## "SILENCE IS DAMNING": RAHUL GANDHI TARGETS S JAISHANKAR AGAIN, BJP REPLIES

**Diary Times Desk:** Doubling down on his attack on External Affairs Minister Dr S Jaishankar, senior Congress leader Rahul Gandhi today reiterated his earlier claim that the Centre informed Pakistan "at the start" of Operation Sindoor and said this wasn't a "lapse", but a "crime". This drew a sharp response from the government, which called it "an utter misrepresentation of facts". The BJP has said the Leader of Opposition's misrepresentation of the minister's remarks "reeks of malafide intent" and questioned the timing of this charge.

On Saturday, Mr Gandhi shared a video of Dr Jaishankar interacting with the media. "At the start of the operation, we have sent a message to Pakistan, saying we are striking at infrastructure and we are not striking at the military, so the military has an option of standing out and not interfering in this process. They chose not to take good advice." Sharing the video, Mr Gandhi said in a post, "Informing Pakistan at the start of our attack was a crime. EAM has publicly admitted that GOI did it. Who authorised it? How many aircraft did our airforce lose as a result?" he asked.

Reposting the video today, Mr Gandhi said the External Affairs Minister's "silence isn't just telling – it's damning". "So I'll ask again: How many Indian aircraft did we lose because Pakistan knew? This wasn't a lapse. It was a crime. And the nation deserves the truth," he said. Senior Congress leader Pawan Khera repeated Mr Gandhi's allegations during a press briefing and questioned the "relationship" the External Affairs Minister and Pakistan, due to which he informed them "beforehand".

## "NO NUCLEAR SIGNALLING BY PAK": SOURCES ON WHAT PARLIAMENT PANEL WAS TOLD



**Diary Times Desk:** There was no 'nuclear signalling' by Islamabad during the military conflict with Pakistan earlier this month, Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri told Parliament Monday evening.

Mr Misri told the House's Standing Committee on External Affairs the conflict remained "conventional" and that Islamabad's use of Chinese-made weaponry - including the HQ-9 missile defence system - was irrelevant because "what matters is we hit their air bases hard..."

However, he declined to comment on any Indian fighter jets that may have been shot down, citing national security constraints. There were reports Pak shot down five Indian jets.

Concerns that nuclear facilities - for weapons or civil use - may be targeted, deliberately or inadvertently, were red-flagged during the conflict. Such concerns were also shouted out by Pakistan in an attempt to paint India as the aggressor and 'blackmail' the Indian armed forces into submission. These, however, were dismissed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Mr Modi had said India will not be intimidated by 'nuclear blackmail'. "Any terrorist safe haven operating under this pretext will face precise and decisive strikes," he declared.

The Indian Air Force earlier trashed rumours its strikes had hit Pak's Kirana Hills, where that country's nuclear facility is reportedly based. In a humorous aside, Air Marshal AK Bharti told reporters he hadn't even heard of Kirana Hills and thanked the press for the 'tip'. In a detailed briefing about Operation Sindoor - India's military response to the Pahalgam terror attack - Mr Misri also said the United States had no role to play in the May 12 ceasefire.

### SUPREME COURT REJECTS APOLOGY BY MP MINISTER VIJAY SHAH: ORDERS SIT PROBE AGAINST HIM

Diary Times Desk: Rejecting the apology by Madhya Pradesh Tribal Affairs Minister Kunwar Vijay Shah, the Supreme Court on Monday ordered an SIT probe against him over his controversial remarks against Col Sofia Qureshi - the face of India's press briefings on 'Operation Sindoor'. "We are constituting an SIT with three IPS officers and one should be of the rank of IGP. All of them should be from outside the state. It's a litmus test and we want the state to submit the SIT report to us. We would like to have a very close watch," a Bench of Justice Surya Kant and Justice N Kotiswar Singh ordered. It directed the Madhya Pradesh Director General of Police to constitute the Special Investigation Team (SIT) by Tuesday. The Bench, however, staved Shah's arrest and ordered the minister to join the probe. It also issued notice to the state of Madhya Pradesh on Shah's petition challenging the high court's order for registration of an FIR against him. Asking the SIT to submit a report to it, the Bench posted the matter for May 28. "The kind of crass comments you made, completely thoughtless...We don't need this apology," Justice Kant said, terming it an attempt to wriggle out of the legal consequences of his statement.



