SUPREME COURT

SC NOTICE TO CENTRE ON PIL SEEKING TO BAN SEXUALLY EXPLICIT CONTENT ON OTT, SOCIAL MEDIA

Diary Times Desk : The Supreme Court on Monday issued notice to the Centre and others on a petition seeking a ban on sexually explicit content on over-the-top (OTT) and social media platforms even as it said it's for the Legislature or the Executive to take measures to deal with the issue.

Noting that "present petition raises an important concern with regard to the display of various objectionable, obscene and indecent contents on OTT platforms and social media," a Bench of Justice BR Gavai and Justice AG Masih also issued notice to X Corp, Netflix, Amazon, Ullu Digital, ALTBalaji, MUBI, Google, Apple and Meta on a petition filed by Uday Mahurkar and four others.

"This is not within our domain. As it is, there is a lot of allegation that we are encroaching upon the Legislative and Executive powers," Justice Gavai told Solicitor General Tushar Mehta who said the Government would not take it as an adversarial litigation. Vice-President Jagdeep Dhankhar had recently questioned the Supreme Court for setting a timeline for the President to take decisions on Bills referred to her by governors and questioned the alleged misuse of Article 142, saying the Supreme Court cannot fire a "nuclear missile" at democratic forces. BJP MP Nishikant Dubey had said Parliament and state assemblies should be shut if the Supreme Court had to make laws. "Kindly monitor it here. We will come out with something which balances the freedom of speech while (Article) 19 (2) is taken care of," Mehta said, pointing out that certain contents circulating on OTT platforms were "perverse".



PAHALGAM TERROR ATTACK



SHOAIB AKHTAR'S YOUTUBE CHANNEL GETS BLOCKED IN INDIA AMID PAHALGAM CRACKDOWN

Diary Times Desk : Cricketer-turned-commentator Shoaib Akhtar's YouTube channel was blocked in India on Monday, April 28. The blocking of the channel comes in the aftermath of the Pahalgam terror attack, which left 26 people dead in the Kashmir valley.

Shoaib Akhtar, who is popular in India for his match analysis and takes on world cricket, was amongst 16 other channels that got blocked by the government of India. The banned platforms, which collectively have around 63 million subscribers, include major Pakistani news channels such as Dawn News, Samaa TV, ARY News, Bol News, Raftar, Geo News, and Suno News. Earlier, the Board of Control for Cricket in India vice-president Rajeev Shukla had stressed that India would not play bilateral ties against Pakistan going forward. Shukla had condemned the terrorist attack in Pakistan, which was carried out by members of The Resistance Front. The terrorists opened fire on innocent tourists, leaving 26 dead.

The last time India played a bilateral series with Pakistan was in 2013. Since then, India vs Pakistan matches have only taken place in ICC events. India didn't travel to Pakistan for the Champions Trophy earlier this year and played all their matches in Dubai.

Apart from Shukla, a host of cricketers and former cricketers had condemned the attack and asked the BCCI to cut cricketing ties with Pakistan. Former India captain Sourav Ganguly was one of the prominent voices in the plea. "100 percent, India should do this (break ties with Pakistan). Strict action should be taken. It has turned out to be a joke that such things are happening every year. Terrorism cannot be tolerated," Sourav Ganguly told reporters. After the attack, Prime Minister Narendra Modi assured strict action against the terrorists and the people linked to the attack.

16 PAKISTANI YOUTUBE CHANNELS BLOCKED; CENTRE WRITES TO BBC ON ITS PAHALGAM COVERAGE

Diary Times Desk : The Centre has banned 16 Pakistani YouTube channels, including Dawn News, Samaa TV, Ary News and Geo News, for disseminating provocative and communally sensitive content, false and misleading narratives, and misinformation against India, its Army, and security agencies. The decision was taken following recommendations from the Ministry of Home Affairs in the wake of the April 22 terror attack at Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam in which 26 people, mostly tourists, were killed. The government has also sent a formal letter to BBC over it terming terrorists "militants" in its reportage on the Pahalgam tragedy. "On the recommendations of the Ministry of Home Affairs, the Government of India has banned Pakistani YouTube channels for disseminating provocative and communally sensitive content, false and misleading narratives and misinformation against India, its Army and security agencies in the backdrop of the tragic Pahalgam terror incident in Jammu and Kashmir," officials said. The National Investigation Agency teams, stationed at the attack site since April 23, have intensified the search for evidence. The Army is on a high alert, launching several search operations to neutralise the terrorists following the attack.



