HARYANA IPS OFFICER'S WIFE NAMED IN FIR BY INVESTIGATING COP'S WIDOW



Diary Times Desk: Her husband, Haryana IPS officer Y Puran Kumar, died by suicide last week. A week later, the officer's wife, Amneet Kumar, an IAS officer, faces a police case filed by the wife of a cop who was investigating an alleged corruption case against Y Puran Kumar

In his eight-page "final note," Y Puran Kumar had accused senior officers of "mental harassment" and "caste discrimination

Assistant Sub-Inspector (ASI) Sandeep Kumar, posted in Rohtak's cyber cell, who was investigating a corruption case against Puran Kumar, shot himself with his service revolver in a field in Rohtak

on Tuesday.

In his suicide note and a video message, ASI Sandeep Kumar that Puran Kumar of being a corrupt officer and alleged that Puran Kumar died by suicide because he feared an expose of his corrupt activities. Sandeep Kumar also made serious allegations against Y Puran Kumar's wife, Amneet Kumar (an IAS officer).

The Rohtak police officer's family had demanded that an FIR be registered based on the officer's suicide note and said they would not consent to the post-mortem unless a case was filed.

ASI Sandeep Kumar had played a role in the arrest of Head Constable Sushil Kumar, alleged to be an aide of Puran Kumar The FIR by Sandeep Kumar's wife, Santosh, has been filed against Amneet Kumar, her brother and Punjab AAP MLA Amit Rattan, and

Y Puran Kumar was cremated today following an autopsy at the PGIMER, with his wife expressing hope for an impartial probe into the matter so that "justice is served at the earliest."

Earlier, the Haryana government sent state Director General of Police Shatrujeet Kapur on leave and transferred Rohtak Superintendent of Police Narendra Bijarniya.

Amneet Kumar had filed an FIR against the two officers for abetment to suicide and under the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act in connection with the death of her husband.

ONLY 3 DISTRICTS NOW MOST AFFECTED BY NAXALISM: MHA

Diary Times Desk: The Ministry of Home Affairs on Wednesday said that the districts mos affected by Naxalism have been brought down to three from six.

Now, only Bijapur, Sukma and Narayanpur in Chhattisgarh are the most affected districts by

Left Wing Extremism (LWE), the ministry said in a statement that came as 88 members of CPI (Maoist) surrendered in Chhattisgarh and Maharashtra in yet another success for the anti-Naxal campaign.

"In a giant stride towards the Modi government's vision of building a Naxal-free Bharat, the number of districts most affected by Naxalism has been brought down to three from six," the ministry said.

In the category of LWE affected districts, the number has also been further brought down to just 11 from 18.

Only 11 districts are now Left Wing Extremism affected.

The Modi government is committed to completely eradicating the Naxal menace by the 31st of March 2026, the statement reiterated.

"Under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and quidance of Union Home Minister Amit Shah, the operational successes have surpassed all previous records this year wherein 312 LWE cadres have been eliminated, including CPI (Maoist) General Secretary and 08 other Polit Bureau/ Central Committee Members," the MHA said.
As many as 836 LWE cadres have been arrested and 1,639 have surrendered and joined the

ZUBEEN GARG'S FANS THROW STONES AS ACCUSED MOVED TO ANOTHER PRISON



broke out in Assam's Baksa district after the five people, who were arrested in connection with the death of singer Zubeen Garg in Singapore last month were shifted to a newly-constructed prison on Wednesday.

According to sources, the situation outside Baksa district jail at Mushalpur remained tense as Garg's fans threw stones and slippers and apparently attempted to storm the premises.

The fans, the sources added, are upset with the decision to send the accused to Baksa prison, a newly-constructed premise with no inmates and a lot of amenities. The state government is trying to protect the accused, they alleged.

North East India Festival (NEIF) chief organiser Shyamkanu Mahanta, Zubeen's manager Siddhartha Sharma, his cousin manager Siddhartha Sharma, his cousin and police officer Sandipan Garg and his personal security officers (PSOs) Nandeswar Bora and Prabin Baishya were remanded in judicial custody by the Kamrup Chief Judicial Magistrate on

Wednesday.
The court, expressing concern for their safety, also ruled that they should be sent to a jail where there were fewer prisoners. Accordingly, the authorities decided to shift all five accused to Baksa Jail at Mushalpur, which was inaugurated two months ago, and there are still no prisoners, an official said. Mahanta and Sharma were arrested on

October 1 in Delhi in connection with the singer's death in Singapore last month and were booked under various sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) for culpable homicide not amounting to murder, criminal conspiracy and causing death by negligence, with murder charge

'HE'S SITTING THERE, HOPING THEY'LL RETURN": MAN LOSES 3 GRANDCHILDREN IN **BUS FIRE**



Diary Times Desk: When a bus caught fire in Rajasthan's Jaisalmer on Tuesday, 21 people died and at least 15 were injured. But behind these numbers lie deeply personal tragedies, including a man who has lost three granddchildren while his son and daughter-in-law are critical, and a family that has lost its only breadwinner

The bus, which left from Jaisalmer with 57 passengers around 3.30 pm on Tuesday and was bound for Jodhpur, caught fire on the Jaisalmer-Jodhpur highway just half an hour later. The only door of the bus was jammed and many passengers could not escape

At a home in Bambaron Ki Dhani village, where the courtyard used to be filled with the laughter of young children, all that's left is gloom. Tears in his eyes, Sohrab Khan (73) sits on a chair in the house, staring out into nothingness. Khan's son, Pir Mohammed, had taken his wife, Imamat, and eight-year-old son Yunus to a hospital in Jaisalmer, 30 km away, for a medical check-up. Accompanying them were Yunus' siblings, Hasina (10) and Irfan (5), and Imamat's sister. The family was travelling in the ill-fated bus, which was just 10 km away from the village when it caught fire.

Khan said he got a call from Mohammad telling him the bus had caught fire and while he, Imamat, Yunus and Imamat's sister managed to get out, Hasina and Irfan were still inside. Mohammad told him Yunus had suffered burns, and he and Imamat were also badly injured and were being taken to Jodhpur Hospital. Khan didn't hear from Mohammad after that.

