
Diary Times Desk : Tahawwur Hussain Rana, a key accused in the 26/11 Mumbai terror attacks, was brought to India after being "successfully extradited" from the US and was formally arrested, the National Investigation Agency (NIA) announced on Thursday.

The 64-year-old Canadian citizen of Pakistani origin landed in Delhi in a special plane from Los Angeles on Thursday evening, ending days of speculation of when and how he will be extradited, officials said. In a statement late in the evening, the NIA said Rana was "formally arrested immediately after his arrival at Delhi airport".

Rana was escorted to Delhi by teams of NIA and National Security Guard (NSG), the agency said. An NIA team at the airport arrested Rana soon after he emerged from the aeroplane, upon completion of all the necessary legal formalities, it said.

The agency in an earlier statement said that it had secured the successful extradition after years of sustained and concerted efforts to bring to justice the key conspirator and "mastermind of the deadly attack" that claimed 166 lives.

Senior advocate Dayan Krishnan and special public prosecutor Narender Mann, who are representing the NIA, reached the Patiala House court premises shortly after news that Rana had landed in Delhi. Police officials asked mediapersons to leave and said they were ensuring the court premises were fully vacant. The lawyers, however, refused to comment.

PM MODI TO LAUNCH PROJECTS WORTH RS 3,880 CR IN VARANASI ON APRIL 11

Diary Times Desk : Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit his parliamentary constituency Varanasi on April 11, where he will address a public gathering and inaugurate and lay the foundation stone for 44 projects worth Rs 3,880 crore.

Varanasi Divisional Commissioner Kaushal Raj Sharma said among the projects to be inaugurated are schemes focused on rural development, including 130 drinking water projects, 100 new Anganwadi centres, 356 libraries, a polytechnic college in Pindra, and a government degree college.

The Prime Minister will also inaugurate a transit hostel at the Police Lines and police barracks in Ramnagar and four rural roads, he said.

Focusing on urban development, Modi will inaugurate projects at Shastri Ghat and Samne Ghat, along with various beautification projects carried out by the Railways and the Varanasi Development Authority (VDA).

Among the projects for which foundation stones will be laid, 25 are worth Rs 2,250 crore, with a major focus on strengthening the city's electricity infrastructure. This includes the construction of 15 new substations, installation of new transformers, and laying of 1,500 km of new power lines. A new 220 kV substation will also come up near Chaukaghat, aiming to provide a 24-hour uninterrupted electricity supply.

Sharma said infrastructure projects related to the airport are also on the agenda, including the laying of a tunnel for its expansion. The Prime Minister will lay the foundation stone for three new flyovers as well as various road widening initiatives and school renovation work and two stadiums in Shivpur and UP College.

US SUSPENDS ADDITIONAL 26% TARIFF ON INDIA TILL JULY 9: WHITE HOUSE

Diary Times Desk : The US has announced the suspension of additional tariffs on India for 90 days until July 9 this year, according to the White House executive orders. On April 2, President Donald Trump slapped universal duties on about 60 countries exporting goods to America and additional steep levies on countries like India, potentially impacting sales of products from shrimp to steel in the world's biggest economy. The move was aimed at cutting its trade deficit and boosting domestic manufacturing. The US imposed an additional import duty of 26 per cent on India. The tariffs were high on its competitors like Thailand, Vietnam and China. This suspension of tariffs is not applicable to China, including Hong Kong and Macau. "Effective with respect to goods entered for consumption, or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after 12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time on April 10, 2025, enforcement of the second paragraph of section 3(a) of Executive Order 14257 is suspended until 12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time on July 9, 2025," the order bina

SC ASKS CENTRE TO SUBMIT PROPOSAL FOR USE OF ELECTRIC VEHICLES BY GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS

Diary Times Desk : The Supreme Court has directed the Centre to submit a proposal by April 30 on the adoption of electric vehicles (EVs) by government departments to reduce pollution. A Bench, led by Justice Abhay S Oka, on Wednesday asked Additional Solicitor General Aishwarya Bhati to place on record the proposal by Aprilend. The top court has been monitoring the air pollution issue in Delhi in an ongoing PIL filed by advocate and environmental activist MC Mehta since 1985. While 60 lakh vehicles over the permissible age were plying in Delhi, in the NCR, the number stood at 25 lakh, Bhati told the Bench. "The ASG has flagged issues with the large number of overage vehicles plying in Delhi and NCR region. We will issue directions on this when we consider the issue of vehicular pollution (sic)," the bench said. The top court further directed the Centre to complete the study within three months on the use of remote-sensing technology to keep a check on vehicular pollution.

