BIHAR RESULTS: THE BIGGEST WINNERS AND LOSERS Diary Times Desk: The National Democratic Alliance (NDA) is on



course to secure one of its strongest mandates in two decades as the counting of votes cast in the Bihar Assembly elections continues. With the coalition crossing 200 seats in the 243member Assembly, the result marks a consolidation of support for Chief Minister Nitish Kumar and the BJP-led alliance eclipsing its own 2010 performance.

WINNEDS

Nitish Kumar

After 20 years in office, Chief Minister Nitish Kumar's Janata Dal (United) not only countered anti-incumbency but registered a clear gain, leading in more than 80 seats. The NDA's combined tally above 200 seats ensures Kumar a fifth term as Chief

The outcome halts Tejashwi Yadav's efforts to position himself as Bihar's next leader. The "youth versus experience" contrast that dominated the opposition's pitch did not translate into votes. 2. Chirag Paswan

Chirag Paswan has staged one of the most notable comebacks of this election. After winning only one seat in 2020 but securing nearly 6 per cent of the vote, his Lok Janshakti Party (Ram Vilas) translated support into 22 of the 29 seats it contested. The consolidation of the Paswan vote and Chirag's appeal among young voters and Dalit communities played a key role. 3. Asaduddin Owaisi and AIMIM

The Asaduddin Owaisi-led All India Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIMIM) registered a strong performance in the Seemanchal region

of Bihar.

Election Commission of India (ECI) data showed AIMIM winning four seats -- Jokihat (Araria), Kochadhaman (Kishanganj), Amour (Purnea) and Baisi (Purnea). Incidentally, Jokihat, Kochadhaman, Amour, and Baisi were also secured by the party in the 2020



FROM SINGLE LARGEST PARTY TO 2ND WORST PERFORMANCE: RJD'S BIG **BIHAR ROUT**



Diary Times Desk :As the counting of votes cast in the high-voltage Bihar election is coming to an end, the main opposition RJD's score is a sorry sight.
The Tejashwi Yadav-led party, which
contested 143 seats, has now won only 20 seats and is leading in five seats. If these numbers hold, it would be a massive setback for RJD, which finished as the single largest party in the 2020

Also, this would be the RJD's secondworst showing in a Bihar election. In the 2005 Assembly polls, when Nitish Kumar came to power in Bihar after a thumping NDA victory, the RJD had won 55 seats. At the time, Tejashwi Yadav's mother, Rabri Devi, was the Chief Minister, and RJD was facing mounting anti-incumbency in the hinterland state.

A resurgent Nitish Kumar had teamed up with the BJP and scored a thumping win, ending the RJD's rule in Bihar. The RJD's worst show came election in 2010, when RJD managed

vears and Nitish Kumar's multiple flip-flops later, the BJP and JDU are together again and are set for another big win. They have won 52 seats and are leading in 22 in the 243-member Assembly.

The figures show that Tejashwi Yadav has led his party to its worst rout.

The 36-year-old has taken charge of the party, founded by his father and veteran politician Lalu Yadav. Lalu Yadav founded RJD in 1997 and led the party to its best poll victories.

PRASHANT KISHOR'S IAN SURAAI PARTY IN **BIHAR 2025 LOOKS A LOT LIKE CPM IN** CONTEMPORARY BENGAL



Diary Times Desk : Prashant Kishor long seemed to master the art of winning friends and influencing people better than Dale Carnegie himself. But on November 14, 2025, he appeared less the astute political strategist and more like Bengal's CPM. Loud in social media presence, rich in planning mass movements, but unable to convert it into electoral success. It could be argued that Kishor was the strategist who helped propel Narendra Modi to the Prime Minister's chair. He later joined forces with Rahul Gandhi—failing to return the Congress to power, but working on a campaign that sought to sharpen its national message. Rahul has since emerged as a leader who walks long distances, quite literally, to highlight the country's pressing issues. He worked with Jagan Mohan Reddy, who was already battling corruption charges, yet Jagan marched to a landslide. Then came Mamata Banerjee and Abhishek Banerjee, who were burdened by incumbency, corruption allegations, and a rising BJP. They turned to him for rescue. The TMC swept 2021, and today Abhishek Banerjee, once under agency scrutiny, seems more politically acceptable than other TMC leaders.

The man who professionalised long marches, revolutionised political vocabulary, and mainstreamed data-driven campaigning decided in 2024 that he no longer wanted to be the power behind the throne. Diary Times Desk: Following is the list of the major winners and losers of BJP, JD(U) and RJD in the Bihar Assembly election.

Samrat Choudhary won Tarapur seat by a margin of 45,843 seats, defeating RJD's Arun Kumar. Choudhary polled 1,22,480 votes.
Vijay Sinha won the Lakhisarai seat by a margin of 24,940 votes, defeating Congress' Amaresh Kumar. Sinha polled 1,22,408 votes.

