INDIA'S MODI VOWS TO PROTECT FARMERS, CUTS TAX, PUSHES SELF-RELIANCE AMID TRUMP TARIFF TENSIONS

With the punishing tariffs imposed on Indian exports by U.S. President Donald Trump expected to hurt growth in the world's fastest growing major economy, Modi announced lower goods and services taxes (GST) from October - a move that could help boost consumption. He also announced India would set up a new defence system Sudarshan Chakra' in the aftermath of India's four-day military conflict with Pakistan in

He did not elaborate but a government statement said the system is aimed at neutralising enemy infiltrations and enhancing India's offensive capabilities. Indian defence and policy circles have informally referred to the Russian S-400 air defence system - which played a key role during the fighting with Pakistan - as Sudarshan Chakra, after a Hindu

Modi was addressing the nation on the occasion of its Independence Day at a time New Delhi has been struggling with Trump's tariffs and the collapse of trade talks, largely due to differences over imports of American farm and dairy products. "Farmers, fishermen, cattle rearers are our top priorities," Modi said in his customary annual address from the ramparts of the Red Fort in New Delhi. "Modi will stand like a wall against any policy that threatens their interests. India will never compromise when it comes to protecting the interests of our farmers," he said. Modi did not mention the tariffs or the U.S. in his speech that lasted nearly two hours. Last week, Trump imposed an additional 25% tariff on Indian goods, citing New Delhi's continued imports of Russian oil in a move that sharply escalated tensions

GLOBAL PLASTIC TALKS COLLAPSE AS COUNTRIES REMAIN DEEPLY

Diary Times Desk: Global talks to develop a landmark treaty to end plastic pollution have once

The UN negotiations, the sixth round of talks in just under three years, were due to end on Thursday but countries continued to negotiate into the night in the hopes of breaking a deadlock.

There remained a split between a group of about 100 nations calling for curbs on production of plastic, and oil states pushing for a focus on recycling.

Speaking in the early hours, Cuban delegates said that countries had "missed a historic

opportunity but we have to keep going".
"I'm hugely disappointed that an agreement wasn't reached," said the UK's Marine Minister Emma Hardy.

"Plastic pollution is a global crisisthat no country can solve alone, and the UK is committed to working with others at home and abroad to protect the environment and pave the way to a circular economy," she added.

The talks were convened in 2022 in response to the mounting scientific evidence of the risks of plastic pollution to human health and the environment.

Despite the benefits of plastic to almost every sector, scientists are particularly concerned about potentially toxic chemicals they contain, which can leach out as plastics break down into smaller

CENTRE PROPOSES REDUCING GST SLABS FROM 4 TO 2. MAY RETAIN 5%, 18%: SOURCES



Diary Times Desk: The Centre has posed that only two slabs for Goods and Services Tax (GST) be retained - 5 per cent and 18 percent - as per sources.

Under this proposal, 90 per cent of the items in the 28 per cent will be moved to the 18 per cent slab, while 99 per cent of the items in the 12 per cent slab will be moved to the five per cent slab, the

A special 40 per cent rate will apply to luxury and sin goods, which include tobacco, gutkha and cigarettes. The 40 per cent category will have just 5-7 items, according to the government sources, but will exclude aspirational items like will exclude aspirational items like refrigerator, air conditioner and washing machine. Further, petroleum products will continue to remain outside the GST regime even in revamped indirect tax

High labour-intensive and export-oriented sectors like diamonds and precious stones would continue to be taxed as per the existing rates. The total incidence of taxation will remain at the current level of 88 per cent. Sources said that the proposed GST revamp is expected to give consumption a big boost, which will offset revenue loss due to rate rationalisation.

The proposal was based on Union Finance Ministry data that stated that 67 per cent of the total GST revenue comes from products in the 18 per cent Slab, while 11, five and seven per cent come from the 28 per cent, 12 per cent and five per cent slabs respectively. DK SHIVAKUMAR COUNTERS PM'S PRAISE FOR RSS, SAYS OUTFIT HAS NO HISTORY



Diary Times Desk : Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar on Friday said that Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh "doesn't have any history" when placed against the Congress party's legacy. 6 KILLED AFTER ROOF AT DARGAH NEAR DELHI'S HUMAYUN'S TOMB COLLAPSES

Darshan was arrested on Thursday (August 14) following the Supreme Court's cancellation of his bail, while Prajwal Revanna, grandson of former Prime Minister H.D. Deve Gowda, has been in prison for over a year, and the Special Court on August 1 convicted him to a life term until his death.