INDIA TOP COURT ALLOWS LESS-POLLUTING CRACKERS **EVEN AS DELHI AIR TURNS** TOXIC



Diary Times Desk: India's top court has allowed the sale and bursting of firecrackers believed to be less polluting during the upcoming Diwali festival, even as air quality dips to very poor levels in the capital Delhi.

Crackers have been banned in Delhi since 2020, as they significantly contribute to the air pollution crisis the city faces each year.

The so-called green crackers, which the court allowed on Wednesday, are designed emit 20-30% less pollutants traditional ones and generate minimal ash, their makers say.

But critics say that even though less harmful, they still release toxic substances into the air and adversely impact air quality.

The Supreme Court's decision came on a day when air quality in Delhi was 25-to-30 times worse than the safe levels recommended by

the World Health Organization. According to the Central Pollution Control Board's website, most parts of the city on Wednesday morning recorded PM2.5 levels -tiny particulate matter in the air - between 300 and 400.

These fine particles are extremely dangerous they can penetrate deep into the lungs and pose serious health risks. In some of the worst-hit areas, the levels crossed the 400-

TN HEAVY RAIN: ALERT FOR 12 DISTRICTS, FISHERMEN WARNED AGAINST VENTURING INTO SEA

Diary Times Desk: Widespread heavy rain continued to lash several parts of Tamil Nadu, including Chennai, on Wednesday, October 15, disrupting normal life and prompting weather officials to issue alerts for 12 districts across the state. The Regional Meteorological Centre (RMC), Chennai, has forecast heavy rainfall in the hilly and coastal regions, warning of thunderstorms accompanied by gusty winds in parts of the southern and western districts.

According to the latest forecast, districts, including Coimbatore, Nilgiris, Dindigul, Theni, Virudhunagar, Madurai, Sivaganga, Ramanathapuram, Thoothukudi, Tenkasi, Tirunelveli, and Kanyakumari, are likely to experience heavy to very heavy rainfall during the day.

TAMIL NADU GOVT TO INTRODUCE BILL BANNING HINDI HOARDINGS AND FILMS ACROSS STATE

Diary Times Desk: The Tamil Nadu government is set to introduce a bill to ban Hindi hoardings and Hindi-language films across the state. Chief Minister MK Stalin is expected to present the bill in the assembly today, marking the government's move to prohibit the use of Hindi in public displays and cinema. Tensions Between DMK And BJP Over Language Policy The move comes amid ongoing tensions between the DMK and the BJP, with the ruling party in Tamil Nadu accusing the BJP-led central government of attempting to impose Hindi through the National Education Policy (NEP) and the three-language formula, an allegation the Union government has consistently denied.

Meanwhile, All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (AIADMK) national spokesperson Kovai Sathyan on Wednesday criticised the Tamil Nadu government led by MK Stalin over claims of a Rs 15,000 crore investment by Foxconn, calling the ruling Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) a party that "survives only on lies."

"DMK is a party that survives only on lies. All their achievements are nothing but falsehoods. The Rs 15,000 crore Foxconn investment, as claimed by Industry Minister TRB Raja, has been refuted by Foxconn. It is shameful. M.K. Stalin and his minister should hang their heads in shame for misleading the people of Tamil Nadu," Sathyan said in a video.

NITISH KUMAR HAS HIS WAY, JDU LIST HAS 5 SEATS CHIRAG PASWAN WANTED

Diary Times Desk: A day after its ally BJP, the Nitish Kumar-led JDU has released its first list of 57 candidates for the upcoming Bihar election. Five ministers in the current government have retained their seats. Three strongmen, including Anant Kumar Singh, also feature in the JDU's first list. Four women candidates are on the first list.

The five ministers who made it to the first list are Rural Development Minister Shravan Kumar, who will contest from Nalanda, Water Resources Minister Vijay Kumar Chaudhary (Sarairanjan), Information and Public Relations Minister Maheshwar Hazari (Kalyanpur), Social Welfare Minister Madan Sahni (Bahadurpur) and Prohibition Minister Ratnesh Sada from Sonbarsa.

JDU and BJP are contesting 101 seats each in the election to the 243-member Bihar Assembly. The remaining seats are divided between Chirag Paswan's Lok Janshakti Party (Ram Vilas).

SC ISSUES NOTICES ON PLEA FOR LAWYER ACCESS DURING POLICE INTERROGATION



Diary Times Desk: The Supreme Court on Wednesday issued notices to the Centre, states, and Union Territories in a public interest litigation (PIL) seeking to make it a fundamental right for individuals to have their lawyer present during police or investigative agency interrogations, PTI reported.

The plea was filed by lawyer Shaffi Mather and was listed before a bench of Chief Justice BR Gavai and Justice K Vinod Chandran. Senior advocate Menaka Guruswamy, appearing for the petitioner, referred to the India: Annual Report on Torture 2019 by the National Campaign Against Torture, which highlights widespread instances of custodial torture and lack of accountability.

BENGALURU CITIZENS SAY WON'T PAY TAX OVER "POOR INFRA", DK SHIVAKUMAR RESPONDS



Diary Times Desk: Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar on Wednesday said the work of filling potholes in Bengaluru is "progressing swiftly", even as a group of citizens threatened to stop paying property tax amid a raging debate over the city's crumbling infrastructure.

In a post on X, Shivakumar wrote in Kannada: "Giving priority to smooth traffic in Bengaluru city, the work of asphalting roads at various places in the city and filling potholes is progressing swiftly."

The development came days after Biocon chief Kiran Mazumdar-Shaw reignited the debate over Bengaluru's infrastructure by sharing a visiting overseas executive's critical comments on the city's roads and garbage. Her remarks prompted Shivakumar, who is also the minister in charge of Bengaluru development, to say the city deserves collective effort, not constant criticism.

CENTRE CLEARS APPOINTMENT OF JUDICIAL OFFICER VINAI KUMAR DWIVEDI AS ALLAHABAD HC JUDGE

Diary Times Desk: The Union government on Wednesday notified the appointment of judicial officer Vinai Kumar Dwivedi as a judge of the Allahabad High Court.

Union Minister of State (I/C) for Law & Justice Arjun Ram Meghwal in a post on X said.

