#### NEHRU BETRAYED VANDE MATARAM, COMPROMISED ITS SPIRIT UNDER MUSLIM LEAGUE PRESSURE: PM



Diary Times Desk: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday said that the first Prime Minster Jawaharlal Nehru 'betrayed Vande Mataram by compromising its spirit under the pressure of Muslim League and Congress policy of appeasement later had it accept the Partition of India too.

Initiating a special discussion on "The 150th Anniversary of the National Song" in the Lok Sabha today, the Prime Minister said the Muslim League leader — MA Jinnah — first intensified his opposition to Vande Mataram on October 15, 1937, from Lucknow, and on October 20, Nehru wrote to Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose associating with Jinnah's sentiments and noting that Vande Mataram's Anandmath background had the potential to "irritate

Quoting Mahatma Gandhi on Vande Mataram, PM Modi said there were forces and urges that got the better of even Gandhi's views about Vande Mataram. Gandhi, writing in Indian Opinion, a weekly published from South Africa, on December 2, 1905, said: The song Vande Mataram, composed by Bankim Chandra, has become extremely popular in Bengal. During the swadeshi revolution, Bengal saw massive rallies where lakhs congregated and sang Bankim's song. The song has become so popular it seems as if it has become our National Anthem. Its sentiments are lofty and it is sweeter than the songs of other nations. Its sole objective is to inspire us to win freedom. It sees India as a mother and inspires us to worship it." Recalling the genesis of Vande Mataram from 1875 when Bankim Chandra Chatterjee first wrote it, the PM asked if the song was so great, its sentiments lofty and if it had the strength to bind Indians across regions into one thread of unity against the British, "why was there betrayal with Vande Mataram in the bygone century?"

Diary Times Desk : Congress MP Priyanka Gandhi Vadra on Monday dismissed Prime Minister Narendra Modi's claim that Jawaharlal Nehru had written to Subhash Chandra Bose saying the origins of Vande Mataram may incite Muslims, stating that the Prime Minister had selectively quoted from the letter during his address in the Lok Sabha

Citing the 1937 letter written by former Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru to Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose, Priyanka Gandhi said, "The so-called objection against the remaining stanzas of Vandra Mataram was manufactured by the communalists." went on to say that PM Modi did not mention this part in his speech. Earlier in the day, PM Modi, citing Nehru's letter to Subhash Chandra Bose, said that the first Indian Prime Minister had accepted Muhammad Ali Jinnah's sentiments on Vande Mataram. PM Modi went on to quote Nehru as saying that he had communicated to Bose that the background of Vande Mataram might end up instigating Muslims. "On October 20, Nehru wrote to Netaji, informing him that he accepted Jinnah's sentiments regarding Vande Mataram. He noted that the song's Anandamath association could instigate Muslims." I have read the background of Vande Mataram, and I believe this context may indeed offend Muslims.' Nehru wrote to Bose," PM Modi had said in the Parliament.

IndIGo has been facing heat from both the government and the passengers for cancelling hundreds of flights since December 2, citing regulatory changes in the pilots' new flight duty and regulations norms, which resulted in lakhs of passengers getting stuck at airports pan-India. #### BILL TO LEVY NATIONAL SECURITY CESS ON PAN MASALA RETURNED TO LOK SABHA



Diary Times Desk: In a move projected as essential for safeguarding both national and public health priorities, the Rajya Sabha on Monday returned The Health Security se National Security Cess Bill, 2025, to the Lok Sabha after a detailed consideration.

The legislation proposes a new cess on pan masala. tobacco and other "demerit goods" to create a dedicated revenue stream for national security and health security.

The Bill comes at a critical moment, with the existing GST levied atop the 28% GST on these products — being phased out. The new cess, capped at 40%, is intended to replace that revenue without disturbing the GST architecture. "This is a dedicated and predictable resource stream for two domains of national importance." Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said while moving the Bill. Stressing that the levy targets only demerit goods and not essential commodities, she added, "It does not burden the common man. It acts as a deterrent for those who consume harmful products and does not alter the GST regime."

#### **BRS WELCOMES HEALTH AND NATIONAL SECURITIES BILL, SEEKS PROTECTION FOR 7** LAKH BEEDI WORKERS



Diary Times Desk: BRS Parliamentary Party Deputy Leader and Rajya and National Securities Bill-2025, calling the proposal to share revenue from increased cess on tobacco products with States a positive step. He said the BRS extended its support for the bill.

Speaking in the Rajya Sabha, Ravichandra cautioned that the cess hike could hurt beedi workers, especially nearly 7 lakh workers who were mostly poor and women in rural areas of Adilabad, Nizamabad, Karimnagar, Warangal and Khammam districts. He urged the Centre to provide alternative livelihoods, including a Rs 1.5 lakh grant per worker, jobs in food processing units, skill development, and support for those shifting to agriculture.

The BRS MP also raised alarm over rising cases of mouth and throat cancer caused by gutka, pan masala and other tobacco products, especially among beedi workers who comprise around 16 of every 100 patients admitted to Hyderabad's MNJ Hospital, which is higher than the national average. He warned the numbers could reach alarming levels by 2030.

He sought more de-addiction centres, regular screening, free health services, and stronger publicity on the dangers of tobacco. He also called for stricter vigilance as tobacco products continue to flood tea stalls and pan shops under misleading labels.

