## PM MODI FRANCE VISIT

## INDIA AND FRANCE ELEVATE DEFENCE COOPERATION WITH INTEGRATED COMBAT SYSTEM AND R&D PARTNERSHIPS

**Diary Times Desk :** India and France are taking their defence cooperation to the next level by exploring the development of an integrated combat system (ICS) for Indian submarines. This move is part of a broader effort to deepen research and development partnerships in defence, with the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) set to collaborate with its French counterpart, the Directorate General of Armament (DGA).

The Indian Navy currently operates six French-origin submarines, the Kalvari class, and is considering the acquisition of three additional Kalvari class subs. The two nations have discussed the possibility of introducing an ICS into future submarines, with Prime Minister Narendra Modi and French President Emmanuel Macron welcoming ongoing discussions between DRDO and French body L'Office National d'Etudes et de Recherches Aérospatiales (ONERA) to identify technologies for R&D partnerships.

In another significant development, Prime Minister Modi has invited the French Army to consider acquiring the Pinaka multi-barrel rocket launcher, which is currently used by the Indian Army. This potential acquisition would mark another milestone in Indo-French defence ties.

The two sides discussed continuation of cooperation of air and maritime assets in line with the ambitious 'Defence Industrial Roadmap' agreed upon in 2024.

Modi and Macron discussed ongoing discussions in missiles, helicopter and jet engines, with French company Safran, collaborating with Indian Hindustan Aeronautics Limited to develop engines for next-generation copters and jets. India has also joined as observer in the Eurodrone UAV programme.

**Diary Times Desk :** The simplified Income Tax Bill 2025, which brings in the concept of 'tax year' and abolishes the archaic and complicated terms 'previous' and 'assessment years', is likely to be introduced in Parliament on Thursday. The Bill comprises 536 sections, 23 chapters and 16 schedules in just 622 pages. It

The Bill comprises 536 sections, 23 chapters and 16 schedules in just 622 pages. It does not bring in any new taxes, but only simplifies the language of the existing Income Tax Act, 1961.

The six-decade old legislation has 298 sections and 14 schedules. It had 880 pages when the Act was introduced.

The new Bill seeks to replace the Income Tax Act, 1961 which has become too voluminous due to the amendments made over the last 60 years. The new law is expected to come into effect from April 1, 2026. The new bill has omitted redundant sections, like those relating to Fringe Benefit Tax. The Bill is free from 'explanations or provisos', thereby making it easier to read and comprehend.

Also, the word 'notwithstanding', which was used excessively in the Income Tax Act, 1961, has been done away with in the new Bill and almost everywhere replaced with the term 'irrespective'.

The Bill uses shorter sentences and has been made reader friendly with the use of tables and formulae. Tables have been provided for provisions relating to TDS, presumptive taxation, salaries, and deductions for bad debt.

The 'Taxpayer's Charter' has been included in the Bill which outlines the rights and obligations of the taxpayers.

The Bill replaces the term 'previous year' as mentioned in the Income Tax Act, 1961 with 'tax year'. Also, the concept of assessment year has been done away with. Currently, for income earned in the previous year (say 2023-24), tax is paid in assessment year (say 2024-25). This previous year and assessment year (AY) concept has been removed and only tax year under the simplified bill has been brought in.

Once introduced in the Lok Sabha likely on Thursday, the Bill will be sent to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Finance for further deliberations.

The Statement of Objects and Reasons of the new I-T Bill said that the Incometax Act passed in 1961 has been subjected to numerous amendments since its passage 60 years ago.

