INDIA, AUSTRALIA PUSH DEEPER RESEARCH TIES IN AGRICULTURE, WATER SUSTAINABILITY



Diary Times Desk: India and Australia have agreed to intensify joint research and academic cooperation in agriculture and water sustainability. Senior officials said discussions this week centred on expanding collaborative science, boosting student and faculty exchanges, and accelerating technology transfer between the two countries.

The renewed push came during the three-day fifth anniversary celebrations of Australia-India Water Centre (AIWC), held from November 17 to 19 at Western Sydney University (WSU). The event brought together Indian and Australian scientists, research institutions and policy leaders for conferences, international symposiums and panel sessions on climate-resilient agriculture and emerging water challenges.

Consul General of India in Sydney, DrS Janakiraman, and DrM L Jat – Secretary of Department of Agricultural Research and

Education (DARE) and Director-General of Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) - attended the deliberations alongside their

A key outcome was the signing of an addendum to the existing ICAR-WSU work plan by DrJat and WSU Vice-Chancellor Prof G Williams, extending their institutional collaboration until 2029. Officials said the extension will enable long-term cooperation in areas such as sustainable water use, climate-smart farming systems, dual-degree programmes and capacity-building initiatives.

The anniversary meetings underscored the growing strategic relevance of AIWC, which has emerged as a platform for advancing applied research at a time when both India and Australia are grappling with climate-driven water stress and the need for resilient

SC STRIKES DOWN TRIBUNAL REFORMS ACT 2021 PROVISIONS FOR GOING AGAINST ITS JUDGMENTS

Diary Times Desk :Terming it "legislative overruling" of binding judgments without curing any defects, the Supreme Court on Wednesday struck down the Tribunal Reforms Act, 2021, provisions on appointment and tenure of members for violating judicial independence and going against its earlier judgments on these issues.

"Therefore, the provisions of the impugned Act cannot be sustained as they violate separation of powers and judicial independence principles. It amounts to legislative overwrite without curing any defects and the binding judgment. It falls foul. Thus, it's struck down as unconstitutional," a Bench of CJI BR Gavai and Justice K Vinod

The top court directed the Centre to constitute a National Tribunals Commission in

The Bench expressed displeasure over the Central government not following the top court's judgments on functioning of tribunals.

The Tribunals Reforms Act, 2021 -- which replaced the Tribunals Reforms (Rationalisation and Conditions of Service) Ordinance, 2021 -- abolished certain appellate tribunals, including the Film Certification Appellate Tribunal, and amended various terms related to the appointment and tenure of judicial and other members of various tribunals.

BSF FORMS JOINT TEAM WITH TECH INSTITUTES FOR DEVELOPING DRONE TECHNOLOGIES



Diary Times Desk: With the proliferation of drones heavily impacting the security environment, the Border Security Force (BSF) has formed a joint research group comprising of BSF officers and faculty and students of the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Delhi and the Rustumji Institute of Technology (RIT), Tekanpur, to develop fully customised indigenous drone technology in India.

A technical session in this regard comprising 20 senior professors and experts from IIT and RIT along with BSF officers was conducted at IIT's Sonepat Campus on November 18 to discuss various aspects of drone technology.

The topics included lightweight composite materials, propulsion systems, aerodynamics, low-temperature batteries, motors and control systems, sensing technologies and secure communication networks, according to a BSF spokesperson.

The session was chaired by Prof Ashwini Agarwal, Dean (Research and Development), at IIT. BSF Director-General Daljit Singh Chawdhary presided over the concluding session where the future roadmap of this collaboration was discussed.

A Memorandum of Understanding was signed between the BSF, IIT and RIT on November 10 for academic collaboration, research and technical innovation in different fields concerning the BSF, of which drone and counter-drone technology form an important part.

BENGALURU SHOCKER! MEN POSING AS GOVT OFFICIALS INTERCEPT CASH VAN, FLEE WITH RS 7 CR



Diary Times Desk : Unidentified men posing as Central Government officials fled with about Rs 7 crore on Wednesday, police said.

The incident occurred near Ashoka Pillar when the vehicle was transporting cash from a bank branch in JP Nagar.

Preliminary investigation revealed that a group of men arrived in a car carrying a Government of India sticker and stopped the cash vehicle, claiming that they wanted to verify documents.

The suspects then forced the van's staff into their car along with cash. They allegedly drove towards Dairy Circle where they dropped the staff and sped away with the cash which is estimated to be about Rs seven crores, a senior police officer said. CCTV footage is being examined to trace the route taken by the vehicle and identify those involved.

GANGSTER ANMOL BISHNOI ARRESTED AFTER US DEPORTATION, SENT TO 11-DAY NIA CUSTODY



Diary Times Desk: The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Wednesday arrested Anmol Bishnoi, brother and close aide of dreaded gangster Lawrence Bishnoi, following his deportation from the US to India.

A Delhi court on Wednesday sent Anmol Bishnoi, an accused in the murder of NCP leader Baba Siddique, to 11 days of NIA custody.

Special Judge Prashant Sharma sent Anmol to NIA custody on the agency's plea seeking 15-day custodial interrogation of the accused.

Speaking to reporters outside court, special public prosecutor Rahul Tyagi said the accused will be produced before the court again on November 29 after completion of his NIA custody.

INDIA LAUNCHES INDIGENOUS GENE THERAPY TO ERADICATE SICKLE CELL DISEASE

Diary Times Desk: Aligning with the aim of eradicating sickle cell disease which is largely prevalent among the tribal population, India on Wednesday launched the first indigenous CRISPR-based gene therapy.

The breakthrough was developed at CSIR-Institute of Genomics & Integrative Biology (IGIB). Sickle cell anaemia is an inherited blood disorder where red blood cells misshapen, leading to pain crises, anaemia and organ damage.

CRISPR (clustered regularly interspaced short palindromic repeats) is a gene-editing technology that allows scientists to modify DNA in sickle cell disease patients. Doctors collect blood from the patient and isolate the patients carrying the sickle cell mutation and stem cells are edited.

SAMRAT CHOUDHARY NAMED BJP LEGISLATURE PARTY LEADER IN BIHAR

Diary Times Desk: Tarapur MLA Samrat Choudhary was on Wednesday named the leader of BJP legislature party in Bihar during a meeting of newly elected legislators, UP Deputy CM Keshav Prasad Maurya said. The newly elected MLAs also chose Vijay Kumar Sinha as deputy leader of the BJP's legislature party, he said.

Maurya, who was present in the meeting, said, "Samrat Choudhary and Vijay Kumar Sinha were elected the leader and deputy leader of the BJP's legislature party, respectively."

Maurya was appointed the central observer for the election of the legislature party leader in Bihar

Union Law Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal and former union minister Sadhvi Niranjan Jyoti were also made co-observers for the election of the legislature party leader of the BJP. Both were also present at the meeting.

