
AMIT SHAH ON J&K PRAISES EFFORTS TO TACKLE TERRORISM IN J&K

Diary Times Desk : Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Friday reiterated Modi government's zero tolerance policy towards terrorism and lambasted previous dispensations for being 'soft on terror'.

Amit Shah, while replying to the debate on the working of Ministry of Home Affairs in the House, listed out some path-breaking decisions of Modi government including abrogation of Article 370 and how it brought lasting peace in the valley. Home Minister, speaking in Rajya Sabha, said that after the removal of Article 370, the involvement of locals with terrorists has completed ended, marking the restoration of peace in the entire region.

He further said that the glorification of terrorists, which was often seen during UPA rule, has come to an end during the NDA's decade-long rule. He also noted a 70 percent reduction in deaths due to terror-related incidents. Comparing figures, he said that between 2004 and 2014, the region saw 7,217 terror incidents, whereas between 2014 and 2024, this number dropped to 2,242.

The Home Minister expressed deep respect for the sacrifices made by police personnel and also took the opportunity to highlight their achievements in strengthening the nation's security and governance. "I want to pay tribute to all the police personnel who have sacrificed their lives for the safety and security of the people. Thanks to their immense sacrifice, India is now poised to play an important role in global affairs, a position we've been working toward for over 76 years. My heartfelt gratitude goes to the families of these brave officers for their unwavering service," he said.

"OUR HOPE IS...": AFTER TRUDEAU EXIT, INDIA RECALLS "LICENCE TO EXTREMISTS"

Diary Times Desk : Days after Mark Carney replaced Justin Trudeau as Prime Minister of Canada, India, on Friday, recalled "the downturn in India-Canada relations". New Delhi squarely blamed the "licence given to extremists" under Justin Trudeau for the strained ties, hoping to rebuild them after the change in Canada's leadership.

Justin Trudeau's ouster was complete last week when Canada's ruling Liberal Party replaced him with a new prime minister. An entirely new Cabinet was sworn in on March 14. Both Ottawa and New Delhi now hope to rebuild ties, which currently are at a historic low.

On a question regarding Canada at a weekly press briefing, India's Ministry of External Affairs today said that "The downturn in India-Canada relations was caused by the license that was given to the extremist and secessionist elements in the country", adding that "Our hope is that we can rebuild our ties based on mutual trust and sensitivity."

Shortly before taking oath as Prime Minister, Mark Carney had also expressed his keenness to build on ties with "like-minded countries" and had called the chance to rebuild ties with India as an "opportunity" he would like to work on.

"What Canada will be looking to do is to diversify our trading relationships with like-minded countries – and there are opportunities to rebuild the relationship with India. There needs to be a shared sense of values around that commercial relationship, and once I am the prime minister, I look forward to the opportunity to build that," he had said. Ties between India and Canada saw a sharp decline after a surge in incidents of radicalisation and extremism by rogue elements of 'Khalistani' separatist groups, which Justin Trudeau permitted, describing them as "free speech" and "freedom of expression".

'CASH AT JUDGE'S HOUSE': SC DISPELS 'MISINFORMATION AND RUMOURS' ABOUT DELHI HC JUSTICE YASHWANT VARMA'S TRANSFER

Diary Times Desk : Amid reports about the transfer of Justice Yashwant Varma of the Delhi High Court to the Allahabad High Court following alleged recovery of unaccounted cash at his residence during a fire incident, the Supreme Court on Friday sought to dispel "misinformation and rumours", saying the transfer proposal was still under consideration. In a statement, the top court clarified that the proposal to transfer Justice Varma to the Allahabad High Court was not linked to the in-house enquiry initiated by the Delhi High Court Chief Justice. "The proposal for transfer of Mr. Justice Yashwant Varma, who is the second senior most Judge in the Delhi High Court and a member of the Collegium, to his parent High Court i.e. the High Court of Judicature at Allahabad, where he will be ninth in seniority, is independent and separate from the Inhouse enquiry procedure," the statement read. "The proposal was examined by the Collegium comprising of the Chief Justice of India and four senior-most Judges of the Supreme Court on 20th March 2025, and thereafter letters were written to the consultee Judges of the Supreme Court,.