# PM Modi, Macron inaugurate India's new consulate in France's Marseille

Diary Times Desk : On the last day of his visit to France, Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President Emmanuel Macron on Wednesday jointly inaugurated India's new consulate in France's Marseille city. The consulate will be India's second diplomatic mission in the country after the embassy in Paris. It will reduce the need for people to travel to Paris for consular work. The two leaders jointly inaugurated India's new consulate in Marseille with the press of a button amid cheers from the gathered crowd. Many of these people had come bearing national flags of both India and France, while some sported a tricolour headgear, adding colour to the occasion. The inauguration marked a culmination of the announcement that was made during Modi's France visit in 2023 about India opening a consulate in the city located in the South of France on the Mediterranean coast. Marseille is a key strategic location and marks the entry point for the ambitious India Europe Economic Corridor. India has plans to use the Marseille port, where no foreign power has current presence. Prior to the inauguration, Modi and Macron visited the historic Mazargues Cemetery, and paid tributes to the fallen Indian soldiers of World War-1.



After arriving in Prayagraj on Tuesday, Kumble chose to take the holy dip on Magh Purnima, a day when no VIP protocols are observed. He joined the devotees as a regular pilgrim, taking a boat to the confluence with his wife for the ritual.

#### "Are We Not Creating Class Of Parasites?" Supreme Court's Big Remark On Freebies

Diary Times Desk : Making strong observations on the practice of political parties announcing freebies ahead of elections, the Supreme Court has said people are "not willing to work" because of them and wondered whether a "class of parasites" was being created in the country. Hearing a matter on the right to shelter of homeless persons in urban areas, a bench of Justices BR Gavai and AG Masih said people were getting ration and money without working. "Rather than promoting them to be a part of the mainstream of the society by contributing to the development of the nation, are we not creating a class of parasites?" the bench asked. Pulling no punches, Justice Gavai referred to the 'Ladki Bahin' scheme in Maharashtra - under which women in the age group of 21-65 with an annual family income of less than Rs 2.5 lakh get Rs 1,500 per month - and similar programmes run by ruling parties in other states and said, "Unfortunately, because of these freebies, which just on the anvil of elections are declared, like 'Ladki Bahin' and other schemes, people are not willing to work... They are getting free ration and money without doing any work."

#### Meat found in Hyderabad temple triggers outrage, BJP questions police probe

Diary Times Desk : Tension gripped a Hyderabad temple on Wednesday after pieces of meat were found near the Shiva Lingam inside the premises. Devotees, shocked by the sight, immediately informed the police, who rushed to the spot to assess the situation. According to authorities of Jirra Hanuman Temple in Tappachabutra locality, the priest discovered pieces of meat and alerted the committee members. As the news spread, a crowd gathered outside the temple, with local BJP workers also taking up the issue. Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) Chandra Mohan confirmed that the police opened an "We investigation. received information about meat being present near the Shiva Lingam. Upon reaching the spot, we found the doors of the temple were locked. We suspect that some animal might have brought the meat inside. CCTV footage is being examined, and further details will be shared," he said. BJP MLA Raja Singh alleged that such acts had become common in Hyderabad. "Previously, similar incidents have taken place. Police always say that a dog or cat brought the meat. This has become their regular explanation.

#### Dumbbells Hung From Private Parts: Ragging Horror At Kerala Medical College



Diary Times Desk : Stripped naked, dumbbells hung from private parts, stabbed with geometry box compasses and beaten bloody for three months - a fresh ragging incident has rocked a government college in Kerala where five third-year nursing students have been arrested for allegedly subjecting their juniors to months of brutal physical and mental abuse. The incident took place at Government Nursing College in Kottayam where three first-year students - all from Thiruvananthapuram - filed a formal complaint with the Kottayam Gandhinagar police, detailing a series of violent acts that began in November 2024 and continued for nearly three months. The complaint led to the suspension of the students and their arrest under the Anti-Ragging Act. According to the police, the first-year students were forced to stand naked while their seniors hung dumbbells from their private parts. The victims were also subjected to injuries using sharp objects, including a compass from a geometry box.

Sources have said that the investigators will also speak to those who attended the show as an audience and record their statements. The participants who made objectionable remarks on the show are also under the scanner. The cyber cell is also reaching out to YouTube for the deletion of all the episodes of India's Got Latent.