### **HEAVY DOWNPOUR SINKS BENGALURU: OPPOSITION TEARS INTO GOVT ON CITY INFRA**

Diary Times Desk: Unusually heavy overnight rains pounding Bengaluru brought the country's IT capital to its knees on Monday, with the usual monsoon-time scenes of inundation, people wading through water and evacuation by inflatables playing out on the streets of this cosmopolitan city. A 35-year-old woman died after a rain-soaked wall collapsed on her, while uprooted trees added to the woes of the people and the administration. Opposition BJP mounted an offensive against the ruling Congress, alleging that the crores of rupees spent over the last two years on the city's infrastructure have yielded no results. It attacked Deputy Chief Minister and Bengaluru in-charge DK Shivakumar for the state of affairs, even as the latter admitted Bengaluru's problems were not new but that the government was now working for a long-term fix. With an average rainfall of 10.5 cm last night, Bengaluru found itself deploying dinghies.

### STRUGGLING WITH 140 CRORE PEOPLE, INDIA NOT 'DHARAMSHALA': SUPREME COURT TO SRI LANKAN NATIONAL



Diary Times Desk: Noting that India was struggling with its own 140 crore population, the Supreme Court on Monday said the country was not a 'dharamshala' or a public shelter to accommodate foreign nationals from across the world. "What's your right to settle here? Go to some other country," a Bench led by Justice Dipankar Datta told Subaskaran—a Sri Lankan national of Tamil origin—who wanted to stay back in India after completing his sevenyear jail term in an Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA) case. "Is India (meant) to host refugees from all over the world? We are struggling with 140 crore people... This is not a 'dharamshala' that we can entertain foreign nationals from all over...," said the Bench which also included Justice K Vinod Chandran. The Bench made these comments while hearing Subaskaran's petition challenging a Madras High Court order directing him to leave India after his seven-year jail term in an Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA) case was over. As his counsel said Subaskaran faced threats of arrest and torture in Sri Lanka as he was a former Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE) member and that his wife and children were settled in India, the Bench said the fundamental right to settle in India was available only to its citizens and that there was no violation of his rights under Article 21 (protection of life and liberty) of the Constitution.

### CEASEFIRE WITH PAKISTAN WAS BILATERAL: FOREIGN SECRETARY MISRI TO PARLIAMENTARY PANEL

Diary Times Desk: Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri told a parliamentary committee on Monday that the conflict between India and Pakistan was always in the conventional domain, and there was no nuclear signalling by the neighbouring country, sources said. The sources said Misri reiterated the government's stand that the decision to stop military actions was taken at a bilateral level, as some opposition members questioned US President Donald Trump's repeated assertions about his administration's role in stopping the conflict. When some opposition members of the Standing Committee on External Affairs, which is headed by Congress MP Shashi Tharoor, prodded him on the US leader's repeated attempts to take centre stage, India's top diplomat quipped that Trump did not seek his consent for doing so. No other country, the foreign ministry in its presentation said, has "any locus standi" to comment on the issue of Jammu and Kashmir, a clear repudiation of the US' suggestion for mediation between India and Pakistan.

Paraglider Rahul Gharwal had applied for a paramotoring license with the Tourism Department Hamirpur for a long time, but the license was issued only after taking a trial by the department after 300 paragliding flights. ### HIMACHAL: CHIEF MINISTER SUKHU SAID-MAJOR DEPARTMENTS WILL NOT BE SHIFTED, EMPLOYEES WILL LEAVE SHIMLA VOLUNTARILY

Diary Times Desk: Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu said that the offices of the departments and other major offices will remain in Shimla. There is no plan to shift the major departments and offices in Shimla. Nor will the government employees be shifted. Other employees will be appointed in their place. New commissions like GST Commission, RERA or other commissions are being formed, they will be shifted from here. He said that the congestion in Shimla has to be reduced. Even if the Chief Minister's car has to go, there is a long queue or there is a traffic jam. Now orders have been given to widen the circular road of Shimla. On Monday, Chief Minister Sukhu said that the previous BJP government built a building worth Rs 1000 crore and left. These buildings are lying vacant. When I was coming back by road, there is an office of the Tourism Department near Bhararighat, trucks are standing there and the place is lying vacant. All such places which are lying vacant, in which crores of rupees have been spent. If there are such places in Dharamshala and Mandi, then they will be shifted there. Due to being a hilly area, the problem of traffic here is very big. If you have to cover a distance of four kilometres in the morning, it takes one hour. Chief Minister Sukhu said that the government is considering shifting those for whom space is available. For example, the forest department's wildlife office.

