MAJOR COLLISION AVERTED AT DELHI AIRPORT AS AFGHAN AIRLINE FLIGHT LANDS ON WRONG RUNWAY

A major collision was averted at the Indira Gandhi International Airport here when Ariana Afghan Airlines from Kabul mistakenly landed on a runway from where another flight was taking off, a senior DGCA official said.

The pilot-in-command (PIC) of the Ariana flight stated that he lost ILS (Instrument Landing System) at 4NM (nautical miles) and the aircraft turned right, after which the captain landed with visual approach runway 29R, official said.

The ILS is a precision radio navigation system that provides short-range guidance to an aircraft allowing to approach runway at night, during bad weather and poor visibility. As per the PIC, he lost ILS at 4NM and the

RAM MANDIR

PM MODI TO HOIST SAFFRON FLAG AT RAM MANDIR ON TUESDAY

Diary Times Desk : Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit Ram Janmabhoomi temple in Ayodhya, Uttar Pradesh, on Tuesday and hoist the traditional saffron flag on the temple.

Prime Minister will first visit Sapt Mandir which houses temples associated with Maharshi Vashishtha, Maharshi Vishwamitra Maharshi Agastya, Maharshi Valmiki, Devi Ahilya, Nishadraj Guha and Mata Shabari. This will be followed by a visit to Sheshavtar

The PM will then visit Mata Annapurna Mandir, after which he will perform darshan and puja at Ram Darbar Garbh Grah, which will be followed by darshan at Ram Lalla Garbha Grah.

At 12 noon, the Prime Minister will ceremonially hoist a saffron flag on the Shikhar of the sacred Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Temple in Ayodhya, symbolising the completion of the temple's construction and signalling the government's commitment to 'heritage and development."

The programme will coincide with Panchami of the Shukla Paksha in the month of Margashirsha, marking Lord Ram and Maa Sita's Vivah Panchami, a day symbolising divine union. This date also marks the martyrdom day of Guru Tegh Bahadur, the ninth Sikh Guru, who meditated in Ayodhya for 48 uninterrupted hours in the 17th century, further enhancing the spiritual significance of the day.

The right-angled triangular flag, measuring ten feet in height and twenty feet in length, bears the image of a radiant Sun symbolising the brilliance and valour of Lord Ram, with an 'Om' inscribed on it along with an image of Kovidara tree.

The sacred saffron flag will convey a message of dignity, unity, and cultural continuity, embodying the ideals of Ram Rajya, a PMO

The flag will rise atop a temple summit constructed in the traditional North Indian Nagara architectural style, while the surrounding 800-metre Parkota, a circumambulatory enclosure built around the temple, designed in the South Indian architectural tradition.

The temple complex features 87 intricately carved stone episodes from the life of Lord Ram based on the Valmiki Ramayana on the outer walls of the main temple, and 79 bronze-cast episodes from Indian culture placed along the enclosure walls

JUSTICE VIKRAM NATH NEW EXECUTIVE CHAIRMAN OF NALSA

Diary Times Desk :Justice Vikram Nath, the senior-most judge of the Supreme Court, has been nominated as the next Executive Chairman of the National Legal Services Authority (NALSA).

Constituted under the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987, NALSA is mandated to provide free legal services to weaker sections of the society.

According to the NALSA Act, the CJI is the Patron-in-Chief of NALSA.

The President, in consultation with the CJI, appoints an active or retired Supreme Court iudge as the Executive Chairman of NALSA

The nomination was made by President Droupadi Murmu in exercise of powers conferred by the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987.

Justice Nath, who has served on the Supreme Court Bench since 2021, will supervise NALSA's mission of guiding the nation's legal aid system and offering competent and free legal services to those in need of the same.

Another Supreme Court judge, Justice Maheshwari, has been nominated as Chairperson of the Supreme Court Legal Services Committee (SCLSC) by CJI Surya Kant.



TAX EXEMPTION

SC ISSUES NOTICE TO CENTRE, EC, 12 POLITICAL PARTIES OVER PIL AGAINST TAX EXEMPTION ON ANONYMOUS CASH DONATIONS BELOW RS 2.000



Diary Times Desk :The Supreme Court on Monday issued notices to the Centre the Election Commission and 12 political parties on a PIL challenging the validity of an Income Tax Act provision that allowed political parties to receive "anonymous" cash donations below Rs 2,000.
"Thus, with the advent of UPI revolution

in the country, permitting exemption of income received by way of contribution in cash below Rs 2.000 under Section 13A(d) of the Income Tax Act, 1961, can no more be justified and is manifestly arbitrary and has no nexus to the object of maintaining transparency in the funding of political parties," the PIL

A Bench of Justice Vikram Nath and Justice Sandeep Mehta asked the Centre, the Central Board of Direct Taxes, the EC, BJP, Congress and 10 other political parties to respond to the PIL and posted the matter for hearing

Filed by one Khem Singh Bhati, the PIL urged the top court to declare clause (d) of Section 13A of the Income Tax Act, 1961 unconstitutional and direct the poll panel to scrutinise Form 24A contribution reports of all recognised political parties at the national and state level and to require them to deposit the amount received by way of contributions for which address and/or PAN had not been furnished.

FRENCH-ORIGIN HAMMER, USED DURING **OPERATION SINDOOR, TO BE MANUFACTURED** IN INDIA



Diary Times Desk : A French-origin weapon called the 'HAMMER', used during Operation Sindoor by the Indian Air Force, will now be made in India.

Public sector undertaking Bharat Electronics Limited (BEL) and French-major Safran Electronics and Defence (SED) today signed a joint venture cooperation reement (JVCA) for producing the HAMMER.

'HAMMER' is an abbreviation of 'Highly agile modular munition extended range'. It is a smart precision guided air-to-ground weapon in India.

The Ministry of Defence said HAMMER is a combatproven, precision-quided weapon system known for its high accuracy and modular design, making it adaptable for multiple platforms, including the Rafale and Light Combat Aircraft Tejas.

STUDY FINDS GENDER-SPECIFIC BRAIN PATTERNS IN CHILDREN PREDISPOSED TO SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER



Diary Times Desk: A new study has found differing patterns in the brain activity of boys and girls with a family history of substance use disorder, reflecting distinct ways in which they may be predisposed to addiction long before substance use begins.

