## MODI PAYS TRIBUTES TO RSS FOUNDERS, SAYS THEIR MEMORIAL DEDICATED TO VALUES OF INDIAN CULTURE

**Diary Times Desk:** Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday visited Dr Hedgewar Smruti Mandir in Nagpur and paid tributes at the memorials dedicated to Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) founder Keshav Baliram Hedgewar and second sarsanghchalak (chief) MS Golwalkar.

RSS chief Mohan Bhagwat, former Sangh general secretary Suresh Bhaiyyaji Joshi, Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis and Union minister Nitin Gadkari were present during Modi's visit to the Smruti Mandir in Reshimbagh, the administrative headquarters of the RSS. Modi also met RSS officer-bearers in the Smruti Bhavan located at the memorial and took group pictures with them.

The memorials are dedicated to the values of Indian culture, nationalism and the organisation, Modi wrote in Hindi in a message book at the venue."The memorial of the two strong pillars of the RSS is an inspiration to lakhs of swayamsevaks who have dedicated themselves to the service of the nation," the PM said in his message.

"I am overwhelmed to visit the Smruti Mandir which cherishes the memories of Param Pujaniya Dr Hedgewar and Pujya Guruji," he added. Modi's visit coincides with the Sangh's Pratipada programme, marking Gudi Padwa, the beginning of the Hindu New Year. He visited the memorial for the first time after becoming the PM.

# 'NEVER AGAIN': BIHAR CM NITISH KUMAR TELLS AMIT SHAH ON BREAK-UPS WITH BJP





**Diary Times Desk:** Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar assured Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Sunday that he would "never again" ditch the BJP, having done so "twice by mistake". With Assembly elections barely a few months away, the JD(U) president's averment came at a function in Patna where Shah and he unveiled several projects of the Centre and the state.

Shah, a former BJP president, had given a pep talk to the cadre late Saturday night, when he is said to have asserted "our victory in Bihar will resonate far and wide". Widely regarded as the BJP's principal strategist, Shah is likely to wind up his two-day tour later in the day with a brainstorming session at Kumar's place, where other NDA constituents are also expected. At the function in the state capital, Shah was visibly warm towards Kumar.

The JD(U) president seemed chuffed as he told the gathering, "This sprawling auditorium has been filled beyond capacity". He was greeted with roars of "Jai Shri Ram", in an obvious indication of the overwhelming presence of BJP cadre at the event, but the leader, proud of his "secular" credentials, took it in his stride.

"What did the ones in power before (RJD-Congress combine) do? They used to get votes of Muslims but could never put a stop to clashes between communities," he said. "There was no healthcare in Bihar worth the name. No good educational facilities. We came to power in November 2005 and things started to look up," claimed Kumar, recalling the ascent to power in the state of the JD(U)-BJP combine. A BJP ally since the mid-90s, Kumar split with the party in 2014, only to realign three years later. In 2022, he again parted ways, vowing to dislodge the BJP from power at the Centre and bring together parties from across the country to form the INDIA bloc. However, ahead of last year's Lok Sabha polls, the JD(U) supremo did yet another volte face and was back in the NDA.

### 1 DEAD. 7 INJURED AS BENGALURU-KAMAKHYA EXPRESS DERAILS IN ODISHA'S CUTTACK

Diary Times Desk: One person was killed and three others injured as an express train derailed in Odisha's Cuttack district on Sunday, officials said. Eleven coaches of the SMVT Bengaluru-Kamakhya AC Express derailed at Nirgundi near Manguli at 11.54 am, Chief Public Relations Officer (CPRO) of the East Coast Railway Ashok Kumar Mishra said. The deceased was identified as 22-year-old Suvankar Roy of Alipurdwar in West Bengal, railways said, adding that the youth jumped from the train after derailment and died. However, the railways authorities were waiting for the postmortem report to ascertain the exact cause of the death, an official said. The East Coast Railways in a statement also said that one female passenger suffered grievous injury and two other male passengers are being treated for simple injury. Cuttack District Collector Dattatraya Bhausaheb Shinde, who oversaw the rescue operation, had earlier said that one person died and seven others were injured in the accident, but the railways claimed the number of injured persons was three. "The four other persons though being shifted to hospital, did not get injuries due to derailment. Rather, these people were patients returning home after treatment in Bengaluru. They were also rescued from the derailed bogies and taken to hospital," a senior official claimed.