### TERROR ATTACK AVERTED IN HYDERABAD, 2 ISIS-LINKED SUSPECTS ARRESTED

Diary Times Desk: A local court in Andhra Pradesh's Vizianagaram town on Sunday evening remanded two suspected terrorists, allegedly linked to a Saudi Arabia-based outfit, to 14 days of judicial custody, according to people familiar with the matter. The two accused—Sirajur-Rehman (29) from Vizianagaram and Syed Sameer (28) from Bhoiguda in the Secunderabad region of Hyderabad-were arrested earlier in the day in a joint operation conducted bv counterintelligence police of Andhra Pradesh and Telangana. Following specific intelligence input, police raided Siraj's house in Vizianagaram in the early hours and seized explosive materials, includina ammonia, sulphur, and aluminium powder, from the premises. "Based on the information provided by him, the Telangana police picked up Sameer from Hyderabad and brought him to Vizianagaram later in the evening after obtaining a prisoner transit (PT) warrant from a Hyderabad court," said police.

### "FACE CONSEQUENCES": TOP COURT RAPS MINISTER FOR COLONEL OURESHI REMARK



Diary Times Desk: The Supreme Court has rejected Madhya Pradesh minister Vijay Shah's apology over his derogatory and communal remarks for a woman military officer and ordered that a new three-member team of IPS officers would now probe the case against him. ### WE DECIDE WHO GOES": TRINAMOOL SAYS WON'T SEND DIPLOMATIC OUTREACH NOMINEES

Diary Times Desk: Bengal Chief Minister and Trinamool Congress chief Mamata Banerjee has said her party will skip the all-party international delegation on Operation Sindoor, since the Centre had not consulted her party before naming three of its leaders as the country's representatives. Ms Banerjee, however, said this is not a boycott and she would reconsider the matter if the government reaches out. "We will definitely send a representative if they inform us. Why wouldn't we? There is no point of controversy here. We are fully with the government," Ms Banerjee told reporters today as she headed for the hill town of Darjeeling to escape the heat. "We have made it clear that we are endorsing all steps taken by the Union government to combat terrorism, safeguarding the country's sovereignty, and protecting the national interest... If any delegation is going, which I think should go, my party can only decide who to assign for the delegation.



## TRUMP'S "ONE BIG BEAUTIFUL BILL" TAXES REMITTANCES. BIG IMPACT FOR INDIANS

Diary Times Desk: The US House Budget Committee voted late on Sunday night to advance President Donald Trump's "One Big Beautiful Bill Act", which would make sending money back home more expensive for thousands of Indian residents and nonresident Indians (NRIs) living in America. The bill proposes a 5 per cent tax on all international money transfers made by non-US citizens, including non-immigrant visa holders (like H-1B) and green card holders. If passed, the law would withhold 5 per cent of the remitted amount at the point of transfer. No exemption threshold limit has been set, meaning it would even apply to transfers of small denominations. The section on remittances in the 1,116-page legislation, however, specified that the 5 per cent clause will not apply to any remittance transfer by a 'verified US sender', meaning if the sender is a US citizen or national of the United States. The law could come as a massive financial blow to nearly 45 lakh Indians living in the US, including nearly 32 lakh persons of Indian Origin.

### NETANYAHU SIGNALS ISRAEL'S READINESS FOR GAZA CEASEFIRE

Diary Times Desk: Israel opened the door to both a short-term ceasefire proposal and even a broader agreement to end the Gaza conflict entirely, Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's office said on Sunday. Israeli negotiators in Qatar are actively exploring multiple diplomatic tracks, including a short-term truce and a long-term settlement. "Under the prime minister's direction, even at this hour, the negotiating team in Doha is working to exhaust every possibility for a deal -- whether according to the Witkoff outline or within the framework of ending the war, which would include the release of all hostages, the exile of Hamas terrorists, and the disarmament of the Gaza Strip," Netanyahu's office said. The "Witkoff outline," reportedly proposed by US special envoy Steve Witkoff, includes a phased roadmap beginning with a temporary ceasefire and the release of Israeli hostages. In return, Israel would consider the release of Palestinian security prisoners, with the longerterm aim of achieving a comprehensive and permanent ceasefire through continued

### PM MODI EXPRESSES CONCERNS OVER BIDEN'S PROSTATE CANCER DIAGNOSIS, WISHES QUICK RECOVERY



Diary Times Desk: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday expressed "deep concerns" over the cancer diagnosis of former US President Joe Biden. The comments came as Biden's office announced that the 82-year-old has an "aggressive form" of prostate cancer. "Deeply concerned to hear about @JoeBiden's health. Extend our best wishes to him for a quick and full recovery. Our thoughts are with Dr. Jill Biden and the family," Narendra Modi said in a post on 'X'. Biden's office released a statement saying, "While this represents a more aggressive form of the disease, the cancer appears to be hormonesensitive, which allows for effective management... The President and his family are reviewing treatment options with his physicians," it added. Many political leaders have expressed their concerns and wish for Joe Biden for a speedy recovery.

