"LIKE KINGS PRAYED BEFORE GOING TO WAR...": VIJAY'S ALL-OUT ATTACK ON DMK,

Tamilaga (TVK) chief Vijay on Saturday launched his most scathing attack yet, accusing both the BJP at the Centre and the DMK in Tamil Nadu of "cheating the people in different ways" and failing to deliver on their promises.

Beginning his maiden statewide tour from Tiruchirappalli, the actor-politician said just as kings once prayed at temples before going to war, he had come to meet the people before preparing for the "democratic battle of 2026". He reminded supporters that he had promised to visit them and declared that his was not just a single voice but "the

MANIPUR STATE

INDIA'S MODI VISITS MANIPUR STATE TWO YEARS AFTER ETHNIC CLASHES



Diary Times Desk: Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi has made his first visit to the troubled Manipur state where at least 260 people have been killed in ethnic clashes in two years.

Manipur in the northeast has been bitterly divided since May 2023, when violence broke out between the mainly Hindu Meitei majority and the largely Christian Kuki community.

The violence has also displaced tens of thousands of people who are still living in makeshift camps set up by the government.

"In order to bring life back on track in Manipur, the government of India is making all possible efforts," Modi told a gathering of thousands in Churachandpur, a Kuki-dominated town, on Saturday.

"I promise you today that I'm with you. The government of India is with the people of Manipur," Modi said, while also appealing "to all groups to take the path of peace for realising their dreams."

Speaking in the Meitei-majority city of Imphal, also Manipur's capital, Modi also announced that the government was supporting the construction of 7,000 new homes for the families displaced by the conflict

He urged both the communities to engage in dialogue. "We should strengthen the bridge of brotherhood between the hills and the valley," he said.

SUPREME COURT TO PRONOUNCE ORDER ON PLEAS TO STAY WAQF AMENDMENT ACT 2025 ON MONDAY

Diary Times Desk: The Supreme Court will pronounce its interim order on pleas to stay the provisions of the Waqf Amendment Act 2025 on Monday(September 15). A bench of Chief Justice of India BR Gavai and Justice AG Masih had reserved the order on May 22 after hearing the parties over three days. The petitions are filed challenging the constitutionality of the sweeping changes made to the Waqf law by the amendments passed by the Parliament in 2025.

In April, after a bench led by former CJI Sanjiv Khanna expressed some prima facie reservations about some of the provisions, the Union undertook that non-Muslims would not be appointed to the State Waqf Boards and the Central Waqf Councils during the pendency of the matter. The Centre also agreed that no Waqf, including a Waqf by user, whether declared by way of notification or by way of registration, shall be de-notified, nor will their character or status be changed.

AS PRIYANKA GANDHI VISITS WAYANAD, 2 SUICIDES PUT CONGRESS ON DEFENSIVE



Diary Times Desk: The alleged suicides of two party workers -one last year and another a day ago-in this hill district have put the opposition Congress in Kerala on the back foot. This is particularly damaging at a time when its MP, Priyanka

Gandhi, is present in her constituency.

A day after a local party worker died allegedly by suicide in Mullankolly in Wayanad, the daughter-in-law of a former District Congress Committee (DCC) treasurer, NM Vijayan, allegedly attempted to take her own life by injuring her wrist.

Padmaja was admitted to the hospital,

and her condition is now stable, police said. She made the attempt hours after telling

She made the attempt hours after telling the media that financial assistance promised by the party following Vijayan's death last year- a tragedy which also claimed the life of his son, Jijesh -had still not been delivered.

Vijayan, 78, and his son, 38, allegedly consumed poison after running into debt. The family claimed he had borrowed heavily for party activities and ended his life when he failed to repay.

Following the incident, Congress had assured to take responsibility for the liabilities.

However, Padmaja told reporters on Saturday that the family still has debts of over Rs two crore, of which less than Rs 20 lakh has been settled.

"My father-in-law took loans for party needs, not for personal purposes. The party promised to clear all liabilities, but has gone back on its word. My husband is in the hospital due to the stress. I can't hold on for long," she said, adding that the family plans to stage a protest before the DCC office and petition the Chief Minister.

'HISTORIC DAY FOR MIZORAM AS STATE ENTERS COUNTRY'S RAILWAY MAP': CHIEF MINISTER LALDUHOMA



Diary Times Desk: Chief Minister Lalduhoma on Saturday said it was a historic day as the state entered the country's railway map, which will have a far-reaching impact as it bridges the dreams and reality between the state and Bharat. He was addressing a gathering as Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated Mizoram's first railway line and flagged off the state's maiden Rajdhani Express, connecting Aizawl with Delhi.

"Today is a historic day for our state. It marks a new chapter in our journey towards progress...The railway projects are not just infrastructure; they are investments in our children's future, in the dignity of our citizens and in the economic resilience of our state. 'NONE OF THEIR OWN WERE LOST': PAHALGAM VICTIM WIDOW, SHIV SENA (UBT), AAP SLAM BCCI, MODI GOVT OVER INDIA-PAK MATCH



Diary Times Desk: A day before the high-profile India-Pakistan Asia Cup clash in Dubai, Opposition parties lashed out at the Prime Minister Modi-led NDA government at the Centre, calling the cricket match a betrayal of the victims of the Pahalgam terror attack and the soldiers martyred at the borders. Shiv Sena (UBT) chief Uddhav Thackeray went a step further, announcing 'Sindoor' protests across Maharashtra.