Sources stated that both are in a state of depression following these developments and chose to remain in their barracks. Sources further stated that Darshan did not sleep throughout the night in the prison.

According to sources, all accused, including Darshan, have been assigned remand prisoner numbers. Darshan's prisoner number is 7314 and Darshan's partner Pavitra Gowda's number is 7313. Pavitra Gowda is the first accused in the fan murder case. The last time Darshan was arrested, many fans had created tattoos with his prisoner number, which sparked controversy and even led to police cases being filed. Currently, Darshan and the other three accused have been placed in the same

Meanwhile, film actress Ramya, who faced brutal trolling from Darshan's fans after she posted that the family of the deceased man Renukaswamy in the fan murder case should receive justice, reacted to the media by saying that Darshan should have kept better company. BENGALURU'S YELLOW LINE METRO SEES HUGE PASSENGER SURGE AHEAD OF LONG WEEKEND

Diary Times Desk: Bengaluru's newly inaugurated Yellow Line stretch of the Namma Metro witnessed an overwhelming passenger surge on Friday evening ahead of the long weekend, drawing notable attention from commuters, residents and social media users alike.

A video shared by a Bengaluru resident on social media site X showed throngs of people queuing up at the Yellow Line metro station, waiting for trains. Many were seen carrying luggage for outstation travel, with metro security personnel guiding the crowds.

The Namma Metro hit a new milestone on Monday, clocking its highest-ever single-day ridership just a day after the city's long-anticipated Yellow Line began operations.

According to figures released by Bangalore Metro Rail Corporation Limited (BMRCL), a total of 10,48,031 commuters rode the metro network that day - marking a record across all active lines.

The launch was followed by a long weekend, with Independence Day falling on Friday, August 15, Krishna Janmashtami on Saturday, August 16, followed by Sunday.

PREYING ON OLIVE RIDLEYS & EVEN YOUNG WOLVES, HOW STRAY DOGS HAVE BECOME A BIG THREAT TO CONSERVATION

Diary Times Desk: Earlier this week, the Supreme Court ordered the removal of stray dogs from Delhi and NCR cities in public interest. But there is another area where these dogs are potentially more harmful—in the wild.

For years, environmentalists and biologists have stressed the threat posed by packs of stray, feral dogs to endangered animals like Olive Ridley turtle nests, Great Indian bustards, snow leopards, black-necked cranes, and even Indian wolves.

In every ecosystem, from marine beaches to deserts to the mountains, packs of stray dogs outnumber other animals by a wide margin and have become one of the biggest conservation threats in recent years, said Sumit Dookia, a wildlife biologist based in Rajasthan.

"You name any animal, snow leopards in Ladakh or wolves in Maharashtra or our GIB in Rajasthan, they are all threatened by dogs," said Dookia, an associate professor at the University School of Environment Management, Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University. "They can bring down animals even larger than them because, like wolves, they hunt in packs."

The last government survey in 2019 pegged India's total stray dog population at 1.52 crore, making India home to one of the largest stray dog populations in the world. From 2022 to 2025 January, India recorded 92 lakh reported cases of dog bites, and 125 deaths from them.

HOW INDIA'S CHOICE OF AUGUST 15 AS INDEPENDENCE DAY HAS A JAPAN LINK

Diary Times Desk: The last Viceroy of India under British rule decided that India would observe its Independence Day on August 15, a day which in 1947 marked the second anniversary of Japan's surrender in World War II. This, Lord Mountbatten later said, represented the conclusion of imperial conflict and not nationalist jubilation.

Just two years before August 15, 1947, Japan's emperor surrendered to the Allies, ending World War II. The country's war dead crossed 3 million. The date of Japan's surrender also held significance for Lord Mountbatten, who had fought against the Japanese in the War as a Navy officer in erstwhile Burma.

The Indian Independence Bill was given Royal Assent in July 1947, which was to "make provision for the setting up in India of two independent Dominions, to substitute other provisions for certain provisions of the Government of India Act, 1947".

