KASHMIR TO KANYAKUMARI NOW A REALITY FOR RAIL NETWORK TOO: PM MODI

Diary Times Desk : The Chenab bridge has become a new milestone in pan-India connectivity, with Prime Minister Narendra Modi remarking that the phrase 'Kashmir to Kanyakumari' has now become a reality even in the Indian railway network.

"While walking on the Chenab and Anji bridges today, I lived the lofty aspirations of India and the skill and courage of our engineers and workers," the Prime Minister proudly said at a rally in Katra after inaugurating the two bridges. He also inaugurated the Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Line and flagged off Vande Bharat services between Katra and Srinagar, which is expected to be a game-changer for tourism.

"We have always invoked Maa Bharati with deep reverence, saying 'from Kashmir to Kanyakumari.' Today, this has become a reality even in our railway network," said PM Modi, referring to Jammu and Kashmir as the "crown jewel of India". The Chenab bridge, the world's highest railway bridge, is an engineering marvel built in the face of extreme weather and a challenging topography. At 359 metres, it is taller than the Eiffel Tower in Paris by 35 metres. "People visit France to see the Eiffel Tower, and this bridge is taller than that. This bridge will not just help you visit Kashmir, it will become a tourist destination itself," he said. PM Modi said the Chenab and Anji bridges will serve as gateways to prosperity for Jammu and Kashmir.



SEBI FREEZES CHOKSI'S ACCOUNTS

SEBI FREEZES FUGITIVE BUSINESSMAN MEHUL CHOKSI'S BANK ACCOUNTS, INVESTMENTS TO RECOVER RS 2.1 CR.



Diary Times Desk : The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has ordered the attachment of absconding businessman Mehul Choksi's bank accounts, mutual funds, and shares to recover Rs 2.1 crore.

The amount is related to a penalty imposed on him for violating insider trading rules in the shares of Gitanjali Gems.

Choksi, who was the Chairman and Managing Director of Gitanjali Gems, is accused of sharing unpublished price-sensitive information (UPSI) with an associate, Rakesh Girdharlal Gajera.

Based on that information, Gajera sold off his entire 5.75 per cent stake in the company in December 2017, allegedly to avoid losses before details of fraudulent activities involving the company became public.

In January 2022, the SEBI fined Choksi Rs 1.5 crore and banned him from trading in the securities market for one year.

However, Choksi did not pay the fine, prompting the SEBI to issue a demand notice on May 15, 2025. When he failed to respond or make the payment within the 15-day deadline, the market regulator proceeded with the attachment of his assets. The total dues now stand at Rs 2.1 crore, including Rs 60 lakh in interest. In its notice dated June 4, the SEBI directed all banks, depositories like CDSL and NSDL, and mutual fund houses to freeze Choksi's accounts. While no money can be withdrawn, credits are still allowed. The market regulator has also instructed banks to seize any lockers in his name.

MEDIATION BETWEEN TWO UNEQUALS NOT POSSIBLE: SHASHI THAROOR ON TRUMP'S CLAIMS ON INDIA, PAKISTAN

Diary Times Desk : Congress MP Shashi Tharoor has said that to suggest one can mediate between two unequals is not possible because there is no equivalence between terrorists and their victims, amid repeated claims by US President Donald Trump that he "helped settle" the tensions between India and Pakistan. Tharoor, currently in the US leading a multi-party delegation on Operation Sindoor, made the comments in response to a question during a conversation at the Council on Foreign Relations here on Thursday. "... Mediation is not a term that we are particularly willing to entertain. I'll tell you why not. The fact is that this implies, even when you say things like broker or whatever, you're implying an equivalence which simply doesn't exist," Tharoor said. He said there is no equivalence between terrorists and their victims. "There is no equivalence between a country that provides safe haven to terrorism, and a country that's a flourishing multi-party democracy that's trying to get on with its business," he said. "There is no equivalence between a state that is a status quo power that just wants to be left alone by its neighbours, where the neighbours don't agree with us, and a revisionist power that wants to upset the geopolitical arrangements that have existed.



ICICI BANK RELATIONSHIP MANAGER **SWINDLES RS 4.58 CRORE FROM** CUSTOMER ACCOUNTS, LOSES MOST **OF IT IN STOCKS**

Diary Times Desk : A relationship manager in an ICICI bank branch in Kota allegedly swindled around Rs 4.58 crore from customers' accounts only to lose the lot of it in the stock market. police on Friday said. She was arrested last week and is currently under judicial custody, they said. Sakshi Gupta was posted as a relationship manager at ICICI Bank's DCM branch. Police said she had been pilfering from more than 110 accounts belonging to 41 customers for around two and a half years. She allegedly invested these amounts in the stock market and lost a large chunk of it, they said. Branch manager Tarun Dadich filed a complaint against her at the Udhyog Nagar police station on February 18, accusing her of siphoning Rs 4.58 crore from customer accounts. Based on the complaint, Gupta, who worked at the branch from 2020 to 2023, was arrested on May 31.

