PRESIDENT'S RULE

PRESIDENT'S RULE WILL PAVE WAY FOR POLITICAL SETTLEMENT: KUKI-ZO COUNCIL

Diary Times Desk: The Kuki-Zo Council (KZC) in a statement said it has received positively the government's imposition of President's Rule in the violence-hit state, and the move will help pave the way for political settlements and peaceful coexistence.

"We are hopeful it (President's Rule) would pave the way for due political settlements and peaceful coexistence (of Meitei and Kuki-Zo-Hmar tribals) as good neighbours," KZC secretary (information) Khaikhohauh Gangte said.

Referring to comments by BJP's northeast incharge Sambit Patra that Manipur's territorial integrity will not be touched, the KZC in a statement said, "Patra may be unaware or has chosen not to be aware that Meitei physically violated Manipur's territorial integrity on May 3, 2023, when they massacred, attacked church buildings, destroyed the homes, and forcefully displaced the Kuki-Zo people from the Imphal valley."

The KZC alleged the government led by former chief minister N Biren Singh carried out "ethnic cleansing", which led to the separation of Kuki–Zo tribes and the valley–dominant Meiteis demographically and physically.

"Kuki-Zo are not separatists, Meiteis have separated Kuki-Zo from Manipur. More than 250 Kuki-Zo people have died in this ethnic conflict, over 7,000 Kuki-Zo homes have been destroyed, more than 360 places of worship have been set on fire or destroyed, and more than 40,000 Kuki-Zo people have become homeless," the KZC said in the statement. Mr Patra in Imphal on Friday said the 60-member state assembly was put under suspended animation, meaning the assembly can be revived whenever the President deems it fit. "The BJP government is committed to continuing peace efforts in the state and to maintain the territorial integrity of Manipur. There would be no compromise on the territorial integrity of the state. Illegal infiltration into Manipur would not be allowed in any circumstances and such attempts would be dealt with severely," Mr Patra had told reporters. Speculation is that the BJP is trying to choose a leader who will be acceptable among all communities - Kuki-Zo-Hmar, Naga tribes, and the non-tribal Meiteis. The Kuki tribes and the Meiteis have been fighting since May 2023 over a range of issues such as land rights.



INDIAN IMMIGRANTS

US PLANE CARRYING 2ND BATCH OF 119 INDIAN IMMIGRANTS LANDS IN AMRITSAR



Diary Times Desk: A plane carrying 119 Indians arrived from the United States at Punjab's Amritsar airport on Saturday, the second such arrival in a span of 10 days, as part of the Donald Trump administration's crackdown and decision to deport illegal immigrants. The first round of deportation had taken place on February 5, when a US military plane transported 104 Indians to Amritsar. A third plane with 157 deportees is expected to land in India on Sunday. The C-17 Globemaster aircraft of the US Air Force landed at the Amritsar International Airport close to 11:40 pm on Saturday.

Of the total deportees, 67 are from Punjab, 33 are from Haryana, eight from Gujarat, three from Uttar Pradesh, two each from Goa, Maharashtra and Rajasthan, and one each from Himachal Pradesh and Jammu & Kashmir. Earlier, those deported were from Haryana (33), Gujarat (33), Punjab (30), Maharashtra (3) Uttar Pradesh (3), and Chandigarh (2). They were sent back on the same military aircraft that took off from San Antonio, Texas.

The deportees were shackled and restrained throughout the flight, only to be freed upon arrival in India - a move that triggered a political storm in India, and led to an uproar in both Houses of Parliament during the then ongoing Budget session.

Amid criticism, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said the Centre is engaging with the US to ensure the deportees are not mistreated. He also said the US' deportation of illegal migrants is not a new development and has been going on for years.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who was on a trip to the US on Thursday, said India will take back any of its citizens living illegally in the US. He, however, emphasised that efforts need to be made to end human trafficking. "Our bigger fight is against that entire ecosystem, and we are confident that President Trump will fully cooperate with India in finishing this ecosystem," he said.