TURKISH AUTHORITIES REFUTE CLAIMS OF SENDING WEAPONS TO PAKISTAN

PAHALGAM ATTACK: DEFENCE MINISTER RAJNATH **BRIEFS PM MODI ON J-K SITUATION**



Diary Times Desk : Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Monday briefed Prime Minister Narendra Modi on the security situation in Jammu and Kashmir in the wake of the Pahalgam terror attack, people familiar with the matter said. The briefing came as India mulled its options to punish those behind the terror attack on April 22 that killed 26 civilians. Citing "cross-border linkages" to the horrific incident, India has promised severe punishment to those involved in the strike that triggered widespread outrage within India and abroad. There was no official word on Singh's nearly 40-minute meeting with PM Modi. On Sunday, the Prime Minister said the "perpetrators and conspirators" of the Pahalgam attack will be "served with the harshest response". "The whole world stands with 140 crore Indians in our fight against terrorism. I once again assure the affected families that they will get justice, and justice will be done," Modi said in his 'Mann ki Baat' address.

HIMACHAL WEATHER: HOT WINDS BLEW IN THE PLAIN DISTRICTS, TEMPERATURE ABOVE 30 DEGREES IN 14 PLACES

Diary Times Desk : Hot winds blew on Monday in many areas of Himachal's plain districts Una, Bilaspur, Hamirpur, Kangra including Mandi, Sirmaur and Solan. The maximum temperature has reached more than 30 degrees in 14 places of the state. Heat will haunt the central mountainous and plain districts of the state on Tuesday and Wednesday as well. A yellow alert has been issued for hot winds in these areas of the state on 29 and 30 April. On Monday, the maximum temperature in Una was recorded at 41.6 degrees Celsius. The mercury has crossed 36 degrees in Kanara, Bilaspur and Hamirpur. The heat in Himachal has started making people sweat. On Monday, the maximum temperature in Una was recorded as the highest after 41.0 in the year 2023 and 40.0 in 2024. In the year 2022, the mercury was 43.2 degrees Celsius. Apart from this, Dharamshala, Shimla, Manali also recorded the highest mercury after the year 2022 on Monday. According to Meteorological Centre Shimla, rain is forecast in many parts of the state from May 1 to 4.





SEDITION CASE AGAINST SINGER FOR 'PROVOCATIVE' POSTS ON PAHALGAM ATTACK

Diary Times Desk: Police here have registered a case of sedition against folk singer Neha Singh Rathore over a complaint that her provocative social media posts targeting a particular faith community in the wake of the Pahalgam tragedy could harm the nation's unity. The complainant referred to the execution-like killing of 26 people, mostly tourists, in Pahalgam last week by terrorists after reportedly asking about their religious affiliation, which left the entire country grieving and vying for the blood of the perpetrators. "In this situation, singer and poetess Neha Singh Rathore, using her Twitter (now X) handle @nehafolksinger made some objectionable posts that can adversely affect the national integrity and made repeated efforts to incite one community against another based on religion," the complainant, Abhay Pratap Singh, said. The complaint was registered at the Hazratganj police station in Lucknow. Based on the complaint, police registered a case against the folk singer on multiple charges under the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), including attempting to promote sectarian animosity, disturbing public tranquillity and endangering the sovereignty, unity and integrity of India, police said, adding that she has also been booked under the Information Technology Act.