#### Ex Congress MP Sajjan Kumar Convicted In 1984 Anti-Sikh Riots Case

Diary Times Desk : A Delhi court on Wednesday convicted Congress MP Sajjan Kumar in a case over the murders of two persons in Saraswati Vihar area during the anti-Sikh riots. Special judge Kaveri Baweja passed the conviction order and posted the arguments on sentence on Feburary 18. Kumar was produced before court from Tihar jail for the pronouncement. The case relates to the killings of Jaswant Singh and his son Tarundeep Singh on November 1, 1984. Though Punjabi Bagh police station registered the case initially, a special investigation team later took over the investigation. On December 16, 2021, the court framed charges against Kumar, finding a "prima facie" case against him. According to the prosecution, a huge mob, armed with deadly weapons, resorted to large-scale looting, arson and destruction of properties of Sikhs to avenge the assassination of former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi

#### Guillain-Barre Syndrome: Mumbai Reports First Death, Total 8 In Maharashtra

Diary Times Desk : A 53-year-old patient died at the Nair Hospital in Mumbai of the Guillain-Barre Syndrome, Commissioner of Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) said on Wednesday. With this the number of fatalities from the rare neurological disorder has gone up to 8 in Maharashtra. The 53-year-old person was admitted to Mumbai's Nair Hospital and died during the treatment. As per the Maharashtra health department till February 11, a total of 192 people have been suspected to have contracted Guillain-Barre Syndrome (GBS). A total of 172 cases GBS cases have been confirmed and a total of seven deaths have been reported so far due to the disease. Most cases are from Pune and surrounding areas. As per information, 40 cases are from the Pune MC area whereas 92 are from the newly added villages of the PMC area. 29 cases have been reported from Pimpri Chinchwad.

Russia rejects swapping Ukrainian territory for Kyiv-held parts of Kursk

Diary Times Desk: Russia has rejected trading the Ukrainian territory it occupies for areas in its own western Kursk region held by Kyiv forces, hours after launching a barrage of drones and missiles on the Ukrainian capital that killed one person. Kremlin spokesperson Dmitry Peskov told reporters on Wednesday that accepting the idea floated by Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy in an interview late on Tuesday was "impossible". "Russia has never and will never discuss the topic of exchanging its territory," he said, saying that Ukrainian forces holding territory inside Russia would either be "destroyed" or pushed out. Ukraine staged a lightning incursion over the border last August and seized chunks of Kursk. Russian troops are still battling to eject them. Russia, in turn, controls just under 20 percent of Ukraine, or more than 112,000 square kilometres. Ukraine controls about 450 square kilometres of the Kursk region, according to open-source maps of the battlefield. Zelenskyy said, "We will swap one territory for another," adding that he did not know which part of Russian-occupied territory Ukraine would ask for back. "I don't know, we will see. But all our territories are important, there is no priority," he said.

#### "Nothing To Buy, Will Take It": Trump Doubles Down On Gaza Takeover Plan

Diary Times Desk: US President Donald Trump on Tuesday (local time) doubled down on his threat of the United States "owning" the Gaza Strip by displacing the 2.2 million Palestinians living in the enclave to neighbouring countries as he met Jordan King Abdullah II-- now of America's closest Middle East allies. "We're going to have Gaza. We don't have to buy. There's nothing to buy. We will have Gaza...We're going to take it, we're going to hold it, we're going to cherish it," Trump told reporters from the Oval Office as he met the Jordanian King. But Trump, who made his fortune as a real estate tycoon did however deny that he would seek to personally develop property in Gaza. "No. I've had a great career in real estate," he said. Trump, who had earlier said his plan to "take over Gaza".

### Elon Musk walks back Trump administration's \$50-mn Gaza condom aid claim

Diary Times Desk : US Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE) chief Elon Musk appeared to retract the Trump administration's claim that \$50 million worth of condoms had been allocated for Gaza under the previous administration. Musk, who was seen carrying his son on his shoulders while standing next to US President Donald Trump in the Oval Office, addressed the controversy after a reporter pointed out a recent report debunking the claim. The report revealed that the alleged aid had actually been allocated to a province in Mozambique under a US Agency for International Development (USAID) program to combat AIDS. "Some of the things I say will be incorrect and should be corrected," Musk admitted. "Nobody is going to bat 1,000. We will make mistakes, but we'll act quickly to correct any mistakes." Questioning the allocation of such a large sum for contraceptives, Musk added, "I'm not sure we should be sending \$50 million worth of condoms anywhere... I'm not sure that's something Americans would be really excited about. That really is an enormous number of condoms."