SAUDI BUS ACCIDENT: 38 FAMILY MEMBERS OF VICTIMS REACH JEDDAH, DNA PROFILING UNDER WAY

Diary Times Desk: As many as 38 family members of those who died in the tragic bus fire accident in Saudi Arabia arrived in Jeddah on Wednesday, state government sources said. At least 45 Indians, majority of them Umrah pilgrims from Hyderabad, were killed in Saudi Arabia's Medina after their bus collided with an oil tanker.

However, officials in New Delhi familiar with the development maintained that 42 people were killed in the accident.

The funeral is expected to take place on Friday, sources said.

"Thirty-eight people have reached Jeddah. DNA profiling is ongoing. Once it is done and after some official process of the Saudi Arabia Government, the funeral may take place on Friday," sources told PTI.



50 MAOISTS ARRESTED IN MAJOR CRACKDOWN IN ANDHRA PRADESH

Diary Times Desk: Fifty CPI (Maoist) cadres were arrested across five districts in Andhra Pradesh in a coordinated, intelligence-led operations, poliec said on Wednesday. Out of the 50 arrested, 45 were produced before the respective local court and remanded to judicial custody for 14 days.

The crackdown comes a day after the encounter in Alluri Seetharam Raju district on November 18, in which top Naxal commander M Hidma and five others were killed.

"Following Hidma's killing, we launched a coordinated intelligence-driven operations across five districts and apprehended 50 CPI (Maoist) cadres," said ADGP Intelligence Mahesh Chandra Laddha, addressing a press conference in Vijayawada.

Those arrested include special zonal committee members, divisional committee members, area committee members and regular cadres operating in the south Bastar–Dandakaranya region.

INDIA RECORDED EXTREME WEATHER ON 99 PER CENT OF DAYS FROM JANUARY TO SEPTEMBER

Diary Times Desk: India faced extreme weather events on 99 per cent of days in the first nine months of 2025, marked by heat and cold waves, lightning, storms, heavy rain floods and landslides

These events claimed 4,064 lives, affected 9.47 million hectares of crops, destroyed 99,533 houses, and killed about 58,982 animals, according to Centre for Science and Environment (CSE) and Down To Earth's Climate India 2025 report, an annual assessment of extreme weather events.

The report notes a sharp surge in the frequency and intensity of extreme weather events across India between January-September 2025 compared with the same period in the previous three years. By contrast, during the same period in 2024 such events occurred on 255 days, causing 3,238 deaths.

In 2025, at least 18 states/UTs recorded their highest number of extreme-weather days since 2022. Maharashtra was the worst-hit in terms of cropped area affected, with 8.4 million ha, followed by Punjab (0.26 million ha) and Uttar Pradesh (0.21 million ha).

WOMEN WITHOUT HEIRS SHOULD LEAVE WILLS TO AVOID LITIGATION: SUPREME COURT

Diary Times Desk: The Supreme Court on Wednesday made an appeal to all women without sons, daughters or husbands to make a Will to avoid potential litigation disputes between their parents and in-laws.

Referring to the Hindu Succession Act, 1956, the top court said Parliament at that time may have assumed that women would not have self-acquired property, but the progress of women in these decades cannot be underestimated.

"Education, employment and entrepreneurship of women in this country, including Hindu women, has led to their acquiring self-acquired property.

"If such self-acquired properties are to be succeeded only by the heirs of the husband if a female Hindu dies intestate in the absence of having sons, daughters and husband, possibly it may cause heartburn so far as the maternal family is concerned. We do not make any observation in this regard also," the apex court said.

A Bench of Justices B V Nagarathna and R Mahadevan suggested while disposing of a PIL filed by a woman advocate challenging Section 15(1) (b) of the Hindu Succession Act, 1956.

SUPREME COURT REFUSES TO GRANT QUOTA FOR PROMOTEE JUDGES IN HIGHER JUDICIAL SERVICE

Diary Times Desk: The Supreme Court on Wednesday refused to grant quota for promotee judges in Higher Judicial Service (HJS), observing that there is no "common malady" of disproportionate representation which afflicts the country.

The top court said that a "perceived discontentment" and "heartburn" cannot result in creating an artificial classification of members within a cadre

A five-judge Constitution bench headed by Chief Justice of India B R Gavai said fixation in the Selection Grade and Super Time Scale within the HJS is based on the merit-cumseniority within the cadre and cannot depend upon the length of service or performance in the lower rungs of the judiciary.

NITISH TO TAKE OATH AS BIHAR CM FOR RECORD 10TH TIME ON THURSDAY; PM MODI, SHAH TO ATTEND



Diary Times Desk: supremo Nitish Kumar is set to be sworn-in as Bihar chief minister for a record 10th time on Thursday, days after the NDA secured a landslide victory in the assembly elections.

Preparation for the swearing-in ceremony at Patna's historic Gandhi Maidan is in its final stage, with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Union Home Minister Amit Shah, and several top NDA leaders expected to attend.

UPCOMING AADHAAR APP TO FACILITATE PAPERLESS IDENTITY SHARING: UIDAI

Diary Times Desk: The new Aadhaar app under works will facilitate paperless identity sharing and option to verify and share complete or selective information linked to the unique identity, an official statement said on Wednesday.

The Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) has conducted an informative webinar on 'Offline Verification using the Aadhaar App' ahead of the formal launch of the new Aadhaar app which was attended by over 250 entities and individuals from various sectors, the statement said.

"Upcoming Aadhaar app to facilitate paperless identity sharing, option to verify and share complete or selective Aadhaar information, Aadhaar updates," the statement said.

The new app aims to encourage offline digital verification of Aadhaar holders and discourage use of physical and photocopies of Aadhaar card.

'SHOULD CIVILISED SOCIETY ALLOW THIS KIND OF PRACTICE?' SC QUESTIONS TALAQ-E-HASAN

Diary Times Desk: Eight years after declaring talaq-e-biddat (instant triple talaq) unconstitutional, the Supreme Court on Wednesday questioned the Islamic practice of talaq-e-hasan—another form of triple talaq in which a Muslim man can divorce his wife by pronouncing the word 'talaq' once a month for three consecutive months.

"What kind of thing is this? How are you promoting this in 2025? Whatever best religious practice we follow... Is this what you allow? Is this how the dignity of a woman can be upheld? Should a civilised society allow this kind of practice?" a Bench ked by CJI-designate Justice Surya Kant asked.

The Bench, which also included Justice Ujjal Bhuyan and Justice N Kotiswar Singh, hinted at referring petitions against talaq-e-hasan to a Constitution Bench.

VVPAT NOT MANDATORY FOR LOCAL BODY POLLS, TECHNICALLY NOT FEASIBLE: EC TO BOMBAY HC

Diary Times Desk: The Maharashtra State Election Commission on Wednesday told the Bombay High Court that the use of VVPAT machines was not mandatory for local body polls, and it was also not technically feasible.

