
COVID CASE TALLY HITS 3,758 IN SIGNIFICANT SURGE; 2 DEATHS RECORDED IN KERALA, KARNATAKA

Diary Times Desk: Covid-19 active cases in India have risen to over 3,700—marking the first significant surge in months—with more than 360 new infections reported in the past 24 hours, as per Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) data on Sunday, June 1.

As of Sunday, Kerala, Maharashtra, and Delhi have logged the most Covid-19 active cases at 1400, 485 and 436 respectively. Meanwhile, the country also recorded two Covid-19-related death in the 24-hour period, MoHFW data on Sunday showed.

Covid-19 active cases in India: The country currently has a total of 3,758 active cases of Covid-19, with 363 fresh infections reported between Saturday and Sunday -- May 31 and June 1.

Most cases in these states: Kerala tops the Covid tally chart with 1,400 active cases, followed by Maharashtra (485 cases) and Delhi (436 cases). Kerala, Maharashtra and Delhi logged 64, 18 and 61 fresh cases, respectively, in the last 24 hours, as per MoHFW data. Covid deaths in India: India also reported two Covid-19-related deaths -- one each in Kerala and Karnataka -- in the 24-hour period, MoHFW figures on Sunday showed. In Karnataka, a 63-year-old man with Pulmonary TB, Squamous Cell Carcinoma of buccal mucosa and incidental Covid positive status died, while in Kerala, a 24-year-old woman with Covid-19 and Sepsis Hypertension, DCLD.



KHARGE SAID

PM MODI SHOULD STEP BACK FROM CAMPAIGNING, FOCUS ON ENEMY: KHARGE



Diary Times Desk: Commenting on Prime Minister Narendra Modi's public speeches after Operation Sindoor, Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge on Sunday urged him to "focus on the enemy instead of self-boasting" and to recuse himself from election campaign.

"I don't like reacting to all his (Modi's) statements," Kharge said while addressing reporters in Bengaluru. "But my only request to him is that those in power should sometimes keep their mouth shut."

Kharge questioned the Prime Minister's recent public statements and political activities, suggesting that Modi should temporarily step back from electoral campaigning. "Modi should recuse himself from elections and focus on the country. He should understand whatever has happened in the country and speak," he remarked.

"I am saying without any political differences that he (Modi) should focus on the enemy instead of self-boasting that no one except him would have done it. Our full support is with the Armed Forces," he said.

Referring to ongoing developments linked to Operation Sindoor, Kharge noted that multi-party delegations are visiting several countries to explain India's position. "Let them come back. Till they return, it is not proper to be touring around and giving speeches," he said. The opposition leader in the Rajya Sabha reiterated the Congress party's unwavering support to the armed forces. The Congress chief also took a swipe at the Prime Minister's earlier assertion that the military had been given a free hand.



DIVORCED WIFE ENTITLED TO MAINTENANCE TO SECURE FUTURE, IF LIVING INDEPENDENTLY SANS REMARRIAGE

Diary Times Desk: A divorced wife is entitled to a level of maintenance that reflects the standard of living she enjoyed during the marriage and which reasonably secures her future, if she is living independently without getting remarried, the Supreme Court has ruled. The ruling came from a Bench of Justice Vikram Nath and Justice Sandeep Mehta which enhanced the monthly maintenance of a divorced woman from West Bengal from Rs 20,000 to Rs 50,000. "In our considered opinion, a sum of Rs 50,000 per month would be just, fair and reasonable to ensure financial stability for the appellantwife. This amount shall be subject to an enhancement of 5% every two years," the Bench said in its May 29 order. "As regards the son, now aged 26, we are not inclined to direct any further mandatory financial support. However, it is open to the respondent-husband to voluntarily assist him with educational or other reasonable expenses," it said, allowing the wife's appeal. The Bench, however, clarified that "the son's right to inheritance remains unaffected, and any claim to ancestral or other property may be pursued in accordance with law".



