The Defence Ministry has received and started discussions on the proposal from the Indian Air Force for acquiring II4 'Made in India' Rafale fighter jets, which would be built by the French firm Dassault Aviation involving Indian aerospace firms.

The proposal, expected to be worth over Rs 2 lakh crore, including the indigenous content of more than 60 per cent, is expected to be taken up for discussion by the Defence Procurement Board headed by the Defence Secretary in the next few weeks.

The defence project, once completed, would be the biggest ever defence deal to have been signed by the Indian government.

PM MODI IN MANIPUR TOMORROW IN FIRST VISIT SINCE UNREST



Diary Times Desk: Prime Minister Narendra Modi will be in Manipur on Saturday for his first visit since ethnic violence broke out ir the state in May 2023, the state's chief secretary has confirmed.

The visit had been speculated for several days, but there had been no official announcement until now

Addressing reporters on Friday afternoon, Manipur Chief Secretary Puneet Kumar Goel said PM Modi would arrive in Churachandpur district from Aizawl in Mizoram around 12.30 pm, interact with people who were displaced by the clashes between the Meitei and Kuki communities, lay the foundation stone for projects worth Rs 7,300 crore which would be taken up across the state and address a gathering at the Peace Ground

The choice of Churachandpur is significant because the district was among the worst hit by the violence, which claimed at least 260 lives and left thousands displaced. PM Modi will also be the first Prime Minister - after Rajiv Gandhi in 1988 - to visit Churachandpur in nearly four, decades

FIRE CRACKERS IN DELHI-NCR

'CAN'T HAVE POLICY JUST FOR ELITE DELHI': CHIEF JUSTICE ON POLLUTION, CRACKERS



Diary Times Desk: A policy to curb pollution cannot exist only for Delhi, just because they are the "elite citizens of the country", the Supreme Court remarked on Friday.

"If the cities of NCR (National Capital Region) have the right to clean air, then why don't the people of other cities? Whatever policy is there, it should be at the pan-India level. We cannot make a policy only for Delhi just because they are the elite class of the country," Chief Justice of India BR Gavai said.

The top court made the remarks while hearing a plea against its April 3 order that banned the sale, storage, transportation and manufacture of fire crackers in Delhi-NCR region.

"I went to Amritsar last winter and the pollution there was worse than Delhi. If firecrackers are to be banned, then it should be in the whole country," the Chief Justice said.

During the hearing, senior advocate Aparajita Singh, the amicus curiae in the Delhi pollution case, said "the elite class takes care of itself". "Whenever there is pollution, they move out of Delhi," she said.

In April, a top court bench comprising
Justices Abhay S Oka and Ujjal Bhuyan
said a large section of the population
worked on streets and was the worst
affected by pollution. Not everybody can
afford an air purifier at their residence or
place of work to fight pollution, the bench
said.

"Several orders passed by this court during the last six months bring on the record the horrible situation with which prevailed in Delhi due to very high levels of air pollution..Right to health is an essential part of Article 21 of the constitution so is the Right to live in a pollution free atmosphere," it said.

ADANI GROUP'S COAL MINE CONTROVERSY SPARKS ALLEGATIONS OF RIGHTS VIOLATIONS IN MADHYA PRADESH



Diary Times Desk : Congress leader Jairam Ramesh has recently leveled severe allegations against the Adani Group, accusing them of beginning deforestation activities on government and forest land in Madhya Pradesh for a coal mining project. Ramesh claims these actions violate the Forest Rights Act, stirring controversy over legal clearances. The former Environment Minister pointed out that the project in the Dhirauli area allegedly commenced without Stage-II forest clearance, thereby disregarding the rights of local tribal communities. He underlined the lack of consultations with Gram Sabhas. which are mandated by the Panchayats (Extension To The While Madhya Scheduled Areas) Act. Pradesh's government dismissed these accusations, referring to complete compliance with required environmental approvals, tribal protests have intensified. They argue that the project wasn't approved by local governing bodies, raising concerns about the potential impact on livelihood and sacred lands, "In Dhirauli, Madhya Pradesh, Modani has begun cutting trees on government and forest land for its coal mine - without Stage-II forest clearance and in blatant violation of FRA, 2006 & PESA, 1996. Villagers, mostly Scheduled Tribe communities and even a Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Group (PVTG), are rightly protesting," he said.

DELHI RIOTS: SC DEFERS BAIL PLEAS OF UMAR KHALID, SHARJEEL IMAM, GULFISHA TO SEPEMBER 19

On September 6, the former JNU student, Sharjeel Imam, moved the SC, after the Delhi High Court rejected his bail plea on September 2.

Those who faced bail rejection include Khalid, Imam, Fatima, Mohd Saleem Khan, Shifa Ur Rehman, Athar Khan, Meeran Haider, Abdul Khalid Saifi and Shadab Ahmed.

Similarly, the former JNU student Umar Khalid on September 10, Wednesday, approached the Supreme Court challenging Delhi High Court's order rejecting him bail under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act case related to the alleged criminal conspiracy in the February 2020 riots in the national capital. According to the prosecution, Delhi Police had booked Imam under the stringent Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA). On January 28, 2020, he was arrested by the Delhi Police's Crime Branch from Bihar's Jehanabad in a sedition case for allegedly making inflammatory speeches in the Jamia Millia Islamia University and Aligarh Muslim University.

UP BUS CARRYING ANDHRA PILGRIMS 'ATTACKED' NEAR KATHMANDU AMID NEPAL UNREST: SEVERAL INJURED



Diary Times Desk: An Indian tourist bus from Uttar Pradesh, carrying pilgrims from Andhra Pradesh returning from the Pashupatinath Temple in Kathmandu was allegedly attacked by protesters amid the ongoing unrest in Nepal, leaving several passengers injured, the bus driver has claimed.

The alleged incident took place on September 9 near Sonauli on the India-Nepal border, when the agitators targeted the bus carrying 49 Indians.

