Diary Times Desk : Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge on Wednesday termed the Enforcement Directorate (ED) searches against a party MP and three MLAs in the state, as a "conspiracy" to divide the party in Karnataka.


Without taking the name of the ruling BJP at the Centre, he claimed that the grand old party was being targeted, aimed at creating difference within the party, to reap benefits out of it, but they wouldn't be successful in their attempts as all Congress legislators are united.

"I don't know the details. I just saw it on TV. Naturally, if the ED has done it, they have been angry with the Congress party since the beginning. If they are targeting the Congress MLAs, there seems to be a conspiracy to divide our party," Kharge said.

Speaking to reporters here, he said if they harass them by bringing up something now that is said to have happened during the election, it is not right. "The matter should have been looked into during the election, but after one year, one-and-half year, if they are taking it up now, it seems to be an attempt to divide the party legislators here. Let's see how the ED takes the case. I will get information from the CM over the phone and see what needs to be done," he added. The ED on Wednesday conducted searches against Congress Ballari MP E Tukaram and three MLAs of the party as part of a money laundering investigation.

RAHUL GANDHI WRITES TO PM OVER DELAYS IN SCHOLARSHIPS FOR STUDENTS FROM MARGINALISED COMMUNITIES

Diary Times Desk : Congress MP Rahul Gandhi has urged Prime Minister Narendra Modi to address the "deplorable" conditions students from the Dalit, Scheduled Tribe (ST), Economically Backward Class (EBC), Other Backward Class (OBC), and minority sections of the society have to deal with at residential hostels, along with the delays in post-matric scholarship disbursements.

In a letter dated June 10, the Congress leader detailed a crisis in scholarships programmes, citing Bihar as an example where the scholarship portal allegedly remained non-functional for three years, resulting in no scholarships being disbursed during the 2021-22 academic year.

He noted a sharp decline in beneficiaries, and said, "The number of Dalit students receiving scholarships fell by nearly half, from 1.36 lakh in FY23 to 69,000 in FY24," while adding that "students further complain that the scholarship amounts are insultingly low". The Lok Sabha leader of opposition cited his visit to the Ambedkar Hostel in Darbhanga, Bihar, where students reported severe overcrowding, with "6-7 students forced to share" single rooms, coupled with unhygienic toilets, unsafe drinking water, absent mess facilities, and no access to libraries or the internet.

Gandhi claimed that these issues were not isolated to Bihar but "represent a nationwide failure", hindering education for the vast majority of students from marginalised backgrounds. He called for immediate government action, a comprehensive audit of all hostels serving these communities to ensure basic infrastructure, sanitation, food.





MEGHALAYA COURT SENDS SONAM RAGHUVANSHI, AIDES TO **8-DAY POLICE CUSTODY**

Diary Times Desk : A court in Shillong on Wednesday sent Sonam Raghuvanshi, accused of killing her husband Raja during their honeymoon in Meghalaya, and her four aides to eight-day police custody, an official said. The Meghalaya police brought Sonam here from Uttar Pradesh on Tuesday midnight and the other accused from Madhya Pradesh on Wednesday on transit remand, a senior officer said. "Police had sought a 10-day remand of all the accused. The court granted 8 days of police custody," East Khasi Hills district SP Vivek Syiem told PTI. Sonam, a 24-year-old woman, was arrested from Ghazipur in Uttar Pradesh, while her aides were apprehended from Indore in Madhya Pradesh for their alleged role in conspiring and killing Raja Raghuvanshi. The special investigation team sought police custody of the accused to reconstruct the crime scene in Sohra, the officer said. The SIT has secured a six-day remand for the accused.