Maithili Thakur, first-time entrant, won Alinagar seat by a margin of 11,730 votes, defeating RJD's Binod Mishra. Thakur polled 84,915 votes.

PRASHANT KISHOR'S JAN SURAAJ PARTY FAILS TO OPEN ACCOUNT IN BIHAR, MOST NOMINEES LOSE DEPOSIT

Diary Times Desk : Former poll strategist Prashant Kishor's Jan Suraaj Party (JSP), dubbed the 'X factor' in the Bihar election, failed to open its account in the 243-member assembly, despite contesting in 238 seats.

According to the Election Commission, most of the JSP candidates have secured less than 10 per cent of the total votes polled and have their deposit forfeited.

So far, the party's best performance came from Naveen Kumar Singh, alias Abhay Singh, who secured the second spot from the Marhaura constituency. Jitendra Kumar Rai of the RJD won the seat by a margin of 27,928 votes.

GUJARAT ATS NABS MAN WANTED IN PUNJAB FOR GRENADE, ARMS SMUGGLING FOR PAKISTAN-LINKED GANG

Diary Times Desk: The Gujarat Anti-Terrorist Squad (ATS) has apprehended a man wanted by Punjab Police for his alleged involvement in smuggling arms for a gang working at the behest of Pakistan-based terrorist networks to carry out grenade attacks in the country, an official said on Friday.

An ATS release said Gurpreet Singh aka Gopi Billa was nabbed from Halol town in Panchmahal district based on a specific input shared by the Punjab Police.

"He will be handed over to Punjab Police. Recently, police in Punjab's Gurdaspur district registered a case against certain individuals for smuggling and detonating grenades and helping terrorist networks operating across the border," the release said.

"Preliminary probe revealed the main accused of the case, Manu Agwan and Maninder Billa, who are currently in Malaysia, were recruiting operatives in Punjab at the behest of handlers of Pakistan's ISI to carry out grenade attacks in densely populated areas of Punjab and other states to spread terror," the release added.

THAILAND RELAXES AFTERNOON ALCOHOL RULES AFTER TOURISM INDUSTRY PUSHBACK

Travelling to Thailand soon? Visitors should be aware that the country's strict rules on afternoon drinking are being reconsidered, offering welcome news for those who enjoy a leisurely drink while exploring. Under recent changes to the Alcoholic Beverage Control Act, anyone caught drinking alcohol between 2 pm and 5 pm could face fines of up to 10,000 baht (more than Rs 27K). The regulation also targeted the advertising of alcoholic drinks (particularly using celebrities, influencers, or other promotional tactics) and placed the burden of compliance squarely on consumers, rather than just businesses.

ICELAND ON BRINK OF DISASTER AS OCEAN CURRENT COLLAPSE TRIGGERS ICE AGE THREAT

Diary Times Desk: Iceland is facing an existential threat as climate scientists warn of the rapid weakening of the Atlantic Meridional Overturning Circulation (AMOC). This vital ocean current helps moderate temperatures and weather patterns across Northern Europe, including Iceland. If the AMOC collapses, it could trigger a new ice age and disrupt global climate systems. Iceland's government is already preparing for this dire scenario, but the implications stretch far beyond its borders.

The AMOC: The Ocean Conveyor Under Threat
The Atlantic Meridional Overturning Circulation
(AMOC) is a crucial component of Earth's
climate system, acting as a massive ocean
conveyor that transports warm water from the
tropics to the North Atlantic. This current plays a
significant role in regulating the climate of the
Northern Hemisphere, keeping places like
Iceland and the UK warmer than they would
otherwise be. If the AMOC were to collapse, it
could cause significant cooling in Northern
Europe, potentially leading to conditions similar
to a modern-day ice age.

The potential collapse of this current is becoming increasingly likely due to the rise in global temperatures, which causes the Arctic and Greenland ice sheets to melt at an accelerated pace. This influx of fresh, cold water into the ocean is disrupting the delicate balance that drives the AMOC, weakening the current's flow.

US DESIGNATES FOUR GROUPS IN GERMANY, ITALY AND GREECE AS FOREIGN TERRORIST ORGANIZATIONS

Diary Times Desk: The Unites States is designating German-based Antifa Ost and three other groups in Italy and Greece as specially designated global terrorists, the U.S. Department of State said in a statement on Thursday.

The State Department intends to designate all four groups, which include the Informal Anarchist Federation/International Revolutionary Front, Armed Proletarian Justice and Revolutionary Class Self-Defense, as foreign terrorist organizations, it said.

RESEARCHERS SAY THEY VERIFIED AND SEQUENCED HITLER'S DNA. WHAT THEY DISCOVERED IS A CONTROVERSIAL BOMBSHELL

Diary Times Desk: Researchers have analyzed a sample of DNA believed to belong to Adolf Hitler, which they say reveals the dictator of Nazi Germany had a genetic marker for a rare disorder that can delay puberty, according to a new documentary.