"RN RAVI SHOULD RESIGN": EX GOVERNOR MARGARET ALVA AFTER TOP COURT JUDGMENT

Diary Times Desk : Margaret Alva, former Union minister who occupied the Raj Bhavans in four states - Goa, Gujarat, Rajasthan and Uttarakhand - today said the Supreme Court's landmark verdict on power of Governors was "much needed" and absolutely "on time". Tamil Nadu Governor RN Ravi, she said, now "should resign and go home" for he would be "persona non grata" in the state. Mr Ravi withheld assent to MK Stalin government's 10 bills for three years. The government went to court and the Supreme Court ruled on Tuesday that the Governor's decision to withhold assent was "illegal" and "arbitrary" and he did not act in 'good faith". Setting aside the decisions of the Governor, the court said the bills shall be "deemed to be cleared" from the date they were presented to the Governor for a second time. The court also presented a timeline for Governors: A one-month deadline to withhold assent to a Bill and reserve it for the President's review with the aid and advice of the Council of Ministers; when a Bill is reserved without the aid and advice of the Council of Ministers.

"SHE INVITED TROUBLE": ALLAHABAD HIGH COURT JUDGE'S BAIL ORDER IN RAPE CASE

Diary Times Desk : Weeks after an Allahabad High Court judge observed that grabbing breasts or snapping a pyjama string do not constitute rape or attempt to rape, his colleague has granted bail to a rape accused, noting that the victim "invited trouble and was also responsible for the same". According to the FIR registered in September last year, the victim is a postgraduate student and lived as a paying guest in Delhi. On September 21, she and her friends visited a restaurant in Hauz Khas. They drank there till 3 am and became "very intoxicated". "Since she needed support, therefore, she herself agreed to go to the house of the applicant and take rest," Justice Sanjay Kumar Singh has said in the order. "The allegation of the victim that applicant instead of his house took her to his relative's flat and raped her twice is false and against the evidence on record. On the strength of said facts, it is argued that considering the facts of the case as disclosed by the victim, it is not a case of rape but may be a case of consensual relationship between the parties concerned," the order added. Justice Singh has said that the accused's counsel.

26/11 PLOTTER TAHAWWUR RANA LANDS IN DELHI, ARRESTED UNDER ANTI-TERROR ACT



Diary Times Desk : Tahawwur Hussain Rana, India's most wanted for his role in the 26/11 terror attacks in Mumbai, has landed in Delhi. He was extradited from the US on a special flight on Wednesday and will now face the law. Tahawwur Rana, 64, was arrested by the National Investigation Agency after landing. His flight, which took off from Los Angeles in the US vesterday, landed in Delhi's Palam technical area. It is likely that after the preliminary formalities, he would be taken to the NIA headquarters. He will also be presented to Delhi's Patiala House court. But he could later be placed in Delhi's high security Tihar jail and may be eventually moved to Mumbai to face trial, sources said. He has been charged with criminal conspiracy, waging war against the government of India, murder and forgery and under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act. Rana's extradition takes place two months after US President Donald Trump, during PM Modi's visit, announced that his administration has approved the extradition of the "very evil" Rana.

WITH DONALD TRUMP PAUSING TARIFFS, INDIA SEEKS TO SEAL TRADE DEAL WITH US: REPORT

Diary Times Desk: As US President Donald Trump put a hold on reciprocal tariffs for several countries, India wants to move quickly on a trade deal with the United States, news agency Reuters reported, citing an unnamed government official on Thursday. In February, New Delhi and Washington agreed to work on the first phase of a trade deal to be concluded late this year, with a view to reaching two-way trade worth \$500 billion by 2030. "India is one of the first nations to start talks over a deal with the United States and to have jointly agreed to a deadline to conclude it," Reuters quoted the official as saying. Union commerce minister Piyush Goyal said at an event in New Delhi earlier this week that manufacturers in India and the US have suffered from China's unfair trade practices over the years. India will raise scrutiny on imports to spot any potential dumping of goods, including from China, the official said. On Wednesday, Donald Trump temporarily lowered duties on trading partners.

'YOU WANT MY BLOOD': WHO IS KERALA CM PINARAYI VIJAYAN'S DAUGHTER T VEENA FACING ED HEAT?

Diary Times Desk : Kerala chief minister Pinarayi Vijayan has said the Serious Fraud Investigation Office's (SFIO) action against his daughter, T Veena, in the "illegal payment" scandal was aimed at targetting him. On being asked why the party jumped to his daughter's defence, but the same stand was not taken when late Marxist stalwart Kodiyeri Balakrishnan's son was facing money laundering allegations, Vijayan said in that case, the CPI(M) veteran was not targetted.

