AIR INDIA CRASH INDIA SAYS NO TO UN AVIATION INVESTIGATOR IN AIR INDIA CRASH PROBE: REPORT

Diary Times Desk : India would not allow a UN investigator to join a probe of a crashed Air India jet that some safety experts had criticized for delays in analysis of crucial black box data, two senior sources familiar with the matter told Reuters.

Earlier this week, the United Nations aviation agency took the unusual step of offering India one of its investigators to provide assistance following the Boeing 787-8 Dreamliner crash killing at least 260 people in Ahmedabad on June 12.

Previously, the International Civil Aviation Organization has deployed investigators to help with certain probes, such as the downing of a Malaysian plane in 2014 and a Ukrainian jetliner in 2020, but those times the agency had been asked for assistance.

ICAO had asked for the investigator who was in India to be given observer status, but Indian authorities refused the offer, the sources said. The news was first reported on Thursday by the Indian news channel Times Now. India's Aircraft Accident Investigation Bureau (AAIB), which is leading the probe into the world's deadliest aviation accident in a decade, did not return a request for comment. ICAO was not immediately available for comment. India's civil aviation ministry said on Thursday that investigators downloaded flight recorder data around two weeks after the crash.



RAHUL GANDHI S JAB ON PREAMBLE ROW



Diary Times Desk : Rahul Gandhi weighed in Friday on the row over the words 'secular' and 'socialist' in the Preamble to the Constitution. The Congress MP attacked the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh – the ideological mentor of the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party – after it called for a 'debate' over retaining the terms.

"The mask of the RSS has come off again," Mr Gandhi said on X, picking up where party comms chief Jairam Ramesh left off this morning. "The Constitution irks them because it speaks of equality, secularism, and justice. The RSS-BJP don't want the Constitution... they want the Manusmriti."

"They aim to strip the marginalised and the poor of their rights and enslave them again. Snatching a powerful weapon like the Constitution from them is their real agenda."

"The RSS should stop dreaming this dream - we will never let them succeed..." This chapter in the row over the terms 'secular' and 'socialist' - added to the Preamble in 1976 - began after Mr Hosabale's comments Thursday, and as the BJP upped attacks on the Congress over the Emergency imposed by then-Prime Minister Indira Gandhi a year earlier, i.e., 1975.



PM MODI TO UNDERTAKE 5-NATION VISIT FROM JULY 2-9

Diary Times Desk : Prime Minister Narendra Modi will embark on a five-nation tour beginning July 2 to participate in the BRICS Summit in Brazil and expand India's ties with several key nations of the Global South. Besides Brazil, Modi will visit Ghana, Trinidad and Tobago, Argentina, Brazil and Namibia during the eight-day trip, according to the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA). In the first leg of the visit, Modi will undertake a visit to Ghana from July 2 to 3. This will be the prime minister's first ever bilateral visit to Ghana. It will be the first prime ministerial visit from India to Ghana in three decades. During the visit, Modi will hold talks with the president of Ghana to review the strong bilateral partnership and discuss further avenues to enhance it through economic, energy and defence collaboration, the MEA said. RAPE IN KOLKATA COLLEGE SHOWS FEMALE STUDENTS NOT SAFE, CLAIMS BJP'S BENGAL UNIT CHIEF



Diary Times Desk : Union minister and BJP's West Bengal unit president Sukanta Majumdar on Friday claimed that the alleged gang-rape in a law college in Kolkata shows that female students are "not safe" in educational institutes in the state. Condemning the incident, the ruling Trinamool Congress said the police swiftly apprehended all three accused and urged the opposition party not to politicise the issue. Majumdar, the union minister of state for education, alleged that the law and order situation in West Bengal is "in a shambles" even though Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee takes care of the police (Home) department. After the rape-murder of an on-duty doctor in the RG Kar Medical College and Hospital last year, the alleged incident of gang-rape of a student took place in a law college in Kolkata, and this only proved that "female students are not safe in educational institutions" in the state, the BJP leader said. Majumdar also referred to the killing of a girl in a bomb explosion earlier this week during a TMC victory rally taken out before the results of the Kaliganj assembly bypoll were announced.

