GLOBAL PLASTICS TREATY

INDIA BACKS LIKE-MINDED GROUP; OPPOSES GLOBAL PHASE-OUT LIST IN PLASTICS TREATY TALKS



Diary Times Desk: For the first time in the global plastics treaty negotiations, India has openly opposed the inclusion of any global list with phase-out dates under the article on plastic products — a move that puts it squarely alongside Kuwait and the Like-Minded Group (LMG) of countries that includes Saudi Arabia, Russia, and Iran.

Speaking at the second part of the fifth session of the Intergovernmental Negotiating Committee (INC-5.2) in Geneva, Vir Vikram Yadav, Chairman of the Central Pollution Control Board and member of India's delegation, warned that such provisions would have "larger implications in respect of the right to development of Member States" and should be avoided.

"The instrument needs to have a clearly defined scope... Separate article on supply or any measures to regulate the production of primary plastic polymers has larger implications... Similarly, inclusion of any global list with phase-out dates under the article on plastic products should be avoided," Yadav told the stocktake plenary.

India also reiterated that all decisions should be taken by consensus and that the treaty's scope should focus strictly on "addressing plastic pollution only" as mandated by the 5/14 resolution, without overlapping with other multilateral bodies such as the WTO or WHO.

The stance aligns with Kuwait's call, on behalf of the Arab Group, for a "party-driven process" and for avoiding irreconcilable issues, as well as with Iran's rejection of stand-alone texts on scope, supply, and exemptions. This bloc has resisted broadening the treaty's mandate to include production caps or health provisions and has pushed for more procedural control by member states.

8 KILLED AS WALL COLLAPSES AMID HEAVY RAIN IN DELHI

Diary Times Desk: At least eight people were killed after a wall collapsed amid heavy rain in Delhi's Hari Nagar this morning, officials said.

The fire department received a call about the incident at 9.16 am, and three fire trucks were rushed to the spot along with police teams, the Delhi Fire Service said.

The victims were identified as Shabibul (30), Rabibul (30), Muttu Ali (45), Rubina (25), Dolly (25), Rukhsana (6) and Haseena (7).

The exact cause of the collapse is yet to be ascertained, officials said.

The national capital recorded heavy rain overnight, causing waterlogging in several areas

In the 24 hours till 8.30 am on Saturday, Delhi's primary weather station at Safdarjung recorded 78.7 mm of rainfall, Pragati Maidan 100 mm, Lodhi Road 80 mm, Pusa 69 mm, and Palam 31.8 mm, according to data shared by the weather department.

The temperature was recorded at 23.8 degrees Celsius on Saturday morning, 3.2 notches below the average.



2 SOLDIERS KILLED IN ACTION DURING ENCOUNTER WITH TERRORISTS IN J&K'S KULGAM

Diary Times Desk: Two army soldiers were killed in action during a close combat with terrorists in Jammu and Kashmir's Kulgam district as the gunfight entered its ninth day on Saturday.

This is one of the longest encounters between terrorists and security forces in Jammu and Kashmir in the recent past as terrorists appear to be well entrenched in a densely forest area. "Chinar Corps honours the supreme sacrifice of the Bravehearts, L/Nk Pritpal Singh and Sep Harminder Singh, in line of duty for the Nation. Their courage and dedication will forever inspire us. IndianArmy expresses deepest condolences and stand in solidarity with the bereaved families. Operation continues" Army's 15 Corps headquarters said in a post on X.

Official sources said two more soldiers were injured in the overnight gunbattle, taking the number of injured to 10. Hundreds of troops are involved in one of the biggest anti-terrorist operations to track down hiding terrorists.

Diary Times Desk: The Delhi Metro Rail Corporation (DMRC) on Saturday said it recorded its highest-ever daily ridership on August 8 with 81.87 lakh passenger journeys across all

The previous record was 78.67 lakh journeys on November 18, 2024. Other high ridership days include August 20, 2024, with 77.48 lakh journeys, and February 13, 2024, with 71.09 lakh journeys, officials said.

To cater to the festive rush for Raksha Bandhan, DMRC operated 92 additional trips on August 8 and is running 455 extra trips on August 9 to provide more carrying capacity, the corporation said.

"These figures reflect the growing trust of commuters in the Metro's reliability, punctuality and seamless connectivity across Delhi-NCR," a DMRC official added.