AS TRUMP SPLITS FROM INDIA, IS THE US ABANDONING ITS PIVOT TO ASIA?

Diary Times Desk: When United States President Donald Trump and his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin meet in Alaska on Friday, their summit will be followed closely not only in both those countries, Europe and Ukraine – but also more than 10,000km (6,200 miles) away, in New Delhi.

Since the end of the Cold War, India has juggled a historically strong relationship with Russia and rapidly blossoming ties with the US. New Delhi's relations with Washington grew particularly strong under the presidencies of George W Bush and Barack Obama, and remained that way during Trump's first term and under Joe Biden.

At the heart of that US warmth towards India, say analysts, was its bet on New Delhi as a balancing force against Beijing, as China's economic, military and strategic heft in the Asia Pacific region grew. With Soviet communism history, and China, the US's biggest strategic rival, Washington increased its focus on Asia – including through the Quad.

NEXT-GENERATION GST REFORMS BY DIWALI, SAYS PM MODI; SIMPLIFIED 2-SLAB STRUCTURE PROPOSED BY FINMIN

Diary Times Desk: Prime Minister Narendra Modi's "Diwali gift" to the people of India, of reforms to the Goods and Services Tax (GST) system, will likely be across three pillars — structural reforms, rate rationalisation, and ease of living — and could entail a shift to a two-rate GST system from the current five-rate system."The government will bring next generation GST reforms, which will bring down tax burden on the common man," Mr. Modi said during his speech at Red Fort in New Delhi on India's 79th Independence Day. "It will be a Diwali gift for you."

The Ministry of Finance, elaborating on the Prime Minister's announcement in a press release, said that the Central Government has sent its proposal on GST rate rationalisations and reforms to the Group of Ministers (GoM) that had been constituted by the GST Council to examine this issue.



ALASKA, ONCE RULED BY RUSSIA, GREETS TRUMP-PUTIN SUMMIT WITH MIX OF HOPE AND ANGER

Diary Times Desk: A flurry of superpower-style signalling from Washington and Moscow over the war in Ukraine heralded the first U.S.-Russian summit in four years, but on the ground in Alaska there was a mix of the bizarre, the peculiar and even moose and a bear.

Donald Trump wants Friday's summit at a Cold War-era air force base to be the start of the end of the deadliest war in Europe since World War Two.

Vladimir Putin, ascendant in the war, has meanwhile offered the prospect of a possible deal to limit strategic nuclear weapons, which the Kremlin hopes would usher in a much broader discussion of U.S. and Russian global interests beyond Ukraine.

In Anchorage, nearly 5,000 miles (8,000 km), from the front lines of the war, Putin's foreign minister, Sergei Lavrov, arrived in a sweatshirt with the old Soviet Union initials "USSR" ("CCCP") across the front.

A bear and a moose ambled across at least one live television feed

The Kremlin press pool was housed in an Alaska Airlines Center, where a semi-open-plan room was subdivided by partitions and some reporters were seen making their own camp-style beds. They were fed for free at a nearby university campus, Russian reporters said.

FLASH FLOODS KILL NEARLY 200 IN PAKISTAN AND PAKISTAN-ADMINISTERED KASHMIR

Diary Times Desk: At least 194 people have died in the last 24 hours in heavy monsoon floods and landslides in Pakistan and Pakistan-administered Kashmir.

Most of the deaths, 180, were recorded by disaster authorities in the mountainous Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province in north-west Pakistan. At least 30 homes were destroyed and a rescue helicopter crashed during operations, killing its five crew.

Nine more people were killed in Pakistanadministered Kashmir, while five died in the northern Gilgit-Baltistan region, it said.

Government forecasters said heavy rainfall was expected until 21 August in the northwest of the country, where several areas have been declared disaster zones.

MEET WITH PUTIN WILL WORK OUT "VERY WELL", WILL "WALK" IF IT DOESN'T: TRUMP

Diary Times Desk: US President Donald Trump landed in Alaska's Anchorage today to hold talks with his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin on issues including the war in Ukraine. The meeting backed by advisers of the two leaders is expected to last sixseven hours.