3,802 PEOPLE AFFECTED, 883 HOUSES **DAMAGED AS HEAVY RAIN BATTERS MANIPUR**

Diary Times Desk: Heavy rain wreaked havoc in Manipur with 3,802 people affected and 883 houses damaged due to floods and landslides across the state in the last 48 hours, officials said on Sunday. Several localities of the state's capital Imphal and many parts of Imphal East district have been inundated after a swollen river breached embankments and overflowed in Khurai, Heingang and Checkon areas, they said. Manipur Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla visited several inundated areas of Imphal town even as the army and Assam Rifles personnel rescued nearly 800 people from submerged localities in Imphal East, the worst-affected district, they said. Bhalla, accompanied by Chief Secretary PK Singh and other senior officials, visited Kangla Nongpok Thong, Lairikyengbam Leikai, and Singjamei Bridge in Imphal and assessed the overall situation, a Raj Bhavan statement said. Diary Times Desk: Home Minister Amit Shah on Sunday launched a blistering attack on West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, accusing her of "stooping low" by opposing Operation Sindoor and the Waqf Amendment Act to appease the Muslim vote bank, and alleging that the Murshidabad riots were "state-sponsored". CSIR DEVELOPS NON-DESTRUCTIVE TECHNIQUE TO DETECT DAMAGE IN AIRCRAFT

Diary Times Desk: The Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) has developed a non-destructive evaluation (NDE) framework to detect damage in aircraft components by using ultrasonic guided waves, offering a faster and more cost-effective method over conventional techniques. This will improve aircraft safety and maintenance through reliable damage detection and will benefit not only the civil aviation sector but also be useful for the armed forces in their day-to-day functioning as well as assessments for life extension programmes. Researchers at CSIR's National Aerospace Laboratory (NAL) demonstrated the use of low-frequency guided wavebased damage detection in aircraft structures. They found that significant wavefield interruptions indicated damage presence in a component while pristine structures showed smooth wave patterns. Amplified wave mode responses confirmed damage detection accuracy and effective localisation of multiple affected zones validated the robustness of the detection framework.

HIMACHAL NEWS: DOUBT REMAINS OVER RELAXATION IN MAXIMUM AGE LIMIT IN NEW RECRUITMENTS, PROPOSAL HAS BEEN SENT TO THE STATE GOVERNMENT

Diary Times Desk: In the TGT recruitment released by Himachal Pradesh State Selection Commission Hamirpur, two years relaxation in the maximum age limit has not been given yet. Due to the paper leak case, recruitments could not be conducted through the commission for the last two and a half years, in such a situation, the State Selection Commission had sent a proposal to the state government for two years relaxation in the maximum age limit to the candidates in the new recruitments. No decision has been taken on this proposal yet. In such a situation, there is doubt about the relaxation in the maximum age limit in the recruitment of TGT. The commission argues that the proposal has been sent to the government again on this subject. Amendments can be made regarding relaxation in the age limit after getting permission from the government. Actually, the paper leak case came to light in December 2022. After this matter came to light, the Staff Selection Commission has been dissolved. Dozens of recruitment examinations have come under the purview of vigilance.

HIMACHAL NEWS: CHIEF MINISTER SUKHU SAID- FODDER SUBSIDY FOR ANIMALS IN GAUSHALAS INCREASED FROM RS 700 TO RS 1,200

Diary Times Desk: Chief Minister Sukhwinder Singh Sukhu said that for the purpose of care and welfare of the destitute cows in the state, the state government has decided to increase the monthly fodder subsidy for the animals kept in the Gaushalas from Rs 700 to Rs 1,200 per animal. This decision reflects the government's commitment towards livestock welfare and the interests of farmers. He said that the increased subsidy will prove to be beneficial in ensuring better care of the destitute cows. This decision will prevent the damage caused to the crops of the farmers by stray animals roaming in the fields. Sukhu said that the state government has taken several steps to ensure livestock welfare. Financial assistance is also being given to local people and institutions for the establishment and expansion of Gaushalas. For the establishment of new Gaushalas, the government is providing Rs 10 lakh or 50 percent of the project cost as grant to the people. Similarly, a grant of Rs 5 lakh or 50 percent of the project cost is also given for the expansion of the Gaushala. He said that to strengthen these efforts, the state government has increased the excise duty on liquor to Rs 2.50 per bottle and the additional revenue from this is being used for cow service. The present government is working actively considering the safety of livestock and the interests of farmers as paramount.