HIMACHAL VIDHAN SABHA BUDGET SESSION: EDUCATION MINISTER SAID- 550 LECTURER POSTS WILL BE AVAILABLE IN GOVERNMENT SCHOOLS NEXT MONTH

Diary Times Desk: 550 posts of lecturers will be filled in Himachal's government schools next month. The appointment process will be started after the recruitment exam results are declared. This will overcome the shortage of teachers in schools. This information was given by Education Minister Rohit Thakur during the Question Hour in the budget session of the Assembly on Friday. Answering the question of BJP MLA Reena Kashyap, the Education Minister said that the vacant posts of teachers in schools in tribal areas will be filled on priority, so that the studies of the students are not affected. He said that 336 principals have been promoted. The process of filling 700 posts of PGT is going on in the Education Department. Earlier, PGT Hindi and Physics lecturers have been appointed. The Education Minister said that the previous government had filled only 511 posts of PGT, while the Congress had approved the filling of 700 posts in the very first year of forming the government. In response to the question of MLA Reena Kashyap, he said that 11 posts have been filled and 7 are vacant in Senior Secondary School Jadol Taproli under Pachhad Assembly constituency. The vacant post of Principal has already been filled. He said that the post of clerk has not been created in Senior Secondary School Kotla Barog. Soon a clerk will be deployed in the school.

HIMACHAL NEWS: 6225 CRORES SPENT ON 4 NEW RAILWAY LINES IN HIMACHAL, UNION RAILWAY MINISTER ASHWANI VAISHNAV GAVE INFORMATION

Diary Times Desk : Out of the 4 new rail lines of total length of 255 km costing Rs 13168 crore in Himachal Pradesh, 61 km has been commissioned. He informed that in the Bhanupalli-Bilaspur-Beri (63.5 km) new line project, out of a total of 124.02 hectares of land in Himachal Pradesh. 79.57 hectares has been acquired and work has been started. Rs 5205 crore has been spent on this project and Himachal owes an amount of Rs 1351 crore. He informed that work on the Chandigarh-Baddi (30 km) new rail line project has been started. BJP'S 'ALAMGIR RAHUL-ZEB' SWIPE AT CONGRESS OVER CONTENTIOUS MUSLIM QUOTA BILL IN KARNATAKA

Diary Times Desk : The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) on Friday took a swipe at the Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha, Rahul Gandhi, after the Conaress-ruled Karnataka government passed a bill that allows for 4% reservation for Muslims in government contracts in the assembly. BJP spokesperson Sambit Patra claimed that Rahul Gandhi pushed the state government's decision, alleging he was using the "crutches of Muslim quota" to advance his politics as he knows that he would not be otherwise able to deliver. Patra also claimed that Gandhi was politically unfit and used rhyming Urdu lines to throw several barbs at him. Referring to Mughal ruler Aurangzeb, Patra said that "Alamair Rahul-Zeb" is nursing the ambition to become "Jahanpanah", according to PTI. The BJP leader alleged that the Congress government's decision in Karnataka is only the beginning and will create a divide in the country. He claimed that the Opposition party could even give a "100% quota" to the minority community in pursuit of its appeasement politics.

