"IMPORTANT THAT DE-ESCALATION ON BORDER CONTINUES": S JAISHANKAR, WANG YI MEET



Diary Times Desk: Foreign minister S Jaishankar -- at his meeting with his Chinese counterpart Wang Yi today — made the point that India and China would move forward with their bilateral relationship after "having seen a difficult period in our relationship" but three key concerns need to be addressed.

In his opening remarks before the meet of Special Representatives of India and China, Mr Jaishankar underscored the need to maintain peace in the border areas, ensure a "multipolar Asia" and an "exchange" of views on terrorism -- a crucial point given China's

"The basis for any positive momentum in our ties is the ability to jointly maintain peace and tranquility in the border areas. It is also essential that the de-escalation process move forward," Mr Jaishankar said.

The fight against terrorism in all its forms and manifestations is another major priority. I look forward to our exchange of views," the minister said in what was seen as a reference to the recent joint statement at SCO meet that India had refused to sign. The statement had skipped any mention of the Pahalgam terror attack of April 22 and mentioned incidents in Balochistan instead, tacitly suggesting Indian involvement. In Mr Jaishankar's opening remarks, there was also a tacit reference to the sudden imposition of 50 per cent US tariff on Indian goods. "In the current environment, there is clearly the imperative of maintaining

and enhancing stability in the global economy as well," Mr Jaishankar said.
India, he added, seeks a "fair, balanced and multi-polar world order, including a multi-polar Asia. Reformed multilateralism is also the call of the day". China's growing strong-arm tactics in southeast Asia has been a matter of concern for Indo-Pacific democracies. For years, China has been involved in territorial disputes in the resource-rich South and East China Seas - an area said to have abundant reserves of minerals, oil and other natura

'Indian on moon in 2040': Union minister lays out India's **SPACE AMBITIONS**

Diary Times Desk: Union minister Jitendra Singh on Monday laid out India's space plans for the next 15 years, culminating with an Indian astronaut setting foot on the moon.

Singh was speaking in the Lok Sabha during a discussion on Group Captain Shubhanshu Shukla's mission to the International Space Station (ISS). Initiating the discussion on 'India's first astronaut aboard the International Space Station: Critical role of the space programme for Viksit Bharat by 2047; the minister said Prime Minister Narendra Modi undertook space sector reforms after assuming office in 2014.

Jitendra Singh, minister of state in the PMO, said that India will undertake an uncrewed space mission involving a robot called 'Vyommitra' in 2026, followed by the country's maiden human spaceflight, Gaganyaan, in 2027. "India will set up its own Bharat Antariksh Station in 2035 and in 2040, an Indian astronaut will set foot on the moon," Singh said.

"Modi ji's dream of Viksit Bharat in 2047 will be heralded a few years in advance from the moon An Indian on the moon will announce the heralding of Viksit Bharat," the minister claimed.

Jitendra Singh also claimed that when the government opened up the space sector for private players in 2020, India's space economy had already reached \$8 billion and would touch \$45, billion in the next decade

SPARE CHINA BUT HIT INDIA: US SECRETARY OF STATE DEFENDS RUSSIAN OIL HYPOCRISY



Diary Times Desk: US Secretary of State Marco Rubio has acknowledged that imposing secondary sanctions on China for refining Russian oil could drive up global energy prices, even as Washington has punished India with additional tariffs for continuing to purchase crude from

Speaking to Fox News on August 17, Rubio cautioned that targeting Chinese refiners would have disruptive consequences for

"If you impose secondary sanctions on a country, as in the case of Russian oil shipments to China, China will simply refine that oil and it will return to the global market. Anyone buying this oil will pay a higher price, or if it is unavailable. they will have to look for alternative sources," he said.

Rubio revealed that European nations have already expressed unease over such measures. "When we discussed the Senate bill proposing a 100 percent tariff on China and India, we heard from a number of European countries that they were unhappy with that possibility," he added.

His comments came after he had earlier stressed that India's energy trade with Moscow has long been a sore spot in Washington. Speaking to Fox Radio, Rubio said India's continued purchases of Russian oil were "helping to sustain the Russian war effort in Ukraine" and were "most certainly a point of irritation" in New Delhi's relationship with the United States, though not the only one. "India has huge energy needs and that includes the ability to buy oil and coal and gas and things that it needs to power its economy like every country does, and it buys it from Russia, because Russian oil is sanctioned.

MONSOON FURY LEAVES 263 DEAD IN HIMACHAL PRADESH: LOSSES PEGGED AT ₹2,173



Diary Times Desk: The ongoing monsoon wreaked widespread havoc across Himachal Pradesh, claiming 263 lives since June 20, according to the Himachal Pradesh State Disaster Management Authority (HPSDMA).

Of the total fatalities, 136 were caused by rain-related incidents such as landslides, flash floods, cloudbursts, drowning, and electrocution. At the same time, 127 people lost their lives in separate road accidents, the report stated.

The torrential rains have also left a massive trail of destruction across the hill state. As per the cumulative report, more than 31,000 houses, shops, labour huts, cow sheds, and other structures have been damaged, including both fully and partially collapsed dwellings. On the infrastructure front, damage has been severe. 2,201 roads remain disrupted, hampering connectivity, 2,550 drinking water supply schemes have been hit, while 1,145 power supply lines are down, plunging several areas into darkness. In addition, public property losses have been estimated at a staggering

'REFUSED TO ANSWER HARD QUESTIONS': OPPOSITION HITS OUT AT EC IN JOINT STATEMENT



CHINA'S WANG YI'S 1ST INDIA VISIT IN 3 YEARS, 'ELEPHANT', 'DRAGON' TO DANCE?

