

The police have now issued a notice to pro-Kannada groups, who had threatened to block the film over the actor's comment about the Kannada language.

The court also Kamal Haasan need make no apology for his remark – as demanded by protesters – and lamented the trend of art being stymied by people who claim hurt sentiments. "We cannot allow this to happen. Just because of an opinion, should a movie... a stand-up comedy should be stopped?" The actor, meanwhile, said was satisfied with the state's reply and wants to close the case. However, advocate A Velan, appearing for the original petitioner, opposed the closure request, arguing for guidelines and criminal proceedings against those who had issued the threats. The original petitioner, a Mahesh Reddy, approached the Supreme Court last week; this was after the Karnataka High Court refused to direct the state to ensure the release of 'Thug Life' is not blocked.



BYPOLLS ELECTION

POLLING ENDS IN BYPOLLS ACROSS 5 STATES WITH 69.85% TURNOUT IN WEST BENGA



Diary Times Desk: Polling in five assembly constituencies bypolls across Punjab, West Bengal, Gujarat, and Kerala ended peacefully on Thursday. Polling commenced at 7am and continued until 5pm and 6pm in some seats.

The bypolls in one seat each in Gujarat, West Bengal, and Punjab were necessitated by the deaths of sitting MLAs, while the elections in Kerala and another constituency in Gujarat were held due to the resignation of two legislators. Vote counting is scheduled for June 23.

West Bengal's Kaliganj seat: A voter turnout of 69.85 per cent was recorded till 5pm in the by-election to the Kaliganj Assembly constituency in West Bengal's Nadia district, data from the Election Commission showed. Officials said that polling was largely peaceful except for a few isolated incidents.

"Polling has been peaceful. There was no report of any incident from anywhere in and around the constituency. Till 5pm, the polling was 69.85 per cent," an election official told PTI.

The by-election in the seat was necessitated after the demise of TMC MLA Nasiruddin Ahamed in February. In the election, the ruling Trinamool Congress has fielded his daughter, Alifa Ahamed, a 38-year-old BTech graduate and corporate professional, as its candidate.

The BJP has nominated Ashis Ghosh, while Congress candidate Kabil Uddin Shaikh is contesting with the backing of the CPI(M).

Diary Times Desk: High court judge Yashwant Varma, and his family members had "covert or active control" over the store room where a huge cache of half-burnt cash was found, proving his misconduct, which is serious enough to seek his removal, a report of the inquiry panel probing the incident said. The three-judge panel headed by Chief Justice Sheel Nagu of the Punjab and Haryana High Court conducted the inquiry for 10 days, examined 55 witnesses and visited the scene of the accidental fire that started at around 11.35 pm on March 14 at the official residence Justice Varma, then a sitting judge of the Delhi High Court and now in the Allahabad High Court. Acting on the report, former Chief Justice of India Sanjiv Khanna wrote to President Droupadi Murmu and Prime Minister Narendra Modi recommending the judge's impeachment. "This committee thus holds that the cash/money was found in the store room of 30 Tughlak Crescent, New Delhi officially occupied by Justice Varma. More so, the access to the store room has been found to be within the covert or active control of Justice Varma.



DINESH K PATNAIK LIKELY TO BE INDIA'S NEXT HIGH COMMISSIONER TO CANADA

Diary Times Desk: Seasoned diplomat Dinesh K Patnaik is likely to be appointed as India's new high commissioner to Canada with both sides looking at rebuilding bilateral ties that came under severe strain following the killing of a Sikh separatist in 2023, people familiar with the matter said on Thursday. Patnaik, a 1990-batch Indian Foreign Service officer, is currently serving as India's ambassador to Spain. Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Canadian counterpart Mark Carney on Tuesday gareed to pursue "constructive" steps to restore stability in India-Canada ties including the early return of envoys to each other's capitals. Ties between India and Canada plummeted to an all-time low following a diplomatic spat over the killing of Khalistani separatist Hardeep Singh Nijjar. The people cited above said Patnaik is likely to be succeeded in Spain by Jayant Khobragade. Khobragade is currently serving as India's ambassador to the Association.