According to the driver, the protestors looted the passengers and attacked them leaving over half a dozen passengers injured. They took advantage of the ongoing protests and unrest in the Himalayan state, prompting heightened security along the seven border districts of UP including Maharaiganj, Pilibhit, Shravasti, Balrampur, Bahraich, Siddharthnagar and Lakhimpur Kheri.

Stones were reportedly pelted, shattering windows and injuring passengers, including women and the aged, the driver claimed.

Diary Times Desk: Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) leader Tejashwi Prasad Yadav will embark on a five-day 'Bihar Adhikar Yatra' from Jehanabad district from September 16.

It will conclude in Vaishali district, stated to be the 'cradle of democracy', on September 20. RJD principal general secretary Ranvijay Sahu issued a letter to all district party presidents, former candidates of assembly and Lok Sabha elections and other functionaries on Friday, asking them to make the Yatra a grand success.

According to RJD sources, Tejashwi's 'Bihar Adhikar Yatra' will traverse through 10 districts, including Jehanabad, Nalanda, Patna, Begusarai, Khagaria, Supaul, Saharsa, Madhepura, Vaishali, and Samastipur.

AN ENGINEERING MARVEL: NEWLY BUILT BAIRABI-SAIRANG RAILWAY LINE SET TO BECOME MIZORAM'S GATEWAY TO **GROWTH**

Diary Times Desk: When a two-coach special train carrying railway officials arrived at the newly built platform near Sairang, 85-year-old Satwna stood motionless with his eyes fixed on the gleaming train that had just rolled in.

His wrinkled hands trembled in excitement as he touched the metallic surface of the vistadome coach. For the first time in his life, the octogenarian from nearby Darlawng village who spent his entire lifetime in the hills of Mizoram had a glimpse of a train.

"I had heard about trains, but never thought that I would be able to see one rolling on my land. My dream came true," he said in the local Lushai language softly. Satwna has never been to any place outside Mizoram. He hoped people of his area could now easily move out of the hill state for jobs, education and advanced healthcare.

With green hills sweeping into the misty air, buildings dotting the slopes and miles of bamboo and banana forests, Mizoram is considered one of the most beautiful yet remote states in India. But for the people of the hilly land, the dream of railway connectivity remained elusive for decades.

SOUTH ASIAN UNIVERSITY SACKS PROFESSOR WHO BACKED STUDENT PROTESTS



Diary Times Desk: The South Asian University (SAU) has terminated Associate Professor Snehashish Bhattacharya, two years after suspending him for allegedly backing student protests against stipend cuts. His removal, effective from June 16, 2023, was announced on Thursday, citing "incitement of students against the interest of the university.'

Bhattacharya, who joined SAU in 2011 and taught the university's first batch of Economics students, was among four faculty members suspended in 2023 for allegedly violating the code of conduct. While two colleagues were reinstated after submitting letters of regret, Bhattacharya who refused to apologise, has now been dismissed. A contractual faculty member had already exited when his tenure ended. The action traces back to 2022, when SAU slashed monthly stipends for master's students from Rs 5,000 to Rs 3,000, triggering protests. Students demanded a hike to Rs 7,000, and though the university partially rolled back the cut, the agitation intensified. Police were called to the Chanakyapuri campus in October that year to disperse demonstrators, a move Bhattacharya and 12 other faculty criticised in a letter, warning it would damage the university's "international character." In November, 15 faculty signed another statement calling the expulsion of protesting students "arbitrary actions" that could destabilise the institution.

INDIA IS ONE OF TOP RELATIONSHIPS US HAS IN WORLD TODAY: SECRETARY RUBIO



Diary Times Desk: Amid trade tensions between India and the United States over President Donald Trump's punitive tariffs, US Secretary of State Marco Rubio has hailed New Delhi as one of Washington's "top relationships" in the world today. He made the remarks during the Senate confirmation hearing for Sergio Gor, US ambassador-designate to Delhi. Introducing Sergio Gor at his confirmation hearing in the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, Rubio underscored India's increasingly important role in the Indo-Pacific region and global geopolitics.

"Sergio Gor is the nominee to India (as US Ambassador), which is one of the top relationships that the US has in the world today, in terms of the future of what the world's going to look like. I said it earlier when I held the position as a nominee... In the 21st century, the story is going to be written in the Indo-Pacific. It's so important that we have changed the name of the combatant command in the Indo-Pacific. India is at the core of that," Rubio stated.

AFTER DELHI, BOMBAY HIGH COURT RECEIVES BOMB THREAT EMAIL

Diary Times Desk: Minutes after the Delhi High Court, the Bombay High Court too received a bomb threat email on Friday, with the Bombay Bar Association requesting all the members and staff to vacate the court premises.

According to Mumbai Police sources, bomb detection squads are conducting searches inside the court. However, preliminary reports suggest it is a hoax threat.

Earlier in the day, the Delhi High Court received a bomb threat via email, forcing all benches to stop the hearings and evacuate the court premises. A bomb detection and disposal team was deployed immediately, and the area was cordoned off. After multiple searches, officials did not find anything suspicious, officials said.

The threat, sent by an email under the name 'Kanimozhi Thevidiya', mentioned that the Delhi High Court's judge chamber would be "detonated shortly". It also claimed to "recreate" the 1998 Coimbatore blasts in Patna later today and threatened an acid attack on Udhayanidhi Stalin's son, Inbanithi.

NO MORE SELFIES, REELS IN SUPREME COURT? PHOTOS, VIDEOS BANNED IN HIGH SECURITY AREA



Diary Times Desk: The Supreme Court has banned photography and videography inside its high security zone, warning that violators will face strict consequences.

The circular issued on Friday by the Court's Secretary General said the restriction applies to all lawyers, litigants, interns, law clerks, staff and visitors. The only exception will be official use. The Court made it clear that cameras, tripods, selfie-sticks and mobile phones cannot be used for making videos, reels or taking selfies inside the restricted area. Even the lawn area that falls within the high security zone has been brought under the ban.

Media personnel have been directed to conduct interviews and live broadcasts only from the designated lawn in the low security zone. Any violation by reporters will result in their entry into the high security zone being suspended for a month.