The commission filed an affidavit opposing a petition filed by Congress leader Prafulla Gudadhe before the Nagpur Bench of the High Court, challenging its decision to not use VVPAT in the upcoming local body elections in Maharashtra.

Gudadhe in his plea said the Voter Verifiable Paper Audit Trail (VVPAT) system was essential for a transparent election process. During the hearing on Wednesday, a Bench headed by Justice Anil Kilor sought to know the reason for not using VVPAT machines especially when a Supreme Court judgment said the use of VVPAT was a must.



PM MODI TO ATTEND G20 SUMMIT IN SOUTH AFRICA'S JOHANNESBURG FROM NOVEMBER 21-23

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will be visiting Johannesburg from November 21 to 23 to attend the 20th G20 Leaders' Summit hosted by South Africa, the Ministry of External Affairs said on Wednesday.

This will be the fourth consecutive G20 Summit held in the Global South.

At the Summit, Prime Minister Modi will put forth India's perspectives on the G20 agenda. He is expected to speak in all three sessions of the Summit, it said.

"On the margins of the G20 Leaders' Summit, the prime minister is expected to hold bilateral meetings with some of the leaders present in Johannesburg. The prime minister will also be participating in the India-Brazil-South Africa (IBSA) Leaders' Meeting being hosted by South Africa," the MEA said.

TRUMP DISMISSES US INTELLIGENCE, DEFENDS SAUDI PRINCE OVER 2018 KILLING OF KHASHOGGI

Diary Times Desk: President Donald Trump on Tuesday dismissed US intelligence findings that Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman likely had some culpability in the 2018 killing of Washington Post journalist Jamal Khashoggi as Trump warmly welcomed the de facto ruler of Saudi Arabia on his first White House visit in seven years.

The US-Saudi relationship had, for a time, been sent into a tailspin by the operation targeting Khashogai, a fierce critic of the kingdom.

But seven years later, the dark clouds over the relationship have been cleared away. And Trump is tightening his embrace of the 40-year-old crown prince, who he said is an indispensable player in shaping the Middle East in the decades to come.

Trump in his defence of the crown prince derided Khashoggi as "extremely controversial" and said "a lot of people didn't like that gentleman." Prince Mohammed denies involvement in the killing of Khashoggi, who was a Saudi citizen and Virginia resident.

'COMMIE', 'INCOMPATIBLE WITH AMERICA': ZOHRAN MAMDANI BECOMES TOP TARGET OF RIGHT-WING MEDIA BEFORE TAKING OFFICE

Diary Times Desk : Zohran Mamdani has not yet assumed office as New York City's mayor, but conservative media outlets have already cast him as a political villain.

He has been described as "downright sinister" and "incompatible with America," tagged as a communist, Marxist, jihadist sympathiser and "seething leftist."

Fox News host Laura Ingraham warned viewers not to be deceived by "smiling socialists who rule like Soviet tyrants."

'INDIA SAVED MY MOTHER'S LIFE': SHEIKH HASINA'S SON REJECTS LEGITIMACY OF HER EXTRADITION

Diary Times Desk: The son of Bangladesh's ousted Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has launched a scathing attack on Dhaka's extradition request, dismissing the legal proceedings against his mother while warning India of a growing terrorism threat from across the border.

In an interview with ANI, Sajeeb Wazed Joy expressed profound gratitude to Prime Minister Narendra Modi for granting her asylum, claiming militants had been planning to assassinate her.

Wazed flatly rejected the legitimacy of Bangladesh's extradition request, alleging violation of judicial norms in the cases against his mother.

"They terminated 17 judges before the trial, amended laws illegally without parliamentary approval, and barred her defence attorneys from court proceedings," he told ANI. "When there is no due process whatsoever, no country is going to extradite."

He expressed confidence that Indian authorities would reject the request, citing the absence of proper legal procedures in Dhaka.

CHINA BLUNTS US NAVAL DOMINANCE WITH ITS THIRD AIRCRAFT CARRIER

Diary Times Desk: After Fujian was commissioned on November 5, China now operates a fleet of three aircraft carriers. This makes the People's Liberation Army Navy (PLAN) the world's second-largest operator of carriers.

Nonetheless, this figure still falls someway behind the eleven carriers operated by the USA.

The US Navy (USN) has dominated the Western Pacific since the end of World War II, but China's growing naval power has blunted that ascendancy. China once lagged badly in aircraft carrier technology, too, but that situation is changing.

In fact, the arrival of Fujian constitutes a step change in capability for the PLAN. What is also remarkable is the rapid speed of China's technological advancements.

Additionally, the PLAN operates a fleet of large flattops from which helicopters can take off and land. It has four such Type 075 vessels, compared to nine comparable vessels in the USN, and four in Japan's navy.



RUSSIAN BARRAGE KILLS 10 IN UKRAINE AS ZELENSKYY HEADS FOR TALKS WITH TURKISH LEADER

Diary Times Desk: A large Russian drone and missile barrage killed 10 people and injured dozens more in Ukraine overnight, officials said Wednesday, as Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy was due in Turkey for talks on finding a settlement that might end Russia's invasion of his country.

The nighttime attack hit two ninestory apartment blocks in Ternopil, a city in western Ukraine, according to Interior Minister Ihor Klymenko. Emergency crews were sifting through the rubble in daylight to find any survivors, he said. At least 37 people were reported injured, including 12 children.

Russia fired 476 strike and decoy drones, as well as 48 missiles of various types, at Ukrainian targets overnight, Ukraine's air force said.

"Every brazen attack against ordinary life indicates that the pressure on Russia (to stop the war) is insufficient," Zelenskyy wrote on the messaging app Telegram.

LOUVRE HEIST: MUSEUM TO SET UP NEW CAMERAS, ANTI-INTRUSION SYSTEMS

Diary Times Desk: The head of the Louvre Museum said on Wednesday that new surveillance cameras and anti-intrusion systems will soon be installed at the Paris landmark after last month's crown jewels heist.

The cameras — some 100 of them — will be up and running by the end of next year while anti-intrusion systems will start to be put in place within two weeks, Louvre director Laurence des Cars said.

She described the systems as equipment that will prevent intruders from getting close to the museum buildings but did not offer specifics. The new surveillance cameras will try to ensure "complete protection of the museum's surroundings," she said." After the shock, after the emotion, after the assessment, it's time for action" at the world's most visited museum, des Cars told the Committee of Cultural Affairs of the National Assembly.

She said it was all part of more than 20 emergency measures that will be implemented. The new measures also include the creation of a "security coordinator" position at the museum, and the job has been posted this month, she added.

