### TECHNOLOGY SHOULD AMPLIFY HUMAN JUDGMENT, NOT REPLACE IT: CHIEF JUSTICE SURYA KANT



Diary Times Desk: Chief Justice of India Surya Kant on Sunday said technology should amplify human judgment and not replace it.

He was addressing a symposium on 'Ensuring justice for the common man: strategies for reducing litigation costs and delays' here.

"Pendency of cases in courts clogs every level of the judicial structure, from the trial court to the constitutional court. And when a blockage occurs at the top, the pressure only intensifies below," he said.

He also stressed the need to strengthen judicial infrastructure to reduce pendency. "This is because without sufficient courts, even the most sincere judicial system will collapse under logistical strain," he said. Justice Kant said technology was very useful during the COVID pandemic. He, however, said that one cannot afford to forget that technology comes with its own

"In an age of deep fakes and digital arrests, courts cannot afford naive optimism... A reform that excludes the poor, elderly, or digitally unfamiliar is not reform at all, it is regression. That is why I have always maintained that technology must remain a servant of justice, not its substitute. It should amplify human judgment, not replace it," the CJI said. Diary Times Desk: Stepping up the campaign on the issue of alleged election irregularities, top Congress leaders on Sunday attacked the BJP and the election commissioners at a rally in the national capital, alleging that "vote chori" is in the ruling party's DNA and its leaders were "gaddar" who were conspiring to take away voting rights of people and should be removed from power.

Addressing a 'Vote chor gaddi chhod' mega rally at the Ramlila ground as the Congress sought to build public support on the issue after its Bihar defeat, Rahul Gandhi vowed to oust the "Narendra Modi-RSS government" by following the path of truth and non-violence as shown by Mahatma Gandhi.

"This fight is between 'satya' and 'asatya' (truth and untruth). We will stand behind 'satya' and will remove Narendra Modi, Amit Shah and RSS government from the ntry. They have 'satta' (power) and they indulge in 'vote chori'," he said. Congress f Mallikarjun Kharge alleged that the BJP leadership was "gaddar" (traitors) as they were indulging in "vote theft" and should be removed to save the Constitution and the

Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi Vadra too challenged the BJP to win a fair election with paper ballot voting and asserted that the election commissioners would have to answer to the country on how they "conspired" to take away people's voting rights and made every step of the poll process "suspicious".

### DELHI DYSTOPIA: WITH HIGHEST AQI OF **SEASON AT 461, AIR QUALITY REMAINS** 'SEVERE'



Diary Times Desk: The national capital recorded the highest AQI of the season on Sunday -- up to 461 from 432 a day earlier -- as the air quality remained in the "severe" category, according to the Central Pollution Control Board.

As per the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB), an Air Quality Index (AQI) between zero and 50 is considered 'good', 51 and 100 'satisfactory', 101 and 200 'moderate', 201 and 300 'poor', 301 and 400 'very poor' and 401 and 500 'severe'.

The Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) on Saturday invoked the strictest measures (Stage IV) under its air pollution control plan, Graded Response Action Plan (GRAP), including a ban on all construction and demolition activities in Delhi-NCR after pollution levels rose sharply amid unfavourable meteorological conditions. The Sub-Committee on GRAP decided to invoke Stage III of the GRAP earlier on Saturday across the entire NCR with immediate effect as air quality continued to worsen.

On the weather front, the minimum temperature settled at 8.2 degrees Celsius on Sunday, 0.4 notch below the season's average, and the maximum temperature recorded at 24 degrees Celsius.

The relative humidity was 87 per cent at 5.30 pm, the India Meteorological Department said.

### PRESIDENT MURMU DIRECTS **JUSTICE NISHA BANU OF** MADRAS HC TO ASSUME CHARGE AT KERALA HC BEFORE



Diary Times Desk : President Droupadi Murmu has directed Justice Nisha Banu of the Madras High Court to assume charge at the Kerala High Court on or before December 20, 2025. "The President, after consultation with the Chief Justice of India, is pleased to direct Justice J Nisha Banu, Judge, Madras High Court, to assume charge of her office in the Kerala High Court on or before 20.12.2025," a Department of Justice Notification dated December 12 read. The Centre had notified Justice Banu's transfer from the Madras High Court to the Kerala High Court on October 14, 2025. But she has not assumed charge of her office at the Kerala High Court. The Supreme Court Collegium had on August 27, 2025, recommended the transfer of Justice Banu — third seniormost judge of the Madras High Court and part of the High Court Collegium - to the Kerala High Court. As she did not join the order, some lawyers from Madras High Court wrote to the President, the Vice President, the CJI, Chief Justice of the Madras High Court.

# OUR FIGHT IS AGAINST RSS-BJP, AGAINST THOSE DOING 'VOTE CHORI': MALLIKARJUN KHARGE AT RAMLILA MAIDAN RALLY

Diary Times Desk: Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge on Sunday launched a scathing attack on the BJP, saying those indulging in "vote chori" are "gaddars" and need to be removed from power to save voting rights and the Constitution. Addressing the party's 'Vote Chor Gaddi Chhod' rally at the Ramlila Maidan here, Kharge said the ideology of Mohan Bhagwat, MS Golwalkar and Manusmriti will destroy the country, and only the ideology of Congress can save it. # SCIENTISTS UNVEIL SECRETS OF HIMALAYAN AIR MOVEMENTS THAT CAN IMPROVE MONSOON PREDICTION

Diary Times Desk: A team of Indian scientists has uncovered the dynamics of how vertical air movements over the Himalayas have shaped the Indian summer monsoon that has been the lifeline of South Asia for centuries, which could enhance the accuracy of rainfall forecasts and also help in better assessment of air quality over the sub-continent. Scientists are constantly looking towards ways to improve the prediction of the Indian monsoon for agriculture, water management and disaster preparedness across South Asia, where millions of people rely on rainfall for their livelihoods. However, limited studies on the vertical air movement in this region so far have relied on indirect balloon or satellite-based measurements, which cannot capture the long-term finescale variability of vertical air motion in the complex Himalayan terrain.

# BANGLADESH FOREIGN MINISTRY SUMMONS INDIAN ENVOY OVER EX-PM HASINA'S STATEMENTS

**Diary Times Desk:** Bangladesh's Foreign Ministry on Sunday summoned Indian High Commissioner Pranay Verma to express its "serious concern" over the "incendiary statements" made by deposed prime minister Sheikh Hasina, who is currently in India. Hasina, 78, fled to India in August last year following a violent student-led street protest and continues to stay there.