Advocates, interns or law clerks found flouting the rules will be reported to their Bar Association or State Bar Council for disciplinary action. Registry staff will also face serious consequences while other stakeholders will be referred to their respective heads of department, the circular said.

RS 15,000 FOR AUTO DRIVERS: ANDHRA CM CHANDRABABU ANNOUNCES AUTO MITRA SCHEME

Diary Times Desk: Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu on Wednesday announced a new scheme, Auto Mitra, aimed at providing financial assistance to auto drivers in the state.

Under this scheme, auto drivers will receive Rs 15,000 as financial assistance, which will be given as a gift for the Dussehra festival.

Speaking at the 'Super Six-Super Hit' meeting in Anantapur on Wednesday, CM Naidu said that the goal of his government is to make Andhra Pradesh a "Healthy, Wealthy, Happy" state. The Chief Minister clarified that the meeting was not driven by politics or voteseeking, as there are no elections currently underway. Instead, it was aimed at highlighting the alliance government's fulfillment of its promises as a responsible administration.

CM Naidu underscored that true welfare goes beyond addressing temporary needs; it involves bringing about lasting change in the lives of the poor and improving their living standards.

HEALTH ORGS TO HALT SERVICES AFTER BRUTAL ATTACK ON TRIHMS DRS

Diary Times Desk: The TRIHMS Faculty Association (TFA), the Indian Medical Association Arunachal Pradesh Branch (IMA-AP), the Arunachal Pradesh Doctors' Association (APDA), and the Trained Nurses' Association of India – Arunachal Pradesh Branch (TNAI-AP) have collectively decided to suspend all government and private hospital operations, starting at 8 am on 12 September for 48 hours, following an assault on two doctors on duty in the indoor ward of the Tomo Riba Institute of Health & Medical Sciences (TRIHMS) here on 11 September.

The organisations have announced the 48-hour shutdown of hospital services across the state in protest against the brutal attack on medical personnel, and to press their demand for immediate action to address the issue.

While all non-emergency medical services will be halted, emergency services will remain operational during the protest period.

"THAT'S A BIG DEAL. IT CAUSED RIFT WITH INDIA": TRUMP ON 50% INDIA

TARIFFSDiary Times Desk: US president Donald Trump Friday admitted that the 50% tariff on India for purchase of Russian oil soured the relations between the two countries. "Look, India was their (Russia's) biggest customer. I put a 50% tariff on India because they're buying oil from Russia. That's not an easy thing to do," Trump told Fox News in an interview. India has seen outrage and a spike in anti-US sentiment after Trump imposed tariffs of up to 50 per cent on some of its exports over purchases of oil from Russia, under Western sanctions for its invasion of Ukraine.

"That's a big deal. And it causes a rift with India," Trump told the "Fox & Friends" program.

US-India ties have been strained by Trump's trade war, with talks on lower tariff rates collapsing after India, the world's fifth-largest economy, resisted opening its vast agricultural and dairy sectors. Bilateral trade between the two countries is worth more than \$190 billion each year.

MAHINDRA CLARIFIES WARRANTY TERMS ON USING E20 FUEL ON OLDER CARS, SUVS

Along with this, the automaker has issued an advisory to customers and dealers that Mahindra engines are fully compliant with the existing petrol standards. The announcement serves as a relief for car owners following recent reports that highlighted concerns regarding the effects of E20 fuel on engine performance and warranty protection. Numerous consumers were unsure if using E20 would impact their vehicles' dependability or invalidate manufacturer warranties. Mahindra's clarification seeks to eliminate these uncertainties and instill confidence in its extensive customer base.

As per the company, all Mahindra vehicles are compatible with E20 fuel for safe operation; however, customers may observe slight differences in acceleration or fuel efficiency in models manufactured before April 1, 2025. Mahindra emphasized that these differences are influenced by driving habits and do not compromise vehicle safety.

"Mahindra engines are fully compliant with existing gasoline standards, and all our vehicles can be operated safely with E20 fuel. Vehicles produced post April 1, 2025, are specially calibrated for E20 fuel to ensure acceleration and fuel efficiency. Earlier produced vehicles, whilst being completely safe to drive, could see a minor variation in either acceleration or fuel efficiency depending on driving behaviour," the statement said.

A 22-year-old Utah man, called Tyler Robinson was arrested on Friday as a suspect in the assassination case. The three-day manhunt following the shoot had

The three-day manhunt following the shoot had been intense with the first clues only being a palm print, an impression of shoe soles and a rifle found in the woods. However, the chase ended only after "someone very close turned him in"

Within hours, the FBI and law enforcement detained two people, who were later released after it was determined that the two individuals were not involved in the crime. A reward of \$100,000 was announced after footage of him trying to escape the campus was put out.

On Thursday, the FBI and state officials pleaded with the public for help by releasing photographs and a video of the suspect, who they believed was responsible for the shooting. Authorities said the shooter appeared "to be of college age" and "blended in" with the college population, though authorities clarified on Friday that Robinson is not a student at Utah Valley and that he has been living with family.

Utah governor Spencer Cox in a press conference on Friday, revealed that a family member of Robinson's reached out to a friend who in turn contacted the authorities with information that Robinson had confessed or implied that committed the incident. "I want to thank the family members of Tyler Robinson who did the right thing," he said.

Cox informed that the family member remembered a dinner conversation before September 10 during which Robinson brought up Kirk's upcoming visit to Utah, criticising him saying, "Kirk was full of hate and spreading hate".

EX CHIEF JUSTICE SUSHILA KARKI TO TAKE OATH AS INTERIM NEPAL PM SOON



Diary Times Desk: Capping days of speculation, the Nepal president's office has announced that former chief justice Sushila Karki will be the interim prime minister of the country and will take oath at 9 pm.

The decision was arrived at following a consensus between Gen-Z protesters, President Ram Chandra Paudel and army chief Ashok Raj Sigdel.

