KARUR STAMPEDE: SC TO PRONOUNCE ORDER ON MONDAY ON PETITIONS SEEKING INDEPENDENT PROBE



Diary Times Desk: The Supreme Court will on Monday pronounce its verdict on petitions seeking an independent probe into a stampede at Velusamypuram in Karur district of Tamil Nadu which claimed 41 lives on September 27 during a rally of actor and TVK leader Vijay

A Bench of Justice JK Maheshwari and Justice NV Anjaria will pronounce the verdict on October 13.

While reserving its verdict on appeals by TVK and others challenging the Madras High Court's October 3 order for an SIT probe, the Bench had expressed surprise over the manner in

which it proceeded with the matter.

It had raised questions over the Madras High Court passing 'conflicting' orders — one declining plea for CBI probe passed by

Madurai Bench and the other directing an SIR probe passed by the Principal Bench.

"We are unable to understand how this order was passed? How did the single bench in the Chennai Bench proceed with the matter when the division bench in Madurai was considering the matter?" the Bench had asked.

A total of 41 people died in the stampede, with police noting that the rally saw a turnout of 27,000, nearly three times the expected 10.000 participants.

The high court had also dismissed the BJP leader's plea seeking a CBI probe into the incident and directed her to approach the Madurai Bench. It had formed the SIT under senior IPS officer and Inspector General, North Zone, Asra Garg and pulled up the organisers of the event, the TVK leadership and the police over the stampede.

VIOLENCE AT FARMERS' RALLY ORGANISED BY AAP IN GUJARAT, 3 COPS HURT, TEARGAS SHELLS FIRED

Diary Times Desk: Stones were hurled at police at a 'mahapanchayat' organised by AAP for farmers in Botad district on Sunday, prompting cops to fire teargas shells, officials said, adding that at least three policemen were injured.

Police claimed no permission was taken for organising the rally in Haddad village in the

"The 'mahapanchayat' was organised illegally. These people gathered in the village with the intention of causing damage to the market yard. When police asked them to disperse, they threw stones at us, which damaged a police vehicle," said Superintendent of Police Dharmendra Sharma.

He said police used force and fired teargas shells to disperse the mob "Three policemen were injured and are currently undergoing treatment.

Around 20 persons have been detained, but the final count may rise as police are conducting combing operations," he said, adding that the situation is under control

I HAVE NO CASTE, NO RELIGION: WILL LIVE ONLY AS **HUMAN': YOUTH TEARS** SACRED THREAD AT ZUBEEN GARG'S CREMATION SITE

In a rare gesture at singer Zubeen Garg's cremation site, a youth publicly tore off his sacred thread (lagun), traditionally worn by Brahmins, and declared he would live only as a human, rejecting caste and

Sun Bhagawati, a youth in his early thirties, asserted that he was only following the ideals of his idol Garg and appealed to people to live only as humans by breaking the boundaries of caste religion.

"By birth, my caste is Brahmin, But I have no caste, no religion. We must live as humans," Bhagawati told reporters, pulling out the thread from beneath his clothes and tearing it in front of the cameras.

"Jai Zubeen Da (elder brother). I will never wear it again. People should live as humans only, not as Hindu-Muslims. Here I throw it in the dustbin," Bhagawati said. while throwing away the symbol of Brahmanism

Garg had proclaimed that he had no religion-caste and he was just a human The singer, born as Jibon Borthakur into a Brahmin family, had on several occasions said he had once torn off his lagun to use it as a rope for tying a mosquito net.

Asked why he took the drastic step, Bhagawti said: "In the last few years, I have been seeing only Hindu-Muslim talks on social media. Within Hindu religion also, there are so many castes. If you are a Shudra, I cannot eat from your hand. I don't want to talk about those thousands of rules and regulations. That is why I finished everything here in front of Zubeen da," he said.

Diary Times Desk: Putting to rest a controversy over the ence of women journalists at his media interaction days back, Afghan Foreign Minister Amir Khan Muttagi on Sunday said there was no intention behind it.

Muttaqi said this during a second press conference in three days in New Delhi that was attended by several women journalists.

The Afghan Foreign Minister came under severe attack from India's opposition parties and journalists for "excluding" women press persons from his media interaction on Friday.

Interestingly, a large flag of the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan (as called by Taliban) was placed behind Muttaqi's chair at the Afghan embassy's conference room,

while a smaller one was put on the front.

Muttaqi faced a volley of questions on the controversy over the absence of women journalists at his previous press conference. "With regards to the press conference, it was organised on short notice. A small list of journalists was finalised. It was more of a technical issue," he said.



"The Congress president has been speaking to all the coalition partners in Bihar, and the final discussion is on for deciding candidates in a few seats where the Congress and some other parties feel they are strong. The Congress president is talking to all political leaders for the last two days in Bihar," Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh said.

He said the talks between the leaderships of RJD and Congress are also on and the leaders of the two main parties may also meet by Monday

On the delay in seat-sharing announcement, Ramesh said, "We have to adjust some new partners in the 'Mahagathbandhan' and we have to adjust them too in seat-sharing." "In the next two-three days, we expect all the seats to be finalised and declared," he said.

