

PM MODI INAUGURATES MUMBAI CRUISE TERMINAL, LAUNCHES RS 34,200 CRORE PROJECTS



Diary Times Desk: Prime Minister Narendra Modi, during the 'Samudra se Samriddhi' programme on Saturday, inaugurated and laid the foundation stone for several development projects across multiple sectors worth more than Rs 34,200 crore while also stressing the importance of 'Atmanirbhar Bharat (self-reliant India)'.

A major focus of the event is the maritime sector, with PM Modi inaugurating and launching projects worth more than Rs 7,870 crore. These initiatives span critical infrastructure upgrades across key Indian ports.

Addressing the large gathering at Jawahar Maidan in Bhavnagar, PM Modi said, "This event is being held in Bhavnagar, but is for the entire nation. Today, to decide the direction of India from 'Samudra' (ocean) to 'Samridhhi' (progress), Bhavnagar has been chosen as the centre of the event. I congratulate the people of Gujarat and Bhavnagar for this."

Several children made paintings and sketches for the Prime Minister. Seeing this, he thanked them for the love and asked the officials to collect the art.

Hailing the 'Sewa Pakhwada' events, PM Modi said, "From Vishwakarma Jayanti to Gandhi Jayanti, that is, from September 17 to October 2, millions of people across the country are participating in 'Sewa Pakhwada'. I have been informed that in Gujarat, too, a 15-

'TILAK', RAKSHA SUTRA', 'GAU MUTRA': VHP'S CRITERIA FOR GARBA ENTRY SPARK ROW

Diary Times Desk: Seeking to ensure that only Hindus get entry to garba events, the Vishwa Hindu Parishad (VHP) has said people will have to apply a 'tilak' (a mark on the forehead), tie a

sacred thread ('raksha sutra') and offer prayers to a Hindu god before being allowed in.
'Gau mutra', or cow urine, will also be sprinkled on attendees, the organisation's Vidarbha general secretary Prashant Titre said in Nagpur on Saturday, adding that VHP and Bajrang Dal workers will monitor garba pandals to ensure the guidelines are followed during the Navratra celebrations, which begin on Sunday and end on October 1.

All of this, the VHP said, is necessary to ensure only Hindus enter the events and there are no cases of "love jihad", which is a term used by some right-wing outfits to allege attempted conversion of Hindu girls and women by Muslim men. The issue, incidentally, gets brought up before the Navratra celebrations every year

While the opposition has hit out at the VHP and the Sangh for trying to sow division in society by issuing such diktats. Maharashtra minister and senior BJP leader Chandrashekhar Bawankule aid organisers can decide who enters such events.

Every organising committee sets certain rules, and they have a right to do so. As long as they have police permission to organise the event, there is no problem," Mr Bawankule said.

Maharashtra BJP media head Navnath Ban said garba is a Hindu event and those from other

religions "should not interfere".



MANIPUR AMBUSH

WREATH-LAYING CEREMONY **HELD FOR TWO SOLDIERS** KILLED IN MANIPUR AMBUSH



Diary Times Desk : A wreath-laying ceremony was held in Manipur's Imphal to honour the two Assam Rifles soldiers who died in the Friday's ambush in Bishnupur district

At around 6 pm on Friday, unidentified gunmen ambushed personnel of the 33 Assam Rifles by firing at their vehicle while they were traveling from Imphal to Bishnupur at Nambol Sabal Leikai, Bishnupur District. The attack resulted in the death of two personnel and left five others injured.

The tow soldiers who died were identified as Naib Subedar Shyam Gurung (58) and Rifleman (GD) Kashav (29).

The Manipur government announced Rs 5 lakh compensation for each of the families of the soldiers. A compensation of Rs 2 lakh was announced for each of teh five soldiers injured in the ambush.

The ceremony was attended by Governor of Manipur Ajay Kumar Bhalla, Chief Secretary Dr. Puneet Kumar Goel, Security Advisor Kuldiep Singh, 3 Corps Commander Lt Gen Abhijit S Pendharkar (AVSM, YSM), IGAR (South) Maj Gen Ravroop Singh (YSM, SM), ADGP Manipur Police Ashutosh Sinha, along with senior officers of BSF, CRPF, Assam Rifles, and officials of the state government.

ENCOUNTER BREAKS OUT BETWEEN SECURITY FORCES, TERRORISTS IN **I&K'S KISHTWAR**



Diary Times Desk: An encounter broke out between security forces and terrorists in Jammu and Kashmir's Kishtwar district on Friday night, Army officials said.

"In an intelligence-based operation in the general area of Kishtwar, alert troops of the White Knight Corps established contact with terrorists at around 8 pm," the

White Knight Corps said in a post on X.
Confirming that an exchange of fire took place, the Army said, "The operations is currently underway."

This comes days after a gunfight broke out between terrorists and security forces in the Kulgam district. During that encounter, two terrorists, including one who was believed to be a Pakistani national, were neutralised by the security forces. The two terrorists were identified as Rahman, a Pakistani national, and Amir Ahmed Dar, a resident of Shopian's Daramdora, said the Army, adding that a huge cache of arms and ammunition was covered from them.

Besides, two Indian Army personnel also lost their lives. According to the Indian Army, the two soldiers were identified as Sub Perbhat Gaur and Lance Naik Narender Sindhu, who died during the encounter that was launched in the Gudar forest area of Kulgam after officials received specific inputs about the presence of the terrorists. "Chinar Corps honours the supreme sacrifice of the Bravehearts, Sub Perbhat Gaur and L/Nk Narender Sindhu, in line of duty for the Nation.

YASIN MALIK BEGGED FOR HIS LIFE BEFORE ISI, LASHKAR-E-TAIBA: SOURCES TO NDTV



Diary Times Desk : Separatist leader Yasin Malik once pleaded for his (ISI) and terror group Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT), top intelligence sources disclosed to NDTV. life before Pakistan's intelligence agency Inter-Services Intelligence

The episode dates back to 2013, during a turbulent period in Jammu

and Kashmir's separatist movement.
Intelligence inputs accessed by NDTV showed that Lashkar operative Hilal Dar from Sopore was deputed in 2012 to assassinate Malik. Dar, acting on ISI's directions, conducted a video reconnaissance of Malik's residence at Magbool Manzil in Srinagar's Maisuma locality.

The plot, sources said, was hatched after Pakistan grew suspicious that Malik was secretly working with Indian agencies. The killing of Molvi Showkat, a close associate of Malik, in a bicycle IED blast near his residence had already deepened Pakistan's distrust of the Jammu and Kashmir Liberation Front (JKLF) chief.