Findings published in the journal Nature Mental Health "may help explain why boys and girls often follow different paths toward substance use and addiction", said senior author Amy Kuceyeski, professor of mathematics and neuroscience in the department of radiology at Weill Cornell Medical College, US

Researchers measured how the brain transitions between different patterns of activity during rest. Brain scans of nearly 1,900 children aged nine to eleven from the US' 'Adolescent Brain Cognitive velopment' study were analysed.

Girls with a family history of substance use disorders showed a higher transition energy in the brain's default-mode network — which is at play during idle thinking or daydreaming — suggesting that their brains might need to work harder to shift gears from thought processes that are directed inwards.

"That may mean (a) greater difficulty disengaging from negative internal states like stress or rumination.

Such inflexibility could set the stage for later risk, when substances are used as a way to escape or self-soothe," first author Louisa Schilling, doctoral candidate at Weill Cornell Medical College, said.

Coming from a middle-class family in Harvana's Hisar district, CJI Kant started his professional journey as a small-town lawyer before reaching the pinnacle of the Indian judiciary.

Delineating his top two priorities as the head of the judiciary, CJI Kant recently told the media that dealing with a huge backlog of more than five crore cases across courts and promoting "game changer" mediation as an alternative mode of dispute resolution will be his two important goals.

Senior Jail Superintendent Dr Viresh Raj Sharma said that Muskan was brought to Lala Lajpat Rai Memorial Medical College here around 11.30 pm on Sunday after her labour pain increased.

Sharma said Muskan's family members have been informed. However, no one from the family visited Muskan at the hospital.

According to the hospital administration, Muskan's condition remained normal throughout the day and she was continuously monitored. Given the sensitivity of the matter, police deployment has been increased around the main entrance and wards of the hospital.

ARMY CHIEF GENDWIVEDI TO LEAD FIRST-EVER OFFICIAL **COMMEMORATION OF OPERATION PAWAN ON NOV 25**

Diary Times Desk: Indian Army Chief General Upendra Dwivedi will tomorrow lead the armed forces in the first-ever official commemoration for soldiers who laid down their lives in 'Operation Pawan' in Sri Lanka.

The deployment of forces to Sri Lanka was called the Indian Peace Keeping Force (IPKF). The solemn ceremony tomorrow signifies the long-awaited recognition and closure for the 1,171 soldiers who made the supreme sacrifice of their lives and the 3,500 who were injured in the line of duty.

A 'wreath laying' ceremony will be held at National War Memorial, New Delhi, on November 25. General Dwivedi, will lay a wreath at the memorial, honouring the supreme sacrifice of Maj R Parameswaran and all fallen soldiers of Operation Pawan. Lieutenant General Pushpendra Singh, Vice Chief of the Army, who had participated in Operation Pawan as a young officer, would be accompanying the Army Chief.

PNB LOAN FRAUD CASE: ED HANDS OVER FOUR ATTACHED FLATS OF MEHUL CHOKSI TO LIQUIDATORS

Diary Times Desk: The Enforcement Directorate on Monday said it has restored to the official liquidator four Mumbai flats attached by it as part of a money laundering investigation against absconding diamantaire Mehul Choksi.

The flats were handed over to the liquidator on November 21, enabling it to proceed with the monetisation of these assets for the benefit of victims, secured creditors and other legitimate claimants, the federal probe agency said in a statement.

Restitution of assets is a provision available under the PMLA and is aimed at restoring funds or properties to those victims, including banks, who were duped by individuals and companies through a loan or investment scheme fraud.

Till now, the ED said, immovable and movable properties located in Mumbai, Kolkata and Surat worth Rs 310 crore have been handed over to the liquidator of Gitanjali Gems Ltd., a company of Choksi.

Choksi is currently fighting his extradition to India from Belgium.

Choksi's nephew Nirav Modi, their family members and employees, bank officials and others were booked by the ED and the CBI in 2018 for perpetrating the alleged loan fraud at the Brady House branch of the Punjab National Bank (PNB) in Mumbai.



EX-CJI GAVAI LEAVES OFFICIAL CAR FOR SUCCESSOR SURYA KANT AT RASHTRAPATI **BHAVAN**

Diary Times Desk: Former Chief Justice of India (CJI) B R Gavai on Monday set a new precedent by leaving the official Mercedes-Benz car for his successor, Surya Kant, at Rashtrapati Bhavan after the latter's swearing-in ceremony.

Justice Gavai, who superannuated on November 23, reached the Rashtrapati Bhavan in the official car and left for his residence in his personal vehicle after the function.

"After the oath ceremony, Justice Gavai left the official vehicle designated for the chief justice and returned in an alternative vehicle from Rashtrapati Bhavan, ensuring that the official car is available for use by his successor," a person privy to the development said.

Justice Surya Kant was administered the oath as the 53rd CJI by President Droupadi Murmu at a brief ceremony on Monday morning. He took the oath in Hindi in the name of

COAST GUARD OFFICERS TO RETIRE AT 60: DELHI HC QUASHES DISCRIMINATORY RULES

Diary Times Desk: The Delhi High Court has struck down rules of the Indian Coast Guard (ICG) setting different retirement ages for different ranks, wherein officers of the rank of Commandant and below retired at the age of 57 years, while senior ranks served till the age of 60. This implies that officers of all ranks and enlisted men in ICG would superannuate at the age of 60.

Allowing a bunch of petitions, a division bench of Justice C Hari Shankar and Justice Om Prakash Shukla held Rule 20(1) and 20(2)1 of the Coast Guard (General) Rules, 1986 were unconstitutional and unsupported by rational justification. Rule 20(1) concerns officers while Rule 20(2)1 concerns enlisted men below officer rank.

"We hold that the impugned Rule 20(1) and 20(2) of the 1986 Rules cannot sustain scrutiny of Articles 14 and 16 of the Constitution of India, to the extent they fix the age of superannuation of officers of the rank of Commandant and below, and enrolled persons, at 57. They are, therefore, quashed and set aside," the bench said in their order of November 24. "We hold, therefore, that the age of superannuation of 60 would apply to officers of the Coast Guard at all ranks," the bench added.

BLOS HOLD PROTEST OUTSIDE BENGAL CEO'S OFFICE OVER 'EXCESSIVE' WORK PRESSURE

Diary Times Desk: Surrounded by family members, WinBooth-level officers (BLOs) engaged in the ongoing SIR process in West Bengal police altercations with had personnel on Monday while attempting to enter the Chief Electoral Officer's (CEO) office here during a demonstration against alleged excessive work pressure, a senior officer said.