20 YEARS OF RTI: CONGRESS TEARS INTO MODI GOVT FOR 'SYSTEMATICALLY KILLING' ACT, 'HOLLOWING OUT' DEMOCRACY



Diary Times Desk: The Congress on Sunday accused the Modi government of 'systematically killing" and "weakening" the Right to Information Act, which was brought by its UPA government two decades ago with an aim to bring in transparency and accountability in governance.

On the 20th anniversary of Right to Information (RTI) Act, the Congress alleged that for the BJP, RTI means "Right to Intimidate", and claimed that the ruling dispensation also made the Central Information Commission a "toothless" body with its top post as well as the posts of seven information commissioners lying vacant for a

"For the BJP, RTI means Right to Intimidate," AICC general secretary (communications), Jairam Ramesh, said at a press conference on the 20th anniversary of the Act, which was introduced on October 12, 2005.

OBC MAN MADE TO WASH BRAHMIN'S FEET, DRINK WATER TO "ATONE" FOR INSULT

Diary Times Desk: In a shocking incident of caste-based discrimination, a young man in Madhya Pradesh's Damoh district was allegedly forced to wash the feet of a Brahmin man and drink the water as a punishment for "insulting" him. A now-viral video of the act has sparked outrage in the region. Both parties, however, have downplayed the issue and slammed attempts to "politicise" it.



A police case has been registered under several sections, including one relating to an act that prejudices harmony between different communities. This FIR is based on a complaint filed by a member of the Kushwaha community. Parshottam Kushwaha, from an Other Backward Classes (OBC) community, was made to wash the feet of Annu Pandey, a Brahmin, and drink the water in front of the villagers. He was also fined Rs 5,100 and made to apologise to the Brahmin community.

It started with a village-level dispute. Sataria village, where Parshottam Kushwaha and Annu Pandey live, has declared a liquor ban. Despite this, Annu Pandey allegedly continued to sell alcohol. When caught, the villagers punished him by making him publicly apologise and pay a fine of Rs 2,100, a resolution Pandey accepted. But the matter took a different turn when Parshottam allegedly created and shared an Al-generated image of Annu wearing a garland of shoes. Though he deleted the post within minutes and apologised, some saw the act as an insult to the Brahmin community, adding a caste twist to a village dispute.

TOP COURT TO RULE ON PLEAS SEEKING INDEPENDENT PROBE INTO KARUR STAMPEDE

Diary Times Desk: The Supreme Court is scheduled to pronounce its order on October 13 on a batch of pleas seeking an independent investigation into the Karur stampede incident in which 41 people lost their lives.

A bench of Justices J K Maheshwari and N V Anjaria will pronounce the verdict on the pleas.

On Friday, the top court, while reserving its orders, had questioned the Madras High Court for constituting a special investigation team (SIT) to probe the stampede and wondered how it had proceeded with the matter.



AFGHAN MINISTER CLARIFIES AFTER OUTRAGE OVER NO WOMEN JOURNALISTS AT PRESSER

Diary Times Desk: Afghanistan Foreign Minister Amir Khan Muttaqi on Sunday justified the absence of female journalists from his earlier press conference as a "technical issue", days after the incident sparked a major controversy for "insulting women".

"Regarding the press conference, it was organised on a short notice. (There was) a short list of journalists that were invited. It was more of a technical issue but there was no other problem. Our colleagues had decided to send the invitation to a specific list of journalists. There were no other intentions other than that," the visiting Afghan minister said, as he held his second press conference two days after the first presser at the Afghanistan Embassy triggered the row.

"We have 10 million students in schools and institutes, including over 2.8 million women and girls. In madrasas, education continues up to graduation. Some limits exist, but we've never declared women's education religiously 'haram', it's only postponed until further order," he added.

The interaction was held hours after Muttaqi held wide-ranging talks with External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar. Ahead of the presser, NDTV had raised the issue of the absence of women journalists at the first press meet with Embassy officials and security staff.

OVER 16 LAKH NAMES DELETED IN CLEANUP OF ELECTORAL ROLLS AHEAD OF ELECTIONS

Diary Times Desk: The latest update to Bihar's electoral roll has revealed significant deletions and adjustments with 1,672,513 names removed, marking an overall increase of 1.60% in the voters' list compared to that of 2020.

The final voter list following the SIR was officially published on September 30 by the Election Commission. In response to concerns raised by parties and civil society groups, the Supreme Court had earlier directed the EC to provide detailed information about the deletions. The Court's order emphasised transparency in the revision process. Consequently, the EC allowed voters to file appeals if they believe their names were unjustly removed.

A total of 30,98,228 claims were filed through Form 6, which is used to add new names to the list. Of these, 28,95,191 claims were accepted, meaning 93.4% of the applications for inclusion were approved.

CANADIAN FOREIGN MINISTER ANITA IN DELHI TO RESET TIES, PUSH STRATEGIC COOPERATION WITH INDIA



Diary Times Desk: Canadian Foreign Minister Anita Anand arrived in New Delhi on Sunday, marking a key step in efforts to reset bilateral relations and build a framework for deeper strategic cooperation between India and Canada. Anand, who is on her first official visit to India since assuming office, will hold talks with External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar and Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal. The discussions are expected to focus on trade diversification, energy transformation, investment, and security cooperation. She is also scheduled to travel to Mumbai to meet Canadian and Indian business leaders to strengthen partnerships aimed at creating jobs and expanding economic opportunities in both countries.