In its defense, the US Embassy in India said "enforcing our nation's immigration laws is critically important to the national security and public safety of the United States". "It is the policy of the United States to faithfully execute the immigration laws against all inadmissible and removable aliens," an embassy spokesperson said.

ALLAHBADIA'S PHONE SWITCHED OFF: RAINA GETS TIME TILL MARCH 10 TO RECORD STATEMENT

Diary Times Desk: Mumbai police are unable to trace podcaster Ranveer Allahbadia as his phone remains switched off, while they have given comedian Samay Raina time till March 10 to appear before them in a probe into the former's controversial remarks on his YouTube show, an official said on Saturday. Allahbadia's crass remarks about parents and sex on Raina's nowdeleted YouTube show 'India's Got Latent' have sparked massive outrage, leading to complaints from several persons. The official said the Khar police have been unable to contact Allahbadia, popular on YouTube for his 'BeerBiceps' channel, as his phone is switched off. He said Raina's lawyer met senior police officials seeking more time, citing that his client was in the US. On the lawyer's request, the police have given him time till March 10 to appear before them to record a statement. Allahbadia had earlier requested the Khar police to record his statement at his residence, but his request was turned down.




STAMPEDE-LIKE SITUATION AT **NEW DELHI RAILWAY STATION.** FIRE TENDERS RUSHED TO SPOT



Diary Times Desk: A stampede-like situation broke out at the New Delhi railway station late on Saturday evening, triggering a chaos on platform number 14 and 15, a Delhi Fire Services (DFS) official said. Sources said three women were rushed to a nearby hospital for treatment. The incident occurred around 9:55 pm, prompting an emergency response. Authorities immediately dispatched rescue teams and four fire tenders were rushed to the site to assist in the relief efforts, DFS chief Atul Gara said. The exact cause of the stampede remains unclear, but initial reports suggest overcrowding due to train services for the Maha Kumbh in Uttar Pradesh's Prayagraj.

POLICE ARREST NEW INDIA COOPERATIVE BANK'S **GENERAL MANAGER IN RS 122 CRORE 'FRAUD'**



Diary Times Desk: The Mumbai police on Saturday arrested Hitesh Mehta, General Manager and Head of Accounts of the New India Cooperative Bank. for alleaedly misappropriating Rs 122 crore from the bank, officials said. Mehta was placed under arrest by the Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of the city police after being questioned for more than three hours, an official said. He was called to record his statement before the probe agency at its south Mumbai office in connection with the case registered against him and others, he said. Mehta will be produced before a local court on Sunday, the police official added. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on Friday superseded the cooperative bank's board for a year and appointed an administrator to manage its affairs. A day prior to that, it imposed several restrictions on the lender, including on withdrawal of funds by depositors, citing supervisory concerns emanating from the recent material developments in the bank, and to protect the interest of its depositors.

MAHARASHTRA FORMS 7-MEMBER PANEL FOR LAW ON FORCED CONVERSIONS, 'LOVE JIHAD'

Diary Times Desk: The Maharashtra Government has set up a seven-member committee headed by the state director general of police (DGP) to study the legal aspects for a new law against forced conversions and cases of 'love jihad". The committee includes secretaries of the women and child welfare, minority affairs, law and judiciary, social justice and special assistance departments, and deputy secretaries of the home department. As per a Government Resolution (GR) issued late on Friday, the committee will study the prevailing situation in the state and suggest steps to tackle the complaints of "love jihad" and forced conversions. The committee will also look at legal aspects and the laws framed in other states. Accordingly, it will recommend legislation to prevent forced conversions and instances of "love jihad". Love jihad is a term used by right-wing activists and outfits to allege a conspiracy by Muslim men to convert Hindu women to Islam through marriage.

