MAHA KUMBH 2025 ENDS WITH 66 CRORE ATTENDEES, STAMPEDES, VIRAL STARS LIKE MONALISA

Diary Times Desk: As the Maha Kumbh 2025 in Uttar Pradesh's Prayagraj concluded on Wednesday, February 26, with the final holy dip on Mahashivratri, the world's largest spiritual gathering is leaving behind more than just numbers – some faces like 'Monalisa' and IIT 'Baba' amid the overwhelming crowd of over 66 crore that made hit headlines and some tragic moments like stampedes.

At the Kumbh fairs, devotees from different Hindu sects, or 'Akharas', take part in grand processions to perform the 'Shahi Snan' or royal bath in the sacred rivers at the above-mentioned sites. The spectacle draws millions, not just for the ritual, but also for a chance to see thousands of ascetics, often dressed in saffron, who immerse themselves in the frigid waters. The Maha Kumbh 2025 Mela in Prayagraj commenced on January 13 and since then over 66 crore people have taken a dip at the Sangam, the confluence of rivers Ganga, Yamuna, Saraswati, according to the Uttar Pradesh government. The final figure of attendees is expected to be released by the UP government later.

While a record-breaking 66 crore visitors attended the Maha Kumbh, individuals like garland seller 'Monalisa' who became an internet sensation for her striking appearance and the stampedes at the mela site and New Delhi Railway Station (NDLS) that killed over 45 people made the grand fair a whirlwind of devotion, drama, viral moments and unexpected events. – Monalisa, IIT Baba | Kumbh's viral faces: Monalisa 'Moni' Bhosle, a 16-year-old garland seller from Madhya Pradesh, became an overnight sensation after videos of her, highlighting her striking appearance and eyes, were shared online. Her sudden fame led to crowds chasing her for selfies, sparking both admiration and concern for her safety on social media. While some celebrated her rise, others debated the authenticity of rumours claiming she earned ₹10 crore in 10 days, which she later denied. The girl also bagged a film.

"I APOLOGISE FOR BEING UNABLE TO SPEAK TAMIL": AMIT SHAH AMID LANGUAGE ROW



Diary Times Desk: Amid the row over the alleged imposition of Hindi in Tamil Nadu, Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Wednesday "apologised" for not being able to speak the "world's oldest language." Addressing the special Maha Shivratri celebrations being held at Isha Foundation in Coimbatore, Mr Shah called the event 'Bhakti ka Mahakumbh' (Maha Kumbh of devotion).

"First of all, I would like to apologise for being unable to speak the world's oldest language, Tamil. I extend my wishes on the occasion of Maha Shivratri. I am very grateful that I got the opportunity to come here at the invitation of Sadhguru," Mr Shah said. The ruling DMK in Tamil Nadu has been opposing the three-language mandate of the National Education Policy 2020. The DMK has termed this Hindi "imposition."

Mr Shah said that the entire nation was immersed in Shiv bhakti as Maha Shivratri is not only a festival but an occasion of "self-awakening". "Today, the whole nation, from Somnath to Kedarnath, Pashupatinath to Rameswaram and Kashi to Coimbatore, is 'Shivmay'. The Mahakumbh in Prayagraj is concluding, but the 'Bhakti ka Mahakumbh' is here in front of me in Coimbatore. Maha Shivratri is not only a festival but an occasion of self-awakening," the Union Home Minister said.

Praising Isha Foundation founder Sadhguru Jaggi Vasudev, Mr Shah said that the place built by the spiritual leader was not merely a pilgrimage site but also a place of devotion and liberation. He added that the 112-foot Adiyogi Shiva statue helps one experience the 112 ways of achieving spirituality.

"The place that you (Sadguru) have built is not only a pilgrimage site but a place of yoga, sadhana, devotion, repentance and liberation. Isha Yoga Centre has brought positivity to a lot of lives through yoga. This statue of Adiyogi makes us experience and identify the 112 ways to our spiritual journey. On visiting here, we get to know that the last destination of life is to attain 'Shivatva'. Isha Yoga Centre has become a medium for connecting youth with the almighty," Mr Shah said. Earlier, the minister also made offerings to the 'Dhyanling' during the religious ceremony at Isha Yoga Centre. The Maha Shivratri celebrations at the Isha Yoga Centre started at 6:00 PM on Wednesday and will continue until 6:00 AM on Thursday.