Diary Times Desk: China Foreign Minister Wang Yi met his counterpart S Jaishankar in Delhi Monday evening and will meet Prime Minister Narendra Modi later, hinting at a potential reset of fractured ties between two of the world's largest economies as they navigate being bashed by US President Donald Trump's trade tariffs.

Mr Yi's visit signals the resumption of top-level Delhi-Beijing contact - this is his first visit to India in three years - a resumption to be cemented by the Prime Minister's trip August 31-September 1 trip to China's Tainjin for another meeting of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation.

Wang Yi's visit to India and the PM's China trip are significant from a border and regional security standpoint. Any peaceful resolution to long-standing disputes in Ladakh and Arunachal Pradesh, and any step towards a less geopolitically volatile Eurasia, will be widely welcomed.

The Chinese minister's visit is expected to help restart not just frozen border dispute resolution mechanisms, but also more important people-to-people contact like visas and direct flights stopped in the early days of the Covid pandemic and kept on hold after the violence in Ladakh.

DMK MP OPPOSITION'S FAVOURITE FOR VEEP POLLS, BUT TRINAMOOL HAS A PROBLEM

Diary Times Desk: The Opposition INDIA bloc is likely to pick the DMK's Rajya Sabha MP Tiruchi Siva as its Vice-Presidential candidate, in a strategic move that would pit the senior Tamil Nadu politician against another from his state in the upcoming election and overcome the key hurdle posed by regional politics, said sources. The official nominee will be known only after Opposition parties meet this evening at Congress chief Mallikarjun Kharge's house to decide on their candidate.

Maharashtra Governor CP Radhakrishnan, one of the BJP's tallest leaders in Tamil Nadu, is the NDA's candidate for the September 9 election, the central ruling party had announced last evening.

The untimely Vice-Presidential election follows the sudden resignation of Jagdeep Dhankhar, officially over health concerns, though sources had later pointed out differences with the BJP that ought to have forced the senior Jat leader to an early ovit

Choosing Mr Siva as its candidate could help the Opposition navigate the intricacies of regional politics, the sources indicated, highlighting several factors that may go in favour of the Tamil Nadu politician.

However, it may lead to a fallout with the Trinamool Congress, a key component of the INDIA bloc. Sources within the Mamata Banerjee-led party had earlier suggested that a non-political figure be projected for the Vice-Presidential election, insisting on building a consensus unlike last time. The Trinamool had abstained from voting in the last Vice Presidential election, disagreeing with the Opposition's choice of Congress leader Margaret Alva. Mr Dhankhar had won that election.

MK STALIN'S 7 QUESTIONS AFTER POLL BODY CHIEF DEFENDS BIHAR POLL ROLL REVISION

Diary Times Desk: Tamil Nadu Chief Minister and DMK president MK Stalin on Monday intensified his attack on the Election Commission of India (ECI), accusing it of "voter theft" through mass deletions under the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) process in Bihar. He said the Chief Election Commissioner's (CEC) recent press conference had "raised more doubts than answers" to the concerns flagged by the INDIA bloc. The remarks came a day after CEC

Gyanesh Kumar defended the SIR process, stressing it was transparent and legally mandated. "When more than seven crore voters of Bihar are standing with the Election Commission, then neither can any question mark be raised on its credibility nor the credibility of the voters," he said in New Delhi.

Mr Kumar dismissed allegations of double voting and "vote chori" as baseless, noting that booth-level officers, parties and voters themselves had verified and signed the documents. He urged political parties to point out errors before the September 1 deadline instead of raising objections later, and warned Rahul Gandhi to submit an affidavit within seven days to substantiate his allegations.

SUPREME COURT INITIATES SUO MOTU CASE ON STRUGGLES FACED BY CADETS WHO SUFFER DISABILITY DURING MILITARY TRAINING

Diary Times Desk: A 39-year-old man has been arrested for allegedly raping his 65-year-old mother twice, claiming he was punishing her for an alleged relationship she had in the past. According to police, the woman, accompanied by her 25-year-old daughter, approached the Hauz Qazi police station and lodged a complaint. The assaults took place shortly after the family returned from a religious trip to Saudi Arabia.

As per the complaint, the woman lives with her husband, a retired government employee, her accused son, and younger daughter in Delhi's Hauz Qazi area. The family also has an elder daughter who is married and lives nearby with her in-laws.

On July 17, the woman, her husband, and younger daughter travelled to Saudi Arabia. During their trip, the accused called his father and insisted he return to Delhi immediately. He also asked his father to divorce his mother, and accused her of having had illicit relationships during his childhood.

CARS, MOBILE PHONES, COMPUTERS. WHAT MAY GET CHEAPER IN NEW GST SYSTEM

Diary Times Desk: An overhaul of the Goods and Services Tax, or GST, framework - hailed as "next-generation" by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in his Independence Day speech ast week - is expected to slash prices of daily-use items by rationalising and reducing the number of brackets under which various goods are taxed.

The revision is also expected to lower taxes on passenger vehicles and two-wheelers.

