Of the 71 laws, 65 are amendments to principal Acts, and six are principal laws. Opposition members Manish Tewari, N K Premachandran, Saugata Roy, and Jothimani opposed the Bill, contending that it was circulated late and they had little opportunity to study the draft legislation.

#### PAHALGAM ATTACK: NIA CHARGESHEET NAMES PAK TERROR GROUPS LET, TRF, AND 6 OTHERS



Diary Times Desk: The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Monday filed a comprehensive chargesheet against six persons and two terrorist organisations, Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) and its shadow outfit The Resistance Front (TRF), in connection with the Pahalgam terror attack, which claimed the lives of 25 tourists and a local pony operator.

The 1,597-page chargesheet, filed by NIA before a special court, details the deep conspiracy traced back to Pakistan, which the probe agency said has been "unabatedly sponsoring terrorism against India"

NIA has named LeT headed by Hafeez Saeed, who has been designated as a global terrorist by the US as well as India, along with TRF headed by Habibullah Malik alias Sajid Jatt, in the chargesheet for their role in planning, facilitating, and executing the Pahalgam attack that took place in the Baisaran meadows on April 22 this year "Pakistani handler terrorist Sajid Jatt is also named as an accused in the chargesheet, filed before the NIA special court, Jammu," a statement issued by the anti-terror

#### SC GRANTS INTERIM BAIL TO GUJARAT JOURNALIST IN MONEY LAUNDERING CASE

Diary Times Desk: The Supreme Court on Monday granted interim bail to Gujarat journalist Mahesh Langa in a money laundering case linked to an alleged financial fraud lodged by the Enforcement Directorate at Ahmedabad. Ordering day-to-day trial in the case by a special court, a Bench led by Chief Justice of India Surya Kant asked Langa not to seek adjournments in the hearing and not to write any articles in the newspaper about the pending case against him. If there was any violation of the order, it may consider cancellation of the bail, the Bench cautioned him. On behalf of the Enforcement Directorate, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta opposed Langa's bail, saying a journalist extorting money was a serious offence and the accused did not deserve bail. Senior advocate Kapil Sibal submitted on behalf of the journalist that he had not committed a murder and that he was languishing in jail since October last year. The Bench will take up the matter on January 6 when it will peruse the ED's status report on the compliance of the bail conditions by Lanaa.

# SC PROTECTS ACTORS SHREYAS TALPADE, ALOK NATH FROM ARREST IN MARKETING SCAM CASE

Diary Times Desk: The Supreme Court on Monday gave protection from coercive action to actors Shreyas Talpade and Alok Nath till investigation was over in a case of cheating and breach of trust against a society. During the hearing before a bench led by Justice BV Nagarathna, Talpade's counsel said the actor was called as a guest celebrity in the annual event of the company. "I am not supposed to know. I never earned any money," the lawyer submitted. Nath's lawyer submitted that the actor has not attended any function and his photo has been used for 10 years. "If a top actor or a cricketer is his advertisement appearing as a brand ambassador for a corporate company which goes into liquidation or there are criminal cases against the company will it also go against the cricketer or actor? "We dispose of this writ petition (filed by Talpade) by continuing the interim order of protection from arrest granted by us until the investigation into the offences against the petitioner is complete," the bench said while hearing pleas filed by Talpade and Nath for clubbing of FIRs registered in various states in connection with the case. Thirteen persons, including Talpade and Nath, were booked on the complaint of 37-year-old Sonepat resident Vipul Antil.

# THAI AUTHORITIES TO TAKE UP LUTHRA BROTHERS' CASE; WEIGH LEGAL, HUMAN RIGHTS ASPECTS: SOURCES



Diary Times Desk: Thailand authorities are set to take up the case involving Gaurav Luthra and Saurabh Luthra, the coowners of the Goa nightclub where 25 people were killed in a fire on December 6, with a Bangkok court likely to decide the next course of action, sources here said. The Luthras, coowners of 'Birch by Romeo Lane' nightclub located in Arpora in North Goa, left for Phuket, Thailand, shortly after the fire incident. An Interpol Blue Corner Notice has been issued against them. The Luthra brothers were detained by Thai authorities in Phuket on December 11 following an intervention by the Indian mission, which is in close touch with the Thai government in the case. According to the sources in the Indian Embassy here, all relevant documents related to the two brothers have been transferred through official legal channels. Legal developments suggest the case is likely to be argued before a Bangkok court, they said.