### DGCA PANEL PROBING INDIGO FLIGHT DISRUPTIONS LIKELY TO SUMMON CEO. COO ON WEDNESDAY: SOURCE

**Diary Times Desk:** The Directorate General of Civil Aviation-appointed panel investigating the flight disruptions at IndiGo is likely to summon the airline's CEO Pieter Elbers and Chief Operating Officer Isidre Porqueras on Wednesday as part of the ongoing probe, according to a source on Monday. The four-member panel, comprising Joint DG Sanjay Brahamane, Deputy Director General Amit Gupta, senior Flight Operations Inspector Kapil Manglik, and FOI Lokesh Rampal, has been tasked with identifying the root causes of widespread operational disruptions. Its mandate includes assessing manpower planning, fluctuating rostering systems, and the airline's preparedness to implement the latest duty period and rest norms for pilots. The panel, announced by Director General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) Faiz Ahmed Kidwai on December 5, will also review the extent of compliance with the revised FDTL provisions, including analysis of gaps admitted by the airline and ascertain the accountability and responsibility for planning failures that led to the breakdown of operational stability, among others.

### SUPREME COURT ORDERS 30 PER CENT SEATS FOR WOMEN ADVOCATES IN STATE BAR COUNCILS

**Diary Times Desk:** The Supreme Court on Monday directed that 30 per cent seats in state Bar councils, where the election process has not been set in motion, be kept for women advocates.

A bench of Chief Justice Surya Kant and Justice Joymalya Bagchi said for the current year, the state Bar councils where elections are yet to be held should fill 20 per cent seats with women candidates and 10 per cent by co-option if there are not many desirous lawyers to contest. The top court directed that a proposal for co-option shall be placed before the court in regard to the state Bar councils where the number of contesting women lawyers are inadequate. At the outset, senior advocate Manan Kumar Mishra, who is also the chairperson of the Bar Council of India (BCI), informed the bench that the election process as per court's earlier direction has commenced in six Bar bodies with notification of the poll. He submitted that BCI, in principle, is of the view that there should be at least 30 per cent women's reservation in the state Bar councils, and suggested that for the present year, the councils should be permitted to fill up the posts by co-opting women candidates.



### IN MODI'S VANDE MATARAM REMARKS, RICH REFERENCES TO BENGAL, TAMIL NADU

Diary Times Desk: At a time of constant political jousting with the ruling Trinamool Congress and DMK of West Bengal and Tamil Nadu respectively, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday made rich references to both the states when recalling the glories of Vande Mataram, the National Song. Bengal featured repeatedly in PM's speech on the 150th anniversary of Vande Mataram, which was written by Bankim Chandra Chatterjee in 1875 and included in his epic 'Anandmath' in 1882. PM Modi spoke of the Song written in the aftermath of the 1857 war of independence which made the British realise that "they could not rule over India without dividing it". "The song was written at a time of a conspiracy to take the British song 'God save the gueen' to every house. At that time, Bankim Babu dared the British and wrote the song that united Indians in the common cause of freedom. The British soon realised that they needed to divide India to rule and that is how they partitioned Bengal," said Modi. The PM said there was a time when the British saw Bengal's intellectual might as the core of India's inspiration for freedom.

#### 'WHO APPLAUDED JINNAH — IT WAS ADVANI': JAIRAM AFTER PM MODI ATTACKS NEHRU IN LOK SABHA

#### INDIGO CRISIS REACHES SC; CJI REFUSES URGENT HEARING, SAYS GOVT HAS TAKEN COGNISANCE

Diary Times Desk: As hundreds of IndiGo flights continue to get cancelled, a petition was moved in the Supreme Court on Monday seeking judicial intervention to deal with the crisis. On behalf of the petitioner, 'IndiGo All Passenger and Another', an advocate mentioned the matter before a Bench led by the Chief Justice of India (CJI) and sought urgent listing of the petition on the ground that more than 2,500 flights have been cancelled and a large number of passengers were facing problems. However, a Bench led by CJI Surya Kant refused to list the petition for urgent hearing, saying the Government had already taken cognisance of the issue. "It is a serious matter. Lakhs of people are stranded at airports. We know the Government of India has taken timely action and coanizance of the issue. Let them handle it...We know people may have health issues etc.," the CJI told the petitioner's counsel. Over 250 IndiGo flights from the Delhi and Bengaluru airports were reportedly cancelled on Monday as disruptions in the airline's operations entered the seventh day.

#### DELHI FAMILY'S LONG-AWAITED GOA BREAK ENDS IN NIGHTCLUB BLAZE; RELATIVES SCRAMBLE TO SHELTER KIDS

**Diary Times Desk:** Vinod Kumar, along with his wife and her three sisters, left Delhi less than a week ago for their long-awaited vacation in Goa, as his mother watched them step out with bags and bade them a cheery farewell.

On Monday, she sat by the same door waiting, unaware that her younger son, elder daughter-in-law and two close relatives would never return after losing their lives in a fire. The massive blaze in the early hours of Sunday tore through a Goan nightclub in Arpora, killing 25 people. Four of the five Delhi residents, all members of Kumar's family, were among those who died. The fifth, Bhavna Joshi, survived with injuries, police said. The deceased were identified as Vinod Kumar (43), Kamla Joshi (42), Anita Joshi (41) and Saroj Joshi (39). The injured, Bhavna, is Vinod's wife and a sister to the three deceased women. Kamla was married to Vinod's elder brother. Naveen. Their relatives said the four sisters had been planning the trip for months -- hoping for a few days of rest now that their children were older and no longer wholly dependent on them. Vinod had accompanied them so that they would feel safe and supported during the journey.