Members of BLO Adhikar Raksha Committee marched from College Square in north Kolkata, carrying locks and fetters to symbolically close the main entrance of the building housing the CEO's office.

High drama unfolded as a 10-member delegation — comprising four BLOs and six teachers or state government employees — entered the office of CEO Manoj Agarwal in the evening to submit their grievances. With the CEO absent, his deputy met them and accepted their memorandum.

ED FREEZES DEPOSITS WORTH RS 523 CRORE IN PROBE AGAINST ONLINE GAMING PLATFORMS WINZO, GAMESKRAFT

Diary Times Desk: The ED on Monday said it has frozen collective deposits worth about Rs 523 crore of online gaming companies WinZO and Gameskraft as the platforms allegedly "held" funds worth crores of rupees that should ideally have been refunded to players after India banned real-money gaming recently.

The federal probe agency conducted multiple searches between November 18 and 22 in Delhi, Bengaluru and Gurugram as part of a money laundering investigation against these platforms' parent companies—Nirdesa Networks Pvt. Ltd. (NNPL), Gameskraft Technologies Pvt. Ltd. (GTPL) and WinZO Games Pvt. Ltd—and their promoters.

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) accused WinZO of "engaging in criminal activities and unscrupulous practices as customers were made to play with algorithms without being made aware of the fact that they are playing with the software and not with humans in real-money games".

A WinZO spokesperson said in a statement that the company was "cooperating fully with the investigating agency and will continue to support the process".

WinZO, the ED said in a statement, was operating real-money games (RMGs) in countries such as Brazil, the US and Germany etc., from India (on the same platform used by the Indian entity).

Pema, whose family hails from Rupa in West Kameng district, claimed that Chinese officials insisted Arunachal Pradesh was "part of China" and demanded she accept their interpretation before allowing further processing.

JUSTICE SURYA KANT TAKES OATH AS 53RD CHIEF JUSTICE OF INDIA

Diary Times Desk: Justice Surya Kant, the seniormost judge of the Supreme Court, was on Monday sworn in as the 53rd Chief Justice of India (CJI).

President Draupadi Murmu administered the oath of office to Justice Kant in Hindi at a brief ceremony at the Rashtrapati Bhayan here at 10 am.

He succeeds Justice BR Gavai, who retired on November 23 after a tenure of a little over six months. Justice Gavai had on October 27 recommended Justice Kant's name as his successor. The President on October 30 had appointed Justice Kant as the next CJI.

The swearing-in ceremony was attended by Vice-President CP Radhakrishnan, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, Home Minister Amit Shah, several Union ministers, Haryana Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini.



UN REFORMS NOT OPTIONAL: PM MODI AT IBSA MEET

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday said global institutions had drifted far from 21st-century realities and must undergo urgent reforms. He warned that the absence of India, Brazil and South Africa (IBSA) as permanent members of the UN Security Council (UNSC) "is a proof of the system's deep mismatch with today's world".

"IBSA must send a united message to the world that institutional reform is no longer optional, it is a necessity," the Prime Minister said at the IBSA leaders' meeting in Johannesburg, held on the sidelines of the G20 summit.

He recalled that India, during its 2021 IBSA chairship, hosted the first meeting of the three countries' national security advisers and proposed giving the mechanism a formal, institutional structure to deepen security cooperation.

Participating in the trilateral meeting with President Cyril Ramaphosa of South Africa and President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva of Brazil, Modi said IBSA was not merely a grouping but a bridge linking three continents and three major democratic economies bound by shared values and aspirations.

3 KILLED AS GUNMEN ATTACK PAKISTAN PARAMILITARY FORCE HEADQUARTERS IN PESHAWAR

Diary Times Desk: Gunmen attacked a paramilitary force headquarters in Pakistan's northwestern city of Peshawar on Monday, police said.

The complex, the headquarters of the frontier constabulary paramilitary force, was also hit by two suicide bombers, sources told Reuters, adding that three people had been killed.

"The first suicide bomber carried out an attack on the main entrance of the constabulary and the other one entered the compound," a senior official told Reuters on condition of anonymity.

"Law enforcement personnel, including the army and police, have cordoned off the area and are carefully handling the situation as we suspect there are some terrorists inside the headquarters," the official added.

"The road has been closed for traffic and cordoned off by the army, police and (security) personnel," Safdar Khan, a resident of the area, told Reuters.



DRIVER ARRESTED IN TOKYO AFTER CAR HITS ABOUT 10 PEOPLE: LOCAL MEDIA

Diary Times Desk: A car struck about 10 people in Tokyo on Monday, seriously injuring two of them, and the driver was arrested after fleeing the scene, Japanese media reported. Police did not immediately comment on the incident, but they said a representative would provide an update as soon as possible.

The Mainichi newspaper reported that police had arrested the driver, who fled the scene, adding the driver is under investigation for a suspected hit and run.

CANADA TO AMEND CITIZENSHIP LAW; LIKELY TO BENEFIT INDIAN-ORIGIN FAMILIES



Diary Times Desk :Canada has moved closer toward modernising citizenship-by-descent law, after a bill to amend the act received royal assent, in a move that is likely to affect thousands of Indian-origin families.Bill C-3, an Act to amend the Citizenship Act (2025), has received royal assent. This represents an important milestone in making the Citizenship Act more inclusive, while maintaining the value of Canadian citizenship, said a news release issued by the Canadian government on Friday.

The new law will also allow a Canadian parent born or adopted abroad to pass citizenship on to their child born or adopted outside Canada on or after the date the bill comes into force, provided they have a substantial connection to Canada, the release said.

"Bill C-3 will fix long-standing issues in our citizenship laws and bring fairness to families with children born or adopted abroad. It will provide citizenship to people who were excluded by previous laws, and it will set clear rules for the future that reflect how modern families live. These changes will strengthen and protect Canadian citizenship," Canada's Minister of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Lena Metlege Diab said.

On December 19, 2023, the Ontario Superior Court of Justice declared that key parts of the Citizenship Act relating to the first-generation limit to citizenship by descent were unconstitutional.

DOES JD VANCE HAVE A PALANTIR PROBLEM?