BEIJING BITES BACK AT US TARIFFS BY CURBING HOLLYWOOD IMPORTS

Diary Times Desk : China said on Thursday it would immediately restrict imports of Hollywood films in retaliation for President Donald Trump's escalation of U.S. tariffs on imported Chinese goods, though analysts say the impact is likely to be minimal. After three decades during which China annually imported 10 Hollywood movies, its National Film Administration said Trump's increase of tariffs on Chinese imports would further sour domestic demand for U.S. cinema in China after years of decline. "We will follow market rules, respect the audience's choices, and moderately reduce the number of American films imported," the NFA said on its website. Diary Times Desk : US President Donald Trump on Wednesday announced a 90-day pause on 'discounted' reciprocal tariffs he announced on April 2 for all countries except China. Instead, Trump increased tariff to 125% on China, up from the previously declared 104%, "effective immediately" due to the "lack of respect that China has shown to the World's Markets." Trump said that over 75 countries had negotiated and not retaliated against the tariffs announced. During the pause, a significantly lower reciprocal tariff of just 10 per cent would be in effect. Donald Trump for the last few days has been facing pressure from Republicans and business executives following extensive sell offs in the US stock market. They insisted him to halt tariffs, given the fear of a major trade war. Investors said that tariffs announced can trigger a global market meltdown, and raised concerns of a looming global recession

'SECOND BIGGEST MISTAKE': ZELENSKY ACCUSES RUSSIA OF DRAGGING CHINA INTO UKRAINE WAR

Diary Times Desk: Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky accused Russia of dragging China into the ongoing war in Ukraine, calling it "the second biggest mistake" made by Vladimir Putin. "This is the second mistake for Russia. The first was North Korea. They drag other countries into war. I believe that they are now dragging China into this war," Zelensky told reporters in Kyiv. Zelensky's latest remarks came as he claimed to have evidence that dozens of its citizens were being recruited by Moscow's army to fight. Kviv had details of more than 150 Chinese nationals who had been deployed to the front, Zelensky said, a day after claiming Ukraine's army had captured two Chinese citizens fighting in the eastern Donetsk region. "The 'Chinese' issue is serious. There are 155 people with names and passport details who are fighting against Ukrainians on the territory of Ukraine," Zelensky told journalists in Kyiv.

US'S 'BAD ACTORS' JIBE AT CHINA, SAYS INDIA IN FRONT ON TRADE NEGOTIATIONS

Diary Times Desk : As US President Donald Trump announced a pause of steep reciprocal tariffs on dozens of countries except China, US's treasury secretary Scott Bessent said the issue was about "bad actors" in global trade. Singling out China, on which Trump has imposed a staggering 125% tariff, Bessent emphasised that such countries were contributing to imbalances in the global economy. The treasury secretary revealed that trade negotiations were mainly taking place with "China's neighbours" like Japan, South Korea and India. "It's not a trade war. It's about bad actors. And what we see is some of the very early countries are China's neighbours that we're going to see. I saw Vietnam today. Japan is in front, South Korea and India," Bessent said. The ramping up of the ante against China came after the Asian giant increased its tariff on US goods from 34% to 84% starting April 10. Amid the fullblown tariff war, China underscored that "pressure, threats, and blackmail" were not the right way to deal with it. The spokesperson of China's Commerce Ministry, however, said Beijing's doors were open for talks with Washington.



EU PAUSES COUNTERMEASURES AFTER TRUMP'S REPRIEVE TO GIVE 'NEGOTIATIONS A CHANCE'

Diary Times Desk : The European Union will pause its first countermeasures against US tariffs President Donald Trump after temporarily lowered the hefty duties he had just imposed on dozens of countries, European Commission chief Ursula von der Leyen said on Thursday. The bloc was due to launch counter-tariffs on about 21 billion euros (USD 23.25 billion) of US imports from next Tuesday in response to Trump's 25 per cent tariffs on steel and aluminium. It is still assessing how to respond to US car tariffs and the broader 10 per cent levies still in place. "We want to give negotiations a chance," von der Leven said on X. "While finalising the adoption of the EU countermeasures that saw strong support from our Member States, we will put them on hold for 90 days". Trump's sudden decision on Wednesday to pause most of his hefty new duties brought relief to battered global markets and anxious global leaders, even as he ratcheted up a trade war with China.