LAKHS OF DEVOTEES RUSH TO SANGAM FOR MAHA KUMBH'S FINAL 'SNAN' ON MAHA SHIVRATRI

Diary Times Desk: Amid chants of 'Har Har Mahadev', a multitude of pilgrims from across the country on Wednesday took a holy dip at the Triveni Sangam on Mahashivratri as the 45-day Maha Kumbh inched towards its closure. Maha Kumbh began on January 13 (Paush Purnima) and saw a grand processions of Naga Sadhus and three Amrit Snans. As per official figures, over 65 crore devotees have so far visited this year's Kumbh in Prayagraj. According to government data, by 2 am on Wednesday, over 11.66 lakh devotees immersed themselves in Sangam on Mahashivratri, which marks the last day of the Kumbh. The number surged to 25.64 lakh in the next two hours and 41.11 lakh by 6 am. By 10 am, 81.09 lakh people had taken the final 'snan' at the Sangam, the confluence of the Ganga, Yamuna and the mythical Saraswati rivers. Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath began monitoring the arrangements at the Kumbh Mela at 4 am from Gorakhpur with senior government officials. In a post on X, the CM said, "Hearty congratulations to all the revered saints, Kalpvasis and devotees who have come to take a holy dip in the Triveni Sangam today on the holy bathing festival of Mahashivratri dedicated to the worship of Lord Bholenath in Maha Kumbh-2025, Prayagraj.....Har Har Mahadev!"



ARMY PROCURES RS 80.43 CR-WORTH EQUIPMENT FOR ENHANCING DEFENSIVE CAPABILITY

Diary Times Desk: The Indian Army on Wednesday signed a contract worth Rs 80.43 crore for the procurement of 223 Automatic Chemical Agent Detection and Alarm (ACADA) Systems from the private industry. The induction of ACADA in the field units will substantially enhance Indian Army's defensive Chemical, Biological, Radiological and Nuclear (CBRN) capability for operations, as also for peacetime deployment, especially for responding to disaster relief situations related to industrial accidents. More than 80 per cent of the components and sub-systems of the equipment, being manufactured by Larsen and Toubro Limited, are sourced locally, a Defence spokesperson said. ACADA has been designed and developed by DRDO's Defence Research and Development Establishment, Gwalior, and marks a significant milestone in the nation's indigenisation initiative in the niche CBRN domain.

NAVY MISSILE THAT CAN CHANGE OR SELECT TARGETS WHILE IN FLIGHT SUCCESSFULLY TESTED



Diary Times Desk: A first-of-its-kind Naval Anti-Ship missile (NASM-SR) that has the capability of changing or selecting its target in flight, was successfully tested by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and the Indian Navy from a Seaking helicopter at the Integrated Test Range at Chandipur on Wednesday. The trials have proven the missile's 'man-in-the-loop' feature, that enables the missile's pilot to send it commands while in flight, and scored a direct hit on a small ship in the sea-skimming mode at its maximum range. The missile uses an indigenous imaging infra-red seeker for terminal guidance. The mission also has demonstrated the high bandwidth two-way data link system, which is used to transmit the seeker live images back to the pilot for in-flight re-targeting, a defence spokesperson said. The missile was launched in bearing-only lock-on after launch' mode with several targets in close vicinity for selecting one among them. The missile initially locked on to a large target within the specified zone of search and during the terminal phase, the pilot selected a smaller hidden target resulting in its being hit with pinpoint accuracy.

TUNNEL COLLAPSE: SNIFFER DOG TO BE USED TO LOCATE TRAPPED MEN AS MUCK SOLIDIFYING

Diary Times Desk: As sludge started solidifying inside the Srisailam Left Bank Canal tunnel in Telangana, part of which collapsed trapping eight people, rescuers are planning to use sniffer dogs to locate those got trapped, District Collector B Santhosh said on Wednesday. The official said the National Geophysical Research Institute (NGRI) is expected to give their point of view on Wednesday on the stabilisation of soil and other issues, based on which the action plan would be drafted. Santhosh said the teams were able to reach up to the accident spot inside the tunnel using a thermal fishing boat. "Initially there was a hurdle of 40 metres (from the accident spot). The sludge was there. But that has solidified now to the maximum extent. So the team could go up to the accident spot...So we have a sniffer dog. We will take it. So with the dog's help, we will try to locate (those trapped)," the official told PTI.



