MANIPUR ON EDGE AFTER ARREST OF RADICAL MEITEI LEADER —EX-COP WANTED FOR ABDUCTION OF SENIOR OFFICER

Diary Times Desk : Tensions erupted in two districts of Manipur on Saturday night, prompting the suspension of internet services for five days after a popular leader of the radical group Arambai Tenggol allegedly involved in the abduction of a senior police officer, was arrested and handed over to the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI).

Kannan Singh, the commander of Arambai Tenggol and a former head constable in the Manipur Police who was dismissed from service earlier this year, has been involved in multiple cases, police sources confirmed to ThePrint.

Another arrest of a Kuki National Army (KNA) leader was also made by the National Investigation Agency (NIA) in a case of murder.

Protests broke out in the Imphal valley, demanding the release of Singh and another volunteer of Arambai Tenggol who was arrested by Manipur Police in a separate case. Protesters torched tyres and old furniture on roads in Kwakeithel and Uripok, and clashed with security personnel Saturday night.

A mob also set a bus on fire at Khurai Lamlong in Imphal East district. Security forces fired several rounds of tear gas shells to disperse the protesters in front of Kangla Gate, nearly 200 metres away from the Raj Bhavan.

VIOLENCEPM'S 'INSENSITIVITY' TO SUFFERING OF PEOPLE IN
MANIPUR 'TRULY SHOCKING': CONGRESS



Diary Times Desk : With fresh violence rocking parts of Manipur, the Congress on Sunday targeted Prime Minister Narendra Modi for his "insensitivity" towards the suffering of people in the state. In a post on X, Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh said the pain, distress, and agony of the people of Manipur continues unabated as five districts of Imphal West, Imphal East, Thoubal, Katching, and Bishnupur in Manipur have been rocked by violence in the last 24 hours.

A day after violent protests erupted in Manipur over the arrest of a leader of Meitei outfit Arambai Tenggol, the situation remained tense on Sunday with the administration imposing prohibitory orders and suspending internet services in five Imphal valley districts, police said.

Hitting out at the government, Ramesh claimed that in February 2022 the BJP "engineered a majority for itself alone" in the Assembly elections. "But less than 15 months later from the night of May 3, 2023, Manipur was made to burn. Hundreds of innocent men, women, and children were killed. Thousands were displaced. Places of worship were destroyed," he said.

On June 4, 2023, the Congress leader said the Union Government set up a three-member Commission of Inquiry. That Commission has been given repeated extensions to submit its report and the latest deadline given to it is November 20, he noted. On August 1, 2023, Ramesh said the Supreme Court observed that there had been an "absolute breakdown of constitutional machinery" in the state for the last two months. "The Union Home Minister went through the motions of visiting Manipur while the PM maintained absolute silence refusing to say anything.

CASH DISCOVERY: RESIGNATION ONLY OPTION BEFORE JUSTICE VARMA TO AVOID REMOVAL BY PARLIAMENT

Diary Times Desk : Resignation is the only option before Justice Yashwant Varma to avoid impeachment by Parliament as the government pushes for bringing a motion to remove the Allahabad High Court judge over alleged corruption. Officials aware of the procedure to appoint and remove Supreme Court and high court judges pointed out that while defending his case before lawmakers in any of the House, Justice Varma can announce that he is quitting and his verbal statement will be considered his resignation. Should he decide to resign, he will get pension and other benefits entitled to a retired high court judge. But if he is removed by Parliament, he will be deprived of pension and other benefits, they noted. According to Article 217 of the Constitution, a high court judge "may, by writing under his hand addressed to the President, resign his office". A judge's resignation does not require any approval. A simple resignation letter is sufficient. A judge may give a prospective date to step down. In such cases, the judge can withdraw the resignation before the date he or she has mentioned as the last day in office. Removal by Parliament is the other way a judge can vacate office. Then Chief Justice of India Saniiv Khanna had written to the President and the prime minister to remove Justice Varma, mired in the cash discovery row.



IN 2026, NDA WILL FORM GOVERNMENTS IN TAMIL NADU, WEST BENGAL: AMIT SHAH



Diary Times Desk : Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Sunday asserted that the NDA would form governments in Tamil Nadu and West Bengal and targeted the DMK regime by firing fresh "corruption" salvos, including the Rs 4,600 crore sand mining scam. Addressing party office-bearers, he hailed Madurai as a city of 'parivartan' and said his party's Karyakarta Sammelan (workers' conference) in the temple city would lead to change, of dislodging the DMK from power. Chief Minister M K Stalin claimed that Shah cannot defeat the DMK and he is correct in a sense, he said, adding, "It is not Shah who will defeat the DMK, it is the people of Tamil Nadu who will bring about that change." Shah said he has participated in elections across the country and understands the pulse of the people, and he is fully confident that the people of Tamil Nadu will uproot the DMK government this time. The DMK's corrupt rule has affected the poor, women and children in Tamil Nadu, Shah alleged, and urged his party members to resolve to dislodge the Stalin-led Dravidian party government from the seat of power.