Diary Times Desk: In a recent conversation, Vice President JD Vance asked Roger Stone, President Donald Trump's longtime confidant, for his biggest concern facing the country. Stone later recalled on his radio show that his answer was a technology company Vance now hears about with increasing frequency: Palantir.

For years, Democrats have zeroed in on Vance's relationship with Palantir's co-founder Peter Thiel, the iconoclastic tech titan who gave Vance one of his first jobs and later put \$15 million behind his successful 2022 Ohio Senate bid.

But the pressure on Vance is now coming from inside Trump's coalition. As the administration steers billions of dollars of new work to Palantir, prominent voices have expressed fears that the firm's powerful data analytics tools could give the government sweeping, almost futuristic surveillance capabilities.

The rising unease has put Vance on the defensive. At an October gathering of young conservatives at the University of Mississippi, he bristled at "this internet meme out there that somehow I am super in bed with Palantir" when the company's name surfaced.

INDIAN VISITING GRANDCHILD IN CANADA HARASSES SCHOOL GIRLS, TO BE DEPORTED

Diary Times Desk: A 51-year-old Indian man, who was visiting Canada on a six-month visitor visa, was convicted of criminally harassing two teenage girls outside their school. Jagjit Singh, who arrived in Ontario, Canada, in July to meet his newborn grandchild, will be deported and banned from coming back to the country.

Police said soon after his arrival, Singh started frequenting the smoking area outside a local high school in the Sarnia area, where he allegedly sexually assaulted and harassed young Canadian girls.

He repeatedly approached young girls at the smoking area between September 8 and September 11, attempting to take photos with them, and spoke to them about drugs and alcohol, Canadian media reports said.

According to a report by The Winnipeg Sun, one of the complainants told police that she initially refused a photo but relented in hopes that Singh would leave if she complied.



I WATCHED HELPLESSLY AS **GUNMEN SNATCHED MY SON.** SAYS FATHER AFTER NIGERIAN **SCHOOL KIDNAPPING**

Diary Times Desk: A father has told the BBC he felt powerless as he witnessed gunmen on motorbikes abduct dozens of children, including his son, after storming a Catholic boarding school in northern Nigeria in the early hours of Friday.

The father said he was asleep when he was awoken by the noise of the gunmen as they went past his home with the children they had seized from St Mary's school in Papiri village in Niger state.

"They [the children] were being trafficked on foot the way shepherds control their herds. Some children were falling and the men would kick them and instruct them to stand up.

The gunmen were on about 50 motorcycle bikes while controlling them," said the father, whose name we have changed to Theo for his

Speaking to the BBC in the dormitory where his son used to sleep, Theo said he was in no position to stop the abduction.

"I felt like going [to help] but I thought better of it. Even if I did go, what could I do? I couldn't do anything," he told the BBC, adding that he called the police but it was too late by the time they arrived.

"SON OF A BI**H": HOW **MUSHARRAF HAD REACTED** TO PAK SCIENTIST

"LEAKING" NUKE SECRETS

Diary Times Desk: A former American spy, who led the United States' covert operation that "penetrated and sabotaged" а Pakistani nuclear trafficking network, revealed Pakistan's then-president, Pervez Musharraf, was furious when confronted with evidence that physicist Abdul Qadeer Khan was selling the country's nuclear secrets abroad. According to former CIA operations chief James Lawler, confronting Musharraf proved to be a decisive moment in dismantling one of world's most dangerous proliferation networks, with Islamabad placing Khan under years-long house arrest.

Speaking to news agency ANI, Lawler, who once headed the CIA's Counter-Proliferation Division, said that it was the CIA director George Tenet who personally briefed Musharraf with "absolutely incontrovertible evidence" that Khan was leaking sensitive Pakistani nuclear technology countries such as Libya.

"So Director George Tenet met with President Musharraf and told him that Dr Khan was betraying Pakistan's nuclear secrets to at least the Libyans and maybe others. And Musharraf's initial comment was, I'm going to kill that son of a bitch...," the former spy said.

JUST 110 KM FROM TAIWAN, CHINA LAMBASTS JAPAN'S MISSILE PLANS ON YONAGUNI ISLAND; EXPERT WARNS OF TINDERBOX RISK

Diary Times Desk: China issued a sharp rebuke on Monday against Japan's advancing plans to deploy missiles on Yonaquni Island, a remote outpost just 110 kilometers (68 miles) east of Taiwan.

The dispute, already simmering for weeks, erupted anew after Japanese media reported that Defense Minister Shinjiro Koizumi, during his first visit to the Yonaguni base, affirmed the deployment of Type 03 medium-range surface-to-air missiles was proceeding "steadily" as part of Tokyo's broader fortification of its southwestern islands.

These weapons, designed to counter incoming aircraft and air-to-ground threats, underscore Japan's deepening concerns over China's military expansion in the East China Sea and potential contingencies around Taiwan.

"The deployment can reduce the possibility of an armed attack on Japan," Koizumi said, dismissing criticisms that the move would inflame regional instability.

Yonaguni, Japan's westernmost inhabited island and a popular scuba-diving spot, has hosted a Ground Self-Defense Force camp since 2016, despite early local protests.

The base already features surveillance radars and electronic warfare units, positioning it as a frontline sentinel in any Taiwan Strait crisis.

INSIDE THE ROOM: WHAT HAPPENED DURING TRUMP AND MAMDANI'S MEETING

Diary Times Desk: They talked real estate, debated complicated zoning code, and mulled over how to get a utility giant to bring down electricity rates.

Then, they talked about what it takes to build housing in America's largest city and how the health of the five boroughs hinges on the streets being safe.

Those were some of the topics New York City Mayorelect Zohran Mamdani and President Donald Trump covered during a nearly hourlong meeting at the White House last week.

Mamdani, who arrived in Washington, DC, for sitdown Friday, made his way through the West Wing of the White House alongside three top aides, senior adviser Morris Katz, press secretary Dora Pekec and his chief of staff, Elle Bisgaard-Church, according to a person familiar with the meeting.

When it was finally time to enter the Oval, only Bisgaard-Church was invited. Inside was Trump and his own chief of staff, Susie Wiles.