The research, which took more than four years to complete, was led by geneticist Turi King, a professor at the UK's University of Bath who is known for identifying the remains of King Richard III. King said she verified that a piece of material taken from a couch in the bunker where Hitler shot himself in 1945 was soaked in the dictator's blood by comparing a DNA sample recovered from the blood with a confirmed relative of Hitler's.

In addition to suggesting the possibility that Hitler had a hormone-disrupting congenital condition called Kallmann syndrome, the documentary examined rumors that the dictator had Jewish ancestry and looked at whether he had a genetic predisposition to certain mental health conditions. Called "Hitler's DNA: Blueprint of a Dictator," the documentary premieres Saturday on Channel 4 in the UK.

CHINA'S "NEW STUFF" BOMBSHELL: PLA TEASES WITH MYSTERY AIRCRAFT; FLAUNTS TROIKA OF STEALTH JET, UAV & EW FIGHTER

Diary Times Desk: China is bombarding "arch rival" the US with a tsunami of new defense systems, triggering a snowballing arms race that is overwhelming Washington and making it increasingly difficult to match Beijing's staggering pace of weapons innovation.

Hardly a week passes without Beijing revealing a new defense platform or showcasing new defense technology in areas as wide-ranging as aircraft carriers, tailless stealth fighter jets, long-range missiles, new age radars, and autonomous combat drones, from relatively small to extremely large.

The pace of China's unveiling of new defense platforms has been particularly striking since the Victory Day parade in September, and especially noticeable in the air combat arena.

In the last few months, China has unveiled two sixth-generation stealth fighters—the tailless Shenyang J-50 and the triple-engine, diamond-shaped Chengdu J-36—and their many iterations. It also flaunted multiple stealth drones, launched its stealth fighter jet, the J-35, from its latest aircraft carrier featuring electromagnetic catapults, the world's first twin-seat stealth fighter, the J-20S, the KJ-600 Airborne Early Warning and Control (AEW&C) Aircraft, and the Y-20 military transport aircraft.

CALIFORNIA REVOKES 17,000 COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSES FOR IMMIGRANTS

Diary Times Desk: California plans to revoke 17,000 commercial driver's licenses given to immigrants after discovering the expiration dates went past when the drivers were legally allowed to be in the US, state officials said Wednesday.

The announcement follows harsh criticism from the Trump administration about California and other states granting licenses to people in the country illegally. The issue was thrust into the public's consciousness in August, when a tractor-trailer driver not authorized to be in the US made an illegal U-turn and caused a crash in Florida that killed three people. Transportation Secretary Sean Duffy said Wednesday that California's action to revoke these licenses is an admission that the state acted improperly even though it previously defended its licensing standards. California launched its review of commercial driver's licenses it issued after Duffy raised concerns.

Diary Times Desk: A Russian Su-30 fighter aircraft crashed on a training flight in the northwestern region of Karelia, killing the two-member crew, news agencies quoted the Russian Defence Ministry as

The governor of Karelia region, Artur Parfenchikov, said on Telegram the aircraft crashed in a forest. There were no casualties on the ground.

Parfenchikov said an investigation into the cause of the crash was underway.

"Today, at around 7.00 pm Moscow time, a Su-30 fighter jet crashed in Karelia while performing a scheduled training flight. The aircraft crashed in an uninhabited area. The flight was performed without ammunition. The crew of the aircraft was killed," the Defence Ministry statement released by TASS said.

Officials in Russia's northwestern republic of Karelia dispatched emergency teams to the likely crash location, regional Governor Artur Parfenchikov said.

"I have received information about the crash of a military jet in the Prionezhsky district. I have dispatched Karelia's emergency services to the suspected crash site," he wrote on his Telegram channel.

He later confirmed that no one on the ground was injured and no property was damaged, as the aircraft came down in a dense forested area.

The crew of the Shenzhou-20 spaceflight had been due to finish their mission at China's Tiangong space station last Wednesday; they'd even handed the keys to the space station to a new crew who had just arrived for their own six-month mission.

But instead, their journey home was postponed "due to a suspected impact from tiny space debris" to their ship, according to state-run news agency Xinhua.

After a nine-day wait, they finally headed home on the Shenzhou-21 spacecraft that transported the incoming crew, according to the China Manned Space Agency (CMSA).



PAKISTAN MINISTER ADMITS ISLAMABAD FAILED TO BENEFIT FROM CHINA'S ECONOMIC CORRIDOR

Diary Times Desk: A Pakistani minister has admitted that Islamabad failed to benefit from the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) before political controversies under the previous Imran Khan government forced Chinese investors to flee. Speaking at a public event, Pakistan's Planning Minister Ahsan Iqbal noted that the South Asian nation's economy missed many opportunities to take off and "dropped the catch of the game changer CPEC."