GRABBING BREASTS, SNAPPING PYJAMA STRING NOT ATTEMPT TO RAPE: ALLAHABAD HIGH COURT

Diary Times Desk : Grabbing breasts of the victim, breaking the string of her pyjama and trying to drag her beneath the culvert are not enough to charge an accused with the offence of rape or attempt to rape, the Allahabad high court observed recently, describing such an act as "aggravated sexual assault" while modifying a summoning order and altering the charges against two accused. The two accused were initially summoned by the district court to face trial under Section 376 of the IPC (rape) and Section 18 of the Pocso Act, but the HC instead directed that the accused be tried under Section 354-B of the IPC (assault or use of criminal force with intent to disrobe) with Sections 9/10 of the Pocso Act (aggravated sexual assault). The court observed, "The allegations levelled against the accused, Pawan and Akash, and facts of the case hardly constitute an offence of attempt to rape in the case. In order to bring out a charge of attempt to rape, the prosecution must establish that it had gone beyond the stage of preparation." The difference between preparation and actual attempt to commit an offence consists chiefly in the greater degree of determination, a bench of Justice Ram Manohar Narayan Mishra observed.

AMIT SHAH TAKES 'KAALA CHASHMA' JIBE AT RAHUL GANDHI ON J&K SITUATION



Diary Times Desk: Union home minister Amit Shah on Friday took a sharp jibe at Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi while speaking in the Rajya Sabha on counterterrorism operations and development in Jammu and Kashmir. "If someone is sitting with kaala chashma (black glasses) on, how is it possible to show them the development?" Shah asked in a swipe towards the Congress leader, according to ANI. He also spoke about Gandhi's Bharat Jodo Yatra in Kashmir, saying that the Congress leader had claimed to see terrorists from afar. 388 INDIANS DEPORTED FROM US SINCE JANUARY 2025: GOVERNMENT

Diary Times Desk : A total of 388 Indian nationals have been deported from the US since January 2025, the government informed Parliament on Friday. Of these, 333 were deported directly from the US on three separate military flights in February. Also, the US deported 55 Indian nationals through Panama in commercial flights, Minister of State for External Affairs Kirti Vardhan Singh said in a written response in Lok Sabha. The Ministry of External Affairs was asked whether the Union government has received the details of the persons to be deported from the US this year, and if US officials were requested to provide them adequate facilities. The ministry was also asked whether Prime Minister Narendra Modi had raised concerns with President Donald Trump and top US officials over the "ill treatment" meted out to the deportees. In his reply, Kirti Vardhan Singh said, "Of the 388 Indian nationals deported since January, 333 individuals, after verification.

GOVERNMENT TO LAPSE \$23 BILLION SCHEME TO BOOST DOMESTIC MANUFACTURING: REPORT

Diary Times Desk : The government is likely to let its \$23 billion domestic manufacturing incentive program lapse, just four years after its launch, reported news agency Reuters. The initiative, which was designed to attract firms away from China and boost local production, will not be extended beyond the 14 pilot sectors, and production deadlines will not be pushed forward desnite requests from some companies, as per four government officials mentioned in the report. The Production-Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme, introduced in 2020, aimed to increase manufacturing's share of India's economy to 25% by 2025. The program offered cash incentives to companies that met production goals, attracting major global players such as Apple supplier Foxconn and Indian conglomerate Reliance Industries. However, many firms either failed to start production or faced delays in receivina incentives. government documents.

Diary Times Desk : US President Donald Trump signed an order Thursday aimed at "eliminating" the Department of Education, a decades-old goal of the American right, which wants individual states to run schools free from the federal government. Surrounded by schoolchildren sitting at desks set up in the East Room of the White House, Trump smiled as held up the order after signing it at a special ceremony. Trump said the order would "begin eliminating the federal Department of Education once and for all." "We're going to shut it down and shut it down as quickly as possible. It's doing us no good," Trump said. "We're going to return education back to the states where it belongs." The Education Department. created in 1979, cannot be shuttered without the approval of Congress -- but Trump's order will likely have the power to starve it of funds and staff. The move honors one of Trump's campaign promises and is among the most drastic steps yet in the brutal overhaul of the government that Trump is carrying out with the help of tech tycoon Elon Musk. The order directs Education Secretary Linda McMahon to "take all necessary steps to facilitate the closure of the Department of Education and return education authority to the States."