#### MESSI EVENT CHAOS: BENGAL POLICE SUMMON 6 EVENT MANAGERS, ARREST 5 FOR VANDALISM

Diary Times Desk: The West Bengal Police on Monday sent summons to officials of six companies, which were also involved in organising the Lionel Messi event at the Salt Lake stadium, where spectators resorted to largescale chaos and vandalism two days ago, alleging "gross mismanagement", an officer said. Acting on an FIR on the spectator rampage that led to an estimated loss of over Rs 2 crore of stadium properties, police have also arrested five people so far on charges of vandalism and assault on police personnel. Among the notices which were served to the event organisers included those to Laltu Das, manager of Satadru Datta – the now arrested prime organiser of the event, police said. Summonses were also dispatched by Bidhannagar Police the Commissionerate Manali Bhattacharva, an event manager, Supriva Dasgupta, Sambaran Karmakar, Aditya Das and Amit Kumar, a senior official of a food delivery aggregator.

# SUPREME COURT REFUSES TO ENTERTAIN PIL ON INDIGO CRISIS; SAYS DELHI HC ALREADY HEARING IT

Diary Times Desk: The Supreme Court on Monday refused to entertain a PIL seeking judicial intervention into the crisis created by cancellation of hundreds of Indigo flights, saying that the Delhi High Court was already hearing the issue. "We appreciate the issue but instead of parallel proceedings, you go to the (Delhi) high court," a three-judge Bench led by Chief Justice of India Surya Kant, said, giving liberty to petitioner Narendra Mishra to intervene in the petition pending before the high court. "It (Delhi High Court) is also a constitutional court. If your grievances are not redressed then you can come here," the CJI told the petitioner who sought directions to the Centre to provide support and refunds to passengers affected by the cancellation of a large number of IndiGo flights. He also demanded a court-monitored probe into the Indigo flight cancellation crisis.

#### GOA NIGHTCLUB FIRE: HC CONVERTS CIVIL SUIT INTO PIL; SAYS 'SOMEONE HAS TO BE HELD ACCOUNTABLE'

Diary Times Desk: The Goa Bench of Bombay High Court on Monday converted a civil suit against 'Birch by Romeo Lane' at Arpora, where a devastating fire on December 6 killed 25 persons, into a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) observing "someone has to be held accountable in such kind of cases".

The HC also asked the state government to file a reply on permissions granted to the ill-fated nightclub. The petition was filed by Pradeep Ghadi Amonkar and Sunil Divkar, owners of the land on which the nightclub stood. Converting it into a PIL, the Division Bench of Justices Sarang Kotwal and Ashish Chavan said "someone has to be held accountable in such kind of cases". It observed that the local panchayat had failed to take suo motu cognisance of the club and had taken no action despite complaints. Commercial operations were going in the structure despite it being served a demolition order, the HC bench pointed out.

### RIJIJU SEEKS APOLOGY FROM RAHUL, KHARGE IN PARLIAMENT FOR CONGRESS WORKERS' 'THREAT' TO PM MODI

Diary Times Desk: Union Minister Kiren Rijiju on Monday sought an apology from Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge and Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi for their party workers' alleged threat to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's life. At a hurriedly called press conference here, Rijiju alleged that at Sunday's Congress rally in the national capital, some party workers had threatened to dig the grave of the Prime Minister, which was the "most unfortunate and tragic" thing to happen in Indian democracy. "Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge and Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi should tender an apology for the Congress workers' threat to the life of the Prime Minister. They should tender the apology on the floor of both Houses of Parliament. It is most unfortunate and tragic that Congress workers openly declared to dig the grave of Prime Minister Modi," he said. The parliamentary affairs minister said the workers and leaders of the Congress and the BJP are political rivals, not enemies. "We propagate different ideologies but work together for a developed India," he said.



#### FORMER HONG KONG PRO-DEMOCRACY MEDIA MOGUL JIMMY LAI CONVICTED IN NATIONAL SECURITY TRIAL



Diary Times Desk: Jimmy Lai, the prodemocracy former Hong Kong media mogul and outspoken critic of Beijing, was convicted in a landmark national security trial in the city's court on Monday, which could send him to prison for the rest of his life. Three governmentvetted judges found Lai, 78, guilty of conspiring with others to collude with foreign forces to endanger national security and conspiracy to publish seditious articles. He pleaded not guilty to all charges. Lai, 78, was arrested in August 2020 under a Beijing-imposed national security law that was implemented following massive anti-government protests in 2019. During his five years in custody, Lai has been sentenced for several lesser offences, and appears to have grown more frail and thinner. Among the attendees were Lai's wife and son, and Hong Kona's Roman Catholic Cardinal Joseph Zen, Lai pressed his lips and nodded to his family before being escorted out of the courtroom by guards. Lai's trial, conducted without a jury, has been closely monitored by the US, Britain, the European Union and political observers as a barometer of media freedom and judicial independence in the former British colony, which returned to Chinese rule in 1997. His verdict is also a test for Beijina's diplomatic ties. US President Donald Trump said he has raised the case with China, and UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer has said his government has made it a priority to secure the release of Lai, who is a British citizen. The founder of the now-defunct pro-democracy newspaper Apple Daily was convicted on two counts of conspiracy to commit collusion with foreign forces to endanger national security, in addition to one count of conspiracy to distribute seditious publications.