Iqbal held former Prime Minister Imran . Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) responsible for damaging the reputation of Chinese investments, which, according to him, led investors to withdraw from the country despite Beijing's support in difficult times.

The \$60 billion CPEC project -connecting Xinjiang in China with Gwadar port in Pakistan's Balochistan -- was a central piece in Chinese President Xi Jinping's pet Belt and Road Initiative (BRI). It was envisioned to transform Pakistan's infrastructure and economy while furthering China's influence globally with Chinesefunded infrastructure projects.

G20 "TOO BIG TO FAIL": SOUTH AFRICAN ENVOY SAYS SUMMIT WILL SUCCEED DESPITE TRUMP **BOYCOTT**

Diary Times Desk: South Africa on Friday stated the G20 has become "too big to fail" and will deliver a successful summit despite the United States boycotting the leaders' meeting under President Donald Trump.Speaking to ANI, South African High Commissioner to India Anil Sooklal termed the US decision "unfortunate" but asserted that the forum no longer depends on any single nation.

"It will have an impact. PAKISTAN ARRESTS 4 FROM AN AFGHAN CELL OVER DEADLY ISLAMABAD **ROMRING**

The H-1B visa programme paves a pathway to American citizenship through the Green Card route. Companies can apply for permanent residency for their H-1B employees, who can apply for US citizenship five years after receiving their green cards.

If passed, Greene's bill will bode ill for Indian professionals, who are the biggest beneficiaries of the H-1B visa program, accounting for over 70 per cent of all approved applications in recent years.

TRUMP ADMINISTRATION HIRES 50,000 NEW FEDERAL EMPLOYEES, **FOCUS ON ICE AND SECURITY ROLES**

Diary Times Desk: The U.S. government has hired 50,000 employees since President Donald Trump took office, his top personnel official said, with the new staff largely in national security positions reflecting the administration's policy focus

The bulk of the new hires, reported first by Reuters, work at Immigration and Customs Enforcement, said Scott Kupor, the federal government's human resources director, in an interview on Thursday night.

The staff changes are part of Trump's campaign to recast the government while sharply cutting other federal jobs.

"It's about reshaping the workforce to focus on the priorities that we think are most important," Kupor said.

The administration brought on the new employees while freezing hiring and laying off workers in other parts of the government, such as the Internal Revenue Service and the Department of Health and Human Services.

The administration expects to shed about 300,000 workers this year, Kupor said in August.

Trump's administration dismissed employees charged with enforcing civil rights laws, collecting tax revenue and overseeing clean energy projects.

INDIAN-ORIGIN DOCTOR SAYS "COMPLETELY FORGOT" DEATHS LINKED TO HIS SURGERIES



Diary Times Desk: Nearly two decades after the Bundaberg scandal, Indian-origin surgeon Jayant Patel has brushed aside the events that once made him one of Australia's most infamous medical figures.

Confronted in the United States by a reporter for The Australian, his first public comment since 2015, the 75-year-old responded with a striking level of detachment.

"It was ages ago, and I completely forgot about it, and I'm beyond that," he told the journalist in Portland, Oregon. He added, "That's done, that's history ... I don't react to stupid criticisms, I'm (moved) on with my life. I'm fine." Patel was once at the centre of an explosive medical and legal storm. Staff at Bundaberg Base Hospital in Queensland, where he worked from 2003 to 2005, accused him of botched surgeries, misdiagnoses, and dangerously careless methods.

RUSSIAN DRONE SLAMS INTO BLOCK OF FLATS IN DEADLY WAVE OF STRIKES ACROSS KYIV

Diary Times Desk: A Russian drone has slammed into a block of flats in eastern Kyiv, killing six people and wounding dozens of others, during a wave of strikes throughout the Ukrainian capital.

As emergency workers sifted through the wreckage in the Lisovyi area, one Kyiv resident called Vita described how the drone had pierced the building, exploding on the other side.

Meanwhile, Ukraine stepped up its attacks on Russia's oil infrastructure, with drone strikes on one of its biggest export terminals in Novorossiysk, on the Black Sea coast.

Fire broke out at the Sheskharis oil refinery, and a ship and a block of flats were hit, officials said.

Krasnodar governor Veniamin Kondratyev said three crew members and another man were hurt in the attack which damaged the main oil depot and a container terminal.

BBC APOLOGISES TO TRUMP OVER PANORAMA EDIT BUT REFUSES TO PAY COMPENSATION

Diary Times Desk: The BBC has apologised to US President Donald Trump for a Panorama episode that spliced parts of his 6 January 2021 speech together, but rejected his demands for compensation.

The corporation said the edit had given "the mistaken impression that President Trump had made a direct call for violent action" and said it would not show the 2024 programme again.

Lawyers for Trump have threatened to sue the BBC for \$1bn (£759m) in damages unless the corporation issues a retraction, apologises and compensates him.