She was sentenced to death by a special tribunal last month after being convicted on charges of crimes against humanity. Bangladesh has been demanding her extradition.

"The Ministry of Foreign Affairs summoned the Indian High Commissioner today to convey the Government of Bangladesh's serious concern to the Government of India for allowing fugitive Sheikh Hasina to continue to make incendiary statements calling upon her supporters to engage in terrorist activities in Bangladesh, aiming to thwart the upcoming parliamentary elections," a foreign office statement said.

Bangladesh reiterates its call for her "expeditious extradition" alongside former Home Minister Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal to face death sentences handed down by the special tribunal last month, it added.

## INDIA COULD GET NEW PM SOON, CLAIMS PRITHVIRAJ CHAVAN; SAYS COMMENTS LINKED TO EPSTEIN FILES RELEASE

Diary Times Desk: Senior Congress leader Prithviraj Chavan, citing the release of the controversial Jeffrey Epstein files in the United States on December 19, has claimed India could soon have a new Prime Minister. If someone from Maharashtra were to become prime minister, the present prime minister would have to step down. I only underlined the possibility of a change," Chavan explained.

### UNION MINISTER OF STATE FOR FINANCE PANKAJ CHAUDHARY NAMED NEW UP BJP CHIEF

**Diary Times Desk:** Union Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary was on Sunday named the new president of the BJP's Uttar Pradesh unit, with his election being formally announced by Union Minister Piyush Goyal here. ## CONGRESS STANDS WITH 'SATYA'; WILL REMOVE 'MODI-RSS GOVERNMENT': RAHUL GANDHI

Diary Times Desk: Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Sunday said his party stands with "satya" (truth) and vowed to remove the "Narendra Modi-RSS government". Addressing the party's 'Vote chor gaddi chhod' rally at the Ramlila Maidan here, he launched a scathing attack on the Election Commission and mentioned the names of Chief Election Commissioner Gyanesh Kumar, and Election Commissioners Sukhbir Singh Sandhu and Vivek Joshi to allege that they were working for the BJP. "We will stand with 'satya' (truth) and will remove the Narendra Modi-RSS government from power. ## POLICE SEARCH BROWN UNIVERSITY AFTER SHOOTER KILLS 2 AND WOUNDS 8 ON CAMPUS



**Diary Times Desk:** A shooter dressed in black killed at least two people and wounded eight others at Brown University on Sunday during final exams on the Ivy League campus, authorities said, and police were searching for the suspect.

Officers scattered across the campus and into an affluent neighbourhood filled with historic and stately brick homes, searching academic buildings, backyards and porches for hours after the shooting erupted.

The suspect was a male in dark clothing who was last seen leaving the engineering building where the attack happened, said Timothy O'Hara, Deputy Chief of Police.

Authorities believe the shooter used a handaun. according to a law enforcement official who was not authorised to discuss an ongoing investigation and spoke on condition of anonymity. Rhode Island has some of the strictest gun laws in the US. Last spring, the Democratic-controlled Legislature passed an assault weapon ban that will prohibit the sale and manufacturing of certain high-powered firearms, but not their possession, starting next July. "The unthinkable has happened," Democratic Rhode Island Gov Dan McKee said. Providence Mayor Brett Smiley said a shelter-inplace was in effect and encouraged people living near the campus to stay inside and not to return home until it is lifted. "We have all available resources" to find the suspect, Smiley said. Emma Ferraro, a chemical engineering student, was in the engineering building's lobby working on a final project when she heard loud pops coming from the east side.

### "NO PLACE FOR HATE, VIOLENCE AND TERRORISM," SAYS AUSTRALIAN PM ANTHONY ALBANESE AFTER BONDI BEACH SHOOTING INCIDENT

Diary Times Desk: Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese addressed the nation following the mass shooting at Sydney's Bondi Beach, describing the incident as a "devastating terror attack" and expressing solidarity with Australia's Jewish community. In his address, Albanese said the incident was "a targeted attack on Jewish Australians on the first day of Hanukkah, which should be a day of joy, a celebration of faith, an act of evil, antisemitism, terrorism that has struck the heart of our nation." He added, "There is no place for this hate, violence and terrorism in our nation." The Prime Minister said authorities were working to identify all those involved and stressed accountability. "Let me be clear, we will eradicate it amidst this vile act of violence and hate, and there will emerge a moment of national unity where Australians across the board will embrace their fellow Australians of Jewish faith," he stated.

Diary Times Desk: Hamas has confirmed that senior commander Raed Saad was killed in an Israeli strike in Gaza, marking the most high-profile assassination of a Hamas leader since the ceasefire that came into effect in October, Al Jazeera reported. The Israeli military said it carried out the attack on Saturday near Gaza City, claiming Saad was the target. At least 25 people were reported wounded in the strike. Hamas acknowledged his death on Sunday through a video statement by its Gaza chief, Khalil al-Hayya, who accused Israel of violating the ceasefire agreement. "In the wake of Israel's continued violations, including the latest assassination of a Hamas commander just yesterday, we call on the mediators and especially the US administration and US President Donald Trump as the main guarantor of the agreement, to force the occupation [Israel] to respect the ceasefire deal and to implement it," he said.

## "ANTISEMITISM HAS NO PLACE": RUBIO CONDEMNS BONDI BEACH TERROR ATTACK IN AUSTRALIA

Diary Times Desk: United States Secretary of State Marco Rubio condemned the terrorist attack in Australia that targeted a Jewish celebration, expressing solidarity with the victims, the Jewish community and the Australian people. In a post on X, Rubio said, "The United States strongly condemns the terrorist attack in Australia targeting a Jewish celebration." He underlined that "Antisemitism has no place in this world," and added, "Our prayers are with the victims of this horrific attack, the Jewish community, and the people of Australia." Rubio's remarks came as details emerged about a deadly shooting at Australia's Bondi Beach, which police said was a targeted attack against the country's Jewish community, CNN reported. At least 11 people were killed and 29 others injured in the attack, police said during a press conference, adding that details about the victims have not yet been released. Police said two suspects were involved in the shooting. One suspect is in custody in critical condition, while the other was shot dead at the scene. Authorities said the identities of the alleged attackers have not been disclosed.



