# PM MODI LAUDS ARMED FORCES FOR NON-ESCALATORY STRIKES AGAINST TERROR INFRA IN PAKISTAN

**Diary Times Desk:** Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday lauded the Indian Armed Forces for executing non-escalatory and non-military strikes against terror infrastructures in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK).

After the Prime Minister shared details of Operation Sindoor with the Union Cabinet—meeting for the first time since the strike—the Cabinet hailed his leadership. PM Modi had earlier granted the Armed Forces full operational freedom to determine the targets, mode, and timing of the national military response following the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack. The PM is also expected to brief President Droupadi Murmu, the supreme commander of the Armed Forces, on the operation today.

Meanwhile, the government will convene an all-party meeting on the issue on Thursday. Prior to the full Cabinet meeting, PM Modi chaired a session of the Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS) — the third such meeting since the April 22 terror attack in Kashmir. This is the first meeting of the Union Cabinet and the Cabinet Committee on Security following India's launch of Operation Sindoor, which targeted nine terror training facilities in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK).

Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri described the operation as "proportionate, non-military, and non-escalatory," stating that it was deemed necessary in the aftermath of the savage and barbaric attack on Indian tourists in Pahalgam.

# "IF PAK MAKES MISTAKE OF ESCALATION...": SHASHI THAROOR ON 'OPERATION SINDOOR'



**Diary Times Desk:** Welcoming the precise, coordinated attacks on terror sites in Pakistan after the Pahalgam attack, Congress MP Shashi Tharoor said at least three countries have expressed understanding of India's right to defend itself against terrorism and pointed out that Islamabad's "all-weather friend", China, has not backed it the way it would have expected.


Speaking exclusively to NDTV on Wednesday, Mr Tharoor said one of the motives behind the terrorist attack on tourists in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam was to divert attention from the fact that the Pakistani army is becoming increasingly unpopular. The Congress leader also reiterated that his party and every Indian stands behind the armed forces.

To a question on how the world has responded to India's punitive, preemptive strikes, Mr Tharoor, who was also a senior diplomat, said, "Three countries, France, Russia and Israel, have explicitly expressed some understanding for India's right to defend itself against terrorism. Other countries have been muted in their language. Everyone has called for deescalation, restraint and so on, which is fine, because we are not interested in escalation." "The Chinese, who are Pakistan's quote-unquote all-weather friend, and who might have been expected to back Pakistan more directly, have actually said that both India and Pakistan are our neighbours and we don't want to see fighting and conflict between them. We want to recommend diplomacy and negotiation and calm and so on, which is again constructive language. So if I were to draw a conclusion from all of this, it would be that I believe the world as a whole does not want to see war and will be counselling restraint to Pakistan," he emphasised. Praising the strikes, the Thiruvananthapuram MP said India conducted itself with "a tremendous amount of thought, calculation and calibration". He said terrorists have been sent a message that there is a price to pay for terror without doing anything.



### WE KILLED ONLY THOSE WHO KILLED OUR INNOCENT: RAJNATH SINGH ON OPERATION SINDOOR

Diary Times Desk: The targets set under Operation Sindoor were destroyed with precision as per plan, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh said on Wednesday, hours after the Indian military carried out strikes against nine terrorist bases in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir. "India has exercised its 'right to respond' to the attack on its soil. Our action has been taken very thoughtfully and in a measured manner," Singh said while lauding the retaliation by armed forces against the Pahalgam terror attack in which 26 civilians were killed. "We only killed those who killed our innocent," Singh said at the inauguration of Border Roads Organisation's 50 infrastructure projects across six states and two Union territories. "With the aim of breaking the morale of the terrorists, this action has been limited only to their camps and other infrastructure," he said. The Indian Army has acted with precision, alertness and sensitivity, Singh said, adding, "We have shown sensitivity by not allowing any civilian population to be affected at all." "With 'Operation Sindoor', our forces have given a befitting reply by destroying terrorist training camps...I salute the bravery of our armed forces," the defence minister said.

In this, one person was shown dead and seven people were shown injured. They were sent to IGMC hospital for treatment. At around 4 pm in the afternoon, SDRF, Home Guard and fire brigade personnel carried out a rescue operation in the Deputy Commissioner's office and Sanjauli parking in the air strike. All this happened under the mock drill conducted by the district administration to check the preparations for civil defense.