On board the Air Force One, Mr Trump told reporters he is not going to Alaska to broker a deal on behalf of Ukraine, but said instead his goal was getting Mr Putin to the table. "I'm not here to negotiate for Ukraine," he added. "... I think it's going to work out very well – and if it doesn't, I'm going to head back home real fast," Mr Trump told reporters in the presidential plane.

"Putin believes that his continuous attacks give him strength in negotiations, but I think that hurts him. I think we will achieve some result at the summit with Putin. I am working to end the war to save lives. Russia will face severe economic consequences if it does not reach an agreement," Mr Trump said, adding they will discuss the issue of land exchange, but it is up to Ukraine to make the decision.

TRUMP DEPLOYS 800 NATIONAL GUARD IN WASHINGTON, 45 ARRESTED AMID 'CRIME EMERGENCY'



Diary Times Desk: After Trump announced federal takeover of Washington police, all 800 National Guard troops ordered by President Donald Trump to the nation's capital have now been fully mobilised, the Pentagon confirmed on Thursday.

The deployment marks the latest escalation in Trump's authorised 'criminal emergency' in Washington, DC, a city where violent crime rates, as per numbers, have actually declined over the past year.

"As of today, all 800 Army and Air National Guardsmen are mobilised, as part of Joint Task Force DC, and they are now here in our capital," Pentagon Press Secretary Kingsley Wilson told journalists.

NYC 'EXPLOSION': WHAT CAUSED THE MANHATTAN UPPER EAST SIDE FIRE?

VIDEOS SURFACE

Diary Times Desk: A massive fire erupted Friday at a sevenstory apartment building on Manhattan's Upper East Side. Firefighters arrived at East 95th Street, between First and Second Avenues, shortly after 10 a.m., according to NBC New York.

"I heard an explosion from my building just opposite the fire, and looked outside and saw all the smoke in the skies," Joann Sowma told Daily Mail.

Videos from the scene show firefighters battling intense flames on the building's rooftop as thick black smoke billowed into the skyline. More than 100 firefighters and EMS personnel responded to the incident and remain on site.

According to ABC 7, the third-alarm fire was sparked by a buildup of gas in the building's basement. The building's superintendent was in the basement at the time of the incident and is currently being treated for a minor injury.



JAPAN MINISTER VISITS CONTROVERSIAL SHRINE TO MARK WORLD WAR II ANNIVERSARY

Diary Times Desk : A Japanese cabinet minister was among thousands of people to visit a controversial war memorial in Tokyo as Japan marks 80 years since the end of World War II.

Agricultural Minister Shinjiro Koizumi on Friday paid his respects at the Yasukuni Shrine, a symbol of Japan's militaristic past.

He was joined by dozens of national and local politicians from the farright "Japan First" Sanseito Party, according to local media.

The Shinto shrine was built in the 19th century to honour Japan's war dead, but it is best known for enshrining 14 Japanese "class A" war criminals and 1,000 others also found guilty by an Allied tribunal after World War II.

The Yasukuni Shrine is considered a political lightning rod in East Asia, where memories of Japan's wartime atrocities are not forgotten, but senior Japanese leaders have continued to visit over the years.

But the shrine was just one site where Japanese people gathered on Friday to mark 80 years since Emperor Hirohito announced Japan's surrender in an August 15, 1945, radio broadcast.

GERMANY CALLS ON ISRAEL TO "STOP SETTLEMENT CONSTRUCTION" IN WEST BANK



Diary Times Desk: Germany "strongly" objects to an Israeli plan to build thousands of new homes in the West Bank, calling on the government to "stop settlement construction" in the Palestinian territory.

Berlin "strongly rejects the Israeli government's announcements on thousands of new settlements in the Israeli occupied areas of the West Bank", the foreign ministry said in a statement.

The UN human rights office on Friday called the settlement plan illegal under international law and said it put nearby Palestinians at risk of forced eviction, Reuters news agency reported. A spokesperson for the UN rights organization said it would be "a war crime for an occupying power to transfer its own civilian population into the territory it occupies."

Israel rejects this interpretation, saying the West Bank is "disputed" rather than occupied territory.