#### 'DEEPLY SHAKEN BY TRAGIC LOSS': GOA CLUB OWNER SAURABH LUTHRA SAYS 'PROFOUNDLY GRIEVED' BY FIRE

Diary Times Desk: A day after a devastating fire at Birch By Romeo Lane in North Goa claimed 25 lives and left several injured, the club's owner, Saurabh Luthra, on Monday expressed "profound grief" and assured full cooperation to authorities and families affected by the tragedy. The blaze erupted in the early hours of Sunday at the upscale club located in North Goa's Arpora. Luthra said the management stands in "unwavering solidarity with the families of the deceased as well as those injured" and offered "heartfelt condolences with utmost sincerity".

In a post shared on Instagram, Luthra wrote, "The management expresses profound grief and is deeply shaken by the tragic loss of lives resulting from the unfortunate incident at Birch. In this hour of sorrow and distress, the management stands in unwavering solidarity with the families of the deceased as well as those injured, and conveys its heartfelt condolences with utmost sincerity."

### ELGAR PARISHAD BHIMA KOREGAON CASE: FORMER DELHI UNIVERSITY PROFESSOR HANY BABU WALKS FREE AFTER 5 YEARS

Diary Times Desk: Former Delhi University associate professor and social iustice advocate Hany Babu Tharavil was released from prison this week after more than five years of incarceration in the Elgar Parishad Bhima Koregaon case. His release followed an order of the Bombay High Court granting him regular bail, observing that his continued detention without a completed trial or framed charges violated his constitutional right to liberty. Babu, who taught English and linguistics at Delhi University, is known for his work on language rights, caste justice and academic freedom. Before his arrest, he was widely regarded as a scholar who encouraged critical thinking and supported campaigns for marginalised communities. He was arrested by the National Investigation Agency (NIA) in July 2020 under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA). The agency accused him of having links with banned Maoist groups and participating in an alleged conspiracy connected to the violence that broke out near Bhima Koregaon in January 2018. Babu has consistently denied the charges, asserting that he was targeted for his academic and rights-based work rather than any criminal activity.



## 'DONALD TRUMP AVENUE', HYDERABAD'S BOLD MOVE TO GRAB GLOBAL ATTENTION. BJP REACTS



Diary Times Desk: Telangana Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy has proposed naming a primary road in Hyderabad after US President Donald Trump, a move aimed at grabbing global attention ahead of the "Telangana Rising Global Summit". The road running alongside the city's US Consulate General will be designated "Donald Trump Avenue".

This isn't the only road being renamed; the state is also honouring global business and technology pioneers. 'Google Street' will acknowledge the tech giant's significant presence, while 'Microsoft Road' and 'Wipro Junction' are also under consideration. The 100-metre 'Greenfield Radial Road' will be named after Padma Bhushan Ratan Tata, with the Raviryala interchange already designated the "Tata Interchange".

Chief Minister Reddy believes naming roads after influential figures and corporations serves a dual purpose: paying tribute and inspiring commuters, while boosting Hyderabad's global recognition.

However, Union Minister and BJP leader Bandi Sanjay Kumar has criticised the move, suggesting Hyderabad should be renamed "Bhagyanagar" instead. "If the Congress government is so eager to change names, they might as well start with something that actually has history and meaning," he posted on X. Revanth Reddy is renaming places after "whoever trends", he said.

The Telangana Rising Global Summit, scheduled for December 8-9, aims to position the state as a hub for innovation-driven development, attracting global investments and partnerships.

# TRUMP 'DISAPPOINTED' THAT ZELENSKYY HAS NOT YET READ USAUTHORED PROPOSAL TO END RUSSIAUKRAINE WAR

Diary Times Desk: President Donald Trump on Sunday claimed Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy "isn't ready" to sign off on a US-authored peace proposal aimed at ending the Russia-Ukraine war. Trump was critical of Zelenskyy after US and Ukrainian negotiators completed three days of talks on Saturday aimed at trying to narrow differences on the US administration's proposal. But in an exchange with reporters on Sunday night, Trump suggested that the Ukrainian leader is holding up the talks from moving forward. I'm a little bit disappointed that President Zelenskyy hasn't yet read the proposal, that was as of a few hours ago. His people love it, but he hasn't," Trump claimed in an exchange with reporters before taking part in the Kennedy Centre Honours. The president added, "Russia is, I believe, fine with it, but I'm not sure that Zelenskyy's fine with it. His people love it. But he isn't ready."

# THAILAND LAUNCHES AIRSTRIKES ALONG DISPUTED BORDER WITH CAMBODIA

**Diary Times Desk:** Thailand launched airstrikes along the disputed border with Cambodia on Monday as both sides accused the other of attacking first.

Tensions have simmered since the Southeast Asian neighbours signed a truce agreement in October pushed by US President Donald Trump after their territorial disputes led to five days of combat in July that killed dozens of soldiers and civilians.