Addressing reporters in Mumbai, Thackeray said that India should boycott the contest. "Till the time terror does not stop, we shouldn't maintain any relations with Pakistan," he said, adding that the game was "an insult to national sentiments."

"This cricket match is an insult to national sentiments. Should we be playing cricket with Pakistan while our soldiers sacrifice their lives on the borders?" he asked.

His son Aaditya Thackeray tore into the BCCI, questioning its independence from the government. "Is the BCCI so strong that it can defy PM and defence minister? Does the @BCCI not have any shame? Any feelings for those who were killed in that massacre? Or for our Armed Forces?" he posted on X.At a separate event, AAP's Saurabh Bharadwaj and party workers burnt an effigy symbolising Pakistani players. "This is a gross humiliation of our women who lost their husbands in the Pahalgam attack, but still our central leadership is going ahead with the India-Pakistan cricket match," he said. Later in a post, he wrote: "Pakistan's cricket players mock our widows in such a dirty, disgusting way, and we will play cricket with them. Shame on the BJP government."

"VICE-CHANCELLOR ACCUSED OF SEXUAL HARASSMENT MAY BE FORGIVEN BUT...": TOP



Diary Times Desk: The Supreme Court on Friday dismissed a sexual harassment case against West Bengal National University of Juridical Sciences Vice-Chancellor (V-C) Nirmal Kanti Chakrabarti but directed that the judgment, which carries details of his alleged misconduct, be recorded in his resume.

A bench of Justices Pankaj Mithal and Prasanna B Varal dismissed a petition filed by a faculty member against Mr Chakrabarti but said such actions "may be forgiven but allowed to haunt the wrongdoer forever". "In this view of the matter, we direct that the incidents of alleged sexual harassment on part of respondent no! may be forgiven but

allowed to haunt the wrongdoer forever. Thus, it is directed that this judgment shall be made part of the resume of respondent no.1, compliance of which shall be strictly ensured by him personally," the bench said. The court junked the petition after noting that the survivor had lodged a formal complaint on December 26, 2023, months after the purported sexual harassment last took place in April that year. The survivor registered a complaint with the Local Complaint Committee (LCC).

CLOUDBURST IN HIMACHAL'S BILASPUR; SEVERAL VEHICLES BURIED IN DEBRIS, FARMS DAMAGED

Diary Times Desk: Several vehicles were buried under debris and agricultural lands were damaged after a cloudburst struck Himachal Pradesh's Bilaspur district in the early hours of Saturday. Fortunately, no casualties have been

reported, officials confirmed.
The cloudburst occurred in Gutrahan village in the Namhol area of the Naina

Devi assembly constituency. "Gushing waters along with debris swept away agricultural lands," said Kashmir Singh, a local villager.

Jagdish Patani cited her daughter's "freedom of speech" after a gangster warned the family against insulting Hindu deities.

"I don't think anyone has made any indecent remark. If Acharya ji made a statement on women, then my daughter also made one. Everyone has freedom of speech. But I don't think anyone would make such a big fuss over it," said Jagdish Patani.

The controversy involving Khusboo Patani emerged late July after she accused popular katha vachak Aniruddh Acharya of making a "misogynist" remark in an Instagram story.

BREAKTHROUGH IN MURDER CASE IN WHICH THIEVES TOOK SHOWER BEFORE FLEEING

Diary Times Desk: In a big breakthrough, Hyderabad police have arrested the two men suspected of killing a 50-year-old woman at her Cyberabad home and looting gold worth lakhs. They were traced to Jharkhand. A special team has taken them into custody and is bringing them back for further investigation, said officials.

The chilling murder occurred three days ago, in which the victim was first hit with a pressure cooker and her throat slit with a knife and scissors. The suspects then looted from her home and bathed in her washroom before fleeing.

The Murder

Renu Agarwal, 50, was found dead by her husband at their 13th-floor flat in a gated apartment in the IT hub Cyberabad. Mr Agarwal and their son were at work when the crime occurred. They returned home early after their calls to her went unanswered in the evening.

STAR HEALTH BECOMES 4TH INSURER TO FACE HOSPITAL PUSHBACK OVER CASHLESS SERVICES

Diary Times Desk: Star Health and Allied Insurance may soon face suspension of its cashless service arrangements after the Association of Healthcare Providers, India (AHPI) accused the insurer of engaging in unfair practices.

AHPI, which represents more than 15,000 hospitals, has given the insurer until 22 September to address the grievances, failing which hospitals could stop offering cashless facilities to Star Health policyholders. Hospitals under the ambit of APHI now allege that Star Health has continued to enforce outdated tariff rates despite rising costs and, in some cases, has pressured providers to accept even lower rates.