TRUMP-PUTIN SUMMIT, THE NOBEL PEACE PRIZE AND OTHER IMPONDERABLES

Diary Times Desk: The Russia-Ukraine war faces significant obstacles to ending, primarily due to the conflicting territorial and political demands of both sides. Ukraine insists on reclaiming all its lost territories, including Crimea, and will not renounce its intention of becoming a NATO member. Russia, on the other hand, seeks sweeping political changes in Kyiv and aims to prevent Ukraine from joining NATO. These fundamental disagreements create a deadlock that makes a negotiated settlement extremely difficult. Neither side is willing to end the war on terms that are acceptable to the other side.

Against this background, President Donald Trump said he'll be meeting with Russian President Vladimir Putin on Friday, 15th August, in Alaska, to work out a potential peace deal to end the war in Ukraine that could include "some swapping of territories." Trump's announcement came on the day which he had set as the deadline for Putin to make peace or face severe economic punishment.



Trump posted on Truth Social: "The highly anticipated meeting between myself, as President of the United States of America, and President Vladimir Putin, of Russia, will take place next Friday, August 15, 2025, in the Great State of Alaska. Further details to follow". India has said that it "welcomes the understanding reached between the United States and the Russian Federation for a meeting in Alaska on 15th August 2025".

HEZBOLLAH SAYS LEBANON DISARMAMENT PLAN SERVES ISRAEL, VOWS TO KEEP WEAPONS

Diary Times Desk: Hezbollah chief Naim Qassem has accused Lebanon's government of "handing" the country to Israel by pushing for the group's disarmament, warning it would fight to keep its weapons.

Qassem spoke in a televised address on Friday after meeting Iran's top security chief, Ali Larijani. Tehran has long backed the Lebanese armed group.

Lebanon's Prime Minister Nawaf Salam slammed the remarks, branding them "a veiled threat of civil war." Salam added, "No one in Lebanon today wants a civil war, and any threats or intimidation of such a war are completely unacceptable."

Lebanon suffered one the 20th century's worst civil wars for 15 years, between 1975 and 1990. The war left around 200,000 people dead and an estimated 17,000 others missing. The Israeli army also occupied Lebanon during and after the war, with a full invasion in 1982, only withdrawing its troops in 2000 after being harried out by Hezbollah.

HONG KONG TYCOON JIMMY LAI'S TRIAL DELAYED OVER HEALTH CONCERNS

Diary Times Desk: Hong Kong judges have postponed the trial of media tycoon Jimmy Lai until he is provided with a heart monitoring device and related medication.

Friday's decision marked the second delay to the case this week after his lawyer said he had suffered heart palpitations.

The 77-year-old founder of the Apple Daily newspaper is charged with foreign collusion under Hong Kong's national security law, which Beijing imposed following widespread prodemocracy protests in 2019.

Closing arguments in the longrunning trial were originally expected to begin on Thursday, but all court sessions were suspended due to bad weather.

As the court resumed on Friday, defence lawyer Robert Pang said that Lai had heart "palpitations" and had experienced the feeling of "collapsing", but added that the tycoon did not want attention to be concentrated on his health.

Lai has been kept behind bars since December 2020, reportedly in solitary confinement, and concerns have previously been raised over the septuagenarian's welfare.

OVER 90 ARRESTED FOR AERIAL FIRING IN KARACHI ON PAKISTAN'S I-DAY; 3

DEAD, SEVERAL INJURED

Diary Times Desk: Over 90 people were taken into custody by Karachi Police for indulging in aerial firing during Independence Day celebrations, which turned deadly, ARY News reported. According to the report, police also seized 68 illegal weapons from the suspects, with more than 100 FIRs registered.

ARY News further quoted a police official as saying that additional cases of murder and attempted murder are being filed against those responsible

The celebrations took a tragic turn as aerial firing claimed at least three lives and left 82 others injured across the city. According to ARY News, East Zone reported 30 injuries, West Zone 43, and South Zone 12. The victims included an eight-year-old girl in Azizabad, who was fatally struck in the head, and two elderly men in Korangi and Lyari who died after being shot in the head and neck. Among the injured were 51 men, 24 women, six boys, and one girl, ARY News added.

The city has experienced a sharp increase in crime this year, with more than 26,500 incidents reported in the first five months of 2025, ARY News reported, citing Citizens-Police Liaison Committee (CPLC) data. According to the report, 245 people lost their lives in various incidents, including 48 who were shot dead while resisting robberies.

