

AIR INDIA CANCELS 4 INTERNATIONAL, 4 DOMESTIC FLIGHTS: BOOKINGS DECLINE BY UP TO 20%

Diary Times Desk : Air India on Friday cancelled eight flights, including four on international routes, due to operational reasons even as the impact of the Ahmedabad plane crash last week is becoming manifest on its overall bookings dropping nearly 20 per cent. A London-bound Air India flight, AI-171 carrying 242 passengers and crew members crashed in Ahmedabad on June 12. All but one passenger on board the plane died along with nearly 29 on the ground when the aircraft crashed on a medical college complex shortly after take-off. In a statement on Friday, Air India announced cancellation of several flights-Dubai-Chennai (AI906), Delhi-Melbourne (AI308), Melbourne--Delhi (AI309) and Dubai-Hyderabad (Al2204). On domestic routes, Pune--Delhi (Al874), Ahmedabad-Delhi (Al456), Hyderabad-Mumbai (AI-2872) and Chennai-Mumbai (AI571) flights were cancelled. The Delhi-Pune flight was cancelled after the airline, on its arrival from Delhi, detected that it had a bird hit.



"WHEN INDIANS WEREN'T...": SHARK TANK'S AMAN GUPTA ON 2000S GOA PARTIES

Diary Times Desk: Aman Gupta, the co-founder of boAt Lifestyle, took listeners back to a very different Goa during a conversation on The Prakhar Gupta Xperience podcast. It was a time when Indian partygoers were rare and the underground rave culture was dominated almost entirely by foreign tourists. TEMPERATURE DROPS, LIGHT RAIN EXPECTED IN DELHI, YELLOW ALERT ISSUED

Diary Times Desk: The weather has turned pleasant across Delhi-NCR as drop in both minimum and maximum temperature has brought relief to the people from the scorching heat. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued a yellow alert for the next five days, forecasting rain and strong winds across the region. On June 20, the maximum temperature is not likely to exceed 36 degrees Celsius, and the minimum is 27 degrees Celsius. On June 21, the temperature is expected to hover around 37 degrees C (max) and 28 degrees C (min), with humidity between 80 per cent and 82 per cent. According to the IMD, light to moderate rain, accompanied by lightning and gusty winds, is expected during the evenings and nights of June 20 and 21. Between June 22 and 25, the region is likely to witness cloudy skies, moderate to heavy rain, and thunderstorms, with wind speeds reaching 30-40 km/h. During this period, the maximum temperature may drop further to 35 degrees Celsius and the minimum to 26-27 degrees C. The weather department said humidity could climb up to 90 per cent, keeping the atmosphere sticky.

INDIA HOLDS EMERGENCY TALKS WITH STAKEHOLDERS AS IRAN-ISRAEL **CONFLICT PUTS \$825 BILLION TRADE AT** RISK

Diary Times Desk: The commerce ministry on Friday will meet stakeholders, including shipping lines, exporters, container firms, and other departments, to assess the impact of the Iran-Israel conflict on India's overseas trade and address related issues, an official said. The industry official said that the meeting will be chaired by Commerce Secretary Sunil Barthwal. "The meeting is today. We will raise issues related to freight rates," the official said. Barthwal has earlier stated that India is keeping a close watch on the situation. Exporters have stated that the war, if escalated further, would impact world trade and push both air and sea freight rates. They have expressed apprehensions that the conflict may impact the movement of merchant ships from the Strait of Hormuz and the Red Sea. Nearly two-thirds of India's crude oil and half of its LNG imports pass through the Strait of Hormuz, which Iran has now threatened to close.