DEATH TOLL CLIMBS IN SOUTHEAST ASIA AS HEAVY RAINS CAUSE FLOODS AND LANDSLIDES

Diary Times Desk: The death toll in widespread flooding and landslides caused by heavy rains in Southeast Asia mounted on Monday with another person reported killed in Vietnam, and five others in Thailand with tens of thousands of people displaced.

The total number of confirmed dead in Vietnam is now 91, with 11 others missing as the heavy rain that began a week ago has caused severe flooding and triggered landslides from Quang Tri to Lam Dong provinces, a stretch of 800 kilometers (500 miles) along the country's central region, including the highlands.

In Dak Lak, the worst hit province, 63 people were killed, mostly due to drowning. Other fatalities were from Khanh Hoa, Lam Dong, Gia Lai, Danang, Hue and Quang Tri provinces.

With roads washed out in many areas, helicopters have been deployed to drop food.

ISRAEL FIRES MILITARY COMMANDERS OVER OCTOBER 7 FAILURES

Diary Times Desk: The Israeli military has dismissed several senior officers and censured others over the failure to prevent the Hamas-led attack in October

The list of generals formally fired on Monday included those in charge of military intelligence, operations, and the southern command, which is responsible for Gaza.

The move comes despite the government having yet to launch an investigation into the attack, which launched the devastating war in the enclave.

The military had announced in a statement on Sunday that a number of officers were to be released from reserve duty and would no longer serve in the military.

"The IDF [Israeli army] failed in its primary mission on October 7th – to protect the civilians of the State of Israel," military chief of staff Eyal Zamir said.

"This is a severe, resounding, systemic failure," he continued. "The lessons of that day are numerous and significant, and they must serve as our compass for the future."

Those informed that they would be released from reserve duty included the former heads of the intelligence directorate, operations directorate, and southern command.

They had previously resigned from active service but remained on reserve duty.

The current intelligence directorate chief, who on October 7, 2023 served as chief of the operations division



DEEPEST DISCOUNT IN TWO YEARS: RUSSIA OFFERS CHEAPER URALS CRUDE TO INDIAN REFINERS

Diary Times Desk: Russian Urals crude is being offered to Indian refiners at the steepest discount in at least two years, Bloomberg reported on Monday. The shift comes as major Indian buyers, including Reliance Industries, have scaled back or halted Russian oil imports to comply with tightening Western restrictions.

The US sanctions on top Russian producers Rosneft PJSC and Lukoil PJSC have disrupted the oil trade that had boomed since 2022.

According to the report, Urals cargoes for December loading and January arrival are being offered at discounts of up to \$7 a barrel to Dated Brent on a delivered basis - more than double the previous discount of around \$3 per barrel before sanctions took effect last week.

Only about a fifth of the available cargoes are being marketed by non-sanctioned sellers, limiting options for Indian refiners that want to avoid sanctions exposure.

X'S NEW LOCATION TRANSPARENCY FEATURE UNLEASHES QUESTIONS ABOUT ORIGINS OF MAGA ACCOUNTS

Diary Times Desk :A new feature on X has stirred confusion, anger and a wave of online sleuthing after users discovered that the platform was suddenly displaying the surprising locations where certain accounts are based.

Over the weekend, users noticed that clicking on an account's join date now opens a tab that shows the country or region in which the account is located.

X's head of product, Nikita Bier, teased the feature last month as a way to help users verify the authenticity of content they read and limit the influence of troll farms, which often run political accounts from outside the countries they target.

The issue of inauthentic or "bot" accounts has plagued the platform, formerly Twitter, and other social media sites for over a decade. Perhaps most notably, inauthentic accounts on Twitter and other social media platforms were allegedly used by a Russian government operation in the runup to the 2016 election in an attempt to influence the outcome. The incident set off a wave of concern online about the persistent presence of inauthentic accounts, but detection methods to sniff out such accounts remained unreliable for years.

'NO ONE WILL SUPPORT IT': UKRAINE'S SOLDIERS REACT TO US PEACE PLAN



Diary Times Desk: Ukraine's frontline soldiers have reacted to draft US peace proposals with a mixture of defiance, anger and resignation.

The BBC spoke to half a dozen who sent us their views via social media and email in response to the original US plan – details of which were leaked last week.

Since then, American and Ukrainian negotiators have been working on changes to the proposals – and are set to continue talks about the "peace framework".

Of the original US plan, Yaroslav, in eastern Ukraine, says it "sucks...

no one will support it" while an army medic with the call sign Shtutser dismissed it as an "absolutely disgraceful draft of a peace plan, unworthy of our attention".

But one soldier with the call sign Snake told us "it's time to agree at least on something".

SEVERAL FLIGHTS CANCELLED AS ETHIOPIAN VOLCANIC ASH DRIFTS TOWARDS INDIA

Diary Times Desk: Several flights were cancelled, and Indian airlines and airports were issued an advisory to deal with possible disruptions due to the ash plume from the volcanic activity in Ethiopia. The ash cloud is moving eastward and is forecast to reach northern India by late Monday evening.

The Hayli Gubbi volcano erupted on Sunday for the first time in nearly 12,000 years, sending thick ash plumes across the Red Sea toward Yemen and Oman. The cloud has now stretched over the northern Arabian Sea.

The plumes are already reaching some parts of Rajasthan and Haryana, and the ash cloud's dense, concentrated parts are likely to move over Delhi in a few hours, according to a weather forecast. The plumes could also further plummet the air quality in Delhi, its neighbouring areas and Uttar Pradesh. However, there are low chances of any ash fall as the plumes are several thousand feet high in the atmosphere.

EXPLAINED: THE TAX TRIGGER BEHIND STEEL TYCOON LAKSHMI MITTAL'S UK EXIT

Diary Times Desk: Indian-origin billionaire Lakshmi Mittal, long based in the United Kingdom, is reportedly leaving the country as the Labour government plans major tax reforms targeting high-net-worth individuals. Mittal, currently a tax resident in Switzerland, will now spend most of his time in Dubai, according to The Times.

Why Is Lakshmi Mittal Leaving The UK? The decision appears linked to the UK's abolition of the long-standing "non-domiciled" (non-dom) tax status. There have been no official statements yet. Previously, this status allowed wealthy residents to pay taxes only on income earned in the UK, protecting global assets from inheritance

With the so-called "super-rich tax" expected to be passed in the next budget on November 26.