WORLD'S GLACIERS ARE RAPIDLY SHRINKING DUE TO CLIMATE **CHANGE: UN**

Diary Times Desk : All 19 of the world's glacier regions experienced a net loss of mass in 2024 for the third consecutive year, the United Nations said on Friday, warning that saving the planet's glaciers was now a matter of "survival". Five of the last six years have seen the most rapid glacier retreat on record, the UN's World Meteorological Organization weather, climate and water agency said, on the inaugural World Day for Glaciers. "Preservation of glaciers is not just an environmental, economic and societal necessity: it's a matter of survival," said WMO chief Celeste Saulo. Beyond the continental ice sheets of Greenland and Antarctica, more than 275 000 glaciers worldwide cover approximately 700,000 square kilometres, said the WMO. But they are rapidly shrinking due to climate change.

HEATHROW AIRPORT SHUTDOWN MAY HAVE CASCADING EFFECTS, AIR INDIA **AMONG THOSE HIT**



Diary Times Desk : The Heathrow airport in London (LHR), one of the busiest in the world and an important international hub for Indian passengers, was forced shut due to a fire at a power substation near the airport, leading to massive flight disruptions for the day. "Heathrow is experiencing a significant power outage across the airport due to a large fire at a nearby electrical substation. Whilst fire crews are responding to the incident, we do not have clarity on when power may be reliably restored. To maintain the safety of our passengers and colleagues, we have no choice but to close Heathrow until 23h59 on 21 March 2025," the airport, which serves as a major gateway for travel between India and the UK, and also as a transit point for those travelling to other parts of Europe or the US, said in a statement.

TRUMP AWARDS NEXT-GENERATION F-47 FIGHTER JET CONTRACT TO BOEING

Diary Times Desk : US President Donald Trump announced Friday that Boeing has been awarded a major contract for the Air Force's high-tech nextgeneration F-47 fighter plane. The contract is aimed at continuing the development of the replacement for the F-22 stealth warplane -- which has been in operation for some two decades -- with a new, more advanced aircraft that will be able to operate alongside uncrewed drones. After a rigorous and thorough competition between some of America's top aerospace companies, the Air Force is going to be awarding the contract for the Next Generation Air Dominance (NGAD) platform to Boeing," Trump told reporters at the Oval Office. He said the price of the contract could not be revealed for security reasons. "Nothing in the world comes even close to it, and it'll be known as the F-47, the generals picked a title, and it's a beautiful number, F-47," said Trump, who is the 47th president of the United States. The announcement is a boon for Boeing, which faced a difficult last year in which it struggled with a lengthy labor strike and safety problems.

ERDOGAN WARNS AGAINST PROTESTS OVER ISTANBUL MAYOR'S DETENTION

Diary Times Desk : President Tayyip Erdogan warned on Friday that Turkey would not tolerate street violence or public disruptions after the detention of Istanbul's mayor Ekrem Imamoglu prompted some of the biggest shows of civil disobedience in more than a decade. "We will not accept the disruption of public order. Just as we have never vielded to street terrorism, we will not surrender to vandalism," Erdogan, 71, told an audience in the capital Ankara. The warning came after thousands of people protested for two days in Istanbul, Ankara and other cities, including at university campuses, leading to some clashes. Police used water cannon to disperse some crowds and have closed down streets. More demonstrations are planned later on Friday and tensions could rise at the weekend when a court is expected to rule to formally arrest Imamoglu, Erdogan's main political rival who leads him in some opinion polls. An arrest could also accelerate a three-day selloff in Turkish assets that prompted the central bank to intervene to protect the currency.