DONALD TRUMP'S GOLDEN DOME STILL SHROUDED IN MYSTERY, EVEN FOR ITS RUILDERS

Diary Times Desk: The companies expected to create President Donald Trump's "Golden Dome for America" know the objective: to protect the US from missiles and airborne threats. They know it means billions of dollars' worth of contracts. But they don't know much about what, exactly, they are expected to do - and at an event last week, the government officials who might tell them weren't even allowed to mention the project by name.

Attendees at the 28th annual Space and Missile Defense Symposium in Huntsville, Alabama, saw signs early on that the topic on everyone's minds might be tricky to discuss. Before the event even began, the industry groups hosting it removed a Golden Dome-focused panel. "Information regarding Golden Dome for America will be promulgated by the government," they said.

Major defense contractors, including Lockheed Martin Corp., RTX Corp. and Northrop Grumman, prepared slick websites and flashy sideshows for the conference to demonstrate how their work fits with the president's vision for an air and missile defense network protecting the entire US.



TRUMP AND PUTIN TO MEET IN ALASKA FOR HIGH-STAKES SUMMIT

PUT UP OR SHUT UP, MATCH TRUMP'S INDIA SANCTIONS ON RUSSIA OIL: BESSENT TO EUROPE

Diary Times Desk: US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent has sent a blunt message to European allies, calling on them to stop lecturing the United States and start imposing sanctions on Russia at the same level as Washington.

"It is time for our European counterparts to put up or shut up," Bessent said in an interview with Fox

"They keep saying, 'Oh, the US should do this, the US should do that.' President Trump has imposed secondary sanctions, or secondary tariffs, on India because of their consumption of Russian oil, and the Europeans haven't done that yet." Bessent said.Bessent accused European nations of continuing to buy refined products from Indian refineries that process Russian crude -- a move Bessent says undermines the West's united front.

MOSCOW "KILLING PEOPLE" ON DAY OF PUTIN-TRUMP SUMMIT, SAYS ZELENSKY

Diary Times Desk: Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky said Friday that Moscow was still killing people and not showing that it wanted to end the war, hours before the start of a summit between the Russian and US presidents in Alaska.

"There is no order, nor any signals from Moscow that it is preparing to end this war... they are also killing on the day of the negotiations," Zelensky said in a video address posted on social media.

MAN ARRESTED AFTER SANDWICH THROWN AT FEDERAL AGENT IN WASHINGTON DC



Diary Times Desk: An employee at the US Department of Justice (DOJ) has been arrested for throwing a Subway sandwich at a federal agent deployed to Washington DC as part of President Donald Trump's vow to crackdown on crime.

Sean Charles Dunn, who had worked in the DOJ Criminal Division, was fired after video of the incident emerged. He is being charged with felony assault.

The presence of federal law enforcement agents, as well as the National Guard, has led to widespread anger in the mostly Democratic city.

Trump, a Republican, has said the deployment is necessary to fight crime and remove "drugged-out maniacs and homeless people". Local police data shows violent crime is at a 30-year low in Washington DC.

According to charging documents, Mr Dunn allegedly threw a "submarine-style sandwich" at a Customs and Border Patrol (CBP) officer on Sunday.

In a video of the incident, which prosecutors cite in their charges, the suspect is heard calling the agents "fascists" and screaming profanities directed at them.

"Why are you here? I don't want you in my city," he yells before crossing the road.

He later returns and is seen hurling the wrapped sandwich into the chest of a uniformed agent, who appears to be wearing a bulletproof vest.

He then flees on foot as officers give chase. According to prosecutors, Mr Dunn confessed after he was arrested on Wednesday, telling investigators: "I did it. I threw a sandwich."

A NEW BOOK ON CHINA PUTS ITS RISE IN SOUTHEAST ASIAN

CONTEXT

Diary Times Desk: Endless headlines about Chinese adventurism in land and sea—whether it is Beijing's aggression at the China-India border or its heightened military activity in the Taiwan Strait—offer light insight into hard realities for Southeast Asian countries that have to strike a balance between China and the US in order to preserve their economic and security interests in a shifting political climate.