#### 6 SCHOOL STUDENTS, CAB DRIVER KILLED IN CAR-TIPPER TRUCK COLLISION IN PUNJAB

Diary Times Desk: At least six school children and the cab driver died on the spot after the vehicle was hit head-on by a tipper truck coming from the opposite direction in Punjab's Patiala on Wednesday, police said. Another student, who was onboard the ill-fated school cab, was admitted to a nearby hospital in a critical condition. He is currently admitted to the Intensive Care Unit (ICU). The driver of the tipper vehicle is absconding. "A very unfortunate incident has taken place. Seven children and a driver were travelling in an Innova. We received information that six of these children and the driver died. The seventh child is critical," Senior Punjab Police officer, Palwinder Singh Cheema, was quoted as saying by news agency ANI. This was a headon collision with the tipper vehicle," he added. Meanwhile, the police are examining the CCTV footage obtained from nearby areas to ascertain the exact cause of the accident. Police have also registered a case against an unknown person and promised that the guilty will be brought to justice. Further investigation is underway.

#### PM MODI OPENS GLOBAL SPACE MEET IN NEW DELHI HOURS AFTER OPERATION SINDOOR

Diary Times Desk: Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the 12th Global Space Exploration Conference (GLEX) 2025 in New Delhi on Wednesday, hours after India's retaliatory strikes as part of Operation Sindoor. The prime minister emphasised that India's space journey is about "reaching higher together" rather than competing with others. In his address, Modi highlighted India's significant milestones in space exploration, pointing to the nation's commitment to global cooperation and the welfare of humanity. PM Modi recalled the landmark achievements of India's Chandrayaan missions: "Chandrayaan-1 helped discover water on the Moon, Chandrayaan-2 provided the highest resolution images of the lunar surface, and Chandrayaan-3 deepened understanding of the Moon's south pole." He also pointed out India's prowess in satellite launches, having deployed 100 satellites in a single mission and launched over 400 satellites for 34 countries using Indian launch vehicles. This year, India made a major leap by docking two satellites in space, a first for the country. The Prime Minister stressed that India's space ambitions are not about racing others.

## INDIA STRIKES PAKISTAN OVER TOURIST KILLINGS, PAKISTAN SAYS IT WILL RETALIATE



Diary Times Desk: India hit Pakistan and Pakistani Kashmir with missiles on Wednesday and Pakistan said it had shot down five Indian aircraft and vowed to retaliate, in the worst fighting in more than two decades between the nucleararmed neighbours. India said it struck nine "terrorist infrastructure" sites, some of them linked to an attack by Islamist militants on Hindu tourists that killed 26 people in Indian Kashmir last month. Pakistan said at least 26 people had been killed on Wednesday and that India "had ignited an inferno in the region". Islamabad pledged to respond "at a time, place and manner of its choosing to avenge the loss of innocent Pakistani lives and blatant violation of its sovereignty". A government security committee said Islamabad emphatically rejected Indian allegations of the presence of terrorist camps on its territory. The Indian strikes included targets in Punjab, its first attacks on Pakistan's most populous province since the last full-scale war.

#### PAKISTAN SHUTS DOWN AIRSPACE, PLANS TO HIT BACK AFTER INDIA'S PRECISION STRIKES

Diary Times Desk: Pakistan, in disbelief and distress after Indian armed forces missiles pummeled multiple terrorist camps in Pakistanoccupied Kashmir, as well as deep inside Pakistan, has decided to close down its airspace entirely. So far, Pakistan had closed its airspace only for flights that are owned, leased, or operated by Indian carriers, but after India's precision strikes, Islamahad and Rawalpindi (Pak headquarters) have announced a total closure of the country's airspace for all countries, including its own civilian planes. Only some essential flights are reportedly being permitted. The order, issued by Pakistan's aviation authority, states that Pakistan is now a no-fly zone for the next 48 hours. While Pakistan has called the move a precautionary measure, the country has vowed to retaliate. It must be noted that India's kinetic action against Pakistan was a response to Pakistan's links to cross-border terrorism.