HIMACHAL WEATHER: ORANGE ALERT FOR HEAVY RAIN AND SNOWFALL IN HIMACHAL, 211 ROADS INCLUDING ATAL TUNNEL AND TWO NHS CLOSED

Diary Times Desk: Due to heavy snowfall and rain on Wednesday amid orange alert in upper areas of Himachal, traffic remained closed on two national highways and 211 roads including Atal Tunnel. Due to snowfall of up to one feet in Lahaul, electricity is disrupted in 90 percent of the villages of the district. Snowfall in upper areas of Shimla, Chamba, Kullu, Kinnaur and Sirmaur and rain in most districts on Tuesday night and Wednesday has increased the cold in the state. Meteorological Center Shimla has also issued an orange alert for heavy rain and snowfall on Thursday and Friday. Heavy rain occurred in the capital Shimla on Tuesday night. On Wednesday, it was cloudy throughout the day and there was drizzle. Due to snowfall in Lahaul-Spiti, traffic has been disrupted between Keylong-Manali in NH-3 through Atal Tunnel Rohtang and NH 305 through Jalori Pass. Due to closure of Atal Tunnel Rohtang, Lahaul has been cut off from Manali. There has been fresh snowfall of 75 cm at Rohtang Pass, about 50 cm at North Portal, 45 cm at Koksar and Sissu, 25 cm at Udaipur and 45 cm at Darcha

HIMACHAL NEWS: TWO YOUTHS FROM PUNJAB ARRESTED FOR CHITTA BUSINESS IN MANALI, MANALI POLICE RAIDED THE HOTEL AND CAUGHT THEM

Diary Times Desk: In the tourist city of Manali, the police has taken a big action against chitta. The police caught two youths dealing in chitta in a hotel. JAIRAM THAKUR: LEADER OF OPPOSITION JAIRAM SAID- WHAT IS THE SECRET BEHIND THE FAVOUR OF RS 97 LAKH ON THE NGO INSTEAD OF TAKING ACTION

Diary Times Desk: Leader of Opposition Jairam Thakur said that Sukhu's government has become synonymous with scams and corruption in the state. Wherever you look, you see scams. Today, newspapers revealed that a case of wrongly approving projects worth Rs 97 lakh of some NGOs in the Social and Empowerment Department has come to light. RTI ACT: FIVE HIMACHAL OFFICIALS REPRIMANDED FOR TAKING RTI ACT LIGHTLY

Diary Times Desk: The State Information Commission reprimanded five officials for taking the RTI Act lightly. Four officials, as the appellate authority, did not hear the case on time or as per rules. These include Additional Secretary Animal Husbandry, Joint Director Tourism, Superintendent Engineer of Water Power Department Hamirpur and SDM Kullu. State Chief Information Commissioner RD Dhiman has asked the officials to be cautious. Ajay Kumar of Bhanjwali village of Ghumarwin had souaht information in his RTI application about the service charges given to the veterinary pharmacist and assistant for looking after the animals. On not getting the information, he filed an appeal in the First Appellate Authority. On not getting a hearing here, he filed a second appeal in the Commission. The Commission said Additional Secretary Animal Husbandry, working as the First Appellate Authority, did not show interest in hearing the appeal. The Commission warned the Additional Secretary to be cautious.

HIMACHAL: QUESTION PAPERS OF LAST FIVE YEARS WILL BE AVAILABLE ON THE WEBSITE OF SCHOOL EDUCATION BOARD, STUDENTS WILL GET HELP

Diary Times Desk : Himachal Pradesh School Education Board will make available the auestion papers of the last five years on its website. This will benefit the candidates appearing for the 10th-12th board examinations as well as non-board classes across the state. Earlier, the board management used to provide only model papers of auestion various subjects, but the Teachers' Union has requested the Education Board to make available the question papers asked in the board examinations in the last five years on the board's website. While the board examinees will be able to evaluate themselves related to the evaluation of these questions, they will also be able to know what kind of questions the Education Board has asked during the examinations till now.

