MODI CALLS FOR READINESS AMID HEIGHTENED TENSIONS AFTER CROSS-BORDER STRIKES

Diary Times Desk : Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday instructed all ministries to ensure seamless coordination to uphold "operational continuity and institutional resilience" and ensure fool-proof functioning of essential systems, with special focus on readiness, people aware of the matter said.

The comments at a meeting of secretaries to assess the preparedness, emergency response, and internal communication protocols came against the backdrop of heightened tensions following air strikes under Operation Sindoor on targets in Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir (PoK) and Pakistani Punjab province on Wednesday. On Thursday, defence ministry said the armed forces targeted air defence radars and systems in Pakistan, even as Pakistani troops increased the intensity of firing across the Line of Control, the de facto India-Pakistan border in Jammu and Kashmir (J&K).

The people cited above said Modi called for continued alertness, institutional synergy, and clear communication as the nation navigates a sensitive period. Modi reaffirmed the government's commitment to national security, operational preparedness, and citizen safety.

The meeting was called to review national preparedness and interministerial coordination following strikes on terror camps. "Secretaries have been directed to undertake a comprehensive review of their respective ministries' operations and to ensure fool-proof functioning of essential systems, with special focus on readiness, emergency response, and internal communication protocols," said one of the people cited above.



IPL 2025: PBKS-DC GAME CALLED OFF AMID OPERATION SINDOOR' **ESCALATING BORDER TENSIONS**



Diary Times Desk : The IPL 2025 fixture between Punjab Kings and Delhi Capitals in Dharamsala was called off after 10.1 overs amid escalating tensions on the India-Pakistan border. Just past the midway point of the first innings, at 21:29 IST, three light towers at the stadium went off, forcing a stoppage in play and then subsequently forcing the players off the field.

According to an official BCCI statement, the abandonment was due to a "significant technical failure" at the HPCA Stadium. "Due to a power outage in the area, one of the light towers at the HPCA stadium malfunctioned. BCCI regrets the inconvenience caused to in-stadium attendees," the board's release stated.

Both teams and spectators were evacuated from the HPCA Stadium. At the time of writing, Cricbuzz has learnt that the players and coaches had boarded buses to the team hotel, shortly after their families had been ferried out around 10 minutes earlier.

Cricbuzz understands that the HPCA was asked by the Himachal Pradesh state government to order the evacuation as a precautionary measure. According to sources at the venue, there was no announcement over the PA system but the local police and the venue operations team requested for a slow evacuation of the stadium. "There is no rush or panic... the cops came and asked everyone to move slowly towards the exits," a team source at the venue told Cricbuzz.

The development followed news reports of military escalation in Jammu, about 200 kilometres away from Dharamsala. There has been no blackout enforced in the Himachal hill town at the time of writing. Cricbuzz understands that BCCI officials are huddled in a meeting.

PAKISTAN ATTEMPTS HITTING JAMMU AIRPORT, CITY; **BLACKOUT INITIATED**

Diary Times Desk : Civil defence drill was activated in Jammu city on Thursday evening after loud bangs were heard at least thrice at a close interval of about 15 minutes. A complete blackout ensued as countermeasures were initiated. Residents across Greater Kailash, RS Pora, Chhani Himmat reported hearing massive bangs in and around the city areas quickly followed by a spotting of several red balls in the air. Akhil Razdan, a resident of Greater Kailash, Jammu, said it looked like a drone or a missile attack "very close to where he lived in Greater Kailash but it was intercepted very quickly." Razdan said he lived very close to the airport at a distance of around 7 km. "I heard a loud bana and thought these were firecrackers. So I went to the terrace to look things up and spotted at least eight red balls in the direction of the bang. It looked like a drone attack from across the border which our air defence systems intercepted. As soon as the red balls were seen, the air sirens went off and there was a complete blackout," Razdan said. Vijay Kumar, an RS Pora resident, reported the same sequence of events thrice and said it was still continuing.

'OPERATION SINDOOR'

Diary Times Desk : The choice of de-escalation is with Pakistan as it escalated the situation with the Pahalgam terror attack and India only responded to it through 'Operation Sindoor', Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri said on Thursday. His comments at a media briefing came amid heightened tensions between the two countries. Misri said escalation started from that side (Pakistan) with the April 22 Pahalgam attack in which 26 people, mostly tourists, were killed. "Our approach is not to escalate the situation, we only responded to the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack," he said. On de-escalation of the situation, Misri said, "Pakistan escalated the situation, we only responded. Choice is with Pakistan." He said at the UNSC meeting, Pakistan opposed mention of the role of terror group The Resistance Force (TRF) when it had already claimed responsibility for the Pahalgam attack. The foreign secretary also said the retaliatory actions of Pakistan are impacting civilians.