PRIME MINISTER MODI TO ATTEND G20 SUMMIT IN JOHANNESBURG FROM **NOVEMBER 21 TO 23**



Diary Times Desk: Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit Johannesburg from November 21 to 23 to attend the 20th G20 Leaders' Summit hosted by South Africa, the Ministry of External Affairs said on Wednesday.

The meeting marks the fourth consecutive G20 Summit held in the Global South and highlights a continued shift toward developing country leadership on global economic and governance issues. At the Summit, the Prime Minister will present India's perspectives on the G20 agenda and is expected to speak in all three sessions.

The MEA said he will also hold bilateral meetings with several leaders on the margins of the gathering and participate in the India Brazil South Africa Leaders' Meeting being hosted by South Africa.

The first session titled "Inclusive and Sustainable Economic Growth Leaving No One Behind" will focus on strengthening global economic recovery, expanding trade opportunities, improving development financing and addressing the growing debt burden on vulnerable economies.

The second session titled "A Resilient World – the G20's Contribution" will take up disaster risk reduction, climate change, just energy transitions and food systems.

Trump said he knew nothing about that and said the focus should be on other people named in those emails, including former President Bill Clinton. After a journalist from Bloomberg News tried to ask a follow-up question on Epstein, the president turned to her and said: "Quiet. Quiet, piggy."

The exchange occurred as calls grew for the US Department of Justice to release files related to its investigation into Epstein, the late financier and convicted sex offender who died in prison in 2019.

The mission, at the direction of the president, was part of the White House effort to resuscitate peace talks, according to a separate source who is a US official.

CONGRESS VOTES TO SEND EPSTEIN FILES BILL TO TRUMP

Diary Times Desk: Both chambers of US Congress have agreed to order the US justice department to release its files on late sex offender Jeffrey Epstein.

The House of Representatives overwhelmingly approved the measure in a 427-1 vote. The Senate said it would pass the bill before it officially received it.

President Donald Trump must ultimately sign off the measure, which he has said he will do. He recently reversed his position and urged fellow Republicans to vote to disclose the records, following pushback from many of his supporters.

Earlier on Tuesday, survivors of Epstein spoke in support of the measure at the US Capitol. One of them said they had suffered "institutional betrayal" for years.

The "Epstein files" refer to the vast trove of documents that were amassed during criminal investigations into the financier, including transcripts of interviews with victims and witnesses, and items confiscated from raids of his various properties.



CHILDREN AMONG 25 KILLED IN ONE OF RUSSIA'S DEADLIEST STRIKES ON WESTERN UKRAINE

Diary Times Desk: At least 25 people have been killed including three children in a Russian missile and drone attack that hit two blocks of flats in the western city of Ternopil, Ukrainian officials say. They say another 73 people were wounded, 15 of them children, in the strike early on Wednesday - one of the deadliest in the region since Moscow launched its full-scale invasion in February 2022.Ukraine's air force later said Russian X-101 cruise missiles had hit the residential flats. The neighbouring Lviv and Ivano-Frankivsk regions were also struck, and a drone attack on three districts of the north-eastern city of Kharkiv wounded more than 30 people. Photos posted online showed buildings and cars ablaze. Ukraine's air force said it had shot down 442 of 476 drones and 41 of 48 missiles launched by Russia, including 10 missiles destroyed by F-16 and Mirage 2000 fighter jets supplied to Kyiv by its Western allies.

9/11 SURVIVORS FURIOUS OVER SAUDI CROWN PRINCE'S US VISIT. HOW HE RESPONDED

Diary Times Desk: Osama bin Laden used Saudi people for the 9/11 attacks to destroy US-Saudi relations, insisted Mohammed bin Salman at the White House, as the families of the victims pressed for accountability from the visiting Saudi Crown Prince. Saudi Arabia is doing its best not to let it happen again, he assured the Americans, with the survivors still furious over his presence at the Oval Office. Laden, a Saudi national, was the founder of the al-Qaeda terrorist group that carried out four coordinated attacks in the US on September 11, 2001, killing nearly 3,000 people. Salman was cornered by reporters over the 9/11 attacks and the 2018 killing of Saudi journalist Jamal Khashoggi when he and President Donald Trump addressed the media after unveiling a civilian nuclear deal and the sale of F-35 jets. He claimed that the 9/11 attacks were a ploy to harm the US-Saudi ties, and anyone who believes in that is helping to fulfill Laden's purpose.

8-MONTH PREGNANT INDIAN WOMAN, OUT ON WALK, KILLED IN BMW CRASH IN AUSTRALIA

Diary Times Desk: A 33-year-old pregnant Indian woman, who was weeks away from giving birth to her second child, has been killed in a horrific car crash in Australia's Sydney. Samanvitha Dhareshwar, who was eight months pregnant, was taking a walk with her husband and three-year-old son when the tragedy struck last week, according to police.

Police said that a Kia Carnival car had slowed to let Dhareshwar and her family cross the footpath along George St in Hornsby at about 8 pm on Friday, when a speeding BMW rear-ended it. The impact pushed the Kia car forward, hitting Dhareshwar as she crossed a car park entrance.

Police said Dhareshwar suffered catastrophic injuries in the accident and was immediately rushed to Westmead Hospital, but sadly, neither she nor her unborn child could be saved

The luxury BMW was reportedly being driven by Aaron Papazoglu, a 19-year-old P-plater (driver who has a provisional or probationary licence). Drivers of the BMW and Kia cars, however, escaped without injuries," police said.

It is not known if Dhareshwar's husband and her three-yearold child suffered any injuries in the crash.

According to her LinkedIn, Dhareshwar was a qualified IT systems analyst, specialising in business application administration and support. She was working as a test analyst for Alsco uniforms.

Police said the driver of the BMW car was later arrested at his Wahroonga home. He has been charged with dangerous driving occasioning death.

LARRY SUMMERS RESIGNS FROM OPENAI BOARD AFTER EPSTEIN EMAILS MADE PUBLIC

Diary Times Desk: Former US treasury secretary Larry Summers is stepping down from the board at OpenAI, a week after a tranche of emails between him and late convicted sex offender Jeffrey Epstein was released.

Summers said in a statement to the BBC that he was "grateful for the opportunity to have served, excited about the potential of the company, and look forward to following their progress".

Summers, who was also once the president of Harvard University, said on Monday that he would be stepping back from public commitments over his ties to Epstein.

The recently released emails showed Summers communicated with Epstein until the day before Epstein's 2019 arrest for the alleged sex trafficking of minors.

In a statement, the artificial intelligence company said it respected Summers' decision to resign.

UK BABY SUFFERS HEART ATTACK, LOSES TONGUE AFTER MISTAKING DRAIN CLEANER FOR MILK: "IT'S A MIRACLE HE SURVIVED"

Diary Times Desk: A 13-month-old baby in UK's Birmingham suffered a heart attack, internal burns, and lost half his tongue after accidentally drinking drain cleaner, mistaking it for milk. The incident occurred when the toddler slipped behind his mother, who was cleaning the bathroom, and drank caustic soda from a white bottle left on the floor. According to Wales Online, Sam Anwar was just 13 months old when the incident happened in May this year.

