PM MODI PUSHES FOR GLOBAL AI GOVERNANCE AT


PARIS SUMMIT

Diary Times Desk: Prime Minister Narendra Modi emphasised the need for collective global efforts to establish a governance architecture and standards for artificial intelligence (AI) during Paris AI Action Summit. He co-chaired the summit with French President Emmanuel Macron.

Modi highlighted India's expertise in AI, citing its large talent pool and efforts to build AI applications for global good. "India is ready to share its experience and expertise to ensure that the AI future is for good, and for all," he said, noting that India was building its own large language model considering its diversity.

Pitching for India's AI landscape as a unique space with a public-private partnership model for pooling resources like compute power, PM said in India resources are made available to start-ups and researchers at an affordable cost. The Prime Minister, while stressing the emergence of AI as a tool that was "writing the code for humanity and progressing at an unprecedented pace" noted that the key to humanity's collective future and shared destiny was in the hands of humans themselves. The PM was addressing fears that technology can somehow become more intelligent than the human mind. Earlier in his address, Modi said given a deep inter-dependence across borders, "there is a need for collective global efforts to establish governance and standards, that uphold our shared values, address risks, and build trust".

Modi also spoke for the Global South when he flagged that governance was not just about managing risks and rivalries but also promoting innovation and deploying it for the global good.



SUPREME COURT

DON'T DELETE EVM DATA PENDING VERIFICATIONS, APEX COURT TELLS ELECTION COMMISSION



Diary Times Desk: The Supreme Court on Tuesday asked the Election Commission to respond to a plea seeking directions to allow verification of the burnt memory and Symbol Loading Units (SLUs) of the Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs).

Acting on an interim application filed by the Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR), a Bench of Chief Justice Sanjiv Khanna and Justice Dipankar Datta told senior counsel Maninder Singh, representing the EC, not to erase or reload the data in EVMs while carrying out verifications.

As ADR alleged that the Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) framed by the poll panel for verification of EVMs was not in accordance with the top court's April 26, 2024 verdict in the EVM-VVPAT case, the Bench asked the EC to file an affidavit explaining the SOP for verification of EVMs. It also sought a direction to the poll panel to check and verify burnt memory/micro-controllers and SLUs of EVMs. Terming the present cost of Rs 40,000 fixed by the EC for verification of EVMs as "too high", it also asked the poll panel to reduce it and posted the matter for the week commencing on March 3.

While dismissing PLs seeking return to the paper ballot system or a 100% cross-verification of votes cast through EVMs with Voter Verifiable Paper Audit Trail (VVPAT) slips, the top court had issued certain directions to the EC to strengthen the current EVM system. It had opened a window for the aggrieved unsuccessful candidates securing second and third places by allowing them to seek verification of microcontroller chips embedded in five per cent EVMs per assembly constituency on a written request upon payment of a fee to the EC.

It had also mandated that five per cent of the EVMs in every assembly constituency should undergo verification by the engineers from EVM manufacturers after the election results were announced.

On Tuesday, ADR counsel Prashant Bhushan contended that the EC's SOP on EVM verification was inadequate as it didn't comply with the court's directions in the April 26, 2024 verdict. "What we want is for someone to examine the software and hardware of the EVMs to see whether they contain any element of manipulation," Bhushan said. The Bench told EC counsel Singh that its April 26, 2024 verdict did not intend to erase or reload the polling data in EVMs and that it only intended.

Cricket terminology abounds in Lok Sabha in barbs against Congress, BJP

Diary Times Desk: Shiv Sena MP Shrikant Shinde on Tuesday described the Congress as a "batter" who is trying to get the other partners of the INDIA bloc "run out". Independent MP from Maharashtra's Sangli, Vishal Patil, also resorted to cricket lexicon to take a swipe at the Mahayuti government, saying that after winning the assembly poll, the alliance got the "12th man" to run the government. Participating in a discussion on the Union Budget in Lok Sabha, Shinde said, "The INDIA bloc is like a cricket team that has a batter named the Congress who is bent on getting others run out." Shinde also lauded the Union Budget saying, "If we call (PM Narendra) Modi ji the captain of Team India then Nirmala Sitharaman is its winning all-rounder." In a swipe at BJP leader and Maharashtra CM Devendra Fadnavis, Patil said, "In the past, people would show the photograph of an eligible person and then get a useless person married in his place. This is what has happened in Maharashtra, they showed the face of Eknath Shinde and after the results some other person became the 'groom'." "The man of the match was made the 12th man and the 12th man is now running the government after becoming the captain," he said.