#### "TOOK MY CHILDREN, WIFE OUTSIDE": EX-ARMY COMMANDO AMID PAK SHELLING

Diary Times Desk: Former Army commando Havildar Mohd Khan's home - in Uri in Jammu and Kashmir's Baramulla district - was damaged by artillery shells fired across the Line of Control by Pakistan early Wednesday. Three civilians were killed and several injured in the firing by the Pak Army. During his career Havildar Khan had been posted to the 6 Para Special Forces unit. "There was some firing first... it began 1 am. At first it was sporadic and distant. Then, by 2.30 am it became louder and the artillery shelling began," Havildar Khan told NDTV. "When my house was damaged I took my children and my wife, and took them outside. I knew firing was still going on, so I told them to lie down on the ground to be safe. I also lay down." "Then the whole house began shaking," he said, pointing to damaged sections of his house. The shelling was the Pak Army's immediate response to the Indian military's precision overnight strikes on nine terrorist bases and training camps in Pak and Pak-occupied Kashmir, or

# "VERIFY FACTS": INDIA SLAMS CHINESE STATE MEDIA OVER OP SINDOOR "DISINFORMATION"

Diary Times Desk: India has strongly criticised Chinese state media Global Times for spreading disinformation to mislead the public on India's cruise missile strikes at terror infrastructure deep inside Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir (POK). Global Times had run reports using old images of crashed aircraft in the context of Operation Sindoor, as part of which India launched 24 precision missile strikes in nine locations that were identified as hubs of terrorist activity. "Dear Global Times, we would recommend you verify your facts and cross-examine your sources before pushing out this kind of disinformation," the Indian embassy in China said in a post on X. "Several pro-Pakistan handles are spreading baseless claims in the context of Operation Sindoor, attempting to mislead the public. When media outlets share such information without verifying sources, it reflects a serious lapse in responsibility and journalistic ethics," the embassy said.

## NSA AJIT DOVAL'S MESSAGE AFTER OPERATION SINDOOR: 'INDIA READY TO RETALIATE RESOLUTELY IF PAKISTAN...'

Hours after Indian forces Diary Times Desk : launched airstrikes on terror sites in Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir, national security advisor Ajit Doval on Wednesday told his counterparts in several countries that New Delhi has no intent to escalate tensions but is prepared to "retaliate resolutely" if Islamabad does so, news agency PTI reported, citing officials. Ajit Doval briefed his counterparts in the US, UK, Saudi Arabia and Japan about India's missile strikes against terror infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir. He also established contact with Russia and France. "NSA briefed his counterparts on actions taken and method of execution, which was measured, non-escalatory and restrained. He emphasised that India had no intent to escalate but was well prepared to retaliate resolutely should Pakistan decide to escalate," an official told PTI.



# TRUMP TEASES 'VERY, VERY BIG' ANNOUNCEMENT AHEAD OF MIDDLE EAST TRIP

Diary Times Desk: US President Donald Trump on Tuesday teased that he will make a major announcement ahead of his trip next week to the Middle East, without revealing what it would be. "We're going to have a very, very big announcement to make. Like, as big as it gets, and I won't tell you on what. And it's very positive," Trump said in the Oval Office. "It'll be one of the most important announcements that have been made in years about a certain subject," Trump said. Trump did not offer further clues. Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney, who was opening a meeting with Trump, responded drily: "I'm on the edge of my seat." Trump heads next week to Saudi Arabia, Qatar and the United Arab Emirates on the first foreign trip of his second term other than a brief stop in Rome for the funeral of Pope Francis. Diplomats say that the United States is hoping for progress ahead of Trump's trip on Gaza, where Israel has cut off shipments of food and other supplies for two months as it unleashes a renewed assault.

#### LINDA MCMAHON'S SCATHING LETTER TO HARVARD DRAWS ATTENTION FOR 'GLARING GRAMMATICAL ERRORS'

Diary Times Desk: Secretary of Education Linda McMahon on Monday sent a sharply worded letter to Harvard University President Alan Garber, criticizing the Ivy League institution's handling of antisemitism on campus and accusing it of systemic failures in leadership and policy. In the letter, McMahon accused Harvard of promoting race-based preferences in admissions and hiring. She further advised the university to stop seeking federal funding. "Receiving such taxpayer funds is a privilege, not a right," she wrote. "Yet instead of using these funds to advance the education of its students, Harvard is engaging in a systemic pattern of violating federal law. Where do many of these 'students' come from, who are they, how do they get into Harvard, or even into our country - and why is there so much HATE? These are questions that must be answered, among many more, but the biggest question of all is, why will Harvard not give straightforward answers to the American public?" McMahon declared: "Given these and other concerning allegations.