"VERY SMART MAN": TRUMP PRAISES XI JINPING AMID US-CHINA TRADE WAR

Diary Times Desk : US President Donald Trump has called his Chinese counterpart, Xi Jinping, a "smart man" amid a trade war between the two countries that has triggered an economic storm across the world. The world's two largest economies are at a crossroads after Trump imposed tariffs on China and Beijing announced retaliatory measures. "I think President Xi is a man who knows exactly what needs to be done. He's a very smart man. He loves his country. I know that for a fact. I know him very well," told reporters at the White House. "And I think he's going to want to make a deal. I think that's going to happen. We'll get a phone call at some point, and everything will be ready," he added. PUNJAB: DRI INSPECTOR AMONG EIGHT NABBED FOR DRUG TRAFFICKING

Diary Times Desk : The CIA wing of the Amritsar police commissionerate has arrested a Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) Inspector and seven other persons in connection with cross-border drug trafficking. Over 4 kg heroin was seized from their possession. Four separate cases have been registered against them at the Ranjit Avenue and Chheharta police stations here. Police Commissioner Gurpreet Singh Bhullar said the DRI Inspector, identified as Manjit Singh (24) of Rohtak in Haryana, and Ravi Kumar (35) of Gandhi Nagar in Ferozepur were helping the drug cartel for easy money. The police also seized a motorcycle used by the accused for the transportation of drugs. They were sourcing drug consignments from across the border. Ravi was in contact with foreign-based smugglers," said the Police Commissioner. Further investigations led to the arrest of six more persons involved in drug smuggling and hawala financing, he added. Other persons arrested in connection with the case were: Palwinder Singh (34), alias Tindu, of Dhanoa Khurd village; Rohit Sharma (34) of Harkrishan Nagar; Abhishek Singh (19) of Chogawan; Arshdeep Singh (19) of Baba Deep Singh Colony, Chheharta; Amit Kumar (34), alias Sonu, of Sunder Nagar; and Satnam Singh (26) of Chhidan village in the Lopoke area. They were part of the second module involved in the racket.

484 NDPS ACT CASES REGISTERED IN 4 DISTRICTS OF PATIALA RANGE THIS YEAR

Diary Times Desk: Deputy Inspector General (DIG) of Patiala Range, Mandeep Sidhu, on Thursday said that under the 'War Against Drugs' campaign, significant action had been taken. Over the past 100 days, from January 1, 2025, a total of 484 cases were registered under the NDPS Act in four districts of the Patiala Range–Patiala, Sangrur, Barnala and Malerkotla-leading to the arrest of 693 accused. Addressing the media at Police Lines here, Sidhu shared details of the seizures made during the period. The police seized 21.9 kg of heroin, 3.6 kg of smack, 2,525 kg of poppy husk, 17.5 kg of opium, 83 kg of cannabis, 1,33,400 narcotic tablets/capsules, Rs 5.18 lakh in drug money and 56 vehicles used by smugglers. During this period, eight the proclaimed offenders were apprehended. Eleven properties purchased through drug proceeds, valued at Rs 4.83 crore, were frozen. Six illegally constructed houses linked to drug smugglers were demolished. The Patiala Range police also conducted 52 Cordon and Search Operations. Of the narcotics seized, 2,464 kg of poppy husk, 22.96 kg of opium, 2.27 kg of heroin and 13,260 narcotic tablets/capsules were destroyed. Also, six cases were registered against gangsters, resulting in the seizure of 16 weapons, 59 cartridges and two vehicles. 693 accused arrested, says DIG Mandeep Sidhu.



PUNJAB COPS TAKE PAPALPREET INTO CUSTODY AS NSA DETENTION ENDS

Diary Times Desk : The Punjab Police on Wednesday arrested Papalpreet Singh, a close aide of Khalistan sympathiser and Khadoor Sahib MP Amritpal Singh, after his year-long detention under the NSA ended at Assam's Dibrugarh jail. Soon after his release, Papalpreet was taken into custody in connection with the 2023 Ajnala police station attack case and brought to Amritsar. Maninder Singh, Amritsar (Rural) SSP, confirmed his arrest, stating that he would be produced before the Ajnala subdivisional court on Thursday. The development paves the way for the release of Amritpal, whose detention under the stringent NSA ends on April 23. He is likely to be arrested in the Ajnala police station attack case soon after his release. However, the authorities have not confirmed whether Amritpal will be released or face fresh charges. With Papalpreet's release, Amritpal is now the only detainee remaining in Dibrugarh jail, where he has been held with nine associates since 2023. Earlier, Varinder Sinah, alias Fauji, Basant Singh, Bhagwant Singh, alias Pradhan Mantri Bajeke, Gurmeet Singh Gill, alias Gurmeet Bukkanwala, Kulwant Singh Dhaliwal, alias Kulwant Singh, Gurinderpal Singh Aujla, alias Guri Aujla, Harjeet Singh, alias Chacha, and Sarabjeet Singh Kalsi, alias Daljeet Singh Kalsi, were brought back to Puniab.