"In exercise of the power conferred by the Constitution of India, the President of India, after consultation with Chief Justice of India, is pleased to appoint Shri Vinai Kumar Dwivedi, Judicial Officer as a Judge of the Allahabad High Court. I convey my best wishes to him."

The development follows the Supreme Court Collegium's recommendation for Dwivedi's elevation on October 06.

DELHI'S AIR QUALITY REMAINS 'POOR' AS TEMPERATURE SETTLES BELOW NORMAL

Diary Times Desk: The air quality in the national capital was recorded in the 'poor category' for the second consecutive day on Wednesday morning, with an Air Quality Index (AQI) reading of 210.


An AQI reading of 201 was recorded on Tuesday.

The minimum temperature on Wednesday settled at 18.3 degrees Celsius, 1.3 notches below normal, according to the India Meteorological Department (IMD).

The maximum temperature is likely to settle around 33 degrees Celsius, with the weather department forecasting "mist haze" in morning hours and mainly clear sky later.

The relative humidity was 89 per cent at 8.30 am, the IMD said.

According to the Central Pollution Control Board, an AQI between zero and 50 is considered 'good', 51 to 100 'satisfactory', 101 to 200 'moderate', 201 to 300 'poor', 301 to 400 'very poor' and 401 to 500 'severe'.



KERALA MINISTER DIRECTS SCHOOL TO ALLOW MUSLIM GIRL IN HIJAB AMID ROW



Diary Times Desk: Kerala General Education Minister V Sivankutty on Tuesday directed a Christian-run private school in Kochi to allow a Muslim girl studying there to continue her education while wearing her religious headscarf.

He also sought a report from the school authorities for denying her religious rights earlier, which caused her mental distress. Authorities of St Rita's Public School, Palluruthy in Kochi, had declared a two-day holiday on Monday following an escalation of a dispute with the parents of the eighthstandard student over her wearing the 'hijab'.

In a statement on Tuesday, the minister instructed the school's principal and management to address the mental distress caused to the student and her parents in connection with the girl not being allowed to attend classes wearing a hijab (religious headscarf) to the institution.

CONTRACTS OF BULK LPG TANKERS WILL BE EXTENDED TILL MARCH 31: OIL FIRMS TO MADRAS HC

Diary Times Desk: Paving the way for ending the indefinite strike of bulk LPG tanker operators, the major oil marketing companies on Tuesday informed the Madras High Court that the existing contracts for the bulk LPG tanker operators will be extended up to March 31, 2026.

Agreeing with the offer, the tanker operators promised the court that they would not resort to further strikes in the future.

Additional Solicitor General (ASG) A R L Sundaresan made the submission on behalf of the oil companies on the extension of the tender before Justice M Dhandapani when the petitions filed by the Indian Oil Corporation Limited (IOCL), Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL) and other companies seeking to bar the operators from going ahead with the indefinite strike came up for hearing.

The IOCL has completed the tender process and will issue work orders from November 1.

BEHIND GADCHIROLI SURRENDER: WHY MAOIST COMMANDER BHUPATI, 60 CADRES LAID DOWN ARMS

Diary Times Desk: The surrender of the most-wanted Maoist commander, Mallojula Venugopal Rao alias Bhupati, along with over 60 of his associates, is being billed as a major success in anti-Maoist operations in Gadchiroli, Maharashtra. Bhupati, a firebrand member of the banned Communist Party of India (Maoist)'s Central Committee, is known by several other aliases, like Sonu, Sonu Dada, Venugopal, Abhay, Master, Vivek, and Venu. He carried multiple bounties, ranging from Rs 1 crore to 10 crore, across states like Odisha, Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, and Andhra Pradesh. Bhupati's surrender leaves the Maoist activities in the Gadchiroli belt almost decimated.

Who Is Bhupati?

Bhupati, 69, is considered one of the most influential leaders and senior strategists in the Maoist movement. He had been active in the banned outfit for 40 years, conducting operations in the "Red Corridor" of Chhattisgarh, Maharashtra, and Telangana.

DISAPPOINTED WITH FAMILY, 28-YEAR-LONG LEGAL BATTLE, LITIGANT ENDS LIFE BY JUMPING OFF PUNE COURT BUILDING

Diary Times Desk: Fed up with his relatives and a protracted legal battle over property, a 61-year-old man allegedly committed suicide by jumping off the District Court building here on Wednesday, police said.

The deceased was identified as Yashwant Jadhav, a resident of Wadki.

"Around 11.45 am, he jumped from the third floor of the new building of the Pune District & Sessions Court. He was rushed to hospital where he was declared dead," said an official of Shivajinagar police station.

As per the note found in his pocket, Jadhav's father sold a property in 1997 without his consent. Jadhav subsequently filed a suit against the buyer which was still going on.

MASSIVE JAM ON MUMBAI-AHMEDABAD HIGHWAY, 500 STUDENTS STUCK FOR 12 HOURS

Diary Times Desk: A massive traffic jam on the Mumbai-Ahmedabad National Highway in Maharashtra's Palghar district stranded more than 500 students and commuters for nearly 12 hours, officials said on Wednesday.

Twelve buses carrying students from Classes 5 to 10 of different schools, along with some college students from neighbouring Thane and Mumbai, were caught in the gridlock stretching for several kilometres near Vasai from around 5.30 pm on Tuesday till early Wednesday morning, they said.

The children, who were returning from a school picnic near Virar, had to remain without food or water for several hours.

Deputy Commissioner of Police (Traffic), Vasai, Poornima Chowgule-Shringi said the traffic jam was yet to be cleared. The massive congestion on Tuesday evening left vehicles barely inching forward for hours.



HOSTAGE FAMILIES CONFIRM IDENTITIES OF THREE OF FOUR BODIES HANDED OVER BY HAMAS

Israeli hostage families have confirmed the identities of three of four bodies handed over by Hamas in Gaza on Tuesday.

The bodies of Tamir Nimrodi, 20, Eitan Levy, 53, and Uriel Baruch, 35, were part of the latest return, the Hostages Families Forum said. The fourth body does not match any of the known hostages. Israel said.

So far seven hostages' bodies are confirmed to have been sent back from Gaza. Hamas has yet to return the other bodies as agreed under a ceasefire deal brokered by the US.

Frustrated by the slow return of bodies, Israel has threatened to further restrict humanitarian aid until the remains of all 28 hostages were returned. Hamas says it has had difficulty locating them.