#### PAKISTANI-ORIGIN DUO NAMED AS SYDNEY SHOOTERS; FATHER ARRIVED ON STUDENT VISA IN 1998, SON BORN IN AUSTRALIA

Diary Times Desk: New South Wales Police say they have identified the two gunmen responsible for a deadly shooting at a Hanukkah event near Sydney's Bondi Beach as a father and son, confirming that no other attackers were involved. The father, a 50-yearold, was killed at the scene, taking the number of dead to 16, while his 24-year-old son was in a critical condition in hospital, police said at a press conference on Monday. The father and son were identified as Sajid Akram and Naveed Akram, respectively, by state broadcaster ABC and other local media outlets. Officials have described Sunday's shooting as a targeted antisemitic attack. Forty people remain in hospital following the attack, including two police officers who are in a serious but stable condition. police said. The victims were aged between 10 and 87. Witnesses said the attack at the famed beach, which was packed on a hot evening, lasted about 10 minutes, sending hundreds of people scattering along the sand and into nearby streets.

## IRAN'S RIAL CURRENCY PLUMMETS TO NEW LOW, SPARKING FEARS OF HIGHER FOOD PRICES



Diary Times Desk: Iran's rial slid further to a new record low of more than 1.3 million to the US dollar on Monday, deepening the currency's collapse less than two weeks after it first breached the 1.2-million mark amid sanctions pressure and regional tensions. Currency traders in Tehran quoted the dollar above 1.3 million rials, underscoring the speed of the decline since December 3, when the rial hit what was then a historic low. The rapid depreciation is compounding inflationary pressures, pushing up prices for food and other daily necessities and further straining household budgets, a trend that could be intensified by a gasoline price change introduced in recent days. The fall comes as efforts to revive negotiations between Washington and Tehran over Iran's nuclear programme appear stalled, while uncertainty persists over the risk of renewed conflict following June's 12day war involving Iran and Israel.

### AUSTRALIAN PRIME MINISTER ALBANESE PROPOSES TOUGHER NATIONAL GUN LAWS AFTER MASS SHOOTING IN SYDNEY

Diary Times Desk: Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese on Monday proposed tougher national gun laws after a mass shooting targeted a Hanukkah celebration on Sydney's Bondi Beach, leaving at least 15 people dead. Albanese said he would propose new restrictions, including limiting the number of guns a licensed owner can obtain. His proposals were announced after the authorities revealed that the older of the two gunmen - who were a father and son - had amassed his six guns legally. "The government is prepared to take whatever action is necessary. Included in that is the need for tougher gun laws," Albanese told reporters. "People's circumstances can change. People can be radicalised over a period of time. Licences should not be in perpetuity," he added. At least 38 people were being treated in hospitals after the massacre on Sunday, when the two shooters fired indiscriminately on the beachfront festivities. Those killed included a 10-year-old girl, a rabbi and a Holocaust survivor. The horror at Australia's most popular beach was the deadliest shooting in almost three decades in a country with strict gun control laws primarily aimed at removing rapid-fire rifles from circulation.



#### FLASH FLOODS KILL AT LEAST 37 PEOPLE IN MOROCCO'S SAFI PROVINCE

Diary Times Desk: At least 37 people were killed in flash floods triggered by torrential rains in Morocco's Atlantic coastal province of Safi, Moroccan authorities said Monday. According to an official statement, 14 people remain hospitalised, including two in intensive care, following the disaster. Heavy rainfall on Sunday inundated homes and shops in the old town of the port city of Safi, swept away vehicles, and cut off several roads in and around the city, located about 300 km south of the Moroccan capital, Rabat. As residents assessed the damage and began cleaning flood-hit areas, schools in Safi were suspended on Monday, authorities said. Videos shared by local media showed flooded streets, submerged vehicles, and rescue teams using boats to evacuate residents from affected neighbourhoods. One video posted by local news website safigoud.com showed a woman being pulled to safety after being trapped in muddy floodwaters near an ancient gate in Safi's old town. Authorities confirmed that at least 70 homes and shops were flooded in the incident. Morocco is currently witnessing heavy rainfall and snowfall in the Atlas Mountains after seven consecutive years of drought, which had significantly depleted major water reservoirs across the