BIJNI-MANDI PROJECT: TUNNEL WILL BE BUILT IN THE SHAPE OF A HORSESHOE, THERE WILL BE AN EXIT GATE EVERY 500 METERS

Diary Times Desk : The twin tunnel being built under the Bijni-Mandi project in the Pathankot-Mandi four-lane will be in the shape of a horseshoe. Its alignment is almost straight. There will be slight turns in between. The other end of the tunnel starting from Bijni will come out on Score Road. A big bridge will be built on Beas here and will connect to Bindravani. The tunnel will also have state-of-the-art facilities. With this strategically important project, the Pathankot-Mandi four-lane will be connected to the Kiratpur-Manali four-lane at Bindravani. A junction will be built at Bindravani. Five service lanes will be built here. This will connect Mandi city, Kullu, Dharamshala, Chandigarh. A total of Rs 971.99 crore will be spent on the 5.357 km long project. A 3.5 km long tunnel is being built in it. The tunnel will have cross passages every 500 meters so that in case of any untoward incident, vehicles and others can be easily evacuated from the other tunnel. Apart from this, there will be a lay by place at every 800 meters i.e. a place to park the vehicle in case of emergency. The tunnel will have all kinds of facilities including ventilation, fire detection, CCTV, communication. The tunnel will have Skoda system. Under this, if there is more gas inside the tunnel.

The marriage took place on the recommendation of the woman's brother. After some time, the wife instigated him to sell 18 biswa land. When the land was sold, he got Rs 2.50 lakh transferred to his account. She kept procrastinating every time when it came to getting her name registered in the Panchayat. Gvan Chand alleaed that in April 2025, she suddenly disappeared from the house with 20 thousand rupees in cash and precious jewelry. INDIA'S ACTIVE COVID-19 CASES RISE TO 6,133, SIX **DEATHS IN LAST 24 HOURS**

Diary Times Desk : India's active Covid-19 case tally has crossed the 6.000-mark with 378 fresh cases reported in the last 24 hours, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare's (MoHFW) data on Sunday, June 8, showed. India's active Covid-19 case tally stood at 6,133, with Kerala making the biggest contribution in the fresh infections, followed by Gujarat and West Bengal. India's active Covid-19 cases rose by 378 since Saturday to stand at 6,133, while 753 people with the infection were cured or discharged in the last 24 hours, the health ministry's data on Sunday showed. India also logged six deaths between Saturday and Sunday – two in Karnataka, three in Kerala and one in Tamil Nadu. Details of which are as follows: Karnataka - A 4- year old male with Cor pulmonale, Pulmonary Arterial Hypertension and incidental Covid-19 positive, a 78-year old male with Ischemic Heart Disease, Immune Thrombocytopenic Purpura (and incidental Covid positive. Among the three Covid fatalities in Kerala was a 51-year-old male with SHT, CAD, CKD, a 64-year-old ma;e with T2 DM, CKD, oesophageal adenocarcinoma with metastasis and a 92-year-old male with CAD-Post CABG, CKD Multiple Myeloma.

EC ASKS LOP RAHUL GANDHI TO FILE COMPLAINT DIRECTLY TO POLL BODY OVER MAHARASHTRA ELECTION 'RIGGING' CLAIM



Diary Times Desk : With Congress leader Rahul Gandhi sought the Election Commission's response on his article alleging rigging in Maharashtra polls, the EC said it would respond only if the Leader of the Opposition writes to it directly, PTI quoted a source as saying. According to the report, the EC stated that it had invited all six national parties for separate interactions. While the other five met the EC brass, Congress cancelled the May 15 meeting. Earlier on Saturday, Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha hit back at the Election Commission following sources in the poll panel rejected allegation of rigging in the 2024 Maharashtra Assembly polls, stating the evasion would not protect its credibility but telling the truth would. In an article, the Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha had alleged "match-fixing" in the Maharashtra polls and claimed that it would next happen in the Bihar elections and "anywhere the BJP is losing". Responding to a question on Gandhi's demand for CCTV footage of Maharashtra's polling stations, the EC source cited the instructions of the poll body.