Thai army spokesperson Maj Gen Winthai Suvaree said the Cambodian troops fired first into Thai territory in multiple areas. He said one Thai soldier was killed and four other soldiers were wounded, and civilians were being evacuated from the affected areas. Thailand used aircraft "to strike military targets in several areas to suppress Cambodian supporting fire attacks," he said. Cambodian Defence Ministry spokesperson Maly Socheata said the Thai military attacked the Cambodian troops first. She said Cambodia did not retaliate during the initial attacks on Monday. "Cambodia urges that Thailand immediately stop all hostile activities that threaten peace and stability in the region," she said. The USbrokered ceasefire that ended the brief conflict was threatened last month after Thai troops were injured by land mines. Both sides continue to trade accusations over responsibility, even as they are supposed to be cooperating in getting rid of the

### TRUMP SAYS NETFLIX DEAL TO BUY WARNER BROS. 'COULD BE PROBLEM' BECAUSE OF SIZE OF MARKET SHARE

Diary Times Desk: President Donald Trump said on Sunday that a deal struck by Netflix to buy Warner Bros. Discovery "could be a problem" because of the size of the combined market share. "There's no question about it," Trump said, answering questions about the deal and various other topics as he walked the red carpet at the Kennedy Centre Honours. The Republican president said he would be involved in the decision about whether the federal government should approve the USD 72 billion deal. If approved by regulators, the merger would put two of the world's biggest streaming services under the same ownership and join Warner's television and motion picture division, including DC Studios, with Netflix's vast library and its production arm. The deal, which could reshape the entertainment industry, has to "go through a process and we'll see what happens," Trump said. "Netflix is a great company. They've done a phenomenal job. Ted is a fantastic man," he said of Netflix CEO Ted Sarandos, noting that they met in the Oval Office last week before the deal was announced Dec. 5.



# AUSTRIAN WOMAN REPORTEDLY LEFT TO FREEZE TO DEATH BY BOYFRIEND IDENTIFIED AS KERSTIN GURTNER

**Diary Times Desk:** The woman who allegedly froze to death after being abandoned near the summit of Austria's highest mountain has been identified as 33-year-old Kerstin Gurtner, reports New York Post.

Gurtner died on January 19 less than 150 feet below the peak of Grossglockner during a night climb led by her boyfriend, 39-year-old experienced mountaineer Thomas Plamberger, according to the Daily Mail. Gurtner, who described herself on social media as a "winter child" and a "mountain person," reportedly had little experience with highaltitude alpine climbing.

Plamberger has now been charged with negligent homicide for planning and guiding the demanding winter ascent, which required the pair to climb more than 12,000 feet in temperatures around -4°F. According to the Innsbruck public prosecutor's office, the couple became effectively stranded from around 8:50 p.m. onward.

### TOKYO DISMISSES CHINA'S RADAR-LOCK ACCUSATION AS TENSIONS RISE OVER TAIWAN REMARKS

**Diary Times Desk:** Japan on Monday rejected China's accusation that interference by its Self-Defence Forces (SDF) led to Chinese military aircraft locking fire-control radars on Japanese fighters, calling the claim "baseless" amid heightened tensions following Japan's Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi's recent comments on a potential Taiwan contingency, Kyodo News reported.

Speaking at a press briefing, Japan's Chief Cabinet Secretary Minoru Kihara said that the country's Air Self-Defence Force (ASDF) jets maintained a "safe distance" from Chinese aircraft during the incident off Okinawa on Saturday.

He stressed that clear communication between the defence authorities of both nations remains "extremely important", even as China continues to retaliate diplomatically over Takaichi's earlier remarks on Tokyo's possible response to an attack on Taiwan, as reported by Kyodo News. According to Japan's Defence Ministry, Chinese J–15 fighters from the Chinese carrier Liaoning locked their radars on an ASDF F–15 at around 4:32 pm (local time) and again on another aircraft at 6:37 pm (local time) on Saturday over international waters southeast of Okinawa.



#### AIR AMBULANCE FOR BANGLADESH'S EX-PM KHALEDA ZIA TO LAND IN DHAKA ON TUESDAY

**Diary Times Desk:** An air ambulance arranged to fly Bangladesh's critically ill former prime minister Khaleda Zia to London for medical treatment will land in Dhaka on Tuesday, aviation officials have said.

A senior official at the Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh (CAAB) said on Sunday the aircraft has been allotted an 8 am landing slot on Tuesday, with a departure time of 9 pm the same day, news portal bdnews24.com reported.

According to tbsnews.net, the Qatar government has arranged the aircraft, renting it from the Germany-based FAI Aviation Group after opting for a replacement air ambulance to conduct the long-range medical evacuation.

FAI Aviation Group's initial application had sought clearance to land on Tuesday and depart for London on Wednesday. Zia, the 80-year-old Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) chairperson, has been receiving treatment for multiple ailments at Dhaka-based Evercare Hospital for nearly two weeks.

#### MEA URGES CHINA TO PROVIDE ASSURANCES INDIAN TRAVELLERS NOT TO BE HARASSED AT AIRPORTS

Diary Times Desk: The Ministry of External Affairs on Monday sought "assurances" from China that Indian citizens transiting through Chinese airports will not be "selectively targeted, arbitrarily detained or harassed" and that Beijing will "respect" regulations governing international air travel.

Addressing the weekly press briefing, MEA Spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal also issued a travel advisory warning Indians travelling to or transiting through China to "exercise due discretion."

Jaiswal was responding to media queries when asked what the MEA recommends for Indian nationals travelling to or through China after an Indian woman from Arunachal Pradesh, Pema Wangjom Thongdok, was detained at Shanghai Airport for 18 hours last month, with Chinese officials claiming her Indian passport was invalid since Arunachal Pradesh is part of China. "We fully share your concern following the recent incident at Shanghai airport that you have cited. We expect the Chinese authorities to provide assurances that Indian citizens transiting through Chinese airports will not be selectively targeted, arbitrarily detained or harassed and that regulations governing international air travel will be respected by the Chinese side," Jaiswal said.