#### MERRIAM-WEBSTER'S 2025 WORD OF THE YEAR IS 'SLOP'

Diary Times Desk: Creepy, zany and demonstrably fake content is often called "slop". The word's proliferation online, in part thanks to the widespread availability of generative artificial intelligence, landed it Merriam-Webster's 2025 word of the year. "It's such an illustrative word," said Greg Barlow, Merriam-Webster's president, in an exclusive interview with The Associated Press ahead of Monday's announcement. "It's part of a transformative technology, Al, and it's something that people have found fascinating, annoying and a little bit ridiculous." "Slop" was first used in the 1700s to mean soft mud, but it evolved more generally to mean something of little value. The definition has since expanded to mean "digital content of low quality that is produced usually in quantity by means of artificial intelligence". In other words, "you absurd videos, images, advertising cheesy propaganda, fake news that looks real, junky Al-written digital books," Barlow said. Al video generators like Sora have wowed with their ability to quickly create realistic clips based merely on text prompts. But a flood of these images on social media, including clips depicting celebrities and deceased public figures.

#### NEPAL WAIVES BAN ON HIGH-DENOMINATION INDIAN NOTES AFTER NEARLY **A DECADE**

Diary Times Desk: Nepal's Council of Ministers has decided to lift the ban on high-denomination Indian currency notes of Rs 200 and Rs 500, a government spokesperson confirmed to ANI. Minister for Information Technology and Communication Jagdish Kharel, who is also the government spokesperson, said the Cabinet meeting held on Monday decided to allow the import and export of Rs 200 and Rs 500 denomination Indian notes. "But the cap remains up to Rs 25,000 to be carried between India and Nepal," Kharel told ANI over the phone. Further elaborating, Kharel said, "The provision has been made for Nepalese or Indian citizens to bring Rs 25,000 per person from India to Nepal and take the same amount from Nepal to India. With the government lifting the ban on high-denomination Indian notes, those notes issued after November 9, 2016, can be brought into circulation." India had demonetised high-denomination currency notes in 2016, following which the import and export of such notes from Nepal was banned. Earlier, India's central bank, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), had made arrangements to allow the import and export of highdenomination Indian notes to Nepal. After India eased restrictions, the Nepal government also lifted its ban. The RBI had amended the Foreign Exchange Management Regulations, 2015, to permit the import and export of highdenomination Indian notes between Nepal and India. Following India's demonetisation move in 2016, largedenomination Indian currency notes were not exchanged in Nepal. As a result, Nepal also imposed restrictions on the circulation of Indian currency notes of denominations higher than Rs 100.

### LUTHRA BROTHERS DEPORTATION: FINAL COURT PROCEDURE AWAITED, SAY SOURCES

Diary Times Desk: The much-anticipated deportation of Luthra brothers, Saurabh and Gaurav Luthra, from Thailand to India is now in its final stage, with top sources indicating they are likely to be sent back to India soon. The brothers are expected to land in Delhi following the deportation. Indian furnished all authorities have required documentation to the Thai side, including the necessary Emergency Certificates (ECs) issued after the brothers' passports were cancelled. Sources confirm that procedural bottlenecks have been largely resolved. Thai immigration authorities are coordinating closely with Indian officials and are preparing to present the case before a local Bangkok court. This court appearance is understood to be the final, mandatory legal requirement under Thai law before a formal deportation order can be executed. Sources close to the matter says,"Relevant documentation is submitted. The matter now moves for its last legal review by a local Bangkok court."

### URBAN, RURAL AREAS OF ISLAMABAD AND KARACHI GRAPPLE WITH GARBAGE CRISIS

Diary Times Desk: Waste management in Pakistan's major cities is reportedly in crisis, as both Islamabad and Karachi struggle to maintain cleanliness, Dawn reported. Streets, roads, and open spaces across urban and rural areas are littered with garbage, leaving residents exposed to foul odours, dust, and toxic air.

In Islamabad, Dawn reported, rural areas have been particularly neglected. With no formal system in place, residents dispose of garbage in nullahs and open grounds. "Secondary collection by the Capital Development Authority (CDA) is irregular, and rural waste management contracts that expired a year ago have not been renewed, leaving services inconsistent. Urban areas receive temporary coverage through CDA staff, excontractor workers, and machinery, but repeated efforts to outsource waste management across the city were cancelled several times this year," Dawn said.