Sources said Ms Karki, who will create history by becoming the first woman prime minister of Nepal, will have a small cabinet in the caretaker government, and the first meeting will be held on Friday night itself. The cabinet is likely to recommend the dissolution of the federal parliament as well as all seven provincial parliaments.

According to Clause 2 of Article 68 of the Constitution, an election to fill a vacancy in the office of the Vice President occurring due to his death, resignation or removal, or otherwise, should be held "as soon as possible". The person elected to fill the vacancy will be entitled to hold office "for the full term of five years from the date on which he enters upon his office".

MEET DIELLA, WORLD'S IST AI-MADE 'MINISTER' TASKED WITH CURBING ALBANIA CORRUPTION

Diary Times Desk: Albania has become the world's first country to appoint an 'Al minister' -- not a person to oversee the growth and ethical use of artificial intelligence in the country, but a virtual member of government, made of pixels and code. The Al minister is named Diella -- meaning 'sun' in Albanian -- and is tasked with tackling corruption, according to Albanian Prime Minister Edi Rama.

Presenting his new cabinet at a meeting of his Socialist Party following a big May election victory, Rama said Diella will oversee public tenders, promising its artificial intelligence would make his government "corruption-free".

"Diella is the first cabinet member who isn't physically present, but is virtually created by AI," Rama said, introducing her.

TRUMP TO PUSH G7 FOR TARIFFS ON INDIA, CHINA OVER RUSSIAN OIL PURCHASES Diary Times Desk: The United States will now pressure G7

Diary Times Desk: The United States will now pressure G7 member nations to impose higher tariffs on India and China, the two largest buyers of Russian oil, in an attempt to compel Moscow to engage in peace talks with Ukraine, The Financial Times reported.

Citing sources, the report added that in a video call on Friday (local time), finance ministers from the Group of Seven leading economies are set to discuss a US proposal for new measures as President Donald Trump intensifies efforts to broker a peace deal in Ukraine

This comes just days after Trump urged the European Union to impose a 100 per cent tariff on India and China for their continued purchase of crude oil from Russia, a move that he argues is fuelling President Vladimir Putin's war in Ukraine. However, a Reuters report citing EU officials said such a move was unlikely because the bloc treats sanctions and tariffs differently



US JOINS UN SECURITY COUNCIL CONDEMNATION OF ISRAELI STRIKES ON OATAR



Diary Times Desk: The United Nations Security Council has condemned Israel's strikes on a residential compound in the Qatari capital Doha, which targeted senior members of Hamas.

The statement - which did not

directly name Israel - was backed by all 15 Security Council members, including the US, which traditionally blocks actions against its close ally. "Council members underscored the importance of de-escalation and expressed their solidarity with Qatar," read the statement, drafted by the UK and France. Israel defended its decision to mount the attack

Qatar has played a key role in brokering diplomatic efforts to end the Israel-Gaza war, serving as a mediator of indirect negotiations between Hamas and Israel.

It has hosted the Hamas political bureau since 2012 and is a close US ally, hosting a large American airbase in the desert south-west of Doha.

The emergency meeting was requested by Qatar, Algeria, Pakistan and Somalia. Qatar's Prime Minister Mohammed bin Abdulrahman al-Thani travelled to New York to attend.

"CAN'T WEAR ROSE-TINTED GLASSES": RUSSIA SAYS UKRAINE PEACE TALKS ON PAUSE

Diary Times Desk: The Kremlin said Friday that peace talks between Russia and Ukraine were on "pause" as US President Donald Trump's efforts to end the three-and-a-half-year conflict falter.

Pushing for a deal to end the fighting, Trump has engaged in a flurry of diplomacy -- including hosting Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin in Alaska -- but Moscow has pressed on with its offensive and aerial barrages. "Our negotiators have the opportunity to communicate through channels. But for now, it is probably more accurate to talk about a pause," spokesman Dmitry Peskov told reporters, including AFP, in a briefing call.

"You can't wear rose-tinted glasses and expect that the negotiation process will yield immediate results," he added.

Putin has effectively ruled out a meeting with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky, who says a summit is vital to break the deadlock.

CCTV SHOWS MOTEL STAFF CHASE, BEHEAD INDIAN MAN IN FRONT OF WIFE, TEEN SON



Diary Times Desk: An Indian man from Karnataka was brutally beheaded by a Cuban immigrant at a motel in Dallas, Texas. Fifty-year-old Chandra Nagamallaiah, who managed the Downtown Suites motel on Samuell Boulevard, east of Downtown, was repeatedly assaulted with a machete by Yordanis Cobos-Martinez, 37, who has a violent criminal history and was recently released from custody.

In CCTV footage that has gone viral, the killer can be seen chasing Nagamallaiah with a machete in the motel corridor. Nagamallaiah's screams alerted his wife and 18-year-old son, who tried to intervene several times, but Cobos-Martinez pushed them away and continued the assault.

At one point, Nagamallaiah's son-- seen in a yellow shirt-- brings a baseball bat. But by that time, his father seems to have gone still.

Cobos-Martinez then takes out something from Nagamallaiah's pockets before again resuming the frenzied attack. Then, the victim's severed head rolls out. When Nagamallaiah's wife, wailing loudly, tries again to stop him, he is seen advancing menacingly towards her. At this point, Nagamallaiah's son drags his mother away from the grisly scene.

PRINCE HARRY MAKES SURPRISE VISIT TO UKRAINE



Diary Times Desk: Britain's Prince Harry has arrived in Ukraine for a surprise visit in support of wounded service members.

Harry's representatives confirmed they were in the capital, Kyiv, on Friday, though they declined to discuss the prince's schedule for security reasons.

This is the second time Harry has visited Ukraine since the start of Russia's full scale invasion.

"We cannot stop the war but what we can do is do everything we can to help the recovery process," Harry told the Guardian newspaper while on an overnight train to Kyiv.

Harry, a British Army veteran, is the founder of the Invictus Games, a Paralympic-style event designed to inspire military veterans around the world as they work to overcome battlefield injuries. Ukraine is bidding to host the games in 2029.