Culture Secretary Lisa Nandy told BBC Breakfast she was confident the corporation was "gripping this with the seriousness that it demands", adding her role was to ensure "the highest standards are upheld".

IRAN'S REVOLUTIONARY GUARDS DRAGS MARSHALL ISLANDS TANKER INTO ITS WATERS, TRIGGERS FRESH STANDOFF IN STRAIT OF HORMUZ



Diary Times Desk: Iran has opened another front at sea.

On Friday, Iranian forces seized a Marshall Islands-flagged tanker in the Strait of Hormuz and pulled it into their territorial waters, setting off alarms across military and shipping circles already stretched by months of regional conflict.

A US defence official confirmed the seizure of the Talara, saying Iranian forces "turned the ship into Iranian territorial waters."

The Talara was moving from Ajman to Singapore when Iranian boats closed in. Data analysed by the Associated Press showed a US Navy MQ-4C Triton drone circling overhead "for hours," watching the seizure unfold in real time.

Private security firm Ambrey said the assault involved "three small boats approaching the Talara." UKMTO called it possible "state activity," confirming the vessel was forced off its route and into Iranian waters.

The tanker's manager, Columbia Shipmanagement, said the crew stopped responding without warning.

ISRAEL RETURNS BODIES OF 15 PALESTINIANS: GAZA HEALTH OFFICIALS

Diary Times Desk: Israel returned the bodies of 15 Palestinians to Gaza on Friday, officials at Nasser hospital in Khan Younis said, in the latest step to fulfil the terms of the fragile US-brokered ceasefire agreement.

The bodies were returned after Hamas late Thursday handed over the body of one of the last four remaining Israeli hostages taken during the Oct. 7, 2023, attack that launched the war in Gaza.

Israel identified the returned body as that of Meny Godard, who was abducted from Kibbutz Be'eri in southern Israel. His wife, Ayelet, was killed during the attack.

The armed wings of Hamas and the Palestinian Islamic Jihad said Godard's body was recovered in southern Gaza.

The bodies of 25 hostages have been returned to Israel since the ceasefire between Israel and Hamas began on Oct. 10. There are still three more in Gaza that need to be recovered and handed over. Hamas returned 20 living hostages to Israel on Oct. 13.

PAKISTAN SUPREME COURT CALLS MEETING OF ALL JUDGES AFTER PARLIAMENT PASSES CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

Diary Times Desk: Pakistan's top court called a meeting of all judges on Friday, after parliament passed a constitutional amendment this week that curbed its remit, prompting two judges to quit, saying the reform "stands as a grave assault on the constitution". Under the amendment, which the political Opposition says has undermined democracy, Supreme Court will no longer hear constitutional cases. The changes also expand the powers of the country's and extend his term.

In theory, the remaining Supreme Court judges can suspend the new law, but lawyers said that was unlikely. Before this week, the court had 24 judges.

Pakistan's government has waged a sweeping crackdown on dissent and its main Opposition, which has included jailing former prime minister Imran Khan for over two years

Rights groups say the crackdown has been led by the powerful military and have routinely looked to the courts to safeguard democracy. The military has repeatedly denied interfering in politics. The administration of Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif said the changes would improve governance and reward the army chief for the military's performance in the conflict with India in May.

ANALYSIS: BBC SIGNALS IT WILL FIGHT, NOT FOLD **UNDER TRUMP'S POLITICAL PRESSURE**

Diary Times Desk: At least half a dozen major media companies have stared down legal threats from President Trump this year. Some have chosen to fight, others have opted to fold. The BBC is signaling that it will fight.

On Thursday, the British national broadcaster responded to a demand letter from Trump's lawyers by apologizing for an editing error but arguing that the president doesn't have a serious case

The public response indicated that if Trump goes ahead and sues, the BBC will vigorously defend itself, rather than immediately seek to settle the matter out of court.

BBC APOLOGIZES TO TRUMP OVER EDITING BLUNDER, REJECTS DEFAMATION CLAIM

Diary Times Desk: The BBC apologized to US President Donald Trump on Thursday over a documentary that Trump's lawyers described as false and defamatory, seeking to defuse a row that has plunged the public broadcaster into its worst crisis in years.

A BBC spokesperson said that lawyers for the broadcaster had written to Trump's legal team in response to a letter received on Sunday.

"BBC chair Samir Shah has separately sent a personal letter to the White House making clear to President (Donald) Trump that he and the corporation are sorry for the edit of the president's speech on 6 January 2021, which featured in the program," the spokesperson said.

The spokesperson said the BBC has no plans to rebroadcast the documentary on any BBC platforms while rejecting that it was defamatory.

Rebuffing Trump's demands for compensation, the broadcaster said that "while the BBC sincerely regrets the manner in which the video clip was edited, we strongly disagree there is a basis for a defamation claim."



