

BY 2027, EVERY CAPITAL OF NORTHEAST WILL BE CONNECTED BY RAIL, ROAD, AIR: SHAH

Diary Times Desk: Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday said that every capital in northeast India would be connected by rail, road, and air within the next two years. The biggest achievement of the BJP government is that it has reduced the distance between the Northeast and the rest of India. By 2027, every capital of the Northeast will be connected by train, plane, and road," the Home Minister said while addressing the Northeast Students' and Youth Parliament organised by ABVP.

Shah, in his address, said that violence has significantly reduced in northeast India under the Prime Minister Narendra Modi's government. The number of violent incidents has decreased by 70 per cent from 11,000 between 2004 and 2014 to 3,428 between 2014 and 2024," he said. Additionally, the number of security force fatalities has dropped by 70 per cent, while civilian deaths have reduced by 89 per cent over the past decade.

The Home Minister said that the BJP government has signed 12 important agreements in the past decade. "We have signed agreements with all armed groups and more than 10,500 insurgents have laid down their arms and joined the mainstream," said Shah. He said that in the past 10 years, PM Modi has taken care of the Northeast so much that he has decided that every month, one minister will stay overnight in some state of the Northeast. I want to tell you that the total number of visits of all the prime ministers to the Northeast since independence is 21, except Assam, and the number of visits of Narendra Modi alone to the Northeast is 78, which shows how much importance has been given to the Northeast," Shah said.



DELIMITATION

DELIMITATION WILL INCREASE SEATS EVENIN TAMIL NADU, SAYS RAJNATH SINGH



Diary Times Desk: Defence Minister Rajnath Singh has sought to allay concerns raised by Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M.K. Stalin over the proposed delimitation exercise in 2026, asserting that the process will lead to an increase in seats across all states, including Tamil Nadu.

Speaking to IANS, Rajnath Singh said, "I believe that delimitation should proceed as planned. If MK Stalin has any objections, he is free to raise them. The relevant authorities will deliberate on the matter, and the judiciary will have the final say." "People should rest assured that, whether for the Legislative Assembly or the Lok Sabha, the number of seats will naturally increase after delimitation in every state. I firmly believe that Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, and Kerala will also see an increase. The claim that only North India will benefit is not justified," he further told IANS.

Rajnath Singh's remarks came a day after CM Stalin wrote to seven Chief Ministers, urging them to oppose the proposed delimitation exercise, which he termed a "blatant assault on federalism." We are forming a Joint Action Committee to ensure that our states are not silenced. Let us stand together -- not as separate political entities, but as protectors of our people's future," Stalin emphasized in his letter.

Earlier Stalin had described delimitation as a looming threat to the southern states. In a lighter vein, he has even suggested that Tamil Nadu's residents have more children to counter the potential reduction in parliamentary seats. He has often argued that southern states are being penalized for their success in population control and economic management. "We controlled our population, built our economy, and now they want to take our voice away?" he said at a recent public meeting.

TRUST MANAGING MUMBAI'S LILAVATI HOSPITAL SAYS RS 1.500 CRORE MISAPPROPRIATED BY EX-TRUSTEES

Diary Times Desk: The charitable trust that runs Mumbai's well-known Lilavati Hospital on Tuesday alleged that funds of over Rs 1,500 crore were misappropriated by its former trustees and other related individuals. The Lilavati Kirtilal Mehta Medical Trust (LKMMT) has lodged separate complaints with the Enforcement Directorate (ED) and at the Bandra police station. It has also claimed that black magic was performed on the hospital premises by erstwhile trustees and related individuals. The complaints allege the misappropriation, uncovered during a forensic audit of Lilavati Hospital's financial records, has impacted the trust's operations and health care services provided by the leading private medical facility located in upscale Bandra area. "We filed complaints which translated into FIRs due to the orders of the Bandra Magistrate Court. Three FIRs have been filed against the former trustees and other related individuals. A fourth proceeding against these individuals is now pending before the magistrate, which is based on our complaint filed in the Bandra police station for black magic and occult practices," LKMMT Permanent Resident Trustee Prashant Mehta told reporters.