Himachal: 25 industries will invest Rs 883 crore in the state, 2,830 will get employment

The Authority has given permission to M/s Bauji, a capsule and tablet manufacturer, Jaipali Infra, a PUF panel manufacturer, Rich Printers, a corrugated box manufacturer, Ridgelins Health Care Company, a tablet-capsule manufacturer, in Solan, M/s Shri Kaumudi Textiles, a IMFL and country liquor manufacturer, in Kangra, M/s Efficient Crop Control, a textile fabric towel manufacturer, in Solan, M/s SA Consultancy and Projects, a zinc powder manufacturer, to set up and expand their industries in Solan.

HP Cabinet Decisions: CM Sukhu will present the budget on March 17, approval to release the recruitment result of 699 posts

Diary Times Desk: The Himachal Pradesh Cabinet meeting was held on Saturday under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu at the State Secretariat Shimla. Many major decisions have been taken in the meeting. In the state cabinet meeting, it was decided to recommend the Governor to hold the budget session of the Himachal Pradesh Legislative Assembly from 10 to 28 March 2025. Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu will present the budget of Himachal on March 17. There will be 15 meetings in the budget session. The Governor's address will be on March 10. After that it will be discussed. The CM will respond to the discussion on March 13. Ministers Harshvardhan Chauhan and Anirudh Singh gave information about the decisions of the cabinet. The cabinet approved the declaration of pending results of 699 posts of six post codes. These include Market Supervisor Post Code-977, Fireman Post Code-916, Drawing Master Post Code-980, Clerk Himachal Pradesh Secretariat Post Code-962, Lineman Post Code-971 and Steno Typist Post Code-928.

E-waste cannot be dumped here and there, registered organizations will place bids; new rules implemented

Diary Times Desk: E-waste cannot be dumped here and there in Himachal Pradesh. Only the institutions registered with the Pollution Control Board will bid for this. The new rule has been implemented to get rid of the increasing e-waste and problems related to its disposal in Himachal Pradesh. E-waste generated by all government departments, boards, corporations and commissions will be disposed of according to Rule-9 of the 'E-Rules-2016'. Management information was given by a spokesperson of the Central Government's Department of Environment, Science Technology and Climate Change on Friday. Under the new rule, it has been decided to deliver e-waste to authorized dismantlers or recyclers only through authorized collection centers, manufacturers' dealers, dismantlers, recyclers or take-back service providers nominated.

Himachal Pradesh: Preparations are being made to make electricity cheaper for industries in Himachal Pradesh, industrialists are angry

Diary Times Desk: Preparations are on to make the electricity being supplied to industries cheaper in Himachal. Work has begun on the proposal to give subsidy up to 50 paise per unit. Golden Sword, Crowns Among J Jayalalithaa's Seized Assets Given To Tamil Nadu

Diary Times Desk: Nearly 27 kg of gold ornaments, including at least two golden crowns and a gold sword, were some of the items belonging to former chief minister and AIADMK chief J Jayalalithaa that were handed over to Tamil Nadu government by a special court in Karnataka as part of a process that began on Friday. The items were seized in connection with disproportionate case against the former Tamil Nadu chief minister. who died in 2016, and had been lying in the Karnataka state treasury for nearly 21 years. Some of the other articles in the treasure trove are 481 items made of gold - including a golden ornament shaped like what appears to be the former chief minister's profile - documents of over 1,520 acres of land and some Visuals showed officials carrying out bags, suitcases and trunks full of the items. The disproportionate assets case against Jayalalithaa, which lasted about 18 years, was transferred to Bengaluru from Chennai. She and three other accused, including her close associate VK Sasikala and Ms Sasikala's relatives VN Sudhakaran and J llavarasi, were convicted by a special court in Bengaluru in 2014.