Sources told NDTV last week five per cent and 18 per cent brackets have been proposed, and goods earlier taxed under others, i.e., 12 and 28 per cent, will now be shifted to one of these.

Specifically, sources said the government plans to cut tax on 90 per cent of all goods currently attracting 28 per cent GST and drop these products into the 18 per cent bracket. A similarly large chunk of goods now taxed at 12 per cent will face reduced levies – five per cent only.

The five per cent bracket will include 'daily-use' items, the government had said.

In addition, there will be a special 'sin tax' of 40 per cent on certain items, including tobacco products. There will be only five to seven goods in this list, sources said.

These already attract higher levies. Chewing tobacco, for example, faces a 160 per cent cess and cigarettes are taxed through a mix of GST, cess and National Calamity Contingent

BENGALURU BRACES FOR WEEK-LONG RAIN AS IMD ISSUES RED ALERT FOR PARTS OF KARNATAKA

Diary Times Desk: The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued a red alert for multiple districts in Karnataka, forecasting "very heavy to extremely heavy rain" on August 18 and 19.

The highest-level weather warning is in place for Udupi, Dakshina Kannada, Shivamogga, Chikkamagaluru, and Uttara Kannada districts. Meanwhile, an orange alert has been issued for Belagavi and Haveri.

Bengaluru Urban and Rural, along with Ballari, are expected to receive moderate yet consistent rainfall, accompanied by strong winds. For the state capital, IMD has predicted a continuous spell of rain lasting through August 23, raising concerns about further waterlogging and disruption to daily life.

Already grappling with flooding in several neighbourhoods, Bengaluru could see worsening conditions if the wet weather continues. Authorities have warned of possible traffic delays and interruptions to civic services.

The current surge in rainfall is attributed to a low-pressure area that has formed over the Bay of Bengal near the Andhra Pradesh–Odisha coast. IMD noted that this system is likely to intensify and move inland by August 19, drawing moisture-laden winds across Karnataka.

An active monsoon trough stretching across central India, along with a cyclonic circulation over the northeast Arabian Sea, is also fuelling widespread rainfall in the state.

Diary Times Desk: A Hong Kong court heard final arguments Monday in the landmark national security trial of former prodemocracy newspaper founder Jimmy Lai, who could be sentenced to up to life in prison if he is convicted.

Lai, 77, was arrested in 2020 under a national security law imposed by Beijing following anti-government protests in 2019. He is being tried on charges of colluding with foreign forces to endanger national security and conspiring with others to issue seditious publications.

Lai founded Apple Daily, one of the local media outlets that was most critical of Hong Kong's government. His high-profile case that has stretched nearly 150 days, almost double the original estimate, is widely seen as a trial of press freedom and a test for judicial independence in the Asian financial hub.

It is unclear when a verdict will be delivered.
Prosecutor Anthony Chau said on Monday that

Prosecutor Anthony Chau said on Monday that Lai was arrested for collusion in August 2020, but he continued to make requests for sanctions, blockades or other hostile activities in the following months.

Chau suggested that the appeals for foreign actions did not only target individuals, but also China, while the foreign collaborations Lai had were long-term and persistent. Chau cited Lai's foreign connections to show what he called Lai's "unwavering intent" to solicit foreign actions. A prosecution document shown in court argued that the law doesn't prohibit normal international exchanges. But how Lai attempted to draw an analogy of what he did to the cooperation between Hong Kong's prosecuting authority and the International Association of Prosecutors was bewildering.

WHY US UPGRADED BALOCHISTAN LIBERATION ARMY'S TERROR DESIGNATION



Diary Times Desk: US systemic rivalry with China over the contours of the emerging world order has made many assume that it backs all opponents of the People's Republic, from neighboring states with whom Beijing has territorial disputes to terrorist groups, yet a recent move just shattered this perception.

The US State Department abruptly raised the Balochistan Liberation Army's (BLA) 2019 "Specially Designated Global Terrorist" designation to a "Foreign Terrorist Organization" amid the US-Pakistani rapprochement.

The BLA is veritably a terrorist group whose last well-known attack was its deadly hijacking of the Jaffar Express earlier this spring, which followed an upsurge of other terrorist attacks over the past three years, including against projects connected to the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC).

CPEC is a flagship project of China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) and was envisaged as giving China direct access to the Indian Ocean for preemptively mitigating the effects of any future US blockade of the Malacca Strait.

TAIWAN 'ISSUE' AN INTERNAL MATTER, CHINA SAYS IN RESPONSE TO TRUMP

Diary Times Desk: Taiwan is an internal matter for China, Beijing's foreign ministry said on Monday, in response to US President Donald Trump saying Chinese President Xi Jinping told him he will not invade the island while Trump is in office.

Trump made the comments in an interview with Fox News, ahead of talks in Alaska with Russian President Vladimir Putin over Moscow's war with Ukraine.

Asked about Trump's remarks at a daily news briefing in Beijing, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Mao Ning said Taiwan is an inalienable part of Chinese territory.

"The Taiwan issue is purely an internal affair of China, and how to resolve the Taiwan issue is a matter for the Chinese people," she said.

"We will do our utmost to strive for the prospect of peaceful reunification.