PRESIDENT GRANTS SANCTION TO PROSECUTE LALU IN LAND-FOR-JOB PMLA CASE



Diary Times Desk : President Droupadi Murmu has granted sanction to prosecute RJD chief and former Union Minister Lalu Prasad in a money-laundering case linked to the alleged Railways land-for-job scam, official sources said on Thursday. Murmu has accorded the permission as mandated under Section 197(1) of the CrPC (Section 218 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023), they said. The case has been investigated by the Enforcement Directorate (ED), and the federal probe agency chargesheeted the 76-yearold former Bihar Chief Minister, his son and former Deputy CM of the state Tejashwi Yadav and other family members in August last year. Before this, in January 2024, the ED had filed its first chargesheet against an alleged associate of the Prasad family, Amit Katyal, and other family members of Prasad, including his wife and former Bihar CM Rabri Devi, MP daughter Misa Bharti, another daughter Hema Yadav and two associated companies.

CASH AT JUDGE'S HOUSE: CJI KHANNA RECOMMENDS REMOVAL OF JUSTICE YASHWANT VARMA

Diary Times Desk : Days after a three-judge inquiry panel indicted Allahabad High Court's Justice Yashwant Varma for recovery of unaccounted cash during a fire incident at his residence here on March 14 - when he was a judge of the Delhi High Court, CJI Sanjiv Khanna is reliably learnt to have recommended his removal to the government. "Chief Justice of India, in terms of the in-house procedure, has written to President of India and the Prime Minister of India enclosing therewith a copy of the three-member committee report dated May 3 along with the letter/response dated May 6 received from Justice Yashwant Varma," a Supreme Court statement read. In its report submitted to the CJI on May 4, the threemember committee comprising Punjab and Haryana High Court Chief Justice Sheel Nagu, Himachal Pradesh High Court Chief Justice GS Sandhawalia and Justice Anu Sivaraman of the Karnataka High Court found clear evidence to confirm recovery of a huge stash of cash in the storeroom of Justice Varma's official residence in New Delhi at the time of the fire incident, sources said. After the indictment, the CJI who is due to retire on May 13 – had sought Justice Varma's response to the panel's report and had also advised him to step down.



Diary Times Desk : Amid Indo-Pak tension, Himachal Pradesh government has increased bus fares. On Thursday, the state government has issued a notification fixing new fare rates for stage carriage bus services. The fare has been increased by about 15 percent. According to the notification, there will be separate fares for plain and hilly roads. The new fare will be applicable with immediate effect. Earlier, the ordinary bus fare in plain areas was Rs 1.40 per passenger, now it has been increased to Rs 1.60 per kilometer. Similarly, in hilly areas, it was earlier Rs 2.19 and now it has been increased to Rs 2.50 per kilometer. Earlier, the government had increased the minimum fare from five to 10 rupees. The government has also clarified that in future, the proposal for fare hike can be submitted by the Transport Department from time to time according to the official rate of inflation. The minister in charge is authorized to take a decision in this regard. The government has already increased the minimum bus fare from five to 10 rupees. Now the general fare of buses has also been increased.

GOVERNMENT DEBUNKS REPORTS OF PAKISTANI STRIKES ON AMRITSAR MILITARY BASE

Diary Times Desk : Hours after India's Operation Sindoor, a targeted military strike on nine terror camps across the border to avenge the Pahalgam terror attack, a flood of disinformation has emerged from Pakistani media and governmentlinked social media handles. Many of these platforms circulated baseless narratives alleging retaliatory attacks by Pakistan on Indian soil one such claim that Pakistan attacked the military base in Amritsar. However, the Indian government's official fact-checking agency has debunked the claim, calling it "false". A fake video of the claim was also circulated on social media, with the Press Information Bureau (PIB) Fact Check division noting that the footage is from a wildfire in 2024. "Pakistan-based handles are spreading old videos falsely alleging strikes on a military base in Amritsar. The video being shared is from a wildfire from 2024. Avoid sharing unverified information and rely only on official sources from the Government of India for accurate information," the PIB wrote in a post on X.