### INDIAN-ORIGIN MAN AMONG 4 KILLED IN TEMPLE COLLAPSE IN SOUTH AFRICA

**Diary Times Desk:** A 52-year-old Indian-origin man is among four people killed as a four-storey Hindu temple under construction collapsed in South Africa's KwaZulu-Natal province, officials have said.

The New Ahobilam Temple of Protection, situated on a steep hill in Redcliffe in north of eThekwini (formerly Durban), was being expanded when a section of the building gave way on Friday while workers were on site.

The exact number of workers and temple officials believed to be trapped beneath tonnes of rubble is unknown.

While two people, a construction worker and a devotee, were confirmed dead on Friday, the death toll rose to four on Saturday after rescue teams recovered more bodies. Of the four deceased, one has been identified as Vickey Jairaj Panday, an executive member of the temple trust and manager of the construction project, local media reported, quoting officials.

### TIBETAN YOUTH CONGRESS CONDEMNS CHINA-APPOINTED PANCHEN LAMA'S REMARKS ON REINCARNATION

### MACRON DENOUNCES "ANTISEMITIC" TERROR ATTACK ON HANUKKAH **GATHERING IN SYDNEY**

Diary Times Desk: French President Emmanuel Macron condemned the attack in Sydney that targeted people gathered to celebrate Hanukkah, describing it as an "antisemitic" terrorist act and expressing solidarity with those affected. New Zealand Prime Minister Christopher Luxon underscored the close ties between the two countries, saying New Zealand and Australia are "family." In a post on X, he said he was "shocked by the distressing scenes at Bondi" and extended his thoughts to those impacted by the attack. United Kingdom Prime Minister Keir Starmer described the developments as "deeply distressing."



### INDIA "REJECTS" BANGLADESH **CLAIMS, REAFFIRMS SUPPORT** FOR FREE, FAIR ELECTIONS

Diary Times Desk: India on Sunday "categorically rejected" the assertions made by the interim Government of Bangladesh, responding to Dhaka's recent press note and clarifying its position amid heightened diplomatic exchanges between the neighbours. In a press release issued by the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), it stated, "India categorically rejects the assertions made by the interim Government of Bangladesh in its press note dated 14 December 2025." The statement came minutes after the Bangladesh Ministry of Foreign Affairs summoned the Indian High Commissioner to lodge Dhaka's strong concerns over statements made by former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, accusing her of inciting violence from abroad. Reiterating its consistent stance, India underlined its support for the democratic process in Bangladesh. "We have consistently reiterated our position in favour of free, fair, inclusive and credible elections being held in Bangladesh in a peaceful atmosphere," the MEA said. Addressing allegations that Indian territory was being used for activities against Bangladesh's interests, the MEA firmly rejected the charge. "India has never allowed its territory to be used for activities inimical to the interests of the friendly people of Bangladesh," the statement said.

### TAIWAN CONDEMNS CHINA POLICY PAPER. REJECTS CLAIM OF SOVEREIGNTY OVER ISLAND

Diary Times Desk: The Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA) accused China of misrepresenting the facts after Beijing, in a policy document, stated that "Taiwan is an inseparable part of China's territory" and expressed opposition to "Taiwan independence in any form", as reported by the Taipei Times. Earlier this week, the Chinese Ministry of Foreign Affairs held a press conference to unveil its document titled China's Policy Paper on Latin America and the Caribbean, in which it asserted that the "one China" principle is the fundamental basis for China in building diplomatic ties with other nations. "The . Chinese government recognizes that the majority of Latin American and Caribbean (LAC) countries support the one China principle, acknowledge that there is only one China globally, consider Taiwan an inseparable part of China's territory, and view the government of the People's Republic of China [PRC] as the sole legitimate government representing all of China, while opposing 'Taiwan independence' in any form," the document stated, according to the Taipei Times report. The ministry insisted that Beijing's erroneous assertion that "Taiwan is an inseparable part of China's territory" and its claim to oppose.

### UK PM KEIR STARMER EXPRESSES CONDOLENCES AFTER DEADLY BONDI BEACH SHOOTING

Diary Times Desk: UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer expressed condolences following the deadly shooting at Australia's Bondi Beach, calling the incident deeply distressing and extending solidarity to those affected. In a post on X, Starmer said, "Deeply distressing news from Australia. The United Kingdom sends our thoughts and condolences to everyone affected by the appalling attack in Bondi beach. I'm being kept updated on the developing situation." His remarks came as world leaders strongly condemned the attack and urged authorities to take stronger steps to counter antisemitism and ensure the safety of Jewish communities. At least 10 people were killed and 12 others injured, including two police officers, after multiple gunmen opened fire on a crowded beach, the Sydney Morning Herald reported. The shooting took place on the first evening of Hanukkah, as Jewish Sydneysiders had gathered near the Chanukah by the Sea festival to mark the holiday, according to the Sydney Morning Herald. Israeli President Isaac Herzog denounced the incident as a targeted assault on Jews. "Our sisters and brothers in Sydney, Australia, have been attacked by vile terrorists in a very cruel attack on Jews who went to light the first candle of Hanukkah," Herzog said.

## LACK OF BASIC SERVICES, WEAK LAW ENFORCEMENT WORSEN CRISIS IN TIRAH VALLEY

Diary Times Desk: The worsening conditions in Tirah Valley have exposed significant failures in Pakistani governance, with security officials citing lack of basic services, ineffective administration, and insufficient law enforcement as major issues in this remote area of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, as reported by The Express Tribune (TET). Frontier Corps officials indicated that the void caused by inadequate governance has been taken advantage of by extremist and criminal organisations, including Fitna-al-Khawarij, which they claim fosters instability and finances their actions through drug trafficking and extortion. The Inspector General of the Frontier Corps Khyber Pakhtunkhwa North mentioned that the province has a 1,224-kilometre-long border with Afghanistan, with around 717 kilometres under the supervision of the FC. He explained that the difficult landscape includes snow-laden.