65 per cent of Indians use AI, more than double the global average: Microsoft



Diary Times Desk: A Microsoft study, reflecting the rapid adoption of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in India, has found that 65 per cent of surveyed Indians have used AI-more than double the global average. Microsoft on Tuesday unveiled the Global Online Safety Survey, which studies the growing influence of Al. The survey is based on responses from 15,000 teenagers (13-17) and adults that was conducted in 15 countries between July 19 and August 9, 2024. "65 per cent of respondents have used AI (+26 per cent from 2023). This is more than double the global average of 31 per cent in the same time period. "India is most excited about using AI for translations, answering questions, increasing efficiency at work and helping students with schoolwork," the report said. The report showed that millennials (people aged 25-44) lead adoption, with 84 per cent reporting usage. Indian parents are more aware of their children's digital challenges, showing increased awareness compared to the previous year, it said. However, India also has some reservations about AI, including concerns about online abuse, deepfakes, scams, and Al hallucinations, mirroring global trends. Online abuse was among the top worries regarding Al.

Diary Times Desk: An industrialist and his wife, who were returning after having dinner at a restaurant at Ajouli Mor on the Punjab-Himachal border, were assaulted by four people, including former state spokesperson of BJP Yuva Morcha and Zila Parishad member from Laldi, Una, Kamal Saini. German pilots stuck in Bengaluru traffic, miss Aero India opening ceremony: Report



Diary Times Desk: A group of fifteen German pilots visiting Bengalury for the first time faced an unexpected challengegetting through the city's notorious traffic. According to a Deccan Herald report, their journey to Aero India on Monday turned into a frustrating ordeal as they found themselves delayed for hours, ultimately missing the inaugural event and the much-anticipated aircraft displays. The pilots, who had traveled to the city in an A330 passenger aircraft and were staving at a hotel 17 km from the event venue, set out early in the morning, expecting a smooth ride. However, their private cab got caught in a traffic snarl, turning what should have been a short commute into an hours-long wait. By the time they reached Yelahanka Air Force Station, the opening ceremony had already concluded, the DH report added. Reflecting on the situation, one of the pilots noted with irony that he had been discussing Bengaluru's infrastructure with a local guide the previous day.

Ahead Of Big Day At Kumbh, Authorities Work On Security, Smooth Traffic Flow

Diary Times Desk: The administration is gearing up for another big day at the Maha Kumbh in Uttar Pradesh's Prayagraj. Several measures have been put in place for the safety of the devotees after a stampede killed 30 last month during 'Amrit snaan' or holy dip. Prayagraj, where the Maha Kumbh is taking place, has been turned into a 'no vehicle zone' ahead of the Maghi Purnima Snan which will mark the end of the Kalpvas period, a tradition central to the festival which began on January 13. Kalpvas refers to the practice of living near a sacred river for a set period, adhering to fasting, selfdiscipline, introspection and spiritual purification. Performing Kalpvas during the Maha Kumbh is considered auspicious. This year, more than 10 lakh devotees have undertaken Kalpavas at the Triveni Sangam - The point of confluence of Ganga, Yamuna and mythical river Saraswati. A total of 133 ambulances have been deployed for the safety of devotees. Over 40 hospitals in Mahakumbhnagar.