DELHI BRACES FOR INTENSE HEAT, TEMPERATURE LIKELY TO HIT 44 DEGREES IN COMING WEEK

UKRAINE REJECTS CLAIM RUSSIAN FORCES ENTER KEY CENTRAL REGION

Diary Times Desk : Kyiv's armed forces rejected as "disinformation" Russia's claim that its ground troops have crossed into Ukraine's Dnipropetrovsk region for the first time, even as prospects for a US-brokered ceasefire remain elusive. Separately, Ukraine and Russia continued testy exchanges over the details of a planned large prisoner swap agreed to during last week's talks in Turkey. The exchange is likely to move ahead in the coming days. Russia's defense ministry said Sunday that units of its 90th tank regiment had crossed the western administrative border of Donetsk into neighboring Dnipropetrovsk, in what would be a symbolic milestone in their years-long offensive. In response, Ukraine's southern defense forces said its troops were "holding their section of the front" while involved in a situation that, while "tense," is still contained within the Donetsk region. At issue is the potential advance by Moscow's land forces into one of Ukraine's most populous and industrialized areas. The value of reaching the edge of the region appears mostly symbolic, as Kremlin troops are still more than 140 kilometers away from the regional capital.

IRAN SAYS ISRAELI 'TREASURE TROVE' OF SECRET DOCUMENTS TO BE UNVEILED SOON

Diary Times Desk : Iranian Intelligence Minister Esmail Khatib has said sensitive Israeli documents related to its nuclear facilities, its relationship with the United States, Europe and other countries, as well as its defensive capabilities, will be unveiled soon. Khatib told state TV on Sunday that the documents obtained by Tehran were a "treasure trove" capable of strengthening the nation's offensive posture, but he did not provide any immediate evidence. The Israeli government, which has never revealed details about its nuclear arsenal, said to comprise substantial atomic weapons, making it the only country in the Middle East with nuclear bombs, has not yet commented on the report of the leaked documents. However, there have been arrests of Israelis allegedly spying for Tehran amid its war in Gaza. It was not clear if the materials were connected to a reported hacking of an Israeli nuclear research centre last year. The transfer of this treasure trove was time-consuming and required security measures. Naturally, the transfer methods will remain confidential, but the documents should be unveiled soon," Khatib said.



WORLD LEADERS URGED TO **STEP UP FOR OVEREXPLOITED** OCEANS

Diary Times Desk : World leaders arrive in the French Riviera on Sunday ahead a high-level summit on ocean conservation, as nations face pressure to adopt tougher stances on overfishing, pollution and marine protection. The United Nations has sounded the alarm over an oceans "emergency" and leaders gathering in Nice will be called to commit money and stronger protections for the seas. AGENT ARRESTED AFTER 3 PUNJAB MEN ARE NABBED AT DELHI AIRPORT FOR HAVING FAKE VISAS, TICKETS TO SPAIN

Diary Times Desk : A man accused of trying to facilitate the illegal travel of three Punjab-based men to Spain using forged Schengen visas and fake tickets has been arrested by IGI Airport police, an official said on Sunday. The three men were arrested at the Delhi airport after their documents and tickets were found to be fake. They had been promised jobs in Spain after paying Rs 17 lakh for the illegal travel. Kamaldeep Singh (25), a resident of Amritsar, went into hiding after the trio's arrest but was later tracked and arrested from Kurukshetra, police said. He was working with another agent, Sonu Walia, already arrested by Punjab Police, to send the trio abroad on fake documents, they added. "On May 29, three passengers from Amritsar arrived at the IGI Airport to board a flight to Madrid. Airline officials flagged their tickets as fake and referred their documents to immigration authorities. The Schengen visas on their passports were confirmed to be counterfeit by a Swiss liaison officer," said the official. Schengen visa allows people from non-EU countries to enter Schengen countries (all in Europe) and permits free travel across borders within it. Following a complaint, an FIR was lodged and an investigation was ordered. Kamaldeep had promised the three jobs in Spain and charged them Rs 17 lakh in total.

Apart from the plain areas, the temperature of the hilly areas has also increased. The Meteorological Center Shimla has predicted clear weather in all parts of Himachal Pradesh till June 11. Light rain is expected in some mid-hill areas including high hills on June 12 and 13. During the next 4 to 5 days, maximum temperature is likely to increase by 3 to 4 degree Celsius and minimum temperature by 2 to 3.

KHALEELS FIERY FOUR-FOR HANDS INDIA A SLENDER FIRST-INNINGS LEAD

After the interval, Nitish Kumar Reddy broke Farhan Ahmed's dogged resistance -- his 87-ball 24 frustrating the visitors -- to make it 279 for 9. But from there India A struggled to break through with the final wicket stand between Josh Tongue and No 11 Eddie Jack, frustrating the visitors. Tongue remained unbeaten on a resolute 36 (61 balls), while 19-year-old Jack -- playing only his second first-class game -- displayed remarkable composure under pressure. The lefthander struck three boundaries and partnered for a gritty 48-run lastwicket stand that took England Lions past the 300-run mark, frustrating the Abhimanyu Easwaran-led side. India A rotated their bowlers and even took the second new ball in the 81st over in pursuit of the final scalp.