CHIEF JUSTICE RECOMMENDS INITIATING PROCEDURE TO REMOVE CASH ROW JUDGE: SOURCES

Diary Times Desk: After receiving a report from the three-member panel looking into allegations of a huge pile of burnt cash being found in a storeroom attached to the bungalow of Delhi High Court Justice Yashwant Verma, the Chief Justice of India has written to the President Prime Minister and and recommended that proceedings be initiated to remove him, sources said. In a statement on Thursday, the Supreme Court said, "Chief Justice of India, in terms of the In-House Procedure, has written to Hon'ble the President of India and Hon'ble the Prime Minister of India enclosing therewith copy of the 3-Member Committee report dated 03.05.2025 along with the letter/response dated 06.05.2025 received from Mr Justice Yashwant Varma." While the details of the panel's report are not yet known, the sources said that Chief Justice Sanjiv Khanna has recommended that a motion for the removal of Justice Verma be initiated. A large pile of cash had allegedly been recovered from a storeroom attached to Justice Verma's house in Lutvens' Delhi following a fire call on March 14, which was Holi. The judge had said that the storeroom is used by several people and he was not aware of any cash being kept there.

ABDUL RAUF AZHAR, IC-814 HIJACKING MASTERMIND, KILLED IN OP SINDOOR: BJP



Diary Times Desk : The BJP has claimed that Abdul Rauf Azhar, the younger brother of Jaish-e-Mohammed chief Masood Azhar, was among the terrorists killed as India struck terror infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir under Operation Sindoor yesterday. India yesterday launched precision airstrikes at nine locations in Pakistan and PoK in retaliation for the Pahalgam terror attack in which 26 innocents were murdered in cold blood. One of these locations was the Jaish headquarters in Bahawalpur. The BJP put out a social media post with Abdul Rauf Azhar's photo and "eliminated" written on it. Abdul Rauf Azhar, a most-wanted terrorist, was the mastermind of the hijack of Indian Airlines IC 814 in Kandahar in 1999. He was involved in the Pathankot terror attack and the 2001 attack on Parliament. In the IC 814 hijack, an India Airlines plane flying from Kathmandu to Delhi with 190 people on board, was diverted to Kandahar and the Indian government was forced to release three terrorists.

MULTIPLE LOUD EXPLOSIONS HEARD IN JAMMU, PANIC AMONG RESIDENTS



PM MODI MEETS ARMY CHIEF AFTER PAKISTAN'S MISSILE ATTACK, INDIA'S RESPONSE

BORDERS SEALED, MISSILES READY: RAJASTHAN, PUNJAB ALERT AFTER OP SINDOOR

Diary Times Desk : A day after India's precision missile strikes in Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir to avenge the Pahalgam terror attack, border states Rajasthan and Punjab are in alert mode. Leaves of all police personnel have been cancelled and public gatherings restricted as local authorities gear up for any escalation from the Pakistan side. Rajasthan, which shares a 1,037km border with Pakistan, is on high alert. The border has been completely sealed and Border Security Force personnel have been given shoot-on-sight orders if they spot any suspicious activity. Authorities in Rajasthan have also restricted movement near the border for those who don't live there. The Indian Air Force is on high alert. Flight movement from Jodhpur, Kishangarh and Bikaner airports has been suspended till May 9 as fighter jets patrol the skies in the western sector. Missile defence systems are activated. it is learnt. Sukhoi-30 MKI jets are conducting air patrols from Ganganagar to the Rann of Kutch. Schools in Bikaner, Sri Ganganagar, Jaisalmer, and Barmer districts have been shut and ongoing exams have been postponed. Leaves of cops and Railways staff have been cancelled.

INDIA REPELS PAK ATTACK ON TARGETS IN 15 CITIES, NEUTRALISES LAHORE'S AIR DEFENCE

Diary Times Desk : The armed forces targeted air defence radars at a number of locations in Pakistan and destroyed the system in Lahore on Thursday after Islamabad attempted to strike 15 military targets in India in response to Operation Sindoor. Sources said Pakistan's HQ-9 missile defence system units, developed by China, were hit by Israeli-made HARPY kamikaze drones, effectively rendering the Pakistani army defenceless in Lahore. The government's statement came shortly after Pakistan claimed one drone crashed near Lahore, while 12 others were taken down close to Gujranwala, Chakwal, Bahawalpur, Miano, Karachi, Chhor, Rawalpindi, and Attock. Pakistan claimed that four army personnel sustained injuries in Lahore while one civilian was killed in Miano, Sindh. The incident comes a day after India struck terror camps in Pakistan, in an operation named 'Sindoor', in response to the Pahalgam terror attack, which claimed 26 lives.