"CONGRESSMAN BY BIRTH": DK SHIVAKUMAR ON REPORTS OF 'CLOSENESS' WITH BJP

Diary Times Desk : Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar on Wednesday termed as rumours the reports suggesting that he is getting close to the BJP, saying that there are no such developments. When asked about the Maha Kumbh Mela, however, Mr Shivakumar, who is also the state Congress chief, deviated from his party's stand to praise the organisation of the Maha Kumbh. Addressing a press conference at his residence here, Mr Shivakumar stated: "I am making it very clear. I could see in media and social media, some of my friends are calling after seeing reports that Shivakumar is getting closer to the BJP. By birth, I am a Congressman, my stand is I am a Hindu, and I believe in every culture of society. Besides my personal belief, the Congress ideology is to take everyone together." "People are planting stories. Sadhguru of the Isha Foundation came to my residence and invited me to Shivratri. He is from Mysuru and I admire him for his knowledge. Social media is analysing that I am getting close to the BJP. I have not met Union Home Minister Amit Shah yet," he added Mr Shiyakumar and Amit Shah are slated to attend Mahashivratri celebrations at the Isha Foundation in Coimbatore along with scores of national and state ministers.

"FIGHT AMONG KG STUDENTS": ACTOR VIJAY ON DMK-CENTRE CLASH OVER HINDI

Diary Times Desk: Tamil actorpolitician Vijay on Wednesday waded into the 'Hindi imposition' row between Tamil Nadu's ruling Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam and the Bharatiya Janata Party-led centre, slammed both parties and labelling their bitter back-and-forth "a fight among KG (kindergarten) students". The jabs drew a swift response: the DMK accused Vijay of "creating an illusion" and of being "scared" of the BJP. The Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam boss - who has a large fan following and is seen as a dark horse for next year's Assembly election - seemed to kickstart his campaign by accusing the DMK and the BJP of having "staged" the confrontation over the National Education Policy and the three-language formula. "One (party) sings while the other dances, both in unison... symbolising their collusion in maintaining the status quo. This leaves the concerns of the common people unheard and unaddressed," the actor raged, asserting the rise of his TVK ahead of the 2026 election. Vijay also underlined his own opposition to the three-language policy - which the DMK has claimed.

WON'T LOSE ANY SEAT: AMIT SHAH'S BIG PROMISE TO TAMIL NADU ON DELIMITATION



Diary Times Desk: Union minister Amit Shah said today addressed the hot button issue of delimitation in southern states, saying it would not reduce the number of seats there even by one. "I want to reassure the people of South India that Prime Minister Narendra Modi has kept your interest in mind and will make sure that not even one seat is reduced. And whatever increase is there, southern states will get a fair share, there is no reason to doubt this," he said, speaking at the inauguration of party offices in Coimbatore, Tiruvannamalai. His assurance came amid a massive meeting on delimitation and its effects called by Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin. "Today a meeting will be held to ensure the South does not suffer on account of delimitation. The people in Tamil Nadu is disturbed. Tamil Nadu Chief Minister and his son (Udhayanidhi Stalin) are trying to distract the public. Mr Stalin, the Modi government has made it clear in Lok Sabha that after delimitation, on pro rata basis, not a single seat will be reduced in any southern state," Mr Shah

added. DELHI AIRPORT'S TERMINAL 2 TO BE SHUT

TEMPORARILY FROM APRIL FOR UPGRADATION

Diary Times Desk: Delhi airport operator DIAL on Wednesday said Terminal 2 (T2) is expected to be shut down for four to five months, starting from April and one of the runways will also be closed for upgradation during this period. After renovation works, TI is expected to be open for operations after March 15, subject to various approvals. In addition, as part of larger efforts to develop an aviation hub, Delhi International Airport Ltd (DIAL) aims to have four slot banks by the end of the next fiscal. Generally, slot banks are referred to as particular time windows for efficient flight connections. The Indira Gandhi International Airport (IGIA) in the national capital has three terminals -- Tl, T2 and T3 -- and the total annual passenger handling capacity is around 109 million. It handles around 1,300 flights daily. DIAL CEO Videh Kumar Jaipuriar said the works at T1 are expected to be completed by March 15 and will be open for flights after getting requisite approvals. T2 is expected to be shut down temporarily in April.

