PM NARENDRA MODI PM NARENDRA MODI BEGINS 3-NATION VISIT TO CYPRUS, CANADA, CROATIA

Diary Times Desk : Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on Sunday his three-nation tour of Cyprus, Canada and Croatia will help expand ties in trade, investment and security and galvanise global understanding on tackling all forms of terrorism.

The visit is being closely followed as Modi is set to hold his first meeting with Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney on the margins of the G7 Summit during the second leg of the tour. The meeting has been described by the Indian side as an opportunity to reset relations with Canada after a long-running diplomatic row over the killing of a Khalistani separatist in 2023.

Modi arrived in Cyprus late on Sunday afternoon, becoming the first Indian premier to visit the Mediterranean country in 23 years. The decision to travel to Cyprus on the way to Canada was influenced by Turkey's support for Pakistan during last month's clashes with India. Turkey recognises Northern Cyprus, comprising territories seized by Turkish forces in 1974, while India has maintained close ties with the Republic of Cyprus. In a statement issued ahead of his departure from New Delhi, Modi described Cyprus as a close friend and important partner in the Mediterranean region and the European Union (EU). He said: "The visit provides an opportunity to build upon the historical bonds and expand our ties in the areas of trade, investment, security, technology and promote people-to-people exchanges."



PUNE BRIDGE 4 DEAD AFTER OLD BRIDGE COLLAPSES IN PUNE COLLAPSES AMID HEAVY RAIN, SEVERAL STILL MISSING



Diary Times Desk : Four people were killed and 32 others were injured after an old bridge collapsed in Pune amid heavy rain on Sunday afternoon, Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis said. The bridge collapsed and fell into the Indrayani river and swept away at least 15 to 20 people with the speeding stream.

Fadnavis has also announced financial aid of Rs 5 Lakh to the families of those who lost their lives in the incident. The incident occurred when several people had gathered on the bridge, which had been in a dilapidated state, to witness the swelling river. Among the injured, six of them were critical, according to Fadnavis. The bridge was closed to vehicular traffic. Five to six people have been rescued from the river.

According to initial reports, the strong water current led to the collapse of the bridge. Rescue and search operations have been launched on a war footing, with teams from the local police and district administration actively engaging in relief efforts. As many as 15 ambulances are presently being rushed to the spot.

"According to preliminary information, two people have died in this incident. I pay my heartfelt tribute to them. We share the grief of their families," Fadnavis wrote on X. At least 32 people were injured, six of them are critical. They have been admitted to the hospital for treatment," he said. "I have spoken to the Divisional Commissioner, Tehsildar and the Police Commissioner. Some people have been injured and taken to hospital. Some people are also trapped. The NDRF team is reaching there. It is possible that some people have been swept away," he added.





PASSENGERS FUME AS AIR INDIA EXPRESS PLANE FLIES FROM **GUWAHATI TO KOLKATA LATE BY 18 HOURS**

Diary Times Desk : Passengers on an Air India Express flight from Guwahati to Kolkata faced a harrowing ordeal after being de-boarded twice due to a "technical glitch" in the aircraft before being flown to their destination on Sunday afternoon - more than 18 hours after the scheduled departure, officials said. The incident involved 170 passengers aboard Air India Express flight IX-1226, which was scheduled to depart from Lokpriya Gopinath Bordoloi International Airport at 9.20 pm on Saturday. The flight was delayed till after midnight because of a "technical glitch" and passengers remained seated inside all the while, an aggrieved traveller said in a video that has gone viral on social media. Several such videos of the delayed flight are being circulated on social media alleging no clear information for the flight's delay. PTI, however, independently could not confirm the authenticity of the videos. "Around 1.30 am, we were asked to de-board and taken to the lounge. From there, we were taken to a cheap hotel for overnight stay. It did not provide us breakfast," he alleged.

Diary Times Desk : Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar on Sunday said the iron bridge over the Indrayani river was rusted and prima facie it gave way as several people were standing on the structure, killing two individuals. Pune district collector Jitendra Dudi said 38 people had been rescued so far, and 30 of them hospitalised, while six others sustained serious injuries. The collector said the exact number of people present on the bridge when it collapsed and was swept away is being assessed. "We are also assessing how many people are missing," he added. The incident occurred in the Kundamala area of Maval tehsil frequented by picnickers, officials said. They said the area had been receiving heavy rains over the past few days, sending the river into a spate. Pawar said, "We have received various versions of the incident. As per the preliminary information, the bridge was old and rusted. Many people were standing on the bridge when it collapsed."