## ISRAEL'S HIGH COURT OVERTURNS GOVERNMENT'S ATTEMPT TO REMOVE ATTORNEY GENERAL



Diary Times Desk: Israel's Supreme Court on Sunday overturned the government's decision to dismiss Attorney General Gali Baharav-Miara, ruling that she will continue to serve in her position. The decision also criticized the government for procedural flaws and a lack of legal foundation in its attempt to remove the country's top legal advisor. "The Attorney General continues to serve in her position lawfully; the dismissal decision is void; and any unilateral action that could change her status, powers, or working methods is inconsistent with this ruling," the court said. The expanded panel of seven justices stressed that the rule of law applies to all, including state authorities, and highlighted the "great discomfort" caused by the government's conduct. The controversy centers on the government's dismissal of Baharav-Miara in August. According to the Supreme Court, the procedural changes were applied retrospectively and lacked consultation, alternatives, or a proper factual and legal foundation. "This decision was made in a lightning-fast process, without organized staff work and in sharp deviation from the Shamgar Committee's recommendations," the court said, referring to a previous advisory body that had established guidelines to ensure the Attorney General's independence from political pressure.

### MASS SHOOTING AT SYDNEY'S BONDI BEACH LEAVES TEN DEAD, INCLUDING GUNMAN

Diary Times Desk: At least nine people were killed in a shooting attack at Sydney's Bondi Beach, New South Wales Police told CNN. One gunman was also killed in the incident. Reacting to the attack, Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese described the scenes at the popular beach as "shocking and distressing." He said, "Police and emergency responders are on the ground working to save lives." Authorities confirmed that the police operation remains ongoing, with security forces deployed across the area. New South Wales Police advised "anyone at the scene" to take shelter in a post on social media, urging the public to avoid the beach and surrounding areas. Multiple people were reported injured in the shooting, according to the Sydney Morning Herald. A local witness told the newspaper, "I saw at least 10 people on the ground and blood everywhere." Separately, Alex Ryvchin, co-chief executive of the Executive Council of Australian Jewry, told Sky News that the shooting occurred during an event at the beach celebrating the Jewish festival of Hanukkah, which began at sundown.

# SEVERAL PEOPLE FEARED DEAD AFTER GUNFIRE ERUPTS AT BONDI BEACH DURING HANUKKAH GATHERING

Diary Times Desk: Several people are feared dead following a shooting incident at Bondi Beach, where dozens of rounds were fired into a large crowd on Sunday evening, triggering panic and a police warning for the public to take shelter, according to The Sydney Morning Herald. reported by The Sydney Morning Herald, the incident occurred shortly after 6.40 pm, coinciding with the first night of Hanukkah. Residents in the area described police vehicles rushing towards Bondi as large numbers of people fled the beach amid scenes of chaos. Police later confirmed that two people were taken into custody at Bondi Beach, the report said, while at least one of the suspected gunmen is believed to have been killed during the incident. Herald journalists at the scene reported multiple fatalities, with injured victims being transported by ambulance to Prince of Wales Hospital in Randwick. Separate police sources cited by the outlet said a NSW Police officer was among those shot, though the officer's condition was not immediately known. Eyewitness accounts described the intensity of the attack, with people in Bondi saying.

## "RUSSIA IS DRAGGING OUT THE WAR," SAYS ZELENSKYY AS RUSSIAN STRIKES LEAVE HUNDREDS OF THOUSANDS WITHOUT POWER



Diary Times Desk: Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy on Sunday said Russia continues to target Ukraine's energy infrastructure, leaving hundreds of thousands of families without electricity, heating and water, even as Kyiv prepares for crucial diplomatic engagements with the United States and European partners aimed at ending the war. In a series of posts on social media, Zelenskyy said Ukrainian emergency and utility services have been working continuously since Friday to restore basic services after fresh Russian strikes. "The situation remains difficult hundreds of thousands of families are still without electricity in Mykolaiv, Odesa, Kherson, Chernihiv, Donetsk, Sumy, and Dnipro regions," he said, thanking workers involved in repair efforts. Zelenskyy added that Russian attacks continued overnight, leaving civilians wounded. "Russia is dragging out the war and seeks to inflict as much harm as possible on our people," he said. According to the Ukrainian president, Russia carried out an intense wave of attacks over the past week alone. "In total, the Russians launched more than 1,500 attack drones, nearly 900 guided aerial bombs, and 46 missiles of various types against Ukraine this week.

# INDIAN COAST GUARD RESCUES UKRAINIAN NATIONAL AFTER HEART ATTACK OFF GOA

Diary Times Desk: The Indian Coast Guard on Saturday carried out a swift medical evacuation of a 62-year-old Ukrainian national who suffered a heart attack while onboard a merchant vessel off the coast of Goa, the Indian Coast Guard said. According to the Indian Coast Guard, Coast Guard Ship C-420 conducted the emergency medevac of the crew member from the Malta-flagged merchant vessel MV Interasia Amplify. The rescue operation was carried out promptly after the distress call was received, ensuring the patient was safely evacuated for urgent medical treatment. The ICG described the operation as a reflection of its "resolute commitment to safeguard lives at sea," highlighting the force's readiness to respond to maritime emergencies at any hour. In a separate maritime security operation earlier this week, the Indian Coast Guard apprehended 11 Pakistani fishermen after their fishing boat was found inside Indian waters.

### BALOCH AMERICAN CONGRESS PRESIDENT URGES BOLLYWOOD TO EXPOSE 'FORCED OCCUPATION' OF BALOCHISTAN

Diary Times Desk: Indian High Commissioner toTara Chand, President of the Baloch American Congress, has strongly appealed to Bollywood actors and the Indian film industry to produce a powerful film highlighting what he described as Pakistan's forced and undemocratic occupation of Balochistan. In a post on X, Chand asserted that Balochistan had attained independence before being forcibly occupied by Pakistan in March 1948. He claimed that since the occupation, the Pakistani army has invaded and maintained control over Balochistan and its regions, leading to decades of conflict and repression. "The hateful graffiti discovered at NYU's Bern Dibner Library, including antisemitic symbols and slurs targeting Indian students and other communities, is deeply disturbing and wholly unacceptable," he said. The Indian-American lawmaker said acts of hatred and intimidation have no place on college campuses or in society at large. "Acts of hatred and intimidation have no place on our campuses or anywhere in our society," Krishnamoorthi said, adding that the incident must be thoroughly investigated.

### CURFEW IMPOSED IN THAILAND'S TRAT PROVINCE AS BORDER CLASHES WITH CAMBODIA CONTINUE

**Diary Times Desk :** Thailand's military on Sunday imposed a curfew in parts of Trat Province, citing the ongoing security situation along the border areas, Xinhua reported.