Diary Times Desk : For the repair of the bridge at Summerhill on the Kalka-Shimla railway track, trains will now run only till Taradevi on 27th and 28th June. The Railway Board has prepared a plan to get the work done in the second phase. As per the plan, finishing work will be done on the bridge. In the first phase, the construction work has been completed up to about 70 percent. The officials of the technical wing have also inspected the work. During the inspection, satisfaction has been expressed in the ongoing work. At present, trains are being sent to Taradevi till June 12. All the trains are also returning from here. Now after this, the Railway Board has decided to get the work done in the last week. The repair of the bridge will also be completed after the completion of the work in two phases. After this, the Railway Board will issue the time period for running all the trains. Bridge 800 was completely damaged near Summerhill in the rain on 14 August 2023 on the Kalka-Shimla railway track. Due to the excessive flow of water due to cloudburst, even the girders of the bridge were broken. The railway line was hanging in the air. After this a bridge was built here with the help of two girders. This bridge started needing repairs after two years. Now its repairs are going on.

"GRATITUDE TO INDIAN NAVY": CHINA ON SWIFT RESCUE OF FIRE-HIT CARGO SHIP

Diary Times Desk : China has expressed gratitude to India for successfully rescuing the crew of the Singapore-flagged cargo vessel MV Wan Hai 503 that caught fire off the Kerala coast on June 9. Spokesperson of the Chinese Embassy in India, Yu Jing, took to X and said that of the 22 people on board the vessel, 14 were Chinese nationals, as she thanked the Indian Navy and Mumbai Coast Guard for their prompt actions. "On June 9, MV Wan Hai 503 encountered onboard explosion and fire 44 nautical miles off Azhikkal, Kerala. Of the total 22 crew members on board, 14 are Chinese, including 6 from Taiwan. Our gratitude goes to the Indian Navy and the Mumbai Coast Guard for their prompt and professional rescue," Yu Jing wrote on X. Of the 22 crew members on board the ship, four people are missing, five were injured, while 18 others were rescued. China said it wishes further search operations to be successful, and the injured crew members have a speedy recovery. The explosion occurred while the vessel was en route from Colombo to Nhava Sheva near Mumbai. It experienced an explosion in one of its containers, sparking a massive onboard fire while sailing roughly 70 nautical miles off Kozhikode. The vessel is currently adrift.

WE HAVE BOYCOTTED HER, CUT ALL TIES: SONAM'S BROTHER ON MEGHALAYA MURDER



Diary Times Desk: Sonam Raghuvanshi, who has reportedly confessed to killing her husband Raja Raghuvanshi in Meghalaya, has now been "boycotted" by her family. Her brother, Govind, met Raja's family and said her family wants her to be hanged if she is guilty. Govind went to the residence of Sonam's in-laws in Indore on Wednesday and a video shows him hugging Raja Raghuvanshi's mother. The mother, Uma, is seen crying and Govind breaks out into tears too. Sonam, 24, is accused of plotting the murder of Raja, 29, who was killed during their honeymoon in Meghalaya on May 23, just 12 days after they got married. Sonam was allegedly in love with Raj Kushwaha, a 21-year-old employee in their family business, and they had roped in three of Kushwaha's friends to carry out the murder. Speaking to reporters with Raja's brother, Vipin, after the meeting, Govind said in Hindi, "It is not confirmed that Sonam was behind the murder. But the evidence being brought to light makes me 100% sure that she has got this done.

ALL SEATS BOOKED FOR NEXT 10 DAYS ON KASHMIR TRAIN DAYS AFTER INAUGURATION

TELANGANA HC GRANTS BAIL TO JANARDHAN REDDY, STAYS CONVICTION IN ILLEGAL MINING CASE

The High Court's decision comes over a month after a special Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) court in Hyderabad convicted Reddy and four others on May 6 in the longrunning case. Along with Reddy, the High Court also granted bail to co-accused VD Rajagopal (then Director of Mines), BV Srinivasa Reddy (Managing Director of Obulapuram Mining Company), and K Mehfuz Ali Khan (Reddy's personal assistant). The court had reserved its orders on the interim bail applications earlier this week on Monday, June 9, after hearing arguments from both sides. Senior advocate S Nagamuthu, appearing for Reddy.