#### **MOHANLAL EXPRESSES REGRET OVER** 'EMPURAAN' ROW, ASSURES REMOVAL OF **CONTROVERSIAL PORTIONS**

Amidst the intense criticism unleashed by Sangh Parivar against some portions of the movie, Mohanlal said in his Facebook post, "As an artist, it is my duty to ensure that none of my films promote hatred toward any political movement, ideology.

### AFSPA EXTENDED IN MANIPUR, PARTS OF NAGALAND, **ARUNACHAL**



Diary Times Desk: The Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act (AFSPA), which gives armed forces operating in disturbed areas sweeping powers and immunity from prosecution unless approved by the Centre, was on Sunday extended for six months in entire Manipur, except the jurisdictions of 13 police stations, in view of the law and order situation there. The AFSPA, under which a particular state or some areas are declared "disturbed", has also been extended to eight districts in Nagaland and 21 police station areas in five other districts of the state for six months, according to a notification issued by the Union Home Ministry. The law was also extended to Tirap, Changlang and Longding districts in Arunachal Pradesh and three police station areas in Namsai district in the state for six months beginning April 1 after a review of the law and order situation in these northeastern states. The AFSPA, often criticised as a draconian law, gives armed forces operating in disturbed areas sweeping powers to search, arrest and open fire if they deem it necessary.

### 'LALU PRASAD ATE UP FODDER, HE CAN'T THINK ABOUT BIHAR'S WELFARE': AMIT SHAH

Diary Times Desk: Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Sunday slammed RJD supremo Lalu Prasad for his alleged involvement in various scams, and alleged that those who "ate up fodder" cannot think about Bihar's welfare. Addressing a rally in Gopalganj, Shah accused Prasad of ignoring the development of Bihar and working only for the betterment of his family. "The NDA governments, both at the Centre and in Bihar, have been working for the overall development of Bihar. But those who ate up fodder meant for cattle cannot think about the welfare of the people of the state," he alleged. Shah further claimed that Prasad was involved in several scams, including the bitumen scam, the flood relief material supply scam, and the 'Charwaha Vidyalaya' (school for cattle grazers) scam. The fodder scam, exposed in the 1990s when Jharkhand was still part of Bihar, involved fraudulent withdrawals of crores of rupees from treasuries in Doranda, Deoghar, Dumka, and Chaibasa. Prasad, a former Bihar chief minister, is one of the high-profile politicians who was convicted in the case.

### HIMACHAL NEWS: MAJOR ACCIDENT IN MANIKARAN, HIMACHAL PRADESH, TREE FELL ON VEHICLES, SIX KILLED: SOME PEOPLE INJURED

Diary Times Desk: A tragic accident took place on the day of Nav Samvat in the religious city of Manikaran in Himachal Pradesh. A Kayal tree fell on the vehicles parked below due to strong winds. Six people died due to the falling of the tree. After the information, the police reached the spot. Some tourists are also among the dead. The injured are being brought to Kullu Hospital. At present, the deceased are being identified. At the same time, former Chief Minister and Leader of Opposition Jairam Thakur has expressed deep grief over the accident in Manikaran, Kullu and expressed his condolences to the bereaved families. According to eyewitnesses, a tree broke and fell near the road right in front of Manikaran Gurudwara, due to which a street vendor standing there, a car rider and three tourists who were present on the spot died. The deceased are being identified. ADM Kullu Ashwani Kumar said that 6 people have lost their lives in the accident, while many are injured. Relief and rescue work is going on. The administration team has reached the spot.