HELICOPTER CRASHES NEAR KEDARNATH SHRINE IN **UTTARAKHAND, ALL 7 ON BOARD KILLED**

Diary Times Desk : A helicopter crashed near the Kedarnath shrine in Uttarakhand amid poor visibility early Sunday, killing all seven on board. Rudraprayag District Disaster Management Officer Nandan Singh Rajwar said the accident took place above the forests of Gaurikund. Five pilgrims, the pilot and an employee of the Badrinath-Kedarnath temple committee was among those killed. The helicopter took off from Kedarnath for Guptkashi around 5:30 am and crashed soon after. The crash site is located nearly 5 km above Gaurikund known as Gauri Mai Khark. Sources said the chopper belonging to Aryan Aviation Pvt Ltd crashed between Gaurikund and Trijuginarayan in Kedarghati and caught fire. Rajwar said zero visibility caused by bad weather apparently led to the crash and added that rescue and relief teams have been dispatched to the spot. District Tourism Development Officer and Nodal officer for Heli Service Rahul Chaubey said information about the helicopter going missing was received early this morning and a search was launched immediately. The deceased hailed from Maharashtra, Gujarat, Uttarakhand and Uttar Pradesh. Those on board the helicopter included Shraddha Rajkumar Jaiswal (35) from Maharashtra, Kashi (2) from Maharashtra, Rajkumar Suresh Jaiswal (41).



3 KILLED AS BUILDING COLLAPSES IN CONGESTED KACHCHI SADAK AREA IN MATHURA

Diary Times Desk : Three people, including two minor sisters, were killed when a multi-storey building collapsed on Sunday in the congested Kachchi Sadak area here, officials said. One person was pulled out from the debris, they said. District Magistrate Chandra Prakash Singh said the building was located on a mound. Rescue operations are under way to ascertain that no one else is buried under the rubble. He said Totaram (38) and two sisters -- Yashoda (6) and Kavva (3) -- were killed in the incident. SSP Shlok Kumar said one person was earlier rescued from the rubble and taken to hospital. He is currently under observation and is stable. "Rescue operations are under way. Teams from the fire services, municipal corporation, civil defence and police are currently on the site. Additionally, National Disaster Response Force and State Disaster Response Force teams have been called in to assist with the rescue efforts," said the SSP.

LANDSLIDE ON NH-169, WATERLOGGING IN MANGALURU AS HEAVY RAINS LASH COASTAL KARNATAKA

Diary Times Desk : Heavy rains across Karnataka disrupted daily life on Sunday, with a landslide near Kettikallu in Belthangady taluk affecting vehicular movement along the busy National Highway-169. The downpour triggered widespread waterlogging and caused damage to infrastructure in several parts of the state, particularly coastal Karnataka. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) recorded intense rainfall in Dakshina Kannada, with Mangaluru receiving 170 mm and the Panambur observatory reporting 210 mm of rain in 24 hours. Neighbouring Udupi district received about 50 mm. An orange alert was issued for Dakshina Kannada, Udupi, Shivamogga, Chikkamagaluru, and Kodagu, warning of thunderstorms and lightning. In Mangaluru city, several low-lying areas such as Pumpwell, Kaikamba, Kankanady, and Bikarnakatte were severely affected by flooding. Residents reported rainwater entering homes, shops, and roadways due to poor drainage systems. The flooding in Pumpwell – a major traffic junction - led to slow-moving traffic, with buses from Bengaluru forced to reroute via Nanthur Circle after a diversion at Padil

AIR INDIA CRASH: 47 VICTIMS IDENTIFIED VIA DNA; 24 BODIES HANDED OVER

Diary Times Desk: Three days after an Air India flight bound for London crashed in Ahmedabad, authorities have identified 47 victims through DNA testing. Of these, 24 bodies have been handed over to their families, according to an official statement issued on Sunday. "We have established contact with the next of kin/relatives of all passengers and crew members, expressing our condolences and helping them with the next steps. Over 400 family members have reached Ahmedabad and are being assisted by our teams on the ground," Air India said in a statement on social media site X. "Every affected family in Ahmedabad has been assigned at least one caregiver by Air India. Air India is working closely with other Tata Group companies to provide every possible assistance to the families and loved ones of those deceased, which remains our number one priority," the airline added. Authorities are conducting DNA tests to confirm the identities of the deceased, as several bodies were either burned or damaged. "A total of 47 plane crash victims have been identified so far through DNA matching. Of these, bodies of 24 victims have been handed over.