CHINA HANDS OVER THIRD HANGOR-CLASS SUBMARINE TO PAKISTAN

Diary Times Desk: China has delivered the third of the eight new "advanced" Hangor-class submarines to Pakistan as part of Beijing's efforts to upgrade Islamabad's naval strength to support its growing presence in the Indian Ocean, India's backyard.

The launching ceremony of the third Hangor-class submarine was held in Wuhan, Central China's Hubei province, on Thursday, the state-run Global Times reported on Saturday.

The second of the eight submarines China is building for Pakistan was handed over in March this year.

This is in addition to four modern naval frigates that China supplied to Pakistan in the last few years as part of its efforts to boost Pakistan's naval strength amid the Chinese navy's steady expansion in the Arabian Sea, where it is developing the Gwadar port in Balochistan, as well as in the Indian Ocean. Speaking at the launch of the third submarine, Pakistan's Deputy Chief of Naval Staff Project-2 Vice

Speaking at the launch of the third submarine, Pakistan's Deputy Chief of Naval Staff Project-2 Vice Admiral Abdul Samad said the Hangor-class submarine's cutting-edge weaponry and advanced sensors would be instrumental in sustaining regional power equilibrium and ensuring maritime stability, the daily quoted a Pakistan defence statement as saying.

According to a recent report by the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI), China supplied over 81 per cent of Pakistan's military hardware.

Some of Pakistan's key orders in the past five years include the country's first spy ship, the Rizwan; more than 600 VT-4 battle tanks, and 36 J-10CE 4.5-generation fighters, according to the SIPRI database.

UKRAINE'S DEFENSE FORCES HIT OIL PUMPING STATION OF DRUZHBA PIPELINE IN RUSSIA'S TAMBOV REGION

Diary Times Desk: On the night of August 18th, units of Ukraine's Unmanned Systems Forces, working with other units of the Defense Forces, struck the Nikolskoye-1 oil pumping station in Russia's Tambov region, the General Staff reported.

"As a result of the strike, a fire broke out at the facility. Oil pumping through the Druzhba main pipeline has been completely halted," the department said.

The shutdown was also confirmed by Hungary's Foreign Minister Péter Szijjártó on Facebook.

He condemned the attack, saying it had forced a suspension of oil supplies to Hungary.

"Another attack on our energy security is outrageous and unacceptable," Szijjártó said. He added that Russian Deputy Energy Minister Pavel Sorokin had reported about specialists attempting to restore the transformer station critical to the pipeline's operation, but no timeline for resuming supplies was available.

The damage was confirmed by NASA's Firms fire monitoring service, which recorded several fire sites around 2 a.m. local time.

The Nikolskoye-1 station is located near Sestrenka-Kugushevo, about 400 kilometers from the front line. It is a key facility on the 5,500-kilometer Druzhba pipeline, responsible for supplying oil products to Tambov and neighboring regions in central Russia

14 KILLED IN RUSSIAN ATTACK ON UKRAINE AHEAD OF TRUMP-ZELENSKY TALKS

Diary Times Desk: Russian attacks, including on an apartment block in Kharkiv city, killed 14 people across Ukraine, authorities said Monday, ahead of talks in Washington between President Volodymyr Zelensky and US leader Donald Trump.

The early-morning drone attack on Kharkiv reduced part of a fivestorey residential building to rubble and sparked fires on at least three floors, governor Oleg Synegubov said on Telegram.

The emergency services posted videos showing rescuers trying to break through rubble to free a trapped resident.

"Seven civilians, including two children, have been killed in the attack," Interior Minister Igor Klymenko said on social media, adding that 23 people were wounded.

The city near the Russian border was also hit hours earlier by a ballistic missile that wounded at least 11 people, Mayor Igor Terekhov said

Klymenko said another three people were killed and 23 wounded in a strike on the Zaporizhzhia region.



ZELENSKY RETURNS TO SITE OF STUNNING OVAL OFFICE SHOUTING MATCH TO MEET TRUMP

Diary Times Desk : Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky returns to the Oval Office on Monday for the first time since a spectacularly tense exchange with President Donald Trump saw their talks cut short and question marks raised over future US support.

At the February 28 meeting, President Trump and Vice President JD Vance berated Zelensky on live television, accusing him of being ungrateful for US aid provided since Russia's invasion three years prior, and pressing for quick negotiations to end the war.

The hostile confrontation marked a turning point in Kyiv-Washington relations, which had been warm under former president Joe Biden, and raised fears that President Trump would cut off US military support.

The scene quickly devolved at the end of a long question-and-answer session with the press.

Vice President Vance accused President Zelensky of being "disrespectful" and displaying ingratitude for President Trump's diplomatic efforts, after the Ukrainian leader expressed skepticism that Russian President Vladimir Putin could be trusted, given his repeated violations of earlier agreements.

INDIAN TRUCK DRIVER'S FATAL U-TURN SPARKS TEAM TRUMP VS CALIFORNIA GOVERNOR

'SKIBIDI' AND 'TRADWIFE' AMONG WORDS ADDED TO CAMBRIDGE DICTIONARY

Diary Times Desk: "Skibidi", "tradwife" and other slang terms popularised on social media are among thousands of new words to be added to the Cambridge Dictionary this year.

Skibidi is a gibberish term which gained popularity via a viral animated video series on YouTube, while tradwife is a shortening of "traditional wife" – a married mother who cooks, cleans and posts on social media.