'NOT CONFINED TO...': AAP DISMISSES ARVIND KEJRIWAL'S PARLIAMENT ENTRY BUZZ

Diary Times Desk: AAP supremo Arvind Kejriwal has a big responsibility for the party's pan India expansion and he will not become a Rajya Sabha MP from Punjab, party leaders said on Wednesday. The buzz over Mr Kejriwal going to the Rajya Sabha intensified with the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) declaring the sitting MP of the upper house from Punjab, Sanjeev Arora, as its candidate for the bypoll in Ludhiana West Assembly seat. Mr Kejriwal, the former three-term chief minister of Delhi, was defeated in the recent assembly polls from the New Delhi seat by BJP's Parvesh Verma. Mr Kejriwal is working to expand the AAP throughout the country, said senior party leader Somnath Bharti. "Kejriwal will not go to the Rajya Sabha because he has the big responsibility of the party's expansion in the country and he is working on it," Bharti told PTI. Echoing similar sentiments, AAP chief spokesperson Priyanka Kakkar said Sanjeev Arora is the best candidate for Ludhiana West seat.

DMK SLAMS ZOHO FOUNDER: TEACH HINDI TO YOUR STAFF, NOT STUDENTS IN TAMIL NADU

Diary Times Desk: DMK spokesperson Saravanan Annadurai hit back at Zoho founder Sridhar Vembu's call for Tamil Nadu's engineers and entrepreneurs to learn Hindi, questioning why students in the state should prioritise the language for business needs. In a post on X, Annadurai wrote, "Teach Hindi to your staff if your business needs it. Why should students in Tamil Nadu study Hindi because your business needs it? Inversely, you can request the Union Govt to ensure rudimentary knowledge of English to school kids there, which would solve the problem. The only issue with these types is that they imagine 'they are twice as smart' than others. Pathetic." His remarks came in response to Vembu's argument that the lack of Hindi proficiency was a "serious handicap" for Tamil Nadu's engineers in business dealings. In a post on X, Vembu stated that many of Zoho's engineers work with clients in Hindi-speaking regions such as Delhi, Mumbai, and Gujarat, and that not knowing the language.

PUNE WOMAN RAPED INSIDE BUS PARKED JUST 100 METRES FROM POLICE STATION

Diary Times Desk: A 26-year-old woman was raped inside a bus early Tuesday morning - while it was parked in the middle of Pune's busy Swargate Bus Stand and around 100 metres from a police station. The accused has been named as Dattatraya Ramdas - he was identified through a CCTV feed but has not yet been arrested. The police have formed eight special teams, and deployed a canine sniffer unit, to track him down. Ramdas, 36, already has a criminal record. The bus in which the young woman - a domestic worker travelling to her home village of Phaltan in Satara district - was raped has been vandalised, the police also said. According to the police, the crime took place sometime between 5.45am and 6.30am. A preliminary scan of CCTV footage shows the alleged rapist talking to the woman, who said Ramdas addressed her as 'didi', or 'sister'. According to the woman, he asked after her destination and told her the parked vehicle - in which there were no lights - would take her there.



'WE WILL DELIVER ALL OF IT': MIKE JOHNSON SECURES KEY WIN FOR DONALD TRUMP'S BUDGET

Diary Times Desk: On Tuesday, the House passed a budget plan that would fund President Donald Trump's legislative agenda. This move is considered a huge victory for House Speaker Mike Johnson. He had been trying to persuade a small number of holdouts in the final hours before the vote. Republicans adopted the resolution on a narrow 217-215 margin with no Democratic support. Warren Davidson, Victoria Spartz, and Tim Burchett, who had earlier voted against it, voted in favor. Representative Thomas Massie, was the only Republican who voted against the resolution. After the resolution's adoption, Johnson, a Louisiana Republican, said, "We have a lot of hard work ahead of us. We are going to deliver the American first agenda. We're going to deliver all of it, not just parts of it, and this is the first step in that process." It was not certain whether Republicans would have enough votes to approve the measure on Tuesday afternoon and evening. At least four Republican members had indicated that they would oppose the plan, and Speaker Mike Johnson could lose only one

