

PM MODI INAUGURATES 2 HIGHWAY PROJECTS IN BIG PUSH TO **DECLOG DELHI**

Diary Times Desk: In a major infrastructure push to ease traffic congestion and reduce travel time across Delhi and several other cities in the National Capital Region, Prime Minister Narendra Modi today inaugurated two major projects -- a key stretch of the Urban Extension Road-II and the Delhi section of Dwarka Expressway.

The two projects, with a combined cost of Rs 11,000 crore, reflect Prime Minister Modi's vision of "creating world-class infrastructure that enhances ease of living and ensures seamless mobility", the Prime Minister's Office said ahead of the inauguration event at Rohini today. The new projects will aid the commute of people in the Delhi-NCR region, the Prime Minister said. "I congratulate the people of Delhi-NCR for this modern connectivity. When the world judges India, it first looks at our capital, Delhi. We have to make Delhi a model of a developed India. Our government has worked on this at multiple levels. In the past 11 years, travel has become easier

"After a long time, there is a BJP government in Delhi. The previous governments put Delhi in a ditch. The BJP government has to fill up that ditch and then progress will be seen. But I believe this team you have elected will pull Delhi out of that situation," the Prime Minister said. Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta, Haryana Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini and Union Road Transport Minister Nitin Gadkari are also present. Mr Saini said Haryana will be the biggest beneficiary of these projects. Mr Gadkari said these two projects are expected to reduce traffic jams in Delhi by 50 per cent.

CHINESE FOREIGN MINISTER WANG YI TO MEET PM MODI ON TUESDAY



Diary Times Desk: Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi is set to meet Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday Tuesday during his two-day visit to India, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said.

Wang Yi, who is set to visit India on Monday, will also hold talks with External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and National Security Advisor Ajit Doval with both sides expected to deliberate on a range of issues, including border situation, trade and resumption of flight services.

The Chinese foreign minister's visit to India comes ahead of PM Modi's scheduled visit to China to attend the annual summit of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation

Wang Yi's visit is largely seen as part of ongoing efforts by the two countries to rebuild their relationship after it came under severe strain following the Galwan Valley clashes in 2020.

Earlier, Hindustan Times reported that Wang's visit was a follow-up to Doval's trip to Beijing last December and part of preparations for PM Modi's visit to China for the SCO Summit.

The two sides are expected to discuss new onfidence-building measures for durable peace and tranquillity along their contested border during Wang's visit, Plauoted people familiar with the matter as saying. The visit of the Chinese leader comes amid increasing tensions in India-US relations following President Donald Trump doubling tariffs on India to 50 per cent. Wang Yi will land in New Delhi at around 4:15 pm on Monday and will meet Jaishankar for bilateral talks at around 6 pm. Meanwhile, Wang and NSA Doval are scheduled to hold a new edition.

MAHARASHTRA GOVERNOR CP RADHAKRISHNAN IS BJP'S VICE PRESIDENT CANDIDATE

Mr Radhakrishnan has also been the Governor of Jharkhand, held additional charge of Pondicherry, has been a two-term MP from Coimbatore and headed the Tamil Nadu unit of the BJP. With the combined strength of both houses standing at 786, the majority mark is 394 The NDA's combined strength in the two houses is 422 --293 members in the Lok Sabha and 129 in the Raiva In a post on X, PM Modi said Mr Radhakrishnan has done extensive work at the grassroots level in Tamil Nadu and he was glad that the NDA family has decided to nominate him as the Vice Presidential candidate of the alliance. PM MODI URGES STATES TO COOPERATE IN IMPLEMENTING PROPOSED GST REFORMS



Diary Times Desk: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday said the Centre has circulated the draft of the next-generation GST reforms states and sought their cooperation to implement the among proposal before Diwali.

He said the reform in GST would benefit poor and middle-class people, as well as small and big businesses. Addressing an event after the inauguration of two expressways, the prime minister said the Centre intends to make the GST law simpler and revise tax rates. Modi had announced the proposal to reform the GST law in his

Modi had announced the proposal to reform the USI law in the Independence Day speech on August 15 from the ramparts of the Red Fort. "For us, reform signifies the advancement of good governance, which is why we place a strong emphasis on continuous improvement. In the near future, we are set to implement reforms aimed at making life and business operations smoother and more convenient. "As part of this vision, next-generation reforms will be introduced under the CST framework. This Divall, these GST reforms. introduced under the GST framework. This Diwali, these GST reforms will bring a double bonus to the people, enhancing their celebrations," he said. Modi said the Centre has sent the draft proposal of the GST

reform to the states. "I hope that all states will cooperate in the initiatives of the central government," he said, urging them to complete the process at the earliest so that the Diwali festival becomes more fabulous.

"The objective of this reform is to make GST simpler and revise rates." he added. The present GST tax rates of nil/zero on essential food items, 5 per cent on daily use products, 12 per cent on standard goods, 18 per cent on electronics and services and 28 per cent on luxury and sin goods will be replaced by two tax slabs of 5 per cent and 18 per cent plus a special 40 per cent top bracket for 5-7 demerit goods.

SC TAKES SUO MOTU NOTICE OF PLIGHT OF CADETS DISCHARGED AFTER TRAINING INJURIES

Diary Times Desk: The Supreme Court has taken a suo motu cognisance of the challenges faced by cadets who were discharged from their services at military training institutes after suffering disabilities during their training period, PTI reported. The case was registered on August 12 following a media report that brought attention to the condition of these cadets, who had trained at prestigious military academies like the National Defence Academy (NDA) and the Indian Military Academy (IMA).