FIRST-EVER FREIGHT TRAIN ARRIVES IN VALLEY, MARKS NEW ERA OF LOGISTICAL, ECONOMIC GROWTH



Diary Times Desk: In yet another boost to Jammu and Kashmir's transportation network, the Indian Railways on Saturday ran a freight train for the first time from Rupnagar in Punjab to Anantnag in Kashmir.

The freight train, carrying cement, reached Anantnag Goods Shed in the Kashmir Valley on Saturday around 12 noon, marking a major milestone in connecting the Kashmir region to the national freight network. The goods train comes two months after the successful launch of passenger operations on the complete stretch of 272-km Udhampur–Srinagar–Baramula Rail Link (USBRL), or Kashmir line, in June this year. The freight connectivity is expected to give a new lease of life to Kashmiri fruit and handicraft industry by easing access to markets across the country.

"The arrival of freight train in Kashmir Valley heralds a new era of logistical and economic growth," the Railway Ministry said in a statement, calling it a historical development. "(It) is not just a logistical achievement but a powerful symbol of progress and integration, paving the way for a more connected and prosperous Kashmir Valley," said the ministry.

THREAT OF LANDSLIDE LOOMS OVER SIX VILLAGES OF KULLU DISTRICT, TEAM OF GEOLOGISTS WILL CONDUCT SURVEY

Diary Times Desk: Threat of landslide looms over six villages of Kullu district of Himachal Pradesh namely Ghaliad, Darmedha, Talinga, Balu, Kubni and Raunal. Out of these, Ghaliad village of Tirthan valley of Banjar and Darmedha village of Sainj are at greater risk. In view of this, the district administration will get Darmedha and Ghaliad villages surveyed by a team of geologists. More than 100 people from about 30 families live in Ghaliad village of Tirthan valley of Banjar and Darmedha village of Sainj. The district administration has decided to get a survey conducted by a team of geologists regarding the threat of landslide looming over these villages. Geologists will examine the soil of both the villages and will find out the reason for the danger of the hills cracking from behind the villages. Regarding this, SDM Banjar has started preparing a report and it will be sent to the Geological Survey of India through the district administration for survey.

Landslides have been occurring from the hill behind Darmedha village for about two weeks and about 60 members of 14 families of the village are in panic. The administration has also distributed tents for their safety. Arrangements have been made for them to stay in the rest house of Great Himalayan National Park in Ropa. Some people are forced to stay in the rest house while many people are forced to stay at their close relatives' place. Villagers Chet Ram and Rameshwar Thakur said that the danger is not over. The series of landslides from behind the village continues. Landslides are also continuously occurring from the hill behind Ghaliad village of Tirthan Valley of Banjar. The houses of the village are in danger. In view of this, the administration has already evacuated 10 houses of the village. The families are being accommodated in tents in safe places.

HIMACHAL WEATHER: 362 ROADS BLOCKED IN THE STATE, ALERT FOR HEAVY RAIN FOR FOUR DAYS, 219 PEOPLE DEAD IN MONSOON SO FAR

Diary Times Desk: Himachal Weather: 362 roads blocked in the state, alert for heavy rain for four days, 219 people dead in monsoon so far In Himachal Pradesh, 362 roads are closed due to landslides caused by rain. The difficulties of the people have increased due to the closure of roads in the middle of the apple season. It has become difficult to transport fruits and vegetable crops to the market. Till Saturday evening, 613 power transformers and 520 water supply schemes were also closed in the state. 220 roads, 202 power transformers and 78 water supply schemes are still blocked in the disaster-hit Mandi district. 91 roads, 393 power transformers and 367 water supply schemes are closed in Kullu district. Waterlogging occurred at many places in Una district due to rain. Maize crop has also been damaged due to water accumulation in the fields.

Director of Mushroom Directorate, Dr. VP Sharma said that scientists have done successful research on growing Gucchi in greenhouse. Now research is being done on seeds and size. When the seeds are ready, it can be grown in every season. The quality of Gucchi grown naturally and in greenhouse is the same. A presentation was also given on Gucchi in the conference, in which scientists shared their research on the success achieved so far.