UNTCC CHIEFS CONCLAVE: DELEGATES WITNESS NEW-AGE TECH DEMONSTRATION IN AGRA, VISIT TAJ MAHAL

Diary Times Desk: A group of delegates attending the United Nations Troop Contributing Countries' (UNTCC) Chiefs Conclave here travelled to Agra on Wednesday and witnessed an "integrated new-age technology demonstration" by the Indian Army, officials said. India is hosting the conclave from October 14-16, which is being attended by delegates from countries that contribute troops to the UN peacekeeping missions around the globe.

The UNTCC serves as a vital forum to address operational challenges, evolving threats, interoperability, inclusivity in decision-making and the role of technology and training in strengthening UN peacekeeping missions.

After deliberations in Delhi, the UNTCC chiefs travelled to Agra, where they "witnessed an integrated new-age technology demonstration and were shown an array of new generation equipment by the Indian Army", the defence ministry said in a statement.

The demonstration underscored India's emphasis on 'Atmanirbharata' (self-reliance) and its ability to field modern, innovative and cost-effective solutions to meet contemporary operational challenges in peacekeeping and beyond, it said.

PAK, AFGHANISTAN AGREE TO 48-HOUR CEASEFIRE AFTER DOZENS KILLED IN CLASHES



Diary Times Desk: Pakistan and Afghanistan agreed to a 48-hour ceasefire Wednesday evening after dozens of people were killed, and many more wounded, in violence along their shared border earlier in the day

The ceasefire came into effect 6 pm PKT or 6.30 pm IST

'Both sides will make sincere efforts, through dialogue, to find a positive solution to the complex yet resolvable issue', Islamabad said in a statement cited by Reuters.

Pakistan claimed Afghanistan asked for the ceasefire. Afghanistan has not yet commented, either on the ceasefire or Pak's claim on who asked for a temporary halt to the fighting.

INDIA FALLS 5 PLACES IN PASSPORT INDEX, THIS COUNTRY REMAINS NO. 1 IN WORLD

Diary Times Desk: India has fallen to the 85th rank in the 2025 Henley Passport Index, offering visa-free access to 57 countries. Last year, India's passport was ranked 80th on the list with visa-free travel to 62 destinations. Singapore continues to be the most powerful passport with visa-free access to 193 countries. South Korea is second on the list this year with 190 countries and Japan is third, allowing travel to 189 countries. Germany, Italy, Luxembourg, Spain and Switzerland share the fourth rank with visa-free access to 188 countries while Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Ireland and the Netherlands share the fifth rank, allowing travel without a visa to 187 countries. Hungary, New Zealand, Norway, Portugal and Sweden are at the sixth place with visa-free access to 186 countries. Australia, Czechia, Malta and Poland share the seventh rank with visa-free access to 185 countries.

HAMAS BRUTALLY EXECUTES 8 GAZANS IN PUBLIC AMID TRUMP'S 'DISARM' WARNING

Diary Times Desk: Hamas is reportedly carrying out mass public executions in Gaza as it desperately seeks to maintain control over the Palestinian enclave, even as US President Donald Trump has vowed to disarm the group. Videos of Hamas' barbaric reprisal have gone viral on social media as the group clashed with other armed Palestinian clans to retain control of the Gaza Strip after a US-brokered truce with Israel. The footage, apparently from Monday evening, showed the street execution of eight men, whom the armed group branded "collaborators and outlaws". In the graphic video, eight badly beaten men can be seen blindfolded and kneeling in the street before each is shot dead by gunmen wearing the green headbands associated with Hamas. Chants of 'Allahu Akbar' (God is greatest in Arabic) can be heard from the crowd surrounding the bodies.



PAKISTAN, IMF REACH PRELIMINARY DEAL TO RELEASE \$1.2 BILLION FROM BAILOUT PACKAGE

Diary Times Desk: Pakistan and the International Monetary Fund have reached a staff-level agreement for the release of \$1.2 billion from the bailout package approved last year.

The \$7 billion bailout approved by the IMF in July 2024 aimed to keep Pakistan from defaulting on its debt repayments. The agreement following several days of talks in Islamabad was reported by state media Wednesday and the IMF confirmed it in an overnight statement.

The IMF said Pakistan's economic program is helping entrench macroeconomic stability and rebuild market confidence.

The development comes weeks after Pakistan urged the IMF to consider concessions in light of devastating floods that killed more than 1,000 people and affected some 7 million in recent months.

BANGLADESH GARMENT FACTORY FIRE KILLS AT LEAST 16

Diary Times Desk: At least 16 people have died after a huge fire broke out at a garment factory in Bangladesh, with officials warning that the toll could rise.

Sixteen bodies have been recovered and would be handed to families after DNA testing, as they have been burnt beyond recognition, the fire service said.

Distraught relatives gathered outside the four-storey factory in Dhaka's Mirpur area on Tuesday in search of their loved ones still missing. The blaze, which broke out at the

factory around midday, was extinguished after three hours. But an adjacent chemical warehouse continued to burn, authorities said. Large fires are relatively common in densely populated Bangladesh, often due to lax safety standards and poor infrastructure. Hundreds of people have been killed in fires in recent

Up until 21:00 local time (15:00 GMT) on Tuesday, the fire at the chemical warehouse in Mirpur had not been completely doused, media reports said.

US, CHINA IMPOSE PORT FEES: IS A RETURN TO ALL-OUT TRADE WAR IMMINENT?

Diary Times Desk: China and the US have started charging additional port fees on shipping vessels as trade tensions between the world's two largest economies soared back, following China's rare earth export controls in response to new trade restrictions imposed by the Trump administration.

The port fees from both sides went into force on Tuesday and have caused fear among analysts, who say maritime trade has become a key battlefront between the two nations.

The new trade tensions erupted despite a pause in the tariff war, and come as Trump is expected to meet his Chinese counterpart Xi Jinping on the sidelines of the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) summit in South Korea at the end of this month.

China has accused the US of "double standards" after it threatened to impose a 100 percent tariff on Chinese goods following last week's rare earth curbs by Beijing.