More than 6,000 new words have been added, including those that relate to tech giants and remote working.

"Internet culture is changing the English language and the effect is fascinating to observe and capture in the dictionary," said lexical programme manager Colin McIntosh.

Skibidi is defined in the dictionary as "a word that can have different meanings such as 'cool' or 'bad', or can be used with no real meaning as a joke". An example of its use is "What the skibidi are you doing?"

Reality TV star Kim Kardashian revealed her familiarity with the phrase when she posted a video on Instagram showing a necklace engraved with "skibidi toilet" – the name of the YouTube series.

An earlier use of the word came in 2018 when the band Little Big released a track called Skibidi. The music video has been viewed more than 700 million times and features a dance that went viral.



PUTIN'S BODYGUARDS CARRIED 'POOP SUITCASE' TO ALASKA SUMMIT. HERE'S WHY

POLLS CLOSE IN BOLIVIA AS 20 YEARS OF LEFTIST RULE EXPECTED TO END

Diary Times Desk: Polls have closed in Bolivia's presidential and general elections, with the governing socialists expected to lose power after almost 20 years due to a deep economic crisis and division within the leftist coalition.

Ballot stations shut at 4pm (20:00 GMT) on Sunday, with initial results expected after 9pm (01:00 GMT on Monday)

The election is the first time in almost two decades that polling indicates Bolivia's incumbent Movement for Socialism (MAS) could face defeat. MAS-affiliated and other left-leaning candidates trail the right-wing opposition by about 10 percent, according to the latest Ipsos survey done in August.

Eight presidential candidates are in the running – from the far-right to the political left. But two candidates appear to have a comfortable lead: Jorge "Tuto" Quiroga, who served as interim president and vice president under former military ruler Hugo Banzer, and Samuel Doria Medina, a wealthy businessman and former planning minister.

Medina, 66, and Quiroga, 65, are neck and neck, according to the polling survey.

Former leftist President Evo Morales has been barred from running, and the outgoing socialist President Luis Arce, who had fallen out with Morales, opted out of the race.

ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT ZELENSKY'S UPCOMING MEETING WITH TRUMP

Diary Times Desk: US President Donald Trump is set to host Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy and European leaders at the White House on Monday to discuss how to end Russia's three-year war in Ukraine

Months of US-led diplomatic efforts to stop the fighting haven't made headway, but the stakes have risen since Trump met with with Russian President Vladimir Putin on Friday. After that summit, Trump abandoned the requirement of reaching a ceasefire in order to hold further talks and aligned with Putin's position that negotiations should focus on a long-term settlement instead.

The presence of several European leaders at the talks in Washington shows how central the conflict - and any settlement - is to wider security questions on the continent.

They are looking to safeguard Ukraine and Europe more broadly from any further aggression from Moscow - but also are providing a show of support for Zelenskyy after his last visit to the White House led to an angry confrontation. The American and Ukrainian leaders are scheduled to first meet privately, without the Europeans.



THE INDUSTRIAL HEARTLAND IN UKRAINE THAT IS KEY TO PEACE DEAL WITH PUTIN

Diary Times Desk: The United States monitors the India-Pakistan situation "every single day", said US Secretary of State Marco Rubio on Sunday, reiterating claims by American President Donald Trump of having helped in averting a nuclear escalation between two Asian neighbours. India has maintained that the military conflict with Pakistan ended in May through a ceasefire sought by Islamabad after suffering heavy damage. People were simply sleeping when the Russian army launched strikes on the cities. We discussed the battlefield situation and our strong diplomatic capabilities - Ukraine's and all of Europe's together with America," the Ukrainian president added further.

WAR-TORN MYANMAR TO HOLD FIRST GENERAL ELECTION SINCE **2021 COUP**

Diary Times Desk: Myanmar will begin its general elections on 28 December, its military government announced, in a phased poll widely condemned as a sham that will be used to entrench the junta's power.

This will be the first vote since the junta seized power in a bloody coup in 2021, and imprisoned democratically elected leader Aung San Sung Kyi.

Myanmar has been embroiled in a civil war since, with deadly battles between the military and ethnic armed groups, many of whom have said they would not permit voting in their areas. Previous plans to hold an election were repeatedly delayed as the military has struggled to contain an opposition insurgency which has gained control over much of the country.

Some 55 parties have registered for the polls, state media said Monday, adding that nine of them plan to compete for seats nationwide.

"The first phase of the multi-party democratic general election for each parliament will begin on Sunday, 28 December 2025," Myanmar's election commission said in a statement.

"Dates for the subsequent phases will be announced later."

With large parts of Myanmar under opposition control and in a state of war, holding this election is a formidable logistical exercise for the country's military rulers.

But the junta's leader Min Aung Hlaing, who led the catastrophic coup four and a half years ago, has said the vote must go ahead, and has threatened severe punishment for anyone who criticises or obstructs the election.



PUNJAB CABINET SHUFFLE: SANJEEV ARORA GETS POWER DEPT, HARBHAJAN ETO LEFT WITH PWD

Diary Times Desk: Harbhajan Singh ETO has lost the Power department to Sanjeev Arora, a new entrant in the Bhagwant Mann-led Punjab Cabinet. ETO will now have only the Public Works department. Arora, who was sworn in as a minister in Punjab Cabinet last month, has been empowered by getting another portfolio. He already has the Industry and Commerce, Investment Promotion, and NRI Affairs departments. The notification regarding the reallocation of portfolios was issued late this evening.