NOT INFORMING CHANGES IN INTEREST RATES COST DEAR TO ICICI BANK

Diary Times Desk : The UT State Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission, Chandigarh, has directed ICICI Bank, Chandigarh, to pay Rs 70,000 each to two consumers for not informing them about the change in rate of interest from time to time for several years. The commission has passed the orders while deciding two appeals filed by two consumers, Rajiv Aggarwal and Kamal Goel, of Panchkula. The consumers filed the appeals for enhancement of the compensation given by the District Consumer Commission while allowing their complaints against the bank. They filed a complaint before the District Commission alleging deficiency in service against ICICI Bank in over-charging interest rate and also not giving prior information about the changes in the interest rates. The District Commission accepted the complaint and awarded Rs 7,000 as compensation and Rs 7,000 as costs of litigation. The same compensation was given in another case filed by Kamal Goel. Both the complainants filed an appeal before the UT State Commission for enhancement of compensation, through their advocate Pankaj Chandgothia. The bank contended that it had informed the consumers about the changes in their loan rate of interest.



CONGRESS REPLACES HARYANA'S AJAY SINGH AS OBC HEAD AHEAD OF BIHAR ELECTION

Diary Times Desk : The Congress has appointed Dr Anil Jaihind Kumar Yaday as the chairman of its OBC wing, replacing Captain Ajay Singh Yaday, a veteran party leader from Haryana. FED UP WITH OUTAGES, SPITI RESIDENTS DEMAND REGULAR POWER SUPPLY

KANGANA DOESN'T PAY POWER BILLS ON TIME: ELECTRICITY BOARD

Diary Times Desk : Himachal Pradesh State Electricity Board Limited (HPSEBL) today termed Mandi MP Kangana Ranaut's claim that she had been handed a monthly bill of Rs 1 lakh for her Manali residence as wrong and misleading. According to the electricity board, the Rs 90.384 bill was for two months. It claimed that Kangana didn't pay her bills on time and the connected power load at her residence was 94.82 kW, which is 1,500 per cent more than the normal household. Kangana, while addressing a public gathering in Mandi on Tuesday, had claimed that she had received a Rs 1 lakh bill for her Manali residence where she didn't even stay. "They have increased the bus fare, agencies conduct probes on samosa, we hear and read all this and feel embarrassed. I want to say that they are like wolves and we need to rescue the state from their claws," she had said. In its clarification, the board said that it was wrong and misleading on the part of Kangana to claim that the power bill was for one month. "In the bill issued to Kangana Ranaut on March 22, the previous unpaid bill of Rs 32,287 has also been included. The total bill for two months amounts to Rs 90,384," said a board's spokesperson.

DALAI LAMA 'OVERWHELMED' BY TREKKERS WHO UNDERTOOK 1959 'FREEDOM TRAIL'

It is unclear how the six participating nations will be determined and the issue of representation, in the cases of Great Britain and the West Indies, is yet to be addressed as well. Cricket was last part of the Olympic Games in 1900, when it was contested by just two teams - Great Britain and France. Great Britain went on to win the only cricket Olympics Gold Medal thus far by winning what was a 2-day game. Cricket has recently been a part of other international multi-sport events. Both men's and women's cricket competitions were part of the Hangzhou 2022 Asian Games whereas the Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games featured an eight-team women's competition.

Diary Times Desk : South Africa's Test captain Temba Bavuma has suffered an elbow injury again and will miss the domestic first-class final which starts in Johannesburg today. Bavuma was due to join up with the Lions team on Tuesday from Cape Town, but did not arrive in Johannesburg. The Lions found out late on Wednesday that Bavuma would not play the match because of the niggle, which has taken place just over two months before the World Test Championship final in June. ESPNcricinfo has ascertained Bavuma's injury is on the left elbow the same one he has injured before. The Lions are unaware at this stage how serious the injury is and were caught off guard by Bavuma's late withdrawal. On Wednesday morning, Lions captain Dominic Hendricks told the media he was looking forward to playing with Bavuma in the marquee game. Bavuma fractured his left elbow in 2022, which forced him out of South Africa's tour to England that year and sidelined him for three months. He then reinjured the same elbow when he fell awkwardly while completing a single against Ireland in an ODI in Abu Dhabi last year and missed South Africa's Tests against Bangladesh. He had no red-ball match practice before the home summer and spoke openly about battling mental demons after a wretched run with his fitness, which also included injuries to both hamstrings.