INDONESIAN VOLCANO SENDS ASH CLOUD 8KM HIGH, SOME **FLIGHTS CANCELLED**

Diary Times Desk : An eruption by Indonesia's Mount Lewotobi Laki-Laki volcano, located in the southeastern part of Flores Island, spewed ash clouds more than 8km (5 miles) into the air, disrupting flights and raising emergency warnings to the highest level for residents and tourists. Indonesia's Center for Volcanology and Geological Disaster Mitigation warned locals and visitors on Friday against activities within a radius of 7-8km (4.4-5 miles) in the southwest and northeast sectors of the eruption. The ash column was observed grey to black with thick intensity," Indonesia's volcanology agency said in a statement about the eruption that began at 10:56pm local time on Thursday night (14:56 GMT). There were no immediate reports of damage to nearby villages, but the agency warned residents of the potential for volcanic mudflow due to heavy rainfall. The long eruption prompted the country's geological agency to raise the volcano's alert level to the highest of the four-tiered system.

PAKISTAN ARMY CAPTAIN, 10 TERRORISTS KILLED IN OPERATION IN KHYBER PAKHTUNKHWA

Diary Times Desk : A Pakistani Army captain and at least 10 terrorists associated with a banned outfit were killed during a gunfight in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's Dera Ismail Khan district, the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) has said. The intelligence-based operation (IBO) was conducted on Thursday following reports of the presence of terrorists in the area, a statement from the military's media wing said. It said that during the intense fire exchange, Captain Hasnain Akhtar fought gallantly and made the ultimate sacrifice, leading his troops from the front. "Hasnain was a brave officer and renowned for his courage and bold and daring actions.



PUNJAB BUDGET SESSION: GOVERNOR'S ADDRESS MARRED BY CONGRESS WALKOUT

Diary Times Desk : The Punjab Assembly Budget Session began on Friday with the Governor's address. Congress MLAs entered the Assembly wearing black armbands to protest against the state government's "ill-treatment of farmers" and its alleged failure to properly handle the issue of a colonel being beaten up by police in Patiala. They entered the Well of the House and raised slogans against the government before staging a walkout. The Governor's address will be followed by obituary references. The Budget session will last till March 28. Governor Gulab Chand Kataria, addressing the opening session, said: "The Punjab government has circulated a draft agriculture policy to all stakeholders, including farmers and labourer unions, seeking comments." He said: "The policy has been prepared by an 11-member committee based on inputs regarding environmental, cultural and crop aspects for sustainable agriculture, protecting natural resources, and increasing farmers' income." He said, "The government has ensured more than eight hours of power supply to agricultural consumers during the paddy season without any cuts to domestic, commercial, or industrial consumers."

AAP MAKES MANISH SISODIA PUNJAB AFFAIRS IN-CHARGE

Diary Times Desk : In a major restructuring of Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), senior AAP leader Manish Sisodia was on Friday appointed the party's incharge for Punjab while Satyendra Jain was given the role of co-incharge. A meeting of the party's Political Affairs Committee was held at the house of AAP convener Arvind Kejriwal here, where a series of key decisions were taken. Former Delhi minister Saurabh Bharadwaj, who recently lost the Delhi Assembly election from Greater Kailash was appointed the party's convener for Delhi, replacing Gopal Rai. Rai, meanwhile, has been made in-charge of Gujarat. For Goa and Jammu and Kashmir, Pankaj Gupta and Mehraj Malik, respectively, given the key responsibilities. were Announcing the key decisions, AAP MP Sandeep Pathak said a discussion was also held on the BJP's poll promises for Delhi.