BIHAR MAN WANTED TO MARRY GIRLFRIEND, SO HE SET SECOND WIFE ABLAZE



Diary Times Desk: A man in Bihar wanted to marry his girlfriend, but his second wife objected. Angered by this, he doused her in petrol, released LPG from a cylinder, and set her ablaze, officials said on Saturday.

Vikas Kumar, from a village in Nalanda district, had married Sunita Devi (25) five years ago. Sunita's father said it was only after the wedding that they realised Kumar had already been married once and had not divorced his first wife.

Kumar's family managed to convince Sunita to live with them, and she had two children, both of whom died shortly after they were born. Kumar then began talking about marrying his girlfriend and this led to frequent arguments between him and Sunita, who then left to live with her parents.

NDA'S BIHAR SEAT SHARE PLAN: BJP, JDU TO **CONTEST 101 EACH, CHIRAG PASWAN GETS 29**

Diary Times Desk:

The NDA has finally inked the deal on Bihar seats after weeks of back-and forth. The break-up was posted on X. formerly Twitter, by Union minister Dharmendra Pradhan. Under the deal, the BJP and Chief Minister Nitish Kumar's Janata Dal United will contest 101 each of the state's 243 assembly seats.

The Rashtriva Lok Morcha of Upendra Kushwaha and Jitan Ram Manihi's Hindustan Awam Morcha or HAM will get six seats each, posted Mr Pradhan, who is also the BJP's incharge for the state's assembly polls. Chirag Paswan's Lok Janshakti Party (Ram Vilas) - for which the deal was held up for long -- will get 29 seats. The regional ally of the BJP had been playing hardball, demanding 40-45 seats, while the BJP was ready to allocate only 25 seats. The leaders of the party had even indicated that they would not rule out a tie up with Prashant Kishor's Jan Suraaj Party.

'P CHIDAMBARAM'S **REMARK ON OP BLUE STAR** IS HIS OPINION': CONGRESS **LEADER**

Diary Times Desk: Maharashtra Congress President Harshwardhan Sapkal said on Saturday that senior party leader P Chidambaram's remark on the 1984 Operation Blue Star reflected his personal opinion.

"Terrorism had increased in the country during that period, and former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi had to lose her life because of the same. Whatever Chidambaram said must be considered his personal view," Sapkal added.

What Did P Chidambaram Say On Op Blue Star?

On Saturday, P Chidambaram criticised Operation Blue Star under the Indira Gandhi-led government in 1984, describing it as "the wrong way," and said that the former prime minister paid with her life for the

Speaking at the Khushwant Singh Literary Festival 2025 on Saturday, Chidambaram, the former Union home and finance minister, said that Operation Black Thunder was the right way to retrieve the Golden Temple, by keeping the Army out of the Sikh worship place.

"No disrespect to any military officers here, but that (Blue Star) was the wrong way to retrieve the Golden Temple. A few years later, we showed the right way to retrieve the Golden Temple by keeping out the army," Chidambaram said.

"Mrs Gandhi (former PM Indira Gandhi) paid with her life for that mistake. It was a cumulative decision of the Army.

HARYANA: DALIT IPS OFFICER'S DEATH SPARKS POLITICAL STORM. **MAHAPANCHAYAT GIVES 48-HOUR ULTIMATUM TO BJP GOVT**

Diary Times Desk: The alleged suicide by senior IPS officer Y. Puran Kumar on October 7 – after he accused his superiors of caste-based discrimination and humiliation – has triggered a political storm not just in Haryana but across the country.

The echo of the incident has reached as far as Bihar, where elections are due next month

The death of a senior police officer has shaken up the system, raising serious questions over persistence of caste discrimination even within high echelons of bureaucracy. But what's more surprising is the lack of prompt action by the Bharativa Janata Party (BJP) government in Haryana.

The party's cautious and guarded response so far has only intensified the controversy.

MADHYA PRADESH COURT DENIES BAIL KERALA ON ALERT AS BRAIN-EATING TO DOCTOR ARRESTED FOR COUGH **SYRUP DEATHS**

Diary Times Desk: A court in Madhya Pradesh has denied bail to a doctor recently arrested for prescribing Coldrif cough syrup that led to the death of several children in Chhindwara district.

Additional Sessions Judge Goutam Kumar Gujre, posted at Parasia Civil Court, took note of the prosecution submission that the pediatrician Dr. Praveen Soni had prescribed the medicine to children below the age of four years in violation of the guidelines issued by Directorate General of Health Sciences.

In the order passed on October 8, the Court also said that the probe into the deaths is still incomplete and the allegations against the accused are of serious nature. Therefore, it refused to grant regular bail to Soni. At least 24 children died after allegedly consuming the cough syrup in Madhya Pradesh, according to media reports.

AMOEBA CLAIMS 23 LIVES: HOW THE STATE IS BATTLING A RARE DISEASE

Diary Times Desk: Kerala is on high alert after a surge in cases of cases of amoebic encephalitis (brain fever) - popularly called the "brain-eating amoeba." So far, the state has reported a total of 104 cases of amoebic encephalitis (brain fever). News18 reported.