### TRUMP'S CALL WITH PUTIN UNDERWAY TO 'END BLOODBATH' IN UKRAINE

Diary Times Desk: US President Donald Trump on Monday called Russian President Vladimir Putin, a White House official said on condition of anonymity as reported by AFP. Trump has repeatedly called for an end to the "bloodbath" in Ukraine and is pinning his hopes on a fresh personal appeal to Putin to agree to a 30-day unconditional ceasefire with Kyiv. Earlier today, White House Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt said that Trump's goal for the call was to "see this conflict come to an end," adding that the US leader had "grown weary and frustrated with both sides." The White House also said that the Trump was "weary and frustrated" with the slow progress in resolving the conflict. Additionally, the US President is also set to speak to Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelensky and NATO officials during the day as he scrambles to find a solution to the three-year-old war. Meanwhile, Vice President JD Vance also reiterated that Trump was losing patience. "There's a bit of an impasse here, and I think the president's going to say to President Putin, look, are you serious?" Vance told reporters as he left Rome, where he met both Pope Leo XIV and Zelensky.

### ISRAELI STRIKES BATTER GAZA HOSPITALS AS BRUTAL SIEGE, BOMBING INTENSIFY

Diary Times Desk: In its latest assault on Gaza's decimated healthcare system, Israel has once again targeted the Indonesian Hospital in northern Gaza, this time with drones, as its forces are also carrying out a ground offensive in the north and south of the bombarded territory. Health officials said late on Sunday that fighting around the Indonesian Hospital in Gaza and an Israeli military "siege" forced it to shut down. It was the main medical facility in the north after Israeli air strikes last year also forced the Kamal Adwan and Beit Hanoon hospitals to stop providing health services. "There is direct targeting on the hospital including the intensive care unit," Indonesian Hospital director Dr Marwan al-Sultan said in a statement, adding that no one could reach the facility, which had about 30 patients and 15 medical staff inside. Israel has repeatedly targeted hospitals during its 19-month war on Gaza. Human rights groups and United Nations-backed experts have accused Israel of systematically destroying Gaza's healthcare system.



# HYDERABAD-ORIGIN PHOTOGRAPHER WINS 1ST PLACE IN 35AWARDS GLOBAL PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST

Diary Times Desk: Raghuvamsh Chavali, a Canadian photographer of Hyderabad origin, has secured top honours across multiple globally recognised photography competitions this year, including first place in the 10th Annual 35AWARDS. Known for his conceptual and urban-inspired imagery, Chavali's series "Wings Over Concrete: Urban Birds' Interlaced Flight Through City Streets" won first place in the photo project category for the '35 Best Series Photos'. The 10th Annual 35AWARDS drew over 473,100 submissions from 112.700 photographers across 174 countries. Chavali thus became one of the very few photographers representing Canada or India to receive this top honour in the competition's history. About the Project, 'Wings Over Concrete', he said the photo series captures the way birds fly through our cities, "something we see every day but rarely pay close attention to". Moreover, in the 'Thematic Contests', Chavali triumphed in the Black and White Mobile Shot competition (March 2025), selected from 12,506 entries by 3,120 photographers across 104 countries, and the "Birds in the City" competition (February 2025), chosen from 9,549 submissions by 2,666 photographers from 94 countries.

## IRAN TO KEEP ENRICHING URANIUM WITH OR WITHOUT DEAL, SAYS FOREIGN MINISTER

Diary Times Desk: Iran's Foreign Minister Abbas Araahchi said Sunday his country would keep enriching uranium "with or without a deal" with world powers, despite ongoing negotiations over its nuclear programme. "If the US is interested in ensuring that Iran will not have nuclear weapons, a deal is within reach, and we are ready for a serious conversation to achieve a solution that will forever ensure that outcome," Araghchi posted on X. "Enrichment in Iran, however, will continue with or without a deal," he said. Iran currently enriches uranium to 60 percent, far above the 3.67percent limit set in the 2015 deal but below the 90 percent needed for a nuclear warhead. Tehran says its nuclear ambitions are for civilian purposes only, and entirely peaceful. It also insists its right to continue enriching uranium for peaceful purposes is "non-negotiable", but says it would be open to temporary restrictions on how much uranium it enriches and to what level. On Wednesday, Iranian atomic energy agency chief Mohammad Eslami reiterated that Tehran "does not seek nuclear militarisation".