AT LEAST 107 KILLED IN CONGO AS WHALEBOAT SINKS IN RIVER



Diary Times Desk: At least 107 people have died after a whaleboat caught fire in the west of the Democratic Republic of Congo, according to an internal government report seen by Reuters on

The boat, a narrow, double-ended open vessel caught fire on the Congo river near Malange village in Lukolela territory on Thursday evening, leaving 146 people missing, the Ministry of Social Affairs said in the memo.

Rescue teams recovered 209 survivors, several with injuries, after the vessel burned and drifted downstream, the note said.

The fire also destroyed cargo on board and ignited 15 riverside homes.

Search operations continued on Friday with naval personnel and community volunteers combing the banks while authorities pledged medical care for the injured, assistance to be eaved families and the repatriation of survivors to their places of origin and destination.

NEPAL'S CIVIL SOCIETY CLAIMS 'CONSPIRACY' TO RESTORE MONARCHY 'UNDER MILITARY MEDIATION'

Diary Times Desk: A civil society alliance has alleged that a "conspiracy" is being staged "under military mediation" to restore monarchy in Nepal, even as political parleys for a transitional government continued following the fall of the K P Sharma Oli administration.

The Brihat Nagarik Andolan (BNA), representing people from diverse walks of life, in a statement on Thursday, voiced concern over the Nepal Army's growing role in national affairs after it took charge of nationwide security operations from Tuesday.

The group alleged that "over the bodies of the martyrs of the Gen-Z movement, a grave reactionary conspiracy is being staged — under military mediation to restore the monarchy and to abolish secularism, federalism and the proportional inclusive system", MyRepublica news portal reported.

Such attempts are "completely unacceptable", it said, adding that the anti-government movement was never intended to reverse republicanism and secularism or to expand what it described as the "unconstitutional activism of the military".



FROM POLITICAL OUTSIDER TO A PRESIDENT LIKE NO OTHER: BOLSONARO'S RISE AND FALL

Diary Times Desk: In September 2018, as Jair Bolsonaro campaigned in the south-eastern city of Juiz de Fora, a 40-year-old man pushed through the crowd and stabbed the presidential candidate in the stomach.

Images of Bolsonaro doubled over in pain, wearing a T-shirt in Brazil's football colours, were shared millions of times and broadcast endlessly on television.

The former army captain survived, and the shock and commotion caused by the attack boosted his outsider image and helped carry him to victory weeks later.

Seven years on, Brazil's Supreme Court has found him guilty of plotting a coup and sentenced him to more than 27 years in prison. On the face of it, Bolsonaro's career is over.

However, he remains one of the most consequential politicians of recent decades, and with allies already pushing for amnesty, his influence and even the prospect of a comeback still hangs over Brazil's future.

"THIS PLACE BELONGS TO US": ISRAEL PM VOWS "THERE'LL BE NO PALESTINIAN STATE"

Diary Times Desk: Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu vowed on Thursday that there would be no Palestinian state, speaking at a signing ceremony for a major settlement project in the occupied West Bank.

"We are going to fulfil our promise that there will be no Palestinian state, this place belongs to us," Netanyahu said at the event in Maale Adumim, an Israeli settlement just east of Jerusalem.

"We will safeguard our heritage, our land and our security... We are going to double the city's population." The event was streamed live by his office.

Israel has long had ambitions to build on the roughly 12 square kilometre (five square mile) tract of land known as E1, but the plan had been stalled for years in the face of international opposition.

Last month, Israel's far-right Finance Minister Bezalel Smotrich backed plans to build around 3,400 homes on the ultra-sensitive parcel of land.

His announcement drew condemnation, with UN chief Antonio Guterres saying the settlement would effectively cleave the West Bank in two and pose an "existential threat" to a contiguous Palestinian state.

SOUTH KOREAN WORKERS DETAINED IN US HEAD HOME AS SEOUL SEEKS SUPPORT FOR NEW VISA

Diary Times Desk: South Korean Foreign Minister Cho Hyun has urged the U.S. Congress to support a new visa for his country's businesses, as hundreds of mainly Korean workers arrested during a massive U.S. immigration raid last week were set to return home on Friday.

During his meetings with U.S. senators in Washington, Cho reiterated concerns among South Koreans over the detention of Korean professionals participating in investment projects in the United States, his ministry said in a statement.

A plane carrying more than 300 Korean workers who were detained during the raid at a Hyundai Motor and LG Energy Solution battery joint venture in the state of Georgia has left the United States, bound for South Korea.

The plane is expected to touch down in South Korea at around 2 p.m. (0500 GMT), according to LG Energy Solution, whose workers and subcontractors were among the detainees

After being held for a week by U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement, the South Korean workers have been released and flown from Atlanta.



INDIA VOTES IN FAVOUR OF FRANCE-SAUDI-BACKED "NEW YORK DECLARATION"

Diary Times Desk: The UN General Assembly on Friday approved a resolution backing the New York Declaration on the Peaceful Settlement of the Question of Palestine and the implementation of the two-State solution, with India among the 142 countries voting in support.

The resolution was backed by 142 countries, opposed by 10, while 12 abstained, according to the voting result displayed on the UN screen.

India's stance on the two-state solution for the Israeli-Palestinian conflict is a long-standing, consistent policy of supporting a negotiated settlement that establishes a sovereign, independent, and viable State of Palestine living peacefully alongside a secure State of Israel within recognised borders.

But when the U.S. killed Osama Bin Laden in Pakistan, the UN chief at the time celebrated that "justice has been done to such a mastermind of international terrorism." France called it a "victory for all democracies." We ask both: how is this different?"

He was then interrupted by Pakistani delegate, who said, "While we believe in constructive engagement with the civil society organisations and value their inputs, we urge you to ensure that no speaker violates the principles and purposes of the UN Charter and the territorial integrity of sovereign member states. We reject casting unfounded accusations and allegations."