#### Mark Zuckerberg claims he was 'almost sentenced to death' in Pak over blasphemy

Diary Times Desk : Facebook CEO Mark Zuckerberg has claimed that he was "almost sentenced to death in Pakistan" after being sued for blasphemous content on his social media platform. Zuckerberg made the claim during a recent interview with podcaster Joe Rogan while discussing challenges to social media platforms posed by different frameworks across the world. There are laws in different countries that we disagree with. For example, there was a time when someone was trying to get me sentenced to death in Pakistan because someone on Facebook had a drawing of the Prophet Muhammad, and someone said 'that's blasphemy in our culture'. They sued me and opened criminal proceedings... But I am not planning to go to Pakistan, so I'm not worried about it," he said. The Facebook CEO did acknowledge that the situation was a "little disconcerting", adding that "it's not great (if you're) flying over that region, you don't want your plane to go down above Pakistan".

### Trump's Citizenship Order's Big Impact On Expecting Indian Parents

Diary Times Desk : US President Donald Trump's executive order seeking to ban birthright citizenship for children of temporary visa holders was a bolt from the blue for immigrants, especially Indians, in America. Although on hold for now after a legal challenge, the policy has left thousands of Indians, expecting to be parents shortly, in limbo. For Indian professionals on H-1B visas, the impact is huge. Many assumed their US-born children would automatically get citizenship, but the order now threatens to upend those expectations. "This impacts us directly," said Akshay Pise, an Indian engineer in San Jose, California, whose wife, Neha Satpute, is due this month. "If the order takes effect, we don't know what comes next - it's uncharted territory," he told With their BBC. due date approaching, the couple briefly considered inducing labour early but decided against it. "I want the natural process to take its course," said Ms Satpute. Mr Pise added, "My priority is safe delivery and my wife's health. Citizenship comes second." The panic has led to reports of parents going for early C-sections to secure their child's US citizenship. But Satheesh Kathula, president of the American Association of Physicians of Indian Origin (AAPI), advised against it. "In a country with strict medical laws.

### 1984 anti-Sikh riots: Delhi court holds former Congress leader Sajjan Kumar guilty of murder

Diary Times Desk : A Delhi court on Wednesday held former Congress MP Saijan Kumar guilty of murder in a 1984 anti-Sikh riots case in connection with the murder of two persons in Saraswati Vihar area of the national capital. Special Judge Kaveri Baweja, who had on February 7 deferred the pronouncement of the verdict till today - posted the matter for hearing arguments on quantum of punishment to be awarded to the convict on February 18. Kumar (79) is already serving life imprisonment in another anti-Sikh riots related case. After hearing additional submissions made by Public Prosecutor Manish Rawat, Special judge Baweja had on January 31 reserved the verdict. Earlier, the prosecution had sought time to further argue on certain points raised by the defence counsel on January 8. Kumar is currently serving life imprisonment in Tihar Jail in another anti-Sikh riots case. The case relates to the killings of Jaswant Singh and his son Tarundeep Singh on November 1, 1984. Punjabi Bagh police station registered the case and the probe was subsequently taken over by a special investigation team. On December 16, 2021, the court framed charges against Kumar, finding a "prima facie" case against him. According to the prosecution, a huge mob, armed with deadly weapons, resorted to large-scale looting, arson and destruction of properties of Sikhs to avenue the assassination of former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi.