Dar was arrested in Srinagar after a tip-off by the Jammu and Kashmir Police late in 2012. In his confession, he claimed the ISI-Lashkar jointly wanted to eliminate Malik since he was found to be

engaged and working for India's Intelligence Bureau. The turning point came in 2013, when Afzal Guru was hanged in India for his role in the Parliament attack. Malik, who was then in Pakistan, immediately organised protests against India. Among those joining him was Lashkar founder Hafiz Saeed. The sources revealed that during these demonstrations, Malik privately begged Saeed for mercy, promising that he would never again cooperate with Indian agencies and would instead follow ISI's orders.

'IAISH' NO MORE. HIT BY SANCTIONS, BANNED TERROR GROUP CHANGES NAME



Diary Times Desk : Banned terrorist group Jaish-e-Mohammed will now be known as Al-Murabitun - which means 'defenders of Al-Murabitun - which means 'defenders of Islam' in Arabic - within Pakistan, intel sources told NDTV this week. The new name will be used during the 'memorial' next week for Yusuf Azhar, the brother of founder Masood Azhar. Sources said the group -responsible for the attack on the Indian Parliament in 2001, the 26/11 Mumbai attacks, and on the Army in Jammu and Kashmir's Uri and Pulwama - wants to delink from the 'Jaish-e-Mohammed' name because sanctions make it difficult to access funding. The name change, however, is only expected for its Pak operations, sources said. July report by the Financial Action Task orce, a global anti-terror funding ratchdog, underlined the funding watchdog, underlined the funding challenge facing the terrorist group. The FATF said the Jaish is now using digital payments, i.e., e-wallets and UPI transfers, to channel money into rebuilding itself. According to the FATF five such e-wallets

have been traced so far, and each has direct links to the terrorist group and members of founder Masood Azhar's family. The goal, reports indicate, is to raise nearly four billion Pak rupees to set up over 300 'markaz', i.e., hubs or training centres.

INDIA SAYS 'IN TOUCH WITH FAMILY' AFTER TELANGANA TECHIE WAS SHOT DEAD BY US COPS



Diary Times Desk: The Ministry of External Affairs on Friday confirmed that India is in touch with the US authorities and with the family of a man from Telangana who was allegedly killed in California. While adressing the weekly briefing, MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said that, "There has been an incident in California. We are in touch with the family. We also understand that an investigation is underway by local authorities."

Jaiswal added that US authorities had already released preliminary details of the case. "You would have also seen that the local police department, they have put out a video and a statement giving details of the circumstances," he said.

Reiterating India's commitment to providing support in such situations, the MEA stated, "We are also in touch with the family and will render our possible assistance in this matter."

Mohammed Nizamuddin, a 30-year-old software engineer from Mahabubnagar, Telangana, was shot by police in California earlier this month.

Before his death, Nizamuddin had publicly spoken about facing harassment and racial discrimination, both at his workplace and in his personal life. He even claimed that attempts had been made to poison his food.

In a LinkedIn post, he identified himself as a "victim of racial hatred" and urged an end to what he described as the "white supremacy/racist white American mentality."

WHY TEJASHWI IS STEERING CLEAR OF SIR IN HIS SOLO BIHAR YATRA



Diary Times Desk: Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) leader Tejashwi Yadav's ongoing Bihar Adhikar Yatra is being viewed in some quarters as a move to assert his leadership within the Opposition alliance in Bihar.

This impression has been fuelled by the Congress party's hesitation in formally naming Tejashwi as the Mahagathbandhan's chief ministerial face. The fact that the RJD leader's new march was launched shortly after Rahul Gandhi's Voter Adhikar Yatra concluded has added to perceptions of a carefully timed political manoeuvre.

MULTIPLE DELHI SCHOOLS RECEIVE BOMB THREATS; SEARCH OPERATIONS UNDERWAY

Diary Times Desk: Multiple schools in Delhi allegedly received bomb threats on, prompting large-scale search operations by the police and bomb disposal squads. Authorities swiftly cordoned off the affected areas and evacuated students and staff as a precautionary measure.

A senior police officer confirmed that four FIRs under the Arms Act had been registered in connection with the ongoing investigation. "The arrested people were identified as Abbas alias Guddu Chundha (45), Ishrat (45), Altaf (22), Ayaan alias Salman (23), and Armaan (22)," he added.



Police sources said that search operations were still underway at several schools and that they were working with specialised agencies to ensure the safety of students and staff. Officials have stated that the threats are being taken "extremely seriously" and that further questioning of the arrested individuals is in progress.

FIVE MORE BODIES FOUND IN RAIN-RAVAGED CHAMOLI, TOLL RISES TO SEVEN

'PAYING HIDDEN TAX': BENGALURU TECHIE'S RANT OVER TRAFFIC. COMMUTE VIRAL



Diary Times Desk: Bengaluru's employees face daily, serpentine traffic jams while commuting to work, a problem highlighted by a Reddit user who expressed frustration over paying significant taxes without seeing any return on investment, as road infrastructure and traffic management remain a mess.

In the post titled "Traffic is the new tax", the user, a tech employee for Oracle, living in JP Nagar, detailed their commute problems. The user stated that they had an annual income of Rs 28 lakh but were paying approximately Rs 6.5 lakh in income tax and Rs 1.4 lakh in GST on everyday expenses, which collectively represent over three months of their yearly earnings.

PUJA KHEDKAR FAMILY'S BODYGUARD ARRESTED IN KIDNAPPING CASE, COPS SUSPECT PARENTS FLEEING INDIA

Diary Times Desk: Former IAS probationer Puja Khedkar's family bodyguard, accused of abducting a truck driver after a road rage incident in Navi Mumbai, was arrested from Maharashtra's Dhule on Friday night, officials said. Praful Salunkhe, who has also been the Khedkar family's driver, was produced before the Navi Mumbai Belapur Court and was remanded to five days of police custody.

Khedkar's parents, Dilip and Manorama, are still missing, with the police suspecting they might have fled the country.

The kidnapping case unfolded earlier this month when a concrete mixer truck, driven by Prahlad Kumar (22), brushed against a Land Cruiser on the Mulund-Airoli Road, triggering an argument with two occupants of the car. Investigation revealed that Khedkar's father and his bodyguard allegedly bundled the truck driver in the SUV and took him to Khedkar's bungalow - in a bid to get compensation for the damage caused to the car.

When the cops returned to the bungalow, they found that the car involved in the crime was missing, along with Khedkar's father and their bodyguard. As they tried to enter the premises, Manorama unleashed two ferocious dogs to scare them. A day later, the police visited the bungalow again, only to find Manorama missing too.