FIRST TARGETED FIRING IN POONCH SECTOR AS PAK VIOLATES CEASEFIRE AGAIN

Diary Times Desk : Pakistani troops resorted to unprovoked firing, violating the ceasefire along the Line of Control (LoC) in Jammu and Kashmir for the fourth straight night, officials said this morning. "During the night of April 27-28, Pakistan Army posts initiated unprovoked small arms fire across the Line of Control in areas opposite Kupwara and Poonch districts," the Indian Army said in a statement, adding that they responded "swiftly and effectively". This was the first time that the Pakistan Army violated the ceasefire in the Poonch sector. The exchange of fire between Indian and Pakistani troops started after 26 people were killed in a terrorist attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam last Tuesday. Relations between India and Pakistan have soured further after the role of a terror group linked to Pakistanbased Lashkar-e-Taiba emerged in the Pahalgam terror attack -- the worst in Jammu and Kashmir since the Pulwama incident. India has hit Pakistan with a series of strict.

"SHAME ON ME IF...": OMAR ABDULLAH WON'T USE PAHALGAM FOR STATEHOOD PUSH



Diary Times Desk : Sending a strong message in the aftermath of the Pahalaam terror attack, Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah said his politics is not so "cheap" that he would use this tragedy as an opportunity to press for his government's demand for statehood. "Jammu and Kashmir is currently not the elected government's responsibility. But I don't want to use this as an opportunity to demand statehood. How can I use the Pahalgam tragedy to ask the Centre for statehood? Is my politics so cheap? Do I value these 26 lives so little? We have spoken about statehood earlier and will do so in the future. But shame on me if I go to the Centre and ask for it now. At this point, no politics, no business rules, no statehood. This time is only for the strong condemnation of this attack and heartfelt support for the victims," he told the Jammu and Kashmir Assembly during a special session.

UNAWARE TOURIST ON ZIPLINE CAPTURES PAHALGAM TERROR ATTACK

Diary Times Desk: A tourist who was on a zipline ride during a trip to Jammu & Kashmir's Pahalgam last week inadvertently captured the terrorist attack that left 26 civilians dead, according to a new video that has emerged on social media. In the 53-second video that has gone viral, the tourist - a man in a blue checked shirt, wearing a pair of sunglasses and helmet as safety gear can be seen taking and recording the ride using a selfie stick, even as sounds of gunshots can be heard in the background. Unaware of the terror attack, the man enjoys his ride with a smile, while the remaining tourists on the ground run helterskelter. As the zipline ride finishes and the man moves closer to the ground, another tourist is seen falling down, presumably after sustaining a bullet injury. Earlier in the day, another video of tourists running and hiding behind a kiosk emerged. The sound of gunfire can be heard in the distance. Another video shows bodies strewn across the grass, bursts of gunfire echoing in the backdrop.

ISLAMIC COURT JUDGMENTS NOT LEGALLY VALID OR ENFORCEABLE: SUPREME COURT

Diary Times Desk: Islamic courts like "Qazi's Court", "Kaziyat's Court (Darul Qaza)" or "Sharia Court' have no recognition in law, the Supreme Court has reiterated. The court made it clear that any direction given by them is not applicable in law and neither are their decisions binding. A bench of Justice Sudhanshu Dhulia and Justice Ahsanuddin Amanullah -- while hearing an appeal by a woman seeking alimony on February 4 -- cited a 2014 judgment that said Shariat courts and fatwas do not have legal recognition. The woman was refused alimony by the family court which had relied on a settlement deed filed before an Islamic court. The decision was upheld by the Allahabad High Court. Criticising the approach of the Family Court, Justice Amanullah underscored that 'Qazi Court', '(Darul Qaza) Kaziyat Court', 'Sharia Court' and similar others have no recognition in law. Their decision is not binding and no one can be coerced into accepting it. The exception was when the affected parties voluntarily accept the decision.