HIMACHAL: REAL ESTATE REGULATORY AUTHORITY OFFICE WILL BE SHIFTED TO DHARAMSHALA, APPROVAL GIVEN IN CABINET MEETING

Diary Times Desk: The Sukhu government of the state has given another gift to Kangra, the largest administrative district of Himachal Pradesh, in the form of RERA office. After the announcement of the Chief Minister, the State Cabinet meeting on Saturday also approved the transfer of Real Estate Regulatory Authority (RERA) office from Shimla to Dharamshala. Earlier last month, the state government had approved the shifting of the Directorate of Himachal Pradesh Tourism Development Corporation and Himachal Pradesh Wildlife Department to Dharamshala in the State Cabinet meeting. A notification has also been issued by the government regarding shifting the State Wildlife Department to Dharamshala. It is being shifted to the KFW office building located in Dharamshala. Now, with the shifting of three offices from Shimla to Dharamshala, the employees of lower Himachal will get its benefit. At the same time, the business of the people will also increase at the local level. Because the employees and their families have to buy daily items including ration, clothes.



HIMACHAL: CHARGES ON BUYING GOODS IN GLASS, PLASTIC AND ALUMINIUM PACKING, MONEY WILL BE REFUNDED ON RETURNING THE BOXES

Diary Times Desk: Now, in the state, additional charges will be levied on purchasing goods in glass, plastic, aluminum packing. Initially, this scheme will be implemented on a pilot basis in some tourist places. If the scheme can successful, it be implemented in the entire state. This work will be handed over to a private company. All such material will have a QR code. This will be used to keep track of it. This fee will be refunded on returning empty bottles, containers and boxes. This decision has been taken to dispose of the waste lying in the open or in forest areas in the form of glass, plastic, aluminum etc. In the cabinet meeting held at Himachal Pradesh Secretariat on Saturday, it was also decided to launch the Deposit Refund Scheme-2025 for effective management of biodegradable waste and to reduce it. Industry Minister Harsh Vardhan Chauhan said that under this scheme, a refundable deposit can be paid in addition to the price of the consumer product, which will be returned on returning the empty product. The scheme will be applicable to a wide range of glass bottles, plastic beverage containers, aluminum cans, liquid flexible plastic packaging, packaging and multilayer packaging.

SHEIKH HASINA'S BIG TRIAL **BEGINS, CHARGED WITH CRIMES AGAINST HUMANITY**

Diary Times Desk: Bangladeshi prosecutors officially charged former prime minister Sheikh Hasina and two senior officials with crimes against humanity for their alleged roles in violent crackdowns during the 2024 student-led uprising. An investigation report found that Hasina "directly ordered" state security forces, her political party and affiliated groups to conduct operations resulting in casualties. "These killings were planned," Chief Prosecutor Tajul Islam said in a televised hearing on Sunday, citing video evidence and encrypted communications between different agencies. The case listed 81 people as witnesses, Islam said. Prosecutors also alleged that Hasina, as head of government, bears command responsibility for security force operations during the unrest. Hasina resigned as prime minister in August after ruling for 15 years and fled Bangladesh for New Delhi under pressure from millions of protesters who had taken to the streets for weeks to demand she step down. She and some of her family members also face allegations of corruption.