A new book called "In the Dragon's Shadow", written by Sebastian Strangio, an author and journalist who writes on the region, puts some of these headlines in context. It wasn't like China was always this assertive in the region that comprises eleven countries (Vietnam, Cambodia, Laos, Thailand, Myanmar, Singapore, Malaysia, Indonesia, Brunei, East Timor, and the Philippines).

In the late 1970s, China began establishing ties with the countries it had alienated during Mao's rule, which had lasted almost three decades from 1949 until 1976. In September 1980, China had passed a new nationality law that revoked dual citizenship for people from China living overseas.

This helped fix ties with the countries that were suspicious about Chinese intention to normalise relations. It also led to investment into China from ethnic Chinese living abroad, mainly from those living in Hong Kong and Taiwan. But now, things have changed drastically. Not only is China suspected of mobilising its citizens' sympathies abroad into active support for the Communist Party, but it is also accused of using dubious measures to gather that support.

So are all of these concerns legitimate? The answer to that is a little complicated. Some concerns about the Chinese engaging its diaspora community for political ends are true in the sense that the Chinese government has placed greater importance on engaging its citizens living abroad.



'48% DECLINE IN ACCIDENTAL DEATHS': PUNJAB CM MANN LISTS ACHIEVEMENTS DURING I-DAY SPEECH IN FARIDKOT

One woman died on the spot, and three others (one female and two males) succumbed to their injuries at Dr Rajendra Prasad Medical College and Hospital at Tanda. The deceased have been identified as Jagsir Singh (38), son of Varyam Singh; Paramjeet Kaur, wife of Gurmel Singh (35); Kiran (35), wife of Sukhjinder Singh; and Shukhjinder Singh (35), son of Parkash Singh — all residents of Baaghi ke village, Nihal Singh Wala sub-division, Moga district.

FOUR GURDASPUR RESIDENTS ARRESTED WITH 25.19 GRAMS OF 'CHITTA' IN KANGRA DISTRICT

Diary Times Desk: In a significant crackdown on drug abuse, the Kangra district police have arrested four individuals from Gurdaspur district, Punjab, after recovering 25.19 grams of 'chitta' (heroin) from their vehicle.

An investigation is currently underway.


HIMACHAL SPEAKER: 12 BILLS PENDING WITH PRESIDENT, GOVERNOR FOR OVER THREE MONTHS TO BE DEEMED PASSED

Diary Times Desk: Vidhan Sabha Speaker Kuldeep Pathania today said that in light of the recent Supreme Court ruling, 12 Bills cleared by the Himachal Vidhan Sabha but were pending with the Governor or the President of India for their assent for more than three months would be deemed to have been passed.

Pathania, while addressing mediapersons, said, "Of the total 73 Bills passed by the 14th Vidhan Sabha, 12 are still awaiting the assent of the Governor or the President. The Supreme Court ruling will now be applicable to these pending Bills, which include five pertaining to raising the emoluments of the legislators."

He was responding to a question about the status of the Bill passed by the Assembly regarding increasing the emoluments of the Chief Minister, Speaker, Deputy Speaker, ministers and MLAs during the Budget session in March this year.

The Speaker's remarks come amid an ongoing standoff between the Raj Bhawan and the state government over the delay in the grant of assent to many Bills, including the one regarding an amendment to the Act for the appointment of Vice-Chancellors of two horticulture and agriculture universities. Since the Bill passed by the Assembly in 2023 was still to be granted assent by the Governor, it had delayed the appointment of Vice-Chancellors of the two varsities.

Germany Calls On Israel

G ermany "strongly" objects to an Israeli plan to build thousands of new homes in the West Bank, calling on the government to "stop settlement construction" in the Palestinian territory.

Berlin "strongly rejects the Israeli government's announcements on thousands of new settlements in the Israeli occupied areas of the West Bank", the foreign ministry said in a statement.

Israeli far-right Finance Minister Bezalel Smotrich said work would start on a long-delayed settlement that would divide the West Bank and cut if off from East

Jerusalem, a move his office declared would "bury" the idea of a Palestinian state.