In an official order, the military said a curfew has been enforced with immediate effect in five districts of Trat Province--Khlong Yai, Bo Rai, Laem Ngop, Khao Saming and Mueang Trat. Residents in these areas have been instructed not to leave their homes between 7:00 PM and 05:00 AM the next day.

Thai media reports said the decision followed an incident late Saturday night in which three M79 grenades were fired at the headquarters of the Marine Corps Task Force in Trat Province. The grenades are believed to have been launched from within Thai territory. No casualties were reported as the explosives landed in an uninhabited area.

This is the second Thai province to impose a curfew since the latest round of clashes along the Thailand-Cambodia border began. Earlier, the Thai military had imposed similar restrictions in four border districts of Sa Kaeo Province on Wednesday.

The curfew announcement comes amid continuing hostilities and heightened tensions between Thailand and Cambodia.

# INDIA POISED FOR NEXT PHASE OF MULTI-TRILLIONDOLLAR WEALTH CREATION: MOSL

Diary Times Desk: India is entering a decisive phase of economic expansion that could redefine wealth creation over two decades, next according to the 30th Wealth Creation Study by Motilal Oswal Financial Services. ## MCAP OF 8 MOST VALUED FIRMS ERODES BY RS 79,129 CRORE; BAJAJ FINANCE, ICICI BANK HIT HARD

Diary Times Desk: The combined market valuation of eight of the top-10 most valued domestic firms eroded by Rs 79,129.21 crore last week, with Bajaj Finance and ICICI Bank taking the biggest hit, amid a largely bearish trend in equities. Last week, the BSE benchmark index declined by 444.71 points or 0.51 per cent. From the top-10 pack, Reliance Industries and Larsen & Toubro were the only gainers, while HDFC Bank, Bharti Airtel, Tata Consultancy Services (TCS), ICICI Bank, State Bank of India, Infosys, Bajaj Finance and Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) faced erosion from their valuation. The market capitalisation (mcap) of Bajaj Finance dropped by Rs 19,289.7 crore to Rs 6,33,106.69 crore. ICICI Bank's valuation tumbled Rs 18,516.31 crore to Rs 9,76,668.15 crore. The mcap of Bharti Airtel tanked Rs 13,884.63 crore to Rs 11,87,948.11 crore and that of State Bank of India diminished by Rs 7,846.02 crore to Rs 8,88,816.17 crore. Infosys lost Rs 7,145.95 crore from its market valuation which stood at Rs 6,64,220.58 crore. The mcap of TCS declined by Rs 6,783.92 crore to Rs 11,65,078.45 crore and that of HDFC Bank dipped by Rs 4,460.93 crore to Rs 15,38,558.71 crore.



## 50% OF INDIAN FAMILY BUSINESSES REPORT REVENUES BETWEEN \$1–30 BILLION ANNUALLY: DELOITTE

Diary Times Desk: Nearly half of Indian family businesses report annual revenues ranging from USD 1 billion to USD 30 billion, with 36 per cent falling within the USD 1-5 billion range, according to a latest report by Deloitte. Deloitte Private's Family Business Insights Series: Defining the family business landscape, 2025, reveals that family-owned businesses are evolving to fuel long-term growth. The report surveyed 1,587 family businesses across 36 countries, including 50 in India, and conducted in-depth interviews with 30 senior executives. Projections for 2025-2026 are equally robust, with 75 per cent of Indian family enterprises targeting growth rates above 15 per cent.



## INDIA LEADS GLOBAL GENAI LEARNING WITH 3.6 MN ENROLLMENTS, HIGHEST WORLDWIDE: REPORT

Diary Times Desk: India has emerged as the global leader in learning about Generative AI (GenAI), recording an impressive 3.6 million enrollments in 2025, the highest worldwide, according to a report by online learning platform Coursera. This surge is a significant reflection of India's rapid transition toward a digital, Al-ready workforce, according to Coursera's 2025 Learner Trends report. Prepared by surveying 32.8 million learners, the report added that GenAl continued to dominate India's learning patterns in 2025. The report further added that Indian learners are enrolling in both introductory and advanced GenAl programs at an accelerating pace, with the country now recording three GenAl enrollments every minute--up from one per minute last year. Popular courses such as Google Al Essentials, Generative AI for Everyone, and Generative AI: Introduction and Applications have driven this massive growth in AI education, the report stated. Beyond AI, learners continued building strong foundations in data, cybersecurity, digital marketing, project execution and finance, reflecting a workforce preparing for increasingly specialised, digital-first roles. ## REC LTD COMPLETES VERIFICATION OF \$500 MN AND Y=61BN GREEN BOND USAGE

Diary Times Desk: REC Limited, a government-owned power sector company, has finished an independent check to confirm that the money it raised through its green bonds was properly used for environmentally friendly projects. These bonds include USD 500 million raised in September 2024 and about JPY 61 billion raised in January 2024, both issued under its green funding guidelines. The PSU said in a release that the verification. independent conducted in accordance with the International Capital Market Association (ICMA)'s Green Bond Principles confirmed that the entire net proceeds from both the issuances have been fully allocated to eligible projects consistent with REC's Green Finance Framework. REC's inaugural Green Bond Impact Report (FY 2025) reflects a green-finance maturing ecosystem where accountability is as important as ambition.

### ADB APPROVES USD 108 MN LOAN TO MIZORAM TO STRENGTHEN PUBLIC HEALTHCARE SYSTEM

Diary Times Desk: The Asian Development Bank (ADB) has approved a USD 108 million results-based loan to support the Government of Mizoram in strengthening its public health care system and achieving universal health coverage. The Supporting Public Health Care System Strengthening to Achieve Universal Health Care for Mizoram Programme aims to improve equitable access to affordable, high-quality health services for the state's 1.38 million residents, particularly women, older people, and persons with disabilities, the ADB added in a release. "This programme will help the state roll out its new Mizoram Universal Health Care Scheme (MUHCS), which brings all citizens under one health insurance umbrella consisting of subsidised and contributory mechanisms," said ADB Country Director for India Mio Oka. "By leveraging and augmenting existing Central (Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana) and state government (Mizoram State Health Care Scheme) programmes under a single, cashless, and paperless platform, the state ensures poor and vulnerable people get free coverage.