TRUMP DEMANDS HAMAS DISARM AS GROUP MOVES TO ASSERT CONTROL WITH PUBLIC EXECUTION

Diary Times Desk: US President Donald Trump has threatened to disarm Hamas "violently" amid moves by the group to reassert control over the Gaza Strip, targeting what it called "collaborators". Speaking to reporters on Tuesday, Trump said if Hamas failed to disarm within "a reasonable period of time" then "we will disarm them". He did not say when he expects the group to surrender its weapons.

His comments came as footage circulated online showing a public execution and other displays of force by Hamas fighters in Gaza since the US-brokered ceasefire began last week.

The execution - which BBC Verify geolocated to a junction in central Gaza City - follows Hamas's pledge to crush "lawlessness" in the Strip.

Other verified clips have shown armed men wearing insignia identifying them as members of Hamas's internal security force on patrol and masked fighters firing on unarmed men.

Analysts told BBC Verify that the show of force is at least partially intended to counter armed clans which have increasingly challenged the group's hold on the Strip over the past two years.

Israel has previously said it has supplied weapons to other armed groups in the Strip. One Hamas internal security unit recently pledged to "eradicate gangs and militias" it accused of co-operating "with the enemy".

"MAKING HIM LOOK VERY BAD": TRUMP SLAMS PUTIN OVER UKRAINE WAR

Diary Times Desk: US President Donald Trump on Tuesday criticised Russian President Vladimir Putin over his ongoing war in Ukraine, saying it was "making him look very bad.""I don't know why he continues with this war," Trump said. "He should have won that war in one week." Trump made the remarks during a bilateral lunch with Argentine President Javier Milei at the White House. The meeting took place shortly after the US government announced a USD 20 billion financial package to support Argentina's economy. The comments came ahead of Trump's meeting with scheduled Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky at the White House on Friday, which is expected to focus on continued US support for Kyiv.

The meeting follows reports from October 13 that Trump was considering sending the US-made Tomahawk long-range cruise.



RAFAH CROSSING MAY OPEN THURSDAY FOR GAZANS TO CROSS INTO EGYPT: REPORT

Diary Times Desk: The Rafah border crossing between Egypt and the Gaza Strip is expected to reopen to allow people to cross on Thursday with an EU mission set to deploy there, two sources told

The sources did not specify what restrictions might be applied to those seeking to cross. The Israeli military and the office of the Israeli prime minister did not immediately respond to a request for comment.



US ICE DETAINS INDIAN-ORIGIN GREEN CARD HOLDER WITH BRAIN TUMOUR, DELAYS SURGERY

Diary Times Desk: Paramjit Singh, a 48-year-old Indian-origin Green Card holder, has been detained by U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) for over two months, after being stopped at Chicago's O'Hare International Airport. Singh, who has lived in the United States since 1994, is facing serious health issues, including a brain tumour and a heart condition. His family alleges that his medical needs are being ignored, with his scheduled brain tumour surgery delayed due to his detention.

Singh was taken into custody on July 30 after returning from a trip to India. He was held at the airport for five days before being moved to a detention center in Clay County, Indiana. ICE officials have cited two past criminal cases as the basis for his detention, but Singh's family argues that these charges are outdated or erroneous, according to BBC.

US-INDIA EXPERT ASHLEY TELLIS ARRESTED FOR RETAINING SECRET DOCUMENTS, LINKS TO CHINA

Diary Times Desk: A leading expert on US-India relations who has advised successive US administrations has been arrested and charged with unlawful retention of national defence information, including over a thousand pages of top secret and secret documents at his home, court documents showed.

Ashley Tellis, 64, who served on the National Security Council of former Republican President George W Bush and is listed in an FBI court affidavit as an unpaid adviser to the State Department and a Pentagon contractor, was arrested on the weekend and charged on Monday, the documents seen on Tuesday showed.

Tellis is also a senior fellow at the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, a Washington think tank.

A State Department official confirmed that Tellis was arrested on Saturday, but declined to comment further. A Pentagon official said it does not comment on ongoing litigation.



CHINA DRIVES MOUNTING CYBERATTACKS, DISINFORMATION AGAINST TAIWAN

Diary Times Desk: Average daily cyber intrusions aimed at Taiwan were reported by its National Security Bureau to have reached 2.8 million this year, with the 17% increase from 2024 attributed to aggressive China's more and cyberattacks online disinformation operations. according to The Record, a news site by cybersecurity firm Recorded Future. Influence operations involving state-contolled media and an online troll army spreading intelligence-generated artificial memes and videos, as well as other fabricated content targeted at the Taiwanese government advancing pro-China sentiment, have been leveraged by Beijing as part of a state-level cyber strategy that also entailed cyberespionage and data exfiltration, the NSB report revealed.

BITCOIN WORTH \$14BN SEIZED IN US-UK CRACKDOWN ON ALLEGED SCAMMERS

Diary Times Desk: The US government has seized more than \$14bn (£10.5bn) in bitcoin and charged the founder of a Cambodian business empire, the Prince Group, with allegedly masterminding a massive cryptocurrency scam, which involved forced labour camps.

UK and Cambodian national Chen Zhi was charged on Tuesday in New York for allegedly engaging in a wire-fraud conspiracy and money laundering scheme.

Mr Chen's businesses were also sanctioned by the US and the UK as part of a joint operation. The UK government says it has frozen assets owned by his network, including 19 properties in London one of which is worth nearly £100m (\$133m).

The BBC has contacted the Prince Group for comment.

US prosecutors said it was one the biggest financial takedowns in history and the largest ever seizure of bitcoin, with approximately 127,271 bitcoin being held by US government.

Mr Chen, who remains at large, is accused of being the mastermind behind a "sprawling cyber-fraud empire" operating under his multinational company, the Prince Group, said the US Department of Justice (DOJ).

BRITAIN ILL-PREPARED FOR EXTREME WEATHER THAT'S ALREADY OCCURRING: CLIMATE ADVISERS



Diary Times Desk: Britain must urgently prepare for global warming of at least 2 degrees Celsius above pre-industrial levels by 2050, its climate advisers said on Wednesday, warning the country is ill-prepared for extreme weather that is already occurring.

Britain this year experienced its warmest summer since records began, which impacted health, agriculture and infrastructure with droughts declared in several regions.