Policeman among 3 govt employees sacked by J&K LG for terror links

Diary Times Desk: Jammu and Kashmir lieutenant governor Manoj Sinha on Saturday sacked three government employees, including a police constable, for their terror links. With this, the services of 69 J&K government employees have been terminated since the abrogation of Article 370 in August 2019. The employees whose services were terminated on Saturday were identified as constable Firdous Ahmed Bhat, government teacher Mohmad Ashraf Bhat and Nisar Ahmed Khan, an orderly in the J&K forest department. On November 30 last year, Sinha had terminated the services of two government officials for their alleged involvement in antinational activities and terror links. This is the second such termination since chief minister Omar Abdullah took charge in October last year. The fresh terminations on the orders of the lieutenant governor may raise questions over Abdullah's authority in the government. Constable Firdous Ahmed Bhat was engaged as an SPO in 2005 and became constable in 2011. He was arrested in May 2024 and is facing terror charges and currently lodged in Kot Bhalwal Jail.

'Is this the gift Modi ji is bringing back': Punjab CM Bhagwant Mann on Indians deported from US



Diary Times Desk: Ahead of a US military aircraft arriving in Amritsar tonight with 119 deported Indians, Punjab chief minister Bhagwant Mann accused the BJP government of targeting the state over its electoral loss while failing to address its concerns. He said Prime Minister Narendra Modi should explain why he remained silent on his own citizens in front of his friend Donald Trump. "The BJP should not defame Punjab or Punjabis, nor should it take out its anger on the people just because they did not vote for the party. This country is a democracy, and good work should be done here. Are such actions considered good? How will they (BJP) face the people in 2027? Will they say that they sent deported Indians to Punjab?" questioned Mann while talking to reporters. He said it was happening at a time when Modi was embracing the same Trump under whose watch Indians were being deported on a US military aircraft. "Is this the gift Modi ji is bringing back?" he asked.

26/11 Accused Tahawwur Rana's Extradition To India May Be Delayed: Sources

Diary Times Desk: The extradition of 26/11 Mumbai attacks accused Tahawwur announced by US President Donald Trump during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to the country earlier this week, is likely to be delayed, sources have told NDTV. The sources said Rana has filed a final appeal on humanitarian grounds after the US Supreme Court rejected his review petition, paving the way for his extradition, which may push back his arrival in India by a few weeks. Rana, a Canadian national of Pakistani origin, had earlier worked as a doctor for the Pakistan army and a federal jury had convicted him in 2011 of providing material support to Lashkar-e-Taiba, the terrorist organisation behind the 2008 attacks. Several places in Mumbai, including the Chhatrapati Shivaji Terminus and the iconic Tai Mahal Hotel. were attacked and 166 people were killed, including 20 personnel from the police.

BJP Sweeps All 10 Mayor Posts In Urban Bodies Election In Chhattisgarh

Diary Times Desk: After its resounding victories in assembly and Lok Sabha elections in Chhattisgarh, the BJP on Saturday won elections to a majority of civic bodies in the state, riding high on welfare schemes and fulfilled promises. The saffron party won all ten mayor posts in the state, poll officials said. The performance of the main opposition Congress was lacklustre, but it managed to win the post of chairman in the Kunkuri Nagar Panchayat in Jashpur district, in the assembly constituency of Chief Minister Vishnu Deo Sai. Elections to 173 urban bodies including 10 municipal corporations, 49 municipal councils and 114 Nagar Panchayats were held on February 11 with a 72.48 per cent turnout. Counting of votes was held on Saturday. As per the results, the BJP won mayoral posts in all 10 municipal corporations, captured by Congress in the last elections held in 2019-2020. Of the chairperson posts in 49 municipal councils, BJP won 35, Congress eight, Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) one.

Goa Ex MLA Dies Shortly After Fight In Karnataka, Auto Driver Arrested

Diary Times Desk: Former Goa MLA Lavoo Mamledar died, shortly after he had an altercation with an auto driver, in Karnataka's Belagavi district on Saturday. The reason behind the death of the Maharashtrawadi Gomantak Party legislator could not be immediately ascertained but police said the driver has been arrested. Sources said the altercation between Mamledar and the driver took place after the former's vehicle reportedly bumped into the auto near Srinivas Lodge at around 1.40pm. Visuals of the incident captured on CCTV showed Mamledar and the driver locked in a severe argument. The argument takes a violent turn when Mamledar slaps the driver. The driver slaps Mamledar in return. The people around the two intervene and try to push the driver away but he again slaps Mamledar. The driver then goes on to assault the former legislator. As more people step in to defuse the situation, Mamledar goes inside the lodge.