MANIPUR MP ARTHUR SLAMS BUDGET AS "ANTI-PEOPLE" FOR IGNORING **60,000 DISPLACED CITIZENS**

Diary Times Desk: Outer Manipur MP Alfred Kangam Arthur has strongly criticised the Manipur Budget, labeling it "anti-people" for failing to address the needs of over 60.000 people displaced due to ethnic clashes in the state. The MP emphasised that the budget neglects those who have lost their livelihoods, homes, and suffered damage worth over Rs 20,000 crore. "I implore the conscience of this House once again. Give me the privilege of relinquishing my seat, and I will not return. It is painful to come here, speak repeatedly, and not be heard. It is equally painful to see that my words are not translated into action on the ground. To return home to an empty house, knowing that today's budget fails to address the needs of those affected, is unbearable," Arthur said. The MP also pointed out that the budget lacks a separate section for the hills and valley, a mandatory provision. He questioned how the allocation of funds would be determined.


MAURITIUS NOT JUST PARTNER COUNTRY, IT IS FAMILY, PM MODI TELLS DIASPORA



Diary Times Desk: Terming Mauritius as a bridge between India and the Global South, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday said the island nation is part of India's family and not just a partner country. Mauritius is like 'Mini India'," Modi told the Indian diaspora at a community event in Port Louis, which was also attended by Mauritius Prime Minister Navinchandra Ramgoolam, his wife and cabinet ministers. Modi said that Mauritius is not just a partner country. "For us, Mauritius is family!", he said. "This bond is deep and strongly rooted in history, heritage and the human spirit." Mauritius is also a bridge connecting India to the wider Global South. A decade ago, in 2015, on my first visit as the PM, I announced India's SAGAR vision. SAGAR means Security and Growth for All in the Region. Today, Mauritius is still at the heart of this vision," he added. At the beginning of the event, Modi handed over the Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) cards to Ramgoolam and his wife Veena. He said the decision had been made to extend the OCI Card to the seventh generation of the Indian diaspora in Mauritius.

SUPREME COURT SEEKS CENTRE'S RESPONSE ON PLEA FOR BETTER FACILITIES FOR DISABLED PRISONERS

Diary Times Desk: The Supreme Court has issued notice to the Centre on a petition seeking adequate facilities for disabled prisoners and implementation of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, in prisons across India. Acting on a petition filed by activist Sathyan Naravoor, a bench of Justice Vikram Nath and Justice Sandeep Mehta asked the Centre and others to file their responses in four weeks. Naravoor contended that even after more than eight years since the enactment of the Act, most state prison manuals do not include the mandatory provisions for ramps and other essential accessibility measures. This ongoing failure severely impacts the basic mobility of disabled prisoners within prison premises, directly violating the statutory requirements of the Act," the petitioner submitted. Naravoor said due to lack of infrastructural facilities such as ramps and accessible toilets, prisoners with disabilities often depended on others for assistance with their daily tasks.

HP HIGH COURT: THERE WILL BE NO RECOVERY FROM EMPLOYEES WHO AVAIL SENIORITY BENEFITS OF CONTRACT SERVICE PERIOD. RELIEF FROM HIGH COURT

Diary Times Desk: Himachal Pradesh High Court has stayed the recovery from employees who have taken seniority benefits of contract service period. More than 500 employees who received recovery notices from the Directorate of Education have got a big relief from the court. The government has sought three weeks' time to file a reply in this matter. The next hearing of the case will be on April 1. The division bench of Justice Tarlok Singh Chauhan and Justice Sushil Kukreja has stayed the recovery order of financial benefits received during the contract service period issued by the government on February 27. The government has issued a notification to withdraw the contractual benefits given to contract employees after the year 2003. The Director of Education has issued notices to all school principals on March 3 in compliance with this order. Now, after the court's order, recovery will not be made from those who have taken seniority benefits. On the other hand, Advocate General Anoop Ratan sought time from the court to respond to this. The court gave three weeks' time to file a reply. The petitioners have challenged the government's recruitment conditions, the Staff Selection Commission (SSC) notification dated February 27, 2024, and the orders dated March 3,



HIMACHAL COMMISSION RECRUITMENT PAPER LEAK CASE: FIR AGAINST ACCUSED UMA FOR HAVING ASSETS DISPROPORTIONATE TO HER INCOME

Diary Times Desk: An FIR has been registered against Uma Azad, accused in the paper leak case, in the disproportionate assets case. Uma Azad was posted as a senior assistant in the confidential branch of the dissolved Staff Selection Commission. So far, she is named in 16 FIRs registered in the paper leak case. The 17th FIR has been registered against her. After the paper leak case was disclosed in December 2022, the Vigilance investigated the properties of accused Uma Azad. In this investigation, the properties have been found to be more than the income. In such a situation, now an FIR has been registered in this case. The family members of the accused are also under investigation in this case. During the disclosure of the paper leak case, the Vigilance team recovered more than six lakh cash and jewellery worth lakhs of rupees from the house of accused Uma Azad. The accused also owns a luxury car.