# 'THEY ARE LOOKING FOR A MENDER': CATHOLIC CARDINALS MEET TO ELECT NEXT POPE



Diary Times Desk: For days, the cardinals of the Roman Catholic Church have been slipping beyond the Vatican's walls, gathering for discreet dinners at old trattorias and secretive sessions at private living rooms across Rome. Tasked with electing the new leader of 1.4 billion Catholics, the red-hatted princes of the Church have been engaged in feverish discussions as they seek to identify the ideal successor to Pope Francis, who died last month. The talks ground to a halt at 4:30pm (14:30 GMT) on Wednesday when the 133 cardinals aged under 80 marched in a solemn procession to the sound of prayers to enter the Sistine Chapel for the conclave. Referring to this year's election process, Marco Politi, a Vatican expert and author of the book Pope Francis Among the Wolves, said, "There is a new element. "The south of the world is making its way and asking to be listened to and wants to have its say - it is not enough that the problems are outlined from the centre or Northern Hemisphere."

## TRUMP'S MOVIE TARIFF THREAT ALARMS BOLLYWOOD

Diary Times Desk: India's film industry, which earns roughly 40% of its overseas revenue from the United States, sounded the alarm this week about higher costs after President Donald Trump threatened a tariff of 100% on all movies produced beyond American soil. Film makers, producers and distributors in one of the world's largest film industries by output struggled to weigh the likely impact of such a tariff as Trump provided scant details, stirring more questions than answers. "The real question is how the term 'foreign produced' will be defined, and until that's clear, it's hard to say anything," said film maker Anubhav Sinha, known for his Netflix streaming series, "IC 814: The Kandahar Hijack". "It's not yet clear whether services like postproduction will be affected." India's film industry employs 272,000 people, with overseas box office takings of about 20 billion rupees (\$237 million) in fiscal 2024, or a tenth of total earnings, Deloitte and studio grouping the Motion Picture Association said.

## MICHELLE OBAMA REVEALS SHE'S IN THERAPY AS SHE GEARS UP FOR "NEXT PHASE" IN LIFE

Diary Times Desk: Former First Lady Michelle Obama shared that she is seeking therapy to navigate the "next phase of her life." With her daughters grown, her public service work concluded, and her focus now on herself for the first time in years, she emphasised the importance of therapy in navigating this personal shift. Her comments follow speculation about a possible divorce from former President Barack Obama. "At this phase of my life, I'm in therapy right now because I'm transitioning, you know? I'm 60 years old, I finished a really hard thing in life with my family intact. I'm an empty nester. You know my girls are in - they've been launched. And now for the first time, as I've said before, every choice I'm making is completely mine," she said in an interview with the Jay Shetty Podcast. The former First Lady said a combination of being out of public service and her children being fully grown has left her in a situation where "every choice that I'm making is completely mine". "I now don't have the excuse of, 'Well, my kids need this,' or 'my husband needs that, ' or 'the country needs that.' So, how do I think about this next phase? Let me get some help," she added.



### BANGLADESH EX-PM KHALEDA ZIA RETURNS TO DHAKA AFTER TREATMENT ABROAD

Diary Times Desk: Former Prime Minister and Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) Chairperson Begum Khaleda Zia returned to Dhaka, on a special aircraft provided by Emir of Qatar, from the United Kingdom after undergoing treatment for her illness. Accompanied by her two daughtersin-law, Dr Zubaida Rahman and Sveda Sharmila Rahman, Ms Zia was welcomed by her party's senior leaders at the Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport. Zia, 79, served as prime minister of the South Asian nation twice but was jailed for corruption in 2018 during the tenure of Sheikh Hasina, her successor and lifelong rival. The caretaker government of Muhammad Yunus took charge of Bangladesh last August after the toppling of expremier Sheikh Hasina, who fled to New Delhi after a student-led uprising. Hordes of BNP supporters gathered on the streets to welcome Khaleda Zia as the party prepares for elections that are supposed to be held in the country next year. Khaleda Zia's return will put pressure on the interim government to hold elections as it is seen dithering on setting a date to hold elections.