FATAL SHOOTING 'DISGUISED' AS ROAD ACCIDENT EXPOSED IN JAMMU; THREE COPS SUSPENDED

Diary Times Desk: Three policemen were suspended after a probe into the death of a woman here last month revealed that she died of gunshot wounds and not of a road accident, an officer said on Saturday. On August 21, Mehjabeen Akil Sheikh, 30, a resident of Mumbai, her sister Fatima, 21, and Jaspreet Kour, 28, of Ludhiana were brought to a private nursing home on the outskirts of Jammu by two men, who claimed that they had sustained injuries in a road accident on the Ring road.

On August 29, Mehjabeen Sheikh succumbed at the Government Medical College (GMC) Hospital.

A probe, however, revealed that the three had been fired upon by unidentified persons and were not injured in a road accident.

CAN'T ORDER BEGGAR TO MAINTAIN HIS DESTITUTE WIFE: KERALA HIGH COURT ASKS STATE TO STEP IN

Diary Times Desk: A court cannot order a beggar to part with his alms to maintain his destitute wife, observed the Kerala High Court recently while dealing with a unique case where a woman sought maintenance from her blind husband, who survived by begging. Justice PV Kunhikrishnan, instead, ordered the State to step in and ensure that the beggar's destitute wife was provided with food and clothing. The Court noted that the beggar had married twice under Muslim personal laws, and urged the State to take measures to help both his wives. "I am of the considered opinion that this Court cannot direct a beggar to pay maintenance to his wife. However, the government should ensure that the petitioner's wives are also provided with food and clothing," the Court said.

"As mentioned by the Family Court, no court can direct a beggar to pay maintenance to his wife when the wife admits that her husband is a beggar

LET'S REVEAL POOMPUHAR'S PRIDE, SAYS TN CM, AS UNDERSEA EXCAVATION BEGINS IN EARLY CHOLA CAPITAL

Diary Times Desk: After Keezhadi, Poompuhar undersea excavation has begun, and it will reveal the ancient civilisation that once flourished, Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M K Stalin said on Saturday.

The deep-sea excavation between the early Chola capital, Poompuhar, and Nagapattinam, a medieval trade hub with maritime links to Southeast Asia, was commenced by the state Archaeology department on September 19 in collaboration with the Indian Maritime University.

The ancient port city was once known as Kaviripoompattinam located in the present-day Mayiladuthurai district. The previous undersea survey was carried out in Poompuhar in 1991. The Keezhadi site on the banks of the Vaigai River in Sivaganga district is situated close to Madurai and a series of excavations carried out by the state Archaeology Department showed evidence of an urban civilization dating back to the Sangam.

ALLAHABAD HIGH COURT BANS MENTION OF CASTE IN POLICE RECORDS, ORDERS ACTION AGAINST CASTE STICKERS ON VEHICLES

Diary Times Desk: The Allahabad High Court recently directed the Uttar Pradesh government and its Director General of Police (DGP) to amend the police manuals to prohibit the disclosure of caste in investigations and related public records [Praveen Chetri v State of UP and Another].

Justice Vinod Diwakar also called for amending the Central Motor Vehicle Rules (CMVR) to explicitly ban caste-based slogans and caste identifiers on all private and public vehicles. It also called for their removal and imposition of fines on vehicle owners.

"The entries, in paragraph and column pertaining to the requirement of caste or tribe shall stand deleted, whereas the Mother's Name shall be added along with the name of father and husband in all the aforesaid FORMATS annexed with the counter affidavit filed by Director General of Police, UP," the Court ordered

It also directed that the caste column on the notice boards installed at police stations be also deleted. However, the Court clarified that there would be exemption in cases where there is a statutory requirement for mentioning caste, like in cases registered under the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 (SC/ST Act).

"The aforesaid directions shall be applicable in the territorial jurisdiction of Uttar Pradesh and are optional for the central government, as it was not before this Court," the Court said.

UKRAINE SAYS THREE KILLED IN 'MASSIVE' RUSSIAN AERIAL ATTACK



Diary Times Desk: At least three people have been killed and more than 30 injured in a "massive" overnight Russian aerial attack on Ukraine, President Volodymyr Zelensky says.

He says regions across the country were targeted as part of a "deliberate strategy" to "intimidate civilians and destroy our infrastructure", with one direct missile hit reported on a residential building.

Ukraine's air force says Moscow launched 619 drones and missiles. Russia's defence ministry says its "massive strike" used "precision weapons" and targeted military-industrial facilities

Separately, Russia says four people were killed in a Ukrainian drone attack on the Samara region. Kyiv says it hit a major oil refinery there.

Ukraine also says another Russian oil refinery was damaged in the neighbouring Saratov region.

Russian President Vladimir Putin launched a full-scale invasion of Ukraine in 2022.

In a post on social media, President Zelensky said Ukraine's Dnipropetrovsk, Mykolaiv, Chernihiv, Zaporizhzhia, Poltava, Kyiv, Odesa, Sumy and Kharkiv regions were attacked by Russia overnight.

He said "residential areas and civilians facilities" were hit

In the central city of Dnipro, the president added, there was a "direct hit of a missile with cluster munitions on a high-rising residential building". The BBC has verified footage uploaded this morning showing a missile in flight and an

morning showing a missile in flight and an impact, as well as still images of a badly damaged building in the same location in Dnipro.

In Russia, Samara regional Governor Vyacheslav Fedorishchev said four people were killed "as a result of an overnight attack by enemy drones".

He said that another person was injured, without giving any other details.

XI HINTS TIKTOK DEAL HAS HIS BLESSING – IF TRUMP MAKES CONCESSIONS ELSEWHERE



Diary Times Desk: Donald Trump's much-touted call with Xi Jinping failed to finalize a long-awaited deal to spin off TikTok's US operations, but China's top leader did signal his blessing for the plan – as long as it aligns with Beijing's interests.

At first glance, Beijing's willingness to play ball on TikTok looks like a sharp reversal from its years of resistance to relinquishing control over the viral video app – the first global social media hit to come out of China.

But rather than bowing to Trump's pressure campaign, analysts say, Chinese leaders are using an app cherished by the US president and millions of Americans as leverage to extract other, far more consequential concessions.

And judging by comments from Chinese officials and state media on the "framework" reached by the US and China in Madrid this week, Beijing appears intent on retaining ownership of TikTok's most prized asset, its algorithm that has helped the app attract 170 million Americans and more than 1.5 billion users worldwide.