State health minister Veena George said 23 patients have so far died due to the infection. . Kollam and Thiruvananthapuram districts are among the most affected areas, with Kozhikode and Malappuram also reporting a surge in cases. "Following the Nipah outbreak in Kozhikode in 2023,

it was decided and directed that all cases of encephalitis (brain fever) must be mandatorily reported and that the causes behind such cases should be identified. As a result, from 2024 onwards, encephalitis cases began to be officially reported, and some of them were found to be amoebic encephalitis.

AVIATION BODY SEEKS REPORT AFTER AIR INDIA PLANE DEPLOYED **EMERGENCY TURBINE**

Diary Times Desk: India's aviation regulator, the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA), has asked Boeing for a detailed report on the uncommanded deployment of the Ram Air Turbine (RAT) on Air India flight AI-117 at Birmingham earlier this month and is advising Air India to reinspect the RAT stowage on all affected aircraft, particularly those with recently replaced power conditioning modules (PCMs).

A senior DGCA official said, "Boeing has been requested to submit a comprehensive report outlining the preventive measures to be implemented in respect of the uncommanded RAT deployment incident, global data on similar incidents reported in the Boeing 787 fleet, as cited in the company's Fleet Team Digest, and details of any service difficulty reports from operators worldwide following Power Control Module (PCM) changes." Additionally, the DGCA has instructed Air India to review the "D" Check work package to ensure that all required actions related to the PCM module replacement have been properly implemented.



DIANE KEATON, OSCAR-WINNING STAR OF 'ANNIE HALL', DIES AT 79 Diary Times Desk:

Diane Keaton, the Oscar-winning star of 'Annie Hall', 'The Godfather' films and 'Father of the Bride', whose quirky, vibrant manner and depth made her one of the most singular actors of a generation, has died. She was 79.

People Magazine reported on Saturday that she died in California with loved ones, citing a family spokesperson. No other details were immediately available, and representatives for Keaton did not immediately respond to enquiries from The Associated Press.

The unexpected news was met with shock around the world.

"She was hilarious, a complete original, and completely without guile, or any of the competitiveness one would have expected from such a star. What you saw was who she was...oh, la, la la!," Bette Midler said in a post on Instagram.

HELICOPTER SPIRALS OUT OF CONTROL, CRASHES INTO PALM TREES AT CALIFORNIA BEACH; 5 INJURED

Diary Times Desk: A helicopter that was coasting above a popular Southern California beach Saturday suddenly lost control and began spiralling in midair, eventually losing altitude and slamming into a row of palms as stunned sunbathers and beachgoers looked on.

Multiple videos posted online show the aircraft twirling clockwise above Huntington Beach, then plunging toward the edge of the beach, where it becomes wedged between palms and a staircase near Pacific coast Highway.

The Huntington Beach Fire Department said five people were hospitalised, including two who were in the helicopter and were "safely pulled from the wreckage." Three other people on the street were injured. Details on their injuries were not immediately available.

The department said the helicopter was associated with an annual "Cars 'N Copters" fundraising event planned for Sunday.

PAKISTAN, AFGHAN TROOPS TRADE HEAVY FIRE ALONG BORDER AFTER AIR STRIKES

Diary Times Desk: Clashes broke out between the Pakistan Army and Afghan forces following firing at multiple locations along the Pak-Afghan border in Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa and Balochistan, Dawn reported.

The firing took place at several key posts, including Angoor Adda, Bajaur, Kurram, Dir, Chitral in Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa and Baramcha in Balochistan, The Express Tribune reported.

Security sources said that the firing was aimed at facilitating the illegal entry of Khwarij—the statedesignated term for the banned Tehreek-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) --into Pakistani territory, as reported by The Express Tribune.

The loudest sound was from the cars crashing together as they were swept along by the water that had escaped from the banks of the Cazones River and flooded the streets with more than 12 feet (4 metres) of water at dawn Friday. On Saturday, much of that water had flowed away. What was left was pure destruction, and the sometimes head-scratching combinations made when nature collides with the man-made: like cars hung in treetops and even a dead horse wedged inside the cabin of a pickup truck. The death toll from landslides and floods set off by incessant rainfall in central and southeastern Mexico rose to 41 people on Saturday, authorities said, a sharp increase as thousands of soldiers cleared blocked roads to rescue the missing.

DOZENS KILLED IN PAKISTAN-AFGHANISTAN CLASHES, BORDER CLOSED



Diary Times Desk: Dozens of fighters were killed in overnight border clashes between Pakistan and Afghanistan, both sides said on Sunday, in the most serious fighting between the neighbours since the Taliban came to power in Kabul.

The Pakistan military said that 23 of its soldiers were killed in the clashes. The Taliban said nine on its side were killed

Tensions have risen after Islamabad demanded the Taliban take action against militants who have stepped up attacks in Pakistan, saying they operate from havens in Afghanistan. The Taliban, which came to power in 2021, denies that Pakistani militants are present on its soil.

Each side said it inflicted far higher casualties on the other side, without providing evidence. Pakistan said it had killed more than 200 Afghan Taliban and allied fighters, while Afghanistan said that it had killed 58 Pakistani soldiers

AFGHANISTAN WILL NOT TOLERATE EXTERNAL AGGRESSION: FOREIGN

As fresh fighting between the two sides broke out following Pakistani air strike in Kabul on Thursday, Muttaqi, currently on a six-day visit to India, said the overall situation is under control and that his country will not tolerate any violation of its sovereignty.