'ENORMOUS MISTAKE': FORMER TRUMP AIDE SAYS 50% TARIFF ON INDIA COULD BACKFIRE FOR US

Diary Times Desk: John Bolton, former US National Security Advisor, has cautioned regarding President Donald Trump's 50 per cent tariff imposition on India. In an interview with CNN, Bolton highlighted Trump's approach as risky, leading to the deepening of India's ties with Russia and China instead of America. He called Trump's decision an "enormous mistake" and called out the president for showing bias towards Beijing over New Delhi.

Outcomes of high tariffs on India In the CNN interview, he said, "Trump's tariffs against India are intended to hurt Russia but they could push India closer to Russia and to China to oppose these tariffs." Highlighting the bias, Ex-NSA added, "Trump's leniency on the Chinese, and heavy-handed tariffs on India, jeopardise decades of American efforts to bring India away from Russia and China."

Mr Pawar's comments coincided with the Maharashtra Congress' observance of the 83rd anniversary of the Quit India Movement.

MORE IMAGES SHOW BATTERING THAT PAK AIR FORCE TOOK IN OPERATION SINDOOR

Diary Times Desk: Several new images of Pakistani military targets struck by India during Operation Sindoor clearly show the neighbouring country's forces, especially its air assets, took a sound beating.

The images were part of a presentation shared by Air Chief Marshal AP Singh earlier today, who for the first time announced the Indian Air Force (IAF) shot down five Pakistani fighter jets and a large aircraft.

The aim of the presentation was to cover what happened during Operation Sindoor and the IAF's thought process during the short but swift conflict that began with the killing of 26 tourists in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam by Pakistan-linked terrorists.

"NORMAL PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE": KIREN RIJIJU ON NEW INCOME TAX BILL

Diary Times Desk: Amid criticism of the new Income Tax Bill's withdrawal from the Lok Sabha, Union Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju said that introducing a Bill in Parliament after necessary amendments is a normal procedure.

The new income Tax Bill was withdrawn from the Lok Sabha on Friday and will be tabled in the House by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Monday after incorporating around 285 suggestions by a Select Committee, BJP member Baijayant Panda. Concerns were raised over the Bill's withdrawal, especially on social media.

"It is being presumed that there will be an absolutely new bill, ignoring the earlier bill for which a lot of work was done, and all the work done and time spent will go down," Mr Rijiju said.

"It is a normal convention that when a Select Committee submits a report and there are several amendments which are suggested and accepted by the government, the earlier bill is withdrawn and a new bill with all the amendments as accepted is introduced, so that it becomes easier for the Parliament to consider and pass the bill".

SHARAD PAWAR CLAIMS 'SEAT GUARANTEE' OFFERED AHEAD OF POLLS, D FADNAVIS SAYS...

Diary Times Desk: NCP (SP) chief Sharad Pawar has claimed that ahead of the Maharashtra Assembly elections, two individuals approached him offering a "guarantee" of 160 seats for the Opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi alliance, well above the 145 needed for a majority in the 288-member House.

"I introduced them to Rahul Gandhi. He dismissed the offer and felt we should not get involved in such matters, but instead go directly to the people," Mr Pawar said in Nagpur.

This marks the first time in recent years that the veteran leader has publicly questioned the Election Commission of India (ECI). The BJP has countered that if the incident was genuine, Pawar should have alerted authorities at the time.

Reacting to Pawar's statement, Chief Minister Fadnavis questioned its timing. "Why did Mr Pawar remember this after meeting Rahul Gandhi? For many years, even though Rahul spoke of EVMs, Mr Pawar said it was wrong to raise such doubts. This change is the impact of their meeting," he said.

'INDIA HAS INDEPENDENT STANDING': ECONOMIST JEFFREY SACHS CALLS DONALD TRUMP'S TARIFFS 'UNCONSTITUTIONAL'

Diary Times Desk: Famed economist Jeffrey Sachs has warned that India would not reap any security benefits by siding with the United States.

Sachs' statement comes amid US President Donald Trump's imposing 50 percent tariffs on imports from India. According to the economist, US politicians do not care about India.

"US politicians don't care at all about India. Please understand this. India is not going to reap long-term security by siding with the United States in the Quad against China. India is a great power that has an independent standing in the world. Everything that Trump is doing on tariffs is unconstitutional," said Sachs during an interview with Hindustan Times

Sachs explained that India should not count on some great trade relationship with the US, even though New Delhi could reduce Washington's dependence on the Chinese supply chains.

"When I was in India in the spring, I said, don't count on some great trade relationship.

