PM MODI TO VISIT MAURITIUS NEXT WEEK TO GRACE NATIONAL DAY CELEBRATIONS

Diary Times Desk: Prime Minister Narendra Modi will pay a two-day state visit to Mauritius beginning March 11 to grace the island nation's national day celebrations as the chief guest. A contingent of Indian defence forces will also participate in celebrations, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said on Friday.

Modi is travelling to Mauritius at the invitation of Prime Minister Navin Ramgoolam. "Prime Minister Narendra Modi will be on a state visit to Mauritius on March 11 and 12 to attend the national day celebrations of Mauritius," MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said at his weekly media briefing.

The national day celebrations of Mauritius will be on March 12.An Indian Navy ship will also travel to Mauritius on the occasion. In Mauritian capital Port Louis, Modi will call on the president of Mauritius and hold wide-ranging talks with Ramgoolam.

India has close and longstanding relations with the island nation in the Western Indian Ocean. A key reason for the special ties is the fact that Indian origin people comprise nearly 70 per cent of Mauritius's population of 1.2 million. Since 2005, India has been among the largest trading partners of Mauritius.

For the financial year 2022-2023, Indian exports to Mauritius was USD 462 million while Mauritian exports to India was USD 91.50 million. The total trade volume was USD 554 million. Trade has grown by 132 per cent in the last 17 years, from USD 206 million in 2005-06 to USD 554 million in 2022-23, according to official data.



'LICENCE ACCORDED TO SUCH FORCES IN UK': INDIA ON JAISHANKAR'S SECURITY BREACH

Diary Times Desk: India on Friday pressed the UK to take action against the pro-Khalistan elements involved in the breach of External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar's security in London and said the incident showed the "licence" accorded to such forces as well as "indifference" to their "intimidation and threats". A pro-Khalistani protester attempted to break barricades while some others were shouting anti-India slogans as Jaishankar was leaving the Chatham House after concluding an interactive session at the institute on Wednesday evening. External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal suggested that the sincerity of the British authorities over the incident would be measured on the action they take against the culprits involved. "We have conveyed our deep concern to the UK authorities about the breach of security arrangements by UK-based separatist and extremist elements during the external affairs minister's visit," he said. There is a larger context to the incident. It brings out both the licence accorded to such forces, as well as indifference to their intimidation, threats, and other actions aimed at impeding our legitimate diplomatic activities in the UK," he said.



TELANGANA TUNNEL COLLAPSE: CADAVER DOGS IDENTIFY TWO POSSIBLE SPOTS FOR **HUMAN PRESENCE**

Diary Times Desk: Cadaver dogs deployed inside the partially collapsed SLBC tunnel in Telangana on Friday identified two possible spots for human presence where the rescue personnel started removing the silt. Eight persons remained trapped inside the tunnel since February 22, after a part of it collapsed. The cadaver dogs of the Kerala police joined the operation, with the rescue teams taking the canines inside the tunnel on Friday morning. Such dogs are trained to locate missing humans and human bodies. "The dogs were locating the probable locations where workers could be trapped. They identified two possible spots and teams are removing the silt from these two points," a senior official told PTI. The cadaver dogs of Kerala police (of the Belgian Malinois breed) can detect smell even from a depth of 15 feet, officials said. The medical team of NDRF has also gone inside the tunnel to ensure SOP (Standard Operating Procedure) as and when workers are traced, he said.