Actor Raghu Ram's Confession During Probe Into 'India's Got Latent' Row

Diary Times Desk: Actor Raghu Ram has appeared before the Maharashtra Cyber Department amid a probe into podcaster Ranveer Allahbadia's controversial remarks on a YouTube show hosted by comedian Samay Raina. Mr Allahbadia, widely known by his online moniker "BeerBiceps", sparked massive outrage this week with his remarks about parents and sex during an episode of the now-deleted show 'India's Got Latent', which also featured content creators like Ashish Chanchlani, Jaspreet Singh and Apoorva Mukhija, who goes by the name "The Rebel Kid" on Instagram. "Would you rather watch your parents have sex every day for the rest of your life or join in once and stop it forever?" Mr Allahbadia had asked a contestant. After the backlash, he offered an apology and blamed a lapse in judgement. Mr Ram, who was on the judges panel in one of the episodes, allegedly told the cyber cell on Thursday that Mr Raina should have edited the abusive language used in the show, sources said. He also confessed that he regretted using abusive language in the show.



'Free speech in retreat': JD Vance sparks diplomatic storm at Munich Security Conference

Diary Times Desk: US Vice President JD Vance ignited controversy at the Munich Security Conference on February 14, 2025, by sharply governments criticising European suppressing free speech, mismanaging migration, and disregarding voter concerns. Vance said that he fears free speech is "in retreat" across the continent. "To many of us on the other side of the Atlantic, it looks more and more like old entrenched interests hiding ugly Soviet-era words misinformation and disinformation, who simply don't like the idea that somebody with an alternative viewpoint might express a different opinion or, God forbid, vote a different way, or even worse, win an election," Vance said. His remarks have drawn strong reactions from European officials, US lawmakers, and the global media. German Defense Minister Boris Pistorius rejected Vance's assertion that Europe was curbing free speech and compared his remarks to attacks from authoritarian regimes. "If I understood him correctly, he is comparing conditions in parts of Europe with those in authoritarian regimes. This is not acceptable," Reuters reported.

Elon Musk's DOGE Barred From Treasury, Access To Health Allowed

Diary Times Desk: A federal judge extended a block on Elon Musk's government cost-cutting team from accessing payment systems at the US Treasury Department on Friday, while another judge allowed the billionaire's DOGE staffers to access records at health, labor and consumer financial protection agencies. Musk's so-called Department of Government Efficiency has swept through federal agencies since Republican Donald Trump became president last month and put the chief executive of carmaker Tesla in charge of rooting out wasteful spending as part of Trump's dramatic overhaul of government, which included thousands of job cuts on Friday. In Manhattan, US District Judge Jeannette Vargas extended a temporary block on DOGE that was put in place on Saturday, which prevented Musk's team from accessing Treasury systems responsible for trillions.

"Obama Is Queer, Married To A Man": Elon Musk's Father's Bizarre Claim

He also alleged that her husband and former US President Barack Obama is "queer". Errol has been known for making ridiculous claims online. "We realised Obama is a queer who is married to a man who dresses as a woman. We all learned that. It's not common knowledge," he said during an interview with Joshua Rubin on 'Wide Awake Podcast'. Conservative Influencer Claims She Gave Birth To Elon Musk's 13th Child

In a post on X (formerly Twitter), St Clair announced that Musk is the father of her five-month-old baby. "Five months ago, I welcomed a new baby into the world. Elon Musk is the father," she wrote, captioning her post with the Latin phrase "Alea lacta est" (The die is cast). St Clair explained that she had chosen to keep the information private for her child's safety, but decided to speak out after realising that tabloid reports were imminent. She said, "I have not previously disclosed this to protect our child's privacy and safety, but in recent days it has become clear that tabloid media intends to do so, regardless of the harm it will cause. I intend to allow our child to grow in a normal and safe environment. For that reason, I ask that the media honor our child's privacy.