PAKISTAN MINISTER ON WHETHER SAUDI ARABIA WILL GET INVOLVED IF THERE IS WAR WITH INDIA

Diary Times Desk: Saudi Arabia will defend Pakistan in the event of India declaring war on its neighbour, Pak Defence Minister Khawaja Asif told reporters in Islamabad Friday, emphasising the 'strategic mutual assistance' component of the deal two countries signed this week.

"Yes, absolutely. There is no doubt about it..." Mr Asif told Geo TV, a Pak news channel, drawing parallels with Article 5 of the NATO agreement that refers to 'collective defence', which essentially means a military attack against one bloc member is an attack on all.

GAZA HOSPITAL DIRECTOR RECEIVES BODIES OF BROTHER AND OTHER RELATIVES WHILE ON DUTY

Diary Times Desk: On Friday, Dr. Mohammed Abu Salmiya left his family home for a shift as the director of the Al-Shifa hospital. A day later, the bodies of six family members arrived while he was still on duty. An Israeli airstrike struck his home in the Al Shati refugee camp, west of Gaza City, where multiple generations had been living together, the doctor said.

"This is the family home where we live. My brother, two of my brother's sons, my nephew's wife, and two of their children were martyred," Abu Salmiya told CNN.

The strike on Abu Salmiya's family home killed six people and injured seven others, including the hospital director's sister, niece and nephews, he said.

CNN has reached out to the Israel Defense Forces for comment on the target of the strikes. A video shared by the Director General of Gaza's Ministry of Health, Dr. Munir Al-Bursh, showed a grief-stricken Abu Salmiya kneeling next to the bodies of his family members at the hospital, still wearing his doctor's scrubs.



ESTONIA SEEKS NATO CONSULTATIONS AFTER RUSSIA JETS INCIDENT



Diary Times Desk: Three Russian fighter jets violated NATO member Estonia's airspace for 12 minutes on Friday in an "unprecedented brazen" incursion, its government said.

Russian jets have violated Estonian airspace in the past, but usually only briefly. The length of Friday's incursion was unusual.

European Union foreign policy chief Kaja Kallas said Russia's incursion in Estonia was a "dangerous provocation," while US President Donald Trump said it "could be big trouble."

However, a statement from Russia's Defense Ministry said the flight was in keeping with "international rules governing airspace" and "did not violate" Estonia's borders.

Meanwhile, Poland deployed aircraft during a massive overnight Russian attack on neighboring Ukraine.

TRUMP TO IMPOSE \$100K FEE PER YEAR FOR H-1B VISAS, LIKELY TO IMPACT INDIANS

Diary Times Desk: The Trump administration said on Friday it would ask companies to pay \$100,000 per year for H-1B worker visas, potentially dealing a big blow to the technology sector that relies heavily on skilled workers from India and China.

Since taking office in January, Trump has kicked off a wide-ranging immigration crackdown, including moves to limit some forms of legal immigration. The step to reshape the H-1B visa program represents his administration's most high-profile effort yet to rework temporary employment visas.

"If you're going to train somebody, you're going to train one of the recent graduates from one of the great universities across our land. Train Americans. Stop bringing in people to take our jobs," US Commerce Secretary Howard Lutnick said.

Trump's threat to crack down on H-1B visas has become a major flashpoint with the tech industry, which contributed millions of dollars to his presidential campaign.

Critics of the programme, including many US technology workers, argue that it allows firms to suppress wages and sideline Americans who could do the jobs. Supporters, including Tesla CEO and former Trump ally Elon Musk.

HAMAS RELEASES "FAREWELL" PHOTO OF HOSTAGES, BLAMES ISRAEL'S GAZA INVASION



Diary Times Desk: Hamas, shared a compilation picture of the remaining 47 Israeli hostages held in Gaza on Saturday. Hamas said that the image released was a farewell picture and each hostage has been labelled as "Ron Arad", an Israeli Air Force navigator who was captured in 1986. Along with it, the hostages were also given a number.

The text on the image accused Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu of rejecting a ceasefire-hostage deal and blamed the IDF Chief of Staff for going ahead with the invasion of Gaza

despite his reported opposition to it. It reads, "Because of [Prime Minister Benjamin] Netanyahu's refusal, and [IDF Chief of Staff Lt. Gen. Eyal] Zamir's capitulation, a parting image as the military operation in Gaza City begins."

According to a report by Ynet, an Israeli publication, officials say out of the 47 hostages, only 20 are believed to be alive. 2 of the remaining hostages are in a grave condition and the rest are dead.

A statement from al-Qassam Brigades said, "Your prisoners are distributed within the neighborhoods of

A statement from al-Qassam Brigades said, Your prisoners are distributed within the neighborhoods of Gaza City, and we will not be concerned for their lives as long as Netanyahu has decided to kill them," as reported by CNN.

"The commencement of this criminal operation and its expansion means that you will not receive any prisoner, neither alive nor dead, and their fate will be the same as that of (Ron Arad)."

During the ceasefire between January and March 2024, Hamas released 30 hostages - 20 Israeli civilians, five soldiers, and five Thai nationals. They also released the bodies of eight killed Israeli captives. In May, they released an American-Israeli hostage as a "gesture" to the United States.

Israel, in exchange, released 2,000 prisoners and detainees.

Israeli strikes killed at least 14 people overnight in Gaza City, said health officials, as Israel ramps up its offensive there and urges Palestinians to leave.

The strikes come as Western countries are getting fed up with the intensifying war in Gaza with some moving to recognise Palestinian statehood at the United Nations General Assembly next week.

US FORCES STRIKE THIRD ALLEGED DRUG VESSEL KILLING THREE, TRUMP SAYS

Diary Times Desk: President Donald Trump has said US forces carried out a "lethal kinetic strike" on a vessel which he said was trafficking drugs, and the attack killed three "male narcoterrorists" on board.

Trump said he ordered the attack on the boat, which was in the US Southern Command's area of responsibility, after US intelligence confirmed it was trafficking drugs. It was the third such strike on alleged drug boats in recent weeks.

Trump's statement on Truth Social on Friday said the strike happened in international waters. The US Southern Command's area of responsibility covers most of South America and the Caribbean.

TRUMP UNVEILS \$1 MILLION 'GOLD CARD' VISA PROGRAM FOR US RESIDENCY

Diary Times Desk: US President Donald Trump signed an executive order for a 'Gold Card' visa program with fees set at USD 1 million for individuals and USD 2 million for businesses.