SUPREME COURT REFUSES TO ORDER STATUS QUO ON ADANI'S DHARAVI REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT



Diary Times Desk: Mumbai's Dharavi redevelopment project being executed by Adani Properties Pvt Ltd remains on track as the Supreme Court on Friday refused to stay the ongoing work on it. A Bench led by Chief Justice Sanjiv Khanna, however, asked the Maharashtra Government and Adani Properties Pvt Ltd, which was awarded the tender for the project, to respond to a petition filed by UAE-based Seclink Technologies Corporation challenging the Bombay High Court's verdict that said there was no "arbitrariness, unreasonableness or perversity" in the decision. One of the world's densest urban sprawls. Dharavi is a slum colony having a mix of residential and small industrial units. In its December 20, 2024, verdict, the high court had cleared the decks for redevelopment of the slums in Dharavi by upholding the tender awarded to the Adani Group for the project. The high court had dismissed Seclink Technologies Corporation's petition challenging the Maharashtra Government's decision to award the project to Adani Properties Pvt Ltd, which had made a Rs 5,069-crore offer.

BENGALURU COURT ACQUITS GOA TOURISM MINISTER IN ILLEGAL MINING CASE

Diary Times Desk: Goa Tourism Minister Rohan Khaunte has been acquitted by a Bengaluru court in a case related to illegal iron ore mining and transportation. The verdict brings closure to a highprofile case that has been under scrutiny for several years. The case traces back to the early 2010s when allegations of widespread illegal mining activities emerged in Goa. In 2012, a government-backed inquiry led by retired judge MB Shah reported that all 90 iron ore mines in Goa were operating illegally, lacking proper environmental permissions. The inquiry estimated that illegal mining had cost the state more than \$6 billion over five years. Consequently, the authorities ordered all mines to suspend operations from September 2012. In 2015, the Goa government renewed 88 mining leases — a move that faced legal challenges. Activists argued that these renewals were arbitrary and bypassed mandatory auctioning processes. Subsequently, in February 2018, the Supreme Court guashed these lease renewals, citing the need for fresh leases to be granted through a transparent process.

SIRMOUR RESIDENT CONVICTED IN CHITTA CASE SENTENCED TO 4 YEARS IMPRISONMENT, FINED RS 25,000

Diary Times Desk: In a case of chitta in the capital Shimla, the district court has convicted Sirmaur resident Manish Thakur and sentenced him to 4 years rigorous imprisonment. Along with this, a fine of Rs 25,000 has been imposed. In case of non-payment of fine, an additional three months of simple imprisonment will have to be undergone. Special Judge Shimla Praveen Garg pronounced this sentence while convicting Manish Thakur (29) in an NDPS case. District Attorney Mukta Kashyap said that on June 27, 2022, a police team was on patrol in Taradevi-Shoghi area. The police stopped a private bus at Taradevi-Tutu bifurcation for investigation. When the police searched Manish Thakur on the basis of suspicion, 7.31 grams of chitta was recovered from his possession. Baluganj police station arrested the accused and filed a charge sheet in the court under section 21 of the NDPS Act. Statements of 14 witnesses including the police were recorded on behalf of the prosecution in the court. The District Court of Shimla has sentenced Sirmaur resident Manish Thakur to 4 years of rigorous imprisonment after declaring him guilty in the drug case.

NABARD WILL GIVE 109.3 CRORES FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF 10 RURAL ROADS IN SIX DISTRICTS OF HIMACHAL

Diary Times Desk: An amount of Rs 109.3 crore has been sanctioned under NABARD for 10 rural roads in 6 districts of Himachal Pradesh. These projects will prove helpful in providing better road and transport facilities in rural areas. People living in rural areas of the state will benefit from this. Public Works Minister Vikramaditya Singh has asked the officials to start construction work within a month after completion of all the necessary formalities. "LET US MAKE ELEPHANT, DRAGON DANCE": CHINA MINISTER AMID US 'TARIFF WAR'

Diary Times Desk: As tensions between China and the United States ramp up - particularly after the US doubled tariffs on Chinese imports to 20 per cent - China's Foreign Minister Wang Yi on Friday called on New Delhi and Beijing to work together and "take the lead in opposing hegemonism and power politics". Speaking after a National People's Congress meet, Mr Wang said "making the dragon and elephant dance is the only right choice". He also said, "Supporting, instead of wearing each other down, and strengthening cooperation, instead of guarding (against) each other, is in our fundamental interests." He also declared that if Asia's two largest economies were to combine, the "democratisation of international relations development and strengthening of 'Global South' will have a brighter future". India has not yet responded to this statement. However, on Thursday Foreign Minister S Jaishankar said the Indian government is working with China to plot "a more predictable and positive course" for the relationship, measures for which will include resumption of pilgrimages to sites under China's control, direct flights, and exchange of journalists.