VIJAY RUPANI'S LAST RITES WITH FULL STATE HONOURS, STATE MOURNING FOR A DAY



Diary Times Desk : The state funeral of former Gujarat chief minister Vijay Rupani, who was killed in the Air India Boeing 787-8 Dreamliner crash in Ahmedabad, will be held on Monday with full state honours. A one-day state mourning in memory of the BJP leader will be observed. Three days after the plane crash, the body of the former chief minister was identified after DNA testing. A large team of forensic experts have been working to identify bodies of those killed in one of the worst aviation disasters in India by matching DNA with samples collected from their relatives. DNA-matching is a complex medical and legal process and involves layers of verification. It's only after an elaborate set of tests and confirmation of DNA samples, families are called up and asked to collect the bodies of their loved ones. In some cases, the analysis is repeated due to insufficient DNA material. The identification process can take up to 72 hours. The confirmation of Vijay Rupani's identification was announced by Gujarat Home Minister Harsh Sanghavi on Sunday morning.

INDIA ISSUES FRESH ADVISORY FOR NATIONALS IN ISRAEL AMID IRANIAN STRIKES

Diary Times Desk : India on Sunday issued a fresh advisory for nationals in Israel as tensions in the Middle East continued to rise. The Indian Embassy in Tel Aviv asked all Indians to stay vigilant and avoid any unnecessary movement while adhering to the safety protocols issued by the Israeli authorities. "The Embassy of India in Tel Aviv is in touch with members of the Indian community in Israel, including caregivers, workers, students, businessmen and tourist groups. All necessary measures are being taken to ensure their safety and well-being," said the Embassy's statement. It added that India is monitoring the situation closely and is in regular touch with the Israeli authorities. JAIPUR-BASED PILOT, FATHER OF 4-MONTH-OLD TWIN, KILLED IN KEDARNATH CHOPPER CRASH

Diary Times Desk : A 37-year-old Jaipur-based pilot, who was killed in the chopper crash near Gaurikund on Saturday, had joined back work 20 days ago after visiting his family and fourmonth-old twin kids. Lieutenant Colonel (retired) Rajveer Singh Chauhan was planning to throw the traditional Rajasthani ceremony for his newborns on June 30, Lt Col (ret) Rajveer's father Govind Chauhan said. "He had become a father after 14 years of marriage. We have been planning for a jalwa pujan (a Rajasthani ceremony for newborns) for Rajveer's four-month-old twin kids. But, everything is over now," he added. At least seven people, including Lt Col (ret) Rajveer, were killed after the chopper flying from Kedarnath to Guptkashi crashed in Rudraprayag district on Saturday morning. Lt Col (ret) Rajveer, a former captain in the Indian Air Force (IAF), had retired a year ago from his 14-year-long service and joined a private chopper service provider company in Dehradun last October. Govind said he received a call from Rajveer's colleague.

PM MODI SENT A MESSAGE THAT INDIA'S BLOOD IS NOT MEANT TO BE SHED: AMIT SHAH

Diary Times Desk : Prime Minister Narendra Modi sent a message to the whole country that India's blood is not meant to be shed and whoever dares to do this will be punished, union home minister Amit Shah said on Sunday. Addressing a public gathering in Lucknow, Shah said that India has "retaliated with surgical strike, air strike and razed terrorist headquarters" to the ground whenever Pakistan tried to attack the country during PM Modi's government in the past 11 years. Shah, who was in Uttar Pradesh's capital to hand over appointment letters to 60,244 newly recruited police constables, said Operation Sindoor, launched on May 7, had led to the death of over 100 terrorists linked to groups such as Jaish-e-Mohammed, Lashkar-e-Taiba, and Hizbul Mujahideen. In an operation named 'Sindoor', Indian armed forces conducted strikes on terrorist infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK), two weeks after the April 22.

PUNE BRIDGE ORIGINALLY BUILT FOR FARMERS 30 YRS AGO COLLAPSED UNDER TOURIST LOAD; 4 DEAD: MLA

Diary Times Desk: The bridge over Indrayani River in Maharashtra's Pune district, which collapsed on Sunday afternoon, was built 30 years ago for the movement of farmers, NCP MLA Sunil Shelke has said. Shelke told the news agency ANI that the bridge was periodically repaired, and tourists were prohibited from entering it. This bridge was constructed for the movement of farmers 30 years ago. But due to the excessive load of tourists and two-wheelers, this bridge collapsed. 2 people have died," Shelke said, according to ANI. "Pimpri-Chinchwad and NDRF are fully supporting. We used to repair it time to time and had denied the entry of tourists... but they came here and the tragedy took place..." he added. While several people are feared to have been swept away in the currents, the police have confirmed the death of four people so far. The accident took place at around 3:30pm on Sunday when many visitors were present near the Kundamala area in Maval tehsil for the weekend. Two teams from the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) have been deployed and are carrying out search and rescue operations at the site.