### QUAD UNDERSCORES INDO-PACIFIC DISASTER PREPAREDNESS AT 4TH ANNUAL HADR STRATEGIC MEET

**Diary Times Desk:** Reinforcing its longstanding commitment to a stable, secure and resilient Indo-Pacific, the Quad convened the 4th Annual Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Response (HADR) Strategic Meeting and Tabletop Exercise in Honolulu, Hawaii, the Ministry of External Affairs stated on Monday.

In a release, the MEA stated that the meeting that took place between December 2 and December 5 was hosted by the United States, and the exercise brought together senior government officials from India, Australia, Japan and the US to sharpen collective disaster-response coordination across the region. ### BRAZIL STEPS UP DIPLOMACY TO CONTAIN RISK OF POSSIBLE US STRIKE ON VENEZUELA

Diary Times Desk: The Lula administration has placed the escalating Venezuela–US tensions at the top of Brazil's diplomatic agenda, following intelligence assessments warning of a possible US airstrike on Venezuelan territory. As first reported by Valour Economico, officials at the Planalto Palace believe recent American military activity in the Caribbean signals preparations for a potential offensive, prompting political, defence and humanitarian alerts within the Brazilian government, as reported by Brasil 247.

According to internal evaluations, President Lula is manoeuvring on two parallel tracks: first, trying to prevent any initial strike, and second, preparing diplomatic strategies to contain regional fallout should an attack occur. Despite Washington's hardening tone, Brasilia still hopes to maintain a channel of communication between Caracas and the United States

#### PAKISTAN: NOKUNDI ATTACK SENDS SHOCKWAVES THROUGH FOREIGN INVESTMENT IN BALOCHISTAN

**Diary Times Desk:** The recent militant attack on the residential compound linked to the Reko Diq and Saindak mining projects in Nokundi, Balochistan, has marked a significant escalation in the region's conflict and raised serious alarm among foreign investors.

The assault, carried out in the late hours of November 30, targeted a facility housing foreign engineers and staff working on Pakistan's most valuable mineral projects.

According to a statement issued by the Balochistan Liberation Front (BLF), the operation was conducted by its newly formed Saddo Operational Battalion (SOB). The attack began with a suicide bombing at the entrance of the Frontier Corps headquarters, followed by an armed breach into the residential zone.

The group claimed its fighters held their positions against Pakistani security forces for more than 36 hours, making it one of the most prolonged and coordinated assaults in recent years.

#### INDIA SENDS MORE NAVAL SHIPS TO SRI LANKA WITH RELIEF SUPPLIES UNDER OPERATION SAGAR BANDHU

Diary Times Desk: India has expanded its humanitarian assistance to Sri Lanka in the aftermath of the recent cyclone, with four more naval ships deployed to deliver essential relief material as part of Operation Sagar Bandhu, the Indian Navy said on Monday.

According to the Navy, INS Gharial, LCU 54 LCU 51and LCU 57 have been tasked with transporting humanitarian assistance and disaster relief (HADR) stores to affected regions across Sri Lanka.

Three of the ships, LCU 54, LCU 51 and LCU 57, reached Colombo on the morning of December 7 and handed over critical supplies to local authorities. INS Gharial is expected to arrive in Trincomalee on December 8 to continue the relief operations. The latest deployment follows earlier assistance delivered by INS Vikrant, INS Udaygiri and INS Sukanya, which carried out relief missions and helicopter-borne search and rescue operations under the ongoing effort. With 1,000 tonnes of relief supplies onboard, this mission reinforces the strong people-to-people ties between India and Sri Lanka.

### FAO FLAGS LOW SOIL FERTILITY AND SEVERE NUTRIENT DEFICIENCY ACROSS PAKISTAN



Diary Times Desk: During the observance of 'World Soil Day, on Friday, the Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) of the United Nations released a new assessment indicating that Pakistan's soils are generally characterised by low fertility and significant nutrient deficiencies, as reported by Dawn. According to the FAO analysis, the levels of organic matter in most soils are alarmingly low, compromising soil structure and diminishing water retention capacity. As of 2022, approximately 36 million hectares are categorised as agricultural land, with around 30.2 million hectares dedicated to arable farming, 5 million hectares for permanent meadows and pastures, and 0.72 million hectares allocated to permanent crops. Additionally, around 2.5 million hectares of the nation's territory is classified as forest land. The soil primarily exhibits alkaline traits, with vast areas suffering from issues of salinity and sodicity, especially in irrigated farming regions. The analysis also highlights that erosion and pollution are prevalent problems. It recommended the establishment of a comprehensive national soil policy.

Diary Times Desk: Israeli President Isaac Herzog sharply criticized New York City's mayor-elect, Zohran Mamdani, for comments he described as "outrageous" and harmful to Jewish communities during a speech at Yeshiva University in New York City. Herzog said the mayor-elect's remarks questioning Jews' right to move to Israel and participate in traditional Zionist practices not only delegitimize the Jewish people's ancient homeland but also "legitimize violence and undermine freedom of religion." He labeled such rhetoric both anti-Jewish and anti-American. Herzog, who was presented with an honorary doctorate, described a climate in which Holocaust inversion, conspiracy theories, and new forms of Jew-hatred proliferate online and in public discourse. He noted that while overt slurs have become socially unacceptable, targeting Jews under the guise of anti-Zionism.