IN HAMIRPUR, YOUTHS FRAUDULENTLY CHANGED ATM AND WITHDREW 50 THOUSAND FROM THE ACCOUNT, OLD MAN DIED OF HEART ATTACK

Diary Times Desk: A case of cheating an old man has come to light in the Mahere branch of PNB Bank situated in the headquarter of sub division Barsar. The youths fraudulently changed the ATM card and withdrew 50 thousand rupees from the old man's account. Shortly after, the victim died suddenly. It is suspected that the death was due to a heart attack. The deceased old man Ashok Kumar, a resident of Samoh, went to the ATM on Monday afternoon with his debit card to withdraw money from the bank's ATM. When the money did not come out of the ATM after continuous attempts, he took help from two youths standing outside the ATM. The youths first swiped their ATM card and then swiped the old man's ATM card and replaced it with the ATM card on the pretext that the money was not coming out. After the old man left, the youth went to another ATM and withdrew Rs 50,000 from his account. As soon as the old man received the message of Rs 50,000 being withdrawn from his account, he went to the PNB branch in Mahere and informed the bank officials about the matter. HIMACHAL NEWS: MELLIFERA BEES WILL ADD SWEETNESS TO STONE FRUITS, 300 BOXES REACHED HIMACHAL FROM RAJASTHAN

Diary Times Desk: These days, flowers are blooming in plum plants in Kullu district of Himachal Pradesh and the adjoining areas. To ensure proper setting after flowering, gardeners will take the help of bees for pollination. Mellifera bees brought from Rajasthan will not only do the work of pollination, but will also add sweetness to the stone fruits. In the initial phase, 300 bee boxes have reached the state from Rajasthan. These will be given to the gardeners as per the demand. In coming days, the more consignments of bees will also reach the district. Bees are considered a better option for pollination, so bee boxes are kept in the gardens for setting during flowering. After stone fruits, there will be flowering in pears and then in apples. In such a situation, bees will remain in the apple belt of the state till April-May. Bees are brought for pollination from the neighboring states of Himachal. The special thing is that mellifera bees from Rajasthan have been sent to the valleys of Kullu for pollination. About 300 boxes have reached Kullu. These bee boxes will be given to the visitors for pollination at reasonable prices.

US' TULSI GABBARD, CANADA'S CSIS CHIEF IN INDIA NEXT WEEK FOR SECURITY CONCLAVE

Diary Times Desk: Top intelligence and security officials from around the world, including US Director of National Intelligence (DNI) Tulsi Gabbard, will gather in the Indian capital next week for a security conclave on the margins of the Raisina Dialogue, people familiar with the matter said on Tuesday. Gabbard will be the first highranking White House official to travel to India after President Donald Trump's inauguration in January. UK National Security Adviser (NSA) Jonathan Powell and Canadian Security Intelligence Service (CSIS) director Daniel Rogers are also expected to attend the security conclave, the people said on condition of anonymity. India's National Security Council Secretariat has hosted the security conclave on the margins of the Raisina Dialogue, the country's flagship conference on geopolitics and geo-economics, since 2022. This year's edition is set to be held on March 16, a day ahead of the Raisina Dialogue. Senior security officials from Australia, New Zealand and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) are also expected to attend the security conclave, which will focus on long-standing concerns such as terrorism, trans-national and financial crimes, cyber-security and emerging technologies, as well as the conflicts in Ukraine and West