PAKISTAN STANDS IN SOLIDARITY WITH **IRAN AMID CONFLICT WITH ISRAEL: PM** SHARIF TO IRANIAN PRESIDENT PEZESHKIAN

Diary Times Desk : Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif spoke with Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian, expressing Pakistan's unwavering solidarity with Iran after Israel's attacks, which he described as "blatant provocations". Israel launched attacks on Iranian nuclear and military facilities on Friday. The strikes killed several senior military commanders and nuclear scientists. Iran later launched retaliatory strikes. In the telephonic conversation with Pezeshkian on Saturday, Sharif strongly condemned Israeli attacks against Iran that he said violated its sovereignty and territorial integrity, and were in complete defiance of the UN Charter and international law. "Spoke with President Dr Masoud Pezeshkian of Iran today to express Pakistan's unwavering solidarity with the brotherly people of Iran in the face of Israel's unprovoked aggression," SHrif posted on X. The Prime Minister said that Iran has the right to self-defence, as provided under Article 51 of the UN Charter.

SAUDI ARABIA EXECUTES JOURNALIST AFTER 7 YEARS ON TERRORISM. **TREASON CHARGES**

Diary Times Desk : A prominent Saudi journalist, who was arrested in 2018 and convicted on terrorism and treason charaes, has been executed, the kingdom said. Activist groups maintain that the charges against him were trumped up. Turki Al-Jasser was put to death on Saturday, according to the official Saudi Press Agency, after the death penalty was upheld by the nation's top court. Authorities had raided Al-Jasser's home in 2018, arresting him and seizing his computer and mobile phones. It was not clear where his trial took place or how long it lasted. According to the New York-based Committee to Protect Journalists, Saudi authorities maintained that Al-Jasser was behind a social media account on X that levied corruption allegations against Saudi royals. Al-Jasser was also said to have posted several controversial tweets about militants and militant groups. CPJ's programme director Carlos Martínez de la Serna condemned the execution and said the lack of accountability in the wake of the killing of Washington Post columnist Jamal Khashoggi at the Saudi Consulate in Istanbul.

'I DO A LOT, NEVER GET CREDIT': TRUMP SAYS **IRAN-ISRAEL PEACE SOON, ASKS THEM TO** MAKE DEAL



Diary Times Desk: US President Donald Trump on Sunday said Iran and Israel "should make a deal" and added that his intervention has led to peace between several countries in conflict, but he "never got credit". Donald Trump, in a post on Truth Social, also repeated his claim of trade being used for India and Pakistan's ceasefire understanding last month. India has rejected Donald Trump's claims of trade being a key part of reaching the ceasefire understanding with Pakistan, saying it was reached following direct talks between the Directors General of Military Operations (DGMOs) of the two militaries. Citing 'peace' between countries like Serbia and Kosovo, Egypt and Ethiopia over issues they once had, Donald Trump on Sunday, in a post on Truth Social, said he does "a lot" and "never" gets "credit" for anythina.

ISRAEL TARGETS IRAN'S DEFENCE MINISTRY HEADQUARTERS AS TEHRAN UNLEASHES DEADLY MISSILE STRIKE

Diary Times Desk : Israel launched an expanded assault on Iran on Sunday, targeting its energy industry and Defence Ministry headquarters, while Tehran unleashed a fresh barrage of deadly strikes. The simultaneous attacks represented the latest burst of violence since a surprise offensive by Israel two days earlier aimed at decimating Tehran's rapidly advancing nuclear programme. New explosions boomed across Tehran as Iranian missiles entered Israel's skies in attacks that Israeli emergency officials said caused deaths around the country, including four in an apartment building in the Galilee region. A strike in central Israel killed an 80-year-old woman, a 69-year-old woman and a 10-year-old boy, officials said. Casualty figures weren't immediately available in Iran, where Israel targeted its Defence Ministry headquarters in Tehran as well as sites that it allead were associated with the country's nuclear programme. Iran's paramilitary Revolutionary Guard claimed that Iranian missiles targeted fuel production facilities for Israeli fighter jets, something not acknowledged by Israel.