## CENTRE IMPLEMENTS QUALITY CONTROL ORDERS WITH RELAXATIONS FOR MSMES TO PROTECT DOMESTIC PRODUCTION

Diary Times Desk: The Central Government has implemented Quality Control Orders (QCOs) in a manner with exemptions and relaxations for the Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) to ensure no disruption to the domestic production, said Union Minister Shobha Karandlaje in a written reply in Lok Sabha. Minister of State for MSMEs Karandlaje highlighted key relaxations and exemptions for MSMEs, according to a release by the Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises. As part of the relaxations, an additional sixmonth extension will be provided to the micro enterprises and  $\boldsymbol{\alpha}$ three-month extension for small enterprises to ensure the QCOs. Exemption for imports will also be provided to the domestic manufacturers for producing export-oriented products. An exemption for the import of up to 200 units for research & development purposes is also made. The provision for clearance of legacy stock (manufactured or imported before implementation) within six months from the effective date has also been made. She added that based on the feedback on certification processes, the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) has implemented some financial and technical relaxations for the MSME sector. "To support MSMEs, financial incentives are provided by BIS in annual minimum marking fee with concession of 80% (for Micro Enterprises), 50% (Small enterprises) and 20% (Medium Enterprises).



## ADB APPROVES \$240 MILLION LOAN FOR CHENNAI METRO EXPANSION IN INDIA



**Diary Times Desk:** The Asian Development Bank (ADB) has approved a USD 240 million loan—the second tranche of the Chennai Metro Rail Investment Project—to support the expansion of the metro rail network and provide cleaner, safer, and more reliable urban transport across the Chennai Metropolitan Area, India.

This tranche is part of ADB's USD 780 million multitranche financing facility for the project, approved in 2022, and follows the initial USD 350 million loan under the first tranche, a release by the ADB added.

The new financing will support key sections of metro lines 3, 4, and 5, covering 20 kilometers of elevated and underground corridors and 18 new stations with universal access features and disaster-resilient infrastructure to keep passengers and services safe during extreme weather events.

"This project will deliver safer, faster, and more reliable daily travel in Chennai while advancing the city's low-carbon development goals," said ADB Country Director for India Mio Oka. "We look forward to continued collaboration to expand metro connectivity and further enhance the capacity of Chennai's metro and suburban rail systems to meet the city's growing mobility needs."

Under tranche 2, ADB will fund civil and system works for metro line 3's elevated section (Sholinganallur-SIPCOT-2), line 4's underground section (Lighthouse-Kodambakkam), and key system components for line 5, including power, traction, and telecommunications. The tranche will also support upgrades to multimodal interchange areas to ensure smoother transfers between metro, buses, bicycles, and other last-mile transport options.

### STATE-LEVEL MEN'S BOXING **COMPETITION BEGINS, 150 PUGILISTS TO TAKE PART**

Diary Times Desk: The HP State Elite Men's Boxing Championship-2025 started at Paras Public School, Bhawarna, 15 km from here today. These areas are part of Fazilka district, which was among the most affected by recent floods. The minimum temperature was recorded at 12.9 °C in the morning hours. Officials confirmed that average polling in Fazilka district was 22.71 per cent by 12 noon. Polling further increased to 36.2 per cent by 2 pm. MLA Sandeep Jakhar was in the first batch to cast vote in Panjkosi village. He said, "I have performed my (constitutional) duty and wish all the candidates a success."

### PUNJAB LOCAL BODY POLLS: STATE ELECTION **COMMISSION ORDERS REPOLL AT 4 BOOTHS AMID COMPLAINTS OF BOOTH CAPTURING**

Diary Times Desk: A voter turnout of over 30 per cent was recorded till 2 pm in the Zila Parishad and Panchayat Samiti elections in Punjab on Sunday, officials said. The polling began at 8 am and continued till at 4 pm. The counting of votes will take place on December 17. Elections were held to elect members of 347 zones of 22 Zila Parishads and 2.838 zones of 153 Panchayat Samitis. Over 9,000 candidates were in the fray, and a total of 1.36 crore voters were eligible to cast their ballots. According to official estimates, polling in Ropar district remained at around 50.20 per cent. The lowest turnout was in Nangal block at just 45.8 per cent, followed by Nurpur Bedi at 46 per cent, Morinda 50.95 per cent, Ropar 52.6 per cent, Chamkaur Sahib 52.9 per cent and Anandpur Sahib 53 per cent. The turnout was particularly low during the early hours, with only about eight per cent of voters casting their ballots till 10 am. The State Election Commission (SEC) has ordered repoll at four polling booths — Chahiyan in Gurdaspur, Babania and Madhir in Muktsar, and Chananwal in Barnala - following complaints that presiding officers allegedly absconded with ballot papers and cases of booth capturing were reported.

### **BJP CANDIDATE'S BROTHER INJURED IN** ATTACK IN FARIDKOT

Diary Times Desk: BJP block samiti candidate Amar Singh's brother, Lakhwinder Singh, was seriously injured in a violent attack in Ghugiana village of Faridkot district on Sunday evening. The incident took place outside the victim's house, where assailants allegedly used sharp-edged weapons and also vandalised the candidate's car. The entire incident was captured on CCTV cameras installed at the house. Singh was rushed to Guru Gobind Singh Medical College and Hospital, Faridkot, where he is undergoing treatment. BJP leaders Sandeep Singh Sunny Brar and district president Gaurav Kakkar visited the hospital to inquire about his condition. BJP leaders alleged that Congress and Aam Aadmi Party supporters carried out the attack, claiming it was a result of frustration over the BJP's growing influence in villages and the anticipated victory of their candidate. They also demanded strict action against the culprits. Faridkot SP(H) Maninder Bir Singh said the incident was not related to the ongoing zila parishad and block samiti elections. He stated that the clash occurred several metres away from the polling booth and appeared to be the result of a personal dispute. Police have initiated an investigation and assured appropriate legal action based on the findings.

### 3 BUSES COLLIDE IN JHAJJAR DUE TO LOW VISIBILITY

**Diary Times Desk:** Three buses collided at Kulana Chowk in Jhajjar, Haryana, due to low visibility caused by dense fog on Sunday morning.

According to the SHO of the Machrauli area, the first bus from Khatusham suffered significant damage compared to the second bus. The accident occurred when a truck was standing in the middle of the road.