## TRUMP PAYS TRIBUTE TO VICTIMS OF US CAMPUS SHOOTING AND AUSTRALIA'S BONDI BEACH TERROR ATTACK



Diary Times Desk: US President Donald Trump on Sunday paid tribute to victims of multiple deadly attacks in the United States and abroad, including a campus shooting at Brown University and a deadly antisemitic terror attack at Sydney's Bondi Beach, during remarks at a Christmas reception. "I want just to pay my respects to the people. Unfortunately, two are no longer with us. Brown University, nine injured. And two are looking down on us right now from heaven," Trump said. Referring to the attack in Australia, he added, "Likewise, in Australia, as you know, that was a terrible attack. Eleven dead, 29 badly wounded. And that was an anti-Semitic attack, obviously. And it's -- I just want to pay my respects to everybody." The US President also mentioned violence in the Middle East, saying, "In Syria also, we had an attack, and we had three great patriots terminated by bad people... It was ISIS. The Syrian government fought by our side. The new president fought by our side. But I just want to pay my respects to the families." The shooting at Brown University unfolded on Saturday when a suspect armed with a firearm entered a campus building where students were taking examinations and opened fire. According to police, nine people were injured, seven of them critically. The incident triggered a massive manhunt involving more than 400 law enforcement personnel, including agents from the FBI and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, while the university was placed under lockdown.

#### SINGAPORE ISSUES ADVISORY TO ITS NATIONALS IN DELHI AS AIR QUALITY TURNS 'SEVERE PLUS', GRAP STAGE 4 CURBS ENFORCED

Diary Times Desk: The High Commission of Singapore in New Delhi on Monday issued an advisory urging Singapore nationals in the Delhi National Capital Region to take precautions after Indian authorities enforced the strictest pollution curbs under Stage 4 of the Graded Response Action Plan (GRAP). The advisorv came after the Commission for Air Ouality Management invoked GRAP Stage 4 on December 13 as air quality in Delhi and surrounding areas deteriorated sharply. At this stage, construction and industrial activities are heavily restricted, while schools and offices are advised to shift to hybrid or online modes. Residents have also been urged to stay indoors, particularly children, the elderly, and those suffering from respiratory or cardiac conditions, and to wear masks when stepping out. Sharing the advisory on X, Singapore's Ambassador to India, Simon Wong, said Singapore nationals in Delhi NCR should pay close attention to local health advisories and pollution-related restrictions.

#### BALOCHISTAN: HUMAN RIGHTS GROUPS DEMAND IMMEDIATE RELEASE OF MISSING WOMAN

Diary Times Desk: The alleged enforced disappearance Farzana Zehri, a resident of Zehri in Balochistan's Khuzdar district, has drawn sharp condemnation from Baloch rights groups and activists, who say her case reflects a troubling pattern of targeting Baloch women. According to Paank, the human rights wing of the Baloch National Movement (BNM), Farzana, daughter of Muhammad Bakhsh Zehri, was forcibly taken by Pakistani forces on the night of 1 December 2025 while returning home from a hospital in Khuzdar. "Her whereabouts remain unknown. and authorities have neither acknowledged her detention nor provided any legal justification," the group said in a statement. Paank described the incident as "a clear case of enforced disappearance" and a "grave violation of fundamental human rights and international law." The group further noted that the disappearance occurred shortly after Farzana's family had migrated from Zehri to Khuzdar due to security concerns, suggesting a continued pattern of targeting Baloch civilians even after displacement. Paank held the state and its security institutions fully responsible for her safety and demanded her immediate production before a court.

## AUSTRALIAN PM PUSHES FOR TOUGHER GUN LAWS AFTER ANTISEMITIC TERROR ATTACK AT SYDNEY'S BONDI BEACH



Diary Times Desk: Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese on Monday said tougher gun laws would be taken up at a National Cabinet meeting, signalling a possible tightening of Australia's already strict firearms rules after the deadly antisemitic terror attack at Sydney's Bondi Beach. Speaking to the media ahead of the meeting scheduled for 4:00 pm local time, Albanese said stricter gun controls, including limits on the number of firearms licensed to individuals and periodic reviews of licences, would be placed on the agenda. "This afternoon, at four o'clock, I will put on the agenda of the national cabinet tougher gun laws, including limits on the number of guns that can be used or licensed by individuals, a review of licences over a period of time," he said. Stressing the need for continuous oversight, the prime minister added, "People's circumstances change. People can be radicalised over a period of time. Licences should not be in perpetuity." Albanese said the federal government would present a proposal aimed at strengthening monitoring mechanisms. "The Australian government will take to national Cabinet this afternoon a proposal to empower agencies to examine what can be done in this area," he said.