CHINA'S XI VOWS TO STAND WITH FRIEND PUTIN AGAINST 'HEGEMONIC BULLYING'

Diary Times Desk: Chinese President Xi Jinping has told Russian leader Vladimir Putin that his country will stand with Moscow against "unilateralism and hegemonic bullying" during a visit to the country to commemorate the defeat of Nazi Germany in World War II. Arriving in Moscow on Thursday at the start of a fourday visit, Xi hailed the "deeper" trust developing between the two countries, appearing to take a swipe at Western critics of Russia's continuing offensive in Ukraine, which Putin has characterised as a war against latter-day Nazis. "In the face of the international countercurrent of unilateralism and hegemonic bullying behaviour, China will work with Russia to shoulder the special responsibilities of major world powers," Xi told Putin. Greeting Xi as a "dear friend" in the Kremlin, Putin took the opportunity to underline Moscow's role in WWII, which he has long accused the West of minimising, and to reinforce his narrative of the Ukraine war as a new battle against Nazis. "Together with our Chinese friends, we firmly stand guard over historical truth, protect the memory of the events of the war years.

CONCLAVE MOVIE SERVES AS GUIDANCE FOR CARDINALS VOTING FOR NEXT POPE



Diary Times Desk : Before entering the papal elections to pick the next pope, several Catholic cardinals reportedly watched the film Conclave, starring Ralph Fiennes, to get a sense of the traditions and political undercurrents of the process. The film, directed by Edward Berger and based on Robert Harris's novel, unexpectedly became a guide for many of the 133 cardinal-electors who entered the Sistine Chapel on Wednesday. Released four months before Pope Francis' death on April 21, the movie served as an unintended primer for those less familiar with the inner workings of the Vatican. A majority of the cardinals participating in this conclave were appointed by Pope Francis himself and have never experienced the intricate ceremony of papal election. Many also come from smaller, historically overlooked dioceses, mirroring the background of characters portrayed in the film. One cleric, speaking to Politico, confirmed that several participants "watched it in the cinema" as part of their informal preparation.

GERMAN SPY AGENCY PAUSES 'EXTREMIST' CLASSIFICATION FOR AFD PARTY

Diary Times Desk : Germany's domestic spy agency BfV has paused its classification of the Alternative for Germany (AfD) as an extremist organisation in what the AfD on Thursday called a partial victory for its challenge against the decision. The agency would not publicly refer to the AfD as a "confirmed rightwing extremist movement" until an administrative court in the western city of Cologne has ruled on an AfD bid for an injunction, a court statement said. The BfV's move last week to classify the far-right AfD as extremist produced sharp reactions along the fault lines of German politics, with some lawmakers calling for the AfD to be banned and the AfD casting it as an attack on democracy. It also sparked strong criticism from U.S. President Donald Trump's administration, with Secretary of State Marco Rubio callina on the German authorities to reverse their decision. The extremist classification allows the Cologne-based spy agency to step up monitoring of the AfD.

TRUMP SAYS CHINA WON'T LOWER TARIFFS AHEAD OF US-CHINA TRADE TALKS

Diary Times Desk : Following requests from Beijing, President Trump has denied to lower tariffs despite of persistent requests. He gave monosyllabic reply "No" when questioned by reporters at the White House about Chinese exports. Now at a minimum 145%, Trump denied his interest in lowering them just to initiate trade-talks. The US President implied that Chinese were the ones to initiate and request talks. Contradicting the statement made by the other side, Trump said, "I think they ought to go back and study their files". The meeting with their Chinese counterparts is set to take place to discuss the de-escalation of the tariff wars. The Treasury secretary, Scott Bessent, and Jamieson Greer, the United States trade representative aim to meet with Chinese officials on Saturday and Sunday in Geneva. Following the high-tariff standoff, both countries have hurting business however, a common ground is yet to be found. Chinese officials have claimed previously that they are unclear whether US and China will even strike a deal since they have little clarity regarding policy changes. China's Ministry of Commerce announced on Wednesday that Vice Premier He Lifeng will participate in the upcoming talks in Geneva.