#### Clear legacy waste by March 31: Secretary

Diary Times Desk : Home Secretary-cum-Secretary Local Government Mandip Singh Brar today visited the dumping ground and legacy mining site at Dadu Majra to take stock of waste-management project. He was accompanied by Municipal Corporation (MC) Commissioner Amit Kumar, Chief Engineer Sanjay Arora and other senior officers of the MC. Brar assessed the current status of the waste management and bio-mining project. The visit was aimed at reviewing ongoing waste disposal processes and exploring more technologies to enhance the capacity of the site. During the visit, the MC Commissioner briefed the Secretary on the present condition of the dump site. The Commissioner elaborated on the segregation process of wet and dry waste, explaining how different types of waste were handled to minimise the hazardous impact to preserve environment. He apprised the Secretary that special attention was being given to horticulture waste management. The Commissioner also highlighted the ongoing efforts to ensure daily waste processing at the site. A key focus of the discussion was the initiative to produce bio-soil from organic waste, which can be utilised for agricultural and landscapina purposes.

#### Year on, Shambhu closure remains a hurdle for traders, commuters

Diary Times Desk : One year on, the closure of Haryana-Punjab interstate Shambhu border continues to be a cause of inconvenience for commuters, local businessmen as well as agitating farmers. The Shambhu toll plaza saw cemented barricades and barbed wires come up, besides heavy police deployment to prevent the farmers from marching towards Delhi on February 13 last year. It has been lying sealed since. A large number of vehicles heading for Punjab can be spotted taking a U-turn near the toll plaza and seeking alternative routes. Transporters and commercial vehicle owners claimed to have suffered heavy losses.

#### Farmers' unity talks remain inconclusive in absence of Dallewal faction

Diary Times Desk : The meeting between Samyukt Kisan Morcha leaders and the Kisan Mazdoor Manch, for forging a 'unity' between all farmer unions, remained inconclusive in the absence of Jagjit Singh Dallewal-led Samyukt Kisan Morcha (Non-Political). The three-hour long meeting was held here on Wednesday. Both sides -SKM and KMM - agreed that they need to synchronise their protests and jointly fight for the cause of farmers. The Kisan Mazdoor Manch will now take up the proposal with SKM (Non-Political) farmer leaders, who are protesting at the Khanauri border for a year now. Dallewal, who is the convener of the SKM (Non-Political), has been on the indefinite hunger strike at the Khanauri border point since November 26 last year in support of various demands including a legal guarantee to minimum support price for crops. The third round of 'unity' meeting was called on Wednesday ahead of the February 14 meeting called by the Centre with the KMM and SKM (Non-Political) leaders to end the impasse, ever since talks between the two sides broke in February last year without reaching any conclusion.

#### 'Take it or leave it attitude' of insurance companies unwarranted: Consumer Commission

Diary Times Desk : Observing that the 'take it or leave it' attitude of the insurance companies are unwarranted, the District Consumer Dispute Redressal Commission directed an insurance firm to pay Rs 15,000 as compensation to a city resident for denying the claim without valid reasons. The commission also directed to reimburse an amount of Rs 54,228, spent on the treatment, to the complainant along with an interest of 9 per cent per annum. The commission said it is generally seen that the insurance companies are only interested in earning premiums and find ways and means to decline claims. In his complaint, Sanjiv Rana, a resident of Sector38, stated that he obtained a health insurance policy and on April 10, 2024, visited a private hospital in Mohali for consultation after feeling uneasiness. As there was no relief, he again approached the hospital and was advised admission. At the time of discharge, the hospital filed a claim with the insurance company but it was rejected. As per bills, the complainant had to pay Rs 54,228 for his medical treatment from his own pocket. Despite notices, the insurance company did not put in appearance before the Commission and accordingly they proceeded against ex-parte vide order dated October 30, 2024.