Standing at the site in Maale Adumim, Smotrich said Prime Benjamin Netanyahu Minister and US President Donald Trump had agreed to the revival of the E1 scheme, though there was no immediate confirmation from

The Palestinian foreign ministry called the plan an extension of crimes of genocide, displacement and annexation. Israel has long rejected accusations of genocide and rights abuses and said it is acting in its own

Hamas described the plan as part of Israel's "colonial, extremist" policies and called on Palestinians to confront it. Jordan's foreign ministry condemned the move as a flagrant violation of international law.

Peace Now, which tracks settlement activity in the West Bank, said there were still steps needed before construction, including the approval of Israel's High Planning Council. But if all went through, infrastructure work could begin within a few months, and house building

"The E1 plan is deadly for the future of Israel and for any chance of achieving a peaceful two-state solution. We are standing at the edge of an abyss, and the government is driving us forward at full speed," Peace Now said in a statement.

Palestinians were already demoralized by the Israeli military campaign which has killed more than 61,000 people in Gaza, according to local health authorities, and fear Israel will ultimately push them out of that territory.

.S. President Donald Trump on Thursday said he would see what he could do to help detained Hong Kong media tycoon Jimmy Lai, even though Chinese President Xi Jinping would not be "thrilled."

"I'm going to do everything I can to save him," Trump told Fox News Radio in an interview. "We'll see what we can do ... we're going to do everything we can." Lai, 77, has pleaded not guilty to charges under Hong Kong's national security law conspiracy to collude with foreign forces, as well as to a separate charge of conspiracy to publish seditious material. He has been held in solitary confinement for more than 1,500 days since December 2020

Liu Pengyu, the spokesperson for China's embassy in Washington, said Lai had been "a key orchestrator and participant in anti-China, destabilizing activities in Hong Kong."

"We strongly oppose external forces using judicial cases as a pretext to interfere in China's internal affairs or to smear and undermine Hong Kong's rule of law," he said.

Trump has said he would raise Lai's case as part of negotiations with China over trade and tariffs. On Monday, the U.S. and China extended a tariff truce for another 90 days, staving off triple-digit duties on each other's goods

In his landmark trial, Lai stands accused of two counts of colluding with foreign forces - a crime punishable by life in prison under the 2020 national security law imposed by Beijing - and a separate sedition charge. He has pleaded not guilty to all charges. On Friday, a Hong Kong court is set to hear closing arguments both defense from prosecutors after a day's delay due to a major rainstorm. The hearing - which is expected to last multiple days - paves the way for a verdict that will decide Lai's fate - and test Trump's resolve to make good on his pledge while trying to clinch a trade deal with Chinese leader Xi Jinping. "You can also understand.

President Xi would not be exactly thrilled by doing it," Trump said. "With all of that being said, his name (has) already entered the circle of things that we're talking about, and we'll see what we can

In Hong Kong, dozens of people lined up outside the courthouse on Friday ahead of the hearing amid a heavy police presence.

"I am here to support 'Fei Lo' Lai and let him know that he's not alone," said Pun Tak-bun, 81, calling Lai by his colloquial nickname meaning "fat man." "Apple Daily spoke Hongkongers from the heart."

In October, Trump responded "100% yes' when asked by podcast host Hugh Hewitt whether he would speak to Xi to get Lai out prison if he won the election. Then, as president. Trump pledged to raise Lai's case as part of US trade talks with China.

"I think talking about Jimmy Lai is a very good idea," he told Hewitt in a subsequent radio interview in May, just days before officials met in Geneva for the first round of talks. "We'll put it down, and we'll put it down as part of the negotiation."

Two people who are close to Lai and have been campaigning for his release said they were told that US officials did bring up Lai's case with their Chinese counterparts during the talks.

"We understand it was informally brought up at trade talks, but we don't know the context of it." said Lai's top aide Mark Simon. referring to the negotiations in Geneva.

Mark Clifford, president of the Washingtonbased Committee for Freedom in Hong Kong Foundation, said that before trade negotiators met again in London in June, US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent "had it as a mission" from Trump to ensure that Lai's release was part of the talks.

"I'm told that Bessent was tasked by the President and made it as part of his mission," said Clifford, who has been lobbying the US Congress for Lai's release. "Going into those talks, like immediately before those talks, Bessent told people that he was tasked by Trump with getting Jimmy out."