SCOLDING DOES NOT AMOUNT TO PROVOKING SOMEONE TO TAKE OWN LIFE: SC

Diary Times Desk: The Supreme Court has discharged a man who was accused of driving a student to suicide by scolding him. The accused, in charge of a school and a hostel, had scolded the deceased following a complaint by another student. After the incident, the student hanged himself in a room. A bench of Justices Ahsanuddin Amanullah and Prashant Kumar Mishra stated that no ordinary person could have imagined that a scolding would result in such a tragedy. The top court set aside an order of the Madras High Court, which had refused to discharge the teacher for the offence of abetment to suicide under Section 306 of the Indian Penal Code.

"Having considered the matter in its entirety, we find it a fit case for interference. As has rightly been submitted by the appellant, no normal person could have imagined that a scolding, that too based on a complaint by a student, would result in such a tragedy due to the student so scolded taking his own life," the bench said. The apex court said such scolding was the least to ensure that the complaint made against the deceased by another student was taken note of and remedial measures were effected.

COVID-19 CASES IN INDIA RISE TO 3,395; KERALA TOPS LIST WITH 1,336, FOLLOWED BY MAHARASHTRA, DELHI

Diary Times Desk: The number of active Covid-19 cases in India has risen to 3,395, with Kerala topping the list at 1,336 cases, followed by Maharashtra and Delhi, Union health ministry data released on Saturday said. Between Friday and Saturday, 685 new Covid cases and four deaths were reported - one each in Delhi, Kerala, Karnataka, and Uttar Pradesh. Currently, active case counts in key states are: Kerala (1,336), Maharashtra (467), Delhi (375), Gujarat (265), Karnataka (234), West Bengal (205), Tamil Nadu (185), and Uttar Pradesh (117). The national count has risen sharply, going from 257 on May 22 to 1,010 by May 26, and further to 3,395 by Saturday. Officials said the Covid-19 situation is being closely monitored. Most infections are mild, and patients are recovering at home. "There is no reason to worry," sources told PTI. A 63-year-old man with comorbidities, who tested positive for Covid-19, died at a private hospital in Bengaluru on May 29. He had been admitted on May 21 after feeling weak.

EU 'STRONGLY REGRETS' DONALD TRUMP'S DECISION TO DOUBLE STEEL TARIFFS, WARNS OF RETALIATORY MEASURES

Diary Times Desk: The European Commission announced its plans to retaliate against President Donald Trump's plan to double tariffs on imported steel and aluminium, reported Reuters. The EU said it "strongly regrets" Trump's plan to raise tariffs, and it undermines ongoing efforts to reach a negotiated solution." "This decision adds further uncertainty to the global economy and increases costs for consumers and businesses on both sides of the Atlantic," the report auoted an EU spokesperson, adding that "the (EU) is prepared to impose countermeasures." On Friday, Trump announced at a rally in Pennsylvania that the US would double steel tariffs from 25% to 50% from Wednesday onwards while promoting the partnership between Japan's Nippon Steel and US Steel. Taking to his Truth Social account, Trump later wrote, "It is my great honour to raise the Tariffs on steel and aluminium from 25% to 50%, effective Wednesday, June 4th. Our steel and aluminum industries are coming back like never before. This will be vet another BIG iolt of great news for our wonderful steel and aluminum workers. MAKE AMERICA GREAT ΔGΔΙΝΙ"

'PREPARED TO IMPOSE COUNTERMEASURES': EU WARNS TRUMP OVER 50% STEEL TARIFF

Diary Times Desk: The European Union has strongly criticised US President Donald Trump's decision to double tariffs on steel imports from 25 percent to 50 percent, warning that the move risks derailing efforts to resolve the ongoing trade standoff through negotiations. In a statement to NBC News on May 31, an EU spokesperson said, "We strongly regret the announced increase of U.S. tariffs on steel imports from 25 percent to 50 percent," adding that the escalation "undermines" the possibility of a "negotiated solution." "This decision adds further uncertainty to the global economy and increases costs for consumers and businesses on both sides of the Atlantic," the EU spokesperson added. The EU also confirmed that it is prepared to reinstate and expand its countermeasures if the situation does not improve. "If no mutually acceptable solution is reached, both existing and additional EU measures will automatically take effect.