"We think it's going to be very successful... It's going to raise billions of dollars, which will reduce taxes, pay off debt, and do other good things," Trump said as he signed the executive order.

United States Secretary of Commerce, Howard Lutnick, noted that through the gold card plan, the US will only allow "extraordinary people at the very top" to come to the US who can create business and jobs for Americans.

Lutnick called the employment-based green card program "illogical".

TRUMP SAYS HE IS SPEAKING WITH TALIBAN TO REGAIN CONTROL OF BAGRAM AIRFIELD



Diary Times Desk: U.S. President Donald Trump on Friday said he was speaking with Afghanistan about regaining control of the Bagram air base.

"We should have never given it up," Trump told reporters in the Oval Office.

The comments come a day after Trump, in a joint press conference with British Prime Minister Keir Starmer, said the United States sought to regain control of the base used by American forces following the attacks of September 11, 2001.

The withdrawal of American forces in 2021 led to a takeover of the base by the Islamist Taliban movement.

Afghan officials expressed opposition to a revived U.S. presence.

"Afghanistan and the United States need to engage with one another ... without the United States maintaining any military presence in any part of Afghanistan," Zakir Jalal, an Afghan foreign ministry official, said in a post on X on Thursday.

PORTUGAL CONFIRMS IT WILL RECOGNISE PALESTINIAN STATE

Diary Times Desk: Portugal says it will recognise a Palestinian state on Sunday, making it the latest Western nation preparing to shift policy as the war in the Gaza Strip shows no sign of stopping.

The foreign ministry made the announcement ahead of next week's United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) in

France, the UK, Canada and Australia are preparing similar announcements.

Israel has denounced the move, with Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu saying it "rewards terror" following Hamas's 7 October 2023 attack on Israel.

The US - Israel's main ally - has echoed Netanyahu's

President Donald Trump, speaking alongside Prime Minister Sir Keir Starmer this week, while on a state visit to the UK, said he disagreed with recognition.

Around three quarters of the UN's 193 members already recognise a Palestinian state, which in 2012 was granted the status of non-member observer state.

MINISTER REJECTS TRUMP'S CALL FOR MILITARY TO TACKLE ILLEGAL MIGRATION

Diary Times Desk: The UK military is focused on defending the nation rather than stopping asylum seekers from crossing the Channel, a cabinet minister has said. US President Donald Trump suggested that military intervention could be used to deal with illegal migration to the UK during his state visit this week. But Trade Secretary Peter Kyle has rejected that call, telling BBC Breakfast the UK Border Force has specific responsibility for policing UK borders. About 1,000 migrants are believed to have crossed the the Channel earlier on Friday, as two more deportations under the government's "one in, one out" deal with France took place. Six boats are believed to have set off from northern France, as the smugglers made the most of a break in the windy weather in the Channel. There had been no crossings for a week before then due to choppy seas. The French authorities rescued 23 people on Friday who had got into difficulty at sea - but others refused assistance and continued their journey towards the UK.

CHARGE TRUMP'S POLITICAL OPPONENTS, "FIRED"

US ATTORNEY, UNDER PRESSURE TO

Diary Times Desk : An Indian customs officer recently shared his experience of being denied a US B1/B2 tourist visa during the September 2025 interview at the US

Embassy in Delhi.

Despite a stable government job, owning a house, substantial savings over Rs. 50 lakh, and a clear travel plan, the officer and his wife were refused visas under Section 214(b) in a brief three-minute interview.

The visa officer repeatedly focused on the computer screen with minimal engagement and did not ask about his finances or property, even though he carried necessary documents.

"The whole thing lasted around 3 minutes. No questions were asked about my finances, property, etc. I carried all necessary documents to support my claims, but nothing was asked or sought at all," he wrote in the Reddit post.

INDIAN EMBASSY ISSUES TRAVEL ADVISORY FOR **NEPAL, URGES CAUTION**

Diary Times Desk: The Indian embassy in Kathmandu on Friday issued a travel advisory for Indian nationals travelling to Nepal, stating that while the situation in the country has improved considerably over the past week, visitors should still exercise due caution and strictly adhere to updates and instructions issued by the mission or local authorities.

"The situation in Nepal has improved considerably over the past week. Road transport and flights are now operating regularly," the Indian embassy wrote in the Nepal advisory.

"Indian nationals travelling to Nepal are, however, advised to exercise due caution and adhere to advisories/updates that may be issued by the Embassy of India in Kathmandu or local authorities of Nepal," the advisory added.

CYBERATTACK CAUSES DISRUPTION AT EUROPEAN AIRPORTS INCLUDING **LONDON'S HEATHROW**

Diary Times Desk: A cyber attack targeting a service provider for check-in and boarding systems has disrupted operations at several major European airports including London's Heathrow, Brussels and Berlin, causing flight delays and cancellations, the operators said.

The attack has rendered automated systems inoperable, allowing only manual check-in and boarding procedures, according to Brussels Airport.

"This has a large impact on the flight schedule and will unfortunately cause delays and cancellations of flights," the operator said in a statement published on its website.

"The service provider is actively working on the issue and trying to resolve the problem as quickly as possible." Heathrow also warned of delays caused by "a technical issue" at a third-party supplier.

Passengers with a flight scheduled for Saturday were advised by the affected airports to confirm their travel with airlines before heading to the airport.



PAK TRAIN HIJACK MASTERMIND KILLED IN **AFGHANISTAN**

Diary Times Desk: The mastermind behind the Jaffar Express terrorist attack in Pakistan, Gul Rahman, was killed in Afghanistan, ARY News reported on Saturday.

According to reports, Gul Rahman alias Ustad Mureed, an Indian-sponsored terrorist, died under mysterious circumstances in Helmand province on September 17. Gul Rahman was the trainer and operational commander of the Indian proxy group Fitna al Hindustan (Majeed Brigade). He was involved in several terrorist attacks against Pakistani security forces, innocent civilians, Chinese nationals and various institutions.

Sources stated that Gul Rahman's death underscores the continued use of Afghan territory for orchestrating terrorist activities against Pakistan.

Notably, on March 11, 2025, the Jaffar Express passenger train traveling from Quetta to Peshawar, with 380 passengers, was hijacked by the Balochistan Liberation Army (BLA).

US SENATORS INTRODUCE SHRIMP TARIFF ACT TO PROTECT LOUISIANA INDUSTRY AGAINST ALLEGED UNFAIR TRADE PRACTICES BY INDIA

Diary Times Desk: Republican US Senators Bill Cassidy and Cindy Hyde-Smith introduced the India Shrimp Tariff Act to shield local shrimp and catfish farmers from India's allegedly unfair trade practices, specifically the dumping of cheap shrimp into the US market, a statement by Cassidy's office said.