### PAKISTAN BLAMES INDIA AFTER SEVEN SOLDIERS KILLED IN BALOCHISTAN BLAST

Diary Times Desk: Seven Pakistani army soldiers have been killed when their vehicle was targeted by an improvised explosive device in the province southwestern Balochistan, Pakistan's military says, blaming India for the attack amid rising tensions. Pakistan's military said members of the Baloch Liberation Army (BLA) armed group targeted the vehicle carrying the soldiers in the province bordering Iran and Afghanistan on Tuesday. It described the group as an "Indian proxy", but it did not provide any evidence to support its claim. There was no immediate comment from New Delhi or the BLA. An unnamed senior local government official told the AFP news agency the vehicle that was hit was part of a convoy on its way to a security operation. He said five people were wounded and taken by helicopter to a military hospital in the provincial capital, Quetta. More than 200 people, mostly members of the security forces, have been killed in 2025 by armed groups in Balochistan and neighbouring Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa, according to an AFP tally. At least 31 people, many of them soldiers, were killed in March when the BLA hijacked a train.

# AKAL TAKHT CONDEMNS ATTACK ON POONCH GURDWARA KILLING 3 CIVILIANS

Diary Times Desk: Akal Takht's officiating jathedar Giani Kuldeep Singh Gargaj has strongly condemned the recent attack in the Poonch region of Kashmir, where civilians, including Sikhs, were killed and a gurdwara was targeted amidst escalating tensions and cross-border attacks between India and Pakistan. According to Gargaj, during Pakistan's retaliatory shelling in Poonch following India's 'Operation Sindoor', Central Gurdwara Sri Guru Singh Sabha was hit, resulting in significant damage. A video showcasing the destruction in the gurdwara building went viral, highlighting the severity of the attack. The jathedar expressed deep sorrow over the loss of lives, including three Gursikhs: Amrik Singh (a raagi), Amarjeet Singh (a retired army soldier), and Ranjit Singh (a local shopkeeper). Reports also emerged of a Sikh woman named Ruby Kaur being killed in the Mankote area, along with other civilian casualties in Poonch. Jathedar Gargaj offered prayers for the spiritual peace of those who lost their lives and strength for their families to endure the loss. He emphasised the need for both nations to make sincere efforts to restore peace, stating, "War always harms humanity severely, often resulting in the deaths of many innocent people.



# UNIDENTIFIED AIRCRAFT CRASHES IN BATHINDA; 1 DEAD, 9 INJURED

Diary Times Desk: A civilian was killed and nine others injured when an unidentified aircraft crashed and caught fire in Aklian Kalan village of Bathinda district in the early hours of Wednesday. The deceased has been identified as Govind, a farm labourer from Charkhi Dadri in Haryana. The crash occurred around 2 am in harvested wheat fields, approximately 500 meters from the nearest residential area. According to eyewitnesses, several farm labourers were at the local grain market late Tuesday night when they noticed an aircraft flying unusually low. Moments later, it crashed into the fields. As some people approached the burning wreckage, an explosion took place, killing Govind on the spot and injuring nine others. There is no official information yet regarding the pilot or the origin of the aircraft. Authorities have cordoned off the area, and an investigation is underway to determine the cause of the crash and the identity of the aircraft.

# CHANDIGARH'S LARGEST SLUM CLUSTER RAZED, UT RECLAIMS LAND WORTH RS 350 CR

Diary Times Desk : The UT Administration today removed nearly 2,500 structures at Janta Colony in Sector 25 here and reclaimed about 10 acres of government land worth Rs 350 crore. Earth-moving machines of the Estate Office were pressed into service during the demolition drive, which was carried out to make the city slum-free. Janta Colony was the largest illegal slum cluster in the city. Administration had tried to remove the colony two years ago, but the Punjab and Haryana High Court stayed the demolition. After the stay was vacated recently, the UT reclaimed the land today. Most of the residents had already removed their belongings before the drive began. Many dwellers said they had nowhere to go and they would be forced to live on pavements. The largest slum of the city was home to over 10,000 people. The land has been earmarked for a dispensary, primary school, community centre and a shopping area. To ensure that the demolition was carried out.

## 1984 ANTI-SIKH RIOTS: SC ISSUES NOTICES TO 14 ACCUSED IN 6 ACQUITTAL CASES

Diary Times Desk : The Supreme Court has issued notice in appeals filed by the Delhi Police challenging the Delhi High Court's orders acquitting 14 accused in six cases related to the 1984 anti-Sikh riots in Delhi. We are conscious of the fact that there was a long delay in filing appeals against acquittal before the high court. However, we have noted the grievances made in Writ Petition (Crl.) No.9/2016 and the orders passed therein from time to time. Delay in filing Special Leave Petitions is condoned," a bench led by Justice AS Oka said on Tuesday, asking the accused to respond to the petitions by July 21 - the next date of hearing. It also directed the Registrar to provide a soft copy of the record of the trial court to the counsel appearing for parties who would place on record a compilation of notes of evidence. Around 3,000 people, mostly Sikhs, were killed in the anti-Sikh riots that broke out following the assassination of the then prime minister Indira Gandhi on October 31, 1984, by her two Sikh bodyguards. The order came on a petition filed in 2016 by S Gurlad Singh Kahlon – a former Shiromani Gurdwara Prabandhak Committee member - seeking the implementation of the recommendations of Justice SN Dhingra Committee.