KL RAHUL'S CHILDHOOD COACH MAKES BIG PREDICTION ON INDIA STAR: "IN ENGLAND..."

PARENTS OF STAMPEDE VICTIM, 24, BREAK DOWN WHILE ACCEPTING COMPENSATION

Diary Times Desk : Four days after a deadly stampede in Bengaluru, a family in Karnataka's Kolar was handed a financial compensation for the damage that cannot be compensated - the loss of their 24-year-old daughter. Kolar deputy commissioner MR Ravi visited the home of Sahana, one of the 11 people who died in the June 4 stampede that occurred in front of the Chinnaswamy stadium during the Royal Challengers Bangalore (RCB) team's IPL victory celebrations. Forty-seven were injured in the tragedy. Her mother broke down as she was offered the cheque of Rs 25 lakh compensation by the officer. Sahana's father, who was trying to hold back his tears, burst out crying as soon as he touched the cheque. As other family members comforted them, the parents were seen weeping uncontrollably. All the victims of the stampede were in the 20-30 years age group with a 14-yearold being the youngest - Divyanshi (14), Doresha (32), Bhoomik (20), Sahana (24), Akshata (27), Manoj (33), Shravan (20), Devi (29), Shivalinga (17) and Chinmayi (19) and Prajwal (20). Earlier, the Karnataka government had announced a compensation of Rs 10 lakh each, which was later increased to Rs 25 lakh per family.

Diary Times Desk : India have taken the right decision by handing the reins of the Test team to Shubman Gill and now the youngster must given a long rope to prove his credentials, says Ricky Ponting, who is also confident that India can handle the ongoing transition phase better than other countries. India will be without stalwarts Virat Kohli, Rohit Sharma, Ravichandran Ashwin, who all retired recently, and pacer Mohammed Shami when they begin their five-Test tour of England on June 20. While Kohli and Rohit retired from Tests last month, Ashwin had hung up his boots during the Australia tour last year and Shami was ruled out on fitness grounds for the tour of the Old Blighty. "I actually think it's the right move. I know there's a lot of other people out there, pundits out there saying they can't understand why it wasn't Bumrah and why they have gone to Shubman, but I think it's pretty simple," Ponting told The ICC Review. "Bumrah's injuries are holding him back a bit in the last couple of years and you don't want that with a captain. You can't have a captain coming in and missing games here and there, so I think it's the right decision." "Now that they've made it, it's one they've got to stick with and give him (Gill) a good crack at it for a long period of time," he said.



ENGLAND BOWL FIRST, ONE CHANGE EACH WITH HOSEIN AND WOOD IN

Diary Times Desk : England won the toss and chose to bowl first against West Indies Harry Brook won the toss and chose to bowl first in the second T20I at Bristol, as England looked to seal their second series in a row against the touring West Indies. With grey but dry skies in prospect, and faced with a more compact ground than had been the case in the series opener at Chester-le-Street on Friday, Brook opted to let his bowlers set the tempo, with the left-arm seamer Luke Wood recalled for his first international since September 2023, at the expense of Matthew Potts. "We just fancy a chase," Brook said. "It's quite a big difference to Durham, the boundaries a lot shorter, but it's usually a good pitch to play on. For a point of difference, we want to have a look at Woody with the leftarm swing," Brook added, "and see how he goes with the new ball today." For West Indies, their one change was a notable one, with the left-arm spinner Akeal Hosein slotting straight back into the line-up, having arrived in the country at 8am this morning after visa issues had prevented him from being available for the series opener.

STEVE SMITH REVEALS: 'LET GO OF BATTING AFTER MISSING MOHAMMED SHAMI'S FULL TOSS'

Diarv Times Desk : Australia star Steve Smith has revealed that he let go of one of his favorite things, shadow batting, after getting out to Mohammed Shami's full-toss in the 2025 Champions Trophy semi-final against India. Speaking in an interview on Sunday, he said he hadn't 'hit a ball' after the incident in the lead-up to the World Test Championship summit clash against South Africa, which begins at Lord's on June 11. Smith's wicket for 73 (96) in 37th over of the first innings was a pivotal moment in the game. Australia were bowled out for a slightly sub-par 264, which India chased down in the 49th over with only three wickets to spare. The righthander retired from ODI cricket soon after and spent three months in New York, working on his fitness, away from several of his teammates who played T20 leagues or domestic cricket. "I'd normally have a bat laying around the house somewhere and just pick it up and do a bit of shadow batting and stuff. But I made a conscious decision to try and just let it go for a while. It was good. I hadn't hit a ball since I missed a full toss off Mohammed Shami in the Champions Trophy. "Fortunately, everything sort of clicked into place immediately.