THE AFFORDABILITY CRISIS IS FORCING TRUMP TO RADICALLY RESHAPE HIS ECONOMIC PLAN ON THE FLY

Diary Times Desk: President Donald Trump swept into office with a bold plan to remake America's economy. But the realities of a persistent affordability crisis, low favorability ratings and biting election losses for his Republican party are forcing him to remake his plan on the fly.

Although still in the early stages, Trump's Plan B appears to be a spaghetti-on-the-wall strategy that includes \$2,000 tariff rebate checks, 50-year and portable mortgages and lower tariffs on common grocery items.

Each tactic comes with significant question marks - and some are so radical economists fear they could squeeze Americans' finances even more.

Trump's Plan A

The original Trump economic plan was based on three bold assumptions:

America could bring in hundreds of billions of dollars - perhaps even trillions - through tariffs that would fill the country's coffers without causing inflation to rise.



INVEST IN CRYPTO? HERE'S WHAT TO KNOW ABOUT YOUR 2025 TAXES

Diary Times Desk: When it comes to voluntarily paying taxes on time to the IRS, crypto investors may not have a great record. At least, not according to an IRS review from 2023, which showed "the potential for" a mere 25% compliance rate.

Translation: Only about a quarter of crypto investors are likely voluntarily complying with their tax obligations.

But that low rate is likely to rise, because 2025 is the first year that investors with accounts on centralized crypto exchanges are subject to third-party reporting.

If you sold or exchanged crypto this year and conducted those transactions on a centralized exchange such as Coinbase, the exchange is now required to report your sales and exchanges to the IRS on Form 1099-DA (Digital Assets). You'll get a copy too, and it should be sent to you by January 30, 2026 in time for you to file your 2025 tax return.

To be clear, that reporting does not create any new tax obligations for you. But it will make it easier for the IRS to know if you're shirking them.

But there is something in it for you, too.

THE TRUMP ADMINISTRATION IS LOWERING ITS MEGA TARIFFS ON SWITZERLAND

Diary Times Desk:

The Trump administration plans to lower the United States' tariffs on goods from Switzerland, the Swiss government announced Friday following a meeting with Trade Representative US Jamieson Greer.

The tariff rate the US charges on Swiss imports will fall to 15% from 39%, among the highest levies the United States charges for any country's goods. More details on the agreement are set to be released later Friday.

"They're going to send a lot of manufacturing here to United States - pharmaceuticals, gold smelting, railway equipment," Greer said in a CNBC interview on Friday, previewing details of the agreement.

But it soon got a boost from the Covid-19 pandemic. And now, the company wants to build on that momentum by investing in artificial intelligence. This year alone, eBay has introduced five new AI features, including AIbacked shipping estimates and a shopping chatbot, as well as a partnership with ChatGPTmaker OpenAl.



The transition comes amid a tumultuous time for retailers, as tariffs and sinking consumer sentiment has roiled the industry's bottom lines.

Yet Walmart under McMillon has overcome many of the issues that have plagued competitors - its supplychain dominance and grocery prowess has allowed Walmart to offer rock-bottom prices on necessities, attracting customers across a wide range of income groups.

The company reported in its most recent earnings call that its fastest-growing customer segment includes households who earn more than \$100,000 a year.

WHY MARKETS ARE SUDDENLY ON EDGE



Diary Times Desk: For months, it felt like nothing could knock stocks off their steady ascent — but November has been a rough month on Wall Street.

The tech-heavy Nasdaq Composite is down almost 4% this month and on track for its first losing month since March. The Nasdaq has shed roughly \$2 trillion in market value in two weeks as investors have dumped tech

Stocks were lower Friday but bounced off their lows as investors bought the dip: The Nasdaq was down 0.15% after briefly falling more than 1.6%. The S&P 500 fell 0.3%. The Dow was down 390 points, or 0.82%. Wall Street's fear gauge, the VIX, jumped 10%.

The benchmark S&P 500 is down almost 2% this month while the Dow is down 1.2%. The S&P 500 has shed more than \$1.3 trillion in market value in just over two weeks as it has retreated from a record high set in late October.

After months of gains, investors have outsized expectations, making them easer to disappoint. Tech stocks have become relatively pricey.

And after the government shutdown halted official data releases for weeks, investors are unsure what the new figures, as government releases resume, will show about the state of the world's biggest economy. That, in turn, is stoking uncertainty about whether the Federal Reserve will continue to cut interest rates in December, and adding to the Wall Street jitters.

"When the government was shut down, we could believe whatever we wanted to believe," Ed Yardeni, president of Yardeni Research, told CNN's Matt Egan. "Now we need to be data dependent, and that may not be as much fun."

Enthusiasm about artificial intelligence carried the market to new record highs this year. But now some investors are hitting pause, taking profits and reassessing whether those stocks will continue to produce superior returns.