UKRAINIAN DRONES STRIKE MULTIPLE AIRBASES IN RUSSIA, OVER 40 AIRCRAFT HIT



Diary Times Desk: Ukraine on Sunday launched one of its largest drone-based operations on Russia to date, striking an air base in eastern Siberia, thousands of kilometres (miles) from its border. The Russian governor of the Irkutsk region confirmed the attack, saying Ukrainian remote-piloted aircraft attacked a military unit in the village of Sridni, the first such attack in Siberia. Ukrainian media claimed that a large-scale special operation by Ukraine's Security Service (SBU) has struck "more than 40" Russian aircrafts at air bases in the "rear of the Russian Federation". Citing officials, news agency AFP reported that Russian airbases in the eastern Siberian city of Belaya, in Olenya, up in the Arctic near Finland, and in Ivanovo and Dyagilevo, both east of Moscow, had been targeted. The aircraft destroyed in the attack include Tu-95 and Tu-22M3 bombers, and at least one A-50, a report by Kyiv Independent claimed, citing sources.

26 KILLED, 80 WOUNDED AS ISRAELI TANKS OPEN FIRE NEAR AID CENTRE IN GAZA: REPORT

Diary Times Desk: At least 26 Palestinians were allegedly killed and over 80 others were injured in gunfire near a US-backed aid distribution site in southern Gaza's Rafah area. Gaza rescuers alleged that thousands of Palestinians had authered near Al-Alam roundabout-- close to the aid centre run by the Gaza Humanitarian Foundation (GHF)-- on Sunday when Israeli tanks approached and opened fire on the crowd. However, the reports of the attack were denied by sources in the Israeli embassy. The GHF also claimed that its aid distribution in Gaza went on without" any incident and denied the Hamas allegations of an attack on civilians. Former Israeli Prime Minister Naftali Bennett also took to X (formerly Twitter) and denied the reports of Israeli firing on Gazans near the aid centre in Rafah. In a video message, he said, "This morning, all world media reported a huge lie. They said that Israeli tanks opened fire at a food distribution centre... this has not happened. It's simply a lie."

MUJIB DROPPED FROM NEW BANGLADESH BANKNOTES, REPLACED WITH TEMPLES, LANDMARKS

Diary Times Desk: New banknotes were released in Bangladesh with new designs, replacing the portrait of the ousted Prime Minister and the nation's founding father, Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, with natural landscape and traditional landmarks, the country's central bank said. Till now, all the banknotes feature the portrait of Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, who led Bangladesh to freedom from Pakistan in 1971 until he was assassinated by soldiers in a military coup four years later. Along with the new banknotes, existing notes having Sheikh Mujibur Rahman's portrait and coins will remain in circulation. "Under the new series and design, the notes will not feature any human portraits, but will instead showcase natural landscapes and traditional landmarks," Bangladesh Bank spokesman Arif Hossain Khan told news agency AFP. The new banknotes, released by Bangladesh Bank, will have images of Hindu and Buddhist temples, as well as historic palaces. They will also feature artwork by the late painter Zainul Abedin, depicting the Bengal famine during the British colonial rule.