WON'T USE PAHALGAM FOR STATEHOOD DEMAND: J&K CM OMAR ABDULLAH

Diary Times Desk: At its daylong special session on Monday, legislators of the Jammu and Kashmir (J&K) Assembly passed a unanimous resolution to defeat the nefarious designs of those who sought to disturb the communal harmony and progress of the nation and of J&K. The resolution said "this House is mindful of the sinister design behind the selective targeting of the victims" of the terror attack in Pahalgam on Tuesday, when 26 people were killed. Addressing the Assembly, J&K Chief Minister (CM) Omar Abdullah said he would not indulge in "sasti siyasat", or cheap politics, to use the Pahalgam terror attack as an opportunity to press for the restoration of statehood to the Union Territory. He said as CM and tourism minister of J&K it was his responsibility to ensure that the tourists returned home safely and that he had no words to apologise to them. Abdullah noted that for the first time in many years, he witnessed truly unified protests against terror attacks.

Diary Times Desk : The Philippine military on Sunday hit back at China by planting a flag at the disputed Sandy Cay reef days after Beijing had conducted a similar operation, the Philippine News Agency reported. Beijing's coast guard had said that it 'dealt with' a situation involving six Filipinos who it accused of illegally landing on the reef. China claims that the sandbank had recently come under its control. On Sunday, the National Operational-Tactical Group West Philippine Sea carried out an interagency maritime operation, the Philippine News Agency added. The report further stated that the operation was aimed at strengthening the regular and lawful exercise of the Philippines' sovereign rights and jurisdiction over the waters of the Western Philippine Sea'. According to the agency, the Philippine Navy, Coast Guard, and the Maritime Group of the National Police were involved in the efforts. Four teams in rubber boats landed on the Cay 1, Cay 2, and Cay 3 islands, where they detected Chinese presence.

INDIAN, UK TRADE MINISTERS MEET TO PUSH FOR DEAL UNDER ADDED PRESSURE FROM TRUMP

Diary Times Desk : The British and Indian trade ministers began two days of talks on Monday to conclude more than three years of negotiations on a trade pact, under additional pressure to reach a deal because of Donald . Trump's tariffs on exports to the United States. Indian Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal described his first day of talks in with British trade minister Jonathan Reynolds as "productive" in a post on X, without giving further details. India and Britain are both seeking bilateral deals with the United States to remove some of Trump's tariffs, which have upended the global trade system. The turmoil has also sharpened focus in both London and New Delhi on the need to clinch a UK/India trade deal. "The government's committed to doing the right deal with India, which will improve access for UK businesses, cut tariffs and make trade cheaper and easier," British Prime Minister Keir Starmer's spokesperson said. Talks are seen as nearing completion, with the latest negotiating round.

PUTIN ANNOUNCES UKRAINE **CEASEFIRE MAY 8-10**



Diary Times Desk : Russian President Vladimir Putin has announced a three-day ceasefire in Ukraine between May 8th and 10th for "humanitarian reasons". The Kremlin expects Ukraine to follow through the ceasefire, but has said that they would respond if the ceasefire is violated. "Russia believes that the Ukrainian side should follow this example. In the event of violations of the truce by the Ukrainian side, the Russian armed forces will give an adequate and effective response," the Kremlin added. This comes days after US president Donald Trump posted on his social media, "I am not happy with the Russian strikes on KYIV. Not necessary, and very bad timing. Vladimir, STOP! 5000 soldiers a week are dying". The ceasefire is taking place on Russia's Victory Day on May 9th, which marks the end of the Second World War. Moscow is trying to win back Trump's favour after the US president said he was "very disappointed" after Russia continued to bomb civilian areas in Ukraine. Trump also said that Ukrainian president Volodymyr Zelensky is ready to give up Crimea for a peace deal with Russia.