Diary Times Desk: India's aviation regulator has warned Air India for breaching safety rules after three of its Airbus planes flew despite being overdue checks on emergency equipment, and for being slow to address the issue, government documents show. The warning notices and an investigation report - both reviewed by Reuters - were not in any way related to last week's crash of an Air India Boeing 787-8 plane that killed all but one of the 242 people onboard, and were sent days before that incident. In the report, the Directorate General of Civil Aviation said spot checks in May on three Air India Airbus planes found that they were operated despite mandatory inspections being overdue on the "critical emergency equipment" of escape slides. In one case, the watchdog found that the inspection of an Airbus A320 jet was delayed by more than a month before being carried out on May 15. AirNav Radar data shows that during the delay.

INDIA TO BEGIN EVACUATING CITIZENS WISHING TO LEAVE ISRAEL

Diary Times Desk: India announced on Thursday that it will begin evacuating Indian nationals who want to leave Israel in view of the clashes with Iran, with arrangements being made for them to leave via land borders because of airspace restrictions. The evacuation of Indians from Israel will be done under Operation Sindhu, initially launched by the Indian government on Wednesday for getting Indian citizens in Iran to safety. "In view of the recent developments between Israel and Iran, the Government of India has decided to evacuate from Israel those Indian nationals who wish to leave," the external affairs ministry said in a statement. "Their travel from Israel to India will be facilitated through the land borders and thereafter by air to India," the statement added. This is being done in view of airspace restrictions over Israel since the clashes with Iran erupted over the past weekend. The Indian embassy in Tel Aviv will be responsible for arrangements for evacuating the Indians. All Indian nationals in Israel were requested.

"TRUMP WASN'T DIRECTLY INVOLVED": SHASHI THAROOR TO NDTV ON CEASEFIRE CLAIMS

Diary Times Desk: Donald Trump was not involved in ceasefire talks with Pakistan during Operation Sindoor, India's military response to the Pahalgam terror attack, Congress MP Shashi Tharoor told NDTV Thursday. "This is Trump expressing his understanding of something but, as far as we're concerned, he was not directly involved. US "DOOMSDAY PLANE" THAT CAN WITHSTAND NUCLEAR BLAST LANDS IN WASHINGTON AS TRUMP MULLS IRAN STRIKE

Diary Times Desk: As US President Donald Trump mulls striking Iran's nuclear facilities, one of America's "doomsday planes" made a flight to Joint Base Andrews in Washington on Tuesday night. According to the New York Post, the E-4B Nightwatch - a plane designed to protect the Secretary of Defence and other national security officials and keep the government operating in the time of nuclear war - was spotted by flight trackers. The aircraft departed from Bossier City, Louisiana, on Tuesday evening and landed in Maryland around 4 hours later, after a long, winding route. A "doomsday plane" is a highly specialised aircraft operated by the US Air Force and serves as a National Airborne Operations Centre (NAOC). The US has four E-4Bs that serve as an airborne command centre for the President, Secretary of Defence and the Chairs of the Joint Chiefs of Staff to ensure continued critical command, control and communication in case of emergencies.

Russia's state-owned nuclear energy company, Rosatom, issued a strong statement through its CEO, Alexey Likhachev, saying that if Israel targets Iran's sole active nuclear reactor at Bushehr, it could trigger a Chernobyl-like disaster. Russian state media RIA Novosti quoted Likhachev as urging Tel Aviv to refrain from attacking the only operational nuclear reactor in Iran. An Israeli strike on the Bushehr nuclear power plant - Iran's only functioning reactor - could result in a catastrophe comparable to Chernobyl, warned Likhachev on Thursday. The Rosatom chief called anv such attack "beyond evil" and revealed.