"People come from all over to try Louisiana gumbo, jambalaya, and shrimp and grits. That's because our shrimpers and catfish farmers meet high standards," said Cassidy. "By leveling the playing field, this bill protects Louisiana seafood and the jobs that depend on it."

Senator Hyde-Smith said that Indian shrimp was being 'dumped' there, and the legislation is aimed at focusing on local fishermen.

WORLD WAR II-ERA BOMB WEIGHING 450 KG DISCOVERED IN HONG KONG. THOUSANDS EVACUATED

Diary Times Desk: Thousands of people were evacuated from their homes in Hong Kong overnight so experts could defuse a large USmade bomb left over from World War II that was discovered at a construction site.

Police said the bomb was 1.5 metres in length and weighed about 1,000 pounds (450 kg). It was discovered by construction workers in Quarry Bay, a bustling residential and business district on the west side of Hong Kong Island.

"We have confirmed this object to be a bomb dating back to World War II," said Andy Chan Tin-Chu, a police official, speaking to reporters ahead of the operation. He said that because of "the exceptionally high risks associated with its disposal," approximately households 6,000 involving individuals were evacuate swiftly".

TCS SECOND-HIGHEST **BENEFICIARY OF APPROVED** H-1B VISAS: MICROSOFT, **APPLE ALSO IN TOP 10**

Times Desk Consultancy Services (TCS) is the second-highest beneficiary with over 5,000 approved H-1B visas in 2025, after Amazon, according to federal data.

According to the US Citizenship and **Immigration** Services (uscis), Amazon had 10,044 workers using H-1B visas as of June, 2025. Coming in at the second spot was TCS with 5,505 H-1B visas approved.

Other top beneficiaries include Microsoft (5189), Meta (5123), Apple (4202), Google (4181), Deloitte (2353), Infosys (2004), Wipro (1523) and Tech Mahindra Americas (951). In a move that could significantly impact Indian IT and professional workers in the US, the Trump administration announced staggering annual fee of USD 100,000 on H-1B visas, a move it said aims to check the "systemic abuse" of the programme.

In July, USCIS had said that it has received enough petitions to reach the congressionally mandated 65,000 H-1B visa regular cap and the 20,000 H-1B visa US advanced degree exemption, known as the master's cap, for fiscal year 2026.

US President Donald Trump signed a proclamation 'Restriction on entry of certain nonimmigrant workers' on Friday that will restrict entry into the United States of individuals as nonimmigrants unless their H-1B petitions are accompanied or supplemented by a payment of USD 100,000.

INDIA-GREECE BILATERAL MARITIME EXERCISE MARKS MILESTONE IN DEFENCE COOPERATION

THE TROPE OF 'LIBERAL MEDIA' IS FINALLY DEAD



Diary Times Desk: Growing up in Missouri, the home state of Rush Limbaugh, I often heard the word "media" spoken with a fair bit of derision, sandwiched by the words "liberal" and "bias." It was an accusation that crystallized as a capital-T Truth for much of the country as Fox News emerged in the late 90s, wielding it as a cudgel to reinforce the network's conservative credentials.

The perception of "liberal" media was always exaggerated, and often unfair, rooted partly in the fact that most mass media giants were headquartered in Democratic strongholds like DC and New York (where, of course, Fox is also based.) But President Donald Trump's MAGA coalition are done crying about perceived bias. Even "fake news" has lost its bite. In his second term, Trump is taking his complaints straight to the source. siccing lawyers and regulators on outlets he sees as a threat (the New York Times, NPR), or allowing his billionaire supporters to wrest control of those he thinks he can jostle into compliance (CBS, Nexstar).

WHY TRUMP AND HIS FCC CHAIRMAN'S THREATS AGAINST TV STATION LICENSES ARE 'AGGRESSIVE YET HOLLOW'

Diary Times Desk: President Trump keeps threatening the licenses of local TV stations, but his government has limited power to follow through on those threats

The FCC has not denied any license renewal in decades. And any move to revoke a station license would result in lengthy, protracted legal challenges. "But the threats are the point," as the FCC's lone Democratic commissioner, Anna M. Gomez wrote on X this week

In other words, Trump can't actually stop local stations from broadcasting shows he doesn't like, but he can use his bully pulpit to pressure media companies into submission and self-censorship.

THE ELECTRIC CAR **REVOLUTION IS ON** TRACK, SAYS IEA

Diary Times Desk:

Global electric vehicle sales are set to rise by more than a fifth to reach 17 million this year, powered by drivers in China. according to the International Energy Agency.

In a report Tuesday, the IEA projected that "surging demand" for EVs over the next decade was set "to remake the global auto industry and significantly reduce oil consumption for transport."

It expects half of all cars sold globally to be electric by 2035, up from more than one in five this year, provided charging infrastructure keeps pace. The IEA includes battery electric vehicles and plug-in hybrid vehicles in its definition of EVs.

The agency's bullish long-term outlook for EVs - based on current government policies comes just days after the world's biggest battery EV maker Tesla slashed its prices in major markets to counter declining sales and growing competition from Chinese upstarts and established carmakers.

Recent negative headlines about slowing EV penetration are out of step with positive global trends, according to IEA executive director Fatih Birol. The data "does not at all show a reverse of the growth of electric cars. It shows an extremely robust increase of global electric car sales," he told reporters Tuesday.

ELON MUSK IS BACK TO ASKING XAI EMPLOYEES TO PROVE 'WHAT YOU'VE ACCOMPLISHED'

Elon Musk is back to business - and back to sending emails asking employees what they've accomplished. On Tuesday afternoon, Musk sent an email asking all xAI employees to "send a one page summary of what you've accomplished in the past four weeks and what you intend to accomplish in the next four weeks." "This is due by noon on Thursday," Musk wrote in the email, according to a copy of the email shared with CNN by a source familiar with the situation. A spokesperson for xAI did not respond to a request for comment. Musk is known for making such requests from employees at various companies and agencies he has led throughout his career.

In August 2024, Musk sent out an email to all staff at X asking for a "one page summary of your contributions to the company over the last month and over the last twelve months" as a way to make "stock & option awards proportionate to the likely future contributions of people at X," according to a source who received the email. The Verge first reported on the email last year.

While Musk was advising the White House and the Department of Government Efficiencies, all federal employees were sent mass emails asking them to list what they accomplished in the past week. Musk announced on X at the time that "failure to respond will be taken as a resignation."