DELHI COURT ALLOWS FIR AGAINST ARVIND KEJRIWAL OVER ALLEGED FUNDS MISUSE

Diary Times Desk: In a setback to Arvind Kejriwal, Delhi's Rouse Avenue Court on Tuesday okayed a petition seeking an FIR against the AAP chief and others for allegedly misusing public funds to put up large hoardings in Dwarka in 2019. The case pertains to a complaint filed back in 2019, claiming that Kejriwal, along with former AAP MLA Gulab Singh and Dwarka Councillor Nitika Sharma, misused public funds by installing large hoardings across the area. In September 2022, a metropolitan magistrate dismissed the complaint. However, the sessions court overturned the lower court's decision and sent it back to the reconsideration. magistrate for Following a special judge directing the magistrate court to decide the case afresh, the magistrate has now entertained a plea for an FIR to be registered in the case. On January, Special Judge Vishal Gogne said that the order passed by the magistrate dismissing the complaint earlier did not seek to find.

Tarun Konduraju, who belongs to a prominent business family in Bengaluru, was produced in court. The thirty-three-vear-old actor was arrested last week when a DRI team searched her luggage at Bengaluru airport and found her allegedly smuggling 14 kg of gold from Dubai. Ranya Rao, who started her career with 2014 Kannada film Maanikya, had flown in on an Emirates flight on Monday. She is the stepdaughter of senior IPS officer K Ramachandra Rao. The Karnataka government has now ordered an investigation into reports that police personnel accompanied the actor at the airport. Ranya Rao allegedly used VIP privileges to bypass security checks during her smuggling operations. The actor allegedly made frequent trips to Dubai and smuggled in gold bars.

If tourists are taken to such locations without police permission, the homestay owners will be held responsible for any attacks by anti-social elements

PAKISTAN LEFT RED-FACED AS ITS SENIOR DIPLOMAT DEPORTED BY US DESPITE VISA

Diary Times Desk: In a major embarrassment for Pakistan, a senior diplomat was denied entry into the US despite having a valid visa and necessary documents, reported The News, a Pakistani media outlet. KK Wagan, the ambassador of Pakistan to Turkmenistan, was stopped by the US immigration on his arrival in Los Angeles and deported. Quoting an unnamed official in the Pakistan foreign ministry, the report said the envoy had an "immigration objection". Mr Wagan, a seasoned diplomat, was on a personal trip to Los Angeles. The report said he had a valid US visa and travel documents. Immigration authorities stopped Mr Wagan after he arrived in Los Angeles with officials flagging concerns over diplomatic protocol. The US officials flagged "controversial visa references" of Mr Wagan, though there is no clarity over the specific concerns, the report said citing diplomatic sources. BALOCH MILITANTS HIJACK PAKISTAN PASSENGER TRAIN WITH 400 ON BOARD



Diary Times Desk: Militants opened fire on a passenger train in southwestern Pakistan on Tuesday, injuring the train driver and causing panic among passengers, reports news agency Reuters. The Jaffar Express, with around 400 passengers on board in nine bogies, was on its way from Quetta in Pakistan's southwestern Balochistan province to Peshawar in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa when it was fired on, railway officials said. Authorities have yet to provide details on the extent of the damage or whether additional injuries were reported among passengers. The Baloch Liberation Army (BLA), a militant separatist group, has claimed responsibility for the assault. In a statement, the BLA also claimed to have taken hostages from the train, including security personnel. According to reports on local media, the militant group claimed that six military personnel were killed in the attack. The group also stated that hundreds of passengers were being held captive. In a ominous warning, the BLA threatened to execute all hostages if Pakistan attempted to launch a military rescue operation.

CHINA SLAMS DALAI LAMA, SAYS BEIJING WILL CHOOSE BUDDHIST LEADER'S SUCCESSOR

Diary Times Desk: China's foreign ministry has criticised the Dalai Lama after he claimed in his new book 'Voice for the Voiceless' that the next spiritual leader of Tibetan Buddhism would be born outside China, reported news agency Reuters. Addressing the leader's claims, it said, "He has no right to represent the people of Tibet. Reincarnations of the living Buddha, including the Dalai Lama, should abide by the regulations of the country." They added, "Reincarnation is a special tradition of Tibetan Buddhism and the name of the living Buddha of Dalai Lama was identified by the central government." When asked about the book at a press conference on Monday, the spokesperson for China's foreign ministry had called the Dalai Lama "a political exile."