"We saw that there were 3 buses, the first one with the most damage was coming from Khatusham. And behind that, there were two local buses. The driver of the first bus stated that a truck was blocking the middle of the road... there was a lot of fog, so this is the reason for the collision," SHO told ANI. The SHO further stated that the driver sustained a significant leg injury and has been referred to the PGI, Rohtak, for treatment.

### OPERATION HOTSPOT DOMINATION: OVER 2,000 ACCUSED ARRESTED IN 12 DAYS

Diary Times Desk: Under Haryana's state-wide campaign "Operation Hotspot Domination" the police teams simultaneously raided 805 identified drug and gambling hotspots on December 12

During this action, 210 individuals were arrested and 69 new cases registered. Over the past 12 days, the police have registered 1,117 FIRs and arrested 2,006 offenders, including 430 involved in violent crimes and 139 charged with illegal possession of arms. During this period, 99 fresh cases related to illegal weapons were also registered. Additionally, the Haryana Police strengthened inter-state coordination by sharing 606 intelligence reports with other states to ensure that criminals do not evade the law by crossing borders. During the campaign, Rs 21.20 lakh in cash, 60.9 kg of ganja, 1.6 kg of heroin, 92 kg of opium husk, 3.8 kg of charas, and 282 kg of poppy husk were recovered. The police also seized 12 cars and 51 two-wheelers. On December 12 alone, recoveries included 183.3 grams of heroin, 15 kg of opium husk, 1 kg of charas, and 29.9 kg of ganja. Besides, the police seized more than 10,000 narcotic tablets, 29,574 bottles of English liquor, 8,884 bottles of country-made liquor, and 1,801 litre of illicit alcohol.

## BALLOT PAPER 'POSTED ON SOCIAL MEDIA' BEFORE POLLING; SAD COMPLAINS TO STATE ELECTION COMMISSION

Diary Times Desk: The Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) has submitted a complaint with the State Election Commission (SEC) citing violation of model code of conduct in the ongoing zila parishad and block samiti polls in the state. Citing an incident, SAD's chief spokesperson Daliit Cheema claimed that an AAP candidate from Fatehgarh Sahib had posted ballot papers on social media approximately 10 hours before the commencement of polling. The photographs show the ballot papers bearing the printed serial numbers, "This incident is clearly in contrast to the free, fair and transparent election process and it calls for urgent intervention by the SEC," he said. The SAD demanded the SEC to order immediately a thorough inquiry into how a candidate could gain access to the ballot papers prior to the polling. "We demand an immediate inquiry, fixing the responsibility of the officials involved." SAD's legal cell head Arshdeep Kler said a written complaint has been submitted with the SEC as the incident was a serious breach of election law. He said the silence or inaction in the matter would seriously damage public faith in the democratic process. "It was like undermining the integrity of the polling process by flashing the ballot paper publicly in advance.



# HARYANA MINISTER ANIL VIJ ESCAPES UNHURT IN ACCIDENT IN AMBALA CANTONMENT



Diary Times Desk: Haryana Cabinet Minister Anil Vij narrowly escaped injuries after his car was involved in a minor accident under the jurisdiction of Parao Police Station in Ambala Cantonment late last night. As per information, around 10 pm, the minister was on his way in his car when another car driven by a Sub-inspector of the Special Task Force (STF) of Haryana Police, hit the minister's car. The security personnel caught the driver on the spot. The minister escaped unhurt in the accident. SHO Parao police station Dharambir said that last night near the Maharaja Dhaba, a car driven by an SI of STF hit the minister's car. A case was registered and the medical examination was conducted. Further investigation in the matter is underway.

# BHUPINDER HOODA BACKS RAHUL GANDHI'S EVM CHARGE, SAYS ELECTION COMMISSION HAS LOST NEUTRALITY

**Diary Times Desk:** Senior Congress leader and former Haryana chief minister Bhupinder Singh Hooda on Sunday endorsed Rahul Gandhi's allegation that the Election Commission is no longer neutral, claiming that recent elections had exposed deep flaws in the electoral process.

Addressing the party's "Vote chor, gaddi chhod" rally at Ramlila ground in the national capital, Hooda said the elections held recently, including those in Maharashtra, Haryana and Karnataka, had now "proved" what Rahul Gandhi has been alleging for months, that the constitutional authority tasked with safeguarding free and fair polls had failed in its duty. "The Constitution gave every citizen the right to vote after Independence. Today, that very right is being manipulated," Hooda said, alleging large-scale interference in the voting process. Referring to growing public distrust in electronic voting machines, Hooda said citizens were openly demanding a return to a transparent voting system. "Even the common man says, get rid of EVMs," he said.

### DENSE FOG TRIGGERS MASSIVE VEHICLE PILE-UP IN ROHTAK; 2 DEAD, 24 INJURED



**Diary Times Desk:** Low visibility caused by the season's first dense fog led to a massive pile-up of over 30 vehicles on National Highway-152 D near Kharkara village under Meham sub-division on Sunday morning, causing chaos on the route.

Vehicular traffic remained disrupted for over two hours following the accident. Residents of Kharkhara village and the Meham police rushed to the scene, calling Dial 112 vehicles to transport the injured to government hospitals in Meham and PGIMS. Rohtak.

The villagers helped rescue several people trapped in the damaged vehicles, transporting them to hospitals in their private vehicles. "The mishap occurred around 8 am. We immediately informed the police and the toll plaza staff. Since no ambulance was available at that time, the injured were taken to the hospital in police jeeps and private vehicles," said a local resident. Two of the injured, Ashish (30) of Charkhi Dadri and Sohan Lal (35) of Jind, succumbed to their injuries while 24 other injured, including women and children, are undergoing treatment at PGIMS-Rohtak and other hospitals.

### The evolution of drones

Drones aren't a recent invention. Britain and the United States experimented with radio-controlled unmanned aircraft during World War I, according to the Imperial War Museum in London.

"We were flying hundreds of drones over North Vietnam during the war," said Russ Lee, a curator in the aeronautics department at the National Air and Space Museum in Washington. During that Southeast Asian conflict in 1960s and early '70s. US forces began using drones for many of the same missions we see today - reconnaissance or carrying munitions, or for use as decoys and psyops platforms, according to the Imperial War

The US began widespread use of drones during Operation Desert Storm, the response to Iraq's 1990 invasion of Kuwait. The Tomahawk landattack missile - a cruise missile but also an unmanned aerial vehicle as it can change course and target in-flight - saw its first combat in 1991.