MICROSOFT AND OPENAI REACH NON-BINDING DEAL TO ALLOW OPENALTO RESTRUCTURE

Microsoft and OpenAl said on Thursday they have signed a non-binding deal for new relationship terms that would allow OpenAI to proceed to restructure itself into a for-profit company, marking a new phase of the most high-profile partnerships to fund the ChatGPT frenzy.

Details on the new commercial arrangements were not disclosed, but the companies said they were working to finalize terms of a definitive agreement. This marks a step forward in OpenAl's prolonged talks with Microsoft as the former seeks to raise capital under a more common governance structure and eventually go public to fund artificial intelligence development.

Microsoft invested \$1 billion in OpenAI in 2019 and another \$10 billion at the beginning of 2023. Under their previous agreement, Microsoft had exclusive rights to sell OpenAl's software tools through its Azure cloud computing platform and had preferred access to the startup's technology.

A MAJOR SUBPRIME AUTO LENDER JUST WENT BELLY UP. IT WON'T BE LIKE SUBPRIME MORTGAGE LENDERS SPARKING THE GREAT **RECESSION**

Tricolor, a major subprime auto lender specializing in buyers without social security numbers or credit histories, is going out of business.

The company filed for bankruptcy on Wednesday. Most companies that file for bankruptcy intend to stay in business. But Tricolor does not – it plans to liquidate. Tricolor has not been available for comment.

Tricolor's failure is bad news for buyers who depend on such lenders, often undocumented immigrants - a particular focus of the Texas-based company. It's also not great for the major banks invested in Tricolor's debt backed by its loans.

But Tricolor's problems gren't likely to upend the broader financial services industry the way the subprime mortgage lenders did in 2008, nearly bringing about a new Depression. Those loans gave birth to what became known as "toxic assets," forcing the federal government to pour billions into each of the nation's major banks to stop a complete seizure and collapse of the US economy.

Subprime auto loans, even questionable ones like the low documentation loans Tricolor offered, are a very different animal than the subprime mortgage loans of the early years of this century.

"It's not something to worry about in terms of a market collapse," Pamela Foohey, a law professor at the University of Georgia and an expert in both auto finance and bankruptcies, told CNN Thursday. "I think it's troubling for people that they take out subprime loans and then potentially have their cars repossessed if they can't afford the payments."

"Subprime," whether it be for mortgages or car loans, refers to borrowers with weak credit scores. However, there are many important differences between subprime mortgage loans and subprime auto loans, Foohey

GRAPHIC VIDEOS OF KIRK AND ZARUTSKA DEATHS REIGNITE DEBATE OVER SOCIAL **MEDIA MODERATION**

Diary Times Desk: Within minutes of Charlie Kirk's horrific shooting on Wednesday in Utah, video capturing the moment a bullet hit his body was spreading rapidly online.

Surveillance cameras were rolling when Iryna Zarutska was brutally stabbed on a train in North Carolina on August 22, and the gruesome full video was later released publicly.

Whether users wanted to see them or not, videos of horrific moments have been flooding social media feeds over the past week. These videos have reignited calls for tech giants to exert more control over how content appears on their platforms as some companies have scaled back their moderation efforts.

Each platform has its own content rules, especially around particularly violent content. Most allow some violent content but place restrictions on especially gory and bloody videos and restrict such content from

By default, social media sites like X, TikTok and Facebook autoplay videos as users scroll, a tactic to immediately grab their attention, unless the platform has designated them as restricted. YouTube also autoplays non-restricted content when users hover over the video while scrolling.

But that can result in users being exposed to very sensitive and sometimes graphic content.

Even this morning, videos of Kirk's shooting were still being pushed to users' feeds. Graphic videos of the moment Kirk was shot were some of the top results when CNN searched for "Charlie Kirk" on Instagram. On TikTok's search page, with no prompting, the app suggested the search terms "raw video footage" and "actual incident footage," which immediately linked to graphic videos.

MANN REPEATED WHAT CHANNI DID, CM COULD HAVE JOINED PM MODI VIRTUALLY DURING PUNJAB FLOOD VISIT: BITTU

Bittu noted that while the CM had asked for Rs 1,858 crore during a presentation to the Centre, the remainder of the demand included departmental allocations, such as Rs 4 crore for the Forest Department.

HIMACHAL HC: FILE REPORT ON METHOD TO REDUCE PENDENCY OF VEHICLE CHALLAN CASES

Diary Times Desk: The High Court of Himachal Pradesh has directed the state government to file a status report on the formula for reducina the pendency of summary cases, motor especially vehicle challans in courts. A Division Bench comprising Chief Justice GS Sandhawalia and Justice Ranjan Sharma passed the order on a public interest litigation (PIL) highlighting the issue regarding a large number of challans that were clogging the system on both portals and courts and required redress.

It was mentioned in the PIL that there was a pendency of summary cases in the form of challans in criminal courts of the state to the extent of 50 per cent. The PIL highlighted the inability of the state to serve notices to offenders, due to which, there was difficulty in disposal by courts.

ABVP PROTESTS POOR INFRA AT DEHRI PG COLLEGE

Diary Times Desk: The local unit of the Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad (ABVP) on Thursday staged a protest demonstration at the Government Post Graduate (PG) College, Dehri, against poor infrastructure, lack of amenities and vacant posts in the institution. The half-hour dharna was led by unit president Bala Sharma on the college campus.

Addressing the activists, Sharma said the college, the largest higher educational institution in lower Kangra, catered to thousands of students from distant areas. However, she alleged that the condition of the institution had become deplorable due to inadequate facilities and government neglect.

The students complained of insanitary conditions in toilets, non-availability of potable drinking water and the absence of sanitary pad vending machines despite repeated assurances. The ABVP activists demanded urgent repair and maintenance of the college building, main gate and provision of hostel facilities for girl students.

'I AM DUKH MANTRI, NOT MUKH MANTRI': PUNJAB CM MANN BACK IN ACTION, VOWS RELIEF FOR FLOOD-HIT IN 40 DAYS

Diary Times Desk: A day after being discharged from hospital, Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann was back in action, holding meetings to assess the situation of flood relief and rebuilding the state.