POST OFFICES ACROSS INDIA TO START ACCEPTING DIGITAL **PAYMENTS FROM AUGUST**

Diary Times Desk : Post offices across India will start accepting digital payments at counters from August after completing the rollout of a new application in their IT system, official sources said. Post offices have not been able to accept digital payments as they don't have their accounts synced with Unique Payment Interface (UPI) system. "The Department of Posts is implementing its IT infrastructure which will have new applications that are enabled to perform transactions with Dynamic QR Code. Rollout will be completed at all post offices by August 2025," an official source said. Pilot rollout of the new system under IT 2.0 has been started in the Karnataka circle. QR-based booking of mail products was successfully carried out at the Mysore head office (HO), Bagalkot HO and its subordinate offices. Initially, the Department of Post had introduced static QR code at the point of sale counters at the post offices to enable digital transactions. However, due to recurring technical difficulties and customer complaints, this approach had to be discontinued.

"SEARCHED A LOT": ISRAEL ADMITS PLOT TO KILL IRAN'S AYATOLLAH KHAMENEI

Diary Times Desk : Israel's Defence Minister Israel Katz has claimed that his country's military actively sought to assassinate Iran's Supreme Leader, Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, during the recent Israel-Iran tensions, but failed to identify a viable opportunity. Speaking in a series of primetime interviews across three major Israeli broadcasters, Channel 12, Channel 13, and the state-run Kan, Mr Katz disclosed new details about Israel's war strategy and acknowledged the assassination plan was called off after Khamenei went into hiding. "If he had been in our sights, we would have taken him out," Mr Katz told Channel 13. "We searched a lot," he added. The interviews mark the first public confirmation by a senior Israeli official that the leadership in Tehran had been directly targeted during the war. While the Israeli Defence Forces (IDF) and intelligence agencies had previously focused on attacks on Iran's nuclear infrastructure, this is the first admission of a high-level targeted killing plan. In his remarks to Kan, Mr Katz claimed that Ayatollah Khamenei had quickly retreated into a bunker, severing communication with top military commanders

UK'S STARMER WATERS DOWN WELFARE CUTS TO QUELL LABOUR REVOLT

Diary Times Desk : British Prime Minister Keir Starmer sharply scaled back planned welfare cuts on Friday to quell a rebellion by lawmakers in his governing Labour Party, the latest U-turn to dent his authority just a year after winning power. Planned changes to make it tougher to collect some disability and sickness benefits would now apply only to new applicants, while the millions of people who already rely on the benefits will no longer be affected, the government said. More than 100 Labour lawmakers had publicly opposed Starmer's reforms, which sought to shave 5 billion pounds (\$7 billion) per year off a rapidly rising welfare bill. The revolt had meant Starmer faced a potential defeat in a vote on the changes in parliament next week - a year after he won a landslide majority in a national election. "We have listened to MPs (members of parliament) who support the principle of reform but are worried about the pace of change for those already supported by the system," a spokesperson for Starmer's office said.

CALLS FOR ZOHRAN MAMDANI'S DEPORTATION: TRUMP'S BORDER CZAR SAYS 'GAME ON'



Diary Times Desk: Republicans and affiliated groups are seeking a federal investigation into the citizenship status of Zohran Mamdani, who won the Democratic primary for the New York City's mayoral post, with some calling for his denaturalisation and deportation. Mamdani, son of Indian-American filmmaker Mira Nair, found himself at the centre of a political firestorm following his primary win ahead of the November New York City's mayoral election. And amid calls for probe and deportation US President Donald Trump's border czar, Tom Homan issued a warning to Zohran Mamdani saying that immigration enforcement will "double down and triple down on sanctuary cities". Homan added that if immigration enforcement officials can't arrest people in jail, they would "find them" in neighborhoods or work sites, adding, "so game on, we're coming". Mamdani, who has been an assembly member since 2021, became an American citizen in 2018 shortly after graduating from college.