BENGALURU STAMPEDE: BJP, JD(S) DOING POLITICS OVER 'DEAD BODIES', SAYS DK SHIVAKUMAR

Diary Times Desk : Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar on Friday accused the opposition BJP and JD(S) of doing politics over "dead bodies", as he hit out at them for demanding his resignation following the June 4 stampede here that killed 11 people. 


HIMACHAL NEWS: ULTRASOUND, X-RAY AND ECG WILL NOT BE CHARGED IN GOVERNMENT HOSPITALS, GOVERNMENT HAS WITHDRAWN THE DECISION

Diary Times Desk : There will be no charge for ultrasound, X-ray and ECG in Himachal's government medical colleges and hospitals. These tests will be free in the state's hospitals as before. The state government has withdrawn the decision to charge for all three tests. The state government had issued a notification to charge for ultrasound, X-ray and ECG in addition to Rs 10 for the slip in the hospitals. In this, the fee was fixed at Rs 60 for X-ray, Rs 120 for ultrasound and Rs 35 for ECG. It was also decided to charge test fee from fourteen categories like elderly, pregnant women and patients suffering from serious diseases, but the government has now withdrawn it. On the registration fee (slip), Chief Minister Sukhwinder Singh Sukhu had made it clear on Thursday itself that the patient welfare committees will take a decision on this.

About two months ago, police had registered a case against Rana and his associates. After that, all of them absconded. Meanwhile, Rana and Mankotia filed a petition for anticipatory bail in the High Court. On the rejection of the petition, police arrested both of them on Friday. Police arrested Rana from Badhera Rajputan and Mankotia from Panjawar. ASP Sanjeev Bhatia said that Rana and Mankotia will be presented in Amb court on Saturday. He said that a few days ago, a crusher owner had registered a case against the accused in Gagret police station, accusing them of threatening the workers, spoiling the JCB and extortion. Amrish Rana of Panjawar was sentenced to life imprisonment by the court in the case of murder of three people in Una in the year 1999. After serving 25 years of imprisonment, Rana was released from jail last year on the recommendation of the government for good conduct. Now a criminal case has been registered against him again. Police have arrested Amrish Rana and his associate Amit Mankotia from their house after they were absconding for nearly two months on charges of threatening and extorting crusher owners registered under Gagret police station of Una district.

Diary Times Desk : Himachal Pradesh received 75 percent more rainfall than normal from June 1 to 6. 10.8 mm rainfall was considered normal for this period but in reality 18.9 mm rainfall occurred. All districts except Lahaul-Spiti received more than normal rainfall. Bilaspur received 228 percent more rainfall than normal, Chamba 66 percent, Hamirpur 90 percent, Kangra 31 percent, Kinnaur 24 percent, Kullu 9 percent, Mandi 90 percent, Shimla 194 percent, . Sirmour 239 percent, Solan 104 percent and Una received 224 percent more rainfall than normal. Lahaul-Spiti received 33 percent less rainfall than normal. According to Meteorological Centre Shimla, there is a possibility of light rain at some places on June 6. The weather is forecast to remain clear in the entire state from June 7. However, light rain may occur at one or two places in the high mountains on June 11 and 12. There is a possibility of gradual increase in maximum temperature by 4-6 degree Celsius and gradual increase in minimum temperature by 3-5 degree Celsius in many parts of the state during the next 2-3 days. During the last 24 hours, 10.0 mm rain was recorded in Rohru, 6.0 in Palampur, 6.0 in Bharmour, 4.2 in Chaupal, 4.2 in Bijahi, 3.5 in Kotkhai, 2.0 in Jogindernagar, 1.7 mm in Shilaru, 1.4 in Manali, 0.5 in Dhaula Kuan and 0.2 mm in Sangla.

RBI AIMS TO BOOST ECONOMIC GROWTH, LIQUIDITY WITH JUMBO RATE AND CRR CUTS

Diary Times Desk : In a move to invigorate India's slowing economy and in the wake of consistently easing inflation, the rate-setting committee of India's central bank slashed the repo rate by 50 basis points (bps) on Friday, twice the 25 bps that was widely expected. Further it complemented the policy rate cut with a 100 bps reduction in the cash reserve ratio (CRR). A basis point is one-hundredth of a percentage point. "Inflation is under a lot of control now, and we can accept that we have won the war." RBI governor Sanjay Malhotra said at a media briefing on Friday following the MPC meeting, adding that the central bank has reduced inflation projection for FY26 to 3.7% from 4% earlier. The unexpected bounty was cheered by the stock markets, with the BSE Sensex closing 0.92% up at 82,188.99, and the Nifty 50 surpassing the 25,000 level with a 252 pts upswing to close at 25,003.5. Bond markets, too. reacted positively, with the shorter end of the yield curve seeing some softening. The 10-year G-sec yield hit an intraday high of 6.290, before risina 4.3 bps to close at 6.289.