The case will be heard by a bench of Justices BV Nagarathna and R Mahadevan on Monday.

As per the report, since 1985, around 500 officer cadets have been discharged from these institutions due to various disabilities acquired during training. These individuals are now burdened with rising medical expenses, while the financial aid they receive is insufficient to meet their needs.

At least over 25 shots were fired at Mr Yadav's house.

The three men fled the scene immediately.

Mr Yadav was not at home at the time of the incident. According to the police, he had gone outside Haryana for some work. However, the caretaker of the house and some family members were inside, but no one was injured.

Hours after the incident, the notorious Himanshu Bhau gang took responsibility for the firing in a social media post, accusing the YouTuber of promoting gambling. The post featured two gun illustrations and the text 'BHAU GANG SINCE 2020'. The gang is reportedly led by Portugal-based fugitive gangster Himanshu Bhau.

KARNATAKA DCM ANNOUNCES ACTION AGAINST ILLEGAL BUILDINGS AFTER FATAL BENGALURU FIRE, AWARDS ₹5 LAKH EX-GRATIA:

Diary Times Desk: In the wake of a deadly fire that claimed five lives in Bengaluru's Nagarathpete area, Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar has held the owners of such unauthorized buildings accountable for the tragedy. Visiting the scene on Sunday, Shivakumar stated that all structures in the locality lacking proper permits would be served notices. Owners will be required to either reinforce their buildings or face demolition.

"It is the fault of the building owner. I am going to issue a notice to everyone. They have to strengthen the building. All buildings here are illegal buildings... If they don't strengthen the buildings, we will have to break all of them. I have instructed the authorities to take strict action here... Five people died here. All were from Rajasthan... The government has announced a compensation of Ffive lakh each... What has happened is very painful," he said, as quoted by news agency ANI.

DELHI MAN RAPES 65-YEAR-OLD MOTHER TWICE AS 'PUNISHMENT', ARRESTED: POLICE

Diary Times Desk: A 39-year-old man has been arrested for allegedly raping his 65-year-old mother twice, claiming he was punishing her for an alleged relationship she had in the past. According to police, the woman, accompanied by her 25-year-old daughter, approached the Hauz Qazi police station and lodged a complaint. The assaults took place shortly after the family returned from a religious trip to Saudi Arabia.

As per the complaint, the woman lives with her husband, a retired government employee, her accused son, and younger daughter in Delhi's Hauz Qazi area. The family also has an elder daughter who is married and lives nearby with her in-laws.

On July 17, the woman, her husband, and younger daughter travelled to Saudi Arabia. During their trip, the accused called his father and insisted he return to Delhi immediately. He also asked his father to divorce his mother, and accused her of having had illicit relationships during his childhood.

The complaint stated that after the family returned to Delhi on August I, the accused locked his mother in a room, forced her to remove her burqa, and beat her. He allegedly told her she had "spoiled" him in childhood.

STREE SHAKTI DAY ONE: 12 LAKH WOMEN TRAVEL FREE IN ANDHRA

Diary Times Desk: The Stree Shakti scheme, providing free travel to women in RTC buses, launched on Friday by the coalition government, has become a grand success, with over 12 lakh women passengers travelling within 30 hours. According to sources, there was a tremendous response from all parts of the state for the free bus ride to women, one of the promises under the much-publicised Super Six.

Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu reviewed the implementation of the scheme from time to time and issued necessary instructions to officials. Women saved up to Rs 5 crore by utilising the free travel in RTC buses on the very first day the scheme was rolled out.

As per requests made by women passengers, the Chief Minister directed officials to allow free travel to women on buses operated on ghat roads. Initially, the RTC management did not permit free travel to women on buses running on ghat roads due to overload concerns.

However, following the Chief Minister's directions, the RTC decided to extend the free ride to women on buses running on ghat roads.

With the possibility of more women, particularly employees, travelling in RTC buses from Monday (August 18), officials were told to make arrangements accordingly. Apart from Aadhaar cards, the government will also allow other identity cards proving the locality of women for free travel.

In addition to original Aadhaar cards and Xerox copies, the government is considering allowing soft copies of Aadhaar on mobile phones.

CONGRESS LEADER'S RSS "INDIA'S TALIBAN" REMARK, BJP'S MAHATMA GANDHI

NGO ALLEGES 'STATISTICAL PURGE' IN CHALLENGE TO EC'S 65 LAKH

DELETIONS FROM BIHAR DRAFT ROLLS

Diary Times Desk: The Election Commission (EC) is facing a legal and procedural challenge over its decision to remove approximately 65 lakh voters from Bihar's electoral rolls following a month-long 'special intensive revision' (SIR).

A Maharashtra-based civil society group, Vote for Democracy (VFD), has presented a report to the Supreme Court alleging the exercise was a "statistical purge" riddled with anomalies.

The EC maintains that the process was a transparent and successful clean-up of the rolls, conducted with "overwhelming participation" from electors

The revision, the first of its kind in Bihar since 2003, concluded with 7.24 crore voters re-affirming their eligibility and 65 lakh (8.31% of the electorate) marked for deletion.

A one-month period for claims and objections to the draft rolls, published on August 1, is currently underway.