ICJ BEGINS HEARINGS ON ISRAEL'S HUMANITARIAN OBLIGATIONS TO PALESTINIANS

Diary Times Desk : The UN's highest court has begun a week of hearings into Israel's obligation to "ensure and facilitate" humanitarian assistance to Palestinian civilians in the occupied territories and particularly in Gaza. The hearings come in response to a resolution passed last year by the UN General Assembly asking the International Court of Justice (ICJ) to weigh in on Israel's legal responsibilities after the country blocked UNRWA, the UN agency for Palestinian refugees, from operating on its territory. The hearings opened as as the humanitarian aid system in Gaza is nearing collapse. The UN legal team was the first to address the court on Monday, followed by Palestinian representatives.

EUROPE LEADS GLOBAL DEFENCE SPENDING RISE, AWAKENING TO SECURITY DEFICIT

Diary Times Desk : Europe led a record international rise in defence spending last year, according to a report from the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI). European expenses rose in real terms by 17 percent to \$693m, spearheading a global rise of 9.4 percent to \$2.7 trillion, marking the highest level of defence spending since the fall of communism in Europe. Russia's war in Ukraine was the principal driver of the new trend, SIPRI said on Monday. "The rapid spending increases among European NATO members were driven mainly by the ongoing Russian threat and concerns about possible US disengagement within the alliance," said Jade Guiberteau Ricard, a researcher with SIPRI. The protagonists in that war still bore the brunt of its expense. Russia saw the biggest annual rise of any single country at 38 percent, as it suffered devastating material losses in its war in Ukraine. It spent \$149bn, more than 7 percent of its economic output. Ukraine spent its entire tax income of \$64.7bn on its defence, and was the country devoting the biggest proportion of its economy - 34 percent - to the military.



IRAN ACCUSES ISRAEL OF SEEKING TO DISRUPT NUCLEAR TALKS WITH US

Diary Times Desk : Iran has accused Israel of "brazenly" trying to scupper negotiations as talks with the United States over Tehran's nuclear programme appear to be progressing. Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi said on Monday that Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu was "dictating what [US] President [Donald] Trump can and cannot do in his diplomacy with Iran". In response to a third round of US-Iran negotiations that appeared to gather momentum in Oman over the weekend, Netanyahu reiterated demands that Iran's nuclear programme be entirely dismantled. Araghchi had earlier indicated "cautious" optimism after Saturday's Omani-mediated talks with US Middle East envoy Steve Witkoff. The negotiations are aimed at ensuring Iran does not use its nuclear programme to develop weapons. In exchange, Tehran would receive relief from international sanctions. A senior US official reported "further progress" had been made over the weekend, according to the Reuters news agency.

"WE WILL DIE OF HUNGER": **GAZANS SCRAMBLE FOR** FOOD, RUN TO COMMUNITY **KITCHENS**

Diary Times Desk : At the break of dawn, 10-year-old Youssef al-Najjar races barefoot, clutching a battered pot, to a community kitchen in Gaza City, only to find hundreds of others already queueing. "People push and shove out of fear of missing their turn. There are little children who fall," said Youssef, his voice barely rising above a whisper. Thousands of Gazans, including many children, rush to community kitchens every day in the hope of securing food for their families. The humanitarian crisis in Gaza has worsened significantly since Israel blocked all aid from entering the territory on March 2, days before resuming its military campaign following the collapse of a ceasefire. Supplies are dwindling and the UN's World Food Programme (WFP) on Friday said it had sent out its "last remaining food stocks" to kitchens. The weight of responsibility fell on Youssef's shoulders after his father was killed in the war. He dreams not of toys or games, but of something achingly simple: to sit at a table with his mother and sister, eating peacefully. For that, each morning, he races to the community kitchen. "Sometimes, in the chaos, my pot slips from my hands, and the food spills onto the ground," he told AFP. I return home empty-handed... and that pain is worse than hunger."