### FAMILY ALLEGES PROFESSOR'S ROLE IN FORMER STUDENT'S DEATH IN PHAGWARA

Diary Times Desk: The recent death of Akanksha S Nair, a young professional and former student of a private university in Phagwara, has taken a serious turn after her family alleged that a university professor may have been involved in the circumstances leading up to her death. Akanksha, who had been working with SpiceJet in Delhi, reportedly died on May 17 after falling off a hostel building on the university campus. The incident, initially believed to be a personal tragedy, has now become the focus of a growing controversy following allegations made by her family. Speaking to the media outside the Civil Hospital mortuary in Phagwara, Akanksha's father Surendra Kumar and other relatives claimed that Prof Bilji C Mathews, aged 40, had been in a relationship with Akanksha. According to the family, Mathews had allegedly assured her of marriage but later reneged on the promise after she learned that he was already married and had two children. The family believes that this betrayal caused Akanksha immense emotional distress and directly contributed to her decision to end her life. The family further alleged that the initial statement recorded by the local police at Police Chowki Chaheru, under the Satnampura police station, was fabricated.



### YOUTUBER, STUDENT AND SECURITY GUARD: 12 ARRESTED FROM PUNJAB, HARYANA AND UP FOR SPYING FOR PAKISTAN

Diary Times Desk : At least 12 persons, including a YouTuber, have been nabbed on the charges of spying for Pakistan in the past two weeks from Punjab, Haryana and Uttar Pradesh with investigations pointing out that they were allegedly part of a Pakistan-linked espionage network operating in north India, police said. While six of them have been held from Punjab, four were nabbed from neighbouring Haryana. Among arrested, two women, including the YouTuber from Haryana, were allegedly in touch with Pakistani officer Ehsan-ur-Rahim alias Danish posted at the Pakistan High Commission in New Delhi. On May 13, India expelled the Pakistani official for allegedly indulging in espionage. In addition to the arrests made from Punjab and Haryana, an alleged agent of Pakistan's intelligence agency Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) was arrested from Uttar Pradesh's Rampur on Sunday by the state's Special Task Force.

### HIGH COURT FINDS DEPUTY SUPERINTENDENT GUILTY OF DERELICTION OF DUTY

Diary Times Desk: The Punjab and Haryana High Court has dismissed a petition filed by a jail official challenging the cut in his pension following a custodial death, holding that "the prisoner having been sent to judicial remand by the court, was as a matter of fact in its constructive custody given to the arms of the State, protection of whose was the primary responsibility of the authorities manning the jail." Justice Aman Chaudhary held that while there were no allegations of direct assault against the petitioner, Ferozepur Central Jail Deputy Superintendent Dilbagh Singh, in the custodial death of undertrial Kewal Singh. But he was nevertheless guilty of dereliction of duty as the in-charge of the jail at the time of the incident. The court was hearing a petition filed against the charge-sheet dated April 13, 2010, the punishment order dated September 27, 2013, and the appellate authority's order of May 4, 2016, by which a 5 per cent cut in the petitioner's pension.

## OUR AIR DEFENCE SYSTEM FOILED PAKISTAN'S BID TO TARGET GOLDEN TEMPLE: DEFENCE OFFICIAL

**Diary Times Desk:** Pakistan taraeted the Golden Temple in Amritsar during the recent conflict with India. However, the attempt was foiled by the Indian air defence system. This was claimed by a senior defence official on Monday while demonstrating India's air defence system, including indigenous Akash missiles and L-70 air defence guns, that intercepted the Pakistani drones and missiles. "Following the Pahalgam terror attack, Operation Sindoor was launched and punitive strikes carried out on terror targets in Pakistan. Of the nine targets hit, seven were exclusively destroyed," said the official. He said the army was fully prepared to foil any misadventure by the Pakistan military. The defence system remained operative 24x7, and intercepted and neutralised all attacks targeted at military installations and religious places, he said. "We anticipated that they would target our military installations besides the civilian targets, including religious places, said the official, adding, "Of these, the Golden Temple was the most prominent. We received credible intelligence that the Golden Temple was their target. We mobilised additional modern air defence assets to provide a holistic air defence umbrella cover to the shrine."

### PUNJAB BJP DEMANDS CBI INQUIRY INTO INCREASING ASSETS OF AAP LEADERS, MAJITHA HOOCH TRAGEDY

Diary Times Desk: The Punjab BJP has submitted a memorandum to Governor Gulab Chand Kataria, demanding a CBI inquiry into the alleged rise in assets of Punjab AAP leaders and the tragic Majitha Hooch incident. The horrific tragedy in Majitha, Amritsar, which claimed 27 lives, has deeply affected the people of Punjab. The BJP is appalled by the human cost of this tragedy, which they attribute to the AAP's alleged links with the liquor mafia. Leading the delegation, state BJP president Sunil Jakhar, has requested a time-bound inquiry into the AAP's connections with the liquor mafia and their alleged exploitation of Punjab's excise for personal profit. The BJP claims that the Bhagwant Mannled AAP regime harbours elements of the liquor mafia and profits from their criminal activities. They also highlight a similar incident in Sangrur in March 2024. He further points to the now-scrapped Delhi Excise Policy, under which top AAP leaders like Arvind Kejriwal and Manish Sisodia have faced legal action. He criticised the CM's recent claim that "99 per cent of Punjab's villages are drug-free", calling it insensitive in light of tragedies involving spurious liquor.