Other complaints include arbitrary denials of cashless approvals, unjustified deductions, rejection of claims even after approvals, and anti-competitive collective bargaining tactics that limit fair negotiations on tariffs.

Star Health responded to the allegations, and said, "It is unfortunate that AHPI has chosen to issue threats of suspending cashless services in a manner that is arbitrary, lacking clarity or actionable details. AHPI's abrupt press statement has only prejudiced the interests of policyholders across the country and created unnecessary confusion. We want to reassure our customers that their access to healthcare through Star Health will not be impacted. Tariff negotiations and billing practices are a regular activity between insurers and hospitals. However, AHPI's approach of targeting individual insurers disrupts patient care instead of enabling constructive solutions."

TRUMP THREATENS 50-100% TARIFFS ON CHINA, DEMANDS NATO STOP BUYING RUSSIA OIL



Diary Times Desk: US President Donald Trump on Saturday said that the Russia-Ukraine war would end if NATO countries stopped buying Russian oil. He also threatened to impose 50-100 per cent tariffs on China for its purchase of petroleum from Russia.

Taking to Truth Social, Trump wrote that the purchase of Russian oil by members of NATO is "shocking". Addressing NATO, he said, "It greatly weakens your negotiating position, and bargaining power, over Russia". He also accused NATO and said that their commitment to win the war "has been far less than 100%".

China is the largest buyer of Russian energy, followed by India. In the third place stands Turkey who is a NATO member. Hungary and Slovakia are other members of the 32-state alliance that also purchase oil from Russia.

This comes amid the backdrop of an escalation as drones entered NATO ally Poland's airspace after being launched from Russia. Poland shot down the drones. The Congress has also been pushing Trump for a bill to strengthen sanctions. Trump said that a NATO ban on Russian oil plus tariffs on China would "also be of great help in ENDING this deadly, but RIDICULOUS, WAR."

He noted that China has "strong control, and even grip, over Russia" and said that the tariffs he is imposing "will break that grip".

Blaming the onus of the war on Former US President Joe Biden and Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy, he said, "This is not TRUMP'S WAR (it would never have started if I was President!), it is Biden's and Zelenskyy's WAR." He did not name Russian President Vladimir Putin in the list.

Urging NATO to do "as I say", he wrote, "the WAR will end quickly, and all of those lives will be saved! If not, you are just wasting my time, and the time, energy, and money of the United States."

CHARLIE KIRK WIFE'S DEVASTATING FINAL MOMENTS WITH HER HUSBAND'S BODY





Diary Times Desk: A wife weeping with head bent over husband's open casket - the soul-wrenching picture was shared by Charlie Kirk's wife, Erika, on social media on Friday. In an obituary for her husband, Erika shared a series of pictures and videos from the final goodbye, in which she can be seen crying and rubbing, kissing and holding Charlie's hand for the one last time.

Charlie Kirk, a right-wing activist and US President Donald Trump aide, was assassinated during an event at Utah Valley University on Wednesday. Tyler Robinson, 22, has been arrested as a suspect in the murder of Mr Kirk.

Calling the world "evil", Erika showed trust in god and wrote, "The world is evil. But our Savior. Our Lord. Our God. He...He is so good. I will never have the words. Ever "

NEPAL'S MAJOR PARTIES SAY DISSOLVED PARLIAMENT MUST BE REINSTATED

Diary Times Desk: Nepal's major political parties have demanded the country's president reinstates the parliament he dissolved following deadly anticorruption protests. In a statement, eight parties – including the Nepali Congress, CPN-UML and Maoist Centre – said President Ram Chandra Poudel acted unconstitutionally. Poudel dissolved the House of Representatives on Friday upon the recommendation of newly appointed interim Prime Minister Sushila Karki – it was also a key demand from the protest movement.

More than 50 people were killed in clashes with riot police during this week's mass protests sparked by a ban on social media platforms. Karki was appointed after a deal was reached with protest leaders.

Saturday's statement demanding the reinstatement of the parliament was signed by the chief whips of the eight political parties.

NEW NATO MISSION TO BOLSTER EASTERN FLANK

AFTER RUSSIA DRONE

INCURSION

Diary Times Desk: More Nato countries will move troops and fighter jets eastwards after more than a dozen drones entered Polish airspace on Wednesday.

Denmark, France and Germany have joined a new mission to bolster the military alliance's eastern flank. Other Nato allies are expected to take part later.

Tensions have been high across Europe since Poland accused Russia of an unprecedented incursion. Some of the 19 drones that entered Polish territory were shot down, while others crashed into fields and even a house in eastern Poland.

Warsaw said the incursion was deliberate, but Moscow downplayed the incident, saying it had "no plans to target" facilities in Poland.

Drones and missiles have occasionally veered into countries bordering Ukraine, including Poland, during Russia's full-scale invasion – but this was the most serious incident of its kind since the war began in February 2022.

Polish Prime Minister Donald Tusk said it was "the closest we have been to open conflict since World War Two".

Denmark will contribute two F-16 fighter jets to support Poland's air defence, as well as a warship, its defence ministry said.