VIOLENCE AGAINST CHILDREN IN CONFLICT ZONES HIT 'UNPRECEDENTED LEVELS': UN

Diary Times Desk : From Gaza to the Democratic Republic of Congo, violence against children in conflict zones reached "unprecedented levels" in 2024, a United Nations annual report said Thursday. "In 2024, violence against children in armed conflict reached unprecedented levels, with a staggering 25 percent surge in the number of grave violations in comparison with 2023," according to the report from UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres. The report verified 41,370 grave violations against children in 2024 -- including 36,221 committed in 2024 and 5.149 committed previously but confirmed in 2024 -the highest number since the monitoring tool was established nearly 30 years ago. The new high beats 2023, another record year, which itself represented a 21 percent increase over the preceding year. WE UNDERSTAND, BUT OUR EXPECTATION IS MORE': IRANIAN DIPLOMAT ON INDIA'S **STAND**

Diary Times Desk : Iran expects India to condemn "aggression by Israel" to uphold the principle of sovereignty of countries and international law and to prevent similar actions in other parts of the world, a senior Iranian diplomat said on Friday. Against the backdrop of reports that the US is making an outreach to Pakistan for support for possible American strikes on Iran, Mohammad Javad Hosseini, deputy chief of mission at the Iranian embassy, told reporters that Pakistan should stand with Iran in the face of Israel's aggression. "We believe every country, including India, should condemn this aggression, not because of Iran or because of this conflict, but because it will open the way for other countries who [want] to attack a neighbour on some baseless allegations," Hosseini said. "If you don't condemn it, you are giving them an incentive." India's actions should be in keeping with its role as the voice of the Global South at key forums such as the G20 and the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO). "Our expectation is this voice [will take this issue] not as a matter of bilateral relations with Iran and Israel.

NETANYAHU SAYS SON'S WEDDING DELAY A "PERSONAL COST" OF WAR. STUNS ISRAELIS

Diary Times Desk : Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu is facing fierce backlash after citing the delay of his son's wedding as a "personal cost" of the ongoing conflict with Iran - remarks many Israelis have called tone-deaf and self-centered, according to the Guardian. Speaking solemnly in front of a missile-damaged Soroka Hospital in Be'er Sheva, Netanyahu invoked the spirit of Britain during the Blitz, likening Israel's current crisis to the World War II bombings. "It reminds me of the British people during the Blitz. We are going through a Blitz," he said, attempting to draw parallels between his family's experience and the hardships of everyday Israelis. The prime minister pointed to the rescheduling of his son Avner's wedding - for a second time due to security concerns - as an example of the sacrifices his family has made. He noted that the postponement had also deeply affected Avner's fiance and his wife, Sara Netanyahu, calling her "a hero" for enduring the disappointment.



ISRAELI SCIENTISTS SCRAMBLE TO SAVE WORK AFTER IRANIAN MISSILE HITS LABS

Diary Times Desk : Researchers at Israel's prestigious Weizmann Institute of Science have been scrambling to save their experiments after an Iranian missile destroyed a building containing dozens of cutting-edge laboratories. The missile struck the institute's campus at Rehovot, on the southern periphery of Tel Aviv, in the early hours of Sunday, damaging multiple buildinas and prompting researchers to clamber into the ruins to save samples even as fire raged. No one was hurt as the campus was empty overnight, but one part of a building collapsed entirely, while in the remaining part, the walls were blown out, exposing a tangle of twisted metal, blasted debris and blackened cement. "We did our best to save as much of the samples as we could from the labs, from the buildings, while we were fighting the fire," physicist Roee Ozeri, Weizmann's vice president for development and communications, told Reuters

BOEING GHOST FLIGHTS: CHINA-IRAN AIR ROUTE RAISES **EYEBROWS IN ISRAEL** CONFLICT

Diary Times Desk : Multiple Boeing 747s were tracked flying from China to Iran, disappearing near Iranian airspace, prompting speculation that Beijing may be covertly supporting Tehran during escalating tensions with Israel. A string of mysterious Boeing 747 flights departing China for Iran has raised suspicions that Beijing may be covertly aiding Tehran as Israeli airstrikes intensify against Iran's nuclear infrastructure, according to a Fox News Digital report. "Several Boeing 747s have been spotted on radar leaving China for Iran over the last week," Fox News reported, citing flight-tracking data and European intelligence assessments. Starting June 14, at least five cargo flights took off from various points in China and travelled a discreet route westward along China's northern air corridor. They then descend through Central Asia -- Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, and Turkmenistan -before vanishing from radar near Iranian airspace, according to FlightRadar24 and The Telegraph. Intriguingly, the listed destination for the flights was Luxembourg. But the aircraft never entered European airspace. "The mystery transport planes," as described by The Telegraph, have fuelled speculation amongst defence analysts who suggest the flights could be part of an undisclosed logistics operation possibly moving military supplies, key personnel, or sensitive cargo to support Iran during its escalating.