### INDIA-AUSTRALIA REVIEW EDUCATION TIES "FROM PRE-SCHOOL TO PHD" AS TOP AUSTRALIAN UNIVERSITY GETS NOD TO SET UP CAMPUS IN INDIA

### NINE REPORTEDLY DISAPPEARED AFTER DETENTIONS IN QUETTA, TURBAT AND KARACHI CTD RAID

**Diary Times Desk:** Reports from different regions of Balochistan suggest that Pakistani forces in Quetta and Turbat reportedly apprehended nine individuals and have since vanished, as per The Balochistan Post (TBP).

Eight men were allegedly detained late on Tuesday during a wedding celebration. Their current location remains unknown since the arrest.

In a different incident in Turbat, a university student's family has been notified that Noor Khan, the son of Nazar Muhammad and a student at Turbat University, was taken by Pakistani security forces on Wednesday night.

Family members assert that he has been unaccounted for since the purported detention. Human rights groups have consistently expressed concerns over forced disappearances in Balochistan, observing an apparent rise in such cases, despite ongoing demands for transparency and accountability, TBP reported. This situation aligns with a significant operation that took place overnight in Karachi, where residents in Sharafi Goth, Malir, reported that personnel from the Counter-Terrorism Department (CTD) detained numerous individuals and transported them undisclosed location.



Diary Times Desk: Equity benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty nosedived on Monday after two consecutive days of gains, as investors rushed to take profits amid the unabated selling of stocks by foreign investors. Analysts said investors turned defensive ahead of this week's US Federal Reserve policy decision, which further weakened the sentiment.

The 30-share BSE Sensex plunged by 609.68 points, or 0.71 per cent, to close at 85,102.69. During the day, it plummeted by 836.78 points, or 0.97 per cent, to hit the intraday low of 84,875.59. Snapping a two-day gaining streak, the 50-share NSE Nifty declined by 225.90 points, or 0.86 per cent, to settle at 25,960.55. In the intraday session, it dropped 294.2 points, or 1.12 per cent, to hit a low of 25,892.25. Among the Sensex constituents, Bharat Electronics Ltd, Eternal, Trent, Tata Steel, Bajaj Finance, Adani Ports, Bajaj Finserv, State Bank of India, PowerGrid, Asian Paints, Tata Motors Passenger Vehicles, Titan, NTPC, Kotak Mahindra Bank, Larsen & Toubro and Bharti Airtel were among the laggards.

#### **PUNJAB SEEKS DISMISSAL OF AMRITPAL'S PAROLE PLEA: CITES THREAT TO STATE SECURITY**

Diary Times Desk: Just about a week after Punjab told the Punjab and Haryana High Court that "a single speech" by Khadoor Sahib MP Amritpal Singh could "set the five rivers afire", it today sought the dismissal of his parole plea for attending the ongoing Parliament session by referring to the grounds of detention.

In an affidavit placed before the Bench headed by Chief Justice Sheel Nagu, the State said the "gravity and enormity of the grounds of detention and petitioner's conduct as reflected necessitated continuous and uninterrupted detention for maximum period of 12 months from April 23 in the interest of the security of the state and the maintenance of public order. The affidavit in this regard was filed by Alok Shekhar, IAS, Additional Chief Secretary, Department of Home Affairs, Punjab. The fresh grounds of detention by Amritsar district magistrate said - among other things - that Amritpal Singh had been found to be conspiring with elements. anti-national notorious and dreaded gangsters and terrorists with the intent and objective physically eliminate persons.

#### CRACKDOWN ON DRUG TRADERS: SOLAN POLICE DETAIN 4 HABITUAL OFFENDERS IN PREVENTIVE CUSTODY

Diary Times Desk: In a decisive strike against drug traffickers, the Solan police takes four habitual offenders under preventive detention for three months. They have been identified as Ankush Thakur (36), Naresh Kumar alias Nishu (37) — both residents of Sirinagar panchayat in Kandaghat - Deepak Kumar alias Honey (40), a resident of Dharampur, and Vikas alias Khaula, a resident of Solan. All four had been involved in heroin trade in various parts of the district and had been booked in multiple cases. Solan SP Gaurav Singh informed that under the state-wide campaign being run by the government against heroin traffickers, the Solan police are continuously acting against habitual offenders. "As per the state government's directions, four habitual offenders have been taken into preventive custody under the provisions of the Prevention of Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs & Psychotropic Substances Act, 1988, for a period of three months," the SP said.



#### SNOW, RAIN LIKELY IN HIMACHAL'S **HIGHER REACHES ON DEC 14**

Diary Times Desk: The higher reaches of Himachal Pradesh are likely to experience snow and rain on December 14.

According to the State Meteorological Department, the snow and rain are likely to affect isolated areas of Kullu, Kinnaur, Chamba and Lahaul-Spiti, while the rest of the state is expected to remain dry. Dry weather is also likely to prevail across all districts until December

In addition to this, a yellow warning has been issued for dense fog on December 9. The advisory covers parts of the Balh valley in Mandi district and areas surrounding the Bhakra dam reservoir in Bilaspur, particularly during the early morning hours. Minimum temperatures are expected to rise by 2°C to 3°C over the next two to three days, though maximum temperatures are likely to stay near normal.

The past 24 hours saw mostly dry weather across Himachal. Both day and night temperatures stayed 2°C to 4°C above normal at several locations. Minimum temperatures varied from -6°C to 11°C, while maximum temperatures were recorded between 9°C and 25°C.

"However, in view of the strike call, backup arrangements were made with doctors from the National Health Mission (NHM), Ayush and medical colleges. Since no doctor was on leave, there was no requirement to use the backup services," he said.