7 Dead, 2 Injured After Pilgrims' Bus Returning From Maha Kumbh Rams Truck In Madhya Pradesh

Diary Times Desk: Seven Andhra Pradesh pilgrims returning from Maha Kumbh died and two other sustained injuries after a mini-bus in which they were travelling collided with a truck in Madhya Pradesh's Jabalpur district on Tuesday, a police official said. The accident occurred on a 4-lane highway near a Canal area of Mohla Bargi village under Sihora police station limits in the district on Tuesday. The pilgrims travelling in the mini-bus are residents of Andhra Pradesh and were returning to their home after attending Maha Kumbh at Prayagraj. The truck was going from Jabalpur to Katni when the driver lost his control and moved into the opposite lane and collided with the mini-bus. Upon receiving the information about the incident, the police reached the spot, removed the truck with the help of a crane and then rescued the passengers in the mini-bus, the police added.

New Income Tax Bill To Be Tabled In Parliament On Thursday: Sources

Diary Times Desk: A new Income Tax bill -promised by Union finance minister in her last year's budget -- will be tabled in parliament on Thursday, sources have told NDTV. The bill is meant to simplify the language of the tax laws and it would later be sent to Parliament's Standing Committee on Finance. It will not change the existing tax slabs or review the tax rebates given. Sources said simplification of the language will make the Act concise, clear, and easy to understand, which will reduce disputes, litigations, and provide greater tax certainty to taxpayers. The CBDT had set up an internal committee to oversee the review. Also, 22 specialised sub-committees have been established to review the various aspects of the proposed law that would replace the six-decade-old law. Ahead of drawing up the bill, the government had sought inputs from the people under four categories -- simplification of language, litigation reduction.

Mukesh Ambani and family take holy dip at Sangam in Maha Kumbh Mela

Indian-Origin Mother Flies 5 Days A Week To Balance Work And Family

Diary Times Desk: For most people, a daily work commute involves traffic jams or packed trains, but for this Indian-origin mother in Malaysia, it means boarding a flight to and from her office. Racheal Kaur, an assistant manager in AirAsia's finance operations department, wakes up at 4 am to catch her 5:55 am flight from Penang to Sepang to balance work and time with her children. "With them growing, I feel that the need for their mother to be ground more often." Ms Kaur told CNA Insider in an interview. With this arrangement, she is able to go home every day and see them every night. Previously, Ms Kaur rented a home in Kuala Lumpur and only visited her family in Penang on weekends. But with two children aged 11 and 12, she made the decision to commute five days a week by air. "I can help them with any last-minute homework. You know kids, there's always something lastminute," she added.

Khaleda Zia's party says Bangladesh government keen on holding polls in December

Diary Times Desk: Bangladesh is working towards holding general elections by December, the party of former Prime Minister Khaleda Zia said after some of its officials held a meeting with Muhammad Yunus, the chief adviser to the interim government. The South Asian nation has been in charge of a caretaker government led by Nobel Peace laureate Yunus since August last year when mass protests forced then Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina to resign and flee to neighbouring India. Khaleda's Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) and rival Hasina's Awami League have governed Bangladesh for most of the past three decades. The BNP expects Yunus to soon announce a roadmap for general elections, its secretary general, Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir, told reporters. "We have once again pressed them on this matter," he said on Monday. "He (Yunus) told us that they are working to hold the election by December." There was no comment on the meeting from the interim administration. It is the most specific date since prior suggestions by Yunus of possible timeframes for the end of 2025 or the middle of 2026. The BNP was among parties pushing for early elections.

"All Hell Will Break Loose": Trump's Hostage Warning To Hamas



Diary Times Desk: A shadow of doom looms over the future of Gaza and Palestinians living in the enclave as US President Donald Trump has doubled down on his threat to take over the territory and end the fragile ceasefire between Israel and Hamas. The American President has warned Hamas that "all hell will break loose" following its threats to postpone the exchange of hostages under the war truce with Israel. He also stressed that his plan to "take over Gaza" would not include a right of return for the more than 2 million Palestinians that he has said have "no alternative" but to leave because of the destruction left by Israel's military campaign. The Republican leader set a Saturday deadline for all hostages to be released from Gaza, saying that otherwise "all hell" would break out and he would call for the Israel-Hamas ceasefire to be cancelled. The United States' latest extraordinary intervention in the Middle East came after Hamas threatened to postpone any further hostage-prisoner exchanges, placing the fragile sixweek truce that took effect on January 19 at risk.