PUNJAB CM MANN APPROVES 14-POINT ACTION PLAN TO PRESERVE GROUNDWATER

Diary Times Desk : Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann has approved a 14-point action plan as part of the Integrated State Water Plan to preserve and replenish groundwater in the state. The plan aims to reduce groundwater dependence and promote the use of canal and surface water for irrigation and other needs. Chairing a meeting of the Water Resources department pertaining to Integrated State Water Plan, the Chief Minister said that the plan has been meticulously prepared by the Department of Water Resources of the state in consultation with all the eminent departments. He said that the situation in the state is already alarming as 115 of the total 153 blocks are over-exploited in terms of groundwater extraction. Bhagwant Mann said that the plan focuses on saving the groundwater and enhancing the usage of canal water for various motives. The CM also expressed concern over the annual average of the lowering of water level by 0.7 metre due to extraction of 5.2 billion cubic metres of water. He said that it can be done by reducing the ground water demand, decreasing agricultural water demand, improving techniques of irrigation, replenishing groundwater and artificially augmenting groundwater.

PUNJAB POLICE INTENSIFY VEHICLE CHECKING AT INTER-STATE BORDERS TO CATCH DRUG, LIQUOR SMUGGLERS

Diary Times Desk : The Punjab Police on Friday carried out a special operation at 10 inter-state border districts aimed at checking all the vehicles entering or exiting the state to keep a tab on drug traffickers and illegal liquor smugglers. During the operation, conducted simultaneously in 10 districts from 6 am to 2 pm, all the SSPs of border districts were directed to organise joint 'naka' (check) operations at strategic places and mobilise a maximum number of manpower. Sharing details, Special DGP (law and order) Arpit Shukla said that wellcoordinated strong 'nakas' involving over 900 police personnel were set up under the supervision of Inspectors/DSPs at least 93 entry and exit points of 10 districts, which share boundaries with four border states and UT Chandigarh. The 10 inter-state border districts were Pathankot, Sri Muktsar Sahib, Fazilka, Rupanagar, SAS Nagar, Patiala, Sangrur, Mansa, Hoshiarpur and Bathinda.

PUNJAB AND HARYANA HC UPHOLDS COMPULSORY RETIREMENT OF JUDICIAL OFFICER

Diary Times Desk : The Punjab and Haryana High Court on Friday upheld the premature retirement of a Punjab Additional District and Sessions Judge after concluding that the Full Court exercised its discretion in public interest and within the bounds of law. "It emerges that the Full Court having duly considered the petitioner's service record in its entirety has exercised its discretion within the bounds of law. Ergo, the writ petition in hand deserves rejection," the Division Bench of Chief Justice Sheel Nagu and Justice Sumeet Goel ruled while dismissing the petition filed by Mehar Singh Rattu. The judicial officer was seeking the guashing of the Full Court's recommendation dated September 21, 2000, and order dated October 10, 2000, passed by the Punjab Government prematurely retired from service. Sitting during the summer vacations, the Bench noted that the retirement order was clearly passed in "public interest." Interference in such matters was limited as the competent.

AAP, CONGRESS, SAD TARGET J&K CM OMAR ABDULLAH FOR REMARKS ON WATER SHARING

Diary Times Desk : The ruling Aam Aadmi Party, Congress, and the Shiromani Akali Dal in Punjab on Friday targeted Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah for his remarks that no permission will be given as of now for any proposal to build a canal to divert surplus water to other states. Interacting with the media in Jammu on Friday, Abdullah asserted that Jammu and Kashmir should be allowed to use its waters first. The Chief Minister was replying to a question on the Central government's proposed construction of a 113-km canal to transfer surplus water from Jammu and Kashmir to Punjab, Haryana, and Rajasthan to prevent it from flowing to neighbouring Pakistan. "Right now, Jammu is facing water scarcity... There is no water in the taps. Why should I send water to Punjab? Punjab already has three rivers as per the Indus Water Treaty. Has Punjab given us any water," he asked. "We will use it (water) first, and only then consider others' needs," he added. Reacting to Abdullah's remarks, Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) spokesperson Neel Garg accused the National Conference leader of deliberately politicising the water issue, saying the authority to decide on river waters lies with the Central government.