INDIA SAYS "NO COMMITMENTS" TO TARIFF CUTS AFTER TRUMP'S TAX CUT CLAIM

Diary Times Desk: India says it has not committed to slashing import duties on US products, days after President Donald Trump announced that New Delhi had agreed to "cut their tariffs way down". Only weeks into his second term. Trump has upended global trade, targeting friends and foes alike. He has also blamed all trading partners of "unfair" practices, and has announced reciprocal tariffs on many countries, including India, to begin from next month. Trump once again railed at India's "massive tariffs" last week. You can't sell anything into India, it is almost restrictive," Trump said. 6 KHALISTAN ZINDABAD FORCE TERRORISTS GET LIFE TERM FOR SMUGGLING ARMS IN PUNJAB

Diary Times Desk: A special NIA court in Mohali has sentenced six terrorists linked to proscribed Khalistan Zindabad Force (KZF) to life imprisonment for smuggling explosives and arms through drones in Punjab for launching a terror attack in 2019. Besides KZF, the convicts are also linked to designated individual terrorists – Germany-based Gurmeet Singh alias Bagga and Pakistan-based Ranjeet Sinah alias Neeta, officials said Tuesday. Three other persons have been sentenced to 10 years of rigorous imprisonment in the case by the NIA special court, they said. "While Akashdeep Singh, Balwant Singh, Harbhajan Singh, Balbir Singh, Maan Singh and Gurudev Singh have been sentenced to life imprisonment, accused Shubhdeep Singh, Sajanpreet Singh and Romandeep Singh have been sentenced to 10 years' rigorous imprisonment for their roles in the case," an NIA spokesperson said in a statement. The court has also imposed fine on all convicts, the statement said. The spokesperson said the court found the accused guilty under various sections of the IPC, UAPA, Arms Act and Explosives Substances Act in the case, linked with the proscribed terrorist organisation KZF. The NIA had taken over the investigation from Amritsar police in October 2019.



POLICE SEARCH PINKY DHALIWAL'S HOUSE, SEIZE ELECTRONIC DEVICES, DOCUMENTS

Diary Times Desk : Music producer Pinky Dhaliwal was taken to his house by the police to conduct a search today. ED ATTACHES SUKHPAL KHAIRA'S CHANDIGARH HOUSE IN PMLA CASE

Diary Times Desk : In a recent development, the Enforcement Directorate (ED) has provisionally attached the Sector 5 house of Bholath Congress MLA Sukhpal Khaira in Chandigarh under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA). The attachment is linked to an investigation revealing that Khaira acquired and utilised proceeds of crime (POC) worth Rs 3.82 crore from an international drug syndicate operated by Gurdev Singh and his associates. The ED alleged that Khaira provided protection for smuggling narcotic drugs, and in return, Gurdev Singh made cash payments of Rs 3.82 crore to Khaira and funded his election campaigns using proceeds from the illegal drug business. Khaira denied the allegations, stating that he received no notice about the attachment of his house and that the news was released to the media instead. He termed the action as "pure character assassination" and alleged that BJP is misusing the ED to target opposition leaders. The ED investigation revealed that Khaira and his family members made expenses worth Rs 6.61 crore between April 1, 2014, and March 31, 2020. An unaccounted expenditure of Rs 3.82 crore was identified, which was revealed from handwritten notebooks seized during searches conducted on March 9 and 10, 2021.

TAKHT KESGARH JATHEDAR GIANI KULDEEP SINGH GARGAJ TAKES CHARGE AMID PROTOCOL ROW

Diary Times Desk: In the backdrop of the controversy over the "arbitrary" removal of Takht jathedars, Giani Kuldeep Singh Gargai today assumed charge as the Jathedar of Takht Sri Kesgarh Sahib at Anandpur Sahib and later as the officiating Jathedar of Akal Takht in Amritsar amid opposition from Sikh and Nihang organisations. However, Giani Raghbir Singh and Giani Sultan Singh, who were removed as the jathedars of Akal Takht and Takht Sri Kesgarh Sahib, respectively, by the SGPC and continue to hold the charge of the head granthi and the granthi of the Golden Temple, respectively, were conspicuous by their absence today. Similarly, there was no representative from Sikh organisations. Though the SGPC had announced the schedule for today's installation.