KARNATAKA CAPS MOVIE TICKET PRICES TO ₹200 ACROSS ALL THEATERS INCLUDING MULTIPLEXES

Diary Times Desk: The Karnataka government has introduced a price cap on movie tickets across the state, ensuring that the cost does not exceed ₹200 under anv This regulation circumstances. applies to films of all languages screened in Karnataka, including in multiplexes. The move has come as a surprise to film producers, who frequently request ticket price hikes ahead of major movie releases. During his budget speech, Chief Minister Siddaramaiah emphasized that ticket prices across all theatres would be capped at ₹200. While a similar price ceiling had been imposed earlier, it was not strictly enforced. Over the years, Bengaluru has seen a steep rise in ticket prices, with some movie tickets selling for over ₹600 during initial release days. To make cinema more affordable for audiences, the government has now decided to standardize ticket prices across the state. The new rule will be implemented soon across the state. This decision follows recent remarks by Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar, who made controversial statements about the film industry. At a public event, he remarked that film productions are dependent on government approvals for shooting.

TAMIL NADU'S MK STALIN RAISES STAKES OVER DELIMITATION, CALLS 7 STATE LEADERS TO CHENNAI

Diary Times Desk: Kannada actor Ranya Rao, the stepdaughter of a senior police officer who was arrested for smuggling gold, denied her involvement in the racket and claimed that she was "trapped" during questioning by authorities, sources said. The actor, who was arrested with gold bars worth Rs 12 crore strapped to her body in a hidden belt, broke down during questioning and continued to claim innocence before officials of the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI). The latest revelation has added another dimension to the case after Ranya admitted to the crime in her official statement to the DRI. In her statement, the actor admitted that 17 gold bars were recovered from her possession, and she not only travelled to Dubai but Europe, America and the Middle East as well. The contrasting claims of the actor have led the sleuths to probe whether the actor was unknowingly caught in the smuggling racket.

MK STALIN'S "LKG STUDENT LECTURING PHD HOLDER" CHARGE, AMIT SHAH'S COUNTER

Diary Times Desk: Hours after Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin accused the Centre of imposing Hindi on non-Hindi speakers, Home Minister Amit Shah urged the state government to introduce medical and engineering courses in Tamil. Mr Shah claimed that the DMK chief has not done enough in this regard and that it is Prime Minister Narendra Modi's government that has made key changes to recruitment policies to accommodate regional languages. Till now, there was no place for the mother tongue in the Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF) Constable recruitment. Prime Minister Narendra Modi decided that our youth will now be able to write their CAPF exam in all languages in the Eighth Schedule, including Tamil," said Mr Shah. "I want to urge the Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu to take steps towards introducing the curriculum of medical and engineering courses in Tamil language as soon as possible." The Centre had approved the conduct of the CAPF examination in 13 regional languages, including Tamil.

ALL-WOMEN SECURITY COVER FOR PM MODI'S GUJARAT EVENT ON WOMEN'S DAY

Diary Times Desk: A security cover comprising only women police personnel will be deployed at a mega event to be addressed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in Gujarat's Navsari district on the occasion of International Women's Day on March 8, a state minister has said. This will be the first such initiative in the country, he said. "The Gujarat police is taking a unique initiative on the occasion of International Women's Day. For the first time in the history of India, only women police will handle the entire security arrangement of the PM's event right from his arrival at the helipad at Vansi Borsi village in Navsari till the event venue," Minister of State for Home Harsh Sanghavi said on Thursday. The women police personnel will include IPS officers and constables, he said. The prime minister will be on a two-day visit to Guiarat and the Union Territory of Dadra and Nagar Haveli on Friday and Saturday, during which he will address.