'VERY BIG' TRADE DEAL WITH INDIA SOON: TRUMP AS HE SIGNS PACT WITH CHINA

Diary Times Desk : President Donald Trump on Thursday (local time) said that the US has signed a deal with China and hinted that a "very big" deal with India will follow soon. Trump made the announcement while speaking at an event for the Big Beautiful Bill. He said, "Everybody wants to make a deal and have a part of it. Remember a few months ago, the press was saying, 'You really have anybody of any interest? Well, we just signed with China vesterday. We are having some great deals. We have one coming up, maybe with India. Very big one. Where we're going to open up India, in the China deal, we are starting to open up China." His remarks come at a time when the 90-day deadline for the tariff pause is likely nearing its end on July 9. It was previously reported that the Trump administration is likely to extend the deadline and will send out letters mentioning the terms of trade deals to dozens of countries.

\$30 BILLION INVESTMENT, UNFREEZE FUNDS: US OFFER TO IRAN TO RESUME TALKS

Diary Times Desk : The Trump administration has been exploring a range of proposals to bring Iran back to the negotiating table, including easing sanctions, releasing frozen funds, and facilitating a multi-billion-dollar investment in a civilian nuclear energy programme, CNN reported, citing four sources familiar with the matter. Discussions have continued despite recent military strikes between Israel and Iran. US officials and Middle East intermediaries have been engaging Iran behind closed doors, as per sources. Talks have intensified since a fragile ceasefire was reached this week, brokered by US President Donald Trump. The administration has floated various proposals, all contingent on one non-negotiable: zero Iranian uranium enrichment, a position Tehran has consistently rejected. According to CNN, the proposal includes several incentives for Iran. One idea being floated involves rebuilding the Fordow nuclear site, recently struck by US bunker-buster bombs, into a non-enriching civilian facility, potentially funded by US-aligned Gulf nations. It remains unclear whether Iran would operate that site under the new proposal.



IRAN SUPREME LEADER KHAMENEI SAYS TRUMP 'EXAGGERATED' IMPACT OF US **STRIKES ON NUCLEAR SITES**

Diary Times Desk: Supreme leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei accused US President Donald Trump on Thursday of exaggerating the impact of US strikes on Iranian nuclear sites, in his first appearance since a ceasefire in the war with Israel took hold. In a televised speech, Khamenei hailed what he described as Iran's "victory" over Israel, vowed never to vield to US pressure and insisted Washington had been dealt a humiliating "slap". American "The president exaggerated events in unusual ways, and it turned out that he needed this exaggeration," Khamenei said. rejecting US claims Iran's nuclear programme had been set back by decades. The strikes, he insisted, had done "nothing significant" to Iran's nuclear infrastructure. Trump. however, maintained the US attacks were devastating. The US president said key facilities, including the underground Fordo uranium enrichment site, had been "obliterated" by American B-2 bombers. Posting on his Truth Social platform. Trump dismissed speculation Iran might have removed enriched uranium prior to the raid, saying: "Nothing was taken out... too dangerous, and very heavy and hard to movel"

OPERATION RED WEDDING: HOW ISRAEL EXECUTED A 'GAME OF THRONES' STYLE **COVERT MASSACRE ON IRAN'S** FLITE

Diary Times Desk: In a covert strike reminiscent of the infamous "Red Wedding" from Game of Thrones, Israeli military generals executed a meticulously planned operation on June 13th to eliminate Iran's top military commanders. Running parallel was Operation Narnia, a deadly mission that successfully assassinated nine of Iran's most prominent nuclear scientists - right at their homes in Tehran. These twin operations have now cemented Israel's standing as the undisputed military powerhouse in the region. "When we started to plan this thing in detail, it was very difficult to know that this would work," said Maj. Gen. Oded Basiuk, head of the Israeli military Operations Directorate and a key architect of the assault, according to The Wall Street Journal. The groundwork for this mission wasn't laid overnight. It dates back to mid-1990s when Israeli the intelligence first flagged Iran's clandestine efforts to develop nuclear weapons. CCTV CAPTURES DEADLY ATTACK ON GANGSTER BHAGWANPURIA'S FAMILY IN PUNJAB

Diary Times Desk : Gangster Jaggu Bhagwanpuria's mother and cousin were shot dead by two motorcycle-borne assailants late on Thursday night. Police sources claim Harjit Kaur, mother of Bhagwanpuria and a former sarpanch of her native Bhagwanpur village, which is located on the Batala-Dera Baba Nanak Road, and her nephew Karanveer Singh had just sat in their SUV in front of their residence on the Batala-Oadian road when two persons came on a motorcycle and fired gunshots at them. The assailants came near the vehicle and fired nearly 15 shots before making good their escape. CCTV cameras installed nearby captured the crime. A video of the shootout, carried out in one of the busiest areas of the city, soon went viral. The police have launched a massive drive to nab the accused. A police control room was immediately informed as passers-by took the two injured to the Civil Hospital. Karanveer succumbed to his injuries while on the way to the hospital. Harjit Kaur, who was referred by doctors to an Amritsar hospital. too, died on the way.