NIA FILES CHARGESHEET AGAINST FOREIGN-BASED TERRORISTS IN CHANDIGARH GRENADE ATTACK CASE

Diary Times Desk : The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has filed a chargesheet in the Chandigarh grenade attack case against US-based gangsterturned-terrorist Harpreet Singh, alias Happy Passia, and Pakistan-based terrorist Harwinder Singh Rinda. Two other accused, Rohan Masih and Vishal Masih, have also been named in the chargesheet. They hurled the grenade while sitting in an autorickshaw. Though, Kuldeep Kumar, the autorickshaw driver has not been charged by the NIA. The grenade attack occurred on September 11, 2024, at a house in Sector 10D, Chandigarh. Initially, the Chandigarh Police investigated the case, which was later transferred to the NIA. The agency probed the wider angle of the conspiracy and the smuggling of weapons and explosives across borders. According to the NIA, Rohan Masih and Vishal Masih hurled a hand grenade at the house at the behest of Happy Passia and Harwinder Singh Rinda. The accused carried out a reconnaissance before the attack.

PUNJAB MAHILA CONGRESS PROTEST AGAINST AAP OVER DELAY IN RS 1,000 ASSISTANCE

Diary Times Desk : The Punjab Mahila Congress on Friday staged a massive protest against the AAP government in Punjab for failing to pay Rs 1,000 monthly assistance to every woman as promised before the 2022 elections. Led by Punjab Mahila Congress president Gursharan Kaur Randhawa, the protest saw participation of senior party leaders, including Punjab Congress president Amarinder Singh Raja Warring, Congress Legislative Party leader Partap Singh Bajwa, Congress general secretary incharge Rajasthan Sukhjinder Singh Randhawa. Addressing the protestors, Warring criticised the AAP for failing to fulfil its promise to pay Rs 1,000 every month to the women of Punjab. He pointed out that 36 months had passed since the promise was made, yet the government had failed to provide the assistance. Warring asserted that this was a clear case of cheating. He said not only will the Congress ensure that the AAP starts paying Rs 1,000 per month to women, but it would also seek arrears of Rs 36,000 for each eligible woman.

HC ISSUES NOTICE ON HABEAS CORPUS PLEA FOR FARMER LEADER DALLEWAL'S RELEASE

Diary Times Desk : In a late-evening hearing, the Punjab and Haryana High Court issued a notice of motion to the State of Punjab and the Director-General of Police on a habeas corpus petition seeking the release of Jagjit Singh Dallewal, leader of the joint forum Sanyukt Kisan Morcha (Non-Political). Among other things, petitionerfarmer leader Gurmukh Singh contended that Dallewal was allegedly in illegal custody by the respondents. The case will now come up for further hearing on Monday. "The detention appears to be an attempt to suppress the farmers' movement and instil fear among peaceful protesters, violating the fundamental rights to freedom of speech and expression, assembly, and association under Article 19 of the Constitution", the petitioner contended. In his petition placed before Justice Manisha Batra's Bench, the petitioner contended that "300 to 400 others members of farmer organization were also missing. Going into details, he added Dallewal -- a prominent figure in the farmers' protests--had been actively advocating for a "legal guarantee of Minimum Support Price (MSP) for crops". His "unlawful detention" violated fundamental rights under Articles 21 and 22 of the Constitution, as no "formal arrest procedures or charges" were followed. The petitioner further sought the court's intervention to ensure the safety and security of Dallewal and other missing farmer leaders.

JJP LEADER SHOT DEAD, 2 OTHERS INJURED IN PANIPAT'S VIKAS NAGAR



The injured, Vinay and Vineet, are currently undergoing treatment. Preliminary investigations suggest that old enmity may be behind the murder of Ravinder Minna. According to information, the assailant shot Minna in the forehead, while Vinay and Vineet were hit in the stomach. attacker fled the scene The immediately after the shooting. Family members rushed the three to a private hospital, where doctors declared Minna dead on arrival. The injured were admitted to the ICU. Upon receiving the news, SP Lokender Singh, DSP Suresh Kumar, and police teams arrived at the spot and the hospital to investigate the incident. JJP district president Ramniwas Patwari, along with other party leaders, also visited the hospital.