WHAT KANNADA ACTOR DARSHAN SAID AS HIS BAIL WAS CANCELLED IN RENUKASWAMY MURDER CASE

Diary Times Desk: In a major development in the sensational Renukaswamy murder case that gripped Karnataka earlier this year, the Supreme Court on Saturday cancelled the bail of seven accused, including Kannada film star Darshan and his associate Pavithra Gowda. The order effectively paves the way for the high-profile actor's return to jail.

A bench comprising Justices JB Pardiwala and R Mahadevan delivered the verdict while hearing the Karnataka government's plea challenging the Karnataka High Court's earlier decision to grant bail. The apex court held that the High Court order contained "errors" and that bail had been extended "for certain reasons" which could not be justified.

The bench stressed that "no one is big or small before the law" and even criticised the prison administration for allegedly allowing Darshan a comfortable stay in custody. The court observed that the jail superintendent "should have been suspended" for the reported preferential treatment. Darshan, who had been out on bail since the High Court's ruling, was reportedly in Tamil Nadu when the Supreme Court verdict came. Sources told News18 that the actor had recently returned from an overseas film shoot and was visiting temples with his wife, Vijayalakshmi. His exact location at the time of the announcement remains unclear, but he is believed to have been at a prominent temple in Tamil Nadu.According to police sources, Darshan's mobile phone has been switched off since the verdict, although officers have managed to establish contact. "He has said he will surrender himself," one official told reporters.

Diary Times Desk: The Mexican state of Oaxaca is threatening legal action against Adidas, accusing the footwear company of cultural appropriation over a newly unveiled shoe that resembles a traditional handmade

The "Oaxaca Slip-On," billed as a collaboration between American designer Willy Chavarria and Adidas Originals, features a woven leather surface, open heel, and thick rubber sole – and, in the eyes of the Oaxaca government, bears more than a passing resemblance to the "huarache" handmade sandal from the Oaxacan community of Villa Hidalgo Yalalag. Oaxacan Governor Salomón Jara Cruz on Wednesday accused the company of copying the Yalalag design without asking permission or crediting the community. He also demanded that Adidas withdraw the shoe, engage in talks with the Indigenous community and publicly recognize the Yalalag as the originators of the design.

"This is not just a design, it is about the culture, history and identity of an original (people) and we will not allow it to be treated as merchandise," he said in a video posted on X. He pledged "legal support" for Villa Hidalgo Yalalag, and said he had already spoken with members of the community about taking action against the footwear company.

Adidas did not immediately respond to a CNN request for comment. Neither has it issued a public statement addressing the controversy. One option for the Oaxacan government would be to file a formal complaint with the Instituto Mexicano de la Propiedad Industrial (IMPI), Mexico's federal agency for intellectual property protection.

Diary Times Desk: US First Lady Melania Trump wrote a "peace" letter to Russian President Vladimir Putin on the plight of children in the Ukraine war, urging him to "protect their innocence". Undeniably, we must strive to paint a dignity-filled world for all - so that every soul may wake to peace, and so that the future itself is perfectly guarded," she wrote.

FEWER SOUTH KOREANS & ISRAELIS, MORE SOUTH AFRICANS NOW SEE INDIA FAVOURABLY—LATEST PEW SURVEY

Diary Times Desk: Up to 60 percent or more respondents in Kenya, the UK and Israel hold a highly favourable opinion of India, while most respondents in Turkey and Australia held an unfavourable view, according to a new Pew Research Center survey.

Significantly, in South Korea, favourability fell by 16 percentage points from 2024, while in the US opinion was almost evenly divided.

The Pew survey was carried out this year from January to April across 24 countries, just before the Pahalgam terror attack and the announcement of tariffs on Indian imports by US President Donald Trump. Its findings were made public on 13 August.

In roughly half of the surveyed countries, more respondents held a positive view of India than a negative one, the survey report notes. Also, in half of the countries surveyed, men were more likely than women to have a favourable view of India, with differences by gender in double digits in Japan, the Netherlands, Germany, Argentina and France.

The report also indicated a gradual change in perception of India in several countries, with 46 percent respondents in South Africa expressing a favourable opinion, marking the highest level since 2008 when the question was first asked, and up 17 percentage points since 2023.

SAUDI ARABIA'S LAND TAX TO UNLOCK REAL ESTATE SUPPLY AS NEW FOREIGN BUYERS EYE PROPERTIES

New land tax rules that came into effect in Saudi Arabia this month are expected to spur the development of property projects and boost housing supply.

The kingdom increased the annual levy on undeveloped land to as much as 10 per cent of the value of a plot. It introduced fees of between 5 per cent to 10 per cent on long-term vacant buildings, as part of regulations introduced by the government last week.

The changes apply to plots measuring 5,000 square metres or more, within the approved urban boundaries, Saudi Arabia's Ministry of Municipalities and Housing said.

The plan comes as the kingdom opens up foreign ownership of property from January 2026, particularly in the cities of Riyadh and Jeddah.

"By raising the annual levy on undeveloped land and introducing a fee of up to 10 per cent on long-term vacant buildings, the reforms make it significantly more costly for owners to hold assets without putting them to productive use. This is expected to push many landowners to develop, sell, or lease their properties, bringing more projects to market," Nils Vanhassel, legal director and tax adviser at DLA Piper Middle East, told The National.