Bomb blast kills at least five in Afghanistan

Diary Times Desk: A bomb blast has killed at least five people and wounded seven in northeastern Afghanistan, local police report. The blast took place at 8:35am (04:05 GMT) on Tuesday near a Kabul Bank branch in Kunduz province. No group has claimed responsibility for the blast yet. The bank's security guard and four others, including civilians and members of Afghanistan's ruling Taliban group, were among those killed, police said. "A suicide bomber, who had improvised explosive devices, detonated himself," Jumadin Khaksar, spokesman for Kunduz province police, noted. "The Kunduz province police command is working with relevant organisations to find the perpetrators of the incident and bring them to justice," he added. The number of bomb blasts and suicide attacks in Afghanistan.

FBI uncovers 2,400 JFK assassination files after Donald Trump's order: Report

Diary Times Desk: The Federal Bureau of Investigation has uncovered around 2,400 secret records related to the assassination of former US president John F Kennedy that were never provided to a panel tasked with reviewing and disclosing the documents, an Axios report claimed. The revelation came as a part of the review triggered by US President Donald Trump's executive order seeking the declassification of the files on the assassinations of JFK, along with Senator Robert F Kennedy and civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr. The FBI found that the records, which have been kept secret to this date, are stored in 14,000 pages of documents. The White House was made aware of the discovery last week when the Office of the Director of National Intelligence submitted its plan to disclose the assassination documents under President Trump's orders. According to Axios, the contents of the newly found records are closely held secrets, kept away from the eyes of many of the officials.



Arab Countries Reject Trump's Gaza Plan, Egypt Minister Tells Marco Rubio

Diary Times Desk: Egyptian Foreign Minister Badr Abdelatty told U.S. Secretary of State Marco Rubio on Monday that Arab states support Palestinians in rejecting U.S. President Donald Trump's plan to displace Palestinians in Gaza and take control of the enclave. In a statement, Egypt's foreign ministry said Abdelatty, in a meeting in Washinaton, stressed importance of expediting Gaza's reconstruction while Palestinians remain there. Abdelatty, who arrived in Washington on Sunday, said he was looking forward to working with the new U.S. administration to achieve "comprehensive and just peace and stability" in the region, according to the statement. Any suggestion that Palestinians leave Gaza, which they want as part of an independent state, has been anathema to the Palestinian leadership for generations and neighbouring Arab states have rejected it since the Gaza war began in 2023. Egypt's foreign ministry said on Monday that the international community should unify behind Palestinians to right "historic injustice" and restore their "legitimate and inalienable rights."

3 women kept as slaves at human egg farm were 'fed hormones, treated like cattle': Report

Diary Times Desk: A horrific allegation by three women who claimed to have escaped from a human egg farm has shocked the world. According to the Bangkok Post, these three Thai women were lured into the human-egg harvesting scheme under the pretext of being surrogates for childless couples. Tapped through social media, they allegedly found themselves victims in the scheme operated by Chinese gangsters in the former Soviet republic of Georgia. "They took us to a house where there were 60 to 70 Thai women. The women there told us there was no (surrogacy) contracts or parents," the woman said, reported Reuters. She continued that the women in captivity "would be injected to get treatment, anesthetised and their eggs would be extracted with a machine. After we got this information and it was not the same as the advertisement, we got scared, we tried to contact people back home." According to the Bangkok Post, founder of the Pavena Foundation for Children and Women, Pavena Hongsakula's efforts prompted the freedom of the three women. Foreign Affairs Police coordinated with Interpol to free the three women on January 30.