NEW SEARCH FOR MH370 PLANE THAT VANISHED WITH 239 ON BOARD 11 YEARS AGO

Diary Times Desk: The disappearance almost 11 years ago of Malaysia Airlines flight MH370 with 239 people on board remains one of the world's greatest aviation mysteries. The Boeing 777 went missing on its way from Kuala Lumpur to Beijing on March 8, 2014. Satellite data analysis showed the plane likely crashed somewhere in the southern Indian Ocean, off the coast of western Australia. However, two major searches failed to come up with any significant findings. The last transmission from the plane was about 40 minutes after it took off from Kuala Lumpur for Beijing. Captain Zaharie Ahmad Shah signed off with "Good night, Malaysian three seven zero", as the plane entered Vietnamese airspace. Shortly thereafter, its transponder was turned off, which meant it could not be easily tracked. Military radar showed the plane left its flight path to fly back over northern Malaysia and Penana Island, and then out into the Andaman Sea towards the tip of the Indonesian island.

INVITE TO ZELENSKY TO MEET TRUMP MAY NOT MAKE SENSE: WHITE HOUSE OFFICIAL



Diary Times Desk: A White House official on Wednesday raised doubts about whether an invitation to Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelenskiy to meet US President Donald Trump would make sense given Zelensky's comments that a minerals deal is not complete. "If the Ukrainian leader says the deal isn't finalised, I don't see why an invitation would make sense," the official told Reuters. "There's an expectation that his coming is to recognise a final position (on the minerals deal) and he is not at a final position in his own words in this new wording." The official said Zelensky's latest comments from Kyiv suggest the minerals deal is not completed. Zelensky said on Wednesday that he had reached a "preliminary" deal with the US on minerals. Trump on Tuesday told reporters he had heard Zelensky was coming to the White House on Friday with the expectation that the minerals deal would be signed. He did not say Zelensky had been formally invited.

AMY GLEASON, NOT ELON MUSK, IS ACTING ADMINISTRATOR OF TRUMP'S DOGE

Diary Times Desk: The Trump administration has finally identified the administrator of the new Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE), which has been pushing agencies to fire employees, cancel contracts and make other budget cuts. The White House on Tuesday afternoon said Amy Gleason, a former US Digital Service official, is the acting leader of billionaire Elon Musk-led DOGE. Although DOGE's cost-cutting measures are being championed by billionaire Elon Musk and his associates, the White House has insisted that Mr Musk is overseeing the effort just as a senior adviser to President Donald Trump-- and not a DOGE employee. So far, the identity of who was technically running DOGE had remained a mystery, even though an executive order signed by President Trump last month called for the appointment of an administrator who would report to the White House. The announcement came as more than 20 members of the former United States.

"SORRY, COULDN'T PROTECT YOU": FREED ISRAELI HOSTAGE AT FUNERAL OF WIFE, SONS

Diary Times Desk: Hundreds of mourners gathered at a cemetery in southern Israel on Wednesday to bid a final farewell to Shiri Bibas and her two sons, who were killed in Gaza captivity and had become symbols in Israel of the hostages' ordeal. Orange balloons symbolising the children's red hair fluttered in the breeze from a fence not far from the cemetery of kibbutz Nir Oz, from where the Bibas family were seized by Palestinian militants on October 7, 2023. Signs reading "sorry" and "the broken heart with the Bibas family" hung from a nearby fence. "Shiri, I'm sorry I couldn't protect you all," Yarden Bibas said in his eulogy at the funeral of his wife and two sons -- Ariel and Kfir -- who were aged four and nine months old at the time of their abduction. Hamas handed over the remains of Shiri and the two children last week as part of a ceasefire deal with Israel, while Yarden Bibas was freed earlier this month. "Shiri, I love you and will always love you. Shiri, you are everything to me," said Yarden, his voice choking with emotion as he read his eulogy, which was televised live from the cemetery.