RAILWAYS ANNOUNCES DISCOUNT ON RETURN JOURNEY TICKETS AHEAD OF FESTIVE SEASON

Diary Times Desk: The Ministry of Railways has announced an experimental "Round Trip Package for Festival Rush" scheme aimed at easing passenger congestion and ensuring smoother travel during the upcoming festive season.

According to a Railway Board circular issued on August 8, the scheme offers a 20 per cent rebate on the base fare of the return journey for passengers booking confirmed tickets for both onward and return travel for the same set of passengers, class, and origin-destination pair.

The initiative aims to redistribute crowding, facilitate hassle-free bookings, and enhance the utilisation of train services, including special trains, in both directions.

Under the scheme, bookings will open on August 14, 2025, for onward journeys scheduled between October 13 and October 26, 2025. The corresponding return journey must be booked using the connecting journey feature for travel between November 17 and December 1, 2025. Advance reservation period norms will not apply to the return journey booking. The scheme will be valid across all classes and trains, except those operating with flexi-fare pricing, and will only apply to confirmed tickets.

On Wednesday, Iran executed a nuclear scientist named Rouzbeh Vadi, who was convicted of spying for Israel and passing on information on another nuclear scientist killed in Israel's air strikes on Iran in June, state media reported.

Judiciary spokesperson Asghar Jahangiri told reporters in Tehran on Saturday that charges against some of the 20 suspects arrested had been dropped, and they were released. He did not give a number.

"The judiciary will show no leniency toward spies and agents of the Zionist regime, and with firm rulings, will make an example of them all," Jahangiri was quoted as saying by Iranian media.

INDIA ENDORSES US-RUSSIA SUMMIT IN: DONALD TRUMP REPEATS ROLE IN INDIA-**PAKISTAN TRUCE: ARMENIA AND AZERBAIJAN SAY HE DESERVES NOBEL**

Diary Times Desk: US President Donald Trump on Friday renewed his claims of brokering peace between India and Pakistan while signing a peace accord between Armenia and Azerbaijan at the White House. He also highlighted his role as a mediator in several other countries, including Thailand and Cambodia

After the signing of the accords, the leaders of Armenia and Azerbaijan also stated that they would nominate Donald Trump for the Nobel Peace Prize for the historic agreement, news agencies reported. Azerbaijan President Aliyev said that both countries will issue a joint letter for the Nobel Peace Prize, stating, "Who, if not President Trump, deserves the Nobel Peace Prize?

Speaking at the ceremony alongside the leaders of Armenia and Azerbaijan, Trump said, "Today's signing follows our success with India and Pakistan.

Purported videos on social media showed people running away from the scene and police cordoning off the area and attending to the wounded people. A suspect has been reportedly taken into custody and is being questioned. No charges have been pressed so far.

"NOT GOING TO OCCUPY GAZA, WILL FREE IT FROM HAMAS": NETANYAHU AMID **BACKLASH**

Diary Times Desk: Israel's military will "take control" of Gaza City under a new plan approved by Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's security cabinet, touching off a wave of criticism Friday from both inside and outside

Nearly two years into the war in Gaza, Netanyahu faces mounting pressure to secure a truce to pull the territory's more than two million people back from the brink of famine and free the hostages held by Palestinian militants. Israel's foe Hamas, whose October 7, 2023 attack triggered the war, denounced the plan to expand the fighting as a "new war crime".

Staunch Israeli ally Germany meanwhile took the extraordinary step of halting military exports out of concern they could be used in Gaza, a move Netanyahu slammed as a reward for Hamas.

Under the newly approved plan to "defeat" Hamas, the Israeli army "will prepare to take control of Gaza City while distributing humanitarian assistance to the civilian population outside combat zones", the premier's office said Friday.

Netanyahu in a post on X said "we are not going to occupy Gaza -- we are going to free Gaza from Hamas".



UK POLICE ARREST AT LEAST 200 PEOPLE AT PALESTINE ACTION **PROTEST IN LONDON**

Diary Times Desk: Police in London say they have arrested at least 200 people at a protest in support of the group Palestine Action, which was classified as a "terror organisation" by the British government last month.

The Metropolitan Police said on Saturday that 200 demonstrators had been arrested at Parliament Square "for showing support for a proscribed organisation".

"It will take time, but we will arrest anyone expressing support for Palestine Action," the police force said in an earlier post on X.