His mother, Mukhtara, 27, was cleaning the bathroom when Sam unnoticed followed her and picked up a bottle of drain cleaner she had left on the floor. The chemical instantly burned his lips, mouth, tongue, and airway, causing severe internal injuries.

"APOLOGISE, COMPENSATE": DEAD JOURNALIST'S WIFE ASKS SAUDI PRINCE TO MEET HER



Diary Times Desk: The widow of journalist Jamal Khashoggi, who was murdered by Saudi agents in 2018, has demanded an apology from Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman for her husband's killing after he called it a "huge mistake". Hanan Elatr Khashoggi, in a post on X, said there was no justification to murder her husband, and the Saudi crown prince should "compensate" her for the loss.

Hanan Elatr Khashoggi's remarks came after US President Donald Trump rolled out the red carpet for the Saudi prince's first visit to the United States since Khashoggi was killed inside the kingdom's consulate in Istanbul, sparking global outrage. She earlier said she had written to Trump asking for his help in reaching a financial settlement with Prince Mohammed.

Tagging the President of the United States, Khashoggi wrote, "There is no justification to murder my husband. While Jamal was a good, transparent and brave man, many people may not have agreed with his opinions and desire for freedom of the press."

"The Crown Prince said he was sorry, so he should meet me, apologise and compensate me for the murder of my husband, Jamal Khashoggi," she wrote on X.

ISRAEL WARNS TWO VILLAGES IN SOUTHERN LEBANON TO EVACUATE AHEAD OF STRIKES

Diary Times Desk: The Israeli military on Wednesday warned two villages in southern Lebanon to evacuate buildings close to what it said are Hezbollah sites, as tensions between Israel and militant groups escalate.

At least 14 people were killed in Lebanon in the past day by Israeli strikes on what the military said were sites belonging to groups associated with Hezbollah and Hamas.

Earlier Wednesday, an Israeli airstrike on a car in southern Lebanon killed one person and wounded 11 including students aboard a nearby bus, the Lebanese Health Ministry and state media said.

The strike in the village of Tiri followed an Israeli drone attack on the Palestinian refugee camp of Ein el-Hilweh in southern Lebanon that killed 13 people and wounded several others. The Tuesday night strike was the deadliest among scores of Israeli attacks since a ceasefire in the Israel-Hezbollah war a year ago.

MP'S AIDE REPORTED SUSPECTED CHINA LINKEDIN APPROACH

Diary Times Desk: When MPs, members of the House of Lords and their staff were warned about the threat from Chinese spies, in one office in Westminster, a quick check began.

Simon Whelband is a Conservative councillor and also works for the Conservative MP Neil O'Brien, who was sanctioned by China in 2021.

Simon went into his LinkedIn messages and there it was. A message from an account in the name of Shirly Shen sent some weeks earlier.

He hadn't responded to the unsolicited message and reported it to Parliament's security services. He was then advised to block the account.

The note comes across as pretty innocuous.

He said: "The message wasn't written in very good English, it was a message to say there was a job opportunity and was I interested, and to get in touch if I was.

"I've worked around Parliament for about 10 years now so I'm kind of used to this.

"But if you were more junior, you don't know what you're looking for.

"You might think it's a genuine offer that's made to you on LinkedIn, they might accept."

Whelband added that he thought it was becoming more common for those working in Parliament to be targeted by China.

4 REASONS YOU PROBABLY WON'T GET A \$2,000 CHECK FROM TRUMP SOON (AND 1 **SCARY REASON YOU** MIGHT)

Diary Times Desk : President Donald Trump has promised to deliver \$2,000 tariff rebate checks next year, raising hopes of a lifeline for millions of Americans struggling to make ends meet.

"We've taken in hundreds of billions of dollars in tariff money. We're going to be issuing dividends...probably the middle of next year, a little bit later than that, of thousands of dollars for individuals of moderate income, middle income," Trump said Monday.

Having problems with your favorite websites lately? It's not just you.

Web infrastructure provider Cloudflare experienced disruption on Tuesday that temporarily impacted a swath of online services - from Spotify to ChatGPT and even President Donald Trump's Truth Social platform - marking the latest in a string of high-profile internet outages.

An Amazon Web Services issue disrupted the daily routines of millions of people last month, in some cases preventing them from doing even simple tasks like ordering coffee or managing smart home appliances. Just days later, Microsoft's Azure service was hit with an outage.

According to experts, it's a sign of the times - a combination of society's increased reliance on digital services, the consolidation of critical cloud infrastructure between just a companies and the proclivity of people to complain about tech mishaps online.

LARRY SUMMERS RESIGNS FROM OPENAI BOARD AS SCRUTINY **OVER JEFFREY EPSTEIN EMAILS INTENSIFIES**

Diary Times Desk: Larry Summers is resigning from the OpenAI board as he steps away from public commitments, after more emails between the Harvard economist and convicted sex offender Jeffrey Epstein were released last week by a House committee.

"In line with my announcement to step away from my public commitments. I have also decided to resign from the board of OpenAl," Summers said in a statement. "I am grateful for the opportunity to have served, excited about the potential of the company, and look forward to following their progress."

Last week a House committee released emails showing years of personal correspondence between the two men, including Summers making sexist comments and seeking Epstein's romantic advice.

"Larry has decided to resign from the OpenAl Board of Directors, and we respect his decision," OpenAl's board of directors said in a statement. "We appreciate his many contributions and the perspective he brought to the Board."Summers previously served as former President Bill Clinton's Treasury secretary, former President Barack Obama's National Economic Council director.



TARGET MAY HAVE HIT ROCK BOTTOM

Diary Times Desk: In the latest signal of trouble, the company reported sales dropped during its latest quarter, and Target cut its full-year profit guidance Wednesday. The company's sales have stagnated for about four years, and Target said last month that it would cut 1,000 corporate employees, roughly 8% of its global

Target is betting that a new CEO and investments can spark a turnaround at the company. But Wednesday's quarterly financial report showed there's no quick fix to Target's challenges.

Target has proven over and over that it is poorly positioned to succeed in this uneven economy, selling the wrong mix of items for an increasingly frugal customer. Target specializes in cheap chic clothing and home decorations, but fewer customers believe they can find the best prices and deals there.

Shoppers, strained by inflation, have shifted their spending to essentials and value items. They've switched to Walmart, Amazon, TJ Maxx and other chains instead.

Target's stock slipped 1% during pre-market trading Wednesday. Shares have tumbled roughly 35% this year.

"Target is really struggling and does not seem to be able to climb out of the hole it has dug itself into," Neil Saunders, an analyst at GlobalData Retail, said in a note Wednesday.