RCB OFFICIAL CHALLENGES ARREST AS COURT GRANTS INTERIM RELIEF TO KSCA ADMINISTRATORS

Diary Times Desk : The Karnataka High Court on Friday granted interim protection from arrest to key office bearers of the Karnataka State Association (KSCA) Cricket in connection with the deaths of 11 people and injuries to many more in a stampede during the event held on Wednesday to celebrate Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) winning the IPL. Justice S R Krishna Kumar, who heard the petition seeking to quash the FIR against the KSCA office-bearers, restrained the police from taking any coercive action against the officials until the next hearing. The court also directed the petitioners to cooperate with the ongoing investigation. The petition to quash the FIR will be taken up again on June 16. The KSCA 's lead office bearers comprise: former Karnataka spinner Raghuram Bhatt (president), Κ Sriram (vicepresident), A Shankar (secretary), ES Jairam (treasurer) and former Shahvir Tarapore (joint umpire secretary). Advocate General Shashi Kiran Shetty, who appeared on behalf of the state, clarified that the police had no immediate plans to arrest anyone and sought permission for the investigation to continue.

AMID BENGALURU STAMPEDE, MUMBAI'S T20 WORLD CUP VICTORY PARADE IN FOCUS



Diary Times Desk : The stampede in Bengaluru amid celebrations over RCB's IPL win that resulted in 11 deaths has brought into focus the feat of Mumbai police, which helmed a massive victory parade with picture-perfect arrangements and clockwork precision following India's T20 World Cup win last year. Despite the iconic Wankhede stadium and almost the entire stretch of the picturesque Marine Drive turning into a sea of blue on July 4 as almost three lakh people gathered to greet the Indian team, precise placement of barricades, a steady stream of real-time announcements and on the spot decisions of crowd control saved the day, officials said on Friday. "We had just 36 hours to prepare. We were on our toes and managed around three lakh people. We told the Mumbai Cricket Association that tickets should be issued for such free public events so that crowds can be managed properly. If online tickets are kept for such events, the entry and exit of the people can be monitored and crowding can be avoided," a senior police official told PTI.

NEET-PG TO BE HELD ON AUG 3, SUPREME COURT ACCEPTS EXTENSION REQUEST

Diary Times Desk: The Supreme Court on Friday permitted the National Board of Examinations in Medical Sciences (NBEMS) to reschedule the NEET-PG 2025 examination to August 3, following its earlier directive mandating that the exam be held in a single shift. A vacation bench comprising Justices P.K. Mishra and A.G. Masih passed the order after NBEMS submitted an application citing its inability to conduct the examination in a sinale shift on the previously scheduled date of June 15. Appearing on behalf of NBEMS, Advocate Kirtiman Singh informed the court that the Board had initially planned to conduct the online examination in two shifts, identifying 450 centres accordingly. However, adhering to the new single-shift directive required a substantial increase in secure examination centres equipped with uninterrupted Wi-Fi, hardware support, and power backup. The Supreme Court's May 30 order had struck down the two-shift format as "arbitrary." Following that decision, NBEMS consulted its technical partner.

VIJAY MALLYA ON KINGFISHER AIRLINES DOWNFALL: "I WENT TO SHRI PRANAB MUKHERJEE"

Diarv Times Desk : Fugitive businessman Vijay Mallya, facing fraud and money laundering allegations, has revealed new details about Kingfisher Airlines' downfall. He said he approached then Finance Minister Pranab Mukherjee with a plan to downsize the airline to save it. According to Mr Mallya, his request was met with opposition. In a conversation with YouTuber Raj Shamani, Mr Mallya revisited the collapse of Kingfisher Airlines, attributing much of the airline's troubles to the 2008 global financial crisis. He said that Kingfisher Airlines operated smoothly until 2008, but the situation changed drastically with the onset of the alobal financial crisis. The economic downturn had a significant impact on India, affecting nearly every sector of the economy, he said. "The money stopped. It got dry. The value of the Indian rupee also took a hit," Mr Mallya said. Kingfisher Airlines was launched in 2005, and it earned praise for its premium service. However, financial difficulties escalated as the global economy faltered.