ISRAEL, IRAN BOMBARD EACH OTHER; TRUMP SAYS HE CAN 'EASILY' END CONFLICT

Diary Times Desk : Israel and Iran launched fresh attacks on each other overnight into Sunday, killing scores and raising fears of a wider conflict, as US President Donald Trump said it could be ended easily while warning Tehran not to strike any US targets. Israeli rescue teams combed through rubble of residential buildings destroyed by Iranian missiles, using sniffer dogs and heavy excavators to look for survivors after at least 10 people, including children, were killed, raising the twoday toll to 13. Sirens rang out across Israel after 4 pm on Sunday in the first such daylight alert, and fresh explosions could be heard in Tel Aviv. In Iran, images from the capital showed the night sky lit up by a huge blaze at a fuel depot after Israel began strikes against Iran's oil and gas sector - raising the stakes for the global economy and the functioning of the Iranian state. Iran has not given a full death toll but said 78 people were killed on Friday and scores more have died since, including in a single attack that killed 60 on Saturday, half of them children, in a 14-storey apartment block flattened in Tehran.



MILLIONS PROTEST TRUMP'S POLICIES IN 'NO KINGS' **DEMONSTRATIONS ACROSS US**

Diary Times Desk : Masses of demonstrators packed into streets, parks and plazas across the US on Saturday to protest President Donald marching Trump. through downtowns and small towns, blaring anti-authoritarian chants mixed with support for protecting democracy and immiarant rights. Organisers of the "No Kings" demonstrations said millions had marched in hundreds of events. Governors across the US had urged calm and vowed no tolerance for violence, while some mobilised the National Guard ahead of marchers' gathering. Confrontations were isolated. But, police in Los Angeles, where protests over federal immigration enforcement raids erupted a week earlier and sparked demonstrations across the country, used tear gas and crowd-control munitions to clear out protesters after the formal event ended. Officers in Portland also fired tear gas and projectiles to disperse a crowd that protested in front of a US and Immigration Customs Enforcement building well into the evening. And in Salt Lake City, Utah, police were investigating a shooting during a march downtown that left one person critically injured. Three people were taken into custody, including a man believed to be the shooter, who also suffered a gunshot wound, according to Police Chief Brian Redd

GUNMEN KILL AT LEAST 100 PEOPLE IN NIGERIA'S BENUE STATE, AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL SAYS

Diary Times Desk : At least 100 people have been killed in an attack by gunmen on a village in Nigeria's central Benue state, Amnesty International Nigeria said on Saturday. The attack took place from late Friday into the early hours of Saturday in the village of Yelewata, the group said in a post on social media platform X. "Many people are still missing...dozens injured and left without adequate medical care. Many families were locked up and burnt inside their bedrooms," the post added. Benue is in Nigeria's Middle Belt, a region where the majority Muslim North meets the largely Christian South. The region faces competition over land use, with conflicts between herders, who seek grazing land for their cattle. and farmers, who need arable land for cultivation. These tensions are often worsened by overlapping ethnic and religious divisions. Last month, at least 42 people were shot dead by suspected herders in a series of weekend attacks across Gwer West district in Nigeria's central Benue state.

PUNJAB POLITICAL PARTIES OPPOSE 'ONE NATION, ONE ELECTION' PLAN

Diary Times Desk : Political parties in Puniab have opposed the "one nation, one election" scheme proposed by the BJP-led Union Government. Punjab Finance Minister Harpal Singh Cheema, on Saturday, described it as a direct assault on the fundamental structure and spirit of the Constitution. After attending a meeting convened by the Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) under the chairmanship of PP Choudhary, Cheema said he, along with AAP state president Aman Arora, rejected the move as it was a hidden agenda designed to destroy the federal structure of the nation. Referring to the amendments in the proposed Bill, Cheema said these would render the tenures of state assemblies subject to the discretion of the Centre. He said the Bill would further encourage the misuse of Articles 356 and 360 by the Centre. As per provisions, if the Election Commission is of the opinion that the elections to any Assembly cannot be conducted along with the General Election, it may make a recommendation to the President, to declare by an order, that the election to that Assembly may be conducted at a later date. Cheema said the BJP's "one nation, one election" concept would ultimately backfire as it would enable the Centre to conduct state elections at its convenience. Punjab Congress leaders put up a case against the idea of "one nation, one election" during a meeting with members of the committee set up by the government for the purpose.