7-year-old boy honoured for completing 1,200-km Abohar-Ayodhya run

Diary Times Desk: Seven-year-old Mohabbat has been felicitated for his incredible achievement of completing a 1,200-km run from Abohar to Ayodhya. Deputy Commissioner Amarpreet Kaur Sandhu and Superintendent of Police Pardeep Singh Sandhu visited Mohabbat's village, Killianwali, to honour him for his remarkable feat. Mohabbat's journey began on November 14, and he completed it in 56 days. He was also felicitated by UP Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath upon reaching his destination. Alternative road to Chandigarh airport to be completed by December: Punjab to HC

Diary Times Desk: Alternative road to the Chandigarh airport is all set to take-off by yearend. The Punjab Government has informed the Punjab and Haryana High Court that an 8.5-km alternative road to Chandigarh International Airport is under construction and will be completed by December. The submission came during the hearing of a petition filed in public interest on infrastructure and accessibility issues related to the airport. Appearing before the division bench of Justice Arun Palli and Justice Sudeepti Sharma, Punjab Additional Advocate-General Shekhar Verma submitted that the proposed 50-m wide road was currently being laid at the site in accordance with the plan. The information was furnished in response to court query "as to what is the progress with regard to the alternative road to the airport that had been suggested long ago". According to available information, the shorter route is expected to pass through Sector Junction 65-66 (near Bawa White House) and continue towards Sector 66-B. Currently, the PR-7 road remains the sole access point for traffic from Punjab and Haryana to reach the international airport in Mohali.

May 'dislodge' AAP govt, says Bittu after cases against aides

Diary Times Desk: Union Minister and BJP leader Ravneet Singh Bittu on Monday warned the police against "blindly following" political orders, saying his party could "dislodge" the AAP government and take action against cops for registering "false cases" against his two aides. The statement came as the police arrested his two close associates Rajiv Raja and Rajesh Attri. Raja was booked in an extortion case on Sunday while Attri, arrested on Monday, faces charges under the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes Act for allegedly making casteist remarks over a phone call with a Patiala resident. Angry Bittu, in a statement, said, "We will sort this thing out when we assume power in the state. Police officials should remember power changes with elections." Bittu said his "close family friends for three generations have been booked on false and motivated complaints to settle scores with me". "Raids have been conducted on the houses of relatives and friends, and some in government service have been transferred," he said. The Union Minister also dared Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann to arrest him, announcing his intention to go to his official residence in Chandigarh on February 13. The remarks came amid an increasing attack.

Kargil war veteran saves 5 from drowning in Punjab's Sirhind canal

Diary Times Desk: Harjinder Singh, 49, an ex-armyman and Kargil War veteran, and his two teenaged sons managed to save five persons from drowning whose SUV plunged into Sirhind canal between village Pvaat and Behlolpur village near Machhiwara in Ludhiana on Monday night around 11:30pm. One person did not survive in the accident after his body was fished out of the freezing cold water. The veteran of 15 Punjab (Patiala), now re-employed in the security detail of Mukesh Ambani's Antilia, had come home on vacation. On Monday he, alongwith his two sons Gurleenpreet Singh, 18, and Harkirat Singh, 17, were returning after attending a marriage party in Bathinda when they saw a vehicle plunged in the Sirhind canal with six victims trapped inside the vehicle. "I was sleeping in the backseat of my car when my sons who were driving the car stopped to see the vehicle sliding in the canal. After realising that six youths around 25 to years of age were struggling to get out of the vehicle. Me and my two sons were lucky to bail them out by the grace of God," the former commando said. Harjinder alongwith his son rescued the persons by breaking open the window glasses. His sons took the help of a fallen tree to arrest the slide of vehicle further into the muddy water. The trio brought the victims to safety on the road head and called up the police. Three PCRs and an ambulance reached the spot after around one hour. One person was declared brought dead in the hospital.