But the emails were sent so broadly, federal employees working in sensitive areas such as national security and the judiciary were warned by agency leaders not to respond. In February, the Office of Personnel Management told agencies that responses to Musk's email were voluntary and failure to respond did not equal resignation. By August, the entire program was completely rolled back by OPM.

FLOODWATERS FORCE FARMER TO FERRY MOTHER'S BODY BY BOAT, CREMATE IN COURTYARD

RAVIFLOODS: PUNJAB GOVT SUSPENDS 3 OFFICERS POSTED AT MADHOPUR HEADWORKS OVER FLOODGATE FAILURE IN AUGUST

Diary Times Desk: The Punjab Government has suspended three officers, who were posted at the Madhopur headworks when the floodgates there did not open during the recent heavy inflow of water in the Ravi river, leading to severe flooding in areas of Pathankot and Gurdaspur districts. Those issued suspension orders by the Principal Secretary, Water Resources Department, include XeN Nitin Sood, SDO Arun Kumar and JE Sachin Thakur. The three officers posted there were responsible for the maintenance of the flood gates.

The incident happened on the intervening night of August 26-27. It is believed that 2.12 lakh cusecs of water was released from the Ranjit Sagar Dam. The 54 floodgates at the barrage were reportedly sealed after Operation Sindoor, to stop the flow of water to Pakistan.

PANCHKULA POLICE ISSUE TRAFFIC ADVISORY AHEAD OF NAVRATRI FAIR AT MANSA DEVI

13 YEARS ON, PILLUKHERA FAMILY STILL AWAITS RECOGNITION FOR SON'S SACRIFICE

Diary Times Desk: For 13 years, 60-year-old trader Chander Bhan of Pillukhera, Jind, has been fighting for recognition of his son Saurabh Garg's bravery. At 19, Saurabh saved 11 lives during an LPG blast in December 2012, only to die in the rescue attempt.

Despite repeated recommendations, the teenager never received a bravery medal. "Probably because he didn't come from a family of politicians or bureaucrats, nor is his father a wealthy businessman," Bhan says bitterly.

In 2023, he approached the Haryana Human Rights Commission, which has now directed the Chief Secretary to fix accountability for the delay, take up the matter afresh with the Ministry of Home Affairs, and even consider a state-level gallantry award. The Commission noted, "The denial of recognition to the late Saurabh Garg is not due to any lack of merit in his act of bravery but solely on account of the dereliction and administrative apathy of the public authorities concerned."

TWO MISCREANTS HELD BY STF UNITS AFTER EXCHANGE OF FIRE IN KURUKSHETRA VILLAGE

Diary Times Desk: In a joint operation, the STF Ambala and Karnal units have nabbed two miscreants after a brief exchange of fire near Pratapgarh village on Thursday night in Kurukshetra.

In the exchange of fire, both miscreants, identified as Rahul and Rajiv Sandhu, residents of Peedal village in Kaithal, suffered bullet injuries in their legs. They were taken to the Lok Nayak Jai Parkash District Civil Hospital for treatment. The STF had recovered two country-made pistols and six live cartridges from their possession.

As per the STF, the miscreants were involved in a firing incident that took place on September 12 at an immigration centre in Kurukshetra.

According to the information, the accused are habitual offenders and had been involved in cases of murder, attempt to murder, extortion and Arms Act.

DSP STF Ambala Aman Kumar said following an input received regarding the presence of two miscreants near Pratapgarh village on the national highway, the teams of STF Ambala and STF Karnal started a search operation. After spotting the policemen, the miscreants opened fire and tried to flee but in response and to catch them the STF units also opened fire and the miscreants suffered bullet injuries. Overtourism is leading to more car crashes in Scotland

"We are suffering from overtourism," says Laùra Hänsler, a safety campaigner for the A9, who has been working with Marshall on promoting his Tplates, "The infrastructure is practically on its knees because we're straining to cope with it."



The plates have yet to be officially endorsed by any authorities. When contacted by CNN, Scotland said national driving standards. including the requirements for displaying vehicle plates, were a matter for the Department of Transport. But "as we understand it as long as it's not offensive, you can put what you like on your car."

The plates have been generating buzz online and have been a particular hit on TikTok. Marshall says he's received orders for the £9.99 plates (around \$13.50, of which 10% goes to road-safety charities) from as far afield as the United States, Pakistan and India.

In a Facebook video demonstrating other road users' reactions to the T-plate, Hänsler says that she tested the plates by going on the A9 and keeping to a steady 50 miles per hour (on a 60

Earth-like exoplanet could be habitable

Astronomers might be close confirming the presence of an Earth-like atmosphere on an exoplanet for the first time, if more detailed analyses verify preliminary observations from the James Webb Space Telescope.

The planet is part of a planetary system about 40 light-years away from Earth called TRAPPIST-1, which five Belgian astronomers discovered in 2016 and named after their favorite beer. The system has been heavily studied ever since

"As a planetary system, it's as atmosphere, prompting optimism. alien as it gets," said Néstor Espinoza, an astronomer at the Science Space Telescope Institute in Baltimore. "The star is very, very small — the size of Jupiter - and it has at least seven rocky planets orbiting around it. Three of those are in what we call the habitable zone. which means they are close enough to the star that if they had atmosphere, they sustain liquid water."

Espinoza and his colleagues focused on TRAPPIST-1 e, the fourth planet from the star in the system, in a study published last in The Astrophysical Journal Letters. Four observations performed in 2023 with the Webb telescope were



The data are not yet conclusive," he added in "but they prove that JWST has the power to c Earth-like atmosphere if it exists. For the inition, we are truly within reach of discove atmosphere around a potentially habitable exoplamet."

"Based on the first four observations, we cannot tell that (this planet) doesn't have an atmosphere, so the dream is still alive - it could still have an atmosphere," Espinoza said, and that's super exciting, because we do have a follow-up program of 15 more observations.

The Webb telescope has only been able to rule out any atmosphere on TRAPPIST-1 b, the innermost planet, but the jury is still out on the other six, Espinoza said, with TRAPPIST-1 e seen as one of the best candidates for liquid

'Three years ago, before the launch of James Webb, these kinds of studies were science fiction," Espinoza said about the possibility of detecting atmospheres on faraway planets. "Now I'm pretty confident we'll be able to see what kind of atmosphere TRAPPIST-1 e could have — and if it has an Earth-like atmosphere, we'll be able to tell."