MINISTERS TO UNDERGO COVID TEST BEFORE MEETING PM MODI AMID RISING CASES

Diary Times Desk : Amid the rising Covid-19 cases in India, any minister who is scheduled to meet Prime Minister Narendra Modi must get an RT-PCR test done, sources said. The decision comes as all BJP functionaries from Delhi, including the Chief Minister, are scheduled to meet the Prime Minister at his residence today evening. All the ministers would need to undergo the Covid-19 test, sources said. Additionally, in cases when PM Modi carries out a rally - all the officials present on the stage will also need to show their RT-PCR test. India's active coronavirus cases have climbed to 7,121, with Kerala fighting the latest resurgence of infections - followed by Gujarat and Delhi. According to the data available on the official website of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, 306 new cases were added to the active case count since Friday. Kerala has recorded 2,223 cases, Gujarat 1,223, Delhi 757, and West Bengal 747. Maharashtra has recorded a total of 615 cases so far, while Karnataka and Uttar Pradesh have reported 459 and 229 cases, respectively. Tamil Nadu has reported 204 cases, Puducherry 10, Haryana 125, Andhra Pradesh 72, Madhya Pradesh 65, and Goa six.

GRETA THUNBERG WAS ABUSED BY ISRAELI AUTHORITIES SAYS FRENCH DOCTOR

Diary Times Desk : A French doctor who was on board the humanitarian aid boat that was on its way to Gaza, and which was subsequently intercepted by Israeli authorities, alleged that they were abusive towards the passengers. The boat also had Swedish climate activist Greta Thunberg onboard, and the doctor, Baptiste André said that the Israeli authorities mocked and deliberately deprived passengers of sleep, particularly Thunberg. André told reporters after arriving in France, that as soon as someone would fall asleep, the agents would play loud music and dance. He also claimed that the detainees had a hard time accessing food and water. "I don't have the legal qualifications to specify what happened, but there were acts of mistreatment," André said Tuesday. Madleen was a boat organised by pro-Palestinian Freedom Flotilla Coalition that left Italy on June 1st to deliver aid to Gaza. There were 12 passengers on the boat, including Thunberg. The boat was intercepted 200 kilometres away from the Gaza coast by the Israeli naval forces.

TRUMP SAYS "DEAL WITH CHINA DONE" **ON RARE EARTHS AND STUDENT VISAS**

Diary Times Desk: US President Donald Trump on Wednesday said that, as a part of a trade agreement, China will supply rare earths upfront to the United States, and also permit visas for Chinese students. In a Truth Social post, Trump announced that Beijing will supply United States with "full magnets and all necessary rare earth materials." In exchange for this, United States will let Chinese students study at American colleges and universities. "Our deal with China is done, subject to final approval with President Xi and me. Full magnets, and any necessary rare earths, will be supplied, up front, by China. Likewise, we will provide to China what was agreed to, including Chinese students using our colleges and universities (which has always been good with me!). We are getting a total of 55% tariffs, China is getting 10%. Relationship is excellent! Thank you for your attention to this matter!" Trump wrote on Truth Social. In May, it was because of rare earths, that the tariff truce between the two countries had derailed. Earlier today, China's vice premier said that Beijing was ready to "strengthen cooperation" with Washington. US and Chinese officials said on Tuesday they had agreed on a framework to get their trade truce back on track.

ALLIES TO RIVALS TO ALLIES AGAIN? TIMELINE OF MUSK-TRUMP FEUD



Diary Times Desk : It was the third week of Donald Trump's second term in the Oval Office. His most trusted lieutenant, Elon Musk, led a massive initiative, Department of Government Efficiency (DoGE), to slash federal spending. On February 7, the billionaire, who spent roughly \$300 million on the Republican candidate's election campaign, posted on X, "I love@realDonaldTrump as much as a straight man can love another man." It quickly spiralled, with the billionaire suggesting the President be impeached and accusing the government of hiding his ties to Jeffrey Epstein, the late convicted sex offender.