The Punjab Governor, on the advice of CM Mann, has changed the portfolios of the two ministers. For the past few months, there were murmurs in the corridors of power regarding impending changes in the portfolios of ministers. Even when Arora, who left his Rajya Sabha seat to contest and win the Ludhiana West byelection, was sworn in as a minister in July, the re-allocation of portfolios was expected. However, other than inducting him into the cabinet and removing Kuldeep Singh Dhaliwal, no other changes were made then.



AMRITSAR POLICE BOOK CASE OVER AI-MORPHED VIDEO OF GOI DEN TEMPLE



Diary Times Desk: Following a complaint lodged by the Golden Temple management, the Amritsar police have registered an FIR against an unknown person for hurting Sikh sentiments by morphing videos of Darbar Sahib. In the complaint, lodged by Bhagwant Singh Dhangera, General Manager of Golden Temple, it was alleged that a miscreant with a social media page 'Good Farmers' had uploaded morphed videos of Darbar Sahib using an Artificial Intelligence (AI) tool, showing it collapsing in floodwaters. The complaint was submitted on August 13, and the police registered an FIR with the Cybercrime cell on August 14.

Police Commissioner Gurpreet Singh Bhullar has confirmed the registration of the FIR, adding that investigations are in progress to identify the miscreants behind uploading the Al-morphed video. Dhangera pointed out that the video was shared and viewed by people thousands of times, causing huge resentment among the Sikh community. He termed the incident unfortunate, adding that the Al technique has been repeatedly used in the recent past to tamper with pictures of the Sikh Gurus also. He urged the Police Commissioner to take stringent measures so that nobody could misuse Al technology in the future to hurt Sikh sentiments.

COUNTRY ROADS OF PUNJAB POOR COUSINS OF STATE HIGHWAYS

Diary Times Desk: Country roads in Punjab continue to be the poor cousins of highways in the state, with commuters facing harrowing times during their daily travel across the state. Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann announced in his Independence Day speech at Faridkot that the state had approved a budget for work on 19,000 km of roads in rural areas after the monsoons. But in the context of the Centre recently scrapping Rs 800 crore worth of road projects in rural Punjab, along with the Centre withholding grants worth more than Rs 9,000 crore under Rural Development Fund (RDF), analysts say the target may be difficult to reach.

The figures are important in the context that a bulk of the RDF was spent on repairing and maintaining roads in rural areas. The situation arose after the central government proposed reducing RDF to a maximum of 2 per cent of MSP against the earlier rate of 3 per cent. More than 5,000 km of rural roads are unfit for normal travel or badly damaged. People are pleading for at least the potholes to be filled.

ANDAMAN DGP HARGOBINDER SINGH DHALIWAL TO BE HONOURED WITH PRESIDENT'S MEDAL

Diary Times Desk: The Ministry of Home Affairs has announced President's Police Medal for Distinguished Service to be awarded to Hargobinder Singh Dhaliwal, the Director General of Police (DGP) of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, on the occasion of India's 79th Independence Day.

He belongs to Patiala and is an alumnus of Punjab Public School, Nabha, and Panjab University, Chandigarh. He has completed his degrees of MBA and LLB before joining IDS

A 1997-batch IPS officer of the AGMUT cadre, Dhaliwal has earned a reputation for his sharp investigative skills and leadership in high-profile criminal cases. His most notable contribution in recent years was his pivotal role in the investigation of the Sidhu Moosewala murder case, which drew national and international attention.

As the head of the Delhi Police Special Cell at the time, Dhaliwal led the operation that resulted in the arrest of three key shooters involved in Moosewala's killing. His team apprehended Priyavrat Fauji, Ankit Sersa and Kashish, and coordinated with other agencies to track down Deepak Mundi, who was later arrested near the Nepal border.

FARMERS, CONGRESS FORCED AAP GOVT TO WITHDRAW LAND POOLING INITIATIVE: PUNJAB CONGRESS CHIEF RAJA WARRING

Diary Times Desk: Punjab Congress president Amrinder Singh Raja Warring on Sunday accused the BJP of "trying to steal" the credit for the withdrawal of the land polling policy, saying it was farmers and his party that forced the AAP government to roll back the initiative.

He said it was the Congress and state farmers who put up a strong resistance against the policy with massive protests.

"It is farmers and the Congress workers who deserve the credit. The BJP is trying to steal it," he said asking the BJP leadership to spell out its contribution to making the government withdraw the policy.

The state Congress president also accused the BJP of "playing a fixed match with ruling AAP", which he said was "trying to help it in making inroads into Punjab".

HIGH COURT QUASHES PUNJAB'S BLANKET BAN ON HYBRID PADDY SEEDS



Diary Times Desk: The Punjab and Haryana High Court has set aside Punjab's April 7 order imposing a blanket ban on the use of notified hybrid paddy seeds in the State after holding that it did not withstand the test of legality. The Bench clarified that the State could not prohibit the use of varieties duly notified by the Government of India under the Seeds Act of 1966. It, as such, upheld the administrative orders of April 4 and April 10, 2019, which had restricted only the use of nonnotified hybrid seeds, while permitting the notified varieties.