UKRAINE'S POWER GRID ATTACKED AS MOSCOW WORRIES OVER US TOMAHAWKS

Diary Times Desk: Russia attacked Ukraine's power grid overnight into Sunday, part of an ongoing campaign to cripple Ukrainian energy infrastructure before winter. This came as Moscow expressed "extreme concern" over the United States potentially providing Tomahawk cruise missiles to Ukraine.

Kyiv regional Governor Mykola Kalashnyk said two employees of Ukraine's largest private energy company, DTEK, were wounded in Russian strikes on a substation in the region. AT 92, WORLD'S OLDEST PRESIDENT SEEKS TO EXTEND RULE AS CAMEROON HOLDS



Diary Times Desk: Cameroonians began voting on Sunday in a presidential election where incumbent Paul Biya, the world's oldest ruler at 92, is widely expected to maintain his 43-year grip on power despite an energized opposition pushing for change.

Biya's opponents include former government spokesperson Issa Tchiroma, 76, who has drawn large crowds demanding an end to the veteran leader's long tenure. Tchiroma's bid has drawn endorsements from a platform of some opposition parties and civic groups.

However, analysts say that Biya, in power since 1982, is likely to be re-elected given his firm control of state machinery and the fragmented nature of the opposition.

In the capital, Yaounde, voters trickled in amid tight security at a polling station in the upscale Bastos neighbourhood near the presidential palace, where Biya was expected to cast his ballot.

FORMER NEPAL SPEAKER KRISHNA MAHARA ARRESTED ON CHARGE OF GOLD SMUGGLING

Diary Times Desk : Former Nepal speaker Krishna Bahadur Mahara was arrested on Sunday for his alleged involvement in gold smuggling.

The 67-year-old vice-chair of the Communist Party of Nepal-Maoist Centre was arrested by the Central Investigation Bureau (CIB) from his residence at Lalitpur Metropolitan City, according to a statement issued by Nepal Police.

The former Speaker of the House of Representatives was arrested for his involvement in selling gold pieces amounting to Nepalese Rs 85.52 million, which were stored at the Tribhuvan International Airport three years ago, police said.

A Chinese national coming from Dubai was arrested three years ago from the Kathmandu airport for smuggling the gold pieces hidden inside electronic cigarettes.

Mahara was found to be allegedly involved in assisting criminal gangs and some airport officials to sell the gold in the market at that time.

PREPARATIONS BEGIN TO RAMP UP AID IN GAZA AS CEASEFIRE BRINGS HOPE FOR END TO 2-YEAR WAR

Diary Times Desk: Preparations were underway Sunday for a ramp-up of aid entering the war-battered Gaza Strip under a new ceasefire deal that many are hoping will signal an end to the devastating 2-year-long war.

The Israeli defence body in charge of humanitarian aid in Gaza, COGAT, said that the amount of aid entering Gaza Strip is expected to ramp up on Sunday to around 600 trucks per day, as stipulated in the agreement.

Egypt said it is sending 400 trucks carrying aid into Gaza Sunday. The trucks will have to be inspected by Israeli forces before being allowed in.

The Egyptian Red Crescent said the trucks include medical supplies, tents, blankets, food and fuel.

The trucks will head to the inspection area in the Kerem Shalom crossing for screening by Israeli troops. In recent months, the UN and its partners have been able to deliver only 20 per cent of the aid needed in Gaza because of the fighting, border closures and Israeli restrictions on what enters.

ISRAELI MAN SETS SELF ON FIRE, DIES. HIS GIRLFRIEND WAS KILLED BY HAMAS

Diary Times Desk: An Israeli man who survived the October 7, 2023, Hamas attack on a music festival in Israel has died by suicide, days after the second anniversary of the attack.

Roei Shalev, 28, lost his girlfriend, 25-year-old Mapal Adam, and his friend, Hili Solomon, to the attack two years ago.

On Friday, Shalev was found dead in a burning car on a highway exit near Netanya, The Jerusalem Post reported. CCTV footage captured Shalev at a gas station filling a fuel canister shortly before his body was discovered, according to the report.

Before his death, Shalev shared a message on Instagram. "I'm truly sorry. I can't bear this pain any longer," he wrote. "I'm burning inside, and I can't contain it anymore. Never in my life have I felt such pain and suffering - deep, burning, eating me from within.



NOBEL WINNERS ABHIJIT BANERJEE. ESTHER DUFLO TO LEAVE US AMID FUNDING **ROW**

Diary Times Desk: US-based Nobel laureates Esther Duflo and Abhijit Banerjee will soon join the University of Zurich, where they will establish a new centre for development economics, the institution said Friday.

The University of Zurich (UZH) said the married couple, who currently work at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), would join its economics faculty from July next year.

The statement made no mention why the pair -who won the 2019 Nobel Economics Prize alongside Michael Kremer for their "experimental approach to alleviating global poverty" -- had decided to leave.

But they will be moving to Switzerland at a time when experts are warning US President Donald Trump's cuts to research funding and attacks on universities' academic freedoms could lead to a brain drain, with some countries trying to attract US scientists.

"Hamas agrees to a long-term truce, and for its weapons not to be used at all during this period, except in the event of an Israeli attack on Gaza," the source said.

Another Hamas official requested anonymity to discuss sensitive topics had earlier told AFP that Hamas' disarmament was "out of the question".