HEAT, HOLIDAYS, AND APATHY BLAMED FOR RECORD LOW TURNOUT IN LUDHIANA WEST BYPOLL

Diary Times Desk : Scorching temperatures, summer vacations, and a growing sense of political disillusionment have been cited as key reasons behind the dismal 51.3 per cent voter turnout in the Ludhiana West Assembly bypoll held on June 19 - the lowest in nearly two decades and the second-lowest since 2002. Despite aggressive campaigning by all major parties AAP, Congress, BJP, and SAD - the electorate in Puniab's industrial hub remained largely indifferent. According to the Election Commission data, just over 1.75 lakh voters were eligible to cast their vote, but barely half turned up. The turnout marked a sharp decline from the 64.3 per cent recorded in the 2022 Assembly election and nearly 69 per cent seen in 2012 and 2017. Polling officials noted that by 9 am only 8.5 per cent of voters had cast their ballots, with many deterred by the oppressive heat, which hovered around 36 degrees Celsius. "The weather was a major factor. People preferred to stay indoors, especially the elderly," said a polling officer. The timing of the bypoll during school holidays also played a role. Many families from middle- and upper middle-class areas were away on vacation

CHEATING IN HIMACHAL POLICE RECRUITMENT EXAM: FRAUDSTERS CONFESS TO HAVING TAKEN MONEY

Diary Times Desk : Two youths arrested in the Himachal Police recruitment Pradesh exam cheating scam have reportedly confessed to having accepted money from candidates in exchange for helping them cheat in the examination, which was held on June 15. However, the police investigation team found no clue or evidence of paper leak during the duo's police interrogation, say sources in the local police. On Monday, the Kangra district police had registered a criminal case at the Palampur police station under Sections 318(4) and 3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (Indian Justice Code) against Vikram and Balvinder, alias Sonu Jaryal, and arrested them. They were the main alleged accused, who took money and facilitated the candidates in cheating during the examination. Police sources revealed that they also summoned 10 suspicious candidates during the duo's interrogation and questioned them about the money given by them for cheating. Some of them admitted to having given the money. They revealed that the duo arranged methods to enable them cheat in the examination

DISMANTLED AND SOLD: THE CHILLING TALE OF A STOLEN VEHICLE IN HIMACHAL

Diary Times Desk : A highstakes vehicle theft case that began with the mysterious disappearance of a tipper truck has turned into a gripping tale of crime, deception and a carefully executed cover-up. What seemed like a routine vehicle theft soon revealed an organised operation aimed at dismantling and vanishing heavy vehicles without a trace. The case was registered at Kala Amb Police Station of Sirmaur district on May 27 after a tipper truck (HR37E-5499), previously impounded for illegal mining and awaiting release through court orders, vanished before the owner could reclaim it. By the time authorities realised what had happened, the truck had already crossed state lines and disappeared into Punjab's underbelly. Investigations led police to a scrap shop in Khanauri Mandi, Puniab — a notorious hub for grey-market vehicle parts. There, they made a chilling discovery: the stolen tipper had been completely dismantled.