"9,00,000 ILLEGAL MIGRANTS": WHAT MAKES LA HOTBED FOR IMMIGRANT PROTESTS

Diary Times Desk : Why has Los Angeles, home to some of America's wealthiest and most powerful people, become the hotbed for US President Donald Trump's strictest immigration crackdown over the weekend? The answer lies in the city's ethnic, racial and demographic makeup. Los Angeles County, which spreads over 4,000 square miles of Southern California, includes the city of Los Angeles, along with posh Beverly Hills, Hollywood, Long Beach, Malibu, Pasadena, Santa Monica, among several other communities. PAK MAN EXTRADITED TO US FOR PLOTTING TERROR ATTACK AT BROOKLYN JEWISH CENTRE

Diary Times Desk : A Pakistani national was extradited from Canada to the United States to face federal terrorism charges after allegedly plotting a mass shooting at a Jewish centre in Brooklyn in support of ISIS. Muhammad Shahzeb Khan, 20, alias Shahzeb Jadoon, was arrested near the US-Canada border last year and arrived in New York earlier this week. According to the Department of Justice, Khan aimed to carry out a deadly assault using AR-style rifles and knives, telling undercover operatives he wanted to "kill as many Jewish civilians as possible." "This would be the largest attack on US soil since 9/11," Khan allegedly boasted. Federal prosecutors said Khan coordinated with a US-based associate and two undercover agents posing as extremists. He selected Jewish religious centers as targets, sharing photos of a Brooklyn synagogue and planning to strike on the anniversary of Hamas's 2023 attack on Israel.

"TARRED AND FEATHERED": US **SPEAKER CALLS FOR CALIFORNIA GOVERNOR'S** TORTURE

Diary Times Desk : Speaker Mike Johnson said that California Governor Gavin Newsom should be publicly tortured - "tarred and feathered". However, he refused to say whether Newsom should be arrested. On Tuesday, at a House Republican leadership press conference, he said the question of whether he should be arrested is "not in my lane". "I'm not going to give you legal analysis on whether Gavin Newsom should be arrested," the speaker continued. "But he ought to be tarred and feathered, I'll say that." BBC RELEASES 2 EPISODES OF SIDHU MOOSEWALA DOCUMENTARY ON YOUTUBE AMID COURT CASE

Diary Times Desk : After a controversy erupted over the screening of a documentary on Sidhu Moosewala, the BBC World Service on Wednesday released it on YouTube ahead of its scheduled screening in Mumbai in the afternoon. The documentary has been released on Moosewala's birth anniversary, even as his father has filed a petition in a Mansa court in Punjab, seeking a stay on its screening. The family is likely to release an extended play of his songs on Wednesday.Moosewala was born on June 11, 1993. The BBC has released two episodes of the documentary, featuring some of Moosewala's old friends, a few journalists, and two senior police officers from Punjab and Delhi. The video also includes an audio interview with gangster Goldy Brar, who is accused of orchestrating Moosewala's murder at Jawahar Ke village in Mansa district on May 29, 2022, and is alleged to be the mastermind behind it. The first episode of the documentary, titled 'The Killing Call', focuses on Moosewala's early life, rise to fame, and the controversies surrounding his career, while the second part covers his murder. The BBC World Service, in its YouTube video description, wrote: "On 29 May 2022, Punjabi singer Sidhu Moose Wala was murdered by hired hitmen who followed his car, shot him through the windscreen, and left him to die. As news of the killing spread across India and around the world.



CBI FILES CHARGESHEET AGAINST PUNJAB AGENTS, FRENCH EMBASSY OFFICIAL IN MULTI-CRORE VISA FRAUD CASE

Diary Times Desk : The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has filed a chargesheet against eight accused, including a local law officer at the French Embassy in New Delhi, his family members, visa agents and middlemen in the French Embassy visa fraud case. According to a senior officer, the agency has also secured India's first-ever Interpol Silver Notice to trace illicit assets held abroad in connection with the scam. The chargesheet, filed before a special CBI court in New Delhi, names the embassy official, his father, brother, and wife, along with two Punjab-based visa agents and two middlemen, all allegedly part of a wellorchestrated racket that defrauded visa applicants under the guise of arranging Schengen visas. According to the CBI, the fraud was carried out between January 2021 and May 2022, primarily targeting aspirants from Punjab seeking to travel to Europe. Applicants were allegedly lured through a network of agents and charged exorbitant sums-ranging from Rs 13 lakh to Rs 45 lakh per person-to obtain Schengen visas via the French Embassy.