'WE SUSPECT KIDNAPPING': FAMILY OF INDORE WOMAN MISSING IN MEGHALAYA DURING HONEYMOON

Diary Times Desk: The brother of a newly married woman who went missing during her honeymoon in Meghalaya has told the police their family suspects she has been kidnapped. Rescuers have made no headway in the search for Sonam, a tourist from Indore whose husband, Raja Raghuvanshi, was found murdered in a gorge in Meghalaya's East Khasi Hills district. The missing woman's brother, Govind Raghuvanshi, said they believe she is alive and have no reason to think otherwise. The family also asked the case to be taken up by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI). "It has been so many days and the search team has not got any clue. The rescuers have not yet found her phone or bag. So, this is kidnapping. We appeal to the police and the rescuers not to give up hope and change their tack to find her alive," Govind Raghuvanshi said. "Some 200 metres below the place where Raja's body was found, there were tonnes of garbage.

IN US, SHASHI THAROOR'S SON GRILLS HIM ON PAKISTAN ROLE IN PAHALGAM TERROR ATTACK. CONGRESS MP GIVES 'THREE REASONS'

Diary Times Desk: Congress MP Shashi Tharoor, who is in the United States leading an all-party delegation, was asked a question by his son, Ishan, on Thursday about Pakistan's involvement in the Pahalgam terror attack. Ishaan Tharoor asked whether any country had asked the delegation led by his father for evidence of Pakistan's involvement in the deadly Pahalgam terrorist attack on April 22 that killed 26 people, mostly tourists. He also asked about Pakistan's consistent denial of its involvement in the attack. "I'm curious though, on this tour you've been on various countries in the Western Hemisphere. Have any of your government interlocutors asked you to show evidence of Pakistan's culpability in the initial attack? And what do you say to the repeated Pakistani denials of having any hand in the initial attack?" Ishaan asked.

RUSSIA LAUNCHES 400 DRONES, 40 MISSILES ON UKRAINE DAYS AFTER KYIV'S ATTACK

Diary Times Desk : Russian forces launched 400 drones and 40 missiles on Ukraine overnight on Friday, killing at least four people and injuring dozens, Ukrainian authorities said. All four fatalities occurred in Kviv, where 20 other people were injured, said Kyiv Mayor Vitali Klitschko. The State Service for Emergencies confirmed that three of the victims were emergency service workers. Separately, the National Police reported that about 40 people were injured nationwide, with most of them in Kyiv, the northwestern city of Lutsk and the western city of Ternopil. According to the police, 38 facilities were damaged in the attacks, including five apartment buildings and five private houses, Xinhua news agency reported. For Kyiv residents, the night brought a sadly familiar chorus: the high-pitched buzz of drones, the wail of air raid sirens, and thunderous explosions overhead-whether from successful air defence interceptions or incoming missiles hitting their targets.

OIL PRICES HEADED FOR REBOUND THIS WEEK AS US-CHINA TRADE TALKS RESUME

Diary Times Desk : Oil prices slipped on Friday but were on track for their first weekly gain in three weeks after U.S. President Donald Trump and Chinese leader Xi Jinping resumed trade talks, raising hopes for growth and stronger demand in the world's two largest economies. Brent crude futures fell 19 cents, or 0.3%, to \$65.15 a barrel as of 0441 GMT. U.S. West Texas Intermediate crude gave up 20 cents, also 0.3%, to \$63.17, after gaining around 50 cents on Thursday. On a weekly basis, both benchmarks were on track to settle higher after falling for two straight weeks. Brent has advanced 2.1% this week, while WTI is trading 4% higher. China's official Xinhua news agency said trade talks between Xi and Trump took place at Washington's request. Trump said the call had led to a "very positive conclusion," adding the U.S. was "in very good shape with China and the trade deal." Canada also continued trade talks with the U.S., with Prime Minister Mark Carney in direct contact with Trump, according to Industry Minister Melanie Joly. The oil market continued to swing with news on tariff negotiations.

TRUMP MAY GET RID OF HIS TESLA AFTER MUSK ROW: OFFICIAL



Diary Times Desk : Donald Trump may now offload a Tesla he said he bought earlier this year in a show of support for Elon Musk, a White House official said Friday, following a blazing row between the US president and his billionaire former advisor. The red electric vehicle, which retails for around \$80,000, was still in a parking lot on the White House grounds on Friday, an AFP reporter said, a day after the very public meltdown between Trump and the South African-born tech tycoon. "He's thinking about it, yes," a senior White House official told AFP when asked if the Republican would sell or give away the Tesla. Tesla stocks had tanked more than 14 percent on Thursday amid the row, losing some \$100 billion of the company's market value, but leapt back in early trading Friday. Trump, who does not drive as a president, said he was buying the Tesla in March to boost support for his mega-donor, whose brand -and bottom line -- has been hit hard by public outrage over his role in slashing US government jobs.