PAKISTANI. AFGHAN FORCES EXCHANGE DEADLY BORDER FIRE: WHAT'S NEXT?



MODI TO SKIP GAZA PEACE SUMMIT HOSTED BY TRUMP, SISI, MOS KIRTI VARDHAN TO REPRESENT INDIA

Diary Times Desk: India is set to be represented by Kirti Vardhan Singh, Minister of State for External Affairs, at the Sharm el-Sheikh Gaza peace summit being hosted by US President Donald Trump and Egyptian President Abdel Fattah el-Sisi Monday.

Singh will travel for the peace conference after Prime Minister Narendra Modi received a lastminute invite from both Trump and Sisi. The conference will be jointly chaired by the two presidents, as the ceasefire negotiated by the US between Israel and Hamas came into effect Friday. The two-year war in Gaza between Israel and Hamas is moving towards a conclusion. Hamas has agreed to release the remaining hostages held captive, while Israeli forces are withdrawing to agreed areas under Trump's ceasefire plan announced last month. Hamas will start releasing hostages Monday morning, ahead of Trump's visit to Egypt to jointly chair the peace summit, according to news reports.

In exchange for releasing the remaining captives, Israel is expected to free around 250 Palestinian prisoners and 1,700 detainees from Gaza, while more aid will be allowed into the besieged Strip. The war between Israel and Hamas began on 7 October 2023 after Hamas fighters killed nearly 1,200 Israelis and took about 250 hostages. Israel's response has seen over 67,000 Palestinians killed in Gaza.



MADAGASCAR ARMY UNIT TAKES CONTROL OF MILITARY, JOINS GENZ PROTESTS

Three and a half years since Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine, with a US-led peace process on ice and a stalemate on the battlefield, Kyiv's allies are calling for renewed economic pressure on Moscow. The aim: to raise the cost of war for the Kremlin to a level that forces it to change course.

Eighteen packages of European Union sanctions and dozens more from the United States, United Kingdom and others have weakened Russia's economy but not its resolve to carry on fighting.

What's needed, then, is not just more but smarter penalties, experts say.

"We just need to be cleverer," said Timothy Ash, a Russia researcher at the UK-based Chatham House think tank who has advised a number of governments on the impact of sanctions against Moscow.

CHINA WARNS US OF COUNTERMEASURES IF TRUMP DOESN'T WALK **BACK 100% TARIFF THREAT**

TRUMP'S NEW 100% TARIFFS ON CHINA TRIGGERED AN \$18 BILLION CRYPTO SELL-

Diary Times Desk: President Donald Trump's threat to impose an additional 100% tariff on imports from China sparked a massive cryptocurrency sell-off late Friday that exposed risky leverage in the space.

Digital currencies bitcoin, ether and solana were among the most affected cryptocurrencies, bringing total liquidations to \$18.28 billion as of 3:47 p.m. ET, according to data analysis platform CoinGlass. The losses for cryptocurrencies come amid a broad sell-off, as the Nasdag and S&P 500 on Friday saw their steepest declines in six months.

In the past 24 hours, roughly \$5 billion of bitcoin has been liquidated, along with about \$4 billion of ether and about \$2 billion of solana, according to CoinGlass.

It's the "largest liquidation event in crypto history," CoinGlass said in a post on X.

Bitcoin is down almost 10% in the last five days and was trading at \$111.616.20 as of 3:45 p.m. ET, a jump from when it dropped to \$103,000 at 5:15 p.m. ET on Friday.

Hours later, Trump said he'd hit China with an additional 100% tariff from Nov. 1 - threatening to push rates near what both sides warned earlier this year would represent an effective decoupling. He also announced plans for export controls on critical software.

SILVER (XAG) FORECAST: BULLISH PRICE PREDICTION AS PHYSICAL **SQUEEZE FUELS SILVER RALLY**



Diary Times Desk: Spot silver surged 2.2% to close at \$50.21 per ounce on Friday, buoyed by safehaven demand and strong fundamentals echoing gold's bullish run. The rally comes just a day after prices briefly touched a record \$51.22, with traders now watching the \$51.24 breakout level for a possible run to \$52.00 and beyond.

Silver has gained an impressive 70% year-to-date, driven by a combination of geopolitical risk, central bank accommodation, and tight physical market conditions. Silver is riding the same macro tailwinds lifting gold. Former President Trump's threat of massive new tariffs on Chinese imports roiled global markets and reignited safe-haven demand. SBI MUTUAL FUND TEMPORARILY SUSPENDS FRESH LUMPSUM INVESTMENTS IN SILVER ETF FOF AMID SUPPLY CONSTRAINTS



Diary Times Desk: SBI Mutual Fund has announced a temporary suspension of fresh lumpsum investments in its SBI Silver ETF Fund of Fund (FoF), effective October 13, 2025, in response to a sharp surge in silver demand and constrained physical supply.

In an official notice, the fund house cited global macroeconomic factors and growing investor interest in commodities as key reasons behind the recent spike in silver prices. However, the limited availability of physical silver has restricted the creation of new ETF units at indicative net asset value (iNAV), prompting a move to safeguard investor interests.

The SBI Silver ETF FoF is an open-ended fund-of-fund scheme that invests in the SBI Silver ETF, which in turn tracks domestic silver prices. "The premium in domestic silver prices directly impacts the valuation of the Scheme," the notice stated.