ED ARRESTS ASHISH BHALLA OF WTC GROUP IN REAL ESTATE FRAUD CASE

Diary Times Desk: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has arrested Ashish Bhalla, promoter of WTC Group, days after multi-state raids in connection with an alleged real estate fraud, people familiar with the development said on Friday. The agency claimed that the WTC Group collected more than ₹3,000 crores from various investors across several states such as Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Chandigarh, Ahmadabad, Punjab, etc., for 15 projects in Delhi NCR, but probe revealed that very few were delivered. "ED's Gurugram office has arrested Ashish Bhalla, promoter WTC Group under the provisions of Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) in the case of real estate fraud involving cheating and duping thousands of investors of their monies through well planned conspiracy. During investigations it was revealed that after promising assured returns in exchange for their investment against plot or commercial space, the funds were diverted and siphoned off to several shell companies to acquire lands at various locations," a senior agency official said. "Investigations have also revealed that hundreds of crores were also diverted abroad to suspicious entities in Singapore whose beneficial ownership is with family members of Ashish Bhalla. Further investigation has revealed that WTC group had collected more than ₹3,000 crores from various investors across several states.



DONALD TRUMP DELAYS CANADA, MEXICO TARIFFS AFTER MARKET BLOWBACK

Diary Times Desk: US President Donald Trump on Thursday delayed some tariffs targeting Canada and Mexico -- leading Ottawa to halt an upcoming wave of countermeasures -- in moves that bring reprieve to companies and consumers after blowback on financial markets. Stock markets tumbled after Trump's duties of up to 25 percent took effect Tuesday, as economists warned that blanket levies could weigh on US growth and raise inflation. But Trump signed orders Thursday to delay the fresh tariffs for Canadian and Mexican imports covered by a North American trade agreement, though he dismissed suggestions that his decisions were linked to market turmoil. The halt -- which will last until April 2 -- offers relief to automakers. In the auto sector, parts cross North American borders multiple times during production. Following talks with the "Big Three" US automakers -- Stellantis, Ford and General Motors -- Washington initially announced a one-month exemption on autos coming through the United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA). A White House official told reporters that about 62 percent of Canadian imports will still face the new tariffs, although much of these are energy products hit by a lower rate of 10 percent.

10 INDIAN WORKERS, HELD HOSTAGE IN PALESTINE'S WEST BANK, RESCUED BY ISRAEL

Diary Times Desk: Ten Indian construction workers were rescued from Palestine's West Bank village, a month after they were stripped of their passports, local media reported. News agency PTI quoted reports which claimed that the workers were lured to the West Bank village of al-Zaayem for work. They had originally come to Israel to work in the construction industry. News portal Ynetnews reported that Israeli forces intercepted some suspects at a checkpoint which led to the recovery of the Indian workers. The Palestinians allegedly used the Indian passports to easily cross checkpoints into Israel. In an overnight operation led by the Population and Immigration authority together with the Israel Defence Forces (IDF) and the Justice Ministry, the workers were rescued.

RUSSIA LAUNCHES MAJOR UKRAINE MISSILE ATTACK AFTER US CUTS OFF MILITARY AID



Diary Times Desk: Russian forces damaged Ukrainian energy and gas infrastructure overnight in their first major missile attack since the U.S. paused intelligence sharing with Ukraine, piling pressure on Kyiv as President Donald Trump seeks a swift end to the war. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskiy, seeking to shore up Western support for his country after Trump's diplomatic pivot towards Moscow, called for a truce covering air and sea, though not ground troops - an idea first mooted by France. "The first steps to establishing real peace should be forcing the sole source of this war, Russia, to stop such attacks," Zelenskiy said on the Telegram messaging app, responding to the overnight missile attack. Ukraine's air force said Russia had fired a salvo of 67 missiles and 194 drones in the overnight attack, adding that it had shot down 34 of the missiles and 100 of the drones. Regional officials from the northeastern city of Kharkiv to the western city of Ternopil reported damage to energy and other infrastructure. Eight people were injured in Kharkiv and two more, including a child, were hurt in Poltava, officials said.