The arrests are the latest at a series of protests denouncing the government's ban on Palestine Action, a move critics say infringes on freedom of speech and the right to protest, as well as aims to stifle demonstrations against Israel's war on the Gaza Strip.

Under the Terrorism Act 2000, membership in or support for the group is now a criminal offence punishable by up to 14 years in prison.

Reporting from Parliament Square on Saturday, Al Jazeera's Sonia Gallego said the threat of arrest or punishment "hasn't deterred any supporters" of Palestine Action from expressing their backing for the group.

VANCE AND LAMMY HOST UKRAINE TALKS AHEAD OF US-RUSSIA SUMMIT

US Vice-President JD Vance and UK Foreign Secretary David Lammy are hosting a meeting of senior security officials near London to discuss the war in Ukraine.

Earlier on Saturday, UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer had a call with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky, and said they agreed it would be a "vital forum" to discuss progress towards

. Zelensky has stressed he will make no territorial concessions to Russia ahead of a summit between US President Donald Trump and Russian President Vladimir Putin next week to discuss the future of the war.

Trump earlier signalled Ukraine may have to cede territory to end the war, which began with Russia's full-scale invasion in February 2022.

Saturday's meeting is understood to be taking place at Chevening, Lammy's official country residence in Kent, where Vance and his family are currently staying, and to have been called at the request of the US.

Senior security officials from the US, Ukraine and Europe will take part.

PUNJAB SOLDIER'S WIFE MOURNS, HER HANDS STILL ADORNING MEHNDI, ARMS WITH WEDDING BANGLES MOVE MANY TO TEARS

Diary Times Desk: Army soldier Lance Naik Pritpal Singh was killed during an anti-terrorist operation in the dense forests of Kulgam, Jammu and Kashmir, on Friday night. Another soldier who was killed has bene identified as Sepoy Harminder Singh from Badinpur (Mandi Gobindgarh).

The operation has been ongoing since August 1. His family in Khanna's Manupur village was informed at 5 am on Saturday.

The devastating news shattered the household, especially his wife Manpreet Kaur, who had married Pritpal just six months ago on February 26.

The sight of her hands still adorned with mehndi and arms with wedding bangles moved many to tears.

Pritpal joined the Indian Army in 2015, right after completing his Class 12. He is survived by his elderly parents, wife, and two brothers, Manpreet and Harpreet Singh. The family said they were dependent on him financially and emotionally.



PUNJAB MINISTER BAINS CLEANS DEVOTEES' FOOTWEAR AS PART OF 'TANKAH' FOR SRINAGAR EVENT

Diary Times Desk : Punjab Education Minister Harjot Singh Bains today undertook 'tankah' (religious atonement) at Gurudwara Shishganj Sahib in Anandpur Sahib. The "tankah" was imposed by five Sikh high priests, including the officiating Jathedar of the Akal Takht, for permitting song and dance during an event commemorating Guru Tegh Bahadur's 350th martyrdom anniversary in Srinagar – an act deemed a violation of Sikh maryada (code of conduct). As part of the penalty, Bains was ordered to undertake a barefoot pilgrimage: walking from the Golden Temple to Gurdwara Guru Ke Mahal, visiting Gurdwara Kotha Sahib and Gurdwara Baba Bakala, and offering prayers at Gurdwara Sis Ganj Sahib in Delhi. He was also directed to perform two days of sewa (voluntary service) including cleaning devotees' footwear and sweeping the gurdwara premises in Anandpur Sahib, offer a deg (karah prasad) worth Rs 1,100, and join in ardas seeking forgiveness. Additionally, he is to repair and maintain roads leading to these sacred sites - a first in incorporating infrastructure work into such religious atonement

LAND POOLING POLICY NOTIFIED IN HASTE; LACKS SOCIAL, ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STUDIES: HC

Diary Times Desk: The Punjab and Haryana High Court has come down strongly on Punjab's Land Pooling Policy-2025. The court asserts that the state proposed to take over "tens of thousands of acres of fertile land" for proposed development work without carrying out social or environmental impact assessment studies. "We are, prima facie, of the view that the policy appears to have been notified in haste and all concerns, including social impact assessment, environmental impact assessment, timelines, and redressal grievance mechanism should have been addressed at the very outset in the policy before its notification," the division bench of Justice Anupinder Singh Grewal and Justice Deepak Manchanda asserted.