#### HIMACHAL PRADESH: STUDENTS WITH E GRADE IN 5TH AND 8TH DID NOT PASS, DIRECTORATE OF EDUCATION SOUGHT REPORT

Diary Times Desk: The result of non-board classes of academic session 2024-25 in Himachal Pradesh was declared on Saturday under the detention policy. The detention policy was implemented across the state in the year 2009. After this, now after 16 years, the students who got E grade in class 5th and 8th have not got a chance to sit in the next classes. As soon as the result came out, the Directorate of Elementary Education has sought a report of those with E grade. This policy has been implemented on the students who got E grade in English-Mathematics and Science subjects. Under this, the students who got E-grade will now have exams again after two months. To prepare for examinations, special classes will be held for these students in the schools itself. They will have to get out of E grade. After this they will get a chance to sit in the next classes. Like many states of the country, in Himachal Pradesh also, under the Right to Education Act-2009, students from class 1 to 8 were not failed in the examination.

### HIMACHAL NEWS: TELANGANA GOVERNMENT WILL SET UP TWO POWER PROJECTS IN HIMACHAL PRADESH, 5000 PEOPLE WILL GET EMPLOYMENT

Diary Times Desk: Himachal Pradesh on Saturday signed MoUs with the Telangana government for the 400 MW Seli and 120 MW Miyar hydropower projects to be set up in Lahaul-Spiti district. This is the first time in the history of the state that such a partnership has been initiated and this step will prove to be a milestone in harnessing the immense hydropower potential of the state. These MoUs were signed by Energy Secretary Rakesh Kanwar on behalf of the state government and Principal Secretary Energy Sandeep Kumar Sultania on behalf of the Telangana government in the presence of Chief Minister Sukhwinder Singh Sukhu and Telangana Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka Mallu. Both these projects will be built on the Chenab river at an estimated cost of Rs 6,200 crore.

# HIMACHAL NEWS: NEW CHIEF SECRETARY WILL BE APPOINTED ON OCTOBER 1; PANT, SHARMA'S WAIT INCREASED

Diary Times Desk: The politics of bureaucracy has heated up after Chief Secretary Prabodh Saxena got a six-month extension. For the first time in the history of Himachal, a Chief Secretary has got an extension. The file process of getting extension from the Government of India has been completely confidential. Even the senior officials involved in the race for the post of Chief Secretary could not sense it. The announcement of extension of service at Prabodh Saxena's farewell party on Friday evening left the contenders for the biggest post in the bureaucracy stunned. Prabodh Saxena has got a six-month extension from April 1 to September 30, 2025. In such a situation, now the state will get a new Chief Secretary on October 1. With Prabodh Saxena getting an extension, the wait of Additional Chief Secretaries KK Pant and Omkar Sharma has increased further. On the basis of seniority, 1988 batch IAS officer Sanjay Gupta is in the first place. Currently, he is looking after the work of Chief Minister's Principal Advisor and Chairman of the Electricity Board. After him is 1993 batch officer KK Pant. IAS officer Omkar Sharma, who hails from Chamba district, belongs to the 1994 batch. All three are in the race for the post of Chief Secretary. During the previous government, when RD Dhiman was made the Chief Secretary.

### HIMACHAL NEWS: BULLDOZERS WILL BE RUN ON 259 PROPERTIES BUILT FROM DRUGS IN HIMACHAL PRADESH, DETAILS OF THE NETWORK ALSO SOUGHT

Diary Times Desk: Chief Minister Sukhwinder Singh Sukhu said that illegally acquired properties by drug mafia will be demolished. 259 properties have been identified for action. All district administrations have been directed to complete the mapping of drug network including chitta suppliers and its addicts at the panchayat level by April 20. Expressing displeasure, he said that despite the instructions to complete the mapping by March 15 this year, no district has achieved the target. While chairing a high-level meeting on Saturday, the Chief Minister directed all Superintendents of Police to prepare detailed dossiers on drug smugalers and consumers at the panchayat level with full seriousness. The progress will be reviewed again on April 20 and officers giving wrong reports will be held accountable. He will also conduct surprise inspections at the panchayat level. Sukhu said the state government has passed the Organised Crime Control Act and the Himachal Pradesh Drug Prevention Act.