PUNJAB TO DEPLOY ANTI-DRONE SYSTEMS AMID CROSS-BORDER DRUG TRAFFICKING

Diary Times Desk : Amid escalating tensions between India and Pakistan, Punjab DGP Gaurav Yadav announced on Monday that testing of the anti-drone system has been completed, and installations will begin shortly along the second line of defence across the border state. Addressing a press conference, DGP Yadav stated that the deployment will be carried out in coordination with the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) and the Border Security Force (BSF). "We have begun preparations, and within the next few months, we will intercept drones bringing drugs and weapons from Pakistan. Several meetings with MHA and BSF have already taken place," he said. The DGP also revealed that 31 major hawala operators involved in laundering drug money have been arrested – a first in recent months. The police recovered more than Rs 8 crore during the crackdown. He said the Punjab Government has also approved the transfer of prisoners, including drug smugglers and Hawala operators to other states to break their network. Meanwhile, clarifying the Punjab Government's May 31 deadline to make the state 'drug-free,' DGP Gaurav Yadav emphasised that the focus is on dismantling drug supply chains rather than achieving numerical targets for arrests or seizures.

SOON, CLEARLY DEMARCATED PLOTS IN HARYANA TO BE JUST A CLICK AWAY

Diary Times Desk : Digitally recorded and clearly demarcated plots across Haryana are set to be just a click away – a significant development that will go a long way in reducing citizens' dependency on revenue officials and middlemen. With the Nayab Singh Saini government putting the Haryana Large Scale Mapping Project (HaLSMP), an initiative to bring technological advancement to land record management, on the fast track, the land digitisation process is set to be completed by the 2025-26 fiscal, sources said. Recently, the Haryana Government had selected 22 pilot villages, one from each district, for the digitisation of revenue maps. "On the directions of Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini, 440 more villages (20 villages in each district) have now been identified for the next phase of the digitisation project. The aim is to complete the project by integrating the data on to the Bhu-Naksha portal by 2025-26," Sumita Misra, Financial Commissioner, Revenue (FCR), told. When completed, the project will ensure that each plot of land in Haryana is clearly demarcated, digitally recorded and accessible through a centralised online system, enabling citizens to view and verify their land boundaries online from the comforts.

SENTIMENTS Diary Times Desk : More than five years after the registration of an FIR against Raveena Tandon and another Bollywood personality on the allegations of hurting religious sentiments, the Punjab and Haryana High Court has made it clear that they will not be called to join the investigation. The order will remain in force at least till July 14, the next date of hearing in the case. The direction came after Justice Manisha Batra's Bench was told that Punjab and other respondents had started issuing notices under Section 35 of the BNS, calling upon them to join the investigation. "Till the next date of hearing, no such step shall be taken by the respondent," the Bench ruled. The petitioners were represented by senior advocate Akshay Bhan and counsel Abhinav Sood, Anmol Gupta, Mehndi Singhal, Sayyam Garg, Jay K Bhaardawaj, Arsh Bir Bhatti, Ishan Kshetarpal and Harsh Gupta. The Bench was initially told that none of the ingredients pertaining to offence under Section 295-A of the IPC were made out from the contents of the FIR. It was registered for deliberate and malicious acts intended to outrage religious feelings of a class by insulting its religion or religious beliefs. In an exclusive chat with The Tribune at Punjab Raj Bhavan here on Saturday, Kataria, who had already led a similar initiative in the border state recently, said a state-level war on drugs will be launched in the Union Territory with a mega "walk for drug-free Chandigarh" here on May 3. The sustained campaign to combat drug abuse and make the Capital of Punjab and Haryana free of drugs will involve awareness, education and strict enforcement with zero tolerance for smugglers and all others involved in the illegal trade.Kataria, 80, who is serving as Puniab Governor and Chandiaarh Administrator since July last, will lead the walk in which the chief ministers of Punjab and Haryana, Bhagwant Singh Mann and Nayab Singh Saini, respectively, and the entire top brass from both the states and the UT Administration have been called to take part. "The aim of the mega event will be to spread awareness against drug abuse and engage the community, particularly the youth, in the campaign against drugs," said the UT Administrator.