EXPLOSION AT MADRID CAFE INJURES 21, THREE SERIOUSLY

Diary Times Desk: An explosion at a cafe in Madrid's Vallecas district on Saturday injured 21 people, with three sustaining serious injuries, according to Spanish emergency services. The blast, which occurred around 3 p.m. local time, has prompted a large-scale emergency response and an ongoing investigation.

The powerful explosion ripped through the cafe, located in the south-central district of the Spanish capital, causing significant damage to the establishment and surrounding buildings. Police and fire services quickly cordoned off the area to secure the site and attend to the injured.

While the exact cause of the blast remains unknown, a police source cited in some local reports has indicated that a gas leak is being considered as a possible cause. However, a formal determination has not yet been made.

PAKISTANI RAIDS NEAR AFGHAN BORDER KILL AT LEAST 19 SOLDIERS, 35 FIGHTERS

Diary Times Desk: Pakistani security forces have raided three hideouts of the Pakistan Taliban armed group near the Afghan border in recent days, triggering fierce clashes that killed at least 19 soldiers and 45 fighters, says the military.

The military on Saturday said 22 fighters were killed in Bajaur, a district in northwestern Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province. Thirteen more were killed in a separate operation in South Waziristan district, it added.

The statement said 12 soldiers, "having fought gallantly, paid the ultimate sacrifice and embraced martyrdom" in South Waziristan, their deaths underscoring the struggles Pakistan faces as it tries to rein in resurgent armed groups.

In another clash in the Lower Dir area, seven soldiers and 10 rebel fighters were killed in a shootout after troops discovered a militant hideout, the army said in a separate statement.

CHARLIE KIRK'S SUSPECTED KILLER BROUGHT INTO CUSTODY AFTER CONFESSING TO FATHER

Diary Times Desk: A 22-year-old from Utah has been arrested over the killing of right-wing activist Charlie Kirk, who was shot dead while on stage at a university event earlier this week.

Tyler Robinson was taken into custody late on Thursday, after a 33-hour manhunt that ended after his father helped persuade him to surrender to police.

His arrest was first announced by US President Donald Trump, who called for the suspect to face the death penalty.

The killing of Kirk, who was shot while debating with students on Wednesday, has shocked Americans and laid bare the country's sharp partisan divisions.

Investigators said at a news conference on Friday that the suspect had confessed to his father and said he would rather take his own life than surrender. The father then called a youth pastor who is a family friend.

Both men tried to calm the suspect down, police said. The pastor, who also serves as a court security officer, later called the US Marshals, who detained the suspect at around 22:00 local time on Thursday.



UN GENERAL ASSEMBLY VOTES TO BACK TWO-STATE SOLUTION FOR ISRAEL AND PALESTINE



Diary Times Desk: The United Nations General Assembly overwhemingly backed a nonbinding solution on Friday supporting a two-state solution for Israel and Palestine, hours after Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu rejected the idea of a Palestinian state.

Out of the 193-member world body, 142 countries voted in favour on the New York Declaration, 10 against and 12 abstained.

The resolution, presented by France and Saudi Arabia, envisions the Palestinian Authority (PA) governing and in control of all Palestinian territory, with a transitional administrative committee immediately established after a ceasefire in Gaza. "Hamas must end its rule in Gaza and hand over its weapons to the Palestinian Authority," the declaration says, adding that it must also free all hostages.

AUTHORITIES ASKED FOR HELP IN THE MANHUNT FOR CHARLIE KIRK'S KILLER. A FATHER'S INTUITION LED TO AN ARREST

Diary Times Desk: Like thousands of Americans captivated by the manhunt for the shooter who killed conservative political activist Charlie Kirk, a Utah father had seen the photos and video footage of the suspect released by authorities.

The man in the images, dressed in a black T-shirt plastered with an eagle and American flag, could be seen jumping off the roof of a Utah university building after the shooting and running into a wooded area. His face was partially concealed by a dark pair of sunglasses and a baseball cap. But the father recognized the man.

"Tyler, is this you? This looks like you," he asked his son, according to a law enforcement official briefed on the investigation.

His son, 22-year-old Tyler Robinson, confessed to his father that he had shot Kirk, the official told CNN. "I would rather kill myself than turn myself in," Robinson responded when his father urged him to turn himself in to authorities, the source said.

The father persuaded Robinson to confide in a youth pastor who works with the Washington County Sheriff's Office and the US Marshal's Service, the law enforcement source said.

WHO IS TYLER ROBINSON, ALLEGED KILLER OF CHARLIE KIRK?

Diary Times Desk: How did Tyler Robinson -- a straight-A student raised Mormon by Republican parents -- become the alleged assassin of right-wing mega-influencer Charlie Kirk?

It's a question that has gripped Washington, the small town in Utah where the suspect grew up.

The 22-year-old arrested late Thursday after a 33-hour manhunt reportedly confessed to killing Kirk, whose popularity among young conservatives helped Donald Trump win the presidential election last November.

Robinson grew up the eldest of three boys in a mid-sized house on a winding street with manicured lawns, in a neighborhood that backs up to a church.