### Haryana Assembly's budget session to begin on March 7

Diary Times Desk : Haryana Assembly's budget session will begin here on March 7, according to an official notification issued on Wednesday. The session will commence with the address of Governor Bandaru Dattatreya, said the notification issued by the Haryana Vidhan Sabha Secretariat. ### Deportation from US: Ambala travel agent arrested, two FIRs registered

Diary Times Desk : In a significant breakthrough, Ambala police have arrested local travel agent Gurjant Singh in connection with the deportation of youth Jitesh Walia from America. Gurjant, a resident of Ambala City, was produced before a court and remanded in police custody for five days. The arrest comes after a complaint filed by Sushil Kumar Walia, a retired police official and father of Jitesh. According to Sushil Kumar, Gurjant Singh, along with associates Jasvinder Singh, Amrik Singh, Prashant and Chacha Hyderabad, promised to secure an overseas settlement for his son in return for a fee of Rs 40 lakh. The money was transferred in multiple instalments to account numbers provided by the agents. Sushil Kumar alleged, "Jitesh was first taken to Delhi and kept there in a hotel for a week and then sent to Dubai where he stayed for next 20-25 days and then sent to Kazakhstan where he stayed for 15 days and then Ethiopia. After staying in Ethiopia for next 14 days, Jitesh was brought back to Dubai and then sent to Netherlands where he staved for one week. From Netherlands Jitesh was brought back to India and after keeping him there in a hotel for nine days, he was sent back to Dubai. He again came back to Delhi from Dubai and then sent to Suriname. From Suriname his fourmonth long journey started by car, bus, on foot and boats, and on January 18 this year he was sent to America through Mexico border where he was caught and deported to India," he claimed. The complex spanning itinerary. multiple countries, underscores the alleged modus operandi of the travel agents who purportedly lured victims with promises of overseas opportunities, only to subject them to a relentless cycle of transfers and eventual deportation. A case has been registered at the Sector-9 police station under the Immigration Act.


### Bhanupalli-Leh rail line project makes steady progress in Mandi dist

#### SEBI restrains Manjholi-based industrial firm from securities markets

Diary Times Desk : The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) restrained Manjholi-based LS Industries, its promoter Profound Finance and four others from the securities markets till further orders. The directions were issued yesterday following allegations of fraudulent activities and stock price manipulation as per its probe. The said firm is located at Bairsen village in Manjholi area of Nalagarh. "They have been restrained from buying, selling or dealing in the shares of LSIL either directly or indirectly until further order" as per the SEBI order issued today. The SEBI noted that the company and its promoter devised a scheme in which ex-director of the company, Suet Meng Chay, first transferred 12.12 per cent holding of the company for just USD1 to JPP, then entities namely Multiplier Share & Stock Advisors Private Limited, Setu Securities Pvt. Ltd., Paresh Dhirajlal Shah and Ruchira Goyal caused the sudden spike.

#### No relief in sight, dry spell continues in Himachal Pradesh for next week



Diary Times Desk : The dry spell is likely to continue in Himachal over the next few days. According to the weather department, the state is unlikely to receive any snowfall or rainfall over the next seven days. There could be some snowfall or rainfall at isolated places in the higher reaches, but overall, the state is likely to experience dry conditions. This forecast will disappoint farmers and horticulturalists who are eagerly waiting for a fresh spell of precipitation. The long dry spell has put apple trees under severe stress, and the majority of apple growers are complaining that plants are drying up in the absence of adequate moisture. Due to the dry spell, the average maximum temperatures at most places are 3 to 5 degrees higher than the normal temperature. At many places in the upper Shimla area, natural water sources have dried up or the water has reduced significantly, due to which people are facing problems in getting drinking water supply. At many places, people are depending on water tankers in the middle of winter.

# SC upholding contract staff rights, govt mulls options to avoid burden


Diary Times Desk : With the Supreme Court upholding the High Court decision on grant of seniority and increments to contract employees, the Himachal government is exploring its options to avoid grant of benefits to the eligible employees at par with regular employees. Anticipating a huge financial liability in case of an adverse court order, it was on December 20, 2024 that Himachal Vidhan Sabha had enacted and passed the Himachal Pradesh Recruitment and Conditions of Service Rules Bill, 2024. The Bill has become an Act with Governor Shiv Pratap Shukla giving assent on February 7 last week the possibility of the employees challenging it again in the apex court cannot be ruled out, resulting in a long drawn legal battle. Now with the Supreme Court upholding the claim of contract employees, the state government is faced with a piquant legal position which is likely to be discussed at the Cabinet meeting to be chaired by Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu on February 13. The cash-strapped government is no position to bear the financial implication of the SC order. The main objective cited by the state government while tabling the Bill in the Assembly was that this is being done in order to avoid a huge burden on the state exchequer and not unsettle the settled position.