TARGET KILLING PLOT BY CANADA-**BASED TERRORIST ARSH DALA FOILED IN PUNJAB; 2 ARRESTED**

Diary Times Desk : Punjab Police has foiled a target killing plot orchestrated by Canadabased terrorist Arsh Dala and arrested two key operatives of the module, officials said on Sunday. According to preliminary investigation, the arrested individuals were acting on the directions of Arsh Dala to eliminate rival gang members and extortion targets, DGP Gaurav Yadav posted on X. "In a major breakthrough, State Special Operations Cell (#SSOC), Punjab, foils a target killing plot orchestrated by Canadabased terrorist Arsh Dala and apprehends two key operatives - Kawaljit Singh, R/o Dharamkot, and Navdeep Singh @ Hani, R/o Badduwal," the DGP said in the post. He added that with this timely and intelligenceled operation, the SSOC has successfully busted a targeted killing module, averting a serious threat to public safety. Police also seized one Zigana .30 bore pistol (Turkish made) and nine live cartridges during the operation, the DGP said, "Further investigation is underway to trace both forward and backward linkages of the module." the DGP hing

DRIZZLES, CLOUDY WEATHER **PROVIDE RELIEF FROM HEAT IN PARTS OF PUNJAB, HARYANA**

Diary Times Desk : Cloudy weather conditions prevailed in some parts of Punjab and Haryana on Sunday, providing slight relief from the scorching heat. The maximum temperature, which had been hovering in the range of 41-45 degrees at most places in the last several days, registered a slight drop though it settled close to the normal limits. PUNJAB INFLUENCER MURDER: AMRITPAL MEHRON FLED TO UAE WITHIN HOURS OF **KILLING, SAY POLICE**

Diary Times Desk : Amritpal Singh Mehron, the alleged mastermind behind the murder of social media influencer Kanchan Kumari, also known as Kamal Kaur Bhabhi, fled to the UAE just hours after the incident, takina a flight from Amritsar airport, Bathinda SSP Amneet Kondal said on Sunday. Police had issued a lookout circular for Amritpal on Saturday, anticipating that he might attempt to leave the country. "When we obtained Amritpal's passport details and checked his travel records, we found that he had fled to the UAE after killing Kanchan. We are now following the procedure for his deportation and have informed the authorities there that he is wanted in a murder case here." said SSP Kondal. The police further stated that two more of Amritpal's associates – Ranjit Singh of Sohal village in Tarn Taran district and an unidentified person - have been named in the FIR. "They helped Amritpal flee in a car after committing the crime. Efforts are underway to nab them as well. We obtained this information during the questioning of Amritpal's two associates, Nimaratjeet Singh and Jaspreet Singh, whose two-day remand ends today. We will seek further police custody to interrogate them," said the SSP. She further revealed that during the investigation, it emerged that Amritpal had planned.

HARYANA CM NAYAB SAINI'S LUDHIANA VISIT AHEAD OF BYPOLL SPARKS OUTRAGE

Diary Times Desk : Haryana Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini was met with strong public opposition during his visit to Ludhiana to campaian for BJP candidate Jiwan Gupta ahead of the Ludhiana West byelection. Residents, frustrated over Haryana's historical exploitation of Punjab's water resources, confronted the CM's convoy, waving black flags and raising slogans of "Punjab de Paania de Chor Murdabad." The protests, which drew hundreds of participants, underscored the rising anger among Punjabis over the decades-long issue of water-sharing between the two states. Protesters accused Haryana and the BJP government of trying to loot Punjab's water. They said the Harvana Government was unfairly using Punjab's share of water, leaving the state's agricultural sector struggling. This discontent stems from Haryana's alleged misuse of Punjab's rightful water allocation from the Bhakra Beas Management Board (BBMB). While previous governments remained silent on this issue, the Mann-led government has firmly stood its ground, ensuring that the state's share is not compromised.

POLICE SEEK VALUATION OF **PROPERTIES OF ACCUSED IN MBBS EXAM SCAM**

Diary Times Desk : The district police have approached local offices of the Revenue Department, Public Works (B&R) and vehicle registration authorities seeking valuation reports immovable properties of and vehicles owned by key accused in the MBBS examination scam that surfaced at Pt BD Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak, (UHSR) in January. Confirming the move, DSP Dalip Singh, who is heading the investigation, said it was essential to ascertain the number and value of properties owned by the accused. Sources revealed that more assets could be attached if found to have been acquired through funds exceeding the accused's legal sources of income. Meanwhile, fresh revelations have surfaced during the police interrogation of two university employees - a programmer and a clerk - who were arrested recently. According to sources, one of the main accused used to hand over a mobile phone to the two employees, which was then used to leak question papers from an exam centre set up on the university campus in May 2024. "The employees, who were deputed at the exam centre, would click photos of the question paper using the same phone and send them to the accused via WhatsApp.