He was "quiet, respectful, kind of stayed to himself. But he was really, really smart," 66-year-old Kris Schwiermann, the retired head custodian at the local primary school, told AFP.

Jaida Funk, a 22-year-old who attended elementary and middle school with Robinson, gave a similar assessment.

GULF STATES UNITE TO RESPOND TO ISRAEL'S ATTACK ON QATAR, BUT FIND FEW OPTIONS

Diary Times Desk: For decades, wealthy Gulf Arab states cast themselves as oases of stability in a region mired in conflict, building gleaming capitals with fast-growing economies powered by by millions of foreign workers drawn to economic opportunity and a tax-free lifestyle.

But this year, their sense of safety was shattered when two regional powers conducted a direct strike on a Gulf country for the first time. First, Iran targeted an American airbase in Qatar in June after the US struck its nuclear facilities. Then came Israel's attack this week, targeting Hamas' political leadership in Doha.

Gulf Arab states are rattled as a Gaza war that began thousands of miles from their borders nearly two years ago inches closer to home.

With few viable military options to retaliate, Qatar has vowed a "collective" regional response to Israel's strikes. That response is currently "under consultation and discussion" with other partners, Qatari Prime Minister Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman Al Thani told CNN's Becky Anderson on Wednesday. A decision is expected at an Arab and Islamic summit in Doha this weekend.

MAGNITUDE 7.4 EARTHQUAKE STRIKES RUSSIA'S KAMCHATKA, TSUNAMI WARNING LIFTED

Diary Times Desk: A 7.4-magnitude earthquake struck off the coast of Kamchatka in Russia's Far East on Saturday, the United States Geological Survey (USGS) said.


There was no risk that the quake had triggered a tsunami, according to the Pacific Tsunami Warning Centre (PTWC).

The USGS said the quake hit 111 kilometres (69 miles) east of the Russian city of Petropavlovsk-Kamchatsky, the administrative centre of the Kamchatka region, at a depth of 39.5 kilometres.

The survey earlier gave a magnitude of 7.5 before downgrading it.

The PTWC initially warned that "hazardous" waves of up to one metre (3.3 feet) were possible along some nearby Russian coasts.

The centre later said "the tsunami threat... has now passed". In July, one of the strongest earthquakes ever recorded struck off the Kamchatka peninsula, triggering tsunamis up to four metres high across the Pacific and sparking evacuations from Hawaii to Japan.

"GO BACK TO YOUR COUNTRY": SIKH WOMAN RAPED, FACED RACIST ABUSE IN UK

Diary Times Desk: A Sikh woman in her twenties was raped by two men and was subjected to racist remarks in the UK's Oldbury town. The attackers further told the woman to "go back to your own country", in a racial attack mirroring a similar incident on Indian-origin expatriates.

The incident occurred near Tame Road in Oldbury around 8:30 am last Tuesday.

The police are treating it as a 'racially aggravated' attack and have urged for help to trace the attackers.

The woman has informed them that the attackers made racist comments, the police said, adding that CCTV and forensic inquiries are underway.

Birminghamlive identified the suspects as "white men", one with a shaven head and wearing a dark-coloured sweatshirt, while the other suspect was reportedly wearing a grey top.



'SILENCING ARTISTES DOESN'T PROMOTE PEACE': PARAMOUNT SLAMS PLEDGE BY ENTERTAINERS TO BOYCOTT ISRAELI FILM INSTITUTIONS

Defence Minister Israel Katz also confirmed the receipt of such messages yesterday, writing in response in his account on X: "Let them continue to call and threaten, and I will continue to order the extermination of their members, the leaders of terrorism." (ANI/TPS)

Katz addressed the cyberattack on X, writing: "Organized Islamist-jihadist gangs from various countries are calling my unclassified civilian phone with insults and threats. Let them keep calling and threatening—I will continue to order the elimination of their terrorist leaders."

Israeli security officials have acknowledged a drastic escalation in attempted cyberattacks following Israel's large-scale attack on Iran in June, i24 reported, caveating that "no attempts have been successful and no information has been leaked." Despite such assurances, the incident provoked a firestorm of blowback on Israeli social media, with many users questioning the adherence to security protocol of Katz in responding to the call and more pertinently the leaking of ministers' private contact details

SWATCH TROLLS TRUMP'S 39% TARIFFS, SELLING A WATCH THAT FLIPS THE PLACEMENT OF 3 AND 9

Swatch, the Swiss watchmaker, is trolling the 39% tariffs that the United States placed on its home country by selling a watch that flips the location of the 3 and 9 numerals.

The tongue-in-cheek new watch — dubbed "WHAT IF ... TARIFFS?" — is inspired by the "current events unfolding in today's world," according to the description on its website. Swatch jokes that the new watch is "hopefully just a limited edition."

"The inversion of Arabic numerals 3 and 9 on the dial subtly references the number 39," the page says. "Paired with the percentage symbol found on the battery cover, this inversion hints at the US tariffs imposed on Switzerland and the deeper narrative woven into the watch's design."

The watch is available only in Switzerland and therefore won't be subject to the 39% tariffs — among the highest imposed on a European country by President Donald Trump.