The court said that the current chairman will continue in his post until the government appoints a new chairman. The term of the chairman of the commission is ending on April 5. The division bench of Justice Vivek Singh Thakur and Justice Ranjan Sharma has also ordered the government to appoint two members of the commission by April 4. The posts of members in the commission have been lying vacant for the last two years. The court said that the government has completed the selection process of members in October 2024. Despite that, the appointment has not been made. A PIL was filed in the High Court regarding this. The petition states that if the State Consumer Commission remains vacant, it will affect the common people and the litiaants. The cases in the State Commission will not be settled

#### EXPLOSION INSIDE MOSQUE IN BEED; 2 ARRESTED; PROBE UNDERWAY

Diary Times Desk: A low intensity explosion was reported inside a mosque in Beed district of Marathwada region in Maharashtra, early Sunday morning. The Beed district police said they have arrested two individuals connection with the gelatin blast stick triggered explosion at the mosque in Ardhamsla village, ahead of Eid-ul-Fitr. There were no casualties in the incident. However, the blast caused cracks in the flooring and structure of the mosque. The explosion took place around 4am on Sunday, triggering panic in the area. The incident occrred ahead of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's scheduled visit to Maharashtra, where he is set to visit Smruti Mandir in Nagpur followed by Deekshabhoomi. Prime Minister is expected to lay the foundation stone for the Madhav Netralaya Premium Centre, an extension of the Madhav Netralaya Eye Institute and Research Centre. Following the explosion, members of the Muslim community staged a protest outside the police station, demanding immediate probe into the incident. A senior officer said exact motive behind the explosion and how the accused obtained the explosives remain under investigation.

### ONE DEAD AFTER 11 COACHES OF THE BANGALORE-KAMAKHYA EXPRESS DERAIL IN ODISHA

Diary Times Desk: One person was dead, while seven were left injured after 11 coaches of the Banaalore-Kamakhva AC Superfast Express train derailed in Odisha's Cuttack district, sparking a swift emergency response. "We have received one body has been received apart from some injured passengers. Three teams of doctors have been engaged to treat the injured passengers," Administrative officer of SCB Medical College and Hospital Subash Chandra Ray said. The identity of the deceased is not yet known. According to PTI, the coaches derailed at around 11:54 AM near Nergundi Station in the Cuttack-Nergundi Railway Section of the Khurda Road Division of East Coast Railway. Ashok Kumar Mishra provided an update, stating that the NDRF (National Disaster Response Force) and fire services were immediately mobilized, and a relief train had already been dispatched to the accident site. The railway authorities have also deployed frontline officers and support staff to assist.

## AMIT SHAH, NITISH KUMAR, NDA LEADERS MEET OVER SEAT-SHARING IN BIHAR: SOURCES

Diary Times Desk: The ruling National Democratic Alliance (NDA) partners on Sunday met at Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar's residence in Patna to discuss seat-sharing for the upcoming Assembly polls, sources told India Today TV. Bihar has a total of 243 Assembly seats. The meeting, held by Union Home Minister and former BJP president Amit Shah, was attended by NDA coalition partners, who each brought with them a list of seats they wanted to contest in the upcoming elections, sources said. The BJP, Nitish Kumar's Janata Dal United (JDU), Chirag Pawan-led Lok Jan Shakti Party (Ram Vilas), former Chief Minister Jitan Ram Manjhi's Hindustani Awami Morcha (HAM), Rashtriva Lok Morcha (RLM) of Upendra Kushwaha and Pashupati Kumar Paras's Rashtriva Lok Janshakti Party (RLJP) are the NDA coalition partners in Bihar. None of these coalition partners was aware of the names of seats the others wanted to contest sources added. Leaders of all the constituent parties handed over their respective lists.