ISRAELI WARPLANES STRIKE SOUTH OF DAMASCUS


Diary Times Desk: Israeli warplanes hit a town south of Syria's capital as well as the southern province of Daraa late on Tuesday, residents, security sources and broadcaster Syria TV said. TOP WHITE HOUSE OFFICIAL PUSHES FOR CANADA'S EXIT FROM FIVE EYES ALLIANCE: REPORT

Diary Times Desk: Peter Navarro. one of US President Donald Trump's closest advisers, is pushing for expelling Canada out of the Five Eyes intelligence alliance as POTUS presses in on the pressure on Ottawa, a country he wishes to turn into the 51st American state, The Financial Times reported. The Five Eyes alliance, which includes the US, Canada, the UK, Australia and New Zealand, was founded in 1941, wherein the partner nations exchange a wide spectrum of intelligence within of the world's most tightly knit multilateral agreements as part of the collaboration. Donald Trump, who wants to annex Canada, on Monday had announced that the 25 per cent tariffs planned for the country, along with Mexico, are "on time". He said the plan of tariffs on imports will go ahead as planned next month, when the March 4 deadline elapses. Meanwhile, Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau, who is set to step down from the office on March 9, was earlier caught on mic saying that Donald Trump's aim to absorb Canada was a "real thing". Notably, it remained unclear whether the US President also supports his closest advisor Navarro's proposal. Navarro, who holds direct access to the Oval

ILLEGAL US IMMIGRATION: ED RAIDS VISA FIRMS IN LUDHIANA, CHANDIGARH

Diary Times Desk : The Enforcement Directorate on Wednesday said it raided three visa consultant firms in Ludhiana and Chandigarh as part of a money- laundering investigation linked to alleged fraud in providing immigration services to aspirants who wish to go to the US. The case emerges from the FIRs filed by Punjab and Delhi police on the complaint by the office of the Overseas Criminal Investigations, Embassy in Delhi. The complaint stated that "fraudulent" activities were perpetrated by these firms. In a statement, the federal agency said searches were carried out on Tuesday at five business and residential premises in Ludhiana and Chandiaarh. Incriminating documents, digital devices and Rs 19 lakh in cash were seized during the searches, it said. The accused entities and people running them had "forged" the education certificates/experience letters of "ineligible" visa applicants who were aspiring to study or work in the United States of America.

DELHI CM REKHA GUPTA TO WOO VOTERS IN ROHTAK WITH FEBRUARY 28 ROADSHOW

Digry Times Desk: As the Rohtak Municipal Corporation elections draw near, the BJP is ramping up its campaign efforts with a strategic blend of micro-management and high-profile campaigning. In its final push to retain the Mayor's seat in the March 2 civic body polls, the party has roped in Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta to lead a high-stakes roadshow on February 28, the last day of electioneering. Gupta, who hails from Nandgarh village in Jind district's Julana block, holds deep regional ties, which the BJP aims to leverage in its bid to sway voters. PUNJAB CONGRESS SET FOR OVERHAUL AS BHUPESH BAGHEL TO MEET STATE LEADERS ON MARCH 1

CBI REGISTERS FRAUD CASE AGAINST GODREJ ESTATE, BERKELEY REALTECH

Diary Times Desk: The Central Bureau of Investigation has registered a case against Godrei Estate Developers and Berkeley Realtech Ltd besides unidentified officials of the UT Administration on the charges of cheating and corruption. The case pertains to an alleged violation of conditions of environmental clearance by the two commercial complexes located in the Industrial Area, Phase I. A preliminary enquiry was registered in the CBI Anti-Corruption Branch, Chandigarh, on May 17, 2023, against unidentified officials of the Chandigarh Administration and private builders on a complaint of Bhim Sain Garg, the then Under Secretary, Punjab Raj Bhavan, wherein it was alleged that certain manipulations were done in the minutes of a meeting of the State Board for Wildlife, which was held on June 27, 2022, under the chairmanship of the Punjab Governor and UT Administrator. The CBI investigated the matter and on the enquiry report of ASP Karan Singh Rana, a case under Sections 420 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code and Sections 13(1) (d) and 13 (2) of the Prevention of Corruption Act has been registered. The CBI inquiry had revealed that proponents of Berkeley Square and Godrej Eternia, in collusion with unidentified officials of the UT Estate Office, had obtained occupation certificate without obtaining the requisite wildlife clearance.