The minister also informed that the statue had arrived in Shimla from Delhi and its installation work would commence soon.

NAGPUR GIRL FALLS OFF ZIPLINE IN MANALI AS HARNESS BELT BREAKS

Diary Times Desk : A disturbing video capturing a 12-year-old girl falling 30 feet from a zipline near Nehru Kund in Manali has gone viral, reigniting concerns over adventure tourism safety in Himachal Pradesh. The incident, which took place on June 8, remained under wraps until the footage surfaced online. According to the police, Trisha's father, Prafful Vijve, decided not to pursue legal action, saying he will personally ensure his daughter receives the necessary treatment. Eyewitnesses reported that the zipline cable snapped mid-course, causing the girl to fall. She sustained serious injuries and was initially treated at a hospital in Manali before being referred to Chandigarh. She has since been transferred to Nagpur, where she continues to receive treatment, and her condition is said to be stable. The incident has again raised concerns over the lax safety measures, adherence to proper safety protocols by operators and participation of minors in such high-risk activities. While the Tourism Department has promised a full investigation, there has been no official statement confirming whether the operator involved in the incident will face charges for criminal negligence.

WITH 71 LABS, HIMACHAL TO SET BENCHMARK IN SAFE DRINKING WATER, SANITATION

Diary Times Desk : The state government has set up 71 water testing laboratories and proposes to install sensor-based systems in 291 schemes across 10 districts to ensure safe drinking water for every household in Himachal Pradesh. The government plans to set up one state-level and 14 district-level NABL-accredited water testing laboratories. Additionally, drinking water treatment plants would be established in Jawalamukhi, Jaswan, Pragpur and Dehra of Kangra district during the next financial year at a cost of Rs 43 crore. Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu reiterated that during the last two-anda-half years, the state government has taken major initiatives to ensure clean and "These initiatives are reinforcing the commitment of state government towards ensuring health and well-being of the citizens," he said. The state government will start the 'Mukhya Mantri Swachh Jal Shodhan Yojana' with an initial budget of Rs 80 crore received in the first phase. This initiative would deploy advanced technologies like ozonation (waste water treatment), UV filtration, RO and nano-filtration to purify water for both domestic and commercial use," he said. Similarly, under the 'Rural Drinking Water Up-gradation Project', a provision has been made to provide uninterrupted water supply to as many 20,663 households in rural areas. Funded by the NDB, the total project cost amounts to Rs 745 crore with state share of Rs 148

RAIN BRINGS RELIEF FROM SCORCHING HEAT IN HIMACHAL

Diary Times Desk : People in Himachal Pradesh received relief from the scorching heat as several parts of the state experienced light rainfall on Sunday. According to the State's Meteorological Department, rainfall across the state is very likely to continue till June 21 with heavy spells of rain at isolated areas on June 20 and 21. The department has also issued a yellow weather warning for 10 districts with the exception of tribal districts of Kinnaur and Lahaul and Spiti till June 19, resulting in thunderstorms accompanied by lightning and gusty winds in isolated areas of these districts. Maximum temperatures are also expected to fall by 4°C to 5°C across the state over the next few days while maximum temperatures are very likely to witness a dip of 2°C to 3°C in the next few days, thus bringing the mercury down in the state. Meanwhile, weather was mostly dry across the state during the last 24 hours with maximum temperatures being in the range of 23°C to 42°C in the state. Shimla recorded 27°C maximum temperature while prominent tourist destinations such as Dharamshala, Manali, Dalhousie and Kasauli recorded 32°C, 26.7°C, 25°C and 28.7°C, respectively. Maximum temperature in Solan was 31.4°C, Mandi 35.8°C, Kangra 35.3°C, Nahan 33.8°C, Bilaspur 35.4°C, Hamirpur 36.2°C, Keylong 21.9°C, Kalpa 22.4°C, Kufri 22.6°C, Bhuntar 37.2°C, Sundernagar 35.1°C and Narkanda 20.9°C.

HEAVY RAINFALL PREDICTED ACROSS HIMACHAL ON JUNE 19, 20

Diary Times Desk : Himachal Pradesh is set to receive few spells of heavy rainfall on June 19 and 20. 