WHEN MOSSAD WALKED OUT OF TEHRAN WITH 500 KG OF NUCLEAR BLUEPRINTS



Diary Times Desk: In the early hours of June 13, Israel initiated what it called a "necessary preemptive action" against Iran. Over 100 air and drone strikes pounded key nuclear, military, and intelligence sites across the Islamic Republic. The target list read like a blueprint of Iran's national defence: nuclear enrichment plants, Revolutionary Guard Corps headquarters, missile stockpiles, and covert sites. At least 224 Iranians were confirmed dead. Several Iranian nuclear and missile facilities were reduced to rubble. The covert component, reportedly orchestrated by Mossad, involved high-precision drone strikes deep inside Iran's territory. Israel claimed it had no choice. But this strike wasn't born in a war room the night before. Its seeds were planted years earlier. On the night of January 31, 2018, a small team of Israeli Mossad agents infiltrated a nondescript warehouse in southern Tehran.

THAI GOVERNMENT IN CRISIS AMID FALLOUT FROM PM'S LEAKED PHONE CALL

Diary Times Desk: Thai Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra's government has been rocked after a major coalition partner quit amid mounting public anger over a leaked phone call she had with a former Cambodian leader. Paetongtarn faced growing calls to resign on Thursday as the kingdom was racked by renewed political instability, with fears that an ongoing border dispute with Cambodia could trigger military clashes. The crisis engulfing Paetongtarn's government comes after audio was leaked of a phone call she held with Cambodia's exleader Hun Sen, who still wields considerable influence in his country, discussing a border dispute between the countries in which a Cambodian soldier was killed in a clash in May. During the June 15 call, Paetongtarn pressed Hun Sen for a peaceful resolution to the dispute, calling him "uncle" and urging him not to listen to "the other side" in Thailand, including an outspoken Thai army general who she said "just wants to look cool". Paetongtarn, the scion of a political dynasty who had never held office.

SPACEX'S ROCKET EXPLOSION RAISES SAFETY CONCERNS AHEAD OF AXIOM-4 MISSION

Diary Times Desk: Elon Musk's commercial space flight company SpaceX suffered a major setback after its latest reusable rocket that was under development, the massive Starship, exploded on the launch pad, causing a huge fireball. Does the explosion put a question mark on the safety record and culture followed at SpaceX? On a separate rocket from a different space port, ndia's Astronaut Group Captain Shubhanshu Shukla is set to fly to space no earlier than June 22. The rocket he will use is the Falcon-9 rocket and Crew Dragon capsule. This rocket launch has been repeatedly delayed since it was first scheduled to be held on May 29. Group Captain Shukla will fly from the Kennedy Space Center in Florida. Incidentally a leak of liquid oxygen was reported on the Falcon-9 rocket by SpaceX itself and then Indian scientists stationed at the Kennedy Space Center, under the leadership of Dr V Narayanan, Chairman, Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO), had "insisted" on repairs and "validation", which incidentally SpaceX did carry out on India's insistence.



AFTER DONALD TRUMP'S WARNING TO IRAN, CHINA WARNS AGAINST 'USE OF FORCE'. WHAT BEIJING SAID

Diary Times Desk: Amid the escalating tensions between Israel and Iran, China has warned the United States against the "use of force" as US President Donald Trump mulls American intervention. Speaking at a press briefing, Guo Jiakun, spokesman for the Chinese foreign affairs ministry, said any use of force from the US would be seen as an infringement of Iran's sovereignty and security. "China opposes any act that... infringes upon the sovereignty, security and territorial integrity of other countries, and opposes the use or threat of use of force in international relations", he told reporters. Earlier this week, Chinese President Xi Jinping stated Beijing was "deeply worried" about Israel's military strikes against Iran. Speaking on the sidelines of a summit with five Central Asian nations in Kazakhstan, the Chinese president called for an "urgent deescalation." "All parties should work to de-escalate the conflict as soon as possible and prevent the situation from worsening further," Xi was quoted as saying by Chinese state broadcaster CCTV.