CHINESE WARSHIPS ARRIVE IN SINGAPORE FOR MARITIME DEFENSE EXHIBITION

Diary Times Desk : Two warships independently developed by China have arrived at the Changi Naval Base in Singapore and will be open to the public at the ongoing International Maritime Defense Exhibition (IMDEX) Asia 2025. IMDEX Asia 2025, which opened on Tuesday at the Changi Exhibition Center, is one of the most influential defense events in Asia. China has participated in the exhibition for many consecutive sessions. This edition of the exhibition has attracted more than 100 companies from countries and regions around the world, focusing on displaying the maritime latest sci-tech achievements in the fields including artificial intelligence technology, and ship power systems. The two warships of the Chinese Navy participating in the event are Xuchang Ship and Chishui Ship. Xuchang Ship is a Type 054A missile frigate with a full load displacement of over 4,000 tons. It is capable of carrvina out sea assault, air defense and anti-missile missions. Since it was commissioned in 2017, the ship has participated in a number of major training and exercise missions and maritime escort operations.

QUAD INITIATIVE SEEKS TO BOLSTER CIVILIAN DISASTER RESPONSE IN INDO-PACIFIC

BSF NEUTRALISES PAKISTANI INTRUDER IN PUNJAB'S FEROZEPUR SECTOR

PUNJAB-HARYANA WATER ROW: HIGH COURT ASKS BBMB CHAIRMAN TO FILE AFFIDAVIT

Diary Times Desk : Just about two days after the State of Punjab was directed to abide by the decision to release 4500 cusecs of extra water to Haryana and not to interfere in the functioning of Bhakra Beas Management Board (BBMB), the Punjab and Haryana High Court on Thursday asked Chairman Manoj Tripathi to file an affidavit on his claim that the Punjab Police stopped him from releasing water to Haryana. Appearing through videoconferencing before the high court Bench of Chief Justice Sheel Nagu and Justice Sumeet Goel, BBMB Chairman Tripathi apprised the court that two BBMB officers directed to release 200 cusecs water to Haryana were restrained by the police agency. The chairman also claimed he was "gheraoed" at the guest house by some civilians, when the Punjab Police rescued him. Taking a note of his submissions, the Bench asked Tripathi to file his statement on an affidavit. Additional Solicitor-General of India Satva Pal Jain was also asked to produce minutes of May 2 meeting held under Union Home Secretary's chairmanship, where it was decided to release 4500 cusecs of extra water to Haryana over a period of eight days to meet its urgent requirement. The matter will now come up for further hearing on May 9. The Bench was hearing an application for directing the State of Punjab.

LANCE NAIK FROM PALWAL MARTYRED IN PAK SHELLING IN KASHMIR

40% HIKE IN LICENCE FEE TO SERVE LIQUOR AT RESTAURANTS

Diary Times Desk : There will be few takers for liquor licence, with the state hiking the fee to serve liquor at a restaurant by almost 40%. The hike in excise policy for 2025-26 is expected to impact the night life of Gurugram, which has the highest number of restaurants and pubs serving liquor. The Pub Association owners claim that they are already seeing a dip in patrons due to 'bring your own booze' (BYOB) outlets. And now, with a hike in licence fee, they will have to hike liquor charges, which will drive away customers, they said. Restaurant owners say the cost of L4/L5 (restaurant) licence has increased from Rs 18 lakh to Rs 25 lakh, and they are being asked to pay Rs 45 lakh for a 21-month term. There is an additional Rs 20 lakh annual fee to operate between midnight and 2 am, and restaurants must now pay 20% of Rs 45 lakh (about Rs 9 lakh) if they wish to add extra counters or bars. Restaurateurs warned that though the new policy intended to bring about parity and structure, it could adversely affect the hospitality sector. Several bar owners have demanded phased implementation, or a more flexible assessment model. "The steep rise. coupled with increased procurement and compliance costs, will push up the prices of alcohol. Not many of us can afford it. People are already choosing BYOBs, and now with this hike, they will stop coming here.

CONGRESS CANCELS MEETING CALLED TO DISCUSS NAMES FOR HPCC TOP POST

Diary Times Desk : The appointment of a new president of the Himachal Pradesh Congress Committee (HPCC) will take a little longer. The Congress high command had called Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu, his ministers, former party presidents and other eminent leaders to New Delhi tomorrow to discuss the potential candidates for the top post of the HPCC but the meeting was postponed following the strikes by Indian armed forces in Pakistan. The three-year tenure of incumbent president Pratibha Singh has expired and the names of a few leaders for the post are doing the rounds. The names of a few ministers are being proposed for the post but they are reportedly not interested. At least one minister is said to have agreed to take up the responsibility on the condition that he will be allowed to continue as minister as well. Factors like regional balance and caste are also being considered to decide the next president. "The name of the president should be declared at the earliest. Resentment among party workers and even ministers is growing, which is not good for the party," said a senior Congress leader. With no clear name emerging for the post of the HPCC president, the reconstitution of the dissolved party body will also be delayed further.