SEVERE HEAT WAVE SWEEPS PUNJAB, MET ISSUES RED ALERT FOR JUNE 12-13

Diarv Times Desk : With weather in Punjab remaining dry and some places experiencing a severe heat wave, the Met department has issued a 'red alert' for the state for June 12 and 13 and has advised the public to take due caution against heat-induced illness. Heat wave to severe heat wave conditions are likely to continue over north-west India, including the western Himalayan region, till June 13 and reduce thereafter, according to a bulletin issued by the India Meteorological Department (IMD) on June 11. Light to moderate rainfall at some places, accompanied by thunderstorm, lightning and gusty winds with speed reaching 40-50 kmph, are likely over Himachal Pradesh during June 12-17 and over parts of Punjab and Haryana during June 13-17. Over the past 24 hours, day temperatures were markedly above normal by up to 6.5 degrees Celsius in Pathankot, Gurdaspur, Hoshiarpur, Amritsar, Tarn Taran, Kapurthala, Jalandhar, Ludhiana, Nawanshahar, Fatehgarh Sahib and Patiala districts. These were above normal by up to 4.4 degrees Celsius in all the southern districts of the state, including Fazilka, Muktsar, Faridkot, Ferozepur, Moga, Bhattinda, Barnala, Mansa, Rupnagar, SAS Nagar and some parts of Sangrur districts.

SIDHU MOOSEWALA'S FATHER MOVES COURT AGAINST RELEASE OF DOCUMENTARY

Diary Times Desk : Seeking a stay on the screening of a documentary about his son, slain singer Sidhu Moosewala's father Balkaur Singh filed a petition in a Mansa court on Tuesday. The court of Civil Judge (Senior Division) has adjourned the matter for June 12 for consideration. The documentary is to be screened by a foreign public broadcaster at Juhu in Mumbai on June 11, on the birth anniversary of Sidhu Moosewala. Talking to The Tribune, Advocate Satinder Pal Singh Mittal, counsel for Balkaur Singh, said, "The matter is now sub judice, thus we are hopeful that the broadcaster will not screen the documentary. The court has adjourned the matter for June 12 for consideration." Balkaur has already sent a legal notice to the broadcaster and lodged complaints with the Maharashtra Police, along with a follow-up reminder to restrain and halt the screening of the documentary. He has alleged that the documentary, titled "Investigative Documentary on Sidhu Moosewala", contains unauthorised, sensitive and unpublished material, including personal testimonies and commentary on an ongoing criminal case. He has argued that the screening may incite public unrest, interfere with the investigation into Moosewala's murder, and violate the family's legal rights, , including privacy and posthumous dignity.

ED ARRESTS EX-HARYANA MLA RAMNIWAS, ASSOCIATE IN MONEY-LAUNDERING CASE

Diary Times Desk : The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Wednesday said it has arrested an ex-MLA from Haryana Ramniwas and a former Harvana Shahari Vikas Pradhikaran (HSVP) official under the anti-money laundering law in a case linked to alleged misappropriation of funds in the state government body. Ramniwas and Sunil Kumar Bansal were taken into custody on June 9 in Chandigarh. The ED said in a statement that Niwas was an MLA during 2019-2024. He was also a former official of the HSVP (formerly known as the Haryana Urban Development Authority) like Bansal. Officials said Ramniwas represented the Narwana Assembly seat after he won elections on a Jannayak Janta Party (JJP) ticket. The moneylaundering case stems from an FIR registered by Haryana Police at Sector 7 police station in Panchkula against unknown persons. The case was registered on the basis of a complaint filed by the drawing and disbursing officer (DDO) of HSVP where it was alleged that "fraud and financial loss" was committed through a bank account of HSVP maintained with the Punjab National Bank in Chandigarh.