### OVER 6 KILLED AFTER STRONG WINDS UPROOT TREE IN HIMACHAL TOURIST AREA

Diary Times Desk: Over six people have died after a storm uprooted a tree, which fell on vehicles and food stalls in Himachal Pradesh's Kullu this evening. A relief and rescue operation is currently underway. According to eyewitnesses, a tree near the road right in front of Manikaran Gurdwara fell due to a storm that caused a landslide. Videos showed vehicles parked near food stalls next to the mountain. Cars were crushed by the tree branches that fell on them, and a man was heard saying, "Maa" (mom) and "chale gaye, chale gaye" (they are gone, they are gone) while crying and standing next to a Kayal tree that had fallen on a car. Manikaran is at an altitude of 1,829 metres and approximately 40 km from Kullu. In the same video, a man was seen taking a woman who had blood stains on her shirt. Earlier this week, the weather department issued a yellow warning of thunderstorms accompanied by lightning and gusty winds in four districts of Himachal Pradesh. The Meteorological Department issued a yellow warning of thunderstorms accompanied.

### CASES AGAINST KUNAL KAMRA RISE AFTER 'TRAITOR' JAB, A REQUEST FROM TEAM UDDHAV

Diary Times Desk: Shiv Sena (UBT) leader Sanjay Raut on Saturday demanded special protection for stand-up comedian Kunal Kamra, similar to the one granted to actress and BJP MP Kangana Ranaut, as Mumbai police registered more cases against him for his joke allegedly targeting state Maharashtra deputy chief minister Eknath Shinde. The Rajya Sabha MP said that just like Kangana Ranaut was given protection following her "rift" with Shiv Sena, Kamra should be provided the same. "I also demand that the Maharashtra Govt should provide special protection to Kunal Kamra. Kangana Ranaut was also provided special force for her security when she had a rift with us," news agency ANI quoted Raut as saying. Cases were registered under sections 353 (statements conducing to public mischief) and 356 (2) (defamation) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita at Khar police station on Saturday after complaints were transferred from various police stations.



### YEMEN'S HOUTHIS SAY LAUNCHED MISSILES AT US AIRCRAFT CARRIER, ISRAELI AIRPORT

Diary Times Desk: The Iran-backed Houthis said Thursday they targeted an Israeli airport and army site as well as a US warship, soon after Israel reported intercepting missiles launched from Yemen. The Houthis "targeted Ben Gurion airport... with a ballistic missile... and a military target" south of Tel Aviv, their military spokesman Yahya Saree said. Earlier on Thursday, the Israeli military said it intercepted two missiles launched from Yemen "prior to crossing into Israeli territory" after it activated air raid sirens across multiple areas, including Jerusalem. Saree said the rebels also "targeted hostile warships in the Red Sea, including the American aircraft carrier (USS Harry S) Truman," which he said was "in retaliation to the ongoing US aggression against our country". The United States launched what its Central Command called a "large scale operation" involving air strikes against the Houthis on March 15. Washington vowed to use overwhelming force until they stopped firing on vessels in the key shipping routes of the Red Sea and Gulf of Aden after the rebels threatened to resume attacks over the Gaza

### PAKISTAN THREATENS TO EXPEL 900,000 AFGHAN REFUGEES AS US HALTS FUNDING: REPORT

Diary Times Desk: Pakistan is preparing to deport nearly 900,000 Afghan refugees as international aid declines, following the Trump administration's decision to halt funding and freeze resettlement programs, Financial Times reported. Pakistan is home to approximately 3 million Afghan refugees who have crossed the porous border over the years, escaping prolonged conflict and, more recently, the Taliban's return to power in 2021. The country's interior ministry has issued a warning to around 870,000 Afghan Citizenship Card (ACC) holders, urging them to leave voluntarily before April 1 or face forced repatriation, according to Financial Times. Pakistan introduced ACCs in 2017 to document Afghan refugees residing in the country. A senior Pakistani diplomat. speaking anonymously to Financial Times, cited the decline in international assistance as a major factor behind the move to ramp up deportations. The (UNHCR) reported that the United States contributed 42% of the more than