Supreme Court 'shocked' at police chaining Gurugram man to hospital bed

Diary Times Desk: Shocked to know that Haryana Police handcuffed a man from Gurugram, chained him to a hospital bed and did not inform him the reason for his arrest, the Supreme Court has declared his arrest as illegal and ordered his forthwith release. "The state of Haryana shall issue guidelines/departmental

instructions to the police to ensure that the act of handcuffing an accused while he is on a hospital bed and tying him to the bed is not committed again," a Bench of Justice AS Oka and Justice N Kotiswar Singh ordered. The Bench directed the state government "to ensure that the constitutional safeguards under Article 22 are strictly followed. If necessary, the state government would amend the existing rules/guidelines." The top court directed that a copy of the judgment be forwarded to Haryana Home Secretary compliance. Setting aside the Punjab and Haryana High Court's August 30, 2024 order refusing to set aside the "illegal arrest" of accused Vihaan Kumar, the Bench referred to the "shocking" treatment given to him by the police.

Will submit reply to show-cause notice to party high command: Anil Vij



Diary Times Desk: A day after BJP a show-cause Haryana Cabinet Minister Anil Vij on Tuesday said that he will submit his reply to the party high command. Reacting to the media queries, minister Anil Vij said, "I will give my reply to the party. I was in Bengaluru for the last three days. I will go home first, take a cold shower, have food and then send my reply to the party high command." BJP had issued a show-cause notice to Anil Vij for allegedly breaching party discipline through his public statements against Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini and state party chief Mohan Lal Badoli. In the notice, issued by Mohan Lal Badoli on the directions of the national party president, Vij was asked to respond within three days.

42% departure from normal storage in 3 water reservoirs

Diary Times Desk: The 42 per cent departure from normal storage in the three major reservoirs of Gobindsagar, Pong and Kol Dam in Himachal presently, could result in a possible shortfall in hydel power generation and irrigation projects. The Central Water Commission (CWC) bulletin regarding water storage situation in 155 reservoirs across the country on February 6, 2025 has indicated a 42 per cent departure from normal. Himachal is one of the four states apart from Punjab, Odisha and Goa having lesser storage in percentage than last year for the corresponding period. There is 42 per cent departure in Himachal in storage in the three main reservoirs. As compared to 28 storage as percentage of live capacity last year, the departure reflected in the latest CEC bulletin for the corresponding period indicates 46 storage as percentage of live capacity. The normal storage as percentage of live capacity for the three dams is 48. This shows that the shortfall in the water storage in the three main reservoirs is higher this timer as compared to last year.

99.84 per cent family members verified on e-Parivar register: CM

Diary Times Desk: Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu today said that 99.84 per cent of family members have been successfully verified on the e-Parivar register. "Out of a total of 75.18.296 family members. 75,05,913 have been verified under this initiative," he stated here today. He said e-Parivar is a crucial step towards digitising family records, facilitating the addition seamless of families and modifications to existing records. Additionally, the process of mapping family details with ration cards is currently in progress to enhance service delivery. "Each Panchayat Secretary has been provided with secure login credentials to enter and update family data within their respective panchayats. To ensure accuracy and efficiency, the system was made mandatory from April 27, 2024," he said. E-Parivar system is an online platform designed to manage family records at the Gram Panchayat level.

Drug association ties up with NIPER to set up pharma research centre in Baddi



Diary Times Desk: Facing challenges to access essential technical services, quality testing, research and development, besides regulatory services at competitive rates, a Contract Research Organisation (CRO)-cum-Centre of Excellence is being set up at Baddi nearly two-and-a-half decade after the drug firms began their operations here. The Central Government is contributing Rs 20 crore for this centre, while the state government is providing land as its share. The Himachal Drug Manufacturing Association (HMDA) is partnering with Mohali-based National Institute of Pharmaceutical Education and Research (NIPER) to address the technological requirements through this centre. It is the first such initiative in the state to promote research and development, along with modern technology adoption. "In a bid to work out the future strategy, the HMDA held its first meeting with representatives of NIPER at Baddi today where the broader nitty-gritty details of this centre were discussed," said HDMA president Dr Rajesh Gupta. Elaborating further, Dr Gupta said, "The upcoming CRO will strengthen the pharmaceutical sector, which contributes 5.5 per cent of the State Gross Domestic Product.