HARYANA CM ANNOUNCES AMNESTY SCHEME TO REGULARISE CANCELLED PLOTS

Diarv Times Desk : Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini, while chairing the 128th meeting of the Haryana Shahari Vikas Pradhikaran (HSVP), announced an Amnesty Scheme aimed at providing relief to thousands of residential plot allottees. The scheme will allow regularisation of cancelled plots sold via e-auction from July 6, 2020, "Allottees who onwards had deposited at least 15% of the required 25% of the total plot cost but failed to pay the remaining amount on time can now reclaim their plots by paying the balance with 18% annual interest," said the CM. The dues must be cleared within 60 days from the date of notification. Saini also unveiled three diaital initiatives: the e-Housing Portal, an Online Ex-Gratia Policy Application Portal and a system to link the water billing database with the PPM system. Another key decision was the creation of a new post - Estate Officer II - in Faridabad. "Faridabad Urban Estate manages 62,606 properties, the highest in the state. In contrast, both Gurugram offices together handle only 55.735." officials noted. The Amnesty Scheme excludes group housing societies.

As per the policy of the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI), no toll tax can be imposed on people residing within 5-km radius of a toll plaza. However, the Himachal Government was levying a tax on Nanaal residents, he said.

DELAY IN POWER LINE SHIFTING STALLS BADDI-NALAGARH HIGHWAY FOUR-LANING

Diary Times Desk : The delay in shifting high-tension electricity and other electrical lines infrastructure from the Pinjore-Baddi-Nalaaarh National Highway-105 has inordinately hampered the four-laning project, which was already running behind schedule. Construction of two bridges, one near the Annapurna eatery and the other at Marrawala in Haryana, has been stalled due to the pending relocation of high-tension these lines. Additionally, staff from the Pradesh Himachal State Electricity Board Limited (HPSEBL) is facing challenges in undertaking the augmentation or enhancement of its infrastructure as the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI), which is overseeing the project, has been unable to expedite the contractor's work, an official said. "The onus of shifting the two power lines lies with the Haryana Government and the HP Power Corporation Limited.

HIMACHAL NEWS: LITCHI RIPENED BEFORE TIME IN HIMACHAL... ITS SIZE ALSO DECREASED; CHANGING WEATHER IS AFFECTING THE CROPS

But if the farmers are to be believed, the litchi used to be ready by the end of June, which has already ripened this time. Not only this, this time the size of the litchi has also decreased due to the changing weather. The size of the litchi has not been able to prepare properly. Litchi crop is grown on about 3416 hectares of land in Kangra district. An average of 4875 metric tonnes is produced every year in Kangra district alone. Let us tell you that the rhododendron flower, which often blooms in the mountains from February to March, bloomed in January this time. People consider the change in the weather cycle as the reason for this. The effect of climate change is now slowly affecting everything.

HIMACHAL GOT HEALTH GRANT OF RS 101.18 CRORE FROM THE CENTER, HEALTH MISSION GOT THIS BUDGET

Diary Times Desk : The Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has released a budget of Rs 101.18 crore to Himachal Pradesh for the financial year 2025-26. This financial assistance has been released as the first installment of the current financial year. This amount will be used as a flexible fund for the National Health Program and Urban Health Mission under the National Health Mission. It will be spent on reproductive and child health and strengthening the health system. In this regard, Malay Kumar Haldar, Under Secretary, Ministry of Health, has sent the relevant letter to the Secretary Finance and Health to approve this amount. The approval order issued by the Finance Department on May 22 states that these funds will be used for the set purposes and the financial management systems of NHM will be followed. Himachal Pradesh and the Union Territory will have to ensure that its 40 percent / 10 percent share is deposited in the respective accounts based on the amount released by the Government of India. The approval also emphasised that no change can be made in the allocation or reappropriation between various components and activities without the explicit approval of the State and Union Territory Ministry of Health and Family Welfare. A budget of Rs 101.18 crore has been released to Himachal Pradesh.