Numbered white cards placed alongside the bones mark how many skeletons have been found since digging began in May of this year, reviving decades-old allegations of wartime atrocities and cover-ups.

In the heartland of the country's ethnic Tamil minority, a bloody and brutal history is re-emerging from the soil.

But it is difficult to bury the past entirely.

From 1983 to 2009, the South Asian island nation of 21 million endured a brutal civil war between the Sri Lankan army and the separatist militant group the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE). More commonly known as The Tamil Tigers, the group was listed as a terrorist organization by many countries including the United States.

The war was fought along ethnic lines, pitting the majority Buddhist Sinhalese state against the predominantly Hindu ethnic minority rebels fighting for a separate Tamil homeland in the north and east after years of anti-Tamil violence. The Tigers were ultimately defeated. Atrocities were committed by both sides, according to the United Nations, which estimates

Sixteen years after the war ended, families of the victims and missing are still fighting for justice and accountability.

### A blue school bag

Just a stone's throw from a main road, the Chemmani gravesite is one of more than 20 mass graves identified in Sri Lanka. Many of the gravesites that pockmark the north and east of the country are believed to contain the victims of atrocities committed during the civil war. Caught between warring rebel fighters and the Sri Lankan army the Tamil community in these regions bore the brunt of the

The military occupied Jaffna from 1995 until the end of the war. Chemmani first gained international attention in 1998 when Sri Lankan soldier former Lance Cpl. Somaratne Rajapakse, who was on trial for the rape and murder of schoolairl Krishanthi Kumaraswamy, confessed that hundreds of Tamils had been buried there after the Sri Lankan army retook Jaffna.

For decades, the mass grave remained hidden until construction workers clearing land in the grounds of a Hindu cemetery in February unearthed human skeletal remains.

Their discovery prompted a court-ordered forensic excavation of the site in May and June, which initially uncovered 19 skeletons. Since then, the bones of hundreds more people have been found.

A baby's milk bottle, a blue schoolbag, bangles and cloth fragments have been uncovered alongside the bones.

More than 90% of the remains had no form of clothing. The bodies were buried in a disordered way, heaped together in shallow graves of 1.5-2 feet, according to the Human Rights Commission of Sri Lanka, an independent national body that investigates violations of fundamental rights

## A SPRINKLING OF CLASSIC WEEK HIGHLIGHTS: A 10TH-CENTURY GOSPEL BOOK, A TURNER SKETCH MADE AS A GIFT, A 2ND-CENTURY GREEK SCULPTURE...

**Diary Times Desk:** At the turn of the 20th century, Nicolaas van der Waay was one of Amsterdam's leading artists, and a professor at the city's prestigious Rijksakademie, says Alastair Plumb, director, senior specialist, European Art. 'Among his best-known works are his depictions of the Dutch capital's orphan girls, instantly recognisable by their red and black uniforms.'

The orphan girls were housed in the Burgerweeshuis, which was founded in 1520. Van der Waay wasn't granted permission to sketch inside the orphanage, but the institution did let him have a uniform, which he used to stage scenes with models in his studio and around the city.

The prayer books in this scene indicate that the girls are on their way to church. Behind them, the glazed panorama of the city gently reflects the outlines of their bonnets. The image evokes civic pride, in both the city and its treatment of the less fortunate, but it says little about the harsh realities of life in the orphanage.

Van der Waay's ledgers reveal that he completed at least three paintings of this scene. One is in Poland's National Museum in Poznań, while another is in the Amsterdam Museum, which since 1975 has occupied the former site of the orphanage that didn't allow Van der Waay within its walls.

These recently unearthed Gospels, containing the four books of the New Testament — Matthew, Mark, Luke and John — were made more than a millennium ago. They are written in Carolingian minuscule, a script established by the Emperor Charlemagne, and nail holes indicate that they may originally have been enclosed in a covering of precious metal and jewels, known as a 'treasure binding'. Inside, one tantalising line of script reads 'for the veiling of handmaidens of God', suggesting that the manuscript was produced for women. A probable candidate for its origin is Essen Abbey, an Ottonian imperial abbey founded in the western region of modern-day Germany around 845 by Altfrid, a Saxon noble who was later canonised. Established as a community for women of nobility, it was presided over by an abbess, who performed the duties of a bishop and was answerable only to the Pope. The canonesses, meanwhile, could carry out a life of prayer and devotion without committing to the poverty or celibacy of nuns, living in their own homes and maintaining courtly staff.



### A COLLECTOR'S GUIDE TO METEORITES

### Diary Times Desk:

Meteorites are small rocks from space that impact the Earth. They are exceedingly rare: the collective weight of every meteorite known to exist is less than the world's annual output of gold.

The vast majority originate from the asteroid belt and hail from 100 to 150 different asteroids. Asteroid meteorites are the oldest rocks around — a few hundred million years older than the oldest existing Earth rocks, and approximately 60 million years older than the Moon itself. A few hundred meteorites come from the Moon and Mars; they were ejected by collisions into interplanetary space where they eventually assumed Earthcrossing orbits.

Although there are more than 60,000 meteorites in the world's collections, about two-thirds will never be available to the general public. And the resource is barely growing: each year, hunters recover only about eight to 10 fresh falls and a few hundred weathered non-Antarctic 'finds' (most of which weigh less than 200 grams).

For scientists to classify a meteorite into its proper category, the rock must be broken or cut; only then can well-characterised samples be offered for sale. Meteorite hunters, researchers and dealers work together in a worldwide enterprise to discover new specimens, uncover details about the origin of the solar system, and make samples available to the discerning collector.

Meteorites have been pelting the Earth throughout geological history. Sixty-six million years ago, an asteroid (essentially a giant meteorite) slammed into the Yucatán Peninsula in Mexico, causing a mass extinction that wiped out the dinosaurs. Had that meteorite missed, there would be no cows, cats, pigs or people on this planet right now.

Some stone meteorites contain hundreds of organic compounds, including amino acids, the building blocks of proteins. Many scientists propose that the Earth provided a suitable environment for life to commence after meteorites and comets brought water and organic material to the planet's surface. Had it not been for these extraterrestrial wanderers, there may have been no life on Earth at all.