GANG-RELATED ATTACK KILLS 3 IN SHOOTOUT AT A BROOKLYN BAR

Diary Times Desk: Four people opened fire at a Brooklyn bar early Sunday morning, killing three and wounding nine in what appeared to be a gangrelated attack that sent patrons diving for cover and running for the exits.

The police said the shooters used 9-millimeter and .45-caliber firearms after a "dispute" at the bar, Taste of the City Lounge at 903 Franklin Avenue in Crown Heights, around 3:30 a.m. Nine men and three women were shot, their ages ranging from 19 to 61, Police Commissioner Jessica Tisch said on Sunday.

Three men were killed, ages 19, 27 and 35, the police said. Around 10:20 a.m., the police wheeled out a gurney bearing what appeared to be a body in a black bag. Officers loaded it into a black-and-white

Nine people who were wounded were treated at hospitals for injuries that Commissioner Tisch said were for now "non-life-threatening." No suspects had been arrested as of Sunday afternoon.



ASIM MUNIR'S 'RARE EARTH' PLAN TO BRING PAKISTAN OUT OF DEBT. **ECONOMIC CRISIS**

Diary Times Desk: Pakistan Army chief of staff Asim Munir has revealed a plan to pull Islamabad out of its economic crisis and debt. In a conversation with Pakistani writer Suhail Warraich, the Field Marshal hinted at a "rare earths treasure", shortly after US expressed its interests in Pakistan's mineral reserves.

In a column published Saturday in Pakistan's Geo Group, Warraich claimed Munir revealed his ambition for the rare earths plan during a meeting in Brussels, Belgium.

"Regarding the solution to the economic crisis, he had a complete roadmap, which planned to put Pakistan in the ranks of the developed countries of the world within five to ten years. He calculated and said that from next year, there will be a net profit of two billion dollars every year from Reko Dig, which will increase every year," wrote Warraich.

"He [Munir] said that Pakistan has a rare earth treasure, with this treasure, Pakistan's debt will also be reduced and Pakistan will soon be counted among the most prosperous societies," he added further.

Munir's remarks come as the US and Pakistan continue to strengthen their ties under US President Donald Trump.

ISRAELI MILITARY BOMBS POWER

Diary Times Desk: The Israeli navy has carried out attacks on a power plant near the Yemeni capital Sanaa, according to Israeli media reports.

Houthi-affiliated Al Masirah TV reported on Saturday that the "aggression" damaged generators at the Hezyaz power plant, sparking a fire that was later contained. The country's deputy prime minister confirmed emergency crews managed to prevent further damage. Residents in Sanaa also reported hearing at least two loud

The Israeli military claimed that the site was being used by Houthi fighters. But it did not present evidence to justify hitting a civilian power station, raising concerns that the strike may constitute a

In a statement carried by Israeli outlets on Sunday, the military said the assault was a direct response to repeated Houthi attacks, including missiles and drones launched towards Israel.

The Houthis have repeatedly fired rockets and drones at Israel since 2023 in response to Israel's genocide in Gaza. Israel has retaliated by bombing Yemen's infrastructure, including Hodeidah port, a vital lifeline for humanitarian aid deliveries.

RUSSIA COMPLICATING END TO WAR, SAYS ZELENSKY, AS TRUMP PURSUES **PEACE DEAL**

Diary Times Desk: Volodymyr Zelensky has said that Russia's refusal to agree to a ceasefire is complicating efforts to end the war.

"We see that Russia rebuffs numerous calls for a ceasefire and has not yet determined when it will stop the killing. This complicates the situation," the Ukrainian president said in a statement on X.

On Monday, Zelensky will travel to Washington DC, where US President Donald Trump has said he will urge the Ukrainian leader to agree to a

Trump said he wants to bypass a ceasefire in Ukraine and move directly to a permanent peace agreement after his meeting Russian President Vladimir Putin.

In a major shift in position, the US president wrote on Truth Social following Friday's summit that this would be "the best way to end the horrific war", as ceasefires often "do not hold up".

Following a phone call with Trump after the summit, Zelensky called for a real, lasting peace, while adding that "the fire must cease" and killings

He later outlined Ukraine's requirements for "a truly sustainable and reliable peace", including a "credible security guarantee" and the return of children he says were "abducted from occupied territories" by Moscow.

ISRAELIS HOLD NATIONWIDE PROTEST TO END GAZA WAR, 'BRING BACK THE **HOSTAGES'**

Diary Times Desk: Thousands of protesters in Israel have taken to the streets demanding an end to the war in Gaza and a deal to free captives held there, as the military intensifies attacks on Gaza City to force tens of thousands of starving Palestinians to flee again.

Israeli schools, businesses and public transport have been shut down, with demonstrations planned in major cities as part of a national day of action by two groups representing a number of the families of captives and bereaved families. Protesters, who fear further fighting could endanger the 50 captives believed to remain in Gaza, only about 20 of whom are thought to be alive, chanted: "We don't win a war over the bodies of hostages."

"Military pressure doesn't bring hostages back it only kills them," former captive Arbel Yehoud said at a demonstration in Tel Aviv's.

"BEST WAY TO END HORRIFIC RUSSIA-UKRAINE WAR IS...": TRUMP AFTER PUTIN MEET

Diary Times Desk: Donald Trump on Saturday dropped his push for a ceasefire in Ukraine in favor of pursuing a full peace accord -- a major shift announced hours after his summit with Russian leader Vladimir Putin yielded no clear breakthrough.