CENTRE SETS RS 3-L CR DEFENCE EXPORTS TARGET FOR 2029: SANJAY SETH

Diary Times Desk : Union Minister of State for Defence Sanjay Seth said the Union Government has set the target to export Rs 50,000 crore of defence materials this year and aims to take the total defence exports to Rs 3 lakh crore by 2029. While addressing a press conference here today, Seth said, "Our defence budget for the current fiscal is Rs 6.81 lakh crore. It was Rs 2.53 lakh crore in 2013-14. Earlier, India was known as an importing nation, we didn't even make bulletproof jackets or proper boots, but now, our forces have become fully self-reliant. We have become an exporting nation." He said that last year, India had exported defence equipment worth Rs 23,500 crore and was now supplying arms and ammunition to around 92 countries. Highlighting the NDA government's achievements over the past 11 years, he said that today, the whole world looked at India with respect. "The world's perception of India has changed. This is a new India, one that doesn't fear anyone, doesn't bow down, nor looks away, nor begs before anyone." He said that when the Covid pandemic hit the world and countries began developing vaccines, India developed not just one but two vaccines. Despite being mocked by the Opposition.

SOURAV GANGULY SLAMS BCCI'S TEAM SELECTION FOR ENGLAND TESTS: "NOT THE PLAYER WHO..."

Diary Times Desk : Former Indian cricket team captain Sourav Ganguly was not in favour of excluding Shreyas lyer for the upcoming Test series against England. Shreyas has been enjoying a brilliant run of form in the past year and he emerged as the topscorer for Puniab Kinas in the Indian Premier League (IPL) 2025. In the absence of Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma, Shreyas was suggested as a top contender for the middle-order but he did not find a spot in the final squad. Ganguly believes that Shreyas should have been picked based on his current form and he is not "the player who got left out". "He has been playing at his best in the last one year, and should have been in this team. Last one year has been fantastic for him. He isn't the player who got left out. He is now scoring under pressure, taking responsibility, playing the short ball well. Although Test cricket's different, I would have had him in this series to see what he can do," Ganguly told RevSportz. Meanwhile, teenage fast bowler Eddie Jack has been "invited to practise" with England's senior team ahead of the first Test against India after producing impressive efforts for the Lions against India A in the two four-day games, according to a report.

BRAZIL, ECUADOR QUALIFY FOR FIFA WORLD CUP 2026

Diary Times Desk : Vini Jr scored the winning goal as Brazil beat Paraguay 1-0 at the Neo Quimica Arena to secure FIFA World Cup 2026 qualification. Vinicius Jr clinched Carlo Ancelotti his first win in their hot seat after fine work from Matheus Cunha. Paraguay came into the game in the second half and, despite defeat, are an inch away from qualification, boasting a six-point advantage over Venezuela. The victory was a special gift for Ancelotti, who turned 66 on Tuesday and was honoured by the Brazilian fans, before the start of the game, with an immense mosaic on the Neo Química seats, where it read in green and yellow "Congratulations, Carletto". Ancelotti's first victory in charge of the Brazilian national team broke Paraguay's nine-game unbeaten run in the auglifiers. Brazil became the first team to beat Paraguay in 10 gualifiers. The Selecao have now lost just one of their last 70 World Cup qualifiers at home. This was the third time that Brazil secured a spot in a World Cup while playing at the Neo Química Arena. In 2017, they beat Paraguay and sealed their place in the World Cup in Russia, which was held in 2018. Then, in 2021, they beat Colombia and secured a spot in the World Cup in Oatar in 2022. Meanwhile, Ecuador qualified for their fifth World Cup this century after a goalless draw with Peru.