US Army officially pauses recruitment of transgenders individuals in military

Diary Times Desk: The United States Army has officially announced that they will no longer allow transgender individuals to join the military, after President Donald Trump signed an executive order banning "transgender ideology" and "invented pronouns" in the troops as part of his first set of sweeping actions after return to the White House. In a post on social media platform X, the US Army stated, "The US Army will no longer allow transgender individuals to join the military and will stop performing or facilitating procedures associated with gender transition for service members." The Army added that while people with gender dysphoria would be treated with dignity and respect for volunteering to serve America, genderaffirming care would be paused indefinitely. "Effective immediately, all new accessions for individuals with a history of gender dysphoria are paused, and all unscheduled, scheduled, or planned medical procedures associated with affirming or facilitating a gender transition for Service members are paused," the post said.



Trump keeps tariffs drumbeat going, with autos targeted next

Diary Times Desk: President Donald Trump on Friday kept alive his drumbeat of tariff threats, saying levies on automobiles would be coming as soon as April 2, the day after members of his cabinet are due to deliver reports to him outlining options for a range of import duties as he seeks to reshape global trade. Maybe around April 2," Trump said in response to a question about when auto tariffs might be coming, during an executive-order signing session in the Oval Office. "I would have done them on April 1... But we're going to do it on April 2." It was the latest in a litany of trade actions Trump has unveiled since taking office for the second time on January 20. Since his inauguration, he has imposed a 10% tariff on all imports from China, on top of existing levies; announced and then delayed for a month 25% tariffs on goods from Mexico and non-energy imports from Canada; set a March 12 start date for 25% tariffs on all imported steel and aluminum; and on Thursday directed his economics team to devise plans for reciprocal tariffs on every country that taxes U.S. imports.

Donald Trump admin fires nuclear staff not realising they oversee US weapons stockpile: Report

Diary Times Desk: US President Donald Trump's administration has fired more than 300 officials at the Nuclear Security Administration as part of wider layoffs in the Energy Department of the country, CNN reported, citing four people with the knowledge of the matter. The report claims that the Trump administration's officials likely did not know that the employees they are firing oversee the country's nuclear weapons. Hours later, however, the agency began withdrawing terminations employees. An Energy Department spokesperson claimed that the number of persons "dismissed" was "less than 50 people". spokesperson added that the fired "held primarily employees administrative and clerical roles". Some of the fired employees included NNSA staff, who are on the ground at facilities where nuclear weapons are built. These staff oversee the contractors who build nuclear weapons, and they inspect these weapons. The list of fired employees also included those who draft requirements and guidelines for contractors who build nuclear weapons.

Don't turn holy city of Amritsar into deportation centre: Punjab CM Mann

Diary Times Desk: Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Saturday kept up his attack on the Centre over the landing of US planes carrying illegal Indian immigrants at Amritsar airport and asked it not to make the holy city a "deportation centre". A second US flight carrying 119 illegal Indian immigrants is slated to land in Amritsar on Saturday night. On February 5, a US military aircraft carrying 104 illegal Indian deportees landed at the Amritsar airport. The Chief Minister visited the airport on Saturday and said his government has made arrangements to take the residents of Punjab from among the second batch of deportees to their hometowns. The deportees who hail from other states will head to Delhi from Amritsar in a flight on Sunday morning and then they will be taken to their respective places, Mann said. According to official sources, the second deportation flight from the US is expected to land at Amritsar airport around 10 pm on Saturday. Talking to reporters at the airport, Mann continued his attack on the Centre and said, "Do not make our holy city (Amritsar) a deportation centre." There are many airbases in the country and the flight can be landed at any one of them, the Punjab Chief Minister said.