The suspension applies to all fresh subscriptions via lumpsum mode, including additional purchases and switch-ins. However, existing investments through Systematic Investment Plans (SIPs), Systematic Transfer Plans (STPs), redemptions, and switch-outs will continue as usual, in line with the Scheme Information Document.

AFTER ADVERSE REACTION REPORTS, **GOVT HOSPITALS TOLD NOT TO USE** 8 DRUGS

Diary Times Desk: Following reports of "adverse reaction", the Directorate of Health and Family Welfare has ordered to immediately discontinue in all government health facilities across the state the procurement and use of eight drugs manufactured by three firms.

The directions were issued on Friday. Punjab Health Minister Balbir Singh said the decision was taken following reports of adverse reaction of the drugs after being administered to patients at some government hospitals.

"We have also sent samples of these for further checks and strict action will be taken against firms if found on the wrong side. We cannot allow anyone to play with innocent lives," he said. The discontinued medicines include normal saline (sodium chloride injection IP 0.9%), dextrose injection IP 5% ciprofloxacin injections 200 mg, DNS 0.9%, NI2 + dextrose 5% IV fluid and bupivacaine HCL with dextrose injection.

'OP BLUESTAR WAS A MISTAKE. INDIRA GANDHI PAID WITH HER LIFE': CHIDAMBARAM

Diary Times Desk: Congress leader P Chidambaram said Operation Bluestar was not the right way to capture militants holed up in the Golden Temple in 1984, due to which the then Prime Minister, Indira Gandhi, "paid with her life".

ROHTAK SP TRANSFERRED AS HARYANA CM SAINI VOWS JUSTICE; IPS OFFICER'S KIN SLAM SHIFTING OF BODY

Diary Times Desk: Amid outrage over the suicide of Haryana IPS officer Y Puran Kumar, Rohtak SP Narendra Bijarniya was transferred on Saturday as Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini assured the family of justice. The officer's family has sought the arrest of Haryana DGP Shatrujeet Kapur and Bijarniya.

This came as a controversy erupted on Saturday morning over the shifting of the IPS officer's body from a hospital in Sector 16 here to the PGIMER mortuary for post-mortem "without the family's consent".

Kumar, a 2001-batch IPS officer, had allegedly shot himself at his Sector 11 residence here on Tuesday afternoon, leaving behind an eight-page "final note" accusing senior IPS and IAS officers of caste-based harassment and humiliation.

According to an official order issued on Saturday, IPS officer Surinder Singh Bhoria was appointed as the new Rohtak SP. It said the posting order of Bijarniya would be issued separately. Apart from this, the Chandigarh Police also added Section 3(2) (V) of the SC/ST Act as its first step in the investigation headed by IGP Pushpendra Kumar after an SIT was formed on Friday. It was one of the demands in the complaint forwarded to the UT SSP on Friday morning by IPS officer's wife Amneet P Kumar regarding the amendments required in the FIR.

Diary Times Desk: Senior Congress leader and former Haryana minister Capt Ajay Singh Yadav on Sunday demanded a high court-monitored inquiry into the suicide of senior IPS officer Y Puran Kumar.

He also called for full acceptance of the demands made by the officer's family and strict action to curb rising atrocities against the Dalit community.

Speaking to the media, Yadav said, "The suicide of a senior Dalit IPS officer has exposed serious cracks in the state's administrative framework. If the government fails to deliver justice in such a highprofile case, it sets a dangerous precedent for ordinary citizens and honest officers."

Calling the incident deeply disturbing, Yadav said it has shaken the conscience of the state and raised serious questions about the integrity of governance and the safety of upright officers across the country.

STRINGENT SC/ST ACT SECTION INVOKED IN HARYANA IGP SUICIDE CASE

Diary Times Desk: The Chandigarh Police on Saturday invoked Section 3(2)(v) of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act in the case registered in connection with senior IPS officer Y Puran Kumar's death by suicide, marking the first major step in the ongoing probe. The move followed a complaint by the deceased's wife, IAS officer Amneet P Kumar, to the SSP on Friday morning, demanding the inclusion of stringent provisions of the SC/ST Act to the case to ensure accountability.

Yesterday, a six-member Special Investigation Team (SIT) was constituted under Inspector General of Police (IGP) Pushpendra Kumar to investigate the case. The SIT formation followed a detailed meeting between Resident Commissioner, Haryana Bhawan, New Delhi, IAS D. Suresh and the late officer's brother Vikram Kumar with UT DGP Sagar Preet Hooda on Friday afternoon. The team will conduct a "time-bound and impartial" inquiry into the circumstances that led to the senior officer's death.

'My brother was murdered by greed': Inside Brazil's methanol poisoning crisis

When Marcelo Lombardi, 45, complained he was feeling sleepy on a Friday, his family didn't think much of it.

Lombardi often put in long hours running his family's 17-year-old real estate business in São Paulo, Brazil, working alongside two of his older sisters. A well-known attorney, he was a beloved figure in Sacomã, the southeastern neighborhood where he had lived for more than 35 years.

Fernanda Lombardi, one of his sisters, recalled their life being "perfect" until that day, September 26. "Earlier in the week, he came home with some groceries, which included a bottle of vodka," she told CNN. "It was his favorite liquor.