# CM for skill development to boost job opportunities

Diary Times Desk : Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu today emphasised the need for skill development to enhance employment and selfemployment opportunities for the youth. Chairing a meeting of the Himachal Pradesh Kaushal Vikas Nigam (HPKVN) here today, he directed the officials to implement training programmes with market demand to improve aligned employability and support small-scale business start-ups. ### England's misery complete as Gill ton makes it 3-0

Diary Times Desk : England's miserable tour came to an end following another lopsided win for the home side as India hammered the visitors in the final ODI in Ahmedabad. India's massive win was headlined by Shubman Gill's seventh ton which came in his 50th ODI appearance for India and there were also contributions from the likes of Shreyas Iver, Virat Kohli and KL Rahul. In reply, England's chase fizzled out around the halfway mark as they lost by a massive margin of 142 runs. With a daunting target of 357 ahead of them, England came out all guns blazing on expected lines. Ben Duckett in particular was severe against India's new ball bowlers as he hit four boundaries against Harshit Rana before finding the fence on four successive occasions against Arshdeep Singh. As a result of this onslaught, England raced to 60/0 in just six overs, setting themselves up for the tall chase. However, things quickly turned when Duckett completely mistimed a knuckleball from Arshdeep to get caught for 34. Tom Banton, getting an opportunity at No.3, started off with a switch-hit six against Washington Sundar but at the other end, another slower delivery from Arshdeep consumed Phil Salt. While England had 84 runs in the first nine overs, the two wickets did cause a dent. Joe Root and Banton consolidated for a brief period with the latter employing the switch hit once again for another six, this time off Axar Patel. However, Kuldeep Yadav managed to send Banton back to the pavilion with a googly.



#### Asalanka ton powers SL to win in Colombo low-scorer

Diary Times Desk : Charith Asalanka (127 off 126 balls) and Maheesh Theekshana (4 for 40) inspired Sri Lanka to a memorable come-from-behind win over Australia, by 49 runs, in the ODI series opener in Colombo. The hosts were down and out at 55/5 in the 15th over but the skipper waged a lone battle, leading from the front with his fourth ODI century that took Sri Lanka to a respectable 214. Asitha Fernando provided a fiery start to their defence, and Theekshana troubled the lower-order to keep the visitors to just 165 in reply. Spencer Johnson struck in the opening over to dismiss the dangerous Pathum Nissanka cheaply after Sri Lanka opted to bat first, and later sent back Kamindu Mendis in his new-ball spell, reducing Sri Lanka to 31/4 in the seventh over. In between was Aaron Hardie, who also struck in his opening over to claim the wicket of the other Sri Lankan opener, and then in his third to curb the boundary-filled start of Kusal Mendis. That soon became 55/5 when Sean Abbott had Janith Liyanage caught by Steve Smith on 11. Asalanka then joined hands with Dunith Wellalage to stabilise the crumbling innings with a 67-run partnership for the sixth wicket, taking their side past the 100-run mark. Against the run of play, an excellent catch in the slips from Smith brought curtains on this partnership.