ARJUNA AWARDEES SAWEETY BOORA, DEEPAK HOODA EMBROILED IN MARITAL DISCORD

Diary Times Desk : International boxer Saweety Boora and her husband, former India kabaddi team player Deepak Hooda, are locked in a bitter marital dispute, trading charges of domestic violence, dowry demand, and financial foul play. The Hisar police has registered an FIR under various sections of the BNS against Deepak Hooda on the complaint of Saweety Boora. Saweety, 32, alleged that Hooda, 30, physically assaulted her and demanded an SUV and Rs 1 crore from her family as dowry. In contrast, Hooda accused Saweety's family of usurping his property and with threatening him dire consequences. The couple, both Arjuna awardees, filed police complaints against each other at the Hisar and Rohtak police stations. Hisar SP Shashank Kumar Sawan confirmed that a notice was issued to Hooda regarding the marital dispute, but he failed to respond. The couple married on July 7, 2022, but their relationship has deteriorated, and they may be heading for a split. Saweety, a 2023 World Championships gold medallist, received the Arjuna Award in January 2025. Hooda, a 2020 Arjuna awardee, unsuccessfully contested the 2024 Assembly election on a BJP ticket from the Meham constituency.



KOHLI MOVES UP TO NO.5 ON ICC RANKINGS, PONTING CALLS HIM 'BEST ODI PLAYER'

Diary Times Desk: Former Australia captain Ricky Ponting reckons Virat Kohli will give himself the "best chance to be remembered as the all-time leading run-scorer" in ODIs. With his unbeaten 100 against Pakistan in Dubai on Sunday, Kohli moved up to No.5 on the ICC's ODI rankings and became just the third player to breach the 14,000-run barrier in 50-over cricket. Already past Ponting in the highest runscorers list, he is now 149 away from second-placed Kumar Sanaakkara, but still 4341 behind Sachin Tendulkar who sits on top of the pile. "With someone like Virat, you never write him off, because I'm sure he'd be motivated by that [achieving the record], I think," Ponting said on the ICC Review Podcast. "Now that he's gone past me and only two ahead of him, I'm sure he wants to give himself the best chance to be remembered as the all-time leading run scorer in the game. "So, as long as the hunger's there, obviously, physically wise, he's probably as fit as he's ever been and works exceptionally hard on that side of his game. So, if the hunger's still there, then I'm never going to write him



ICC CLEARS KUHNEMANN'S BOWLING ACTION

Diary Times Desk: The International Cricket Council has cleared Matthew Kuhnemann's bowling action after it came under the scanner recently. The Australian spinner was reported for an illegal action during the second Test of the series against Sri Lanka earlier this month. Having been reported for a suspect action for the first time in his professional career, the 28-year-old left-arm spinner underwent an independent bowling assessment at the National Cricket Centre in Queensland. The results have revealed that the elbow extension for all his deliveries were within 15 degrees, above which an action is deemed illegal. As a result, the Australian can now continue to howl in international cricket. Kuhnemann has played five Tests and four ODIs so far. Making his Test debut in India in 2023, Kuhnemann received a recall to beef up Australia's spin options for another subcontinental tour. He ended up playing a significant role in the series win by picking up 16 wickets.

PAKISTAN AND BANGLADESH SEEK THE PROVERBIAL 'PRIDE' IN DEAD RUBBER

Diary Times Desk: At this stage of multi-team competitions, things usually get intense - points table scenarios shift, teams jostle for position, and some even find themselves rooting for rivals to keep their hopes alive. The battle for qualification reaches its peak. But not today. This is the penultimate Group A match in the ICC Champions Trophy 2025, and there's nothing on the line. A dead rubber between two underwhelming sides, both beaten by New Zealand and India, with no path forward. It's tournament hosts Pakistan against fellow Asians Bangladesh, playing for pride, not progression. Both teams were under par with their batting and did not have much on the scoreboard to put pressure on the oppositions. And while Bangladesh did at least try to make a fight out of it with some spirited bowling, Pakistan were downright mediocre across all facets of their game. In an era where even 350-plus totals aren't safe in the 50-over format. Pakistan and Bangladesh have regressed. While the pitches may have had a role to play to an extent, their batting struggles were evident. Bangladesh managed only 228 and 240, both times batting first, while Pakistan posted 260 in a chase of 321 and 241 when setting a target. These underwhelming totals exposed their shortcomings and ultimately left them far behind in the race to the semifinals. So, what does this game offer for the teams? Not much in terms of stakes.