# HARYANA YOUTUBER'S INSTAGRAM BLOCKED OVER SHARING INFO WITH PAKISTAN

Diary Times Desk : The Instagram account of a YouTuber from Hisar, Jyoti Malhotra, has been blocked following serious allegations of spying for Pakistan. Jyoti is in police custody for five days after the Hisar police booked her under various sections of the BNS and the Official Secrets Act. It is alleged that she had traveled to several sensitive and strategically important locations in Jammu and Kashmir shortly before a terrorist attack in Pahalgam. Her YouTube videos show visits to highsecurity areas including Pahalgam, Gulmara, Dal Lake, and Pangona Lake, which lies near the Line of Actual Control (LAC) with China, the police sources said. They added that these visits, made in 2024 and again on January 5, 2025, have alerted the intelligence agencies, and she was on their radar ever since. Hisar police searched her residence and seized several documents. The sources said that the National Investigation Agency (NIA) is expected to interrogate her soon regarding possible terror links.

### BANK ROBBERY ATTEMPTED AT PNB TARAORI BRANCH IN KARNAL

Diary Times Desk : In a major security breach. unidentified miscreants attempted to rob the Punjab National Bank (PNB) branch in the new grain market area of Taraori by drilling a hole through its rear wall below a window. According to initial reports, the miscreants entered the bank premises by breaking a section of the rear wall. Their attempt was discovered on Monday morning when bank employees noticed signs of forced entry upon opening the branch. Responding swiftly to the alert, local police, along with a team from the Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL), arrived at the scene, collected evidence, and assessed damage. CCTV footage is also being reviewed. "We received information about an attempted theft at PNB's Taraori branch around 8 am, after which we, along with a forensic expert, visited the crime scene and collected evidence," said SHO Nasib Singh Preliminary investigation suggests tampering with a passbook machine and the theft of a tablet device. Fortunately, no cash has been reported missing so far. The investigation is ongoing from all possible angles, he added. The bank authorities have yet to release a detailed statement on the extent of the loss. A bank official, Devender, confirmed that a tablet was missing and said a complete audit is in progress.

### 2 KILLED AS BANYAN TREE FALLS ON TRUCK IN KANGRA

Diary Times Desk: In a tragic incident, two men lost their lives today after a banyan tree collapsed on a truck in which they were sleeping. The incident occurred in Khawa village near Sadon, under the Nagrota Bagwan sub-division of Kangra district. The deceased have been identified as Tek Chand, son of Diwan, a resident of Mahal; and Sanjeev Kumar, son of Ram Kumar, from Masal Bari in Dehra tehsil – both hailing from Kangra district. The truck - which was parked by the roadside, loaded with bricks - was scheduled for delivery later in the day. It was crushed under the weight of the tree, which reportedly had a girth of nearly 50 feet. The early morning storm is believed to have caused the tree to topple, completely engulfing the vehicle in its branches and foliage. The local village pradhan, Manoj, reported the incident to Babloo of Sadon, who is also the state president of the Anti-Terrorist Front. Babloo reached the site around 6 am with emergency support. However, immediate rescue efforts were extremely challenging.

### HIMACHAL GOVERNMENT MAY APPOINT EDUCATION BOARD CHAIRMAN SOON: THAKUR

Diary Times Desk: The Himachal Pradesh Government may soon appoint a new chairman for the Himachal Pradesh Board of School Education (HPBOSE), with the post remaining vacant for over two years. At present, Bairwa, District Magistrate, Kangra, stationed in Dharamsala, is serving as the officiating chairman of the board. In a recent development, eight new members were inducted into the board last week, in addition to the existing ex-officio members. As such, the quorum of the board is now complete. Among the new members is the Congress MLA Ashish Butail from Palampur Assembly constituency, who previously served as the chief parliamentary secretary for the Department of School Education. Two other Congress MLAs Neeraj Nayyar from Chamba Assembly constituency and Chandra Shekhar from Nurpur Assembly constituency have also been nominated as members of the education board. Other members of the board include Anil Thakur, Principal of Government College.