"STRIKING AYATOLLAH REGIME WITH GREAT FORCE": FRESH ATTACKS BY ISRAEL, IRAN

Diary Times Desk: Israel and Iran traded fresh missile strikes as the conflict between the two Middle East countries entered its seventh day on Thursday, with senior US officials reportedly preparing for the possibility of a strike on Tehran in the coming days. The Israeli military late Wednesday said sirens were sounded across the country following a missile attack from Iran. It also said that it intercepted a drone that was launched from Iran. An Israeli Defense Forces (IDF) spokesperson said they launched a "new wave of raids" on the Iranian capital, Tehran, and warned residents in two villages - Arak and Khondab - to leave before it struck the "military infrastructure". The worst-ever conflict between Israel and Iran began when the Israeli military launched "Operation Rising Lion" last Friday and attacked Iranian cities, saying it had concluded Tehran was on the verge of developing a nuclear weapon. More than 250 people, including over 220 in Iran, have been killed in crossborder strikes. Prime Minister Benjamin Netanvahu Wednesday said they began the campaian to remove two existential threats to Israel - the nuclear threat and the ballistic missile threat. "We are advancing step by step to remove these threats," he said in a

video messaae.

LUDHIANA WEST BYPOLL SEES PEACEFUL VOTING, 51.33% TURNOUT RECORDED TILL 7 PM

Diary Times Desk: A voter turnout of 51.33 per cent was recorded till 7 pm for the bypoll to the Ludhiana West Assembly seat in Punjab on Thursday, with poll Voting came to an end at 6 pm, and the turnout figures might increase once all the data pertaining to polling are received. Officials said polling will continue until the last voter is present inside the polling station. The Ludhiana West seat fell vacant following the death of AAP MLA Gurpreet Bassi Gogi in January. The counting of votes will be taken up on June 23. In the first two hours (7 am to 9 am) of polling, the voting percentage was 8.50 per cent, which went up to 21.51 per cent at 11 am, as per the Election Commission data. The voting percentage increased to 33.42 per cent at 1 pm and to 41.04 per cent at 3 pm, the data showed. Voters, including women and the elderly, began arriving at the polling stations in the morning, and their numbers grew as the day progressed.



IN TWO MONTHS, FAMILY LOSES 2 SONS TO DRUG OVERDOSE IN PUNJAB'S TARN TARAN

Diary Times Desk: Sanju (26), a youth of the Valmiki Colony in Fatehbad village under Goindwal Sahib police station in Punjab's Tarn Taran, on Thursday died due to an alleged drug overdose, in what is the second incident in two days. Another resident of the same locality, Partap Singh (40), had died of a drug overdose. Father Tilak Raj said the village has become a hub for drugs, where every type of drug is readily available. He said this was the second death due to a drug overdose within two months in the family. He said his son had injected himself on Wednesday and died shortly thereafter, adding that his elder son, Sarwan Singh, also died from a drug overdose just two months prior. He said that even minor children were consuming drugs in the colony. Atul Soni, DSP, Gonindwal Sahib, and SHO Inspector Prabhjit Singh remained unavailable to comment on the issue, neither answering calls nor responding to WhatsApp messages.

Diary Times Desk: A US visa is "a privilege, not a right", its screening does not stop after a visa has been issued and authorities may revoke it if one breaks the law, the country's embassy here said on Thursday. In a brief statement, the US Embassy also said using illegal drugs or breaking any US laws while on a student or visitor visa can make one ineligible for future US visas. The statement was shared on the X handle of the embassy. It comes in the backdrop of an immigration crackdown by the Trump administration in California's Los Angeles recently. "Using illegal drugs or breaking any US laws while on a student/visitor visa can make you ineligible for future US visas. A US visa is a privilege, not a right. US visa screening does not stop after a visa is issued - and we may revoke your visa if you break the law," it said. This is the third such statement issued by the US Embassy in India this month, in which it has underlined that while people travelling legally to America were welcome, illegal entry or abuse of visas won't be tolerated by the country.