AXED INDIA STAR SENDS BIG MESSAGE TO GAUTAM GAMBHIR WITH CENTURY IN INTRA SQUAD MATCH

Diary Times Desk : Team India continued their preparation for the Test series opener against England, starting June 20, with day 2 of their behind-closed-doors intra-squad game at the Kent Cricket Ground in Beckenham on Saturday. Day 2 was even better for one of India's star batters Sarfaraz Khan; albeit he is not part of the official squad for the five-match series. According to a report by Cricbuzz, Sarfaraz scored a century on the second day of play. Sarfaraz isn't a part of the senior team on the tour, and he made sure to make his time in England count, having also scored a 92 for India A during one of the two unofficial Tests against England Lions. Meanwhile, the Indian Express reported that Sarfaraz was retired out for 101. The likes of Abhimanyu Easwaran (39), Sai Sudharsan (38), Ishan Kishan (43) and Washington (0 and 35) were amonast the runs on Day 2. Ruturaj Gaikwad, who is leading India A in the match, got out for a duck. On the first day of the match, KL Rahul and skipper Gill scored fifties while Shardul Thakur was among wickets. Earlier, India A had played two unofficial Tests against England Lions, both ending in a draw.

PAT CUMMINS' CLASSY RESPONSE PUTS SOUTH AFRICA DOUBTERS TO REST: 'THEY MADE WTC FINAL FAIR AND SQUARE'

Diary Times Desk : Temba Bavuma-led South Africa stunned the world by beating Australia to win the third edition of the World Test Championship (WTC) at the Lord's Cricket Ground on Saturday. The Proteas chased down 282 with five wickets in hand to win their second ICC Men's Senior title. South Africa had to wait 27 years for their second ICC title but it was definitely worth the wait. Aiden Markram and Temba Bavuma scored 136 and 66, respectively in the second innings to help South Africa chase down more than 280 runs in the fourth and final innings of the contest. After the defeat in the WTC final, Australia captain Pat Cummins spoke about South Africa's win in the Test Championship and the route they had to face in reaching the final. Ever since Proteas made the finals of the third edition of WTC, several cricket pundits questioned South Africa's path to the summit clash, saying the Rainbow Nation had an easier route as they didn't play bigger teams. Several naysayers also argued that South Africa just played a two-test series, and it was easier for them to clock points than Australia, England, and India, which played more five-match series.



IND VS ENG: RAVICHANDRAN ASHWIN PUSHES FOR KULDEEP YADAV TO START IN ENGLAND SERIES

Diary Times Desk : Former India spinner Ravichandran Ashwin has uraed the Indian team to consider playing left-arm spinner Kuldeep Yaday throughout the upcoming Test series against England, which begins on June 20. This suggestion comes as a surprise, given that Indian teams have traditionally avoided fielding more than one specialist spinner in English conditions Typically, the combination has leaned toward three to four fast bowlers supported by a lone spinner, due to pitches that tend to favor seam and swing. Ashwin, however, argued that India needs its best bowling attack to win matches - and in his view, Kuldeep is guaranteed starter. a "When batsmen come through, the best bowling attack will win you matches. If they don't leave moisture on the pitch, then I think Kuldeep Yadav would be a certainty. And if there is moisture on the pitch, then Kuldeep should still be there," Ashwin said in an interview with RevSportz. During India's previous tour of England in 2021, the team played only one spinner, Ravindra Jadeja, while Ashwin himself was left out despite his experience. This time, a more flexible team combination could be on the cards - with Jadeja likely to bat higher up the order and the presence of all-rounders like Nitish . Reddy or Shardul Thakur potentially freeing up a spot for Kuldeep.

KHAWAJA HAS ASHES BACKING, BUT LABUSCHAGNE'S SPOT UNCERTAIN

Diary Times Desk : Usman Khawaja has been backed to be part of the Ashes later this year but Marnus Labuschagne's spot is becoming increasingly uncertain with Sam Konstas firming for a Test recall in West Indies following Australia's World Test Championship (WTC) final defeat at Lord's. There is a chance that Steven Smith's finger injury could provide an opening for Labuschagne to cling onto his spot, after he earned a show of faith at Lord's partly because he had been ever-present in the WTC cycle, but the point has been reached where even that may not save him. The selectors will decide in the next 48 batting hours whether reinforcements need to be added to the squad once there is further clarity over Smith's prognosis, but regardless it's difficult to see a scenario where 19-year-old Konstas doesn't return at the top of the order. "It was a big discussion leading into this Test match and I was on the record a couple of weeks ago.
