counterproductive, although the spinners did find some help later on. Earlier in the day, India handed two debut caps - to Yashasvi Jaiswal and Harshit Rana, with Virat Kohli having to miss the contest due to soreness in his right knee. Rana was in for some action early on in the contest, his four overs witnessing extremes of good and bad. In the opening over, he was put away for 11 overs but returned to bowl a maiden. In his third, Phil Salt carted him for 26 runs - the most conceded by a bowler on debut - and then returned to snap two wickets in one over. Gautam Gambhir Sent Rohit Sharma, Virat Kohli "Pressure" Alarm Ahead Of ODI Series

If there is slight assistance on the pitch, it can be slightly testing for Rohit Sharma, But, I don't think they won't score in this series," he added.

Kusal Mendis fights for Sri Lanka as Starc and Lyon stand out

ADiary Times Desk : Australia's trio of specialist bowlers toiled manfully during a see-saw day one against a fighting Sri Lanka on a dry Galle surface that did not live up to the hype, but occasionally spun sharply and is expected to deteriorate significantly. By the end of 90 overs, the second Test was intriguingly poised after several shifts of momentum. Sri Lanka's top-order built a strong platform to reach 93 for 1 before they lost 4 for 34 in a horror period after lunch. But Kusal Mendis and Ramesh Mendis combined for a seventh-wicket partnership of 65 to lift Sri Lanka to what might just be a competitive first innings total. Kusal and Dinesh Chandimal made well-compiled halfcenturies as Sri Lanka batted through the day's play to reach stumps at 229 for 9. After Sri Lanka suffered their worst defeat in Test cricket on a slow surface, there had been much speculation that this new surface.

Marcus Stoinis retires from ODI cricket with immediate effect

Diary Times Desk : Australia all-rounder Marcus Stoinis has brought down the curtains on his ODI career, Cricket Australia announced on February 6 (Thursday) and added that he wants to focus on T20 cricket. Stoinis leaves the format having featured in 71 games since making his debut back in 2015. Stoinis was earlier named in the squad for the Champions Trophy, and will now need to be replaced. "Playing ODI cricket for Australia has been an incredible journey, and I'm grateful for every moment I've had in the green and gold. Representing my country at the highest level is something I'll always cherish," Stonis said. "This wasn't an easy decision, but I believe it's the right time for me to step away from ODIs and fully focus on the next chapter of my career. I've got a fantastic relationship with Ron (Andrew McDonald) and I've hugely appreciated his support," he added. Stoinis's career-best effort with the bat came in just his second outing - an unbeaten 146 against New Zealand in Auckland in 2017. He last featured on the tour of Pakistan last November, and finished with 1495 runs and 48 wickets in the format. Stonis was also part of Australia's World Cup-winning squad in 2023 and was the team's ODI cricketer of the year in 2018-19.

Cummins, Hazlewood ruled out of Champions Trophy

Diary Times Desk : Australia are in the midst of a personnel crisis for the Champions Trophy 2025 as the 2023 ODI World Cup champions will need to make as many as four changes to their squad for the upcoming eight-team competition. Skipper Pat Cummins and Josh Hazlewood have been officially ruled out of the tournament due to injuries while the ODI retirement of Marcus Stoinis and the withdrawal of Mitchell Marsh due to a back injury has left the Australian squad shortstaffed. "Unfortunately Pat, Josh and Mitch are managing some ongoing injuries and haven't come up in time for the Champions Trophy," said George Bailey, the chairman of the selection panel. "While disappointing, it does present a great opportunity for other players to perform for Australia in a world event." Hazlewood is having a hip problem, having earlier suffered hip and calf strains. Meanwhile, the unavailability of Cummins, who is still recovering from an ankle injury he suffered during the Border-Gavaskar Trophy, will mean Australia will have to name another captain for the Champions Trophy. Earlier, having mentioned that Cummins was heavily unlikely to feature in the Champions Trophy, head coach Andrew McDonald had said that Steve Smith and Travis Head are the two cricketers with whom the management.

Not Abhishek Sharma, This India Star Nominated For Big ICC Award

Indian opener Gongadi Trisha, who was the player of the tournament during the recent ICC Women's U19 T20 World Cup, was nominated for the award in the women's category.