#### SENIOR CITIZEN CAN'T RECLAIM PROPERTY FROM DAUGHTER-IN-LAW AFTER SON'S DEATH: PUNJAB AND HARYANA HIGH COURT

Diary Times Desk: The Punjab and Haryana High Court has made it clear that a senior citizen, who transferred property to his son, cannot claim it back from the daughter-in-law after his son's death under the provisions of the senior citizens Act. In a significant ruling with wider implications for property disputes within families, Justice Harsimran Singh Sethi held that the senior citizen cannot invoke the provisions of the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007, to reclaim property from a daughter-in-law, where the land was originally transferred to her nowdeceased husband. The ruling came in a case where the petitioner daughter-in-law was seeking the setting aside of order dated November 25, 2021, cancelling the transfer deeds. Among other things, she contended that proceedings could not be initiated by the senior citizen against the daughter-in-law. Going into the background of the matter, the daughter-in-law submitted that the senior citizen transferred the land in her husband's favour. But he unfortunately died. The property devolved upon the petitioner and her children after the husband's death. The senior citizen to get back the transferred property from the petitioner daughter-in-law filed a petition under the 2007 Act. The appellate authority envisaged under the 2007 Act passed the impugned.

### LT VINAY NARWAL'S WIFE SUPPORTS 'OPERATION SINDOOR', URGES GOVT TO WIPE OUT TERRORISM

Diary Times Desk: Himanshi, wife of Lt Vinay Narwal, who was killed in a brutal terror attack in Pahalgam, Kashmir, on April 22, expressed her support for the Indian Air Force's strikes on terror camps across the border in Pakistan. She urged the government to continue such steps against terrorism until its complete eradication. Visibly emotional, Himanshi said, "My husband joined the defence forces to protect peace in the country and ensure that innocent lives are not lost. This operation signifies his spirit that terrorism and hatred will not be tolerated by the Indian government." She appreciated the name 'Operation Sindoor', saying, "The name is very appropriate, as this incident has completely changed my life. Many others have also suffered immensely. This operation signifies that such tragic incidents will not be allowed to happen again." Himanshi thanked the Union Government and the Indian Army for 'Operation Sindoor' but emphasised that the action must not end there. "I want terrorism to be completely wiped out from our land," she reiterated

#### LAKHS OF LITRES OF WATER GOES TO WASTE IN HISAR AS STAFF HOLDS LIQUOR PARTY AT TREATMENT PLANT

Diary Times Desk: A major water wastage incident occurred when employees of the Public Health Department Engineering allegedly failed to monitor the supply at the Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) water treatment plant, as they were reportedly having a liquor party inside the facility. The negligence led to the overflow of lakhs of litres of water, even as the town continues to grapple with a severe water shortage. The SCADA waterworks cater to nearly 75 per cent of Hisar. Sources revealed that the water supply had been turned on to serve a specific region, but the staff on duty failed to regulate or divert it. As a result, water spilled out from the plant premises, flowed onto nearby roads and travelled several kilometres. Residents, who witnessed the incident, claimed that they had spotted empty bottles of liquor on the plant premises. Videos of overflowing water and evidence of the party, including empty liquor bottles and leftover food on a table, went viral on social media, after which the department removed the contractor's employee on duty and ordered an FIR to be registered against him.

# CONGRESS RULED NATION FOR 60 YEARS BUT IGNORED SCS, POOR: ANURAG THAKUR

Central Tibetan Administration (CTA) president Sikyong Penpa Tsering has said that as a devout Buddhist, he will never accept the Chinese governments interference in choosing the successor of the Dalai Lama. "The system of reincarnation is a unique Tibetan Buddhism tradition. It was the right of the Dalai Lama to decide where he would be born and the Communist government.