# CHINA LAUNCHES "COUNTERMEASURES" AGAINST FORMER JAPAN DEFENCE OFFICIAL

Diary Times Desk: China on Monday announced that it has imposed sanctions on Shigeru Iwasaki, former chief of the Joint Staff of the Japan Self-Defence Forces, saying he had "colluded with separatist forces" in Taiwan. Beijing had, in March this year, lodged a protest over the appointment of Iwasaki as an honorary adviser to the Executive Yuan, the Taiwanese government's highest administrative body. According to a statement by the Chinese foreign ministry, the "countermeasures" on Iwasaki include "freezing his movable and immovable assets and other types of property" within China, the staterun Global Times reported. It also prohibits organizations and individuals within China from conducting any transactions, cooperation or other such activities with him; refuse to issue visas to him and deny his entry into the country (including the Hong Kong and Macao special administrative regions).

#### JAISHANKAR TO VISIT ISRAEL FOLLOWING INDIA-UAE STRATEGIC DIALOGUE IN ABU DHABI

Diary Times Desk: External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar will visit Israel later on Monday after holding high-level meetings with the leadership of the United Arab Emirates, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said. In a statement, the MEA said, "Following his participation in Sir Bani Yas Forum, EAM will co-chair the 16th Joint Commission and 5th Strategic Dialogue with H.H. Sheikh Abdullah bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs of the UAE, in Abu Dhabi today. He will thereafter pay a visit to Israel and hold bilateral consultations with his counterpart, Foreign Minister Gideon Sa'ar." Jaishankar's visit to Israel follows his participation in the 16th Sir Bani Yas Forum, held from December 12 to 14 in the Western Region of Abu Dhabi. The annual forum serves as a high-level platform bringing together senior leaders, policymakers and global experts to discuss major regional and international issues.

## BASC WEBINAR HIGHLIGHTS WIDESPREAD HUMAN RIGHTS ABUSES AGAINST BALOCH IN IRAN AND PAKISTAN

Diary Times Desk: The Baloch Advocacy and Studies Centre (BASC) held a webinar on Saturday, 13 December 2025, to discuss the severe and ongoing human rights abuses experienced by the Baloch community in both Iran and Pakistan, as stated in BASC's press release. The event gathered renowned international specialists, scholars, and advocates for Baloch human rights to illuminate issues such as enforced disappearances, extrajudicial killings, structural discrimination, and the distinct impact of state repression on different genders. #### POJK ASSEMBLY A 'HOAX', REAL POWER LIES WITH PAKISTAN: ACTIVIST AMJAD AYUB MIRZA

Diary Times Desk: Political activist from Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir (PoJK), Amjad Ayub Mirza, has strongly criticised the governance structure in the region, calling it a "fraud" designed to mislead the international community. In an exclusive interview with ANI, Mirza said that while PoJK appears to have all the trappings of a democratic setup, including a Legislative Assembly, a Prime Minister, a President, a Supreme Court and an Inspector General of Police, none of these institutions hold real authority. "You see, Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir has a Legislative Assembly, it has a Prime Minister, it has a President, it has a Supreme Court, it has an IG police. However, they are all spineless," Mirza said, adding that the Assembly cannot pass a single law, nor can it appoint or transfer officials. He explained that all decision-making powers lie with Pakistan's Prime Minister and military establishment, rendering PoJK's institutions purely symbolic. According to him, this setup is deliberately maintained to project an illusion of selfgovernance.

# WUC RAISES ALARM OVER IMMINENT DEPORTATION OF CHINESE WHISTLEBLOWER GUAN HENG IN US

Diary Times Desk: The World Uyghur Congress (WUC) has expressed grave concern over the imminent deportation of Guan Heng, a Chinese national whose secret recordings of internment camps in East Turkistan were instrumental in revealina widespread abuses against Uyghurs and other Turkic communities. In its press release, WUC stated, "In 2020, Guan Heng secretly documented large-scale detention compounds in East Turkistan, producing rare visual evidence that corroborated and survivor testimonies investigative reporting on the Chinese government's repression campaign. His footage was later shared with journalists and researchers and contributed to the growing public record of mass detention, including reporting by BuzzFeed News' Pulitzer Prizewinning investigative team." The press release added that after escaping China, Guan undertook a perilous journey through several countries before arriving in the United States in 2021 in search of protection. Since then, he has lived openly, secured a valid US work permit, and pursued asylum through the US immigration system. WUC highlighted that despite these circumstances