CONGRESS MLA SUKHPAL KHAIRA'S FORMER PSO HELD IN 2015 DRUGS CASE



Diary Times Desk: Punjab Finance Minister Harpal Singh Cheema on Saturday said police have arrested Joga Singh, former personal security officer of Congress MLA Sukhpal Singh Khaira, in a 2015 drug case.

He said Joga had been absconding after being named as an accused on September 28, 2023, and despite numerous police raids, he remained at large.

His bail was denied by the Fazilka session court in October 2023 and thereafter by the Punjab and Haryana High Court in January 2024, said Cheema.

Joga was detained by the immigration authorities at the New Delhi airport as he was attempting to flee to Australia, said the finance minister.

He was caught as a look-out circular (LoC) was active against him since November 2023.

Joga was produced before a court in Jalalabad, which granted a five-day police remand.

Cheema alleged that Joga played a key role in facilitating communication between Khaira and siblings Gurdev Singh and his UK-based sister, Charanjit Kaur.

OVER 2,000 ADVOCATES DEMAND URGENT JUDGE APPOINTMENTS, END TO 'JUDGE-SON' NEXUS

Diary Times Desk: In a sweeping call for systemic overhaul in judicial appointments, more than 2,000 advocates have backed a requisition seeking the immediate filling up of approximately 283 vacant high court judges' posts, including 35 (now 26 after oath of 10 judges on August 4) in the Punjab and Haryana High Court, warning that judicial delays, institutional favouritism, and in-breeding are threatening the credibility and independence of the higher judiciary.

HARSIMRAT BADAL TIES RAKHI TO BROTHER MAJITHIA IN NABHA JAIL AFTER HIGH-VOLTAGE DRAMA

Diary Times Desk: Former minister and Member of Parliament Harsimrat Kaur Badal on Saturday visited Nabha jail and tied a rakhi to her brother, Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) leader Bikram Singh Majithia, who was arrested in a disproportionate assets case.

Majithia is lodged in New Nabha jail at Patiala after the Mohali court extended his judicial custody until August 14.

However, high-voltage drama unfolded before the ceremony this afternoon as Harsimrat lambasted the government for not letting her tie a Rakhi to her brother.

"I came amidst the rain from Delhi to tie a Rakhi on the wrist of my brother, Bikram Majithia, who is lodged in Nabha jail on false charges, but was denied this right. I have been trying for the last four days to get permission to observe Raksha Bandhan with my brother, but to no avail."

"Earlier, Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann denied me permission to visit my brother in jail for 1.5 months. AAP Punjab has stooped to a new low by disrespecting the sacred bond between a brother and a sister and has also violated my human rights," said Badal in a social media post on x

ON WAY TO TIE RAKHI, 80-YEAR-OLD WOMAN DIES WHILE BOARDING BUS IN PUNJAB'S SULTANPUR LODHI

Diary Times Desk: An 80-year-old woman died after a fall while boarding a bus at the Dudwindi bus stop in Sultanpur Lodhi. The victim, identified as Krishna Kaur, wife of Swarn Singh and a resident of Mothanwal village in Kapurthala district, reportedly slipped while trying to board the bus. She fell on the ground, and one of the bus' tyres ran over her leg, fracturing a bone.

Bystanders and police personnel rushed her to the Civil Hospital in Sultanpur Lodhi, but she succumbed to her injuries during treatment. Family members alleged that the accident was the result of negligence on the part of the bus driver and conductor, insisting that Krishna Kaur was in good health and spirits before the incident. They have demanded strict legal action against those responsible.

Diary Times Desk: The Himachal Pradesh government is working on a three-tier policy to check haphazard construction near the banks of rivers and nullahs, as well as flash floods and landslide-prone areas, Town and Country Planning Minister Rajesh Dharmani said on Saturday.

Safety norms and strict regulations would be brought to regulate the construction of houses in rural areas, the minister said.

Construction of buildings, bridges and other structures would require certification by a safety council, and their designs are as per norms set by the public works department, he told PTI Videos.

So far, about 112 people have died in rain-related incidents in the current monsoon season as cloudbursts, flash floods and landslides wreaked havoc, with losses of over Rs 1,900 crore to the state.