Prior to the high-stakes meeting in Alaska, securing an immediate cessation of hostilities had been a core demand of Trump -- who had threatened "severe consequences" on Russia -- and European leaders, including Ukraine's Volodymyr Zelensky, who will now visit Washington on Monday.

The shift away from ceasefire would seem to favor Putin, who has long argued for negotiations on a final peace deal -- a strategy that Ukraine and its European allies have criticized as a way to buy time and press Russia's battlefield advances.

GERMAN FOREIGN MINISTER CRITICISES 'AGGRESSIVE' CHINA AHEAD OF TRIP TO JAPAN



Times Desk : Germany's Diary foreign minister on Sunday criticised what he called the "aggressive behaviour" of China in the Taiwan Strait ahead of a trip to Japan and Indonesia, and stressed need to strengthen the internationally binding rules.

Speaking to reporters, Foreign Minister Johann Wadephul praised Japan's solidarity with Europe over Ukraine as he prepared to board a plane, and highlighted the importance and economic potential of the two populous Asian countries

His ministry also published a separate statement from Wadephul in which he expressed concern about China.

"China's increasingly aggressive behaviour in the Taiwan Strait and the East and South China Seas also affects us in Europe: fundamental principles of our global co-existence are at stake here," the minister said.

"We are countering this together through our commitment to an international order, which is supported by the strength of the law and binding rules for all."

HUNGARIAN OPPOSITION LEADER DEMANDS RUSSIA REFRAIN FROM INTERFERENCE

Diary Times Desk: Hungarian opposition leader Peter Magyar has sought assurances from Russia that it will refrain from interference in his country's politics, saying there would be no scope for meaningful cooperation without respecting its sovereignty.

Earlier this week, Russia's Foreign Intelligence Service (SVR) published a statement describing Magyar as being loyal to "globalist elites" and alleging that the European Commission was considering "regime change in Budapest."

Magyar, whose Tisza Party is ahead of Prime Minister Viktor Orban's Fidesz in most polls ahead of parliamentary elections due next spring, published an open letter to Russia's ambassador in Hungary, asking what was the intended effect of the SVR statement.

"I demand clear assurances that the Russian Federation will refrain from any actions that could be deemed as interference in Hungary's domestic politics, including disinformation campaigns, cyber operations or the intimidation of politicians and citizens," Magyar said in the letter published on Facebook on Sunday.

In power since 2010, Orban has been criticised by some fellow EU leaders for his government's warm ties with Moscow and opposition to military aid for Ukraine. Orban has also accused EU leaders of plotting to topple him.

Magyar, a former government insider, has previously said he would strive for "pragmatic relations" with Russia, which supplies Hungary with most of its energy and is also involved in an expansion of its Paks nuclear plant.



FLOOD-LIKE SITUATION: PUNJAB PUTS HEALTH, CIVIL ADMINISTRATION ON ALERT

Diary Times Desk: As "controlled release" of water from the Pong dam continues and around 20 villages that fall in the riverbed of Beas, mainly in Sultanpur Lodhi, get affected, the Punjab government has put the health and civil administration authorities on alert.

The water level in Pong dam is 1,379 feet, as against the dam's capacity to hold 1,390 feet. With incessant rains continuing in north India, the authorities have gone in for controlled release of 57,000 cusecs of water from the spillways of the dam.

An official in the Punjab irrigation department told The Tribune that the water level in the Bhakra dam has reached 1,661 feet. "But it is still far from the danger mark of 1,680 feet and there is no need to worry or go in for controlled release," said the official.



NEAR-DEATH EXPERIENCE FOR FARIDKOT STUDENT AS CAR PLUNGES INTO SIRHIND CANAL



Diary Times Desk: A 20-year-old student from Faridkot, Karanveer Singh Brar, faced a harrowing near-death experience today while travelling to Chandigarh for his studies. The incident occurred on the Doraha-Neelon stretch near village Rampur when Karanveer swerved to avoid a speeding biker coming from the opposite direction.

In an attempt to avert a collision, Karanveer lost control of his vehicle, which struck a pole and plunged into the Sirhind canal. Trapped inside, he struggled to open the car window as water rushed in. Despite shouting for help, no one responded initially, and the biker, who caused the accident, looked on without offering assistance.

Recalling the terrifying moment, Karanveer said, "As the water began to fill the car, I thought of my parents and summoned all my strength to break the window. I managed to swim to the surface and reach the bank, narrowly escaping a tragic fate."

Witnesses, including local villager Harchand Singh, described Karanveer's quick thinking and bravery in breaking the window. Despite efforts from onlookers to throw turbans as lifelines, their attempts were in vain. The biker fled the scene immediately after the accident, leaving Karanveer to fend for himself.

Doraha police later arrived and recovered the submerged vehicle with the help of cranes and divers. Kulwinder Singh, the officer on duty, confirmed the biker's departure from the scene, emphasizing the need for accountability in such dangerous situations.

NAPA CONDEMNS ATTACK ON ELDERLY SIKH MEN IN ENGLAND'S WOLVERHAMPTON

RAIN WREAKS HAVOC: 355 ROADS BLOCKED, OVER 1,000 DISTRIBUTION TRANSFORMERS DISRUPTED IN HIMACHAL

Diary Times Desk: As many as 355 roads, including three National Highways (NH), remain disrupted for traffic movement as heavy rainfall continues to wreak havoc across the state.