"It is clear we are not yet adapted for the changes in weather and climate that we are living with today, let alone those that are expected over coming decades," the Climate Change Committee (CCC) wrote in a letter to the government in response to a request for advice from an environment minister.

INDIA, BRAZIL REAFFIRM DEFENCE PARTNERSHIP, SEEK TO EXPAND COLLABORATION IN TRADE OF DEFENCE PRODUCTS

INSTAGRAM TO RESTRICT TEEN ACCOUNTS TO PG-13 CONTENT TO BOOST SAFETY

Diary Times Desk: Teenagers on Instagram will be restricted to seeing PG-13 content by default and will not be able to change their settings without a parent's permission, Meta announced on Tuesday.

This means kids using teen-specific accounts will see photos and videos on Instagram that are similar to what they would see in a PG-13 movie—no sex, drugs or dangerous stunts, among others.

"This includes hiding or not recommending posts with strong language, certain risky stunts, and additional content that could encourage potentially harmful behaviours, such as posts showing marijuana paraphernalia," Meta said in a blog post on Tuesday, calling the update the most significant since it introduced teen accounts last year.

NEPAL HOLDS CANDLELIGHT VIGIL FOR BIPIN JOSHI, STUDENT KILLED IN HAMAS CUSTODY

Diary Times Desk: Nepal on Wednesday evening held a candlelight vigil for Bipin Joshi, a student who was killed while in Hamas custody after being abducted in October 2023.

Dozens of youths gathered at the Maitighar Mandala in Kathmandu to pay tribute to Joshi, who had been in Israel under the "Learn and Earn" scheme and was abducted by the militant group on October 7, 2023.

"It is for Bipin Joshi. He actually lost his life two years back, but we came to know it recently following the formal announcement. For two years, we lived with the hope that Bipin Joshi would return. Though he won't be here physically, he will always be remembered," said Rakshya Bam, a participant in the candlelight vigil, speaking to ANI. Israeli authorities confirmed Joshi's death on October 14 following the handover of the remains of those who died in Hamas captivity.

On Tuesday, Nepali Foreign Secretary Amrit Bahadur Rai held a telephonic conversation with Eden Bar Tal, Director General of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Israel. Bar Tal formally informed the Nepali side about the sad demise of Bipin Joshi, expressing condolences on behalf of the Israeli government to his family, the Government of Nepal, and the Nepali people.

CHATGPT UPDATE WILL ALLOW 'EROTICA' FOR VERIFIED ADULT USERS

Diary Times Desk: An upcoming version of popular chatbot ChatGPT will relax existina restrictions to allow more content, including erotica, for verified adult users, according to OpenAl chief Sam Altman.

Altman said in a post on X published Tuesday that the move is part of a drive to "treat adult users like adults."

An update coming in a few weeks will let people choose to make the bot "respond in a very human-like way," before a further easing in restrictions planned for December allows verified users to generate erotica using the chatbot, Altman said.

WITH SOCIAL SECURITY'S COLA ON THE LINE, THE TRUMP **ADMINISTRATION PLANS TO RELEASE INFLATION DATA DELAYED BY THE SHUTDOWN**

Diary Times Desk: The Bureau of Labor Statistics is calling some staff back to work to prepare its closely watched inflation gauge, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) report, despite the government shutdown, a Trump administration official told CNN.

The CPI report, postponed from October 15 to October 24 due to the shutdown, will be released just in time to meet the deadline for adjusting Social Security payments for next year.

"This release allows the Social Security Administration to meet statutory deadlines to ensure accurate and timely payment of benefits," the BLS said in a statement on its website Friday, adding that no will other releases he rescheduled or produced until the government reopens.

Social Security Administration confirmed it will release the 2026 cost of living adjustment, known as the COLA, on October 24. However, a Trump official told CNN that without September's CPI data. the annual increase to Social Security benefits, which takes effect in January, could be impacted. (Social Security benefits continue to be distributed during shutdown.)

JOURNALISTS TURN IN PRESS PASSES AS PENTAGON CLAMPS DOWN ON ACCESS IN 'UNPRECEDENTED' MOVE

Diary Times Desk: A flyer with the words "journalism is not a crime" appeared Tuesday on the wall outside the "Correspondents' Corridor" where journalists operate at the Pentagon.

It was a silent protest of Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth's new policy that severely restricts press

The policy criminalizes routine reporting, according to media lawyers and advocates, so news outlets are refusing to abide by it. Instead, they are giving up their access to the building, while vowing to continue thoroughly covering Hegseth and the military from outside the Pentagon's five walls.

CANADA'S ECONOMY IS IN SERIOUS TROUBLE. **NOW MARK CARNEY IS COMING TO WASHINGTON TO TALK TARIFFS**

Diary Times Desk: The status quo is not going to cut it for Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney at his Tuesday meeting with President Donald Trump in Washington. With unemployment rate of 7.1%, the highest level in nine years and half a percentage point higher since the start of this year, Canada's economy is faltering. Steep tariffs Trump slapped on cars, steel and aluminum - key Canadian exports to the United States - are making matters worse.And Carney's meeting is happening just as Trump is prepared to deal another blow to the Canadian economy: tariffs on softwood and lumber, among the top goods the United States imports from its northern neighbors.

"It makes a difference to have face-to-face time with Trump," said Inu Manak, a senior fellow for international trade at the Council on Foreign Relations. The pressure is on Carney to leverage it.

WORRIED ABOUT YOUR JOB? HERE'S HOW TO PLAN FOR A LAYOFF



Diary Times Desk: Federal workers' experiences this year with layoffs and furloughs may seem extreme. But to anyone who works for a living, they're a reminder that when you see signs that your job may be at risk, it helps to create a financial plan.

US government workers were laid off in droves during the first several months of the Trump administration, and hundreds of thousands were recently furloughed without pay due to the government shutdown. Last Friday, Russell Vought, head of the Office of Management and Budget, announced a new round of mass layoffs. And in a court filing that same day, the government indicated additional agencies are considering letting yet more people go.

Layoffs may be conducted differently elsewhere, but it's up to employees everywhere to learn how to protect their finances. How long you can support yourself between jobs depends on understanding your spending needs and the likely resources you'll have available should you ever be laid off.