"I am not the Mukh Mantri of Punjab... I am the Dukh Mantri. I am back to stand by the people of the state who are facing the worst-ever crisis caused by the floods. Dukh sanjha karan naal dukh adha reh janda hai," he said.

Mann said he would like to assure the flood-affected people that his government would be releasing full compensation within 40 days. "I have instructed all deputy commissioners to complete the special girdawri of crop loss, and submit reports of loss of human lives and livestock deaths and damage to houses, verify these at the earliest, so we can immediately start giving compensation," said the CM.

PUNJAB AAP MLA MANJINDER LALPURA GETS 4 YEARS IN JAIL IN 12-YEAR-OLD MOLESTATION CASE

Diary Times Desk: A court in Tarn Taran on Friday sentenced Khadoor Sahib AAP MLA Manjinder Lalpura, to four years in prison, two days after the legislator was convicted in a case of molestation and assault of a woman in 2013.

Six others, who were also convicted in the case on Wednesday, were also sentenced to four years.

The court of Additional Sessions Judge Prem Kumar awarded the quantum of punishment.

The case had been registered under relevant Sections, including 354 (assault or the use of criminal force against a woman with the intent to outrage her modesty), 323 (punishment for voluntarily causing hurt) and 506 (criminal intimidation) of the Indian Penal Code and the SC/ST Act.

Fines of different amounts have also been imposed on the sitting MLA.

Kirk Faced Personal Threats. Campus Turmoil In Recent Years

As Charlie Kirk mobilized young conservatives on college campuses, he faced numerous personal threats in recent years.

And his stops on campus tours were often met with impassioned protests that sometimes spiraled into chaos and violence, leading some schools to adopt strict security measures around

As authorities continue investigating Kirk's fatal shooting at his campus visit in Utah on Wednesday - the first on another nationwide tour of colleges - they have not yet said whether he faced any specific, recent threats before the

In 2023, UC Davis in California limited tickets to a Kirk event to 1,000, and attendees had to pass through metal detectors and were turned away if they brought backpacks.

That event was still beset by confrontations, with someone iumping on a police officer. protesters smashing glass panes in the doors of the venue and members of the Proud Boys - a far-right aroup clashing with demonstrators, according to local media reports. Months

In 2019, an activist who had been ruiting students for Turning Point USA chapter at UC rkeley reported he was attacked, according to campus

before at the same campus, a 100-person brawl had led to the cancelation of an event featuring another Turning Point USA speaker.

Some prior threats against Kirk or his group's events prompted police to respond.

Last October, police in Tempe, Arizona arrested a man who allegedly made online threats toward Charlie Kirk and Donald Trump Jr, who had traveled to the city for a political rally. Municipal court records show charges filed against the man were later dropped.

In 2022, authorities arrested a Texas man after he threatened a "day of retribution" for attendees of a Turning Point event in Florida, which he had a ticket to attend. He was sentenced to five years in prison last year.

Other apparent threats prompted hosts to back

In 2021, a church in Puyallup, Washington canceled a Kirk visit over what the congregation's senior pastor described in an online video as "threats of physical violence against our church leadership, our neighbors, their properties." That same year, Kirk posted on his organization's website that a venue in Eugene, Oregon had canceled an event following what he characterized as more violent threats

In a post on X on Thursday, Turning Point USA stated that Kirk had received "thousands" of threats throughout his life. "But he always prioritized reaching as many young Americans as possible over his own personal safety," the group

Other Turning Point USA members and supporters have also faced violence campuses



Chicago In Honor Of 20-Year-Old Katie Abraham

Katie Abraham and Chloe Polzin were hunting for a late-night snack with three other friends on a frigid night in Urbana, Illinois,

The end of winter break was nearing for the two university students, who had traveled to Urbana to visit other water polo players at the University of Illinois, Abraham's father told



The two girls were killed in a hit-and-run drunken-driving Department of Homeland Security said, by a man in the United States illegally who fled the scene of the crime. Abraham was pronounced dead at the hospital soon after the accident, police said. Polzin died the next day, according to her obituary.

enforcement action in Illinois, "Operation Midway Blitz," in her honor, drawing the 20vear-old's name into national politics as an example of a broken immigration system amid a larger crackdown in cities across the US.

Her father, Joe Abraham, told CNN the federal government failed "miserably" in protecting his daughter and that state politicians ignored her death, and by extension, "let it happen."

What we know about the wreck

Temperatures had dropped as low as 2 degrees the night Abraham died, and never broke above freezing that day.

Abraham and Polzin were childhood friends from their time at the Fast Side Water Polo Club in the Chicago suburbs.

The two girls, along with three other friends, were sitting at a red light just 1.5 miles north of the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign when a red Mitsubishi Outlander crashed into the back of their car, police said.

according to police. While two were released with minor injuries and another made a recovery, Abraham was declared dead at the hospital. Polzin was declared brain dead the next day, according to her obituary.

The Polzin family did not respond to CNN's attempts to speak with them for this story.

Police said the driver fled the scene on foot. Three days later, the US Marshals Service found him in Texas, riding a bus headed to Mexico.

The death of the voungest daughter Joe Abraham's youngest daughter

"Whether or not Russia's actions were deliberate. Russia violated NATO airspace. Therefore, we must, as NATO, make clear our resolve and our ability to defend our territory," he said. "And that is exactly what

Eastern Sentry is

designed to do."

NATO has launched an initiative to reinforce the defense of Europe's eastern flank after a Russian incursion into Polish drone airspace this week, Secretary General Mark Rutte announced on Friday.

The "Eastern Sentry" operation will commence in the coming days and will involve assets from Denmark, France, the United Kingdom, Germany, and others, Rutte said

"Eastern Sentry will add flexibility and strength to our posture and make clear that, as a defensive alliance, we are always ready to defend," he added.

that Russia's said "dangerous and unacceptable" drone incursion on Wednesday was "not an isolated incident."