PM INVITED TO G7 SUMMIT IN CANADA'S KANANASKIS THIS MONTH

Diary Times Desk : In a big sign of India-Canada ties healing after hitting an all-time low under former prime minister Justin Trudeau, his successor Mark Carney has invited Prime Minister Narendra Modi for the G7 summit in the country later this month. Indicating that he will attend, PM Modi said he is looking forward to meeting Mr Carney at the summit, which will be held from June 15 to 17. Taking to X on Friday, PM Modi wrote he had received a call from the Canadian Prime Minister and that the two countries would work together with "renewed vigour", guided by mutual respect. "Glad to receive a call from Prime Minister @MarkJCarney of Canada. Conaratulated him on his recent election victory and thanked him for the invitation to the G7 Summit in Kananaskis later this month. As vibrant democracies bound by deep people-to-people ties, India and Canada will work together with renewed vigour, guided by mutual respect and shared interests. Look forward to our meeting at the Summit," the Prime Minister wrote.

F-47 SIXTH GENERATION FIGHTER JET OF US LIKELY TO GET ITS FIRST BUYER, NOT INDIA, PAKISTAN, ISRAEL, UKRAINE, UK, FRANCE, SAUDI ARABIA, IT IS...

Diary Times Desk : Amid Russia and China rapidly advancing their military technologies, especially the development of sixthgeneration fighter jets, the United States has announced that it was building F-47- the country's first 6th-gen fighter jet. Sharing the news, US President Donald Trump described the F-47 as the "most advanced and powerful jet" ever built. "The F-47 will be the most advanced, most capable, most lethal aircraft ever built," Trump said, while his Secretary of Defense Pete Hegseth said the 6th-generation aircraft was a "clear message" to US' allies and enemies. "It sends a very clear message to our allies that we're here to stay-and to our enemies that we will continue to project power globally without any obstacles," said Hegseth. Developed and manufactured by American aerospace giant Boeing, the F-47 is the US' first officially-announced 6th-generation fighter jet designed to supplement and support its older platforms, such as the F-15, F-16, F-18, F-22, and F-35 fighters.

OP BLUESTAR ANNIVERSARY OBSERVED PEACEFULLY; FOR 1ST TIME SINCE 1999, JATHEDAR DOESN'T ADDRESS SIKH COMMUNITY AT AKAL TAKHT

Diary Times Desk : Amid tight security arrangements, members of various Sikh organisations participated in the 41st Operation Bluestar anniversary that was observed peacefully at the Akal Takht on Friday. Confrontation between Sikh organisations during the Operation Bluestar anniversary was avoided as Akal Takht officiating Jathedar Kuldeep Singh Gargaj neither delivered an address to the Sikh community from the Fasil of the Akal Takht nor felicitated the Sikh families whose near and dear ones were killed during the Army operation in 1984. Following extensive damage to the Akal Takht building in the Army operation, a new building was constructed in 1998 and in 1999, the Dal Khalsa started observing the Operation Bluestar anniversary. Since then, it is for the first time that the Akal Takht Jathedar did not address the Sikh community nor felicitate the families of those killed during the operation. Instead, SGPC president Harjinder Singh Dhami felicitated the Sikh families who had lost their near and dear ones in the operation. Damdami Taksal head Harnam Singh Dhuma, who had objected to Gargaj delivering an address to the Sikh community from the Akal Takht and felicitating the families, said he "felt relieved".



ROPAR IIT GETS RS 311-CR PROJECT TO DEVELOP AI-BASED AGRI TECH

Diary Times Desk : The IIT, Ropar, has got a grant of Rs 311 crore from the Union Ministry of Education to set up a centre of excellence for developing artificial intelligence (AI)based solutions in the field of agriculture. Director of the IIT, Ropar, Professor Rajiv Ahuja told The Tribune that the project aimed at taking Al-driven innovations to the grassroots level and empowering farmers with cutting-edge tools for better farm management. The institute would work for leveraging AI for sustainable agriculture and food security in the country, he said. The institute has already developed some Albased solutions to assist farmers in animal husbandry and beekeeping. Digital Bee Sence technology has been developed by the institute to monitor bee health using Al. It helps in ensuring effective pollination, resulting in higher crop yield. The institute's other innovative projects include a solution for AI use in livestock management, a smart tag to monitors the health of livestock that sends alerts on the mobile phones of farmers, an AI tool for precision farming that helps in optimising nitrogen levels in the soil etc

COURT ORDERS GMADA TO VACATE EXCESS LAND TAKEN FOR AIRPORT ROAD

Diary Times Desk : In a classic case, an excess piece of land was taken by the Greater Mohali Area Development Authority (GMADA) for the construction of a 200-ftwide road, commonly known as Airport Road, which leads to the Chandigarh international airport in Mohali. The court has now ordered vacation of the land. The state aovernment had acquired land in June 2008 for the road and the acquisition proceedings were completed in June next year with the award of compensation to the landowners, ranging from Rs 5-10 crore, depending upon the condition and location of the acquired land. Two bighas and 12 biswas (almost 0.65 acre) of Narata Singh, a resident of Nadiali village in Mohali, were also acquired. However, during the construction of Airport Road in 2015, his 22 biswas of excess land were also used under the project. Realising the loss of their excess land, his son Rulda Singh.