XI AND TRUMP HOLD PHONE TALKS ON TAIWAN, UKRAINE AND FUTURE OF US-CHINA TIES

Diary Times Desk: China's President Xi Jinping and US President Donald Trump held a phone conversation on Monday, according to China's Xinhua news agency, a call that was later confirmed by a White House official.

The discussion touched on Taiwan, the Ukraine conflict and the future direction of ties between the two countries.

Xi told Trump that "both sides should expand list of cooperation," adding that the bilateral relationship has "maintained positive momentum."

He said China and the US "should strive for more progress in bilateral ties" and "should open new space for cooperation."

On Taiwan, Xi "clarified China's position on Taiwan issue" and told Trump that the "return of Taiwan to China [is] an important part of post-war international order."

He also said the two countries "should jointly safequard victorious outcomes of World War II."

The two leaders also spoke about the conflict in Ukraine. According to Xinhua, Xi "urges all parties to reduce differences." The report noted that "China's Xi, Trump talked about Ukraine crisis."



AUSTRALIA SENATOR CONDEMNED FOR BURKA STUNT IN PARLIAMENT

Diary Times Desk: An Australian senator has provoked anger for wearing a burka in parliament, after pushing for a ban on the Muslim garment.

Pauline Hanson was condemned by fellow senators, with one accusing her of "blatant racism". Proceedings in the senate were halted as she refused to remove the item.

The Queensland senator, of the anti-immigration One Nation party, was seeking to introduce a bill that would ban full face coverings in public – a policy she has long campaigned for.

It is the second time she has worn the garment – which covers the face and body – in parliament, and said her actions were in protest at the senate rejecting her bill.

Shortly after other lawmakers blocked her from introducing the bill on Monday, she returned wearing a black burka.

"This is a racist senator, displaying blatant racism," said Mehreen Faruqi, a Muslim Greens senator from New South Wales.

Fatima Payman, an independent senator from the state of Western Australia, called the stunt "disgraceful".

TORONTO POLICE ARREST INDIAN-ORIGIN MAN ON CANADA'S MOST WANTED LIST

Diary Times Desk: Toronto police have arrested an Indian-origin man on "Canada's 25 most wanted list" with firearms and ammunition, police said.

Nicholas Singh, 24, wanted on a Canada-wide warrant for Breach of Parole, was arrested on Friday, a statement issued by the Toronto Police said. Singh was arrested with a firearm, an extended magazine, and ammunition, it added.

The police say that officials were attending the Bathurst Street and Dupont Street area when they located Singh in a vehicle.

He was arrested without any incident, it added. Singh was serving a five-year, five-month and 10-day sentence for discharging a restricted/prohibited firearm with intent, armed robbery and possessing a weapon contrary to a prohibition order when he breached his parole," City News reported.



AN UNUSUAL TREND IN THE ECONOMY IS **WORRYING THE FED**

Diary Times Desk: Something in the US economy isn't adding up, and it's rattling the people charged with wrangling inflation and keeping the labor market intact.

US companies have sharply slowed their hiring this year, hesitant to invest without knowing the full effects of President Donald Trump's sweeping economic policies. The economy lost jobs in June and August, and the average pace of job gains for the three months ending in September was only around 62,000, according to the Labor Department.

Yet workers' productivity, a key driver of economic output, remains high. And gross product, domestic which captures all the goods and services produced in the economy, has stayed robust.

That dichotomy of an expanding economy and a softening labor market presents a conundrum for policymakers at the Federal Reserve, complicating their efforts to determine whether the economy needs cooling or boosting.

DAILY MAIL OWNER STRIKES \$650 MILLION DEAL TO BUY THE TELEGRAPH

Daily Mail owner DMGT said on Saturday it had struck a 500 million pound (\$650 million) deal to buy rival newspaper The Telegraph in a tie-up that would create one of the most powerful right-leaning media groups in Britain

The deal comes a week after US-based private investment firm RedBird Capital Partners withdrew its bid for The Telegraph, one of Britain's biggest newspapers.

A RedBird-IMI joint venture had acquired the Telegraph Media Group and The Spectator magazine in 2023, only for the then-government to intervene and ban foreign state investment in UK newspapers. RedBird then sought to formally request approval from the government to proceed with the acquisition under a revised structure, with Abu Dhabibacked IMI participating as a minority investor capped at 15%.

WALL STREET BANKS SCRAMBLE TO ASSESS FALLOUT FROM HACK OF REAL-ESTATE DATA FIRM

Diary Times Desk: Hackers stole a trove of data from a company used by major Wall Street banks for realestate loans and mortgages, setting off a scramble to determine what was taken and which banks were affected, according to people familiar with the investigation and a statement from the firm.

New York-based SitusAMC, which boasts 1,500 clients, said Saturday night that account records and legal agreements related to some of its clients had been impacted in the hack.

"The incident is now contained and our services are fully operational," SitusAMC said. "No encrypting malware was involved."

The firm discovered the unauthorized access to its systems on November 12 and within a few days was warning customers that they could be affected.

It was not immediately clear who was responsible for the hack. The FBI is investigating the incident.



'WICKED: FOR GOOD' RECAPTURES BOX OFFICE MAGIC WITH \$150 **MILLION OPENING WEEKEND**

Diary Times Desk: There was no place like the movie theater for fans of "Wicked" this weekend.

Universal's "Wicked: For Good" soared to No. 1 at the weekend box office, earning \$150 million domestically and \$226 million worldwide – far outpacing its predecessor, "Wicked," which opened to \$114 million domestically during last year's pre-Thanksgiving weekend.

"It's never a guarantee that a second installment will outperform an original, especially on the opening weekend," said Paul Dergarabedian, head of marketplace trends at Comscore. "The first film, and now this movie ... created a cultural phenomenon. This was not an overnight success."

The musical fantasy film, which is a retelling inspired by the 1900 children's novel "The Wonderful Wizard of Oz," became the second-highest domestic opener of the year, behind Warner Bros.

Pictures' live-action "A Minecraft Movie" (\$162.75 million) and ahead of Disney's "Lilo & Stitch" (\$146 million). Warner Bros. Discovery is the parent company of CNN.



THE GOVERNMENT SHUTDOWN MAY HAVE MADE IT TOUGHER TO FIX THE AIR TRAFFIC CONTROLLER SHORTAGE

Diary Times Desk: America hasn't had enough air traffic controllers for more than a decade - and the recent government shutdown might have made it even worse.