PUNJAB GOVT ORDERS EMPLOYEES TO BE AVAILABLE ON PHONES 24/7, EVEN ON HOLIDAYS

Diary Times Desk : The Punjab government on Monday issued directions to all state government employees to remain available on their mobile phones at all times. The instructions, issued by the state Personnel Department, have asked officers of the rank of Secretary and above to ensure that no employee under their command switch off their phones after office hours. They have been instructed to remain available on their phones, even on public holidays, "...for official and administrative reasons." "There are times when administrative work needs to be done immediately, thus necessitating the need for officers' availability. It is observed that their phones are either switched off, remain out of coverage area, or diverted to other numbers. This impacts the administrative work" reads the order issued by the Special Secretary, Personnel. The employees have been instructed to follow these orders with immediate effect.

GOVT FORMS ARAVALLI PATROLLING FORCE AMID ALARMING INCREASE IN FIRES

Diary Times Desk : With repeated fire incidents threatening the fragile ecosystem of the Aravallis, the Government Harvana has announced the formation of a special Aravalli patrolling unit to tackle the crisis. Over the past two weeks, more than 50 fire incidents have been reported across the Aravalli forests in Gurugram, Faridabad, and Nuh districts. While authorities initially attributed the fires to rising temperatures, environmentalists and local residents allege deliberate landattempts, grabbing especially around the Bandhwari landfill, where waste strewn across the forest is exacerbating the crisis. Frustrated with the lack of effective action from local authorities, residents and environmentalists have now the approached Haryana Government, warning of protests if immediate steps are not taken. "The Forest Minister himself lives in Gurugram and is oblivious to the crisis. The jungle is being deliberately burnt. It's not just humans who are choking, but also the animals. Has anybody cared to check the impact on over 50 leopards living in the forest or other animals? It's all being done to get more land for the Bandhwari landfill, which has already encroached on the forest," said local environmentalist and Aravalli activist Vaishali Rana Chandra.

GROWERS SKEPTICAL ABOUT WEATHER INSURANCE SCHEME

Diary Times Desk : Despite the increasingly erratic weather over recent years, which has caused substantial damage to fruit crops, fruit growers, especially apple growers, have shown little interest in the weather-based crop insurance scheme designed to secure their produce. Of the estimated 2.5 lakh fruit growers in the state, only around 66,000 opted for the scheme in the last financial year. "It's surprising that not enough growers are opting for the scheme. They should opt for it." says Revenue and Horticulture Minister Jagat Singh Negi. An official associated with one of the three companies managing the scheme in the state attributes the lukewarm response to a lack of awareness among growers. "The response will improve as growers become more aware of the benefits," the official said. However, the growers argue that the scheme has several loopholes and offers minimal benefit, which is why many of them are not insuring their produce.

PM SHRI SCHOOL TEACHERS EMBARK ON GUJARAT TOUR

TOUR OPERATORS LOOK TO DIVERT TOURISTS FROM J&K TO HIMACHAL, UTTARAKHAND

Diary Times Desk: Tour operators across India are looking to divert tourists, who had planned to spend their summer vacation in Jammu and Kashmir, to Himachal and Uttarakhand. Sources say that the hotel owners in Himachal are getting phone calls from tour operators in New Delhi, Mumbai and Gujarat to explore the possibility of diverting tourists from Jammu and Kashmir to Himachal. The sources say that generally during summer months, groups of tourists from southern states come to the hill states of Jammu and Kashmir, Himachal and Uttarakhand. After the terror attack in Pahalgam in which 26 persons were killed, thousands of tourists have cancelled their plans to spend summer vacation in the state. A tour operator said that since a lot of planning was done to book air and railway tickets or buses for groups of tourists, he could not afford to cancel tours, which would otherwise cause him huge financial losses. As tourists were cancelling bookings in Jammu and Kashmir hill stations, the tour operators were trying to divert them to Himachal and Uttarakhand, he added. Ashwani Bamba, president of the Hotel and Restaurant Association of Kangra, said that many tour operators had called hoteliers in Dharamsala and Manali to divert groups of tourists from Jammu and Kashmir to Himachal.