DEVELOPMENT CHARGES FOR PUNJAB REALTORS HIKED BY UP TO 100%

Diary Times Desk : In the wake of the boom in the realty sector, the government on Wednesday substantially hiked the development charges for real estate promoters, ranging from 50 per cent to 100 per cent across the state. To boost the state's revenue, the Cabinet had recently decided to increase the development charges. The maximum hike has been for areas around Chandigarh, like Mohali, Kharar, Zirakpur and Dera Bassi, that are witnessing large-scale urbanisation with a number of residential and commercial projects being approved under the Punjab Apartment and Property Regulation Act-1995 and mega projects under the Mega Project Policy. Now, the promoter of a residential colony in Mohali would have to pay development charges of around Rs 1.28 crore per acre against Rs 67 lakh paid as per the previous rates, implying that the end-user would also have to pay more to buy property. Similarly, the promoter of a group housing project in Mohali would have to pay around Rs 3.65 crore as development charges against the previous rate of around Rs 1.66 crore per acre. In the case of commercial projects in Mohali, a promoter would have to pay nearly Rs 4.60 crore against Rs 2.50 crore charged earlier.

BID TO BUY PEACE BY GIVING INDUS WATER PROVED COSTLY TO NATION, SAYS SHIVRAJ SINGH CHOUHAN

Diary Times Desk : Union Minister for Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare and Rural Development Shivraj Singh Chouhan today targeted the Congress saying its "attempt to buy peace by giving Indus water to Pakistan proved costy for India". "Our nasty neighbour Pakistan kept irrigating the crop of terrorism and unleashed terror on our motherland," he said as he targeted first Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru over the Indus Waters Treaty. The minister was visiting the state as part of the Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan. He engaged with farmers of Patiala to promote sustainable and progressive farming practices. While congratulating PM Narendra Modi for suspending the Indus Water Treaty following the Pahalgam terror attack, Chouhan claimed that 80 per cent of the country's water was flowing into Pakistan. "Now, this water will be used for farming in Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana and Rajasthan," he said. "I have gone through the parliamentary proceedings of the time when the Indus Water Treaty was signed. Even the parliamentarians of the Congress, particularly from Punjab and J&K, had strongly opposed it. And the then PM Nehru had stated that we are buying peace from Pakistan in lieu of water. While peace never prevailed.

HARYANA TO REVIVE 25,000 HECTARES UNDER ARAVALLI GREEN WALL PROJECT

Diary Times Desk : Prime Minister Narendra Modi symbolically launched the Aravalli Green Wall project today, even as Haryana targets to restore around 25,000 hectares of the depleting Aravallis. The project, which aims to combat the threat of desertification, will, in the first phase, develop continuous forests from Porbandar in Gujarat to Rajghat in Delhi. Almost 40 per cent of the Aravallis are in Haryana's six districts, making the state's role particularly crucial for the green wall project to succeed. In Haryana, the restoration will be carried out over the next three years in the recorded forest areas (RFA) of five districts -Gurugram, Faridabad, Nuh, Rewari and Mahendragarh. The Forest Department has used Geographical Information System (GIS) mapping to identify RFA totalling 33,706 hectares across these districts. Of this, 24,990 hectares were found to be degraded. Over half of the degraded land has low tree cover, around a quarter has no forest cover, and 15 per cent of it is scrubland

HARYANA BJP CHIEF MOHAN LAL BADOLI EXHORTS PARTY LEADERS, WORKERS TO TAKE DRIVE TO GRASSROOTS

Diary Times Desk : To mark the successful completion of 11 years of the BJP-led Central government and promote the 'Sankalp Se Siddhi' campaign, a special workshop of the Ambala Lok Sabha constituency was organised in Ambala City on Thursday. HIMACHAL HC UPHOLDS CBI INVESTIGATION IN NEGI DEATH CASE