5 KILLED, SEVERAL INJURED AS FIRE BREAKS OUT IN KUWAIT APARTMENT BLOCK

Diary Times Desk: A fire in a residential building southwest of Kuwait City killed five people, the Gulf state's fire brigade said on Sunday. The blaze broke out in two apartments in the Rigga area, about 10 kilometres (six miles) from the capital, said spokesman Brigadier General Mohammed al-Gharib. Three bodies were found at the scene and two more people died from their injuries in hospital, he told AFP. Several others were injured, and Gharib warned that the number of deaths could rise due to the severity of some of the burns. An investigation has been launched into

CHINA WARNS US NOT TO 'PLAY WITH FIRE' OVER TAIWAN

Diary Times Desk: China has warned the United States against "playing with fire" over Taiwan in response to US Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth calling the Asian power a "threat to the region" at a highprofile summit in Singapore. Speaking at the Shangri-La Dialogue on Saturday, Hegseth said China was "credibly preparing" for military action to shift Asia's power balance, accusing Beijing of rehearsing a potential invasion of Taiwan. China considers Taiwan, a separately governed island, to be a part of its territory and has vowed reunification by force if necessary. Taiwan's government rejects Beijing's sovereignty claims, saying only the island's people can decide their future. Hegseth's remarks provoked a swift rebuke from China's Ministry of Foreign Affairs, which stressed that Taiwan remains a domestic matter, warning foreign powers against using the issue as leverage. It described US actions in Asia Pacific as turning the region into a "powder keg". "The US should not entertain illusions about using the Taiwan question as a bargaining chip to contain China, nor should it play with fire," it said. Hegseth had called on allies in the Asia Pacific region, including key security ally Australia, to spend more on defence after warning of the "real and potentially imminent" threat from China. Calling the US a "true destabilising" force in the Asia Pacific, Beijing accused Washington of deploying offensive weapons in the South China Sea and aggravating regional tensions. Beijing accused Hegseth of "vilifying China with defamatory allegations" and promoting a "Cold War mentality". "Hegseth deliberately ignored the call for peace and development by countries in the region, and instead touted the Cold

War mentality for bloc confrontation.

PUNJAB VIDHAN SABHA ASKS SAD REBEL MLA SUKHI TO CLARIFY POSITION AFTER APPOINTMENT AS AAP VICE PRESIDENT

Diary Times Desk: A day after rebel Shiromani Akali Dal MLA Dr Sukhwinder Kumar Sukhi was appointed Vice President of Aam Aadmi Party, the MLA has been asked by Punjab Vidhan Sabha to clarify his position on July 29. The MLA has been asked to give his reply on a petition filed against his continuation as a SAD MLA by advocate HC Arora seeking the disqualification of Dr Sukhi. The ENT specialist was first elected as MLA from Banga in 2017 and re-elected in 2022. However, he joined AAP in August last year. Bachandeep Bhattal said the patented device offers a compact, userfriendly solution for monitoring air quality in indoor environments, such as classrooms, hospitals, offices, shopping malls, party halls, theatres and homes. Gaurav Gupta said the benefit of this feature of the device.

PUNJAB REGISTERS 25% GROWTH IN GST COLLECTIONS IN MAY

Diary Times Desk: Punjab registered a 25.31 per cent on-year growth in net goods and service tax (GST) collections in May to Rs 2,006.31 crore driven by strong tax administration and enhanced compliance. Finance Minister Harpal Cheema said Punjab's net GST revenue rose to Rs 2,006.31 crore in May, up from Rs 1,601.14 crore in May 2024, showing an increase of Rs 405.17 crore. This marks the highest-ever GST collection for the month of May in Punjab's history, said Cheema in an official statement. This year's performance clearly indicates a robust and accelerating growth trend in Punjab's fiscal health, he said and attributed the growth to strong tax administration, enhanced compliance, and a resilient economic environment. He emphasised that the AAP government's commitment to financial prudence and economic reform led to this consistent upward trend in revenue. Cheema noted that this surge not only represents the highest year-on-year monthly growth in recent years but also outpaced the national average GST growth.