The stress of not being paid for those 44 days, on top of already harsh working conditions, spurred many to leave the workforce, according to Nick Daniels, president of the National Air Traffic Controllers Association, the union representing

Transportation Secretary Sean Duffy said it also prompted many to retire early. Replacing them could take years - and the shutdown underscored the stakes when the country lacks controllers: canceled flights, delays and an even more miserable travel experience overall. Daniels wouldn't estimate the number of

controllers lost, referring CNN to the FAA. The FAA

did not respond to CNN's inquiry about the issue.





MORE AMERICANS ARE TAKING OUT RISKIER **ADJUSTABLE-RATE HOME LOANS**

WEIGHING WHETHER TO DIVORCE IN 2026? TAKING THESE STEPS NOW MAY LESSEN SOME **MONEY STRESS**

This holiday season may be filled with the usual delights and stresses of buying gifts, hosting and seeing extended family. But for some married couples, it also is a time of stress because they're contemplating whether to divorce in the new year.

One study from the University of Washington found that March is a peak month for divorce filings. And two divorce attorneys told CNN they see a surge of new clients coming in as early as January inquiring about next steps.

"They are waiting for the holidays to be over," said Kristen Shearin, a North Carolina-based divorce litigator, mediator and certified divorce financial analyst.

Given how financially fraught splitting up is, couples considering divorce might take a few steps now to prepare for what will happen if they do call it quits. Among them:

1. Learn about your state's divorce laws

"Every state is different in terms of how they deal with separation and divorce," said Lina Guillen, a divorce attorney who wrote the book Divorce and Money for NOLO, a publisher of plain-English legal information.

Diary Times Desk :Palampur is home to valiant military heroes like Major Som Nath Sharma, Captain Vikram Batra, Major Sudhir Walia and Captain Saurabh Kalia, all highly decorated Army officers who had laid down their lives for the nation. The place is also known for its natural beauty and myriad interesting attractions that make it a favourite tourist destination.

Palampur is also known as the 'Tea Capital' of north India due to sprawling gardens in and around the town. It has also become a major educational hub of Himachal Pradesh as several premier institutions such as CSK Himachal Pradesh Agriculture University, GC Negi College of Veterinary and Animal Sciences and the Council of Indian Institute of Scientific Research (CSIR-IHBT) are located here.

Palampur was once part of the Jalandhar kingdom. The town came into existence when Dr Jameson, Superintendent of **Botanical Gardens, introduced** tea bushes here in 1849. Before the 1905 Kangra earthquake, Palampur was the focal point of European tea estate owners. Since then Kangra tea has gained global recognition.

SC RULING PUTS 60% OF ARAVALLIS AT RISK

Diary Times Desk Environmentalists expressed serious concern over the future of the Aravalli range, particularly in Haryana, after the Supreme Court removed protection for hills with an elevation of less than 100 metres. In its recent order, while banning issuance of new mining licences, the court accepted an updated definition of the Aravalli hill range submitted by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change. Under this definition, all hills below 100 metres are excluded from local relief and mining protection.

Experts warn this change could open up nearly 60 per cent of the entire Aravalli system to mining activities, posing a severe threat to biodiversity and climate resilience across North India. They have urged the court to reconsider the implications of adopting a uniform elevation-based definition for the ancient mountain.

"Destruction of these smaller hills would result in India's oldest mountain range losing its continuity which would lead to more gaps created in the range from where dust storms and the Thar desert would advance towards Eastern Rajasthan, Western Uttar Pradesh, Haryana and Delhi-NCR.

HIGH COURT ALLOWS HPSC'S APPEAL IN SELECTION PROCESS OF AYURVEDIC MEDICAL OFFICERS

This unmanned underwater robot can remove ocean trash

Marine litter is a major environmental problem. Abandoned containers and fishing gear can trap or strangle animals, and plastic waste can break down into microplastics, which can release chemicals into the water that get into the food chain. Some research suggests that eating microplastic might even interfere with plankton's ability to store carbon at the bottom of the ocean. which could impact climate change.

Between 1950 and 2020, 32 million metric tons of plastic accumulated in the ocean, according to one estimate — the weight of over 200,000 blue

whales. Without anv additional action, that figure is expected to reach 76 million tons by 2040.

A team of researchers and students is trying to change that - with an autonomous diving robot that can detect and retrieve litter from the seabed.

Smart Grapple, The developed at the Technical Munich University of (TUM), in Germany, uses an Al system to identify individual bits of trash using an onboard camera or, in murky water, sonar imaging.

It then grasps the object with its four-fingered hand - capable of lifting items up to around a meter (3 feet) long and wide, and weighing 250 kilograms (550 pounds) - and brings it to the surface. There, the waste is deposited on a small autonomous boat which takes it to the shore for recycling

The diving robot is 115 centimeters (45 inches) high, with a diameter of 70 centimeters (28 inches), and weighs 120 kilograms (265 pounds).

It's connected to the boat by a cable which provides it with power, although it is also capable of moving underwater via its own

Stefan Sosnowski, head of the research team at TUM, says the cable also aids the robot in bringing heavy items up to the surface.

"We can use the cable as basically the cable of a crane, and then the winch can pull up the system, which is more efficient than the little robot trying to swim things up," he explains.

Once the Smart Grapple has identified the item of trash, it displays it in 3D to pinpoint precisely how to grasp it securely in its powerful hand. A complex set of sensors ensure it exerts enough force to hold onto the object without breaking it into smaller pieces.

Nicolas Hoischen, a doctoral student at TUM, who has worked on the Smart Grapple for two years, says "the most satisfying part" has been seeing the robot in action.

"Because of course then you're projecting back two years ago, when you had a single arm, or maybe some small joint, and then you see the full grapple and it's really breathtaking and amazing to see, in two years, how far we can go," he says



Eradicate Feral Cats

NEW ZEALAND SAYS IT'S GOING

N ew Zealand has announced plans to eradicate feral cats by 2050, as part of efforts to protect the country's biodiversity.

Speaking to Radio New Zealand on Thursday. conservation minister Tama Potaka said that feral cats are "stone cold killers" and would be added to the country's Predator Free 2050 list, which aims to eradicate those animals that have a negative impact on species such as birds. bats, lizards and insects

Cats had previously been excluded from the list, which includes species ferrets, such as stoats, weasels, rats and possums, but Potaka used the interview to announce a Uturn.