DEEPAK HOODA DECLARED PRESIDENT OF ROHTAK BAR ASSOCIATION AMID CONTROVERSY

MUTILATED BODY FOUND ON CHURDHAR PEAK IN HIMACHAL, BELIEVED TO BE OF MISSING HARYANA YOUTH


Diary Times Desk: The mutilated body of a youth was found in a deep snow-covered gorge along the Churdhar Trek in Himachal Pradesh's Sirmaur district, officials said on Tuesday. A team of local volunteers that spotted the body on Monday evening believe it to be that of Akshay Sahani (28), a resident of Panchkula in Haryana, who went missing on February 26, while trekking to the Churdhar peak on the occasion of Mahashivratri. According to the volunteers from the Nohradhar area, the body was found near the statue of Lord Shiva, close to the last rest point on the trek. No other trekker has been reported missing in the Churdhar region in recent months, they said. Churdhar peak is one of the highest in the Shivalik ranges standing at an altitude of 11,965 feet located in Sirmaur district. SDM Sangrah Sunil Kayath said that the administration cannot confirm the identity of the body to be of the missing tourist from Haryana. However, his parents have been informed and they are on their way to Sangrah to identify the body, he said. The body is being brought to Sangrah where the postmortem examination and other scientific tests would be conducted to ascertain the identity.

REVENUE DEFICIT GRANT REDUCING BUT DEVELOPMENT NOT AFFECTED: GOVERNOR

Diary Times Desk: Governor Shiv Pratap Shukla today said that his government had initiated several welfare schemes and fulfilled six of the 10 guarantees despite financial constraints due to the reduction in the revenue deficit grant (RDG) from the Central Government. Shukla addressed the Assembly on the opening day of the 16-day Budget session of the Vidhan Sabha, which would conclude on March 28. Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu, Speaker Kuldeep Pathania and Leader of the Opposition Jai Ram Thakur welcomed him. The Governor delivered a 53-page speech in Hindi in one and a half hour. "The state is facing a financial crunch as the Goods and Services Tax (GST) compensation to states is coming to an end and the RDG will reduce to Rs 3,257 crore during 2025-26. However, this will not impact the pace of development," he said. Being a hilly state with inadequate resources, Himachal was dependent on central grants, he added. Shukla said that for 2025-26, the Budget estimates stand at Rs 6,270 crore, "thus demonstrating that my government has not allowed.

APPROPRIATION BILL TO MEET ADDITIONAL EXPENDITURE OF RS 2,848.43 CRORE PASSED

Diary Times Desk: The Vidhan Sabha today passed the Himachal Pradesh Appropriation (Number 4) Bill, 2024, to meet an expenditure of Rs 2,848.43 crore made on certain services for the financial year 2015-16 in excess of the amount granted for those services in that year. Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu, who holds the finance portfolio, laid the Bill on the table of the House to facilitate the passing of the supplementary budget and authorisation for appropriation of certain sums out of the Consolidated Fund of the state of Himachal Pradesh. "From the Consolidated Fund of the state of Himachal Pradesh, a sum of Rs 28,48,43, 38,113 shall be deemed to have been authorised to be paid and applied to meet the amount spent for defraying the charges during 2015-16, in excess of the amount authorised for these services in that year," the Bill reads. This additional amount spent in excess of the amount granted has been spent on various heads, including Rs 190.95 crore on revenue, Rs 4.65 lakh on education, Rs 63.08 crore on roads and bridges, Rs 185.41 crore on irrigation and water supply, Rs 4.25 crore on forest and wild life, Rs 76.73 lakh on social justice and empowerment, Rs 37.25 crore on power development, Rs 34.73 crore on urban development, Rs 47.13 crore as revenue and Rs 2,319.16 crore as capital in the Finance Department.

The franchise had asked for KL Rahul to be the team's captain, but he very much wishes to contribute for the side as a player in the upcoming tournament," sources told IANS on Tuesday. Axar has been with DC since 2019, and was retained for a whopping Rs 18 crore ahead of the IPL 2025 mega auction. In his IPL career of 150 games, Axar has scored 1653 runs at a strike rate of 130.88 while picking 123 wickets with his left-arm spin bowling at an economy rate of 7.28. Axar had been India's vice-captain during their 4-1 T20I series win over England at home this year, but his possible elevation as DC's captain for IPL 2025 is going to be a major test of his leadership skills, especially with the franchise still looking for their first-ever championship win.