### NAVJOT KAUR SIDHU SUSPENDED FROM CONGRESS OVER 'RS 500 CRORE FOR CM POST' CLAIM

Diary Times Desk: Dr Navjot Kaur Sidhu, wife of cricketer-cum-politician Navjot Singh Sidhu, has been suspended from the primary membership of the party with immediate effect. The action came days after the former MLA made a sensational claim that "a briefcase full of Rs 500 crore" was required to become Chief Minister in the state, something she said her husband could not pay. She also claimed that five CM aspirants in the Congress were pulling down the party.

Though no official reason has been cited in the suspension letter signed by PPCC chief Amarinder Raja Warring, sources said the party had taken a serious view of her utterances that seemed to be taking a dig at Punjab Congress leaders at a time when party leaders were busy with the Zila Parishad and Panchayat Samiti elections. Her statement had created a stir in Punjab Congress, with senior leaders demanding that the Sidhu couple be shown the door. The suspension was seen as an act of discipline, sending a message to disgruntled leaders who had been taking on the top state leadership in the past.



# AMID DOCTORS' STRIKE, DISTRICT MAGISTRATE INVOKES SECTION 163 BNSS; PROHIBITORY ORDERS ISSUED ACROSS KARNAL

**Diary Times Desk:** To ensure the uninterrupted functioning of essential health services amid an ongoing two-day strike of doctors under the banner of the Haryana Civil Medical Services Association (HCMSA), District Magistrate Uttam Singh has invoked Section 163 of the BNSS, 2023, and issued immediate prohibitory orders across the district.

The directive has been enforced to prevent potential protests, disruptions, or public disorder near health institutions during the strike. As per the order, any form of demonstration, protest, sit-in, shouting of slogans, setting up of tented gatherings, marches, or obstruction of access to healthcare facilities is strictly prohibited within a 200m radius of any government health institution in the district. This includes government hospitals, Community Health Centres (CHCs), Primary Health Centres (PHCs), and trauma/emergency units. The order aims to ensure that all essential health services, including OPD, IPD, emergency care, labour room operations, postmortem procedures, medico-legal cases (MLCs).

#### BJP OUTLINES PLAN FOR SIR, HARYANA CM SAINI ACCUSES CONG OF CREATING 'FALSE ISSUES'

Diary Times Desk: The BJP organised a statelevel meeting in Kaithal on Sunday and outlined a future plan for the Special Intensive Revision (SIR), exhorting party workers and leaders to work dedicatedly including the appointment of booth-level agents (BLAs). "SIR is a step being taken by the Election Commission. Workers have been asked to be vigilant. Appointment of BLAs should be done effectively," said CM Saini while interacting with mediapersons on the sidelines of the state-level meeting at RKSD College on Sunday. Targeting the Congress over allegations related to the SIR voter list corrections, Saini said the Opposition was "misleading people through deliberate misinformation", even citing the recent controversy involving the photograph of a Brazilian woman. #### HARYANA GOVT DOCTORS GO ON TWO-DAY STATEWIDE STRIKE



**Diary Times Desk:** On the call of the Haryana Civil Medical Services Association (HCMSA), government doctors across the state went on a two-day strike starting Monday to press their demands, including a halt to the direct recruitment of Senior Medical Officers (SMOs) and issuance of a notification for the already approved Modified Assured Career Progression (ACP) structure. The strike affected healthcare services across the district, including OPDs, emergency care and operations.

To manage the situation in Karnal, the health authorities deployed consultants, directly recruited specialists and doctors from Kalpana Chawla Government Medical College (KCGMC). However, their numbers were insufficient to handle the patient load. Around 1,500 patients visit the Karnal District Civil Hospital every day. The doctors had earlier held a meeting with Health Minister Arti Singh Rao, Additional Chief Secretary (Health) Sudhir Rajpal and other senior officials on December 3. This was followed by another meeting on December 5 with Chief Secretary Anurag Rastogi, Chief Principal Secretary to the Chief Minister Rajesh Khullar, Sudhir Rajpal and Director General Health Dr Manish Bansal. While their demand to stop the direct recruitment of SMOs was accepted, the request for implementation of the modified ACP structure was not fulfilled. Despite this, the doctors decided to go ahead with the strike.

"We were flying hundreds of drones over North Vietnam during the war," said Russ Lee, a curator in the aeronautics department at the National Air and Space Museum in Washington. During that Southeast Asian conflict in 1960s and early '70s. US forces began using drones for many of the same missions we see today - reconnaissance or carrying munitions, or for use as decoys and psyops platforms, according to the Imperial War

Numbered white cards placed alongside the bones mark how many skeletons have been found since digging began in May of this year, reviving decades-old allegations of wartime atrocities and cover-ups.

In the heartland of the country's ethnic Tamil minority, a bloody and brutal history is re-emerging from the soil.

But it is difficult to bury the past entirely.

From 1983 to 2009, the South Asian island nation of 21 million endured a brutal civil war between the Sri Lankan army and the separatist militant group the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE). More commonly known as The Tamil Tigers, the group was listed as a terrorist organization by many countries including the United States.

The war was fought along ethnic lines, pitting the majority Buddhist Sinhalese state against the predominantly Hindu ethnic minority rebels fighting for a separate Tamil homeland in the north and east after years of anti-Tamil violence. The Tigers were ultimately defeated. Atrocities were committed by both sides, according to the United Nations, which estimates

Sixteen years after the war ended, families of the victims and missing are still fighting for justice and accountability.

in the conflict, with thousands of

others forcibly disappeared.