PUNJAB POLICE BUST ISI-BACKED BKI TERROR MODULE, NAB 3

Diary Times Desk : Punjab Police on Friday said they have busted a Pakistan's Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI)terror module named Babbar Khalsa backed International after nabbing three people, including a juvenile. Sehajpal Singh and Vikramjit Singh, both residents of Ramdas in Amritsar, have been arrested, while a 17-year-old boy has been nabbed during the intelligence-led operation carried out by State Special Operation Cell (SSOC), Mohali. Punjab Police chief Gaurav Yadav claimed the group was conspiring to carry out attacks on police establishments and targeted killings in the Amritsar area. "A major terror plot has been foiled, saving countless innocent lives," the DGP said. In a post on X, he said, "In an intelligence-led operation, the SSOC, Mohali has successfully busted a Pak ISI-backed Babbar Khalsa International terror module being operated by UK-based Nishan Sinah and Pakistan-based terrorist Harwinder Rinda. Three associates, including a juvenile, have been arrested." "During the operation, two hand grenades, one pistol, and ammunition were recovered. The nabbed accused have been identified as Sehajpal Singh and Vikramjit Singh, both residents of Ramdas in Amritsar Rural, along with a juvenile," he said.

NIA CHARGES 7 MEN FOR GRENADE ATTACK ON POLICE STATION IN BATALA BY KHALISTANI TERRORISTS

Diary Times Desk : The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has charaesheeted seven accused, including three absconders, in the December 2024 case related to the grenade attack on Gurdaspur police station by Babbar Khalsa International (BKI) terrorists, officials said on Friday. The terror attack on Ghanie Ke Bangar police station in Batala, Gurdaspur district, Punjab, was claimed on social media by BKI operatives Harpreet Singh alias Happy Passia and Gurpreet alias Gopi, they said. USbased Passia, along with Pakistan-based terrorist Harwinder Singh alias Rinda as well as Shamsher Singh alias Shera alias Honey, are the three absconders chargesheeted by the NIA in the case on Thursday before a court in Mohali, the officials said. The four arrested accused chargesheeted by the anti-terror agency have been identified as Kuljit Singh, Abhijot Singh, Gurjinder Singh and Shubham, all residents of Qila Lal Singh village, Batala, Punjab, according to a statement issued by the NIA. All seven accused have been charaesheeted under various sections of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act and Explosive Substances Act, as well as other related provisions, for their roles in the conspiracy and execution of the attack.

HARYANA CABINET CLEARS NEW LAND PURCHASE POLICY TO EMPOWER LANDOWNERS

Diary Times Desk : In a major decision aimed at protecting landowners from distress sales and ensuring smoother land acquisition for public projects, the Haryana Cabinet has approved the Voluntary Land Purchase Policy for Development Projects, 2025, Chaired by Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini, the Cabinet gave its nod to the new policy, which supersedes the earlier 2017 land purchase policy and incorporates several progressive reforms, including incentives for aggregators and online empanelment processes. "The policy provides a voluntary and participatory platform to landowners, enabling them to avoid distress sale and to actively contribute in decision-making for location of development projects," said a government spokesperson. The revised policy applies to government departments, boards, corporations and government companies, including entities of the Government of India that seek land for infrastructure or development purposes in Haryana.