#### 'I batted well in WTC final but got dropped... Abhi bhi cricket bacha hai mera': Ajinkya Rahane eyes Test return

Diary Times Desk : Ajinkya Rahane has said that he continues to be hungry for a return to Test cricket but for now, his sole focus is on performing as best as he can for Mumbai in the Ranii Trophy. Rahane has hit top form in the last 10 matches, registering three 90-plus scores, one 80-plus knock, and a century in the quarterfinal. "I am batting well now. Mushtaq Ali went very well. I have scored runs in earlier matches. I am happy with my batting," Rahane said following Mumbai's entry into the semifinals of the Ranji Trophy with victory over Haryana. Rahane, who made a surprise return to India's Test squad after two years during the last WTC final against Australia in 2023, was the team's top scorer (89 and 46) in an otherwise disappointing outing for the batters. After scoring 135 runs on a challenging surface, Rahane was picked as the vice-captain for the West Indies but after three low scores, the veteran batter was dropped. Rahane said selection is not in his hands. but he believes he did his best in the WTC final and still has a lot to offer at the Test level. "I batted nicely in the World Test Championship final in 2023 too. After that, I got dropped. Being selected or not selected is another matter, and the job of the selectors.

#### Bumrah ruled out of Champions Trophy; Varun a late inclusion in India squad

Diary Times Desk : In a significant jolt to India's plans for the Champions Trophy, Jasprit Bumrah has been ruled out of the tournament. ESPNcricinfo has learned that Bumrah is yet to completely recover from the discomfort in his back, an injury he picked up during the Sydney Test in January that also ruled him out of the England white-ball series. Yashasvi Jaiswal has also been left out of the provisional squad, and Varun Chakravarthy has been named as his replacement. While Bumrah's latest scans, which he underwent in Bengaluru over the weekend, did not reveal anything severe, he is not entirely ready to return to bowling. There is no confirmation on the timeline of his return. It is likely he will resume running in a couple of weeks and then gradually get back to bowling. His progress will be monitored by the BCCI's medical team in Bengaluru. This is the second ICC tournament Bumrah will miss because of injury, having sat out the 2022 T20 World Cup in Australia owing to a back injury that eventually required surgery.



### Stubborn Kerala deny J&K to enter Ranji semis

Diary Times Desk : A dramatic guarter-final in Pune came to an end as Kerala held fort with the bat to make it through to the Ranii semifinals courtesy of their one-run lead from the first innings. The last day was well poised with Kerala requiring 299 runs while J&K had to pick up eight wickets. Sachin Baby and Akshay Chandran stitched a thirdwicket partnership of 58 runs for almost 43 overs before the latter fell to offspinner Sahil Lotra. He later managed to prise out Kerala skipper Baby who scored 48 off 162 balls, as J&K brought themselves back into the hunt. The second session went J&K's way as they picked up three wickets in the session to leave Kerala at 180 for 6 at one point, when they smelt blood. Apart from Baby, Jalaj Saxena and Aditya Sarwate both fell to Abid Mushtaq. With the prospects of chasing 399 having diminished immensely, hero and centurion from the first innings Salman Nizar batted alongside Mohammed Azharuddeen for over 40 overs in a seventh-wicket partnership of 105 runs. J&K threw everything at Kerala but they remained unfazed and stood their ground.

#### Starc out of Champions Trophy for personal reasons; Smith to lead Australia

Diary Times Desk : Australia's Steve Smith-led squad for the upcoming ICC Men's Champions Trophy will be without Mitchell Starc. The left-arm seamer, who recently featured in both Tests in Galle, has withdrawn from the tournament due to undisclosed personal reasons. Cricket Australia have not provided further details, respecting Starc's request for privacy. With Marcus Stoinis retired and the likes of Pat Cummins, Josh Hazlewood and Mitchell Marsh injured, the selectors have brought Ben Dwarshuis, Jake Fraser-McGurk, Spencer Johnson, Tanveer Sangha and Sean Abbott into the new-looking 15-man squad, with Cooper Connolly as the travelling reserve. "We understand and respect Mitch's decision," George Bailey, chair of men's selectors, said of Starc who will also miss the two ODIs in Sri Lanka. "Mitch is deeply respected for his commitment to international cricket and the priority he places on performing for Australia. "His well documented ability to play through pain and adversity, as well as forgoing opportunities in other parts of his career to put his country first should be applauded. "His loss is of course a blow for the Champions Trophy campaign but does provide an opportunity to someone else.