The family later learned from health officials that the sips of the vodka cocktail he had casually enjoyed at home days before were laced with an invisible killer - industrial methanol. The colorless liquid is now responsible for an ongoing health crisis that has triggered a nationwide panic affecting about 100 million people across six states in Brazil, according to health authorities.

Methanol is a clear, odorless, highly flammable liquid found in antifreeze, varnish and fuel. Ingesting just a few milliliters can cause blindness or death

Federal authorities are investigating several fronts to determine how industrial methanol entered Brazil's consumer alcohol supply. In Brazil, methanol commerce is regulated by the government, restricted to industrial uses such as biodiesel production, solvents, and laboratory applications. Its sale is legal but strictly controlled and every transaction must be registered.

One main line of investigation is that methanol, cheaper than ethanol, may have been intentionally used by counterfeiters to cut liquor production costs. Federal police are examining whether the chemical used by clandestine factories was purchased from gas stations and later diverted to illicit alcohol production. At least one gas station in São Paulo has been identified as a common supplier in several cases



Investigators are also probing whether smuggled or diverted industrial methanol entered Brazil's black market and if it has been used for bottle washing or sterilization underground distilleries, contaminating drinks later sold

Federal investigators have uncovered a massive black-market supply chain flooding bars, venues and homes with counterfeit liquor. So far, authorities have seized hundreds of thousands of fake labels, more than 100,000 of them just in the city of São Paulo.

COLLECTING GUIDE: KEY THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT PRINTS AND MULTIPLES

Diary Times Desk: What is a print?

A print is any work of art made in multiple iterations, created through a transfer process. There are many different types of prints, and the process is constantly evolving, but the four best-known techniques are etching, lithography, screenprint and woodcut.

Etching: Using an etching needle, an artist scratches an image onto a metal plate covered with wax. This plate is then submerged in acid, which eats into the metal exposed by the scratched lines. The longer the plate is left in the acid, the deeper and darker the line will be. The plate is cleaned, inked, and cleaned again, leaving only the incised lines filled with ink. Dampened paper and a protective cloth are placed over the plate, which is squeezed through an etching press — the pressure forcing the paper into the etched lines to pick up the ink. The image is printed in reverse, and an indentation, known as the 'plate mark', is left by the plate's edges.

Etching has often been used to achieve extremely delicate black and white images, from the Old Master period through to modern times. Rembrandt famously used this technique to achieve atmospheric effects, and Lucian Freud continued the tradition into the 21st century.

Lithography: The artist draws onto stone using a grease-based medium — normally special lithographic crayons, or greasy ink known as tusche. The stone is then treated with a chemical solution that ensures the image will attract printing ink, and that blank areas repel ink and attract water. A solvent 'fixes' the image, and the surface is dampened with water. Oil-based ink is then applied to the stone with a roller, adhering only to the image. Finally, the stone is placed on a lithographic press and covered with damp paper and board — a pressure bar ensuring force is evenly applied across the image. The image is printed in reverse, with separate stones used for complex images of multiple colours.

Lithography opened up printmaking to artists otherwise reluctant to learn the technical skills needed to create woodcuts or etchings, since many of the same tools, such as brushes and pencils, can be used. Lithography was first made famous by Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec in the 19th century, but has been embraced by many of the major artists of the Post-War period, including Pablo Picasso, Joan Miró, David Hockney and Jasper Johns.





COLLECTING GUIDE: ANCIENT GREEK HELMETS

Diary Times Desk: Helmets give you unique access to the past

Ancient Greek helmets are a source of fascination for the modern audience as they provide a glimpse into this ancient culture and how their warriors functioned. Primarily, helmets were physical protection, worn in battles beginning in the Archaic period, together with greaves, breast-plates, back-plates and shields in many cases.

Helmets were also often symbols of status, with more ornate examples worn by an elite group. 'Many buyers are looking to understand the ancient world through physical objects,' says Hannah Solomon, Head of Department, Ancient Art & Antiquities, at Christie's in New York. Ancient helmets are just one example from which to do so.

There are many types of helmets to look out for

The Illyrian helmet, one of two helmets to appear in the early 7th century BC, is the most common type. It is recognisable by its square face guard and pointed non-hinged cheek pieces, as well as the smooth dome featuring raised parallel ridges to which a crest made from horsehair, wood or leather would be pinned in place by a rivet at the crown.

The Corinthian helmet is the other 7th century helmet, with its characteristic almond-shaped eyes and rounded nose guard. I think that the eyes are especially beautiful,' says Solomon. It's an immediately recognisable shape: the domed head, the slightly flaring neck guard, the elongated eye openings. Aesthetically, it's a beautiful form that has a lyrical nature.'

The Pilos helmet, a later variation that emerged during the Hellenistic period, is one of the most varied forms. Many examples are simple, featuring a conical dome with a recessed band along the lower edge, most likely mirroring a felt or animal-skin cap worn by herdsmen. It is a lighter helmet, with hinged cheek-pieces, and more versatile for the warrior, allowing for more flexibility in battle. Other Pilos helmets are some of the most ornate in the canon and feature modelled decorations and other adjuncts.

You can use them to track developments in society

Helmets also teach the modern viewer about ancient craftsmanship and technological advancement in bronzemaking. What began with one or two helmet prototypes evolved to encompass shapes and sizes designed for increased efficiency and functionality.