HOW A DUTCH CHIPMAKER GOT CAUGHT UP IN THE US-CHINA TECH WAR



Diary Times Desk: The Dutch government has taken control of a Chinese-owned chip company based in the Netherlands following pressure from Washington, in a move that spotlights how countries are caught in the middle of the US-China battle for tech dominance.

Headquartered in the city of Nijmegen, Nexperia produces lower-end chips for consumer electronics, automobile and industrial applications, and runs chipmaking facilities in Germany and the UK.

The Dutch government said Sunday it had taken control of the company. Nexperia said its CEO and shareholder Zhang Xuezheng had been suspended from his post following a court order.

The move came after American officials told the Dutch government that Zhang would likely have to be replaced if the company was to be exempted from the US list of companies considered threats to national security or foreign policy interests, a court document published Tuesday revealed.

Companies on the so-called entity list face US export restrictions.

The rare move by Amsterdam came after escalating friction between the US and China, rekindled partly by Washington's ramping up of export controls in late September.

The US Commerce Department significantly expanded the entity list by making any subsidiary at least 50% owned by a firm already on the list face the same restrictions as the parent company. The new rule, which provided a grace period until November for some scenarios, implicated Nexperia as a 100% owned subsidiary of Wingtech, a partially state-owned Chinese company which has been on the list since late last year.

"The fact that the company's CEO is still the same Chinese owner is problematic," the minutes of the meeting said, as cited by the document. "It is almost certain that the CEO will have to be replaced to qualify for the exemption from the entity list."

Sukhu said that outdated medical equipment hampered the efficiency of doctors. He added that the state government was working to replace all obsolete machinery in hospitals and improve healthcare delivery in Himachal

Diary Times Desk: Amid high drama that continued for the second day, rejected Rajya Sabha candidate Navneet Chaturvedi was handed over to the Ropar police by UT cops here on Wednesday

He was arrested and taken to Ropar by a team led by SP GS Gosal and CIA in-charge Manphool Singh around 8.30 pm after having spent nearly two days in the Sector 3 police station as the "protectee of the Chandigarh Police".

Chaturvedi, who had filed his nomination papers for the Rajya Sabha byelection, is accused of having forged signatures of 10 AAP legislators to project them as his proposers for the October 24 contest. An FIR in this regard has been registered against him in Ropar on the complaint of AAP MLA Dinesh Chadha.

After both Chaturvedi and the state police moved the Punjab and Haryana High Court this morning and a notice was issued to all parties concerned for November 4, the Chandigarh Police did not hand over Chaturvedi to the Ropar police.

It is reliably learned that his lawyers are moving the court, seeking anticipatory bail and also demanding an investigation into the rejection of his nomination papers for Rajya Sabha. Among the senior officials present at the spot is SP of Ropar Police, G S Gosal. Chaturvedi had filed two sets of nomination papers for the Rajya Sabha bypoll, scheduled for October 24. In his first set of nomination papers, filed on October 6, he had named 10 AAP MLAs as his proposers. But these papers did not carry the signatures of any MLA. He submitted a second set of nomination papers on October 13, which carried the names of ten AAP MLAs as his proposers along with their signatures.

During the scrutiny of the nomination papers on Tuesday, Chaturvedi's nomination papers were rejected on the pretext that the signatures of all ten MLAs were forged.

EXPLOSIVES RECOVERED FROM A FIELD IN AJNALA'S TEDI VILLAGE **AHEAD OF DIWALI**

Diary Times Desk: In a major recovery ahead of the Diwali festival, the Amritsar Rural Police on Wednesday seized three hand grenades and an improvised explosive device (IED) from an agricultural field in Tedi village, under the Ajnala subdivision here.

According to police, the explosives - wrapped in a plastic bag — were concealed in the fields and came to light when a local farmer noticed dogs tearing at the bag. On approaching the spot, the farmer found hand grenades and other explosive materials and immediately informed the police.

A police team swiftly cordoned off the area and called the bomb disposal squad for safely neutralising the explosives.

Court rejects Israel's appeal after Indonesia refused to grant team's visas to artistic gymnastics world championships

he Court of Arbitration for Sport has rejected appeals by the Israel Gymnastics Federation to be allowed to compete at a world championships in Indonesia this weekend.

The CAS also turned down Israel's request to force the International Gymnastic Federation (FIG) to guarantee Israel's participation, or alternatively cancel or move the artistic worlds, set to start on Sunday in Jakarta.

The Indonesia government last week said it will not grant visas to Israeli gymnasts, and the Swissbased CAS said on Tuesday that FIG stated it has

Indonesia's visa policies.

reaction Indonesia's move, the FIG did not threaten to take the event away Indonesia stipulated in its statutes for cases where the host refuses to issue visas Israel wanted the FIG "taking note" of the statement government to be annulled, but CAS also rejected that on Tuesday.

Indonesia's decision to deny visas came after Israel's planned participation sparked intense opposition in the world's most populous Muslimmajority nation, which has long been a staunch supporter of Palestinians.

Israel is among 86 countries registered to compete at the worlds, with a team featuring 2021 Olympic gold medalist and defending world champion Artem Dolgopyat in the men's floor exercise.

Now its participation is in doubt, even though the Israel federation said in July that it had been assured by Indonesian officials that it would be welcome at the worlds. That would have gone against Indonesia's longstanding policy of refusing to host Israeli sports delegations for major events. The gymnastics spat is the latest example of how the global backlash against Israel over the humanitarian toll of the war in Gaza has spread into the arenas of sports and culture.

Dolgopyat said on Instagram: "We are so

disappointed for the gymnasts, male and female, and professional teams, but not only that, we are deeply concerned by the recent decisions that could negatively impact the future of all our delegations and the future of sport in general.

"We continue the fight, hoping to achieve justice but unfortunately we will no longer be able to compete in these World Championships.

Dolgopyat was one of six gymnasts - alongside Eyal Indig, Ron Pyatov, Lihie Raz, Yali Shoshani and Roni Shamay - who submitted the requests to Cas in conjunction with the IGF



Dolgopyat, 28, won Olympic floor gold at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics and silver in Paris last year. He is also a two-time European champion.

Prosecutors unsealed indictment Tuesday charging Chen Zhi. a Chinese émigré who holds several passports and built the Cambodia-based Prince Group, one of that country's largest conglomerates, charging with money laundering conspiracy wire frauc conspiracy.