A total of 15 candidates were vying for the MLA's post. The counting of votes for the Tarn Taran bypoll, which began at 8 am here today, was completed in 16 rounds. The counting centre was set up at the International College of Nursing, Piddi.

In the polling on Tuesday, a voter turnout of 60.95 per cent had been recorded. The Assembly seat had fallen vacant after the death of AAP MLA Kashmir Singh Sohal in June.

Instead of adhering to the spirit and intent of the Act, their good judgment has seemingly been clouded over by lack of rationality and proper application of mind."

The court directed that a copy of its order be sent to the Additional Chief Secretary, Women and Child Welfare Department, Haryana, for "appropriate action against the officials concerned of the Child Welfare Committee for failing to show the sensitivity required in the present matter.

Diary Times Desk: Taking cognizance of allegations that a complainant in a criminal intimidation and rioting with a deadly weapon case received threatening calls from a landline installed inside Gurugram District Jail, the Punjab and Haryana High Court has ordered a probe into the matter.

Justice Surya Partap Singh asserted that it was alleged during the hearing of a bail petition by the counsel for the complainant that he had been receiving threatening calls from the landline number installed on the District Jail premises, and screenshots showing eight calls were also placed on record. "If the allegations are true, it is a very serious matter, which requires a thorough probe. Hence, it is hereby ordered that a copy of this order be forwarded to the Director-General of Police (Prisons) with a direction to have the matter investigated by a senior, responsible officer, and take appropriate action against the erring officers/officials," the Bench asserted.



Diary Times Desk: The Hisar court's rejection of bail to Radhey Shyam, CMD of Future Maker Life Care Pvt. Ltd., has exposed the scale of a massive multi-level marketing (MLM) scam that collected over Rs 3,000 crore from lakhs of investors across India between 2015 and 2018

Chief Judicial Magistrate (CJM) Rajeev, while dismissing the bail plea of Radhey Shyam and his co-accused Bansi Lal Sihag on November 10, observed: "The accused, who have cheated persons in lakhs and earned money more than Rs 3,000 crore and who, despite a penalty order against them, have not paid the ordered service tax of approximately Rs 55 crore, are not entitled for the concession of bail. The bail of such accused and in such matters will shake the confidence of the public at large in the law of the nation."

The court ordered both accused to remain in judicial custody till November 24, 2025.

The image, taken in May by photographer Millie Pilkington, shows Charles in the gardens of Sandringham Estate in Norfolk, with the sprawling stately home behind him.

Other photos, seemingly taken at the same time, show him wandering Sandringham's gardens and tending to a maple sapling. They were published in the magazine Country Life on Wednesday to mark Charles' restoration of the historic gardens

On Friday, the King and Queen Camilla traveled to a reception at Cyfarthfa Castle, about 25 miles (40 kilometers) north of capital, Cardiff, where he cut into an enormous birthday cake shaped like the castle.

One showed a baby Charles with his mother Queen Elizabeth in 1949, and another showed him aged two with his grandfather King George VI. The Gazette. the UK's official public record, posted an image of the original announcement of Charles's birth in 1948. "Yesterday evening at fourteen minutes after nine o'clock Her Royal Highness The Princess Elizabeth, Duchess of Edinburgh, was safely delivered of a Prince at Buckingham Palace," it read.

At 77, King Charles is now among Britain's oldest ever monarchs despite the fact he has only been on the throne for just over three years. The longest-lived was Queen Elizabeth who died aged 96, and before that the record was held by Queen Victoria who was 81 when she

Delays Return To Earth

CHINESE ASTRONAUTS ARRIVE HOME AFTER SUSPECTED DEBRIS STRIKE

hree Chinese astronauts landed back on Earth on Friday more than a week later than their scheduled arrival. capping an extended stay in space after a suspected debris strike left their spaceship with a cracked window.

The crew of the Shenzhou-20 spaceflight had been due to finish their mission at China's Tiangong space station last Wednesday; they'd even handed the keys to the space station to a new crew who had just arrived for their own sixmonth mission.

But instead, their journey home was postponed "due to a suspected impact from tiny space debris" to their ship, according to state-run news agency Xinhua.

After a nine-day wait, they finally headed home on the Shenzhou-21 spacecraft transported the incoming crew, according China Space Agency (CMSA).



teams that the astronauts were in good physical condition. Chinese state media outlet CCTV reported

The damaged Shenzhou-20 ship had "a slight crack" in the window of its return capsule, likely caused by debris impact, making it unsafe for the crew to return in, according to the CMSA. The ship will stay in orbit to carry out experiments instead, the agency said. During their extra week in space, the crew continued working and living alongside the newly arrived Shenzhou-21 astronauts, as the space station has enough capacity to support two crews in orbit, according to Xinhua.

The Tiangong station is only one of two operating space stations, alongside the International Space Station.