### MYANMAR EARTHQUAKE AFTERMATH: SATELLITE IMAGES SHOW HUGE-SCALE DESTRUCTION



Diary Times Desk: The stench of decaying dead bodies permeated the air in Mandalay-- Myanmar's second-largest city-- on Sunday as rescuers worked frantically to clear rubble in the hope of finding people still alive, two days after a massive earthquake killed at least 1,700 people and left countless others buried. The initial 7.7-magnitude quake struck midday Friday with an epicenter near Mandalay, followed minutes later by a 6.7magnitude aftershock. The strong tremors downed collapsed buildings, downed bridges, buckled roads and damaged other infrastructure in the city of more than 1.7 million people. The quake also jolted neighbouring Thailand, where at least 17 in Bangkok. Most residents in Mandalay spent the night sleeping on the streets, either left homeless by the quake or worried that the continuing aftershocks might cause structures left unstable to collapse. A 5.1 magnitude aftershock Sunday afternoon prompted screams from those in the streets, and then the work continued

### 7.1 MAGNITUDE EARTHQUAKE HITS TONGA, TRIGGERS TSUNAMI WARNING

Diary Times Desk: A powerful 7.1-magnitude earthquake struck near Tonga, triggering a tsunami warning for the Pacific island nation, according to the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS). The USGS reported that the guake occurred about 100 kilometres (62 miles) northeast of Tonga's main island in the early hours of Monday (local time). The Pacific Tsunami Warning Center issued an alert, warning that hazardous waves could affect coastlines within 300 kilometres (185 miles) of the epicentre. "Hazardous tsunami waves from this earthquake are possible within 300 kilometres (186 miles) of the epicentre along the coasts of Tonga," the US tsunami warning system said. There were no immediate reports of damage. German Research Centre for Geosciences (GeoForschungsZentrum in German) said that the earthquake occurred at a depth of 10 km. Tonga is a Polynesian nation consisting of 171 islands and has a population of just over 100,000 people, with the majority residing on the main island, Tongatapu.

### HAMAS APPROVES GAZA TRUCE PROPOSAL, HOPES ISRAEL WON'T "OBSTRUCT IT"

Diary Times Desk: A top Hamas official said on Saturday the group approved a new Gaza ceasefire proposal put forth by mediators, urging Israel to back it but warning the Iran-backed group's weapons were a "red line". Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's office confirmed it had also received a proposal from the mediators and had submitted a counter-proposal in response. "Two days ago, we received a proposal from the mediating brothers in Egypt and Qatar. We dealt with it positively and approved it. We hope that the occupation (Israel) will not obstruct it," Khalil al-Haya said in a televised address for the Muslim holiday of Eid al-Fitr. The weapons of the resistance are a red line," he added. Netanyahu's office confirmed it had received a proposal from mediators. "Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, yesterday, held a series of consultations pursuant to the proposal that was received from the mediators," his office said in a statement. "A few hours ago, Israel conveyed to the mediators a counter-proposal in full coordination with the US," it said without elaborating.



### PAKISTAN ADMITS KILLING 10 CIVILIANS DURING ANTI-MILITANT OPERATION IN RARE REVEAL

Diary Times Desk: In a rare revelation, Pakistan on Saturday admitted to have killed 10 civilians during an anti-militant operation in the country's northwest and promised to probe circumstances. Authorities in the admission Pakistan made Saturday evening about the deaths which occurred in the early hours of that morning in a remote hilltop area of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province's Katlang, according to an Associated Press report, which added that it was not immediately clear how the operations were carried out. Pakistan does not usually reveals civilian casualties that take place during anti-militant activities. Provincial government spokesman Muhammad Ali Saif said that reports indicated the location was being used as a "hideout and transit point for terrorist" elements. Subsequent information revealed that some unarmed civilians were present in the vicinity of the site, Saif added. According to locals 10 bodies, including those of women and children, were recovered from the area where government officials claimed the anti-militant operation took place.