SAMMY ON POORAN'S INTERNATIONAL RETIREMENT: 'MORE PLAYERS WILL FOLLOW'

Diary Times Desk : West Indies coach Daren Sammy believes Nicholas Pooran's shock retirement from international cricket underlines his challenge to "keep our players motivated to play for the crest", even as he predicts that more players will follow Pooran's lead. Pooran announced his decision to quit the international game on Monday, at the age of just 29. He never played a Test, and his last ODI was two years ago. But Pooran is West Indies' all-time leading runscorer in T20Is, and the timing of his retirement eight months before a T20 World Cup - came as a surprise to many, not least because he is already a top earner in the franchise circuit. But Sammy, who captained West Indies to the 2012 and 2016 T20 World Cups in his playing days, said he had already started planning for life after Pooran before he had announced his decision. "My instincts told me something like that would happen," Sammy said on Tuesday night, after West Indies' sixth consecutive defeat on their white-ball tour to England. "Nicholas sent me a text message, and so did I have a conversation with his agent as well... When we first spoke about the UK tour and the conversation I had with him, I did ask him, 'Are you unavailable for the UK tour only, or indefinite?'

YOGRAJ SINGH TOLD VINOD KAMBLI TO STOP 'DRINKING, SMOKING'. EX-STAR'S REPLY: "AAPKA TIME GAYA"

Diary Times Desk : Former India opening batter Vinod Kambli was one of the most-talked about cricketers when he arrived at the international stage in 1991. Despite playing 104 ODIs and 17 Tests for India after making his debut, Kambli disappeared from the scene after failing to maintain his form. It was his own fault rather than anyone else's. Reason? He became an alcoholic, by his own admission, and was also said to be partying till late at night. Now, Yograj Singh, father of former India all-rounder Yuvraj Singh, has revealed he had asked Kambli to focus on his career, but the latter refused to take his advice. "I told Vinod Kambli once, 'These parties, smoking cigarettes, going to girls - stop it; otherwise you'll be finished, and you'll be crying. See what happened to him. I was talking to him personally but then he said, 'Sir, apka time chala gaya (your time has passed). He used to think, 'I'm the king'. You are not bigger than the game," Yograj told InsideSport. Kambli last came into the limelight again due to his poor health conditions and financial struggles. The 52-year-old has been dealing with several ailments. On December 21, 2024, he was admitted to Akruti Hospital in Thane for urinary infection and cramps. Amid his deteriorating health condition, Kambli is also battling a serious financial crisis.



HOPE RETURNS FOR AUSTRALIA TESTS; ROACH DROPPED

Diary Times Desk : West Indies have made sweeping changes to their Test squad for the upcoming home Tests against Australia, which signals the start of their 2025-27 Test Championship Cycle. Roston Chase, who last played a Test match in March 2023 and was named the Test skipper recently, leads a freshlooking squad which sees limitedovers skipper Shai Hope recalled. Veteran pacer Kemar Roach has been left out while Hope's deputy in ODIs - Brandon King - has earned a maiden call-up. West Indies have bolstered their top-order by bringing back John Campbell and picking the 24-year-old Kevlon Anderson for the first time following his recent successes in the domestic setup. Anderson scored 573 runs in 11 innings in the West Indies Championship 2024/25, including three centuries, and finished third on the list of run-getters. GAUTAM GAMBHIR, BCCI SENT BIG 'JASPRIT BUMRAH' WARNING FOR ENGLAND TESTS: "UNDER BOWL..."

Diary Times Desk : There has been a lot of chatter around Jasprit Bumrah ahead of India's five-match Test series against England. With India missing the likes of Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma, Bumrah is one of the senior members of the side but chief selector Ajit Agarkar made it clear that he is unlikely to play all the five matches in the series. Following the back injury during the series against Australia, Bumrah's workload management has become a huge topic but Ashish Kaushik, the former head physiotherapist of National Cricket Academy, had a slightly different advice for BCCI and the team management. "Strengthening a bowler enough to take the load of bowling is crucial. They will need to train and strengthen up, spend enough time on the ground and run enough in the form of conditioning programs and ensure the bodies can return in second and third spells and deliver in the same manner." "There is an acute to chronic workload ratio for every player. Research suggests that a certain amount of workload must be maintained to reduce the risk of injuries and going above or below that workload could pose a risk." "As much as you can be over bowled.