WANTED 77-YEAR-OLD FRAUDSTER POSING AS ARMY COLONEL HELD FROM PATIALA OLD-AGE HOME

Diary Times Desk: A 77-year-old man who had been absconding for over a decade after jumping bail in a cheating case involving the Army Welfare Housing Organisation (AWHO) was arrested from an old-age home in Punjab's Patiala, the Delhi Police said on Sunday. Sitaram Gupta, a native of Mansa, was impersonating an army colonel and duped people by offering flats and shops under fictitious AWHO schemes, police in a statement said. "Gupta, a postgraduate in economics and history from Panjab University and a former student of ex-Prime Minister Manmohan Singh, had been evading trial in a 2007 cheating case registered at Vivek Vihar police station in Delhi," Deputy Commissioner of Police (Crime Branch) Apoorva Gupta said in the statement. He allegedly took Rs 56,000 from a complainant after offering him a flat and shop under the AWHO scheme and issued forged receipts, the officer said. After his arrest in 2007 and subsequent release on bail, Gupta went underground and failed to appear before court, leading to the issuance of non-bailable warrants. On April 26 this year, the Karkardooma court declared him a proclaimed offender. He had started his career as a contractor supplying oil to Army cantonments across India, the statement said. During this period, he gained knowledge of the Army's functioning, which he later used to impersonate a senior army officer and lure unsuspecting people.

RULES NOTIFIED FOR PROVIDING DRIVERS, HELP TO EX-CJS, JUDGES

Diary Times Desk : The Haryana Government on Friday notified rules for providing facility of domestic help, driver, secretarial assistance, security and telephone facility to retired chief justices, judges and their spouses. A notification issued by Chief Secretary Anurag Rastogi framed the Retired Chief Justices and Judges Domestic Help(s) and other Benefits Rules, 2025, which "applies to a person who has held office either as chief justice or as a judge of the High Court of Punjab and Harvana and their spouses". "To enable the retired chief justice/judge or their spouses, to engage domestic help(s)/driver(s), the high court shall provide a consolidated amount of Rs 45,000 per month to a retired judge or spouse and Rs 50,000 per month to a retired chief justice or spouse," the notification said. Besides, the retired chief justice/judge or spouse shall also be paid Rs 15,000 per month towards the expenses of rental and calls of mobile phones and/or landline, Internet services, secretarial services and security service. However, there are certain conditions for availing these services such as that "they are not availing such or similar facility from any other High Court." The rules clarified that they would not be entitled to these facilities during the tenure of their appointments or assignments to any office, post or assignment except where such appointments did not provide these facilities.

DAYS AFTER ERRONEOUS RELEASE FROM FARIDABAD JAIL, PRISONER CAUGHT FROM VILLAGE IN BIHAR

Diary Times Desk: A prisoner jailed on charges of raping a minor who was released from the district iail here due to a mistaken identity was caught from his village in Patna, Bihar, police said on Sunday. He was produced in a city court and sent into judicial custody again in Neemka jail, they said. Nitesh Pandey was mistakenly released from Neemka jail instead of another inmate named Nitesh who received bail from a Faridabad court, leading the suspension of five jail officials. The fathers of the Niteshs also had the same name, adding to the confusion. A senior police officer said that during interrogation, accused Nitesh Pandey revealed that he knew that the other Nitesh was to get bail in a case in which he was being tried for trespass and assault. After the second Nitesh got bail on Monday, the prisoners were called. The inmate who got the bail was not present at the spot on Tuesday and the rape accused identified himself as Nitesh.

He feels a new IPL champion will be crowned on June 3 and predicted that Josh Hazlewood will play a pivotal role in the Royal Challengers Bengaluru ending their title drought. RCB have already sealed a place in the IPL 2025 final with a thumping win over Punjab Kings in the qualifier 1 and reaching there first made them a firm favourite to win the title. It was Warner who stopped RCB from lifting their maiden title when they last reached the IPL final in 2016, as Sunrisers Hyderabad emerged victorious at the Rajiv Gandhi International Cricket Stadium in Hyderabad. Warner scored a fiery 69 off 38 balls, setting the tone for a big total - 208/7, while Virat Kohli and co. did put up a fight with the bat but were eight runs short in the end.