#### ED QUESTIONS YES BANK'S RANA KAPOOR IN RELIANCE ANIL AMBANI GROUP CASE

Diary Times Desk : The Enforcement Directorate Monday questioned Yes Bank co-founder Rana Kapoor as part laundering а money investigation against Reliance Anil Ambani group companies, officials said. His statement was recorded under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), they said. Kapoor, 68, was arrested and questioned by the ED earlier in separate money laundering cases linked to the alleged illegal disbursal of loans by the lender (Yes Bank) he helmed. ED officials said they suspect a quid pro quo between Kapoor and Ambani in this case. There was no immediate comment from Kapoor or his lawyers on the ED questioning and related charges. Yes Bank, according to the officials, had an exposure of about Rs 6,000 crore to Reliance Anil Ambani Group (ADAG Group) as on March 31, 2017, and this figure doubled to Rs 13,000 crore within a year (as on March 31, 2018). The companies under probe are Reliance Home Finance Limited (RHFL) and Reliance Commercial Finance Limited (RCFL).

#### RUPEE FALLS TO ALL-TIME LOW OF 90.58 AGAINST US DOLLAR IN EARLY TRADE

Diary Times Desk: Rupee depreciated 9 paise to an alltime low of 90.58 against US dollar in early trade on Monday, weighed down by uncertainty over an India-US trade deal and persistent foreign fund outflows. Forex traders said rupee is trading with a negative bias as investors are in wait and watch mode and awaiting cues from the India-US trade deal front. At the interbank foreign exchange market, the rupee opened at 90.53 against the US dollar, then fell further to an all-time intraday low of 90.58 against the greenback, registering a fall of 9 paise over its previous close. On Friday, the rupee had slipped 17 paise to close at an all-time low of 90.49 against the American currency. Meanwhile, the dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was trading 0.05 per cent lower at 98.35. Brent crude, the global oil benchmark, was trading higher by 0.52 per cent at USD 61.44 per barrel in futures trade. On the domestic equity market front, the 30-share benchmark index Sensex was trading 298.86 points lower at 84,968.80.

## GOLD SURGES RS 4,000 TO FRESH LIFETIME HIGH OF RS 1.37 LAKH/10 GM IN DELHI MARKETS

Diary Times Desk: Gold prices surged by Rs 4,000 to touch an all-time high of Rs 1,37,600 per 10 grams in the national capital on Monday, tracking firm global cues, according to the All India Sarafa Association. The precious metal of 99.9 per cent purity had closed at Rs 1,33,600 per 10 grams on Friday. "Gold prices scaled even higher as international spot gold surged towards the USD 4,350 zone, triggering a strong rally in the domestic market," Jateen Trivedi, VP Research Analyst, Commodity and Currency, LKP Securities, said. He added that the yellow metal reflected the global strength with a sharp gain, touching a fresh lifetime high. Gold prices had earlier appreciated by Rs 3,200 to touch an all-time high of Rs 1,34,800 per 10 grams on October 17. "The move was driven by renewed safe-haven demand and expectations around upcoming US economic data, including non-farm payrolls and the Core PCE Price Index scheduled this week, focus has firmly shifted to US macro cues, which are expected to keep volatility elevated," Trivedi added. During the current calendar year, gold prices have surged Rs 58,650, or 74.3 per cent, from Rs 78,950 per 10 grams on December 31, 2024.



## STOCK MARKETS CLOSE MARGINALLY LOWER ON FOREIGN FUND OUTFLOWS, WEAK RUPEE; SENSEX SLIPS 54 POINTS

Diary Times Desk: Benchmark stock indices Sensex and Nifty pared most of early losses to close marginally down on Monday amid persistent foreign fund outflows and weak global trends. The 30-share BSE Sensex closed lower by 54.30 points, or 0.06 per cent, at 85,213.36. The benchmark opened lower and declined further by 427.34 points, or 0.50 per cent, to hit a low of 84,840.32, but value buying in FMCG and IT shares in the second half helped cut losses. The 50-share NSE Nifty edged lower by 19.65 points, or 0.08 per cent, to 26,027.30. The broader index hit a low of 25,904.75 but pared losses later. The rupee hitting fresh record low against the US dollar and uncertainty over an India-US trade deal weighed on investor sentiment, analysts said. The rupee hit an all-time low of 90.80 against the US dollar on Monday. Among Sensex firms, Mahindra & Mahindra fell the most by 1.94 per cent. Bajaj Finserv fell by 0.79 per cent and Maruti Suzuki by 0.71 per cent. Adani Ports, Bharti Airtel, Titan, Power Grid and HDFC Bank were also among the laggards. However, Hindustan Unilever surged the most by 1.42 per cent. Trent, HCL Tech, Asian Paints, and Tata Steel were among the gainers. "Indian equity markets ended today's session on a muted, consolidative note, recovering from early weakness but lacking meaningful follow-through buying." "Persistent FII selling, rupee depreciation, weakness in Asian equities and India-US trade-related uncertainty kept risk appetite cautious.