Cancer day care centres to be set up in 200 districts this year: Nadda

Diary Times Desk: Union Health Minister JP Nadda has announced that cancer day care centres would be established in 200 districts across the nation this year. "Within three years, the government plans to make this facility available in every district," he said. He emphasised that providing world-class medical care to all Indians was a top priority for the government. The Union Minister made these remarks while addressing a gathering at a national seminar on cancer, held at the National Cancer Institute (NCI), in Badhsa village on Saturday. He was welcomed by BJP national secretary and former Haryana Minister Om Prakash Dhankar. During his speech, Nadda highlighted the BJP government's efforts to provide cutting-edge cancer treatments. "In the past, families had to sell houses and lands to afford cancer treatment. Now, with the Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Ayushman Bharat Yojana and affordable cancer medications, all cancer patients have easy access to the treatment they need," he said.

Haryana MBBS exam scam: Probe panel examined 228 answer sheets

: A three-member Digry Times Desk committee, led by Dr MK Garg, Director of Kalpana Chawla Medical College in Karnal, has confirmed the existence of a scam in the annual and supplementary examinations following its inquiry. The committee's findings were presented in a report submitted to the authorities at Pt BD Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak, (UHSR) on Thursday. The committee arrived at its conclusion after examining 228 answer sheets from MBBS students enrolled at a private college, claimed the sources. The inquiry committee was formed by UHSR Vice-Chancellor Dr HK Aggarwal last month on a complaint filed by an MBBS student. He also tasked the committee to submit its report within a month. "The serial number of the answer sheets checked by the examiner, which were available with the university, differ from the serial numbers recorded.

Simran Preet Panesar, wanted in Canada's largest gold heist, found living quietly around Chandigarh

Diary Times Desk: Simran Preet Panesar--Indian-origin former Air Canada manager--wanted in connection with Canada's largest gold and cash heist worth CAD 22.5 million, has been found living in outskirts of Chandigarh. On April 17, 2023, an air cargo container carrying more than 22 million Canadian dollars' worth of gold bars and foreign currency was stolen from a secure storage facility using fake paperwork. The gold and currency had arrived on an Air Canada flight from Zurich, Switzerland, to Pearson International Airport in Toronto. Shortly after the flight's landing, the cargo was offloaded and transported to a separate location on airport property. It was reported missing to the police a day later. Police had arrested six people involved in the theft. The arrested included Indian-origin men Archit Grover, Parmpal Sidhu and Amit Jalota, Ammad Chaudhary, Ali Raza, and Prasath Paramalingam. Canada-wide warrants were issued for Simran Preet Panesar from Brampton and Arsalan Chaudhary from Mississauga.

Tewari demands point of call status for Chandigarh airport

Diary Times Desk: For the convenience of international travellers from neighbouring states, a point of call (PoC) status has been sought for the Shaheed-e-Azam Bhagat Singh Chandigarh International Airport situated in Mohali for international airlines to facilitate flights to and from here. In a letter to Union Civil Aviation Minister. Kinjarapu Rammohan Naidu, Chandigarh MP Manish Tewari stated that a large number of people travel internationally from Punjab, Haryana and Himachal Pradesh both for the purpose of work as well as tourism. "Unfortunately, the airport has not been designated as a point of call for international airlines and therefore is not on the 'Bilateral Offer List', which is a prerequisite for foreign airlines to be able to fly in-and-out for the Chandigarh airport," he said. The MP said he would be extremely grateful if the airport was added as a PoC to the list of 18 airports in India in addition to Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata and Chennai, which are designated as PoC and therefore on the 'Bilateral Offer List' for foreign airlines, to be able to fly to these airports. "This cannot happen till the time it does not become the 23rd airport to be put on 'Bilateral Offer List'," said Tewari. Chandigarh MP Manish Tewari and city Congress president HS Lucky have urged UT Administrator Gulab Chand Kataria to take a compassionate approach toward the regularisation of structures situated outside the lal dora limits.