## HIMACHAL: DOMESTIC HELP, HER 21-YEAR-OLD DAUGHTERS TO GET RS 1,500 MONTHLY GRANT

Diary Times Desk: The Cabinet today approved the inclusion of women working as domestic help under the Indira Gandhi Pyari Behna Sukh Samman Nidhi Yojana. Women, who had completed a minimum of 100 days as domestic help, along with their daughters aged 21 years and above, would now be eligible for benefits under the scheme and receive Rs 1,500 per month as assistance. The Cabinet that met for the second consecutive day under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu also approved the new Homestay Policy and gave relaxation to their owners in rural areas who were opposing a hike in the proposed taxes and water and power tariffs. It decided to fix the registration fee for homestays in Pangi subdivision of Chamba district at 50 per cent of the standard rate. The Cabinet approved an increase in the minimum support price (MSP) for naturally-grown crops in the state. The MSP for naturallygrown wheat was raised from Rs 40 per kg to Rs 60 per kg and for maize from Rs 30 per kg to Rs 40 per kg. It also approved a Rs 90 per kg MSP for naturally-grown raw turmeric and Rs 60 per kg for barley in Pangi block of Chamba district. It also decided to declare Pangi as the first natural farming subdivision of the state.



# OPPOSITION ALWAYS TRYING TO CREATE DIVISION IN CONGRESS: HIMACHAL MINISTER VIKRAMADITYA SINGH

Diary Times Desk: Public Works Department (PWD) Minister Vikramaditya Singh today said that the government of Virbhadra Singh was a bygone era, so it was not appropriate to talk about it up again and again but the fact that he remained Chief Minister six times "is part of history that cannot be changed". Vikramaditya, while addressing mediapersons here, dismissed the charge of factionalism in the Congress and said that the Opposition was always trying to hatch a conspiracy to target ministers and ruling party MLAs to create division in the Congress. # HIMACHAL WEATHER UPDATE: YELLOW ALERT FOR THUNDERSTORM IN 11 DISTRICTS TILL MAY 10

Diary Times Desk: Rainfall is set to continue across Himachal Pradesh for a few days and the state's Meteorological Department has issued a yellow warning of thunderstorms accompanied with lightning and gusty winds for several districts till May 10. A yellow warning of thunderstorms accompanied with lightning and gusty winds at isolated places has been issued for 11 districts with the exception of Kinnaur for May 7. Similarly, a yellow alert has been issued for nine districts with the exception of Solan, Sirmaur and Kinnaur districts for May 8. Also, a yellow warning has been issued for Chamba, Kangra, Kullu, Mandi, Shimla and Lahaul and Spiti for May 9 and 10. Meanwhile, light to moderate rain occurred in a few places of the state during the past 24 hours. The minimum temperatures were 2°C to 3°C below normal while the maximum temperatures fell by 2°C to 4°C in the past 24 hours. Shimla recorded the maximum temperature of 21.2°C, Dharamsala (28°C), Manali Dalhousie (19°C), Solan Sundernagar (30.7°C), Kufri (16.1°C), Kasauli (23.2°C), Narkanda (16.7°C) and Kalpa (19.8°C). Rainfall is set to continue across Himachal Pradesh for a few days and the state's Meteorological Department has issued a yellow warning.

## FINALLY, BRITISH NATIONAL'S PERSISTENCE PAYS OFF, TRACES HISTORY OF ANCESTORS IN HIMACHAL

# IPL 2025: MI TRAVEL TO DHARAMSALA DEFERRED IN THE WAKE OF OPERATION SINDOOR

Diary Times Desk: The wake of Operation Sindoor and the subsequent shutdown of airports in Chandigarh seems to be causing some sort of disruption in the Indian Premier League 2025 (IPL 2025) schedule. Mumbai Indians, who were set to fly to Dharamsala via Chandigarh today (May 7) evening, will not be travelling as planned. The immediate reason for MI's decision to postpone the trip is the lack of permission to land flights in the Punjab city. The team had planned to travel to Dharamsala via Chandigarh, with an overnight stop scheduled in the city. Besides, the airports of many northern cities have been shut down and many flights have been cancelled. Mumbai will now await further instructions from the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) on how to proceed even as the authorities are understood to be looking for new venues to relocate some games. Dharamsala is already hosting two teams in Punjab Kings and Delhi Capitals who are set to play there on May 8. Subsequent travel for both teams with nearby airports shut down is also a matter to be considered if any changes are warranted to the IPL schedule. It is understood that the BCCI top brass is having meetings that are set to address these concerns.