LANDSLIDE BLOCKS DHARAMSALA-KANGRA NATIONAL HIGHWAY, TRAFFIC MOVEMENT DISRUPTED

Diary Times Desk : Vehicular movement on the Dharamsala-Kangra National Highway came to a halt on Friday morning following a landslide triggered by intermittent rains that have been lashing the region since Thursday night. HIMACHAL POLICE LAUNCH PROBE AFTER DEPUTY CM, CONGRESS MLA GET 'DEATH THREAT' ON SOCIAL MEDIA

BCCI BLASTED FOR FAVOURITISM AS DOMESTIC STAR MISSES OUT ON DEBUT IN 1ST TEST

Diary Times Desk : The first installment of Sai Sudharsan's Test debut lasted just four balls as he was dismissed by England captain Ben Stokes on the stroke of Lunch in the first Test in Leeds on Friday. Sudharsan nicked a delivery which was going down the leg, and England wicketkeeper Jamie Smith did the rest, leaping wonderfully to his right and grabbed the ball with both hands. It was not the ideal start for Sudharsan and his wicket also allowed England to peg India back after a great start to the opening day of a long tour. While it is too early to judge Sudharsan after just one failure, fans were not happy with his inclusion in the team in the very first place. Sudharsan's debut came at the expense of Bengal captain Abhimanyu Easwaran, who was once again overlooked despite piling runs in Domestic cricket. Easwaran received his maiden call up in 2022 but is yet to make his India debut. Fans, however, slammed the BCCI for giving prefence to IPL talents. Abhimanyu Easwaran deserved a chance in 1st match. Bcci is treating him like untouchable.

WE TRIED TO BOWL CONSISTENTLY IN ONE AREA: NAYEEM

Diary Times Desk : Nayeem Hasan, the Bangladesh offspinner, said changing the seam position from time to time served him well on Day 4 of the first Test against Sri Lanka in Galle. Despite making his debut back in 2018, Nayeem had played only one Test outside Bangladesh, and that too without bowling a single delivery in the pink ball Test against India in 2019 when he was substituted with a concussion after being hit on the helmet. That he got to play the first Test against Sri Lanka was due to the absence of Mehidy Hasan Miraz, who was rested due to fever.

The 25-year old capitalised on the opportunity with a five-wicket haul to ensure Sri Lanka did not go past Bangladesh's total despite being in a good position to do so. I tried to bowl in one good spot, and then adjust my variation there. I tried changing the seam position from time to time. My line depended on who I was bowling to. I had different plans for each batter," Nayeem said after the day's play. "It was a batting friendly wicket so we tried to bowl consistently in one area. When you cut off the runs, the batter gets into pressure. He tries to do something different, which can lead to a mistake. That was my plan." Nayeem said Bangladesh are in a good position to force a result, having ended the day with an overall lead of 187 runs, with seven wickets in hand.



KL RAHUL'S 'UNFAIR TREATMENT' CALLED OUT BY EX-INDIA STAR. SANJAY MANJREKAR CONTRADICTS

Diary Times Desk : Former India cricketers Deep Dasgupta and Sanjay Manjrekar had contrasting takes on star batter KL Rahul's international career, especially Test cricket. Since his debut in 2015, Rahul has played 58 Tests so far, scoring 3,257 runs with a below-par average of 33.57. And I think once you give him that position, that security, we will see a different KL Rahul," Dasgupta said on Star Sports. Dasgupta suggested it's time for the management to give Rahul a fixed spot, since the likes of Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma are no longer part of the Test setup.

Diary Times Desk : Temba Bavuma, the captain of the WTC 2025 champions South Africa, will miss the upcoming Test series against Zimbabwe due to a left hamstring strain, Cricket South Africa (CSA) revealed in a media release on Friday (June 20). Keshav Maharaj will lead South Africa in the two Test matches. Bavuma sustained the injury while batting in the second innings on Day 3 of the final against Australia at Lord's. The right-handed batter will undergo further scans to determine the extent of his injury, stated CSA. South Africa are also without Marco Jansen, Aiden Markram, Kagiso Rabada, Ryan Rickelton and Tristan Stubbs, who have been rested for the series. The squad, meanwhile, includes five uncapped players -Pretorius, I huan-dre Lesego Senokwane, Codi Yusuf, Dewald Brevis and Prenelan Subraven. It was a 16-member squad announced by CSA earlier this month but the updated squad, in the absence of Bavuma, has been trimmed to 15 with a replacement for the regular skipper not being named. The first Test will be played from June 28 while the second Test begins on July 6, with the Queens Sports Club, Bulawayo hosting both matches. The South Africa squad is set to depart for Bulawayo on June 24.