SIX KILLED AS BOULDER CRUSHES CAR IN CHAMBA, VEHICLE PLUNGES INTO GORGE

Diary Times Desk: In a tragic accident on Thursday night, six persons, including four members of a family, lost their lives when a boulder fell on the car they were travelling in, causing it to veer off the road and plunge into a gorge near Chanwas in Churah subdivision of Chamba district

The police said victims were travelling to their village when a massive rock rolled down from the hillside and hit their vehicle. Local residents, upon hearing a loud crash rushed to the spot and also informed the police. A joint rescue team comprising police and home guard personnel also reached the spot. Bodies could be extricated after hours-long operation due to a sheer slope.

The deceased have been identified as Rajesh Kumar, a 40-year-old government school teacher, his wife Hanso, 36, their daughter Aarti, 17, and son Deepak 15, residents of Bulwas village, said Chamba Superintendent of Police Abhishek Yadav.

Also among the dead were Rajesh's brother-in-law Hem Pal, 37, a resident of Salancha, and a villager Rakesh Kumar, 44, from Bulwas, who had taken lift in the ill-fated car.



Diary Times Desk: American travel vlogger Drew Binsky has shared a chilling account of being stranded in Himachal Pradesh, caught in the chaos of massive landslides during peak monsoon season.

In a now-viral Instagram video, Binsky described the danger, saying, "There are actually 20 landslides within 10 miles of us right now. Absolutely insane and very scary."

Filming from the scene, Binsky showed the damage around him, blocked roads, and rising rivers.

"We don't know how many days we'll be stuck. Rocks are still falling. All the workers are trying to fix it," he said. "We're basically stuck in no man's land for an unknown amount of time."

The video, viewed nearly 4.5 lakh times, drew concern and mixed reactions. While many sympathised and wished him well, others questioned his decision to travel during the monsoon.

"Avoid mountain areas during monsoon," one user warned. Another commented, "You're brave, but this wasn't the best time to visit."



LANDSLIDES HALT TRAFFIC ON MANDI-KULLU HIGHWAY; ALTERNATIVE ROUTE CLOSED TOO

Diary Times Desk: With light to moderate rain in the past 24 hours, flash floods and landslides continued in various locations across Himachal Pradesh, and a total of 358 roads, including two national highways, were closed on Friday, officials said.

The Chandigarh-Manali National Highway 21, which was opened after 40 hours on Thursday afternoon, was closed again on Friday following a landslide in Mandi district, while the Auto-Sainj road NH 305 was blocked near Jahed and Banjar in Kullu district.

Reports of damage to private orchards have also poured in from the Narkanda-Shilaroo area of the Shimla district as floods from drains entered the lands.

A landslide occurred on the road in front of the famous Baba Balak Nath Temple, Diyotsiddha, in the Hamirpur district of Himachal Pradesh on Friday.

The local MeT office issued a yellow warning of heavy rain accompanied by thunderstorms and lightning in three to six districts on Saturday and Sunday, and an orange alert of heavy rains in isolated areas of the state from Monday to Thursday.

'WORLD-CLASS POTENTIAL' - SESKO JOINS MAN UTD FOR £74M


Diary Times Desk : Manchester United have completed the signing of RB Leipzig striker Benjamin Sesko in a move worth £73.7m.

FROM 150S TO DEBUT HEROICS: NZ'S HISTORIC BULAWAYO WIN IN NUMBERS

Diary Times Desk: Innings and 359 runs win against Zimbabwe in Bulawayo is New Zealand's biggest victory margin in terms of runs in Tests. Overall, this is the third biggest innings win margin in Test cricket. The previous largest (by innings and 301 runs) for them was against the same opponent in Napier in 2012. This is also the heaviest defeat for Zimbabwe in Tests. The top three best wins for New Zealand have come against Zimbabwe.

This is the second time New Zealand has won by innings and 300-plus runs, only the third team to do so after West Indies (3) and Australia. Zimbabwe also became the second team to lose by innings and 300-plus runs twice after New Zealand.

601/3 dec. by New Zealand in the 2nd innings is their highest team total against Zimbabwe, bettering 582/4 dec. at the same venue in 2016. This is also the sixth-highest team total against Zimbabwe in Tests. This effort by New Zealand is also the sixth most runs by any team while losing just three or fewer wickets in a Test inning. 476-run lead by New Zealand after their first innings is the 3rd biggest first-innings lead by any team while declaring after losing just three wickets.