### WATER RISING IN MANDI'S PANDOH DAM; PEOPLE CAUTIONED NOT TO VENTURE TO BANKS OF BEAS

Diary Times Desk: Authorities of Pandoh dam in Mandi district on Monday cautioned the general public and tourists not to venture to the banks of the Beas as the spill gates could be opened anytime since the water level is rising. Thunderstorms caused damages in parts of Mandi district on Monday and dark clouds overcast the sky in Mandi and Shimla. The safety of the dam is being ascertained, officials said. Flash floods in Udaipur subdivision of Lahaul and Spiti district have blocked the Sansari-Killar-Tindi-Thirot road. The police have urged the public to avoid travelling on this road, as its clearance was obstructed by rains. The local Met office has issued an orange warning for light to moderate rains accompanied by lightning, hail and gusty winds with a speed of 40-50 kilometres per hour at isolated places in Una and Shimla districts on Monday. It has also issued a yellow warning for light to moderate rains accompanied by lightning and gusty winds with a speed of 30-40 kilometres per hour at isolated places in Bilapsur, Mandi, Kullu, Hamirpur, Solan and Sirmaur districts. Light rain was predicted in Shimla and adjoining areas.



### WILL SEEK DOUBLE TARIFF ON APPLE IMPORT: CM SUKHU

Diary Times Desk: Amidst growing demand for ban on import of apples from Turkey, Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu today said he will demand double tariff on import of apples from Turkey and other countries in his meeting with Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Talking to media persons here today, Sukhu said he will raise the issue concerning the apple growers of Himachal with the PM during the scheduled meeting of chief ministers with Modi at Delhi on May 24. "I will also write to the PM to take steps to impose double tariffs on apple import as the growers of Himachal, Jammu and Kashmir suffer losses due to import of cheap apples from abroad," said Sukhu. The CM said he will urge the PM to impose double tariff on import of apples from Turkey as it is the domain and authority of the Centre to act against any country with whom a trade agreement has been signed. "The import of apples from Turkey and US results in a steep fall in the prices of apples grown by Himachal orchardists. Himachal is known as the fruit bowl of India and growers work hard to cultivate quality fruit but are hit hard by apple import," he said. The demand for banning apple imports from Turkey following Turkey siding with Pakistan in the recent Indo-Pakistan conflict – is gaining momentum in the state. Both Congress and BJP leaders have raised this demand.

## HIMACHAL CONGRESS CHIEF MUST BE A MASS LEADER, NOT RUBBER STAMP: VIKRAMADITYA

Diary Times Desk: Himachal Pradesh PWD Minister Vikramaditya Singh on Monday said the state Congress president should be a strong mass leader, not just a rubber stamp. "Naming the Himachal Pradesh Congress Committee (HPCC) president is the prerogative of the party high command. The person chosen should be a mass leader of stature. It would be detrimental to the party's interests if the responsibility is given to someone who is merely a rubber stamp," said Vikramaditya Singh, Incidentally, Pratibha Singh, mother of Vikramaditya Singh, has completed her term as HPCC president, with no clarity yet on whether she will be given another term. While reiterating that the decision to retain her or appoint a new president rests with the party high command, the minister emphasised that empowering a strong mass leader would benefit the party in the long run. The names of some firsttime MLAs are reportedly being floated for the post of HPCC president. The minister also stressed that the dissolved HPCC should be reconstituted at the earliest, noting that it has been over six months since the AICC dissolved the state unit. Pratibha Singh, mother of Vikramaditya Singh, has completed her term as HPCC president.

### GOVERNMENT TO RECRUIT 1,000 PASHU MITRAS IN ANIMAL HUSBANDRY DEPARTMENT

Diary Times Desk: The state government today gave approval for the appointment of 1,000 multitask workers (Pashu Mitras) in the Animal Husbandry Department. The decision was taken by the Cabinet, which met here today under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu. The Cabinet also approved the Pashu Mitra Policy, 2025, under which these 1,000 appointments will be made. Nod was also given for filling up 100 posts of junior office assistant (Library) in the Education Department to ensure smooth functioning of the school libraries. In another significant decision the Cabinet approved an increase in the monthly honorarium of operation theatre assistants from Rs 17,820 to Rs 25,000 and for radiographers and X-ray technicians from Rs 13,100 to Rs 25,000. This has been done to ensure that quality healthcare is available to people in the state and trained professionals show interest in serving in the state. The Cabinet approved Mukhya Mantri Green Adoption Yojana for plantations on degraded forest lands by private entrepreneurs under corporate social responsibility (CSR) to increase the actual forest areas in the state.