Diary Times Desk: The Himachal Pradesh High Court on Thursday declined to interfere with the earlier decision to transfer the investigation into the death of chief engineer Vimal Negi to the CBI. The order came on a petition filed by Sanjeev Gandhi, who headed the SIT as SO, Shimla. Gandhi had challenged the Single Bench's order transferring the inquiry to the CBI, but the court observed this plea was non-maintainable. However, it issued notices to the state government and Kiran Negi, the deceased's wife, on a limited issue regarding the removal of certain observations made in the single judge's order transferring the probe to the CBI. Negi, a chief engineer at HP Power Corporation Ltd, went missing on March 10. His body was later found in Govindsagar, Bilaspur, on March 18. Suspecting bias in the SIT probe, his family had moved the court seeking a CBI investigation. A Division Bench comprising Chief Justice GS Sandhawalia and Justice Ranian Sharma passed the order on Gandhi's appeal against the single judge's decision. Gandhi argued that certain remarks in the order referencing DGP and ACS (Home) status reports could harm his career as an IPS officer. The court will now hear his plea on this limited aspect.

LIGHTNING STRIKE KILLS 11 BUFFALOES IN CHURAH AREA IN CHAMBA

Diary Times Desk : A lightning strike in Pakhara ridge under the Chanju area of Churah subdivision claimed the lives of 11 buffaloes belonging to a Gujjar hearder. The buffaloes, owned by Sharif Ali, were grazing in the ridge when the lightning struck around 6:30 pm. However, no loss of human life was reported. The incident was reported to local authorities by Sharif Ali, following which the animal husbandry department visited the site on Thursday. The department assessed the losses, recorded the death of the animals and has forwarded the report to higher authorities for further action. Gujjar pastoralists from Punjab migrate to highland pastures in Chamba district during summer to ensure fodder for their cattle. Many of them, including Sharif Ali, had set up temporary camps in the Chanju region. The families are expected to return to their native places after the summer season ends.

SNOW MUCH FUN: ROHTANG PASS DEFIES SUMMER WITH SNOWFALL

Diary Times Desk : Tourists visiting Rohtang Pass this June are in for a rare treat - intermittent snowfall that has transformed the region into a winter wonderland. Perched at an altitude of 13,058 feet, Rohtang defies summer's grip, offering snow-draped peaks, plunging temperatures, and a refreshing chill that leaves visitors wide-eyed with wonder. Across Manali, the mood is celebratory as travellers embrace this unseasonal burst of winter. Many describe the experience as nothing short of magical - an alpine escape where the scorching heat and humidity of the plains vanish, replaced by crisp mountain air. From snowball fights to cozy bonfires, the contrast between the sweltering cities and this frosty retreat couldn't be more dramatic. Tourists are seizing the moment, indulging in thrilling activities like river rafting and paragliding. Meanwhile, locals have swiftly adapted to the surprise cold snap. Woollens are out, and heaters and tandoors are back in use, with mornings and evenings now boasting a December-like chill – even in the middle of June. The snowfall sweeping across Rohtang and surrounding high-altitude regions has drawn visitors from far and wide. Families from Delhi and Kolkata, fleeing 50°C temperatures, are basking in the cool embrace of Manali's snowkissed landscape. "It's surreal - we left an oven behind and walked into a snow globe," said Ashutosh Mehta, a tourist from Delhi.



DEVELOP MECHANISM FOR RELEASING CONVICTS ON PAROLE: HC TO HIMACHAL GOVT

Diary Times Desk : The Himachal Pradesh High Court has directed the state government to develop a mechanism to promulgate, monitor, revise and enforce compliance of relevant provisions, Jail Manual, HP Good Conduct Prisoners (Temporary Release) Act and Rules framed thereunder, especially with respect to the time frame prescribed for process, considering and deciding the applications for temporary release. While passing this direction, a Division Bench, comprising Justice Vivek Singh Thakur and Justice Rakesh Kainthla, observed, "There should be an unambiguous, meaningful provision for considering eligibility for enlarging prisoners on parole, including eligibility for applying for parole for the first time." It further observed, "The denial of the extension of the benefit of parole should not be based upon vague and general objections communicated casually, but there must be substance or material to sustain the reasons for not recommending the case of the prisoners for release on parole. Mere apprehension without any substance or material should not be made basis for denying the benefit of temporary release on parole. The denial or non-recommendation should be based on a credible assertion, including a real cause or threat warranting non recommendation and denial of the benefit of temporary release." The court further directed the state authorities.