CENTRE APPROVES RS 2,006 CRORE FOR HIMACHAL AS 2023 FLOOD RELIEF

Diary Times Desk: A high-level committee headed by Home Minister Amit Shah on Wednesday approved 2,006.40-crore central assistance to Himachal Pradesh for a recovery and reconstruction plan in the aftermath of the flood, landslides and cloudburst incidents of 2023. According to official sources, the amount would help the state in carrying out recovery and reconstruction activities in the aftermath of cloudbursts floods. and landslides in 2023. Of the amount, Rs 1,504.80 crore will be the central share from the recovery and reconstruction funding window under the National Disaster Response Fund. Earlier, on December 12, 2023, the Ministry of Home Affairs had approved additional financial assistance of Rs 633.73 crore from the fund for Himachal Pradesh, which was affected by the disaster. The committee consisting of Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan and Vice Chairman of Niti Aayog Suman Bery considered the proposal for financial assistance to the state from the recovery reconstruction funding window under the fund.

BEWARE OF FRAUDSTERS SEEKING MONEY ON SOLAN MC'S BEHALF: COMMISSIONER

Diary Times Desk: Expressing concern over complaints received regarding some people demanding money on the behalf of Solan Municipal Corporation (MC) for releasing instalments of Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana-Urban, Solan MC Commissioner clarified that no such funds were required to be paid to anyone. Member of Parliament from Hamirpur constituency Anurag Thakur also attended the meeting as a member of the Committee. "We have given certain suggestions on strengthening of democracy which must be incorporated. We were informed about the Draft Bill and we found that the ambit of the Bill had been widened," he said. "We have given a suggestion that by-elections should be held within one year and not six months as is the mandate presently," he said. Sukhu said the Assembly elections in Himachal were due in 2027 and in case the amendment comes into effect from 2029 then what will the term of that government which is elected to power.

NADDA HAILS CENTRAL GRANT OKAYED FOR 2023 MONSOON DAMAGES IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

Diary Times Desk: Against a request for Rs 9,000 crore as Post Disaster Need Assessment (PDNA) for the 2023 monsoon damages, the Centre has approved a sum of Rs 2006.40 crore for Himachal Pradesh. GILL SAYS INDIA WILL GO ALL OUT TO TAKE 20 WICKETS: 'YOU COULD MAYBE SEE FOUR PROPER BOWLERS'

Diary Times Desk: Expect India to stop hedging bets as they did in Australia. India's new captain Shubman Gill said on the eve of the start of the series at Headingley that he was prepared to play even four TA tailenders in pursuit of 20 wickets as quickly as possible. "Yes, definitely." Gill said in response to the question. "You can't win a Test match without taking 20 wickets, no matter how many runs you have scored. So, that assay has been one of our key discussion points, you know, how we're gonna take 20 wickets. And there might be a case, you know, where we could only be going with some pure batters and you could see a bowling allrounder and three to four premier fast bowlers or proper bowlers." The series in Australia was a departure from India's philosophy of playing Test cricket in recent times. They played with only three full-time quicks through the series. The pitches negated the spinner, and the fifth bowler was either Nitish Kumar Reddy or his combination with Washington Sundar. In the absence of Shardul Thakur, who might be the bowling allrounder Gill spoke of, India seemed worried about the depth in their batting. The Border-Gavaskar Trophy was also a series with two different captains, and consequently perhaps no clear direction. Now Gill takes over as full-time captain, and at least in the press conference.