### BLAST IN PUTIN'S LUXURY LIMO NEAR FSB HQ SPARKS ASSASSINATION FEARS

Diary Times Desk: A luxury limousine from Russian President Vladimir Putin's official car fleet exploded in central Moscow, sparking renewed concerns about his security. The Sun reported. The incident has intensified fears of internal threats within the Kremlin. A video of the burning limo has surfaced online, showing thick black smoke billowing from the vehicle. The explosion occurred just days after Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky suggested that Russia could suffer a major setback in the war and amid rumors surrounding Putin's health, The Sun noted. Zelensky also made a bold claim regarding Putin's fate, stating, "Vladimir Putin will die soon," calling it a "fact," as per a report by The Mirror. He further urged the United States to maintain pressure on Moscow. The £275,000 Aurus Senat limousine, a hallmark of Russia's political elite, was engulfed in flames near the FSB headquarters in Lubyanka. Witnesses reported that the fire started in the engine before spreading inside the vehicle. People at nearby restaurants rushed to assist before emergency crews arrived. While the exact cause of the explosion remains unclear, no injuries have been reported so far.

### PUNJAB POLICE BUST TRANS-BORDER NARCO-SMUGGLING NETWORK, ARREST 2 MEN

**Diary Times Desk:** Puniab Police on Sunday claimed to have busted a trans-border narco-smuggling network with the arrest of two men and seizure of 6 kg of heroin. According to preliminary investigation, the contraband was sent by Pakistan-based smugglers, police said. "Acting swiftly on forward and backward linkages, Tarn Taran Police dismantles a trans-border narco-smuggling network and arrests two drug smugglers, Hardeep Singh @ Deep & Harjeet Singh, both residents of Thathi Sohal, #TarnTaran, and recovers 6 Kg #Heroin," Punjab Director General of Police Gaurav Yadav said in a post on X. "Preliminary investigation reveals role of #Pakistan-based smugglers who sent the contrabands," he said, adding that both accused have prior criminal records. The DGP said an FIR has been registered under the Narcotic Drugs further Psychotropic Substances Act and investigation is under way. Punjab Police remain committed to dismantling drug cartels and making the state drug-free, he said.



# CBI COURT ACQUITS FORMER HC JUDGE NIRMAL YADAV IN CASHAT-JUDGE'S-DOOR CASE

Diary Times Desk: A CBI court here today acquitted former Punjab and Haryana High Court judge Justice (Retd) Nirmal Yadav and four others in the sensational 2008 "cash at judge's door" case as the prosecution failed to prove the charges against them. The court of Special CBI judge Alka Malik pronounced the verdict, which was kept reserved on Thursday. Talking to the media after her acquittal, Justice Yadav said she had full faith in the judiciary. The other accused who have been acquitted are hotelier Ravinder Singh, Rajiv Gupta, Nirmal Singh and Sanjiv Bansal, a former Haryana Additional Advocate General who had died during the trial. The case against Justice Yadav had originated when a bag containing Rs 15 lakh was allegedly wrongly delivered at the residence of Justice Nirmaljit Kaur, another sitting judge of the high court, on August 13, 2008. The prosecution had alleged that the bag was meant for Justice Yadav but due to the similarity in the names of the two judges, it mistakenly reached Justice Kaur's residence.

He added: "So, his launch is still ongoing. I mean, Sriharikota launched Chandrayan quickly, but that guy could not be launched by the Congress. The launch is going on. Isn't it." He also went on to say that, "God has not given him that virtue. Why are you pushing him to become a leader? It is not like family fiefdom that the son will come after the father and so on. Please leave him.

#### HARYANA'S KANDELA KHAP DEMANDS BAN ON GUN CULTURE, LIVE-IN RELATIONS

Regular Second Appeals (RSAs) filed up to 2022, where notice of motion has not vet been issued, will also be placed in the urgent cause list. All cases registered up to 1994 will be listed in the urgent motion cause list.

# PREPARE DETAILED DOSSIERS ON DRUG NETWORKS, 'CHITTA' CONSUMERS BY APRIL 20: SUKHU TO SPS

### SUKHU INVITES OTHER STATE GOVTS TO TAKE UP HYDROPOWER PROJECTS IN HIMACHAL


Diary Times Desk: Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu today said that Himachal would welcome other states to take up hydroelectric power generation projects rather than partnering with central public sector undertakings (CPSUs), which have not given Himachal its due. Sukhu, while addressing mediapersons after the signing of a memorandum of understanding (MoU) for the execution of two projects with the Telengana hydroelectric Government, said that Himachal's interests had not been protected in the agreements signed earlier for the setting up of Luhri, Sunni and Dhaula Sidh hydropower projects. The agreement between Telengang and Himachal Pradesh was signed for the execution of 400 MW Selli and 140 MW Miyar hydroelectric projects. Telengana Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka was present on the occasion. Sukhu said, "We have decided to take back these projects from the CPSUs as Himachal is not getting its due." He added that the state government had taken a policy decision to seek enhanced free power at the rate of 12 per cent, 18 per cent and 30 per cent and the return of the hydroelectric projects after 40 years. "We have decided that we will not give any project to any agency for perpetuity," he added.