HARYANA GOVT TO ISSUE JOINING LETTERS FOR 7,500 GROUP-D POSTS: CM NAYAB SAINI

Diary Times Desk : Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini today announced that joining letters for approximately 7,500 Group-D posts in Haryana would be issued shortly. The announcement came during a press briefing held after the Cabinet meeting. "The joining process for nearly 7,500 Group-D posts will commence soon," Saini said. Speaking on the Common Eligibility Test (CET), the Chief Minister said 13.48 lakh vouth had reaistered this year, compared to 11 lakh last year. He acknowledged technical issues on the SARAL portal but added that more than 3 lakh candidates from BC-A and BC-B categories, and an equal number from Scheduled Castes, had managed to download caste certificates and complete registration. "Those who could not download their certificates will still be allowed to appear for the exam. The pending formalities will be taken care of simultaneously," Saini assured. He also informed that departments have been instructed to rationalise posts and send updated requisitions to the Haryana Staff Selection Commission (HSSC), adding that some posts had become obsolete while new roles were being created to meet evolving needs. "This is a continuous and ongoing process of aligning human.

HEALTH DEPT TO LAUNCH PALLIATIVE CARE CAMPAIGN SHORTLY: HIMACHAL CM SUKHU

Diary Times Desk : Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu today directed the officials to identify eligible beneficiaries for palliative care with special focus on elderly persons requiring home based health care. While presiding over a meeting of Health Department here today, he said the state government would launch a comprehensive palliative care campaign shortly, aimed at offering doorstep medical services to elderly and patients across the state. Sukhu said ASHA workers and Community Health officers (CHOs) will identify the eligible beneficiaries and a team comprising of medical officer, physiotherapist from Aadarsh Swasthya Sansthan will visit the shortlisted beneficiaries to finalise the treatment plan. "The identification and planning process will be completed within three months of launch," he said. The CM said palliative and elderly care hubs would be established at Aadarsh Swasthva Sansthan, where two medical officers, two nurses, one physiotherapist and counsellor will provide health care services.

UNION MINISTER HARSH **MAHAJAN SLAMS CONGRESS FOR IMPOSING EMERGENCY IN 1975**

Diary Times Desk: Union Minister of State for Road, Transport & Highways and Corporate Affairs Harsh Mahajan launched a scathing attack on the Congress party on Thursday, marking the anniversary of the 50th imposition of the Emergency in India. Speaking to a section of the media in Dharamsala, Mahajan said on June 25, 1975, the democracy in India was "killed" by then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi, who imposed Emergency by citing vague internal and external threats to the country. "This decision was not the result of any war or rebellion," he stated. "It was an act of desperation aimed at stalling elections and clinging to power." Mahajan alleged that the Emergency was triggered by challenges to Indira leaal Gandhi's election and an effort to subvert democratic processes. During this period, he said the judiciary, legislature and executive were brought under tight control. The freedom of the press was crushed, electricity supply to major newspapers was cut.

DHARAMSALA FLASH FLOOD: MAGISTERIAL PROBE BEGINS; SDM TO CONDUCT INQUIRY AT MANUNI HYDRO PROJECT SITE

Diary Times Desk : A magisterial inquiry has been initiated into the devastating flash flood incident near Dharamsala's Manuni rivulet that claimed the lives of several labourers working at an under-construction hydroelectric power project. Sub-Divisional Magistrate (SDM) Mohit Rattan has begun the probe, following the recovery of six bodies, so far. At least 170 labourers, who had been trapped upstream near the project site, were rescued on the same day. One labourer was later found alive in a forest area, while fee others remain unaccounted for. District Magistrate Hemraj Bairwa confirmed that multiple departments, including Forest, Police, Electricity Board, Jal Shakti Vibhag, Mining, Labour, Him Urja, and the District Disaster Management Authority, will assist the SDM in the investigation. He has asked the SDM-led panel to submit the inquiry report within 48 hours to his office so that further action could be initiated accordingly. The SDM, along with officials from the relevant departments, will visit the project site on Saturday to conduct an on-the-spot assessment. The inquiry will focus on identifying the probable cause of the disaster, the extent of damage to life and property, and the vulnerabilities that may have contributed to the tragedy.