"One day the truth will come." said V S Niranian, a lawver representing relatives of people who went missing in Jaffna.

#### A blue school bag

Just a stone's throw from a main road, the Chemmani gravesite is one of more than 20 mass graves identified in Sri Lanka. Many of the gravesites that pockmark the north and east of the country are believed to contain the victims of atrocities committed during the civil war. Caught between warring rebel fighters and the Sri Lankan army the Tamil community in these regions bore the brunt of the

The military occupied Jaffna from 1995 until the end of the war. Chemmani first gained international attention in 1998 when Sri Lankan soldier former Lance Cpl. Somaratne Rajapakse, who was on trial for the rape and murder of schoolairl Krishanthi Kumaraswamy, confessed that hundreds of Tamils had been buried there after the Sri Lankan army retook Jaffna.

For decades, the mass grave remained hidden until construction workers clearing land in the grounds of a Hindu cemetery in February unearthed human skeletal remains.

Their discovery prompted a court-ordered forensic excavation of the site in May and June, which initially uncovered 19 skeletons. Since then, the bones of hundreds more people have been found.

A baby's milk bottle, a blue schoolbag, bangles and cloth fragments have been uncovered alongside the bones.

More than 90% of the remains had no form of clothing. The bodies were buried in a disordered way, heaped together in shallow graves of 1.5-2 feet, according to the Human Rights Commission of Sri Lanka, an independent national body that investigates violations of fundamental rights

#### A COLLECTOR'S GUIDE TO BUDDHIST SCULPTURE

Anthropomorphic images of the Buddha, the enlightened being who lived and taught in south Asia sometime between the 6th and 5th centuries B.C., originated in northern India and present-day Pakistan and Afghanistan in the 1st century A.D. Over time, sculptural representations of Buddha and the associated pantheon of Buddhist deities became an important artistic tradition in nearly every culture between Afghanistan and Japan.

Today, Buddhism is one of the five largest global religions, with around 500 million adherents. Although many enthusiasts, scholars and collectors of Buddhist sculpture are drawn to the religion, others simply appreciate its rich history, encompassing more than 2,000 years of teachings and art

Buddhist art encapsulates diverse traditions across millennia and throughout the world. As a result, the range of sculpture to explore is extraordinarily wide.

Not surprisingly, given the far reach of his teachings, the Buddha, bodhisattvas, and other Buddhist deities have been interpreted widely, in many different styles and materials. To begin to be able to distinguish between cultures, styles and historical periods, one should view as many examples of Buddhist sculpture as possible.

Among the many fine collections in Asia are the Tsz Shan Monastery Buddhist Art Museum in Hong Kong, the Capital Museum, Beijing, Japan's Tokyo National Museum and the Indian Museum in Kolkata. In the United States, visits to institutions such as the Metropolitan Museum of Art (New York), the Norton Simon Museum (Pasadena), the Cleveland Museum of Art and the National Museum of Asian Art (Washington, D.C.) provide in-depth insight across a range of categories. In Europe, the Musée Guimet in Paris, Berlin's Museum für Asiatische Kunst, the British Museum in London, the Museum Rietberg in Zurich and the Tibet Museum in Gruyères all have significant holdings of Buddhist art.

Great reference books are also worth seeking out. Two definitive works are Ulrich von Schroeder's authoritative Indo-Tibetan Bronzes and Buddhist Sculptures in Tibet, which are carefully organised by type.

Another very useful source of information is Himalayan Art Resources — a website run by one of the world's leading Himalayan art scholars, Jeff Watt — which catalogues tens of thousands of images and serves as an excellent starting point for research.



#### **CERAMICISTS LUCIE RIE AND HANS COPER**


This is the story of two artists: Lucie Rie and Hans Coper, émigrés who escaped to England from the Nazis in the late 1930s, and who would then spend the next 40 years transforming the landscape of studio ceramics in Great Britain.

'It is almost impossible to imagine ceramics in this country without them,' says British artist and ceramicist Giles Round. 'They brought an urban European sensibility to what was, until then, a kind of rustic nostalgia, and they have been a touchstone for British ceramicists ever since.'

Lucie Rie was born into the Jewish-intellectual environs of Sigmund Freud's Vienna in 1902. She trained at the Wiener Werkstätte, the highly influential graphic arts workshop established by Josef Hoffman, and in 1925 opened her own workshop. Here, she created austere bowls in dense matt glazes — 'The perfect objects for a modernist apartment,' according to Edmund de Waal, a long-time admirer of her work.

In 1938, as the Nazis annexed Austria into the German Reich, Rie fled Vienna for England, settling in a mews house in Bayswater from where she established a small pottery studio. She took on émigrés as her assistants, and in 1946 met the young Hans Coper.

Like Rie, Coper was Jewish; he had abandoned an engineering degree in Dresden to escape to Britain in 1939. The journey was the culmination of a traumatic four years of persecution by the Nazis, which had ended with his father's suicide and his brother's exile to South America. In London, Coper was arrested as an enemy alien, and spent two years in an internment camp in Canada. Subsequently, along with thousands of other Austrian and German nationals, he served in the British Army's Pioneer Corps. Rie instantly recognised Coper's talent. Together they ran a successful workshop, producing beautiful, essential objects of impeccable quality. Rie used silicon carbide to create mottled, pitted surfaces that seemed to emerge almost by chance. For Coper, function was secondary to sculptural form. 'You can see how Rie inspired Coper to take risks,' says Round. 'Coper's works are thrown and then reassembled to make these very complex constructions.'