# ROHIT SHARMA RETIRES FROM TEST CRICKET

Diary Times Desk: Rohit Sharma has retired from Test cricket with immediate effect, he announced on social media. He confirmed that he will continue playing ODIs. "Hello everyone I would just like to share that I am retiring from Test cricket. It's been an absolute honour to represent my country in whites. Thank you for all the love and support over the years. I will continue to represent India in the ODI format," said Rohit in his statement. The decision brings an end to an 11-year career in the longest format, during which Rohit played 67 Tests, captaining 24 of them since taking over the reins of the team from Virat Kohli in 2022. He finishes with an aggregate of 4301 runs, including 12 centuries. Rohit's retirement comes close to India's upcoming tour of England, where they are scheduled to play five Tests. The selection of the squad is set to happen soon, and will now have a new captain. In his most recent assignment as a Test captain in Australia, Rohit had at one point sat out considering his own poor form. India lost the series 3-1, with the Boxing Day Test at MCG late last year being Rohit's last. Rohit was originally pencilled in to make his Test debut in the 2010 Nagpur Test against South Africa before suffering a freak injury moments before the toss. It took him a further three years before he was picked to play.

### **JEMIMAH RODRIGUES' CAREER-BEST 123 POWERS INDIA INTO FINAL**

Diary Times Desk: Jemimah Rodrigues' career-best 123 was instrumental in India's win over South Africa in Colombo that sent them to the tri-series final. Rodrigues' ton helped India post a commanding 337 on the board and despite looking down and out in the run chase for the major part of it, South Africa put up a commendable fight in the final 10 overs before eventually falling short by 23 runs. As a result of this loss, South Africa were eliminated despite having one more game left to play in the series. Chasing their first win of the series, South Africa received an early jolt when Lara Goodall edged one to the keeper in just the second over. Miane Smit and Tazmin Brits led a recovery but South Africa still made only 40 runs from the opening 10 overs which meant the required rate had shot up. Both Brits and Smit were then sent packing in quick succession and South Africa were forced to rebuild again. Annerie Dercksen then led her side's charge with a fruitful stand for the fourth wicket but South Africa were always in need of a spell where they could accumulate quick runs.



#### SHUBMAN GILL FRONT-RUNNER TO BECOME INDIA'S NEXT TEST CAPTAIN

Diary Times Desk: Shubman Gill has emerged as the leading contender to captain India in the upcoming five-Test series against England. With Rohit Sharma announcing his retirement from Test cricket, there is growing momentum behind Gill - currently Rohit's deputy in white-ball formats - to take over the reins. The Ajit Agarkar-led panel is understood to be planning a longterm leadership transition. With Jasprit Bumrah unlikely to be available for all five matches, the selectors are keen to groom a younger captain under the guidance of head coach Gautam Gambhir. At 25. Gill is one of the few Indian players to feature regularly across all three formats. He has also led Gujarat Titans in the Indian Premier League for the past two seasons, earning praise from team-mates for his calm and composed leadership, particularly under pressure. Gill has experience batting both as an opener and at No. 3 in Test cricket. In 32 matches, he has scored 1,893 runs, including five centuries and seven fifties.

# NEHRA FINED, HANDED DEMERIT POINT; HARDIK FINED FOR SLOW OVER-RATE AGAIN

Diary Times Desk: Hardik Pandya and his team-mates (first XI plus the impact sub Karn Sharma) have all been hit with fines for Mumbai Indians' (MI) slow over-rate in their loss against Gujarat Titans (GT) at home on Tuesday night. For the winners, head coach Ashish Nehra has been penalised for "conduct that is contrary to the spirit of the game". In the stop-start second half of the IPL 2025 game between MI and GT, when rain took the players off and brought them back in a few times, MI had to bring an additional fielder into the 30-yard circle for the final over - the 19th - of the chase as is the in-game penalty norm in the IPL. GT needed 15 runs to get off that Deepak Chahar over and got over the line off the last ball. Hardik was fined INR 24 lakh, since this was the second time MI had committed the offence under his captaincy this season. His team-mates were each fined either INR 6 lakh or 25% of their respective match fees, whichever is lesser. Nehra, meanwhile, was at his animated best in the dying minutes of the game, when it looked like he wanted the umpires to restart the game after the latest rain interruption. He was fined 25% of his match fee and also handed one demerit point for breaching Article 2.20 of the IPL code of conduct, though the IPL didn't state what exactly his offence was. This is the second time a coach.