### RACE FOR CHIEF SECY'S POST PROLONGS AS SAXENA GETS SIX-MONTH EXTENSION

Diary Times Desk: Chief Secretary Prabodh Saxena has got an extension of six months, prolonging the race for the top administrative post. Preparations for Saxena's farewell had already been made as the letter from the Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT) of the Central Government granting him extension was awaited till late last evening. Bamba praised the Himachal Government for deftly handling the situation and preventing it from escalating. "The way the Himachal and Punjab governments have handled the situation is praiseworthy. The governments of the two states did not allow the situation to escalate," he added.

Ravichandran Ashwin and Ravindra Jadeja took one wicket each as well. Aiming to chase down the target, CSK got off to a horrid start as opener Rachin Ravindra departed for a duck.



### MANJREKAR: 'THINGS ARE SLIPPING AWAY' FOR ROHIT SHARMA

Diary Times Desk: Sanjay Manjrekar believes Rohit Sharma is "going through a phase" and that the senior Mumbai Indians (MI) batter is at a stage in his career where he has to "push himself every morning". Rohit fell for 8 in the IPL 2025 match against Guiarat Titans (GT) on Saturday, and it came after a four-ball duck against Chennai Super Kings (CSK) earlier in the tournament. "Rohit Sharma is clearly going through a phase," Manjrekar said on JioStar. "He's not the Rohit Sharma of, say, three to four years ago. He's at a stage in his career where he has to push himself every morning - train hard and be at his best because things are slipping away for him. He's still relying on his natural talent and instincts." Rohit has gone through a lean patch in international cricket too. He had a horror run in Test cricket, starting with Bangladesh's tour of India in September 2024, with a top score of 52 (his only 50-plus score in this period) and an average of 10.93. He played his part in India's win in the Champions Trophy, though, regularly giving the team quick starts, even though he didn't go on to play a big innings, the 76 in the final against New Zealand the only time he got a half-century. Fivetime champions MI have lost both their games this season so far.

### EXPLOSIVE SRH FIZZLE OUT AGAINST STARC AND KULDEEP

Head began by hitting him for two back-to-back fours, but after the flurry of wickets, Axar Patel's decision to persist with Starc for a third over paid off when Head's attempted ramp against him found KL Rahul's gloves. SRH were 37 for 4 in the fifth over. Aniket, 23, was all of three T20s old coming into this game. But he showed why SRH have so much faith in him.

### "UNPROFESSIONAL, HARASSMENT...": SUNRISERS HYDERABAD THREATEN TO MOVE OUT OF HYDERABAD

Diary Times Desk: Sunrisers Hyderabad have threatened to move out of Hyderabad and may not play their IPL 2025 matches at the Rajiv Gandhi International Stadium, according to a report by Times of India. The 2016 winners alleged intimidation and blackmailing by the Hyderabad Cricket Association (HCA) officials for free tickets. The report added that SRH general manager, Sringth TB, has written a letter to HCA treasurer CJ Srinivas Rao where he has made it clear that the franchise will tolerate such behaviour. "All these unprofessional threats and actions by HCA, especially by the HCA president, make it evident that you don't want Sunrisers to play at your stadium. This was the first slow over-rate penalty in IPL 2025 and came after the ninth game of the season. MI, bowling with four quick bowlers - Trent Boult, Deepak Chahar, Satyanarayana Raju and Hardik himself - overshot the stipulated time to complete their overs as GT scored 196 for 8. MI couldn't quite get the chase off the ground, stopping at 160