UKRAINE, US TO HOLD TALKS ON RUSSIA-UKRAINE WAR IN SAUDI ARABIA NEXT WEEK

Diary Times Desk: Ukraine and the United States have indicated they will meet in Saudi Arabia next week to discuss a framework for ending Russia's war, as Moscow launched a massive drone and missile attack on Ukrainian energy and gas infrastructure. Russia's attack overnight on Thursday came after Washington suspended military aid and intelligence sharing with Kyiv after a fiery exchange between US President Donald Trump and his Ukrainian counterpart Volodymyr Zelenskyy. Zelenskyy said on Thursday he would travel to Saudi Arabia on Monday for a meeting with Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman before bilateral talks with US officials.

WORLD WAR 2 BOMB ON TRACKS OF PARIS'S BUSIEST STATION, EUROSTAR TRAINS HALTED

Diary Times Desk: Train services at Paris' busy Gare du Nord station were disrupted on Friday morning after an unexploded World War 2-era bomb was discovered near the tracks, French national railway company Transport Express Regional (TER) said. "An unexploded bomb from the Second World War was discovered near the tracks", TER said on X. The discovery has impacted local metro services, as well as national and international trains, including Eurostar services. According to Eurostar's website, at least three trains scheduled to depart from Gare du Nord on Friday morning have been cancelled, news agency Reuters reported. Eurostar says on its website: "Due to an object on the tracks near Paris Gare du Nord, we are expecting disruption to our services this morning. Please change your journey for a different date of travel." Authorities are working to safely remove the bomb, but delays and cancellations are expected to continue until further notice. The bomb was found during overnight works on the tracks, train line RER B said on X. Media reports suggest the discovery was made in the area of Saint-Denis, a suburb of Paris. Gare du Nord is Europe's busiest rail station and serves 214 million passengers a year, as per Eurostar.



AFTER TRUMP'S "LAST WARNING" THREAT, HAMAS' "LIES AND DECEPTION" RESPONSE

Diary Times Desk: The armed wing of Hamas said on Thursday it remained committed to its fragile ceasefire with Israel, after Donald Trump told the people of Gaza they would be "DEAD" if hostages held there are not freed. The first phase of the six-week-old truce expired at the weekend and talks on the deal's future have hit an impasse. Hamas Trump's threats said encourage Israel to ignore the deal, which largely halted more than 15 months of war in Gaza between Israel and Palestinian militants. Trump had earlier floated a widely condemned plan to relocate Palestinians from Gaza, prompting Arab leaders who met in Cairo this week to support an alternative. A United States envoy praised Egypt on Thursday for coming up with the new plan, but did not endorse details of the proposed alternative. Trump's warning followed his administration's that revelation it unprecedented direct talks with Hamas -- listed as a "terrorist" group by Washington -- focused on American hostages in Gaza.

"NO GAMES WITH HER HAIR": TRUMP ON STRANDED ASTRONAUT SUNITA WILLIAMS

Diary Times Desk: US President Donald Trump had some words of appreciation for NASA's Indian-origin astronaut Sunita Williams' hair as he told a pair of stranded astronauts aboard the International Space Station that "we're coming up to get you." Trump, 78, mused Thursday about the possibility of personally launching a rescue team into orbit to help bring astronauts Butch Wilmore and Williams back to Earth - and blasted former President Joe Biden for their eight-day mission stretching to nine months and counting. "Biden left them up there," Trump told reporters in the Oval Office. "We have two astronauts that are stuck in space. I have asked Elon (Musk), I said, 'Do me a favour. Can you get them out?' He said, 'Yes.' He is preparing to go up, I think in two weeks." He added that Musk is "right now preparing a ship to go up" and get them. And I see the woman with the wild hair, good, solid head of hair she's got. There's no kidding, there's no games with her hair," Trump said during remarks in the Oval Office Thursday while talking about Williams. Trump was responding to a question about Williams and Wilmore, who have been stranded on the International Space Station for the past nine months. When asked what his message.