Since it was completed in 2022, the biannual launches of China's Shenzhou program have been a source of national pride

Recent advances have seen China break an American-held record for the longest spacewalk, with a ninehour sortie, and it's about to open the doors of the Tiangong to foreigners for the first time, with plans to welcome an astronaut from Pakistan next year.

The Shenzhou-22, due to launch sometime next year, will include one astronaut who stays more than year for a "long-duration residency experiment." Xinhua reported.

China's rapid development in space exploration has raised alarm bells in Washington, which is racing to put an astronaut on the moon again. The Trump administration placed bans on Chinese citizens with US visas participating in NASA

The US space agency is familiar with the difficulties of retrieving astronauts who have been left in limbo. NASA astronaut Frank Rubio, for example, spent 371 days on the ISS - a US record - after a tiny piece of space debris struck his Russian Sovuz spacecraft and forced a monthslong extension to

California Licenses That Remained Valid

CALIFORNIA REVOKES 17,000 COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSES FOR IMMIGRANTS



Under the new rules, only 10,000 of the 200,000 noncitizens who have commercial licenses would qualify for them. which would only be available to drivers who have an H-2a, H-2b or E-2 visa.

alifornia plans to revoke 17,000 driver's licenses commercial immigrants discovering the expiration dates went past when the drivers were legally allowed to be in the US, state officials said Wednesday.

The announcement follows harsh from the Trump administration about California and other states granting licenses to people in the country illegally. The issue was thrust into the public's consciousness in August, when a tractor-trailer driver not authorized to be in the US made an illegal U-turn and caused a crash in Florida that killed three people.

Transportation Secretary Sean Duffy said Wednesday that California's action to revoke these licenses is an admission that the state acted improperly though it previously defended its licensing standards. California launched its review of commercial driver's licenses it after Duffy issued raised concerns.

"After weeks of claiming they did nothing wrong, Gavin Newsom and California have been caught red-handed. Now that we've exposed their lies, illegally issued trucking licenses are being revoked," Duffy said, referring to the state's governor.

"This is just the tip of iceberg. My team will continue to force California to prove they have removed every illegal immigrant from behind the wheel of semitrucks and school buses Newsom's office said that every one of the drivers whose license is being revoked had valid work authorizations from the federal government.

At first, his office declined to disclose the exact reason for revoking the licenses, saying only they violated state law. Later, his office revealed the state law it was referring to was one that requires the licenses expire on or before a person's legal status to be in the United State ends, as reported to the DMV. Still, Newsom's spokesperson

Brandon Richards shot back at Duffy in a statement. "Once again, the Sean 'Road Rules' Duffy fails to share the truth - spreading easily disproven falsehoods in a sad and desperate attempt to please his dear leader." Richards said. Fatal truck crashes in Texas and Alabama earlier this year also highlight guestions about these licenses. A fiery California crash that killed three people last month involved a truck driver in

Duffy revoked \$40 million in federal funding because he said California isn't enforcing English language requirements for truckers and he reiterated Wednesday that he will take another \$160 million from the state over these improperly issued licenses if they don't invalidate every illegal license and address all the concerns.

Diary Times Desk: A 12.68-carat diamond pendant necklace

Among the most legendary of all diamonds are those that come from the Golconda mines in modern-day Hyderabad. For two millennia, these mines were the world's only source of fine diamonds, channelled to the West via caravans on the Silk Road. Many historic diamonds came from there, including the Koh-i-Noor, the Nassak Diamond, the blue Hope Diamond, the pink Daria-i-Noor and the Dresden Green Diamond. But by the middle of the 19th century, the mines had been exhausted.

Often large and with high clarity — thanks to a formula of pure carbon with no nitrogen — Golconda diamonds are generally graded Type IIa, a rare designation of quality that accounts for less than two per cent of all natural diamonds in existence.

Although it can't be proven, the central diamond in this necklace possesses all the defining traits of a Golconda stone: it's classified Type IIa, with extraordinary clarity and purity. The pear-shaped gem was mounted in this gold and platinum pendant around 1910.



A Lacloche Frères Art Deco ruby, emerald, onyx and diamond bracelet

During the 1920s, as the Art Deco movement reverberated out from Paris across continental Europe, artists began to incorporate fashionable exotic motifs into the era's streamlined aesthetic, with chinoiserie and 'Japonisme' seeing a revival.

Made around 1925 — the year of the Exposition Internationale des Arts Décoratifs et Industriels Modernes in Paris, which gave us the term 'Art Deco' — this bracelet is decorated with scenes inspired by Japan. A sun sets between two mountains, its glowing colour reflected in rippling water; a red pagoda and bridge are surrounded by trees and flowering plants; and a sailing boat is greeted by a flock of birds.

The images are crafted from just three coloured gems: red rubies, green emeralds and black onyx. Set against a background of diamonds, the overall design resembles a tapestry draped around the wrist. This technique was pioneered by Lacloche Frères, one of the most acclaimed jewellers of the period.