The company has also faced intense customer backlash for its retreat on some diversity initiatives.



ALIS ABOUT TO FACE AN ENORMOUS TEST. THE MARKET IS ALREADY **NERVOUS**

Diary Times Desk: Growing concerns about an artificial intelligence bubble have, in large part, caused the stock market's recent bout of volatility. So the AI industry will face an enormous test when Nvidia, the world's most valuable company and backbone of the AI boom, reports earnings after the bell on Wednesday.

The stock market rally – that had been going practically nonstop since April until this month's blip - largely depends on Nvidia. The chipmaker, which is the gold standard for Al computing power, has propelled the market higher across the past three years.

Investors are now eager to know whether demand for Nvidia's chips - and its optimism about the future - are continuing to grow or if there are signs of AI fatigue.

Less-than-stellar earnings this month from tech company Palantir (PLTR), which uses AI for its government contracts, gave Wall Street pause - and fueled a sell-off in AI stocks over the past several weeks. Nvidia's stock (NVDA) has fallen more than 10% this month, although it's still up 35% this year.

THE NETHERLANDS TAKES A BIG STEP TO DEFUSE ITS DISPUTE WITH CHINA THAT THREATENED CAR PRODUCTION

A high-stakes standoff between China and the Netherlands over control of a crucial chipmaker reached a detente Wednesday after Amsterdam suspended a controversial order that enabled it to take control of Chinese-owned Nexperia.

The standoff had threatened to shutter auto plants around the world as Nexperia is a critical supplier of computer chips to the global auto industry.

The Dutch government said it had suspended the order after "constructive" meetings with Chinese authorities and that it would continue speaking to them.

Amsterdam took control of Nexperia in late September, under pressure from the US government, which had placed its Chinese parent company, Wingtech Technologies, on a blacklist of companies seen as posing a national security threat. Nexperia's CEO was also suspended from his post following a court order. Maroš Šefčovič, who oversees the European Union's trade policy, also welcomed the Dutch government's move, saying on X that it represents "another key step in stabilizing our strategic chip supply chains."

BBC APOLOGIZES TO PRINCESS OF WALES OVER TITLE ERROR

The BBC has apologized to Catherine, Princess of Wales for referring to her as "Kate Middleton" during the British broadcaster's recent coverage of Armistice Day.

News presenter and correspondent Rajini Vaidyanathan repeatedly referred to the popular 43-year-old royal by her maiden name last week, sparking complaints from viewers watching the Remembrance coverage.

"During our coverage of memorials to commemorate Armistice Day we mistakenly referred to Catherine, Princess of Wales as Kate Middleton; these were errors during hours of live broadcasting for which we apologise," the BBC said in a statement.

"Throughout our Armistice Day coverage more broadly, we referred to Catherine by her correct title," it added.

Armistice Day - also known as Remembrance Day - commemorates the end of World War I and has become a day to remember all those who have lost their lives in conflict.

The Princess of Wales made her first appearance at the Armistice Day Service of Remembrance at the National Memorial Arboretum on November 11, leading the nation in a two-minute silence before laying a wreath on behalf of the royal family.

The apology comes after the BBC also apologized to US President Donald Trump last week over an editing mishap that featured in a documentary, which he has threatened to sue over.

On Thursday, the BBC apologized to Trump for how a 2021 speech was cut together in an October 2024 documentary titled "Trump: A Second Chance?" saying that it "sincerely regrets the manner in which the video clip was edited."

The victim further stated that when she asked the accused to fulfill his promise of marriage, he refused, causing her extreme mental distress. Following this, she approached the police and filed a complaint against the accused.

The police have taken prompt action, registering a case under Section 69 and 3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) 2023. An investigation into the matter has been initiated.

LAKE WATER LEVEL WITNESSES STEEP RISE. TRIGGERS FEARS IN **LAHAUL-SPITI**

Diary Times Desk: An alarming rise in water level of Ghepan Lake in tribal district Lahaul and Spiti has raised concerns among residents and local authorities. According to Deputy Commissioner Kiran Bhadana, the lake has recorded a 178% increase in water levels over the years, significantly heightening the risk of formation of a Glacial Lake Outburst Flood (GLOF) — a sudden disaster capable of releasing massive volumes of water and debris downstream

The district administration has been monitoring the lake on a daily basis as satellite data continues to show a worrying trend. Officials fear that the accumulation of water could lead to a catastrophic event, especially in a region known for its fragile mountain slopes and glacial structures.

A GLOF occurs when the natural dam holding a glacial lake fails. This can be triggered by several factors such as ice or rock avalanches sliding into the lake.

HIGH DRAMA IN GURDASPUR AS EX-ARMYMAN SHOOTS SELF AFTER KILLING WIFE, MOTHER-IN-LAW

Diary Times Desk: Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Tuesday ignited a fresh political debate over Delhi's deteriorating air quality, firmly dismissing allegations that stubble-burning in Punjab is responsible for the capital's toxic smog.

Addressing a press conference, Mann argued that meteorological patterns make it impossible for smoke from Punjab to travel to Delhi. He claimed that winds would need to blow "from north to south at 30 kmph for 10 days straight" for the smoke to reach the national capital - a scenario he described as unrealistic

"The smoke from Punjab doesn't even reach Delhi. For smoke to travel from Punjab to Delhi in 10 days, it requires wind blowing from North to South at 30 kmph, which never happens...The smoke that travels to Delhi stays over Connaught Place! What a joke!.. There are Haryana, Rajasthan and UP neighbouring Delhi, plus Delhi's own pollution...Even before paddy harvesting began in Punjab, Delhi's AQI reached 400.

DETAINED MP AMRITPAL SINGH SEEKS PAROLE UNDER NSA TO ATTEND PARLIAMENT WINTER SESSION

Diary Times Desk: Lok Sabha MP Amritpal Singh, detained in Dibrugarh under the National Security Act, has moved the Punjab and Haryana High Court seeking temporary release to attend the upcoming Winter Session of Parliament from December 1 to 19. The petition invokes Section 15 of the NSA, which empowers the competent authority to grant parole to a detainee in exceptional circumstances.

The plea, filed through counsel Imaan Singh Khara, states that despite being in preventive detention since April 2023, the petitioner was elected from the Khadoor Sahib constituency in the 2024 General Election with nearly four lakh votes and continues to represent about 19 lakh constituents. He has sought a mandamus directing the Union and state authorities to permit his release on parole, or in the alternative, to arrange his personal attendance in the House during the session.

The petition recounts that a third detention order was issued against him on April 17 this year while he was lodged in Central Jail, Dibrugarh.

DELHI LAWYER'S ARREST BY GURUGRAM STF: 'WHY NOT HAND OVER PROBE TO CBI', ASKS SC

Diary Times Desk: The Supreme Court on Wednesday asked the Haryana Government to spell out why the murder case, in which Delhi lawyer Vikram Singh was arrested by Gurugram STF, should not be handed over to CBI after senior counsel Vikas Singh, representing him, alleged custodial torture.