Chen remains at large. In a related action, the Treasury Department sanctioned dozens of affiliates of the Prince Group and designated them as criminal

organizations.

crackdown investment scams known as "pig butchering," named for the practice of fattening up prey before the slaughter, have been on the rise costing Americans millions of dollars.

Prosecutors allege Chen turned the Prince Group into one of the largest transnational organizations in Asia

Authorities say Chen and others used the stolen money to buy vachts, private iets and a Picasso painting bought through a New York auction house

Authorities said they seized 127,271 bitcoin, which is in US custody, that is currently valued at approximately \$15 billion. Christopher Raia, the assistant director in charge of the FBI's New York field office told CNN it's one of the largest pig butchering schemes they've investigated. The scams are rampant, he said, and the FBI is focusing on the biggest cases to try to stop the harm.

"It's kind of like jaywalking," Raia said, adding authorities can't arrest their way out of the problem. The FBI is focusing on the biggest cases, he said, to "cut off the head of the snake."

Raia said the FBI was investigating a money laundering network in Brooklyn, New York, in 2022, which led them to the Prince Group's widespread

Not 'too beautiful' Chen and others allegedly operated at least 10 forced labor camps across Cambodia since 2015 to engage in cryptocurrency investment schemes. Authorities allege they laundered criminal

proceeds through the business and paid bribes to government officials to stay ahead of criminal investigations.

According to the indictment, forced labor camps, surrounded by high walls and barbed wire, were turned into phone farms, or automated call centers, to carry out the cryptocurrency scheme and others

Two facilities were staffed with 1,250 mobile phones that controlled 76,000 accounts on social media platforms, according to the

Authorities allege as part of the scheme people were contacted on messaging apps and social media, sometimes feigning to have the wrong number.

The workers were provided instructions on how to build rapport with future victims by "including a direction to use profile photos of women who were not 'too beautiful

TIQUI ATENCIO ON DISCOVERING HER TASTE AND LIVING WITH ART: 'YOU'RE NOT BORN WITH AN EYE, YOU MUST DEVELOP IT'

Diary Times Desk: 'Trust me,' says Tiqui Atencio, 'I was completely uninformed in those early days.' She throws up her hands in mock horror. For someone who is known for her discerning taste and has been described by the New York Times as 'a highly regarded collector', this is something of an admission. 'I really was ignorant,' she continues, laughing. 'Thankfully, I realised if I was going to do this, I was going to have to get educated.'

Sitting on a sea-green sofa in her beautiful home furnished with an elegant mix of mid-century modern design, Atencio is a warm presence. Her high blonde ponytail is immediately recognisable from her Instagram account. On the wall behind her is Bedtime Story (1999), a sensual pink and red painting by Cecily Brown. Atencio discovered the New York-based British artist long before her works hit the seven-figure mark. 'I should have found more!' she says.

There's something at once timeless and very current about Atencio. She was well ahead of the market on Latin American artists in the 1980s, and today she stands at the high connoisseurship level. She has an encyclopaedic knowledge of the new crop of art stars currently on the ascent, and is an active presence both online and at exhibitions and fairs around the globe. It's fair to say that Atencio lives and breathes art 24/7.

The Venezuelan-born collector is also the author of three books on the lives and living spaces of prominent figures in art and design — meaning that her appreciation of how to place an impressive Serge Mouille triple-armed standing lamp alongside a monolithic fly painting by Damien Hirst, so as not to take away from the artwork's appeal but rather to add to it, may be considered to be in the realms of behavioural science, or perhaps even a professional sport.

Throughout 2025, Atencio and her husband Ago Demirdjian have offered art and design in For Art's Sake: Selected Works by Tiqui Atencio & Ago Demirdjian, a series of sales held across New York and Paris. London's 20th/21st Century Art season in October will showcase post-war and contemporary works from the couple's collection in the 20th/21st Century: London Evening Sale, the Post-War and Contemporary Art Day Sale and Post-War and Contemporary Art Online.



ESTHER MAHLANGU ON PAINTING: 'FOR ME IT IS ABOUT WANTING TO CREATE CALM IN THE VIEWER'

Diary Times Desk: What was the first work you made that you were proud of?

Dr Esther Mahlangu: When I was a child, I used to watch the women of my village paint their homes, and I would want to join them. When they would go for a break, I would try to continue their work for them. When they returned, they would tell me to 'never do this again', and to practice on the back of the homes until I was good enough to paint on the front.

One day, my grandmother called my mother to see what her daughter had done, and when she saw the quality of my work on the back of the home, they invited me to join them in painting on the front. This is when I first knew that I was good at painting.

What advice did your mother and grandmother give you?

EM: I learnt the art of Ndebele design from my mother and grandmother. They taught me many things, not only about painting, but about the traditions and culture of our nation. Painting in a straight line is very important, as is the balance in our work. When a young man was considering taking on a bride, we would say that she is not marriage material because she can't paint a straight line. To master the feather that was used to paint and to keep my hand steady were among the first things I learnt.

Many people ask me if the colours or shapes within my paintings have any meanings, but for me it is more about wanting to create calm in the viewer, and this is created by the balance in the work — through mirroring colours and shapes on adjacent sides and corners of the painting.

How have you passed these traditions on to the next generation?

EM: I have spent my life travelling the world, collaborating with people, entities and global brands, helping to raise awareness and pride in Ndebele design among our tribe, our nation and the continent of Africa as a whole. I have also taught many children the art of Ndebele design, and our traditions and culture. Many of these were taught at the informal school that I have run from my homestead for many years. My art is part of the school curriculum, which also helps in passing this to the next generation.

You have made some huge murals, for instance in the Serpentine North Garden in Hyde Park. How do you work with the space for that kind of commission?

EM: I approach a large work in the same way as a smaller work. There are obviously some additional considerations on a very large work — such as scaffolding and security when painting up high — but the design principles remain the same.

When you look back, can you see how political events might have impacted your art?

EM: While Ndebele art does have some political undertones — as a form of resistance and identification of our nation during Apartheid — I don't really consider my artwork political. Some may say that it is, insofar as it disrupts the understanding of traditional vs contemporary art.