Snowfall in higher reaches of state likely today

Diary Times Desk: The higher reaches of the state will receive fresh snowfall on February 11. As per the State's Meteorological Department, light snowfall as well as rainfall is expected to occur at isolated areas of the of the higher reaches of Shimla, Lahaul and Spiti, Kinnaur, Kullu, Mandi, Kangra and Chamba districts on February 11, while weather will remain dry in mid, lower hills and plains for the next one week. Similarly, light snowfall is also expected to occur in the higher hills of the state on February 15 and 16. Meanwhile, weather was mostly dry across the state during the past 24 hours. Minimum temperature in Shimla was 8.6°C, Dharamsala 5.2°C, Manali and Bhuntar 5.4°C, Sundernagar 6.5°C, Dalhousie 8°C, Bilaspur 6.7°C, Solan 5.2°C, Mandi 7.6°C, Kalpa 0.4°C, Chamba 8.8°C, Nahan 8.5°C, and Keylong – 4°C. With 28°C maximum temperature, Una was the hottest place in the state while Tabo village in tribal district Lahaul and Spiti was the coldest as it recorded -5.6°C minimum temperature. PWD Minister Vikramaditya says UPS will be discussed in Cabinet

Diary Times Desk: Giving a hint that the state government was open to discussing the Unified Pension Scheme (UPS), PWD Minister Vikramaditya Singh today said that the scheme would be discussed in the Cabinet and the government would then take a decision on this. "When Old Pension Scheme was restored in the state, the UPS option was not there. We will discuss it in the Cabinet meeting. The main agenda is to protect the interests of the employees. We will see whether it can be achieved through the OPS or the UPS," the minister said. He further said that the financial implications of both the schemes would be studied and then the decision would be taken by the government. Stunned by the minister's statement, the employees did not waste any time in making it clear that they were against the UPS and any decision taken towards implementing it would be opposed. Incidentally, the Centre has been sending repeated reminders to the state government to implement the UPS instead of the OPS in the state. "There are several shortcomings in the UPS and that's the reason why employees have rejected it across the country," said Pradeep Thakur, an employee leader.

Eight arrested for duping Kinnaur man of Rs 17.5 lakh

Diary Times Desk: The police have arrested eight individuals, including four key masterminds, for allegedly duping a resident of Kinnaur district of Rs 17.5 lakh through a digital arrest scam. The accused have been identified as Mehul Thakor alias Jimmy and Jignesh Vashani alias Rock, both residents of Gujarat and the main masterminds, along with Muhammad Nawaz, Revathi, Sudarshan, and Ravi Kumar from Telangana, and Aanand and Shintu Kumar Mishra from Bihar. According to the complaint, on November 18, 2024, a resident of Skiba village in Kinnaur district received a WhatsApp call from fraudsters posing as police officers. They allegedly threatened to arrest him digitally if he did not transfer Rs 17.5 lakh. A case has been registered against the accused under Sections 318(4) (fraudulent inducement), 351 (2) (criminal intimidation), and 61 (2) (criminal conspiracies) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita 2023. The police have also sealed all bank accounts linked to the accused that were used for fraudulent transactions. Superintendent of Police (SP) Kinnaur Abhishek S confirmed the arrests. The accused were presented before a court in Rampur, which remanded them to police custody for further investigation, he said.



Gautam Gambhir's potential backup plan for Jasprit Bumrah gets negative review: 'We're told Rana is Dube's replacement'

Diary Times Desk: The Indian team management is in a tricky spot with uncertainty over Jasprit Bumrah's availability for the Champions Trophy as the squad-locking deadline nears. Bumrah has reportedly joined the NCA for rehabilitation, where the medical team is assessing him to prepare a report on his match availability for the Champions Trophy, which will start on February 19. The BCCI also has to prepare a backup plan if he fails to get the fitness certificate, and it seems like Gautam Gambhir has identified Harshit Rana as the potential replacement. However, former India opener Aakash Chopra isn't very convinced with the potential backup plan of Gautam Gambhir and Rohit Sharma, as he feels that if Bumrah fails to make it, then they have to make a pivot. "India will have to change the entire goalpost if Bumrah isn't there. They will have to make a solid pivot and it's good if they do that because if they don't and become adamant that the team would be ready if they only keep Harshit for Bumrah, would we be really ready?" IPL Franchise Gujarat Titans Get New Owners, Majority Shares To Be Sold To...