OPPOSITION YOUNG GUNS PUT GOVT ON MAT FOR 'LACKLUSTRE BUDGET'

Diary Times Desk : Young legislators belonging to the Congress and the INLD stole the show during a discussion on the Budget in the Assembly today. At least two first-MLAs–Aditva time Suriewala (Congress) and Arjun Chautala(INLD) -tried to put the BJP government on the mat for "lacklustre Budget", even as the senior legislators played to the agllery. Armed with facts and figures, Surjewala alleged that contrary to the rosy picture of the state's economy painted by Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini during his Budget speech, Haryana was on the verge of "financial emergency" with a huge debt burden. "From November 1, 1966. to March 31, 2014, the state's debt was pegged at Rs 60,293 crore. From 2014-15 to 2025-26, the debt liability has mounted to Rs 3.52 lakh crore, registering a whopping increase of over 600%, which worked out to be Rs 73 crore per day and Rs 3 crore per hour," Surjewala alleged. Claiming that all major big-ticket projects were initiated during the Congress regime between 2004 and 2014, the Congress legislator alleged that even in the Rs 5,000 crore allocation for "Lado Laxmi Yojana" only about 20% of women would benefit. Chautala alleged that the state's debt was increasing at an annual rate of 13%, which accounted for nearly 28% of the state's gross domestic product (GDP).

RS 356 CRORE PAYMENTS PENDING UNDER HIMCARE HEALTH SCHEME: SHANDIL

Diary Times Desk : Payments to the tune of over Rs 356 crore were pending under the Himcare scheme and over Rs 108 crore under the Ayushman scheme in the state. Health Minister Dhani Ram Shandil gave this information in the Assembly today in response to questions raised by MLAs Janak Raj (Bharmour), Randhir Sharma (Naina Devi) and Vipin Singh Parmar (Sullah). He reiterated that the government had not stopped the two schemes and in the past two years, up to February 20, 2025, around 1.20 lakh patients had been treated under the Avushman scheme and around 5.68 lakh patients under the Himcare scheme. The Himcare scheme, in particular, has become a bone of contention between the government and the Opposition. While the BJP accuses the government of stalling the yojana, the latter says it is being reformed by plugging loopholes. Meanwhile, Agriculture Minister Chander Kumar informed the House that the Himachal Pradesh Dairy Cooperative had procured 92,270,946 litres of milk from dairy owners between February 1, 2023, and January 31, 2025, and made Rs 342.34 crore payments.

GOVT SEEKING LEGAL OPINION TO TAKE OVER POWER PROJECTS OPERATING WITHOUT TIMELINES: SUKHU

Diary Times Desk : Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu today said that the state government was seeking legal opinion to power projects take over operating without set timelines and thus were harming Himachal's interests. Sukhu. while presiding over the International Conference on Dam Safety here, said that if required, the government would take over all such projects in which Himachal's interests had been completely janored. Due to immense hydroelectric power potential. Himachal was becoming the focal point in the renewable energy sector globally, he added. He said, "River waters are the main source of power generation in the state but during initial years, there was no timeline set for licences issued to power companies, which is normally for 35 to 40 years. It is because of this the state has suffered substantive losses."

BJP TARGETS GOVT OVER CHIEF ENGINEER NEGI'S DEATH, STAGES WALKOUT

Diary Times Desk : The Congress and BJP legislators had heated exchanges over the death of Vimal Negi, Chief Engineer, Himachal Pradesh Power Corporation Limited (HPPCL), in the Assembly here today. Not satisfied with the action taken by the government, the BJP legislators walked out of the House, demanding a CBI probe into the matter. Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu and his fellow ministers accused the BJP of trying to politicise the matter and said that appropriate action had been taken in the matter. "The bereaved family is satisfied with the government action. Only the BJP is not satisfied because it wants to politicise the issue," said Revenue Minister Jagat Singh Negi. After Vimal Negi's family and colleagues blocked road till late yesterday evening, the government suspended Director (Electricals) Desh Raj and transferred Managing Director Harikesh Meena from the HPPCL. An FIR for abetment to commit suicide was also registered against Desh Raj and Meena. Another FIR was also registered against the Director (Personnel) later.