Justice Kuldeep Tiwari ruled that the administrative order dated April 4, 2019, partially modified vide administrative order dated April 10, 2019, imposing prohibition only on use non-notified varieties of hybrid paddy in the State, while allowing varieties notified by the Government of India under the Seeds Act of 1966 passed the test of legality.

The Bench added that the administrative order dated April 7, prohibiting the use of notified varieties of hybrid paddy seeds in the State, did not pass the test of legality. Therefore, the impugned administrative order dated April 7 was set aside.

SHIMLA-MANDI ROAD SINKS AT SUNNI; VEHICULAR MOVEMENT DISRUPTED



Diary Times Desk: Traffic movement on the Shimla-Mandi road at Sunni in Shimla district has been disrupted after the road was severely damaged after a significant portion of the road sank into the Satluj river.

As a result, the road width has been reduced to 1.5 metres.

According to the district administration, the road has been severely affected due to scouring caused by the water current of the Satluj, making it unsafe for vehicular movement. The district administration has closed the road till further orders.

HEAVY RAINS PROMPT CLOSURE OF 400 ROADS IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

Diary Times Desk: Heavy rains continued to lash parts of Himachal Pradesh on Monday, triggering landslides at several places and prompting closure of 400 roads, including three national highways.

However, no loss of life was reported, officials said.

The Shimla-Mandi road was closed near Tatti-Pani in Sunni area of Shimla district due to scouring and sliding caused by Satluj river. The width of the road has been reduced to 1.5 metres, making it unsafe for vehicular movement. The alternative route via Thali Bridge is also closed, cutting off Karsog from Shimla.

Road connectivity to about 15 villages was snapped following a massive landslide on Aut-Largi-Sainj road near Pagal Nala in Kullu district, reports said.

Dhaulakuan received 113 mm of rain since Sunday evening, followed by Jot 70.8 mm, Malraon 70 mm, Palampur 58.7 mm, Jatton Barrage 49.4 mm, Paonta Sahib 40.6 mm, Murari Devi 33 mm, Gohar 32 mm, Nahan 30.1 mm, Sarahan 28.5 mm and Dharamsala 24.7 mm.

Sundernagar and Murari Devi witnessed a thunderstorm, while Tabo Reckong Peo and Kufri experienced gusty winds with speeds ranging from 37 to 44 kilometres per hour.

The local meteorological office has issued a 'yellow' warning for heavy rains at isolated places in the state till August 24, except on August 21.

he writing has been on the wall for a long time: South Korea's birth rate has dropped throughout much of the past decade, spelling trouble for the military as regional threats and global conflicts simmer.

Now, a new report has found that the number of South Korean troops declined by 20% in the past six years, in large part because of the dwindling pool of young men reflecting the shrinking workforce and swelling elderly population in one of the world's most rapidly aging countries.

Defense Ministry attributed the drop to "complex factors" including population decline and fewer men wanting to become officers due to "soldier treatment." The report didn't elaborate on that treatment but studies and surveys have previously highlighted the military's notoriously harsh



hasic.

As of July, the military had 450,000 training may be troops, it said - down from 563,000

conditions.

"If the number of standing army (members) continues to decline. there can be difficulties in securing elite manpower and limits in operating equipment," warned the

report, shared last week by lawmaker Choo Mi-ae. The news comes at a bad time for South Korea, a key Western ally which hosts huge numbers of US troops and has a mutual defense treaty with Washington.

Just across the border, neighboring North Korea has sent tens of thousands of soldiers to fight for Russia along the front lines with Ukraine - raising fears that Moscow may share advanced military technology with Pyongyang in exchange, violating international sanctions.

Meanwhile, North Korea's ruling Kim family has continued blasting hostile rhetoric, threatening to destroy South Korea with nuclear weapons if attacked and warning that Seoul remains "the enemy."

However, experts say, that doesn't necessarily mean North Korea's military is better off.

The North is facing its own population woes and birth rate decline - and its technology lags far behind the South, which is now hoping to plug the shortfall in military recruits through innovation.

"South Korea is incomparably far ahead of North Korea in terms of conventional weapons," said Choi Byung-ook, a national security professor at Sangmyung University. "We have smaller troops now, but I like to say 'small but strong military,' that's what we need to become."On the surface, North Korea has a few advantages.

It's one of the world's most heavily militarized nations, with up to 1.3 million armed forces personnel, according to the CIA World Factbook. That's nearly three times higher than South Korea's troop numbers.

Those troops also serve in the military for far longer - an average of 10 years, which allows them to have higher cohesion (and) knowledge of each other's capabilities," said Sydney Seiler, senior adviser to the Korea Chair at the Center for Strategic and International

By contrast, there's "really not much advanced skills that you can develop" within the year and a half that most South Korean conscripts serve, Seiler said.

North Korea's fertility rate - defined as the average number of children born to a woman in her lifetime - is also far higher, at 1.77 in 2025 compared to South Korea's rate of 0.75, UN data shows. That data also suggests the North has been having more babies per year than the South since 2018, said Jooyung Lee, senior economist at the Bank of Korea Economic Research Institute.

Terence Stamp star and famed figure

who became synonymous with Swinging London in the 1960s. has died, his family said Sunday, according to Reuters. He was 87 vears old.