CHARLIE KIRK'S SOCIAL MEDIA ACCOUNTS HAVE GAINED MILLIONS OF FOLLOWERS SINCE HIS MURDER

Charlie Kirk's widow and many of his fans have predicted that Wednesday's assassination will make his voice even more powerful posthumously.

Social media statistics indicate that they're right.

Kirk's accounts across the internet have gained millions of followers in the three days since his death, according to data compiled by CNN.

Videos of Kirk's political arguments, promoting President Trump and conservative priorities, have also seen a surge in viewership, with many clips being traded back and forth by fans.

As Kirk's widow Erika said Friday evening, "My husband's voice will remain, and it will ring out louder and more clearly than ever, and his wisdom will endure." So will his organization Turning Point USA's overall digital presence, as the uptick in follower interest signals.

Kirk's main Instagram account has added 3.5 million followers since the assassination; his podcast's TikTok account has gained more than 1.5 million followers; and his main Facebook page has added more than 2.3 million followers.

CRACKER BARREL ISN'T DOOMED JUST YET

Diary Times Desk: It's been a nightmare few weeks for Cracker Barrel, taking a drubbing from random social media accounts all the way up to the White House over a fairly typical logo rebrand. But despite the fallout, the old-timey chain still has a chance to make a comeback.

Cracker Barrel was in the early stages of a major turnaround plan before its new logo and restaurant remodels ran into a right-wing revolt. The changes were bashed on social media, including by President Donald Trump.

The company stopped the updates in their tracks, reverting to its "Old Timer" logo and canceling plans to remodel restaurants with simpler layouts and less cluttered antiques, ornaments and knickknacks. It said it had only completed four remodels out of its 660 total locations.

"Your old country store is here to stay," Cracker Barrel said Monday after announcing the remodel suspension. "We hope that today's step reinforces that we hear you."

The logo and remodel plan were two parts of a much bigger overhaul that includes menu changes, improvements to technology and basic restaurant upkeep. Cracker Barrel was looking to draw new customers, especially younger ones, after years of sagging sales. The chain was trying to avoid tumbling into bankruptcy like Red Lobster, Hooters, TGI Fridays or other family dining chains.

Cracker Barrel should make changes that strike a middle ground between appearing stale to younger customers and unrecognizable to their parents or grandparents who've eaten at the chain for decades, said Chekitan Dev, a professor of hospitality management at Cornell University.

CLEAN PUNJAB POST FLOODS MISSION: RS 100 CRORE FOR 2,300 VILLAGES; RS 1 LAKH INITIAL AID

Diary Times Desk: Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Saturday announced a Rs 100 crore cleanliness drive across 2,300 villages affected by recent floods in the state.

Speaking to the media, Mann said that each village would initially receive Rs 1 lakh as a token amount, with additional funds to be provided based on requirements. The government would also supply essential equipment, including a JCB (earth-moving machine), a tractor-trolley, and labour to help remove debris such as sand and fallen trees.

The cleanliness operation is scheduled to be completed by September 25.

To address health concerns in the flood-affected areas, medical camps will be established, and 550 ambulances will be deployed. Medical staff will be stationed at panchayat bhawans, dharamshalas, anganwadi centres, and schools to ensure access to healthcare services.

IMPACT ON HEALTH FLOODS & AFTERMATH

Diary Times Desk: The devastation caused by the recent floods in North India has resulted in loss of human and animal lives, property and destruction of crops. Many people, evacuated from their homes, are staying in camps and temporary shelters. The impact of these floods, especially on human health, would be felt for some time. After floodwaters recede, besides the destruction and damage, we should prepared for the possibility of many diseases in its aftermath. Floodwater is a mixture of water with sewage, waste, chemicals, and can contain harmful microorganisms. In addition, there is also lack of access to clean water, food, shelter and healthcare, leaving the affected population vulnerable to various infections.

There are several health effects related to floods—some of them can develop immediately, and others over long term. Immediate risks include drowning, hypothermia, electrocution.

HIMACHAL ROADS HEAVILY DAMAGED BUT STILL 1.57 CR APPLE BOXES SOLD

Diary Times Desk: Over 1.57 crore apple boxes have been marketed within and outside the state until now. The number of marketed boxes would have been higher if excessive rain had not blocked or washed away link roads in various parts of the apple belt. Though roads are blocked, around 45 lakh more apple boxes have been marketed compared to the corresponding period last year. Until September 11 last year, 1.13 crore boxes had reached the market.

The significant difference in the marketed box in comparison to last year could be attributed to high production in the lower apple belts of the state. Until August 20 this year, over 88 lakh boxes had been marketed. In the corresponding period last year, only around 32.6 lakh boxes had been marketed. It shows the production in the lower belts had been nearly three times this year as compared to last year. Harvesting in the lower belts normally comes to an end by August 15.