COLLAPSED DURING 2023 FLOODS, BRIDGE IN MANDI DISTRICT YET TO BE RESTORED

Diary Times Desk : The prolonged closure of the Koon Ka Tar bridge over the Beas in Mandi district has left thousands of residents in distress, severely impacting daily life, education and access to essential services. The double-lane bridge, which collapsed during the devastating floods of July 2023, has yet to be restored, cutting off crucial connectivity for over 21 months for the residents of Mandi, Darang and Jogindernagar Assembly constituencies. Amid mounting frustration, residents have renewed their appeal to the Public Works Department (PWD) to expedite the construction of the bridge. A delegation led by the Himachal Kisan Sabha's state vice-president and Zila Parishad member, Kushal Bhardwaj, visited the site along with former ward member Roop Lal Thakur and other local representatives to assess the ongoing work. Bhardwaj expressed strong dissatisfaction with both the state and Central governments, criticising their lack of responsiveness. "Despite repeated appeals, there has been no serious effort to understand or address the suffering of the people," he said, adding that the original bridge had been a lifeline for residents across the Kotli, Jogindernagar, Mandi Sadar, Drang and Dharampur constituencies.

217 TRACTORS, 961 BIKES CHALLANED PLYING WITHOUT REGISTRATION NUMBER

Diary Times Desk : In an alarming revelation indicative of declining trend of registering vehicles, the Baddi police have challaned 1,291 vehicles operating without registration number since January. While violating the Motor Vehicles Act, a large number of them are used in nefarious activities like illegal mining and thefts. This crackdown on unregistered vehicles has been carried out for the first time in this bordering industrial belt as activities like illegal mining have become a major challenge for the law enforcement agencies. Among 1,291 vehicles challaned by the police since January 1, as many as 217 are tractors which are usually used to ferry illegally mined quarry material from various riverbeds of this industrial belt. Every now and then the police seizes tractor trailers loaded with illegal quarry material. In a majority of the cases, such vehicles are not deliberately registered to evade police action as they can easily get away during a police raid. VAIBHAV SURYAVANSHI, 14, SLAMS 35-BALL TON FOR RAJASTHAN ROYALS VS GUJARAT TITANS

Diary Times Desk : Rajasthan Royals' (RR) 14year-old prodigy, Vaibhav Suryavanshi, shattered multiple long-standing Indian Premier League (IPL) records during his side's match against Gujarat Titans (GT) on Monday. On Saturday evening Australian time we received a very polite legal letter about elements of our content from the cricket tournament we speak to you about pertaining specifically to this season. "As a result we decided to take those videos down," he added. According to a report in the 'Sydney Morning Herald', "The legal notice was related to claims that Grade Cricketer IPL videos featured still photography shots from the tournament that the BCCI considered to be used for 'commercial' rather than 'editorial' purposes." BCCI HINTS AT EXPANDED 94-MATCH IPL. REPORTS MAKES BIG CLAIM ON NEW TEAMS

Diary Times Desk : IPL chairman Arun Dhumal said the BCCI is seriously considering to expand the league to a 94-match home-andaway format from the next media rights cycle, which falls in 2028. The IPL currently has the 74-match format ever since Gujarat Titans (GT) and Lucknow Super Giants (LSG) entered the fray in 2022. "Definitely, that might be an opportunity. We've been discussing in ICC, we've been discussing inhouse in BCCI. Given how the interest of the fan is changing with regard to bilateral and ICC events, in regard to franchise cricket and T20 cricket, we'll have to talk more seriously about it and see how we can create maximum value for the stakeholders of the game." "Ideally, we'd want a larger window, or to maybe go on from 74 to 84 or 94 at some point... So that every team gets to play against every team home and away, for that, you need 94 games," Dhumal was quoted as saying by ESPNCricinfo on Monday. There was talk around growing IPL to 84 matches for the ongoing season, but it was delayed due to tight scheduling. "Given the window and the kind of commitments.