"He (Vikram Singh) was tied to a pole all night and made to sleep like that. WhatsApp messages were sent despite this court's order restraining such communication... He was given third-degree torture. He was threatened that his hair would be cut, and it was cut immediately at the police station," Vikas Singh told a bench led by CJI BR Gavai. Accusing STF officials of pressuring the lawyer to "settle" a gang-war related dispute because he represented certain accused persons, the senior counsel wondered, "How can a lawyer settle matters between hardened gangsters?"

WEDDING DANCER BEATEN UP IN HARYANA'S NUH FOR RESISTING ADVANCES

Diary Times Desk: A woman dancer performing at a prewedding celebration at Pachagon village in Nuh was assaulted after she objected to inappropriate behaviour by a relative of the groom.

The incident, caught on camera, showed a man trying to touch the performer inappropriately. She responded by slapping his arm, following which the man attacked her.

Within moments, several others in the crowd joined in, beating up her and other dancers and tearing off their clothes. The performers were eventually pulled to safety by members of their team.

AL FALAH GROUP CHAIRMAN HAD REASONS TO FLEE INDIA; RS 415 CRORE TAINTED FUNDS IDENTIFIED: ED

Diary Times Desk: Al Falah group chairperson Jawad Ahmed Siddiqui had "incentives" to flee India as his close family members are settled in the Gulf and he received at least Rs 415 crore funds generated "dishonestly" from students of educational institutions run by his Trust, the ED has informed a court. Siddiqui was taken into custody by the federal probe agency on Tuesday night after it conducted day-long searches against the Al Falah University group of Faridabad. The University is central to the investigation into the November 10 Red Fort area blast which killed 15 and injured several others.

He was produced at the residence of Additional Sessions Judge Sheetal Chaudhary Pradhan (Saket court) where the agency sought his 14-day remand for custodial interrogation. The court sent him to 13-day ED custody till December 1.

Diary Times Desk: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Tuesday night arrested chairman of the Al-Falah group Jawad Ahmad Siddiqui in an alleged moneylaundering case related to the Al Falah Charitable Trust

He was sent to 13 days' ED custody by a city court till December 1. The order was passed at 1 am on Wednesday by Additional Sessions Judge Sheetal Chaudhary Pradhan.

Siddiqui was arrested on Tuesday under Section 19 of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), 2002. He was produced before the court later in the night for the purpose of seeking ED remand. According to officials, the arrest followed detailed investigation and analysis of evidences gathered during search operations carried out at premises related to the Al Falah group in the ongoing probe in an ECIR recorded by the ED under the PMLA in connection with the Al Falah group.

SKM TO HOLD COUNTRY WIDE PROTESTS ON NOVEMBER 26 TO MARK FIVE YEARS OF DELHI MARCH

Diary Times Desk: Farmer organisations, along with Central Trade Unions, will hold nationwide protests on November 26 to mark five years of the farmers' march to Delhi, demanding fulfilment of unimplemented promises made by the government.

The Samyukt Kisan Morcha (SKM), an umbrella body of farmer organisations that led the 2020-21 protests, slammed the government for failing to implement key promises made during the yearlong sit-in protest at Delhi borders.

"None of the promises made to farmers have been implemented. It was not even discussed... Whether it is MSP at C2+50 per cent, a loan waiver or stopping privatisation of electricity. This is bothering farmers," said Ashok Dhawale, president of All India Kisan Sabha.

Archaeologists may have uncovered a Bronze Age metropolis in Kazakhstan's steppe

pon the open grasslands of what is now Kazakhstan, there once stood a Bronze Age settlement that may have served as a center of exchange and power around 1600 BC.

settlement - called Semiyarka and nicknamed "The City of Seven Ravines" for its location overlooking a network of valleys - was first discovered in the early 2000s, but it wasn't until an international group of archaeologists surveyed the area starting in 2018 that its impressive size and potential importance within the Eurasian Steppe came to light. What the team discovered was an

expansive area that was once replete with houses, a central monumental building, which may have been used for rituals or governance, and possibly even tin bronze metal production facilities.



"It's very exciting, because it's such a rare find to have tin bronze production in this area," said lead author Miljana Radivojević, an



associate professor in archaeological science at University College London, UK. "We know we have hundreds of thousands of tin bronze artifacts from the Bronze Age in the Eurasian steppe and we have only one published site on tin bronze production. And this is the second one." Tin bronze allowed for sturdier tools and other materials to be made, Radivojević added. As the team now embarks on excavating the area, they say the continued discoveries of Semiyarka are transforming what we know about urban life in prehistoric Eurasia.

"We just don't have anything like this at all," said study coauthor Dan Lawrence, a professor of archaeology at Durham University in the UK. There are hardly settlements of any kind recovered in the steppe, he added. "What you get across this landscape, we associate with mobile pastoral groups, and we think maybe they were in tents or yurts. What we've got here is something that's very clearly quite different."

Spanning 140 hectares (about 346 acres) above the Irtysh River valley, the large size and strategic location of the settlement may indicate that the Bronze Age steppe had sophisticated cities similar to those located in more urban areas of the world at the time, Lawrence added.

Surveying a long-lost city

To find the borders of the settlement, Lawrence led the team in a survey project that looked at satellite imagery and analyzed every 50-meter square across the site. They only examined the surface, finding pottery fragments, including at least 114 ceramic vessels, and other artifacts scattered across the settlement.

The team also used imagery from Corona spy photography dating to the 1960s, to identify where the land had been disturbed during the last several decades, as well as magnetometry, a noninvasive survey technique that allowed the archaeologists to see buried structures and metal objects without having to excavate

DENMARK'S HARDLINE IMMIGRATION LAWS HAVE CAUGHT BRITAIN'S EYE.

Denmark's biggest exports include Ozempic, Carlsberg and Lego. But now, European leaders think it has something more sell: valuable to an immigration system tough and effective enough to neuter the hard right and keep mainstream parties in power.

Frederiksen the Mette Danish prime minister, has achieved what many center-left governments of recent vears have found getting impossible: reelected. In an age when incumbents keep getting hammered at the ballot box, many in Europe are looking to the asylum policies of Frederiksen's Social Democrats - which won elections in 2019, 2022. and, polls show, are on course to win again in 2026 - as a model to imitate.

Announcing a radical overhaul of Britain's asvlum system on Monday. Shahana Mahmood the home secretary, said while Britain had "held rigidly to the old model, other countries have tightened theirs." At the end of last year. 123 million people worldwide were forcibly displaced according to the UN, up from about 44 million people in 2010. "Our asylum system was not designed to cope with this." Britain's Prime Minister Keir Starmer said bluntly Monday. Britain is now poised to embark on a policy route first charted by Denmark a decade ago. In 2015, Europe received its most requests for asylum in a single year since World War II, as civil wars in Syria and Libya helped spur around 1.3 million people to travel to the mostly from the Middle East. When Germany's Chancellor Angela Merkel famously said "Wir schaffen das (We can do it)!" urging Germans to welcome in refugees, Denmark took a different approach.