2 MEN ARRESTED FOR VANDALISING HIMACHAL BUS IN KHARAR


Diary Times Desk : Police have arrested the two men involved in the vandalism of a Himachal Road Transport Corporation (HRTC) bus (Chandigarh-Hamirpur) at Kharar on March 18. Rupnagar resident Hardeep Singh and Fazilka resident Gagandeep Singh had been living in Mohali for some time and were arrested from there, police said. Both are around 30 years of age. One of them is a taxi driver and the other an auto-rickshaw driver. Police have also recovered the car used in the incident. Kharar DSP Karan Singh Sandhu said, "The two have been arrested under the Prevention of Damage to Public Property Act and the BNS at the City Kharar police station. They said that after seeing videos of recent incidents they got agitated and damaged the vehicle. They have been counselled and the videos taken note of." The two masked men had vandalised the HRTC bus near Shivjot Enclave in Kharar, leaving passengers panicked. The incident was seen as a retaliatory move in protest against the Himachal Pradesh Police action against radical elements following display of flags and posters on vehicles near Manikaran in Kullu. The two men intercepted the bus and vandalised it in full public view before fleeing the spot.

REDUCED REVENUE DEFICIT GRANT HURTING HIMACHAL: AGNIHOTRI

Diary Times Desk : Leader of the Opposition Jai Ram Thakur, when he was Chief Minister, had told the Central Government that it would be difficult to run the state with reducing revenue deficit grant (RDG), said Deputy Chief Minister Mukesh Agnihotri while taking part in the debate on the Budget proposals in the Assembly today. To Sullah MLA Vipin Parmar's charge that the Goods and Services Tax (GST) compensation and the RDG had reduced for all states, Agnihotri said that it didn't change the fact that our government was getting much less RDG as compared to the previous BJP government. "The Jai Ram Thakur government got GST compensation and much higher RDG. It may be his luck, but the fact is that our government is getting much less RDG," he added. Bharmour MLA Janak Raj challenged the government to reveal how it was going to make the state self-reliant by 2027. "How is the state going to become selfreliant by 2027 and the most prosperous one by 2032? The Budget does not reveal the roadmap to make the state self-reliant by 2027," he said while participating in the debate over the Budget proposals.

GOVT WILL PROTECT FARMERS FROM DISPLACEMENT: CM

Diary Times Desk : Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu met a delegation of the Himachal Pradesh Kisan Sabha at Chowra Maidan here today and assured it of considering its demands sympathetically. A large number of farmers and horticulturists from the state staged a protest in Shimla in support of their demand for the resolution of various land-related issues, including eviction from land. The protesters, carrying banners and placards, marched from the Panchavat Bhawan to the Ambedkar Chowk. Sukhu said that ensuring the welfare of farmers and orchardists was the priority of the state government, and they would not be displaced under any circumstance. "A provision of the Agriculture Loan Interest Subvention Scheme has been made in the Budget, under which the land of the farmers will be saved from being auctioned," he added. The Chief Minister said that he was aware of the problems of the farmers and every effort would be made to address their grievances. Rakesh Singha, a former MLA, said that evictions were being carried out in violation of the rules. He added that the Supreme Court had also deemed land evictions as illegal and a violation of natural iustice.

HASSAN NAWAZ'S BLISTERING MAIDEN TON KEEPS SERIES ALIVE

A stunner of a catch by Haris Rauf at short fine leg had sent Finn Allen packing early while the pacer then had Tim Seifert holing a skier to mid-on. Chapman, though, singlehandedly carried the momentum forward for the Black Caps with a clinical display of ball-strikina. There weren't any other notable contributions in the top six as everyone rallied around Chapman's one-man show. Pakistan's ground fielding was quite sloppy and with Chapman going berserk.