BAJWA FEARS REDUCED REPRESENTATION AFTER DELIMITATION, CALLS FOR PUNJAB LEADERS' UNITY

Diary Times Desk : Partap Singh Bajwa, Leader of the Opposition in the Punjab Assembly, has called upon leaders of all political parties in Punjab to discuss the impending delimitation of parliamentary constituencies, scheduled for 2026. Bajwa expressed serious concerns about the potential consequences of delimitation, emphasising that it's not just southern states that will be affected, but also northern states like Punjab. "Since we belong to Punjab, leaders of all the political parties of the state should come on a single platform to figure out something," he added. Bajwa noted that the Lok Sabha currently has 543 MPs, which may increase to approximately 848 after delimitation. Punjab's parliamentary seats will rise from 13 to around 18, but its representation will decrease percentage-wise, potentially marginalising the state further. In contrast, overpopulated states like Maharashtra, Uttar Pradesh, and Bihar will gain more seats, with BJP holding a strong presence in these



IAF'S JAGUAR CRASHES IN HARYANA'S PANCHKULA; AN-32 AIRCRAFT INVOLVED IN 'SERIOUS ACCIDENT' IN BENGAL'S BAGDOGRA

Diary Times Desk: Two aircraft of the the Indian Air Force (IAF) were involved in separate accidents on Friday. In the first incident, a Jaguar fighter aircraft of the IAF crashed due to a technical defect during a routine training sortie on Friday. The pilot, a Flight Lieutenant, ejected safely and was later evacuated by the IAF. The remains of the ill-fated aircraft fell in a hilly forest area near Raipur Rani in Panchkula district, close to the Haryana-Himachal Pradesh border. The aircraft had taken off from the Ambala airbase. Local villagers gathered around the spot and assisted the pilot in freeing himself from his parachute harness. A Jaguar aircraft of the IAF crashed at Ambala during a routine training sortie today, after encountering a system malfunction. The pilot maneuvered the aircraft away from anv habitation on ground before ejecting safely. An inquiry has been ordered by the IAF to ascertain the cause of the accident," an official statement by the IAF said.

NABARD APPROVES RS 109 CRORE FOR RURAL ROAD PROJECTS IN 6 DISTRICTS OF HIMACHAL



One of the key projects is the construction of a 35-metre span bridge connecting Nehwat, Nayaser, Ghaini, and Devidhar.

PROTEST AGAINST PROPOSED CHANGES IN ADVOCATE ACT HELD IN SHIMLA

Diary Times Desk: Lawyers practising in the High Court of Himachal Pradesh held a protest against the proposed amendments to the Advocates Act in Shimla on Thursday. The protest march, organised by the Bar Association of HP High Court, commenced from the High Court, and culminated at the Raj Bhawan. The legal fraternity raised strong objections to the proposed changes in the law, arguing that these would infringe upon the independence of the legal profession and undermine the rights of the advocates across the country. Former Advocate General of Himachal Pradesh and Senior Advocate Shravan Dogra opposed the amendments, stating that the very intention behind the proposed changes was questionable. "The government argues that the Bill is only in the proposal stage and its final form will be decided later. But we refuse to wait until it is finalised to voice our concerns. The very thought of altering the truth of our profession is fundamentally wrong. Your intentions are not pure. You have attempted to introduce such draconian laws in various sectors at different times, and each time, those sectors have opposed them.