"Russia's recklessness in the air. along our eastern flank, is increasing in frequency," Rutte

NATO's Supreme Allied Commander Europe, US General Alexus Grynkewich, said the operation, which will be "flexible and agile," will include enhanced capabilities, integrated air and ground-based defenses, and increased information-sharing among NATO partners.

Grynkewich noted that it will take some time for the entire operation to come together, but the first steps will begin "immediately."

Among the equipment dedicated to the operation are two F-16s and an anti-air warfare frigate from Denmark, three Rafales and France, Eurofighters from Germany, according to a press release from the alliance.

The initiative is modeled after the "Baltic Sentry" operation that NATO launched earlier this year in response to the sabotage of cables in the Baltic Grvnkewich said.

"Poland and citizens from across the Alliance should be assured by our rapid response earlier this and significant our announcement here today," he said. "NATO will continue to defend every inch of its territory."

The operation will cover the entire eastern flank of NATO states, "from the high north to the Sea and Mediterranean." Grynkewich said. "Across the eastern flank, we'll constantly adjust and change our posture in a manner that keeps the adversary off guard but also responds to specific threats as we see them emerging," he said.



Drone incursion 'wasn't' a mistal Polish Prime Minister Donald Tusk on Friday called the Russian drone incursion into his country an "attack" and said it wasn't a mistake, just hours after US President Donald Trump suggested the airspace violation could have been accidental.

"We would also wish that the drone attack on Poland was a mistake. But it wasn't, And we know it." Tusk said in a social media post.

Poland has information indicating that Russia launched as many as 21 drones at the country on Wednesday, but not all were found, the head of Poland's presidential International Policy Office, Marcin Przydacz, told local media. It's possible that some drones went back and forth crossing the airspace, Przydacz said in an interview with Radio ZET on Friday.Polish officials previously said that there were 19 intrusions of the country's airspace, and that a large proportion of the drones entered from Belarus.

ANDRÉ ONANA LEAVES MAN UNITED FOR TRABZONSPOR ON LOAN

Diary Times Desk: Manchester United goalkeeper André Onana has completed a season-long loan move to Trabzonspor, the Premier League club confirmed on Thursday.

Onana makes the move to the Turkish Super Lig after an inconsistent twoyear spell at Old Trafford and a poor start to this season that saw the Cameroon international usurped by Altay Bayindir as United's No. 1.

Sources told ESPN that there is no loan fee or an option to make the deal permanent, meaning Onana will return to Manchester next summer. The sources added that United will not have to pay any of Onana's wages while he is away on loan.

Onana made the decision to leave United following Senne Lammens' arrival at the club from Antwerp on deadline day after wanting to stay and fight for his place at the club earlier in the summer, sources told ESPN.

The 29-year-old joined United in a deal worth an initial £43.8 million (\$59.1m) from Inter Milan in 2023.

MAN CITY VS MAN UTD: GIANLUIGI DONNARUMMA, JAMES TRAFFORD, ALTAY BAYINDIR AND SENNE LAMMENS GIVE BOTH SIDES SHARED DILEMMA IN MANCHESTER DERBY

Diary Times Desk: In the red corner, Senne Lammens' £18.2m arrival from Royal Antwerp on Deadline Day sealed the immediate future of Andre Onana after a catalogue of high-profile mistakes, with a move to Trabzonspor now confirmed for the Cameroon international. Amorim has since confirmed Altay Bayindir will retain his role in the starting line-up for the derby, insisting it is time to show faith in the Turkey goalkeeper in the face of new competition from their newest recruit.

The United boss has been forced to publicly back Bayindir yet again, after already seeing his starting credentials questioned following errors against both Burnley and Arsenal.

The 1-0 defeat to Mikel Arteta's side arrived from a Riccardo Calafiori header after Bayindir failed to command his area, while victory was almost snatched away against Burnley when Bayindir spilled the ball back into his own penalty area for Jaidon Anthony to tap home.



BAYINDIR KEEPS MAN UTD SPOT AFTER LAMMENS' ARRIVAL

Diary Times Desk: Altay Bayindir will retain his place in goal for Manchester United in Sunday's derby against neighbours City - but head coach Ruben Amorim says new arrival Senne Lammens has potential to be first choice "for a number of years".

United signed Lammens, 23, for £18.1m from Belgium top-flight club Royal Antwerp on deadline day in preference to World Cup winner Emi Martinez, who was ready to leave Aston Villa.

With Andre Onana leaving for Turkish outfit Trabzonspor on loan, it has created uncertainty over the status Amorim's current number one.

Bayindir has started all three Premier League games so far this season – making mistakes that led to goals against Arsenal and Burnley – and will retain the job at Etihad Stadium. However, Amorim thinks Lammens offers plenty of promise.

"He has great potential to be our goalkeeper for a number of years," he said.

"Sometimes as a club, you try to see different options. We are in a moment where the goalkeeper needs to be really strong and have a lot of experience.

"But as well as looking at the present, we must have a focus on the future." Although Bayindir, 27, only made his Premier League debut in April, he has played 10 times for Turkey and has vastly more experience than Lammens, who had had just one season as a top-flight regular.

It makes the decision to let Bayindir continue relatively straightforward.

"It is a different league, different country, different ball," said Amorim. "Altay is going to continue."

Onana has more experience than anyone else, including winning a Serie A title with Inter Milan and playing in a Champions League final defeat by Manchester City in 2023.

LIVERPOOL'S ARNE SLOT URGES PATIENCE WITH 'BEST STRIKER' ALEXANDER ISAK AFTER RECORD MOVE

Diary Times Desk: Arne Slot on Friday described new sianina Alexander Isak as "maybe the best striker in the world" but warned he would be eased into action gradually after a disrupted pre-season. The Premier League champions signed the Sweden forward from Newcastle on transfer deadline day for a British-record fee of 125 million pounds (\$169 million), adding further firepower to their impressive squad. Isak's arrival after a protracted chase was part of an eye-catching splurge of more than 400 million pounds in the summer transfer window, though a deadline-day move to sign Crystal Palace and England defender Marc Guehi collapsed.