WILL TAKE ACTION AGAINST STAFFERS **INVOLVED IN DRUG TRAFFICKING: HIMACHAL CM**

Diary Times Desk : Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu today said that the state government would soon include one chapter on raising awareness about drug abuse in the school curriculum. Presiding over a function organised on the occasion of International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking, the Chief Minister warned that government would take stern action against employees involved in drug trafficking. He urged every section of the society to be a part and join the drive against drug abuse to make Himachal Pradesh a drug-free state. Sukhu said the state government was going to act tough against the government employees involved in drug trafficking. "I want to give a clear message to the people of the state that there is no place for drugs in Devbhoomi. The youth should join the fight against drugs, help themselves and others as well to come out of this evil," he stressed. "The state government has focused on providing employment opportunities and encouraging skill development for those recovering from addiction, thereby integrating them back into mainstream society," he said. He said the state government has approved the establishment of a fully equipped 100 bed de-addiction centre in Kotla Barog in Sirmaur.

EMERGENCY IMPOSED TO SAVE UNITY, INTEGRITY: AICC SPOKESPERSON

Diary Times Desk : As the BJP continues to criticise the Congress over the Emergency, AICC spokesperson Kuldeep Rathore on Friday claimed that it was imposed to save the unity and integrity of the country during a time of widespread unrest. "In the name of total revolution, students were being instigated to boycott classrooms and hit the streets. Workers were being asked to quit factories, and even attempts were made to instigate paramilitary forces," he said. Rathore also challenged the perception that a lot of atrocities were committed on the public during the Emergency. "The Janta Party government fell in just two and half years, and the Congress returned to power. Why would people bring back the Congress if atrocities had truly occurred?" asked Rathore. He further slammed the BJP for trying to portray that all good things have occurred after Narendra Modi became Prime Minister in 2014.

HIMACHAL MINING MAFIA ON THE LOOSE: DESPITE BAN, ILLEGAL SAND **EXTRACTION GOES ON**

Diary Times Desk : Despite clear directions from the district administration prohibiting residents from venturing near riverbeds due to the risk of flash floods, illegal miners continue to defy the warnings. Several individuals have been seen entering the swollen Neugal river to extract sand and stones, putting their lives at serious risk. A team from The Tribune visited the Thural area of Palampur this morning and spotted a tractor-trailer trapped in floodwaters while illegally extracting sand and stones. The incident underscores the extreme dangers of entering flood-prone rivers, especially in mining zones where water levels can rise suddenly and without warning. Every year, a complete ban on mining in rivers and rivulets is imposed before the onset of the monsoon to ensure the safety of those involved in such activities. However, this year, the mining department has yet to issue any such directive. This administrative laxity could result in disaster. In fact, the department appears to have learned no lesson from a recent tragedy in which 15 labourers were washed away in Muayuni Khud near Dharamsala.

SEVERAL CHANGES MADE TO ICC PLAYING CONDITIONS

Diary Times Desk : Changes in regard to the use of balls in ODIs, boundary catches, concussion replacements and Test match pace of play headline updated ICC Playing Conditions. A move back to one ball per innings in the last 16 overs in a One Day International, a new ruling pertaining to boundary catches and the use of stop clocks introduced in Test matches headline a range of changes in the updated ICC (International Cricket Council) Playing Conditions. The new playing conditions also include changes to concussion replacement processes, the DRS wicket zone and deliberate short runs. The changes were recommended by the ICC Men's Cricket Committee, headed by Sourav Ganguly and including playing participation in over 2000 international matches across its members. Two new balls will be used for the first 34 overs of an ODI innings, after which the fielding team will choose one of the balls for the remaining overs. Changes to the playing conditions now require a fielder who makes airborne contact with the ball beyond the boundary to then land and remain inside the boundary. A fielder, after making their first contact with the ball subsequently leaves the field of play, can only make contact with the ball once more while airborne beyond the boundary.

ASHWIN, UNLIKE SUNIL GAVASKAR, URGES RISHABH PANT NOT TO DO 'FRONT FLIP' CELEBRATION: 'HE HAS NOTHING TO PROVE'


Diary Times Desk : Legendary India spinner Ravichandran Ashwin has urged Rishabh Pant not to do his trademark front flip celebration after scoring a century. The wicketkeeper batter scored twin centuries in the Leeds Test against England, while he celebrated his first innings ton with a somersault celebration to enthral fans at Headingley. However, in the second innings, despite demand from legendary Sunil Gavaskar from the stands, he didn't replicate the same celebration and went for another one. However, Ashwin requested Pant avoid his now-famous front flips, especially in Tests. He said he has nothing to prove and is already a top batter in the lineup. "I've only one request, please don't do that front flip. In Tests, your body gets tired unlike in IPL where you will not play more than 50-60 balls. He is a bona fide top batter in the Indian lineup. So he has nothing to prove," Ashwin said on his YouTube channel. He became the second wicketkeeper in cricket history to score centuries in both innings of a Test match after Andy Flower. The wicketkeeper also pulled off a similar celebration after scoring a century for Lucknow Super Giants in their last match of IPL 2025.