When looking for an atmosphere astronomers wait for a planet to transit in front of its star and notice any minor changes in the starlight that filters through. They search for telltale signs of an atmosphere while learning about its chemical composition

With the four transits observed by the Webb telescope in 2023. astronomers were able to rule out of a primary, hydrogen-based atmosphere on TRAPPIST-1 e, which was likely blown away by significant amounts of radiation emitted by its star. (Earth similarly lost its primordial, primary atmosphere on but then built a early secondary one: astronomers hope that TRAPPIST-1 e could have done the same.)

This scenario is detailed in a second study, also published last week in The Astrophysical Journal Letters. It notes that the planet is unlikely to have an atmosphere rich in carbon dioxide like those of Venus and Mars, and points toward a nitrogen-heavy one more similar to Earth and Saturn's icy moon Titan."TRAPPIST-1e remains one of our most habitable-zone compelling planets, and these new results take us a step closer to knowing what kind of world it is.

"If you're going to grow something on Mars, you probably don't want to bring a lot of natural insects to do the pollination." savs Hsiao. "That's where our robot could potentially come into Kevin Chen, an associate professor at MIT and the principal investigator at its Soft and Micro

Robotics Lab adds that the team doesn't want to replace bees, but put the robots to work in scenarios where the insects can't. They could be used in warehouse farms with rows of crops stacked high and ultraviolet

are taking lessons from nature to create robots that might perform better at complex tasks or in difficult environments traditional technology.

At Yale University, researchers developed a gecko-inspired robot that can amputate its own limbs a capability that could be helpful in search and rescue missions in dangerous rubble, according to

And researchers at South Korea's Chung-Ang University recently unveiled a soft robot that can bend and crawl like a caterpillar.

"Millions of years of evolution has helped to give (insects and animals) the best solution. especially for any type of locomotion," says Hsiao, who writes the algorithms that tells the bee robots how to move.

The robot bee flies using soft artificial muscles that elongate and contract to flap the wing. developed by PhD candidate Suhan Kim. The robot's laser-cut wings, and its tiny internal mechanisms, similar in size to watch components, are also made in-house

The team is also working on a grasshopper-like robot. machine, smaller than a human thumb, can hop 20 centimeters (almost 8 inches) into the air and

Across the world, technologists take on terrains ranging from grass to ice to a leaf. Hsiao says that the jumping robot is more energy efficient than a flying robot.

> The small size of the bee and grasshopperlike robots means they could be useful for search and rescue missions or exploring places like the inside of a pipeline or a

turbine engine.



Hsiao says the next step in taking the technology into the real world is to add sensors that can feed information to the robots, and batteries to power them.

The machines currently rely on a wire to power them. "It's very difficult to put a small energy source onboard tiny robots," adds

The ability to deploy a fully autonomous robot in the field could be 20 to 30 years away, he estimates.

The black-and-white publication, featuring texts by the poets Max Jacob and René Char, revealed a schoolboy passion for Surrealism in its heyday and a love affair with the 1920s Marxist magazine Philosophies, edited by Pierre Morhange, Henri Lefebvre, Georges Politzer and Norbert Guterman. In the febrile intellectual atmosphere of mid-1960s Paris, Abadie's fanzine attracted interest from the avant-garde, and before long the precocious editor was making a name for himself on the city's art scene.

Over the next 60 years, until his death in 2023, Abadie forged a unique path as a curator and writer. He devised groundbreaking exhibitions for the Grand Palais, the Centre Pompidou and the Jeu de Paume, and reintroduced the public to artists such as the Italian painter Alberto Magnelli and the American Surrealist Dorothea Tanning.

Abadie was a bold and assertive personality, as characterised by Catherine Millet (Catherine M.) in her autobiographical novel Commencements, which recounted their lives as twentysomethings in Paris. His enthusiasm for art was honed by his devotion to Surrealism, and he used its tenets to great effect, finding imaginative and subversive ways of sidestepping technical and bureaucratic hurdles.

'He gave new visibility to key figures in French abstraction — often swimming against the current of prevailing trends,' says his friend and colleague, France's former Minister of Culture, Rima Abdul Malak.In 1970, Abadie co-commissioned the exhibition Hélion: 100 works 1928-1970 at the Grand Palais. At just 25, Abadie was committed to reintroducing the work of Jean Hélion to the French public. The artist had left France for New York in 1934, where he had something of a Damascene conversion to figuration. This was a seismic shift for the painter, who — together with Jean Arp and Theo van Doesburg — had been a pioneer of abstraction in Paris, celebrated for his biomorphic forms.

COLLECTING GUIDE: TOP BURGUNDY WINE PRODUCERS


The jewel in the crown of the Côte d'Or, this peerless estate commands a roll call of the greatest Grand Cru vineyards: Romanée-Conti, La Tâche, Romanée-Saint-Vivant, Richebourg, Echézeaux and Grands-Echézeaux, among others.

Very few people are able to taste the magnificent wines that emanate from the old cuverie of the monks of Saint Vivant. Those who do are imbibing mythic beasts, pinot noir that displays aromatic fireworks, spherical structure and luscious texture.

The colourful nature of the wines is matched by the intriguing history of the estate: in 1760 it was the subject of a bidding war between Louis XV's mistress, Madame de Pompadour, and the king's cousin, the Prince de Conti. The mistress's pockets were not as big as the prince's, and he handed over 8,000 livres for the estate, appending the best vineyard with his title. This regal pedigree is felt, even today, in the sumptuous and evolved nature of the wines.

Lalou-Bize Leroy is a force of nature. She took over the reins of Maison Leroy in 1955 and maintained the high standards of her father Henri, who had been buying the best wines from up and down the Côte d'Or for production under his own label. The family were heavily tied to the other great name in Burgundy, the Domaine de la Romanée-Conti, as part owners, and the quality of winemaking at both estates was so high that today the wines are among the most collectable in the world.

In the late 1980s Lalou bought vineyards, rather than just barrels as her father had, and started crafting handsome wines from plots such as Richebourg and Romanée St Vivant. She maintains that 90 per cent of the work of the estate is in the vineyard and she is an innovator, allowing the vines to flourish without cutting and overseeing a savage selection process.



LIVERPOOL BEAT EVERTON TO MAINTAIN PERFECT PREMIER LEAGUE START

Diary Times Desk: Liverpool stretched their perfect Premier League start to maintain their stranglehold of the Merseyside derby with a 2-1 win over Everton and open up a six-point lead at the top of the table. Goals from Ryan Gravenberch and Hugo Ekitike were the defending champions' reward for a dominant first half and enough for a fifth consecutive Premier League win. But Liverpool ran out of steam after the break and were left hanging on after Idrissa Gana Gueye fired Everton back into the contest.