MANDI: GREEN ACTIVISTS EXHORT UNIFIED ACTION TO MAKE COUNTRY PLASTIC-FREE



Diary Times Desk : On the occasion of World Environment Day, environmentalists raised a clarion call to make India plastic-free, expressing deep concern over the growing environmental degradation in the fragile Himalayan ecosystem due to plastic pollution. Guman Singh, convener of Himalavan Niti Abhivan, an NGO dedicated to environmental conservation in the state, highlighted the escalating plastic waste crisis in the Himalayan region. "Plastic waste has become a major environmental concern in the hills over the past few years," Singh said. "Not only urban areas, but even villages are grappling with this menace due to the lack of an effective waste processing system." He warned that plastic waste was accumulating on riverbanks and polluting water bodies, with harmful substances seeping into the soil and entering the food chain. The situation had further worsened due to the increasing influx of tourists, many of whom irresponsibly discard plastic waste in ecologically sensitive areas. Singh stressed that plastic pollution was no longer just a local or national concern, but a global issue that needed immediate and coordinated efforts. Narender Saini, chairman of Devbhumi Paryavaran Rakshak Manch, echoed similar concerns.

KULLU: SHRIKHAND YATRA TO COMMENCE ON JULY 10, PREPARATIONS UNDER WAY

Diary Times Desk : The revered Shrikhand Yatra, widely recognised as one of the most challenging pilgrimages, is set to take place from July 10 to 23 this year. 'WILL TRY TO ENSURE SUCH INCIDENTS DON'T RECUR' – BCCI SECRETARY ON CHINNASWAMY STAMPEDE

Diary Times Desk : The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI), which regulates the Indian Premier League (IPL), is considering introducing guidelines for victory celebrations in the future. "At some stage BCCI will have to do something. We cannot be a silent spectator," BCCI secretary Devajit Saikia told Cricbuzz. The BCCI official was reacting to the horrific turn of events in Bengaluru during RCB's victory celebrations on Wednesday (June 5). "It was a private affair of RCB but we at the BCCI are responsible for cricket in India and we will try to ensure such incidents do not recur in future," Saikia further said. Eleven fans died and scores injured in the stampede-like situation near Chinnaswamy Stadium in Bengaluru during the RCB victory celebrations. This has caused a nation-wide outrage leading to action against police and RCB officials by the Karnataka State Government. Quite a few arrests have been made already. Only a day earlier, India coach Gautam Gambhir hit out against the organisers of the victory parade. "I think the lives of people are far more important and I will continue to say. We can be a little bit careful of not holding these kinds of roadshows and can probably have them closed doors or something like this in a stadium.

CARLSEN, GUKESH STRIKE TO SET UP PERFECT NORWAY CHESS LAST ROUND

Diary Times Desk : World number-one Magnus Carlsen leads World Champion Gukesh Dommaraju by half a point going into the final round of Norway Chess 2025 after both stars won their classical games in round nine. Carlsen sacrificed a pawn against GM Fabiano Caruana but ultimately converted an extra pawn in the endgame. Gukesh took big risks in the opening against GM Wei Yi but turned it all around again to win in style. GM Hikaru Nakamura took a classical draw against GM Arjun Erigaisi before winning smoothly in armageddon. All three classical games in Women's Norway Chess 2025 ended decisively and with a major shakeup in the standings. GM Anna Muzychuk beat Women's World Champion GM Ju Wenjun to take a twopoint lead. The former leader GM Koneru Humpy achieved a winning position against GM Lei Tingjie but blundered and lost a piece, leaving her in second. IM Sara Khadem won her second classical game of the event, against GM Vaishali Rameshbabu. With the top-three only separated by two points the final round of Norway Chess is set to be a thriller. Carlsen vs. Caruana has been perhaps the biggest rivalry in chess for a decade, but the world number-one felt his opponent wasn't quite at the races in round nine."



PIYUSH CHAWLA RETIRES FROM PROFESSIONAL CRICKET

Diary Times Desk: Piyush Chawla, the former India legspinner, has called time on a professional career that spanned over two decades. Chawla, 36, played three Tests, 25 ODIs and seven T20Is, with his last appearance for India coming back in 2012 at the T20 World Cup in Sri Lanka. The Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy in 2024-25 was Chawla's final appearance in domestic cricket, a tournament he had committed to play in the hope of featuring in IPL 2025. He went unsold at the mega auction in November and was subsequently part of during , programming ESPNcricinfo's the tournament. Chawla featured in 192 IPL matches, and had stints with four franchises - Punjab Kings (PBKS), Kolkata Knight Riders (KKR), Chennai Super Kings (CSK) and Mumbai Indians (MI). He picked up 192 wickets, with the highlight being the 2014 season, where he famously hit the winning runs to bring KKR their second IPL title in three seasons. Chawla's last IPL appearance came in 2024, when he was part of MI. He finishes as the fourth-highest wicket-taker in the IPL. Chawla came into the limelight as a 16-year-old when he bowled Sachin Tendulkar with a googly in the 2005 Challenger Trophy. In 2006, he earned a Test debut against England in Mohali, soon after being a part of India's Under-19 World Cup squad.