FLOODS RAVAGE 725 HECTARES OF CROPS IN UNA, FARMERS SUFFER RS 2.44-CR LOSS

Diary Times Desk: Heavy rains and floods during the current monsoon season have wreaked havoc on agriculture in Una district, destroying standing crops on 725 hectares and causing an estimated loss of Rs 2.44 crore to farmers. Deputy Director of Agriculture, Kulbhushan Dhiman, said maize — sown across 30,850 hectares this year — suffered the heaviest damage. Nearly 668 hectares were washed away, resulting in losses of Rs 1.88 crore. Vast fields of rotten maize now stand as evidence of the prolonged twomonth spell of rain and waterlogging that gripped the district

Paddy and vegetables were also badly affected. Of the 200 hectares under paddy cultivation, 68 hectares were damaged, leading to a loss of Rs 19 lakh. Meanwhile, vegetable growers reported losses of Rs 33 lakh, with 38 hectares of crops washed away out of 411 hectares under cultivation.

DISASTER FUND: JAKHAR MAKES CAG REPORT PUBLIC, SEEKS APOLOGY FROM PUNJAB CM

MANN FOR 'MISLEADING' PEOPLE Diary Times Desk: Bharatiya Janata Party's state president Sunil Jakhar has once again targeted Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann over the issue of State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF), while making a report of the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) public. UK PUNJABI DIASPORA RALLIES BEHIND FLOOD-HIT PUNJAB WITH GRASSROOTS INITIATIVES

Diary Times Desk : Britain's Punjabi community is launching a new wave of grassroots initiatives to support flood-hit Punjab, with campaigns ranging from online fundraising to symbolic acts of solidarity.

UNITED SIKHS (UK) confirmed that their JustGiving campaign for "Punjab Flood Relief 2025" has now raised more than GBP 32,000 (Rs 30.4 lakh). In a note posted on their fundraising page, the charity said it is "considering adopting a village for ongoing support that will be required for the months ahead".

Another initiative has emerged from the north of England. The Manchester Punjabi Society has launched a GoFundMe drive under the banner "Global Sikhs – Support Flood Relief in Punjab", pledging to channel donations through Global Sikhs. Although the amount collected so far is modest, organisers say it reflects a growing groundswell of support from students and young professionals who want to play their part.



How To Avoid Seeing Disturbing Content

hen graphic videos go viral, like the recent fatal shooting of Charlie Kirk, it can feel impossible to protect yourself from seeing things you did not consent to see. But there are steps you can take.

Social media platforms are designed to maximize engagement, not protect your peace of mind. The major platforms have also reduced their content moderation efforts over the past year or so. That means upsetting content can reach you even when you never chose to watch it.

You do not have to watch every piece of content that crosses your screen, however. Protecting your own mental state is not avoidance or denial As a researcher who studies ways to counteract the negative effects of social media on mental

health and well-being. I believe it's a way of safeguarding the bandwidth you need to stay engaged, compassionate effective.

Research shows that exposure repeated violent or disturbing media increase stress, can heighten anxiety and contribute to feelings of



You are not powerless. Every boundary you set whether it is turnin off autoplay, filterin content or curating your feed – is a wa

helplessness. These effects are not just shortterm. Over time, they erode the emotional resources you rely on to care for yourself and others

Protecting your attention is a form of care. Liberating your attention from harmful content is not withdrawal. It is reclaiming your most powerful creative force: your consciousness.

Just as with food, not everything on the table is meant to be eaten. You wouldn't eat something spoiled or toxic simply because it was served to you. In the same way, not every piece of media laid out in your feed deserves your attention. Choosing what to consume is a matter of health. And while you can choose what you keep in your own kitchen cabinets, you often have less control over what shows up in your feeds. That is why it helps to take intentional steps to filter, block and set boundaries.

Practical steps you can take

Fortunately, there are straightforward ways to reduce your chances of being confronted with violent or disturbing videos. Here are four that I recommend:

Turn off autoplay or limit sensitive content. Note that these settings can vary depending on device, operating system and app version, and can

Use keyword filters. Most platforms allow you to mute or block specific words, phrases or hashtags. This reduces the chance that graphic or violent content slips into your feed.

Curate your feed. Unfollow accounts that share disturbing images. Follow accounts that bring you knowledge, connection or joy instead.

Set boundaries. Reserve phone-free time during meals or before bed. Research shows that intentional breaks reduce stress and improve well-being

Social media is not neutral. Its algorithms are engineered to hold your attention, even when that means amplifying harmful or sensational material. Watching passively only serves the interests of the social media companies. Choosing to protect your attention is a way to reclaim your agency

Then in a later Premier League match, after scoring the opening goal of the game, he produced the cross for Wayne Rooney to score one of the most famous and iconic goals in the competition's history: astonishing overhead bicycle kick that settled the derby 2-1 in United's favor.

The two teams face each other again at the Etihad Stadium on Sunday.

"Playing in the derby is the most beautiful experience you can have in the Premier League, and especially when it's United against City, It's really nice, the team who wins the game, the next day, they can walk free in the city. And then the colors of the team will be out, and the others will sit at home They will not come out," Nani reflected.

For something constructed nearly a century ago, it's an impressive feat of engineering. The descending staircase is built with the chillingly smooth precision for which many Nazi

megastructures are renowned. It leads down to a wide central tunnel lined with railway tracks and pipes.