As per the State Emergency Operation Centre, 202 roads — including NH 21 — are disrupted in Mandi district alone. Additionally, 64, including NH 305 in Kullu, 28 in Sirmaur, 27 in Kangra, nine in Chamba, eight in Shimla, seven in Una, six in Lahaul and Spiti, two, including NH 5, in Kinnaur and one each in Bilaspur and Hamirpur districts are disrupted for vehicular movement, causing inconvenience to commuters.

As many as 1,067 distribution transformers — including 557 in Kullu, 385 in Mandi, 112 in Lahaul and Spiti, 11 in Kinnaur, two in Chamba — and 116 water supply schemes — including 44 in Mandi, 41 in Kangra, 14 in Hamirpur, nine in Kullu, four in Shimla, three in Lahaul and Spiti and one in Solan district — also remain disrupted.

WATER LEVEL IN PONG DAM TOUCHES 1,379.98 FEET, BBMB ORDERS RELEASE OF 57,221 CUSECS

Diary Times Desk: With the water level of Pong Dam in Kangra district rising to an alarming position at 1,379.98 feet at 9 am on Sunday, the Bhakra Beas Management Board (BBMB) has begun controlled release of 57,221 cusecs of water through its turbines and spillways of the dam.

This is the highest release of water from the dam in the ensuing monsoon season. The BBMB has issued an alert to the district administrations of Kangra in Himachal Pradesh and Hoshiarpur in Punjab to take precautionary measures in the low-lying areas.

Already, a flood-like situation has emerged in the 'Mand' areas of the Beas river in both the states. Many villages, settlements have reportedly submerged in both states.

OVER 150 STRANDED TOURISTS AT KINNAUR'S YULLA KANDA RESCUED

Diary Times Desk: Around 150 stranded tourists were rescued from the Yulla Kanda trek route in Kinnaur district, police said here today.

According to reports, around 150 tourists from across the country had gone to pay obeisance at Lord Sri Krishna Temple, in Yulla Kunda on the occasion of Janamashtami. While they were returning from the temple, the trek route was completely obstructed due to overflowing of water in a nearby nallah. As a result, the tourists were not able to cross it and were left stranded. On receiving the information, a police team from Tapri reached the spot and conducted a rescue operation. They were safely able evacuate the stranded tourists with the assistance of locals. The rescue operations continued for a few hours.

Superintendent of Police (SP) Kinnaur Abhishek Shekhar said that due to heavy rainfall in the region, the trek route to the temple was blocked, leaving the devotees stranded. He said that all the people have been safely rescued.



KANGRA ADMINISTRATION BANS PLYING OF HEAVY VEHICLES ON DHARAMSALA-MCLEODGANJ ROAD

Diary Times Desk: In view of the growing threat of landslides and sinking soil, the Kangra district administration has banned the movement of heavy motor vehicles on the Dharamsala–McLeodganj bypass road with immediate effect.

The alternate Khada-Danda road, which also connects Dharamsala to McLeodganj, has already been declared unsafe for four-wheelers after a portion of it collapsed, last week.

The District Magistrate Hemraj Bairwa issued the order on Sunday evening after reports confirmed of subsidence at multiple locations on the bypass — which is a national highway.

The officials of the local police and National Highway Authority of India also warned that the soil beneath the road had turned unstable and might not be able to bear the load of heavy vehicles during spells of heavy rainfall.

SHIMLA-MANDI ROAD SINKS NEAR TATTAPANI; HEAVY RAIN TO CONTINUE TODAY

Diary Times Desk: The Shimla-Mandi road near Tattapani has sunk as a result of heavy rainfall, disrupting the traffic movement on the road. As per the district administration, due to the continuous sinking of the road into the Sutlej river, only 4.2-m-wide road is left, and half of the road is unavailable for vehicular traffic.

Meanwhile, heavy rain is likely to continue across the state as the State's Meteorological Department has issued an orange weather warning for Kullu, Mandi, Chamba, Kangra, Hamirpur, Bilaspur, Una, Solan and Sirmaur districts for the next few hours, resulting in light to moderate rain in many areas along with few spells of heavy rain at one or two places of these districts.

Similarly, a yellow weather warning has been issued for Shimla, Kinnaur and Lahaul and Spiti for the next few hours. As a result, light to moderate rain at isolated areas is very likely to occur in these districts.

CLOUDBURST IN MANDI TRIGGERS CHAOS; KIRATPUR-MANALI ROAD BLOCKED, PROPERTY DAMAGED

Diary Times Desk: A severe cloudburst over Shalanal Nala in Mandi district on Sunday morning caused widespread destruction.

Water and debris flooded the Kiratpur-Manali four-lane at Takoli, disrupting traffic and damaging property.

The cloudburst led to the collapse of walls around the office and colony of the infrastructure firm Afcon, and the employees ran for their lives. No casualties were reported, though several houses suffered significant damage.

Heavy rain triggered landslides, blocking the Kiratpur-Manali highway between Mandi and Kullu at Jhalogi.

District police have deployed teams to manage the situation and begin restoration work. According to officials, it may take four to five hours to clear the highway.

The alternative route via Kataula-Kamand between Mandi and Kullu has also been affected, but authorities expect to restore it soon for light motors.

The Mandi police have urged people to avoid non-essential travel. Travellers are advised to stay alert and follow official updates.