NO DISCUSSION WITH PARTY HIGH COMMAND ON NEW HIMACHAL CONGRESS CHIEF: CM SUKHU

Diary Times Desk: Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu on Friday said no discussions were held about the new state Congress party chief during his recent meeting with the party's national-level leaders in Delhi. SHUBMAN GILL, STEVE SMITH AND GLENN PHILLIPS NOMINATED FOR ICC PLAYER OF THE MONTH



The right-handed India opening batter has been in phenomenal form in the 50-over format, and his form has helped Rohit Sharma and co. reach the final of the ICC Men's Champions Trophy 2025. In the three-match ODI series against England, Gill made valuable contributions of 87 and 60. He rounded off the series with a remarkable 112 in Ahmedabad. The 25-year-old began his Champions Trophy campaign with a 101 not-out against Bangladesh to help chase down a challenging 229 target under the lights in Dubai. Gill is currently the No.1 ranked ODI batter. On the other hand, Australia batter Steve Smith, who recently announced his retirement from ODIs, took centre stage as the stand-in captain in the twomatch Test series against Sri Lanka. The opening Test saw Smith scoring a formidable 141, and he followed it up with a striking 131 in the first innings of the second Test, where Australia registered a nine-wicket victory. This performance sealed him the Player of the Series accolade and a spot back among the top five Test batters in the ICC Player Rankings.

ROHIT, KOHLI TO END ODI CAREERS AFTER CHAMPIONS TROPHY? AAKASH CHOPRA REACTS

Diary Times Desk: Former India cricketer Aakash Chopra believes that if Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma choose to retire from ODIs after the Champions Trophy final, it would be a decision difficult to argue against. However, he remains uncertain whether the two stalwarts will indeed take that step. As India prepares to face New Zealand in the final on March 9 in Dubai, speculation is rife that this could be the duo's last appearance in 50-over cricket. Both Rohit and Kohli bid farewell to T20Is after India's T20 World Cup triumph in 2024. Now, many believe they could follow a similar path post the Champions Trophy, regardless of whether they finally secure the ICC ODI silverware that has eluded them for long. In his recent YouTube video, Chopra addressed the possibility of the two icons moving on from ODIs, acknowledging that with the 2027 ODI World Cup still a few years away, a decision to step aside might be logical. "It's entirely up to them. I will be very honest, it's not going to be easy. In 2025, Kohli's performance with the bat has been outstanding and Rohit's has been okay, okay. I won't say his performance is very good. He might change the scenario by scoring a hundred in the final," Chopra said.

MOHAMMAD HAFEEZ ATTACKS '90S PAKISTAN STARS', SPARKS AWKWARD INTERACTION WITH PAKISTAN GREAT

Diary Times Desk: An awkward incident took place on live television between former Pakistan captain Mohammad Hafeez and pace great Shoaib Akhtar. Then came a difficult period that we had to go through and then in 2007 we lost the final (of the T20 World Cup)," Hafeez said on PTV Sports. On the contrary, Hafeez lauded Pakistan's T20 World Cup (2009) and Champions Trophy (2017) winning sides. He also explained why players like Babar Azam get idolised by fans.



MUMBAI INDIANS CAPTAIN HARMANPREET KAUR FINED FOR SHOWING DISSENT IN WPL 2025

Diary Times Desk: Mumbai Indians captain Harmanpreet Kaur was on Friday fined 10 per cent of her match fee for showing dissent at umpire's decision during her team's match against UP Warriorz at the Ekana Cricket Stadium here. Seemingly unhappy with the ruling, she was seen engaged in a brief argument with the umpire, with teammate Amelia Kerr also joining the discussion.
"Harmanpreet Kaur admitted to the Level 1 offence under Article 2.8 which relates to showing dissent at an umpire's decision during a match," WPL said in a release. HENRY'S AVAILABILITY FOR CHAMPIONS TROPHY FINAL 'A LITTLE BIT UNKNOWN'