He defined a feral cat as a wild animal that lives independently of humans. "They kill to survive." he said.

Among the options on the table to eradicate feral cats

are poisoned sausage bait and a type of poison that would be sprayed from a device on a tree as they walk past. Potaka said

"In order to boost biodiversity, to boost heritage landscape and to boost the type of place we want to see, we've got to get rid of some of these killers," he said

In a statement published Friday, Potaka added more details to the plan. "We know people want their local reserves, beaches and bush tracks to be full of birds, not predators," he said. "Feral cats are now found across Aotearoa New Zealand, from farms to forests, and they put huge pressure on native birds, bats, lizards and insects," added Potaka.

The ministry said that more than 100 short-tailed bats were killed in a single

week by feral cats near the town of Ohakune on the North Island, and they have also contributed to the near-extinction of the southern dotterel on Stewart Island

"They also spread toxoplasmosis, which harms dolphins, affects people, and costs farmers through lost stock," he said.

The statement also revealed that more than 90% of the nearly 3,400 submissions received from the public as part of a recent consultation strategy backed improved feral cat management.

Jessi Morgan, chief executive of the Predator Free New Zealand Trust, a conservation organization that works to protect the country's native species, hailed the decision in an opinion piece published in local media outlet The Post on Friday.

"In June, when the Department of Conservation opened the Predator Free 2050 strategy up for consultation, they asked the public about feral cats," she wrote. "The response was loud and clear; feral cats belong on the target list."

Officials will release more details on the plan in an updated version of the Predator Free 2050 Strategy, which is scheduled for release in

n a recent conversation, Vice President JD Vance asked Roger Stone, President Donald Trump's confidant, longtime for concern facing the biggest country. Stone later recalled on his radio show that his answer was a technology company Vance now hears about with increasing frequency: Palantir.

For years, Democrats have zeroed in on Vance's relationship with Palantir's co-founder Peter Thiel, the iconoclastic tech titan who gave Vance one of his first iobs and later put \$15 million behind his successful 2022 Ohio Senate bid.

But the pressure on Vance is now coming from inside Trump's why not bring one coalition. As the administration steers billions of dollars of new work to Palantir, prominent voices have expressed fears that the firm's powerful data analytics tools could give the government almost futuristic sweeping, surveillance capabilities. MAGA architect Steve Bannon has likened Palantir to a sci-fi villain while comedian Joe Rogan called the company "creepy" on his top-ranked podcast.

The rising unease has put Vance on the defensive. At an October gathering of young conservatives at the University of Mississippi, he bristled at "this internet meme out there that somehow I am

super in bed with Palantir" when the company's name surfaced. "Palantir is a private company, Vance added. "They sometimes do a useful service, and sometimes they're going to do things that we don't like. Since rising to the national scene, Vance has served as a bridge between the GOP's populist wing and the tech world he once occupied as a venture capitalist and biotech executive. He joined the Republican ticket last year with the backing of Bannon and former Fox News host Tucker Carlson, but also with the expectation he could convince his Silicon Valley allies to open their wallets for the

Palantir's emergence as an unlikely flashpoint comes amid a growing divide within the party over Trump's alliance with billionaire technology entrepreneurs. The tensions underscore the challenge ahead for Vance as he takes a leading role in helping to hold together Trump's movement — a task with clear implications for his own political ambitions.

Vance's office did not respond to a request for comment. A spokesperson for Palantir pointed CNN to a lengthy statement the company published in June, which seeks to rebut what it describes as "recurrent misconceptions" about

"We are not a surveillance company," the statement reads. "We do not sell personal data of any kind. We don't provide data



mining as a service."

A contracting behemoth

Founded two decades ago with a funding boost from American intelligence agencies, Palantir has become a go-to contractor for governments and businesses confronting enormous and complex data problems. Federal agencies, local police departments and foreign militaries increasingly rely on its software and Al models, but so do aerospace companies, hospitals and the makers of a pickleball paddle

Palantir's government portfolio grew during Trump's first term and expanded further under President Joe Biden

CEO Alex Karp backed Democrat Kamala Harris for president, but like many of his tech peers, he quickly pivoted after Trump won.

Diary Times Desk: Michelangelo Buonarroti was born in 1475 in Caprese, southeast of Florence, to an impoverished Florentine family of minor nobility. In the sixteenth century, when longevity was exceptional, he lived to eighty-eight, dying in Rome in 1564 as an extremely famous and wealthy man.

Throughout his life, Michelangelo drew constantly. It was through drawing that he planned and prepared his projects, developed his inventions, and refined his ideas.

Unfortunately, the surviving sheets by his hand, numbering roughly six hundred, total only a fraction of the thousands of drawings he must have produced.

Very rarely new drawings have been rediscovered and added to Michelangelo's graphic corpus over the decades. Almost all of Michelangelo's known studies, excluding architectural drawings and the sketches of marble blocks Michelangelo used to send to his quarry masters, are now in public collections. Only about ten sheets, including this newly discovered drawing, are in private hands. Furthermore, no recorded study for the Sistine Chapel has ever come to auction — until now.

The Sistine Chapel ceiling

In the two decades between 1500 and 1520 Michelangelo was in his physical and artistic prime. At that time, he lived and worked between Florence and Rome, undertaking several of the most prestigious and monumental projects of his career, including a commission from Rome by Pope Julius II della Rovere to paint the enormous vault of the Sistine Chapel in the Vatican.

The enterprise was ambitious, as the surface of the vault measures about 530 square meters (5,700 square feet), yet Michelangelo conceived an elaborate decorative program for it.

He designed a painted illusionistic architectural framework simulating white marble with, at the center of the vault, nine compartments with episodes from the Book of Genesis. Flanking the biblical scenes are twenty ignudi (athletic nude youths) seated on illusionistic plinths next to fictive bronze medallions with episodes from the Book of Maccabees. Below these figures, seven monumental Prophets alternate with five Sibyls, each seated on a throne around the ceiling. Immediately after receiving the commission for the Sistine ceiling, Michelangelo began working on studies for the frescoes. Over the following months and years, he continued to produce studies, proceeding piecemeal as he painted the ceiling gradually, completing one bay of the vault after another. Through preparatory drawings Michelangelo studied each of the figures, meticulously planning every detail of their poses and anatomy.