Under Lars Løkke Rasmussen, Frederiksen's predecessor prime minister who then led the center-right Venstre party, Denmark aimed to reduce the number of asylum seekers.

> In a September episode of "Super Mustache," aired shortly after Trump began his campaign of airstrikes on alleged drug boats off the Venezuelan coast, the cartoon superhero doffed his usual costume in favor of a military uniform, wielding sheathed sword and declaring that Venezuela doesn't have a "warmongering culture."

> Yet despite Super Mustache's new look. the Venezuelan government has sent mixed messages since tensions increased with the US simultaneously urging citizens to prepare for action while insisting that everything is fine.

The dissonance between the

gravity of the crisis in the Caribbean and the regime's messaging is visible on the streets of Caracas. Unlike in previous nationwide campaigns. CNN teams in Venezuela have not seen any billboards, banners, murals, or graffiti in the national capital calling for support for the regime's war footing, even in neighborhoods considered government strongholds.


Different strategies Maduro, who prior to August was more commonly seen in enclosed spaces, has been making speeches and public appearances almost daily since tensions began to rise with the United States, often seen surrounded by a significant security detail, according to Venezuelan researcher and journalist Andrés Cañizález. Maduro hasn't taken on the job of projecting Venezuela's military might in the face of Trump's threats. He has instead portrayed himself as a peacemaker, even singing John Lennon's song "Imagine" at a public event urging Trump to come to the table for talks face-to-face. As he waded through the crowd at a rally on November 13. Maduro told CNN's Stefano Pozzebon that the US should unite with Venezuela for peace in the Americas.

Cañizález believes the Maduro government's communication strategy has gone through different stages: initially, tensions with the US were downplayed, but as the US military presence in the Caribbean increased, the discourse shifted "to a more threatening, more retaliatory tone.

Maduro's counterpoint in Venezuela's propaganda machine is Diosdado Cabello, the interior minister and host of one of the country's most popular talk shows on state TV - "Con el Mazo Dando." Spanish for "Hitting it with a Club." In a typical four-hour episode, Cabello meanders between attacking opposition politicians, telling jokes and promoting the government's position.

Chief among those positions is that US actions in the Caribbean have nothing to do with drugs, despite what the Trump

A COLLECTOR'S GUIDE TO PICASSO CERAMICS

Diary Times Desk: Pablo Picasso designed 633 different ceramic editions between 1947 and 1971, with a number of variants and unique pieces resulting from these initial works. He began by creating simple, utilitarian objects such as plates and bowls, but later produced more complex forms, including pitchers and vases — their handles occasionally shaped to form facial features, or anatomical parts of his animal subjects.

Picasso remains one of the most highly prized artists at auction today, and the range of his ceramics means it's easy to find a work that is both an investment and an object you'll love. So there really is a perfect Picasso ceramic for everyone.

Over the course of his career, Picasso explored a wide variety of ceramic techniques — experimenting with paint, playing with form, or engraving the clay's surface. Eventually, extensive research led him to adopt two main production methods.

The first was based on the painstaking replication of an original object by hand, following its form and decoration as closely as possible. The second method involved creating original images in dry clay moulds, then transferring the design onto fresh clay: works made in this way carry the mark 'Empreinte Originale de Picasso'.

Every ceramic produced by Picasso features a stamp or marking, which can be found on the underside of the work, on the reverse, or even inside the piece. Some editions also include their edition number (e.g. 85/150) or a date.

These stamps and markings differ from one edition to another, and evolved over time. The most common, however, are 'Madoura Plein Feu', 'Empreinte Originale de Picasso' and 'Edition Picasso'.

Whether it is one of Picasso's famous bullfighting scenes, a visage plate, an owl, goat or fish piece, or a portrait of his last muse and second wife, Jacqueline Roque, each work will sit differently depending on its surroundings. A particular design might fit better in one room than in another, depending on its shape and colour.

Many of our clients will have more than one Picasso ceramic at home. When deciding to buy a new piece, they will often be influenced by what they already own.

Some will seek out works that can easily be displayed alongside the rest of their collection, choosing to echo a particular theme or style. Others will pursue a ceramic that is completely different from anything they have, gradually amassing examples of a range of Picasso's editions.



A COLLECTOR'S GUIDE TO LINE VAUTRIN

Diary Times Desk: The distinctive work of the French jewellery designer and decorative artist Line Vautrin, dubbed 'the poetess of metal' by Vogue in the 1940s, epitomises Parisian Neo-Romantic chic.

Her witty and imaginative creations — spanning jewellery, boxes, mirrors, powder compacts and other gilt-bronze whimsies — were the result of continuous experimentation, and are imbued with her passion for poetry and fantasy.

'Vautrin famously claimed to have one idea a day,' says Robin Beyries, a specialist in the Design department at Christie's in Paris. 'Even now, we're still discovering previously unseen models and rare variants, so there's always something new for the collector to marvel at.'

Born in Paris in 1913 into a family that owned a bronze foundry, Vautrin taught herself metalworking skills such as gilding, chasing and casting. By the age of 21, she had designed her first jewellery collection. After a brief spell working for the studio of Elsa Schiaparelli, she began making boxes, ashtrays, powder compacts and paperweights, often inscribed with her signature allegories, metaphors, symbols and visual puns.

'There's a playfulness in her work that sparks the curiosity of collectors,' says Beyries. 'Her works also appeal on an emotional level, with her visual cues often evoking memories.'

Over the course of her long career, Vautrin drew inspiration from a variety of sources, ranging from the ancient world to the palm trees of Casablanca, where she moved with her family in 1949. She also continued to innovate, experimenting with materials, designs and techniques in a bid to blur the traditional genre boundaries of the decorative arts.

She worked in bronze, but also played with small fragments of mirror embedded in her own formulation of cellulose acetate resin, which she registered under the trade name Talosel. Her Talosel mirror frames proved a huge hit, enticing celebrities such as the writer Françoise Sagan, film star Ingrid Bergman and fashion designer Yves Saint Laurent.

Her breakthrough came in 1937, when she took a booth at the Exposition Universelle in Paris. She showcased a wide range of gilt-bronze buttons and jewellery, including the celebrated Adam et Eve necklace, to the acclaim of critics and collectors alike. The presentation cemented her reputation as a singular creative innovator, and launched her on the international stage.



BARCELONA JOINED BY BAYERN MUNICH IN RACE TO SIGN EXPERIENCED BUNDESLIGA FULL-BACK