The dam authorities at Pandoh have issued an alert that water may be released from the dam following the cloudburst in Takoli area.

American getting nervous

A mericans are still opening their wallets, with unemployment remaining low and businesses blunting the effects of President Donald Trump's widespread tariffs.

But consumers remain skittish over Trump's erratic trade war, according to recent surveys. Still, they haven't cut back and consumer prices have remained somewhat

Businesses have played a key role in keeping the economy afloat, despite persistent economic jitters. For instance, companies mostly have not ramped up layoffs to deal with the cost pressures arising from Trump's tariffs. Unemployment remains low at 4.2%, and if Americans have a job, then they're able to spend and save.

Companies have also managed Trump's confusing onslaught of tariffs through a serious of maneuvers that have, so far, kept inflation from surging; a recent report from the Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond detailed all those strategies.

Economists have long said that tariffs will likely stoke consumer inflation, but so far, that hasn't happened. That might be because of how businesses have handled the situation, according to a recent analysis from the Richmond Fed that looked at survey responses from businesses.

The report said that businesses have delayed ordering inventories, delayed the timing of when a tariff is charged and negotiated partnerships with suppliers and customers to share costs. Many businesses also stocked up on inventories in the beginning of the year to avoid tariff-induced sticker shock.

And fortunately for the American worker, one of those strategies hasn't been to trim headcount. New applications for unemployment benefits remain low, according to Labor Department data.

That's done the trick in keeping a lid on consumer inflation, but it might not last for much longer. The latest Producer Price Index, which measures the prices businesses pay their suppliers, surged 0.9% in July from the prior month, lifting the annual rate to 3.3%. The monthly and annual figures both rose much more than economists had expected.

"Sensing from businesses suggests that the impact of tariffs on their price-setting has been lagged, but it is starting to play out," Richmond Fed economists said in their paper. "Nonetheless, it remains highly uncertain how tariffs will impact consumer inflation."

Consumer sentiment remains well below where it was late last year, after the presidential election. But it hasn't — and probably still won't — predict how Americans spend in the months ahead.

Consumer sentiment fell 5% this month to a preliminary reading of 58.6, the University of Michigan said Friday, falling for the first time in four months. Sentiment had improved, with consumers feeling a sense of relief that the worst of Trump's trade war might finally be in the rearview mirror.

But the effects of Trump's tariffs are still very much up in

"Consumers are no longer bracing for the worst-case scenario for the economy feared in April when reciprocal tariffs were announced and then paused," Joanne Hsu, the survey's director, said in a release. "However, consumers continue to expect both inflation and unemployment to deteriorate in the future."

Their expectations for inflation rates in the year ahead rose to 4.9% this month, up from 4.5% in July.

Still, Americans will likely continue to spend, just as they did in 2022 when sentiment fell to a record low because inflation was running at 40-year highs. Or in 2023, when a standoff in Congress over the debt ceiling prompted sentiment to fall, yet spending remain robust all throughout that year.

Air Canada suspends

operations as more than 10,000 Air Canada flight attendants went on strike early Saturday after a deadline to reach a deal passed, leaving travelers around the world stranded and scrambling during the peak summer travel season.

Canadian Union of Public

Canadian Union of Public Employees spokesman Hugh Pouliot confirmed the strike has started after no deal was reached, and the airline said shortly after that it would halt operations.

A bitter contract fight between Canada's largest airline and the union representing 10,000 of its flight attendants escalated Friday as the union turned down the airline's request to enter into government-directed arbitration, which would eliminate its right to strike and allow a third-party mediator to decide the terms of a new contract.

Flight attendants walked off the job around 1 a.m. ET on Saturday. Around the same time, Air Canada said it would begin locking flight attendants out of airports.

Federal Jobs Minister Patty Hajdu met with both the airline and union on Friday night and urged them to work harder to them to reach a deal "once and for all."



"It is unacceptable that such little progress has been made. Canadians are counting on both parties to put forward their best efforts,' Hajdu said in a statement posted on social media.

"CUPE has engaged with the mediator to relay our willingness to continue bargaining — despite the fact that Air Canada has not countered our last two offers since Tuesday," he said in a email. "We're here to bargain a deal, not to go on strike."

A complete shutdown will impact about 130,000 people a day, and some 25,000 Canadians a day may be stranded abroad. Air Canada operates around 700 flights per day.

Montreal resident Alex Laroche, 21, and his girlfriend had been saving since Christmas for their European vacation. Now their \$8,000 trip with nonrefundable lodging is on the line as they wait to hear from Air Canada about the fate of their Saturday night flight to Nice,

How long the airline's planes will be grounded remains to be seen, but Air Canada Chief Operating Officer Mark Nasr has said it could take up to a week to fully restart operations once a tentative deal is reached.

Passengers whose travel is impacted will be eligible to request a full refund on the airline's website or mobile app, according to Air Canada.

The airline said it would also offer alternative travel options through other Canadian and foreign airlines when possible. But it warned that it could not guarantee immediate rebooking because flights on other airlines are already full "due to the summer travel peak." Larroche said he considered booking new flights with a different carrier, but he said most of them are nearly full and cost more than double the \$3,000 they paid for their original tickets.

"At this point, it's just a waiting game," he said. Laroche said he was initially upset over the union's decision to go on strike, but that he had a change of heart after reading about the key issues at the center of the contract negotiations, including the issue of wages.