FROM SACHIN TO SHUBMAN: 'NO 4 IS A GREAT POSITION TO BAT'

Diary Times Desk: After a lot of deliberation since the Pataudi Trophy was retired, all future Test matches between India and England will be played for the Anderson-Tendulkar Trophy. Their signatures engraved, the trophy also features images of Anderson and Tendulkar, the two most capped Test players in action. In this interview Tendulkar talks about the honour, his role in carrying forward Pataudi's legacy and India's prospects in the five-Test series beginning on Friday under young captain Shubman Gill. It feels great. I was not expecting this honour. A lot of things have happened for me in England. The first flight I took in my life was travelling to London with Star Cricket Club in 1988. The first hundred I scored was in England in 1990 at Old Trafford. I became the first non-Yorkshire-ite to play for the county in 1992. I surpassed Sir Don Bradman's record of most centuries at Headingley in 2002. Now to know that the trophy is named after me and Anderson is a huge honour. I know the Pataudi Trophy was retired some time ago by ECB and the BCCI. When I got to know (about the renaming), my first phone call was to the Pataudi family. I informed them everything and we discussed ways to keep Pataudi's legacy alive. He has been instrumental in inspiring so many.

INDIA'S REORDER BEGINS IN LEEDS, WHERE ORDER RARELY HOLDS

Diary Times Desk: The walk up the slope from Cardigan Road towards Headingley throws up a peculiar sight: a neglected and abandoned relic. It's an old bear pit from the short-lived Leeds Zoological and Botanical Gardens of the 1800s. The zoo folded quickly under financial strain; the brown bear was eventually sold off with the rest. It's a weirdly fitting image to stumble upon before entering the famous stadium, a place where things can quickly veer off plan, where the past clings to the present in strange ways, like in the form of graffiti on the street's utility boxes that honour Botham and Willis and Stokes and Leach. But, Headingley has retained a quintessentially English vibe: low stands intimately close to the action, shifting cloud patterns, and the ball snaking about. Like the Gabba is to Australia, this ground reflects something elemental about England's cricket. But where Brisbane long served as a launchpad for Australian dominance over visiting teams, Leeds can be less definitive and more unpredictable. No surprise, then, that it's often the setting for midseries drama and only ever chosen to start a Test series nine times in England's long history. But this week, it promises one certainty. It will bring together the game's current top-ranked batter (Joe Root), bowler (Jasprit Bumrah).

BEN STOKES SAYS ENOUGH IS ENOUGH, PUTS AN END TO CHATTER AROUND VIRAT KOHLI, ROHIT SHARMA AND ASHWIN'S ABSENCE

Diary Times Desk: England captain Ben Stokes has had enough of the chatter around India missing Virat Kohli, Ravichandran Ashwin and Rohit Sharma now that the three of them have retired from Test cricket. On the eve of the series-opener against a relatively young Indian side led by first-time captain Shubman Gill, England's experienced all-rounder put an end to the narrative of 'India being weakened' by the absence of Kohli, Ashwin and Rohit. "There's been a lot said about no Rohit, no Virat and no Ashwin, that doesn't mean that we think it's going to be any easier than what it ever is against India. The pool of talent that Indian cricket has is just ainormous," Stokes told the media during the pre-match press conference. Ashwin was the first to retire in the middle of the Border-Gavaskar Trophy earlier this year. Rohit, India Test and ODI captain, called it quits from red-ball cricket last month, and Kohli did the same five days later. Stokes said any team would look pale when players like Ashwin, Kohli and Rohit retire one after the other but India continue to produce high-quality players regularly.



BCCI, GAUTAM GAMBHIR TOLD TO REWARD OVERLOOKED STAR OVER SAI SUDHARSAN: "FORGET..."

Diary Times Desk: There has been a lot of chatter over whether Sai Sudharsan and Karun Nair will play together for the Indian cricket team in the upcoming Test series against England. With Rohit Sharma and Virat Kohli both announcing their retirements, a new-look batting lineup is expected for India with many finding opportunities. However, former India cricketer WV Raman believes that the team management should instead reward Abhimanyu Easwaran with an opportunity. In an interview with Times of India, Raman said that Easwaran has been quite consistent and he should be rewarded along with Karun Nair in the upcoming Test series. "No, let's not forget that Easwaran has been getting runs much higher than him over a long period of time. We have been having Easwaran as a part of the squad. We are not playing him. And that is again creating a lot of dilemma when the next selection comes up. We will have to try and reward him fully in the sense that there is no point picking him in the squad.