### **BCCI YET TO DISCUSS INDIA'S ASIA CUP PARTICIPATION**

Diary Times Desk: Amid growing speculation over whether India will play in this year's Asia Cup, in the wake of tensions with Pakistan, BCCI secretary Devajit Saikia has downplayed reports that India were pulling out, insisting that the issue was yet to be "discussed". India are due to host the six-team event in the T20 format but the Asian Cricket Council (ACC), which runs the Asia Cup, has not yet announced the schedule or the venue. September has unofficially been pencilled in as the window. "The Asia Cup matter or any other ACC event issue has not come up for discussion at any level," Saikia said in a statement on Monday. "... till now, BCCI has not even discussed or taken any such steps regarding ensuing ACC events, leave alone writing anything to the ACC. At this stage, our prime focus is on the ongoing IPL and subsequent England series, both men and women." Saikia said the BCCI had not communicated any decision to the ACC concerning India's participation in the Asia Cup as well as the Women's Emerging Asia Cup in Sri Lanka in June. However, ESPNcricinfo has learned the women's Emerging Asia Cup has been postponed though the reason could not be confirmed. The ACC has not yet made any formal announcement on the postponement. Speculation about India's participation and the fate of this year's event has arisen as tensions between India and Pakistan soared this month after the terror attack in Pahalgam on April 22.



### VIRAT KOHLI'S TEST RETIREMENT DECISION A 'BRAINFADE'. TOLD TO "CLOSE HIS EYES AND..."

Diary Times Desk: Former India cricketer Manoj Tiwary has urged Virat Kohli to reconsider his decision to retire from Test cricket. Kohli announced his Test retirement earlier this month, ending days of speculation over his uncertain future. Kohli's announcement came days after it was reported that he had communicated his decision to retire from Tests to the BCCI. A former teammate of Kohli, Tiwary felt the former India captain has plenty of cricket left in him. Speaking on Cricbuzz, Tiwary added he would be happy, just like any other fan of Indian cricket, if Kohli makes a retirement u-turn. "I felt a bit sad. In an era where T20 cricket is racing ahead, Kohli has kept Test cricket alive. He could have easily not given it the required importance. But he kept Test cricket as a priority always. We saw that in his captaincy, too. I'll ask him to close his eyes and take the retirement back as soon as possible. It'll bring back the happiness on the faces of all cricket fans. Even I did that, I took back retirement from first-class cricket after just five days and then played for Bengal, trying to win the Ranji Trophy," said Tiwary. Tiwary also suggested that Kohli had a 'brain fade' moment and hastily made the decision to retire. "Sometimes you face a time when a brain fade can happen and you make a decision. It's possible he had that too.

### "SHUBMAN GILL, SAI SUDHARSAN CAN WEATHER ANY STORM": IPL-WINNING COACH'S BIG PRAISE

Diary Times Desk: Former Australian cricketer and veteran coach Tom Moody believes Gujarat Titans opening pair Sai Sudharsan and skipper Shubman Gill have learned the art of shifting through gears with a technique that allows them to weather any storm. Shubman (93\*) and Sudharsan (108\*) continued their searing form under Delhi's scorching heat on an actionpacked Sunday in the 18th edition of the Indian Premier League (IPL). After Delhi blazed its way through the obstacles to set up a daunting 200run target for Gujarat, the young Titans duo broke DC's backbone with a sublime batting display. The young sensations are the players across the ten franchises to score 600-plus runs in the current season. They figured out a blueprint for victory and executed it flawlessly to steer the Titans to the top of the table and a playoff spot by staging a 10-wicket triumph. I think the way they dovetail together as an opening pair, they seem to really understand each other's game. One seems to fall in behind the other if one's got off to a flier. So they cover each other, and there seems to be a pattern in that throughout the season. And just their traditional strokeplay," Moody said on ESPNcricinfo Time Out. Shubman's and Sudharsan's opening pair look easy on the eye, but their sublime performances are laced.

### RAHUL DRAVID LOSES COOL AFTER RR'S 10TH DEFEAT OF IPL 2025 SEASON, SAYS "THERE'S NO POINT..."

Diary Times Desk: In a season filled with high hopes and significant challenges, Rajasthan Royals (RR) head coach Rahul Dravid has openly expressed his disappointment following the team's recent defeat to Punjab Kings. This loss marks RR's tenth in the IPL 2025 season, positioning them ninth on the points table. Dravid highlighted issues across all departments, emphasising that the team's performance has not met expectations. Despite a promising start to the season, including a standout century by young talent Vaibhav Suryavanshi, RR has struggled to maintain consistency, particularly in death bowling and middle-order batting. After RR's 8-wicket loss to Punjab Kings, Dravid acknowledged the team's shortcomings, stating, "There's no point just blaming the batsman. I think with the ball also, to be honest, I didn't think it was a 220 wicket, it was about a 195, 200 wicket, and we gave 20 runs extra."