BUMRAH NOT THE ONLY PACER TO SKIP INDIA'S NET SESSION AHEAD OF 2ND TEST, GAMBHIR'S ACT HINTS AT MULTIPLE CHANGES: REPORT

Diary Times Desk : Team India has hit reset mode in Birmingham ahead of the second Test against England, but as the nets rolled out at Edgbaston, all eyes were firmly on one man: Jasprit Bumrah. While the rest of the squad shook off the Leeds loss with an intense training session, India's premier pacer was present but notably stayed away from any on-field activity, according to a report from Times of India, keeping the discussion around his workload very much alive. However, Bumrah wasn't the only one absent from the nets. Prasidh Krishna. who took five wickets in the first Test but leaked runs at over 6rpo in both inninas, didn't take part in the net session, either. While it has been reported that Bumrah is likely to skip the second Test as part of his workload management, Prasidh's absence from the training session is likely to spark speculations over whether India are eyeing a bowling overhaul for Edgbaston. Bumrah had bowled a taxing 44 overs in the series opener, and while he remains the standout figure in India's depleted attack, the team management is considering workload balance with an eye on long-term fitness.

WEST INDIES STAR CRICKETER ACCUSED OF SEXUAL ASSAULT, RAPE BY 11 WOMEN: REPORT

Diary Times Desk : An unnamed West Indies men's cricketer has been accused of several counts of sexual assault, sexual harrasment and rape, as per reports in West Indies-based media outlets. According to a video report by Caribbean-based SportsMax TV, the cricketer in question is from Guyana and is a part of the current national team setup. Further information in the video report states that the cricketer has been accused by at least 11 women. However, no charge has been filed as of yet against the cricketer. Cricket West Indies (CWI) has also refused to comment on the matter. The report appears to have emerged originally from Guyana-based newspaper Kaieteur Sports. The report further contained this revelation: "I have heard accounts from no fewer than eleven women, one of them a teenager, who allege that they have been sexually assaulted, raped, or subjected to unwanted sexual advances by him." As per the subsequent video report, there have also allegedly been significant attempts to cover up the player and his actions.



ZIMBABWE, SOUTH AFRICA MEET IN 'THANK YOU SERIES'

Queens is a long way from Lord's in every sense, but there is no doubt Zimbabwe's second city is far friendlier than London. Doubtless the will champions have been welcomed in style, because Zimbabweans do not hesitate to be hospitable. Indeed, the mayor of Bulawayo himself, David Coltart, has been in touch to organise a reception. The cricket itself might also be friendly. Blessing Muzarabani and Kwena Maphaka are likely to be the only bowlers picked who could do batters damage, which they might struggle with given they will play on one of the most docile pitches in world cricket.

SUNIL GAVASKAR WARNS FANS ON FAKES QUOTES ATTRIBUTED TO HIM: FACT-CHECK AND VERIFY

Diary Times Desk : Indian cricket legend, Sunil Gavaskar highlighted how several sports websites and individual accounts have been attributing fake quotes under his name and has warned fans to be aware of such activity on social media. Gavaskar shared a video on his Instagram handle where he highlighted the issue. The Indian batting great has been a part of the coverage for the ongoing Test series between England and India. He has not specifically mentioned the quotes or the sources that have spreading been the false information. "Over the last few months, it has come to my notice that a lot of sports websites and individual accounts have been attributing comments and quotes to me that I've never made. I request everybody to verify, fact-check, and not to believe everything that they write, particularly coming from some of these individual accounts and sports websites," Gavaskar shared. Gavaskar's comments have been going viral, especially during the first Test when Rishabh Pant scored a century in the first innings.