SECURITY BEEFED UP IN CHAMBA'S BORDER AREAS ALONG J&K, PUNJAB

Diary Times Desk : The district authorities have tightened security along Chamba's borders with Jammu and Kashmir and Punjab after India's retaliatory strikes against terror outfits in Pakistan in the wake of the Pahalgam attack. Chamba shares border with both Jammu and Kashmir and Punjab, making several areas in the district vulnerable. To strengthen security, the police have completely sealed the 220-km-long border starting from the Khairi sector to Churah and Pangi subdivisions. Enhanced surveillance is also being done on the border with Punjab. Police personnel are patrolling sensitive areas day and night and all vehicles entering Chamba from neighbouring states are being checked thoroughly. Military forces stationed in the Khairi sector are working alongside the police to monitor and secure strategic locations. Additionally, intelligence inputs are being actively gathered using technical surveillance resources. Chamba is not immune to terror incidents. One of the most horrifying incidents had occurred in Kalaban and Satrundi of Churah in 1998 when terrorists from Jammu and Kashmir brutally killed 35 labourers. Smaller incidents had also taken place in 1993, 1995 and 1996.





IPL 2025: PBKS-DC GAME CALLED OFF AMID ESCALATING BORDER TENSIONS

Diary Times Desk : The IPL 2025 fixture between Punjab Kings and Delhi Capitals in Dharamsala was called off after 10.1 overs amid escalating tensions on the India-Pakistan border. Just past the midway point of the first innings, at 21:29 IST, three light towers at the stadium went off, forcing a stoppage in play and then subsequently forcing the players off the field. According to an official BCCI statement, the abandonment was due to a "significant technical failure" at the HPCA Stadium. "Due to a power outage in the area, one of the light towers at the HPCA stadium malfunctioned. BCCI regrets the inconvenience caused to in-stadium attendees," the board's release stated. Both teams and spectators were evacuated from the HPCA Stadium. At the time of writing, Cricbuzz has learnt that the players and coaches had boarded buses to the team hotel, shortly after their families had been ferried out around 10 minutes earlier. Cricbuzz understands that the HPCA was asked by the Himachal Pradesh state aovernment to order the evacuation as a precautionary measure. According to sources at the venue, there was no announcement over the PA system but the local police

PCB POSTPONES PSL 2025 MATCHES AMID INDIA-PAKISTAN CROSS-**BORDER TENSION**

Diary Times Desk : The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) has officially deferred the scheduled Pakistan Super League (PSL) 2025 match between Karachi Kings and Peshawar Zalmi, originally set to be played in Rawalpindi on Wednesday. The postponement follows escalating military tensions between India and Pakistan. In a brief announcement, the PCB said it is coordinating with relevant stakeholders and will announce a rescheduled date in due course. While only one fixture has been officially postponed so far, reports suggest that the remainder of the tournament may also be subject to rescheduling or relocation depending on how the situation unfolds. As of Thursday, eight matches remain this season-four in Rawalpindi, one in Multan, and three in Lahore. Tensions flared following India's military response to the 22 April terror attack in Pahalgam, which left 26 people dead. The counter-operation, dubbed 'Operation Sindoor', reportedly targeted militant strongholds across the border. With Lahore-set to host the PSL final on 18 May-also affected, the tournament's future now hangs in the balance. The mounting tension has triggered concern players, among overseas with many reconsidering their participation.

In 46 matches, the left-arm orthodox has scalped 192 wickets at an average of 23.51. However, the 28-year-old was not getting consistent chances to show how good he is in the Indian Premier League (IPL). He warmed the bench for Chennai Super Kings (CSK) when he was a part of their squad in the 2020 and 2021 editions. He also didn't get many matches after joining Gujarat Titans in 2022. However, the traditional spinner's story has turned around completely in the ongoing IPL 2025. Gujarat Titans captain Shubman Gill and head coach Ashish Nehra have given him all the games this season, and on most occasions, he has played ahead of Washington Sundar as a frontline spinner. Sai Kishore has repaid the management's faith by taking 14 wickets in 11 matches. His numbers are all the more impressive considering he did not bowl more than 2 overs in many matches this season, as Shubman Gill did not call him into the attack when left-handers were batting at the crease.

ROHIT SHARMA BLASTS INDIAN COMMENTATORS. **CALLS THEM 'AGENDA-DRIVEN**