Diary Times Desk : Former IPL champions Gujarat Titans are set to have new owners as Indian business conglomerate, the Torrent Group, is in line to acquire a majority stake in the franchise. The Ahmedabad-based conglomerate will purchase a 67 per cent stake in the team from CVC Capital Partners (Irelia Company Pvt Ltd), who had bought the team in 2021. The deal is awaiting final approval from the IPL governing council, which would allow Torrent Group to take control ahead of the upcoming season, which will begin on March 21. "The talks of Torrent Group taking two third ownership (67 per cent) is at an advanced stage. The lockin period for CVC group as sole owners ends in February 2025 after which they are free to sell the stakes," an IPL source told PTI on conditions of anonymity. "Torrent group is one of the biggest names in Pharmaceutical sector in India and in 2021 when BCCI invited bids for two new teams, they had shown active interest. Obviously any change in ownership pattern requires approval from BCCI which is expected to be given in coming days," he added.

Nair, Dubey set up Vidarbha's semi-final date with Mumbai

Diary Times Desk: Harsh Dubey starred with bat and ball, while Karun Nair continued his glorious run from the 2024-25 Vijay Hazare Trophy as Vidarbha beat Tamil Nadu by 198 runs. Mumbai ride on Dias, Rahane, Shardul efforts to seal Ranji semi-final spot

Diary Times Desk: A maiden five-wicket haul from leftarm seamer Royston Dias studded Mumbai's 153-run win over Haryana at Eden Gardens. Up next in the semi-final will be Vidarbha, in a repeat of last year's final. Dias fittingly picked up the final wicket when he had Jayant Yadav top-edge a pull to Suryakumar Yadav at mid-on to complete his five-wicket haul. Shardul Thakur, who picked up 6 for 58 in the first innings, was the other contributor. Haryana responded solidly with Ankit Kumar, the captain, hitting 136, but from 218 for 3, Haryana collapsed to be bowled out for 301, thereby conceding a 14-run lead. Mumbai converted a slender lead into a match-winning one courtesy Ajinkya Rahane's 108. The Mumbai captain put together a 129-run stand with Suryakumar, who ended a lean run of form with a typically robust 70 to set up the innings. Shivam Dube then made 48 to swell the lead further. Haryana were a bowler short for the entire second innings with seamer Ajit Chahal injured. Mumbai were poised for a lead of over 400, but collapsed on the fourth morning, losing 6 for 25 to set Haryana a 354-run target. They weren't in the chase at any stage, stumbling to 60 for 5 very quickly. Opener Lakshay Dalal top scored with 64.

Confident Australia gear up for final round of Champions Trophy preps

Both teams held their customary match-eve training session inside an empty Premadasa on Tuesday, with the Australian session quite indicative of the bit of uncertainty around the make-up of their team. Not for this series but also the Champions Trophy, with the four withdrawals having impacted the core of their otherwise settled team auite a bit.

Varun Chakravarthy Snubbed, WI Star Claims Player Of The Month For January 2025

Diary Times Desk : West Indies' Jomel Warrican has been awarded as the ICC Men's Player of the Month for January 2025. Warrican won the accolade on the back of a splendid run in Pakistan, during which he secured his career-best figures while also leading West Indies to their first-ever Test win in the Asian country in 35 years. This is Warrican's maiden ICC Men's Player of the Month award from two other standout spinners from January's contests, Pakistan's Noman Ali and India's Varun Chakravarthy. The 32year-old's exceptional month saw him take 19 wickets in two Test matches at an average of just 9.00. He became the first West Indian to win the award since fellow spinner Gudakesh Motie back in May 2024. In the first Test in Multan, he claimed career-best bowling figures of 10-101 and scored an unbeaten 31. However, Pakistan, led by Sajid Khan's 9-115 got the better.