Stamp first came to prominence when he took on the titular role in the 1962 film "Billy Budd." The black and white drama, directed by Peter Ustinov, who also starred, saw Stamp nominated for an Academy Award for best supporting actor - the only Oscar nomination of his lengthy career. He went on to star in a host of

films in the 1960s, among them Schlesinger's Hardy adaptation "Far From the Madding Crowd" and Ken Loach's first feature film, "Poor Ken

He was a star who rose from humble beginnings in London's East End, about as far from Hollywood as you can get. He was born on July 22, 1938, to parents Ethel and Thomas, a merchant seaman.

In a 2013 interview with the British Film Institute (BFI), Stamp revealed that his father tried to deter him from a career in showhiz

"He genuinely believed that people like us didn't do things like that," he said. But his mother, he said, "loved every second of it."



Ironically, more than two decades later Stamp went on to voice the role of Superman's father Jor-El in the TV series "Smallville."

"In retrospect, my mother must have always wanted me to do it and must have wished that she could have been more supportive. But my dad was the head of the family and I never really knew what he thought of it because he was of that generation.

"He was a merchant seaman, he shovelled coal, and in that confined living quarters any show of emotion would have been considered

His only marriage came in 2002 - to an Australian pharmacist 35 years his junior - but that lasted just six years, according to the

Stamp famously roomed with fellow actor Michael Caine, who was also a rising star at the time. The pair lost touch, however, as he disclosed in an interview with The Guardian newspaper in 2015.

understand it: in many ways he was much more mature than me." he said of Caine, who was five vears older.

"Caine gave me all my early values, like making sure you were doing good stuff, waiting for the right things - then as soon as he got away he did exactly the opposite. Went from one movie to another.

After a few years away from the screen, Stamp appeared in the 1978 blockbuster "Superman" as superhero's adversary. General Zod. He reprised the role of the comic book villain in the sequel two years later.

His many screen credits also included his role as drag queen the Bernadette in 1990s comedy Adventures of Priscilla, Queen of the Desert." Of his eclectic career - including roles in Hollywood's "Wall Street" and "The Adjustment Bureau" - he told the Guardian that he had no ambitions, adding: 'I've had bad experiences and things that didn't work out; my love for film sometimes diminishes but then it just resurrects itself.

"I never have to gee myself up, or demand a huge wage to get out of bed in the morning.

The US Federal Trade Commission ticket reseller Investment Group for evading purchasing limits to buy up thousands of tickets to live events including Taylor Swift's Eras tour and resell them at a markup, according to a complaint filed in Maryland federal court Monday.

The Baltimore, Maryland-based company, which operates ticket resale sites including TotalTickets.com. used thousands of Ticketmaster accounts. including fake purchased accounts, the FTC said.

Ticketmaster intense faced criticism after its botched 2022 sale of tickets to Swift's muchhyped New Eras Tour, when billions of requests from Swift fans, bots and ticket resellers overwhelmed its website and the company canceled a planned ticket sale to the general public.

For one Swift concert, Key Investment Group used different accounts to purchase 273 tickets and evade a 6-ticket purchase limit, the FTC said on . Monday.

FTC Chairman Andrew Ferguson said in a statement that the lawsuit puts ticket sellers on notice that the agency will go after those who circumvent ticketing platforms' limits on ticket

The lawsuit is part of a crackdown President Donald Trump announced in focused on curbing exploitative ticket reselling practices that raise costs for fans.

Key Investment Group sued the FTC in July to block its investigation, saying that its ticket purchases did not use automated software, or bots, and did not violate the Better Online Ticket Sales (BOTS) Act.

The FTC has made it clear that "they intend to use the BOTS Act secondary-ticket market," the company said in its lawsuit.

The agency on Monday accused Key Investment Group and three of its executives of violating the BOTS Act as well as the FTC Act, which prohibits unfair and deceptive business practices.

Ticketmaster and its parent Nation company. Live Entertainment (LYV), are facing a lawsuit brought by U.S. antitrust enforcers accusing the company of monopolizing markets across the live concert industry.

Much like Blackstone buying a bunch of housing and making it harder for Americans to buy companies like Investment Group are using fake or purchased accounts on

ticketing sites like TicketMaster to buy and resell tickets in bulk, making it harder and more expensive for music fans to get tickets themselves

The lawsuit stems, in part, from a crackdown President Trump announced in March of this year in an effort to curb exploitative tactics with regard to ticket pricing.



IN US OPEN MIXED REVAMP, A THREAT TO DOUBLES FUTURE?



Diary Times Desk: The year's last Grand Slam begins this week with an unconventional first. Mixed doubles as a format in tennis is more than a century old, which the US Open has shaken up through a revamped standalone event starting Tuesday. It largely features top singles stars, with a handful of doubles specialists thrown in to make up the 16-team, two-day, shorter format spectacle. The traditional mixed doubles, a third wheel to the two doubles events at Slams, has been given the boot.

From the time this radical move was announced in February, the debate has been about sidelining an entire event and set of players. Reigning US Open mixed doubles champions Sara Errani and Andrea Vavassori, who have since been handed a wildcard in the singles-driven field, termed it "profound injustice".

Locker room chatter around this appears heading into the innovative unknown."Most of the chat has been about uncertainty – if this can happen at one Slam, where does it stop?" Rohan Bopanna, India's 2024 Australian Open men's doubles champion who has played doubles with and against top singles players over a two-decade long pro career, told HT from the US.