HC raps state for 'dilly-dallying' on illegal construction in Gurugram

Diary Times Desk: Rapping Haryana for "casual approach" and dillydallying action against unauthorised constructions, the Punjab and Haryana High Court has asserted that haphazard and unplanned development will lead to total collapse of infrastructure Gurugram. The assertion by the Bench of Justice Sureshwar Thakur and Justice Vikas Suri came on petitions filed by the DLF City Residents Welfare Association and other petitioners, alleging illegal constructions in and around Gurugram, especially in DLF Phase I to V. The Bench also directed the authorities to take prompt action against unauthorised constructions in DLF Phases I-V and conclude proceedings within two months. The direction came as DLF Ltd. clarified that illegal construction, if any, was carried out by individual allottees. The Bench observed that the photographs enclosed demonstrated blatant transgression of the population/ density norms prescribed by the State, in addition to the terms and conditions of the layout/ building plans, approvals, other bylaws and statutory provisions.

Student jumps from 8th floor of Ashoka University hostel, dies



Diary Times Desk : A 20-year-old student reportedly died jumping from the 8th floor of the Ashoka University hostel on Friday night, officials said. There is complete uncertainty whether Pratibha will be allowed to continue or the party will get a new president. Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu, who remained an arch rival of Virbhadra, would like to get his own man installed as the party president but eventually it is the high command which will have the final say.

Former HP CM's foundation plaque found discarded, probe demanded

Diary Times Desk: The foundation plaque of former Chief Minister Virbhadra Singh was found discarded under a tree near the Block Development Office on Friday evening. The incident has unfolded in the in the home district of CM Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu. Amid mounting political pressure, Chairman of the Workers' Welfare Board, Naradev Kanwar, has called for an investigation into the matter. The plague, laid in 1996 when Virbhadra Singh was the chief minister, was reportedly removed from its original location. Thakur has questioned how and why the plaque was removed and stressed the need for an investigation to determine its exact placement and the circumstances under which it was relocated. The issue has created Hamirpur a center of a political tussle. Leader of Opposition Jairam Thakur swiftly condemned the act, terming it a disgraceful departure from Himachal's political traditions. Accusing the Sukhu-led government of disregarding the legacy of one of the state's tallest leaders.

Work under way to check landslides on the Parwanoo-Solan-Kaithlighat section of the national highway

Diary Times Desk: Commuters will be able to enjoy an unhindered drive on the Parwanoo-Solan-Kaithlighat section of the National Highway (NH)-105 as landslides would be sizeably reduced with the slope protection work under way on this stretch. Connecting the state capital of Shimla to Chandigarh, Delhi and other neighbouring states, this highway serves as a significant route for the region. Work to contain the erosion of vulnerable hilly slopes initially began on the Parwanoo-Solan section of the NH-5 in September 2024. It will cover 42 sites like Chakki Mor, Datiyar, tunnel near the Barog bypass, Sanawara. It has now been extended to the subsequent stretch of this highway where the four-laning work was at an advanced stage. "The slope protection work has recently begun on the 22.91-km Solan-Kaithlighat section where 28 locations have been identified for the job. Dehradun-based Bharat Construction (India) Private Limited has been entrusted the task at a cost of about Rs 100 crore," said Anand.

Chief Minister Sukhu approves 25 industrial project proposals worth Rs 883 crore

India Outplayed By Spain In Men's Pro League Hockey Campaign Opener

While RCB recently appointed Rajat Patidar as their captain, KKR are yet to announce the successor to Shreyas Iyer, who led them to the title in 2024. RCB had finished fourth in the league last year, following a streak of six defeats with six wins to make it to the playoffs where they lost the Eliminator. KKR have been dominant against RCB in Kolkata, winning eight of their 12 matches at Eden Gardens.