"Their wage is barely livable," Laroche said. Air Canada and the Canadian Union of Public Employees have been in contract talks for about eight months, but they have yet to reach a tentative deal. Both sides say they remain far apart on the issue of pay and the unpaid work flight attendants do when planes aren't in the air.

HOW AI IS BEING USED BY POLICE DEPARTMENTS

"The biggest problem in public safety right now is hiring. You cannot hire enough police officers," Isner said. "Anything a police department can adopt to make them more efficient is kind of the name of the game right now."

n his nine years at the Fort Collins, Colorado, police department, Officer Scott Brittingham says he has taken a lot of pride in the process of writing reports after each call for service.

But when the department decided to test a tool to speed things up, he was intrigued. Now, a report that might have previously taken him 45 minutes to write takes just 10 minutes.

"I was a little bit skeptical, I'm not a big technology person," Brittingham said in a March interview at the Fort Collins police station for CNN's Terms of Service podcast. But spending less time writing reports means Brittingham can "take more calls for service" and "be proactive in preventing crime." he said.

Brittingham is referring to Draft artificial intelligencepowered software that creates the first draft of police reports, aiming to make the process and easier. And his faster experience may increasingly become the norm for police officers as departments across the country adopt the tool. It's gaining traction even as some experts and civil rights advocates raise concerns that Aldrafted police reports could contain biases or inaccuracies, as well as presenting potential transparency issues.

Axon — the law enforcement tech company behind the tool that also makes tasers and body cameras — said Draft One has been its fastest growing product since it launched last year. And Axon isn't the only player in this industry; law enforcement tech company Truleo makes a similar Al police report tool called Field Notes.

Police reports sit at the heart of the criminal justice process officers use them to detail an incident and explain why they took the actions they did, and may later use them to prepare if they have to testify in court. Reports can also inform prosecutors, defense attorneys, judges and the public about the officer's perspective on what took place. They can influence whether a prosecutor decides to take a case, or whether a judge decides to hold someone without bond, said Andrew Guthrie Ferguson, American University law professor who the studies intersection technology and policing.

"Police reports are really an accountability mechanism," Ferguson said. "It's a justification for state power, for police power."

For that reason, proponents of Draft One tout the potential for Al to make reports more accurate and comprehensive, in addition to its time-saving benefits. But skeptics worry that any issues with the technology could have major ramifications for people's lives. At least one state has already passed a law regulating the use of Al-drafted police reports.

Draft One's rollout also comes amid broader concerns around Al in law enforcement, after experiments elsewhere with facial recognition technology have led to wrongful

"I do think it's a growing movement. Like lots of Al, people are looking at how do we update? How do we improve?" Ferguson said of Al police report technology. "There's a hype level, too, that people are pushing this because there's money to be made on the technologu."

After an officer records an interaction on their body camera, they can request that Draft One create a report. The tool uses the transcript from the body camera footage to create the draft, which begins to appear within seconds of the request. The officer is then prompted to review the draft and fill in additional details before submitting it as final. Each draft report contains bracketed fill-in-the-blanks that an officer must either complete or delete before it can be submitted. The blank portions are designed to ensure officers read through the drafts to correct potential errors or add missing information.

"It really does have to be the officer's own report at the end of the day, and they have to sign off as to what happened," Axon President Josh Isner told CNN.

Draft One uses a modified version of OpenAl's ChatGPT, which Axon further tested and trained to reduce the likelihood.

Diary Times Desk: Carlos Alcaraz reached his second final at the Cincinnati Open on Saturday after defeating Alexander Zverev in the semifinal. It also marked the seventh consecutive time he reached an ATP Tour final, increasing his season match win total to 53 in a year that already included five titles. The first came in the opening set when Zverev found the antidote to his cross-court game, leaving him trailing 2-3 before a late surge helped him regain the lead. The sight left Alcaraz frozen in shock as he walked to his bench during the change of play. His expression quickly went viral on social media. Zverev, however, failed to capitalize on the advantage as he began feeling unwell and took a medical timeout off court after the third game of the second set. Zverev, who has retired in only two matches since 2014, returned to finish what was a patchy match from Alcaraz, who had double-faulted four times in the second game of the second set but won the last 12 points with Zverev running on fumes.

UFC 319: CHIMAEV DOMINATES DU PLESSIS TO WIN MIDDLEWEIGHT CHAMPIONSHIP

Diary Times Desk: Khamzat Chimaev is the new undisputed UFC middleweight champion after a dominant display against title holder Dricus Du Plessis at the United Center in Chicago.

Billed as a battle between the undefeated UFC middleweights, Du Plessis put his belt on the line for the third time on Saturday against Chimaev, the No 3-ranked contender and considered one of the most feared pound-for-pound fighters on the UFC roster.

But Chimaev was in control of the bout from the beginning until the end in one of the most one-sided title fights in UFC history; all three judges scored the bout 50-44 for the Chechen fighter, who holds dual Russian and United Arab Emirates citizenship.

"I am happy, always," Chimaev said post-fight. "I never have a game plan, just go in and work like I do in the gym. That guy [Du Plessis] is strong. I couldn't finish. I respect that guy. He is the only champion that would say my name. This guy has big heart."

The victory extends Chimaev's unbeaten UFC win streak to 15. Du Plessis experienced his first UFC loss and drops to 23-3 for his mixed martial arts (MMA) career.