At first glance, there's nothing unusual about the countryside around the small Polish village of Pniewo. The landscape is typical the Lubusz Voivodeship region: vast fields of yellow crops beneath big skies, broken only by the occasional patch of forest. It looks serene, but hidden below

is a darker story — a Nazi underground city.

Festungsfront Oder-Warthe-Bogen, or the Ostwall, is a fortified subterranean complex built before World War II as Adolf sought Germany's eastern frontier from Poland and the Soviet Union.

Between the Oder and Warta rivers, which today form part of the German-Polish border, the facility remains largely intact: a sprawling maze of underground railway stations, combat facilities and massive shafts covering about 20 miles in length.

Today, visitors can descend into this largely forgotten feat of military engineering. The soldiers who once occupied the bunkers are long gone, as are partygoers in the 1980s and '90s who left graffitied reminders of their revelry. But the complex has new residents.

After the Nazis abandoned the site in 1945, bats discovered the tunnels, finding them ideal for hibernation. As many as 40,000 arrive annually from across

Central Europe each fall, making it one of Europe's largest bat colonies

The Ostwall's story began in the 1930s, when Hitler, firmly in launched a sweeping power, militarization campaign defiance of the treaties that ended World War I.

He looked to the Lubusz Gate. the territory between the Oder and Warta rivers, then still part of Germany, as the place to fortify. Protecting this corridor, his strategists believed, was key to safeguarding Berlin.

By 1935, plans for the "Fortified Arc" were complete, and Hitler himself traveled to nearby Wysoka to anoint the project. Construction began the following vear.

. Ambitious hardly describes it. Engineers envisioned defensive line stretching nearly 50 miles, with work scheduled through 1951. Though never completed, the project already ranked among the most advanced fortifications in the world. The central section alone used more than two million cubic feet of concrete and could house tens of thousands of soldiers

But priorities shifted. By 1938, Germany's attention turned westward, toward France, and construction stopped. The next year, after the invasion of Poland. which triggered World War II, the



Ostwall's strategic purpose evaporated

The Ostwall complex remained part of the Nazi war machine as war raged across Europe. In January 1945, as the Red Army swept through, Soviet forces captured the line in just three days. The underground city was abandoned. The 21st century has given the Ostwall a second life. With European Union support and local enthusiasm, the complex has been transformed into a dark tourism destination.In 2011, the Międzyrzecz Fortified Region Museum opened. incorporating 19 miles of tunnels in the central section. From the outside, the entrance bunker looks almost cartoonish, topped with green, mushroom-shaped cupolas. Inside, the air is cold and damp but surprisingly hospitable. "The Nazis planned this complex for long-term stay for soldiers, so everything is constructed to make it more habitable," says Mikolaj Wiktorowski, a guide at the museum and a local history enthusiast. The most striking moment comes at the main shaft, a yawning chasm that drops deep into the earth

ARSENAL SPOIL ANGE POSTECOGLU RETURN, NICK WOLTEMADE EARNS NEWCASTLE UNITED WIN



Diary Times Desk: A Martin Zubimendi double took Arsenal top of the Premier League as Ange Postecoglou's first game in charge of Nottingham Forest ended in a 3-0 defeat, while Nick Woltemade's debut goal earned Newcastle's first win of the season against Wolves on Saturday. Postecoglou made a swift return to north London after being sacked by Tottenham in June but did not enjoy a dream debut in the Forest dugout against a ruthless Arsenal. Mikel Arteta's men had two weeks over the international break to mull over losing 1-0 to title rivals Liverpool due to Dominik Szoboszlai's stunning free-kick.

But the Gunners made it three wins from four games thanks to an unlikely goalscoring hero. Zubimendi scored just 10 times in 236 games for Real Sociedad and commanded a £60 million (\$81 million) fee in the transfer window.

GOALKEEPERS THE FOCUS AS MAN UNITED, MAN CITY CLASH IN DERBY

Diary Times Desk: It's evidence of how quickly things can change that at different points this summer, Ruben Amorim and Pep Guardiola, the managers of Manchester United and Manchester City, insisted they were happy with their goalkeepers.

Fast forward to the first Manchester derby of the season, which takes place Sunday, and Guardiola is weighing whether Gianluigi Donnarumma will make his debut at the Etihad Stadium. Amorim has opted for his No. 2 from last season, Altay Bayindir, to play ahead of deadline-day signing Senne Lammens from Antwerp. Bayindir is preferred, according to Amorim, because he has more experience.

Donnarumma, if selected, is unlikely to face a more pressure-packed moment in his City career than making his first Premier League appearance against United. His resume is not in doubt after a decade at the highest level with AC Milan and Paris Saint-Germain. There is a debate about whether the Italian is good enough with the ball at his feet to fit into Guardiola's system.

One way or another, the goalkeepers at both ends of the pitch Sunday will be one of the talking points of the afternoon.

BARCELONA BOSS FLICK SLAMS SPAIN'S HANDLING OF YAMAL INJURY