#### WHOLESALE PRICE INFLATION RISES TO (-) 0.32 PC IN NOVEMBER

Diary Times Desk: Wholesale price inflation (WPI) came in at (-) 0.32 per cent in November, driven by an uptick in prices of food articles like pulses and vegetables on a month-on-month basis, government data showed on Monday. WPI-based inflation was (-) 1.21 per cent in October and 2.16 per cent in November last year. "Negative rate of inflation in November 2025 is primarily due to a decrease in prices of food articles, mineral oils, crude petroleum & natural gas, manufacture of basic metals and electricity, etc," the industry ministry said in a statement. According to WPI data, deflation in food articles was 4.16 per cent in November, compared to 8.31 per cent in October. In vegetables, deflation was 20.23 per cent in November, as against 34.97 per cent in October. In pulses, deflation was at 15.21 per cent in November, while in potato and onion it was 36.14 per cent and 64.70 per cent, respectively. In the case of manufactured products, inflation eased to 1.33 per cent in November, against 1.54 per cent in October. Fuel and power witnessed a negative inflation or deflation of 2.27 per cent, as against 2.55 per cent in October. Data released last week showed CPI inched up to 0.71 per cent in November, from a record low of 0.25 per cent, driven by rising food prices.

#### DEMAND LIFT RETAIL CREDIT **GROWTH IN Q3 FY25: REPORT**

Diary Times Desk: The retail credit demand in India strengthened during the July-September 2025 quarter, by Goods supported and Tax (GST) Services rationalisation and improved consumer sentiment ahead of the festive season, according to TransUnion CIBIL's latest Credit Market Report. The Credit Market Indicator (CMI), a composite measure of credit market health, rose to 99 in the September 2025 quarter from 98 in the preceding quarter, reflecting improved demand, supply conditions and stable quality. The uptick followed the GST rationalisation introduced in September 2025, commonly referred to as GST 2.0, which enhanced key affordability across consumer segments. Vehicle finance. particularly wheeler and auto loans, along with consumer durable loans, recorded strong year-on-year growth in the pre-festive period. The CMI for credit demand increased to 95 in the quarter ended September 2025, up from 93 a vear earlier.

#### **GROSS NPAS IN OUTSTANDING EDUCATION LOANS OF PUBLIC SECTOR BANKS REDUCED TO 2%: MOS FINANCE**


Diary Times Desk: Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary, in a written reply to the Lok Sabha on Monday, said that in terms of outstanding education loans, Non-Performing Gross Assets (NPA) of Public Sector Banks (PSBs) reduced from 7% in FY 2020-21 to 2% in FY 2024-25, thereby showing the significant improvement in asset quality of education loans over the years. "Credit-related matters of regulated entities (REs) are largely deregulated and the same are governed by the Board approved loan policies of the REs framed under the ambit of relevant regulatory and statutory requirements and terms and conditions of the loan agreement hetween borrower and the RE. RBI has advised the banks to put in place a Board approved loan policy and they shall take credit related decisions as per the said policy, subject to the guiding of principles regulations, Chaudhary said in his reply. He stated that the Reserve Bank of India (RB)I has taken several initiatives to improve recovery.

#### LABOUR FORCE PARTICIPATION RATE ROSE TO 55.8% IN NOVEMBER. 7-MONTH HIGH SINCE APRIL

Diary Times Desk: Labour Force Participation Rate (LFPR) increased to 55.8 per cent in November 2025, the highest level recorded since April 2025, showing a steady improvement in the labour market, according to the Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation. The rise in participation came mainly from rural areas. The overall LFPR for persons aged 15 years and above reached a seven-month high in November. Rural LFPR moved up to 58.6 per cent, compared to 58.0 per cent in April and 57.8 per cent in October. Urban LFPR showed a marginal dip to 50.4 per cent from 50.5 per cent in the previous month, indicating stable but slower movement in cities. Female participation continued its upward path during the period. Overall, female LFPR rose from 32.0 per cent in June 2025 to 35.1 per cent in November. The increase also came mainly from rural areas, where female LFPR climbed steadily from 35.2 per cent in June to 39.7 per cent in November. Urban female LFPR remained broadly stable at around 25.5 per cent, showing limited change over the months. Employment levels also showed improvement. The Worker Population Ratio for persons aged 15 years and above increased to 53.2 per cent in November, up from 52.5 per cent in October. Rural areas drove this rise, with WPR improving from 55.4 per cent in April to 56.3 per cent in November. Urban WPR remains largely unchanged during the same period.



#### **EUTELSAT, AIRTEL AID INDIAN ARMY WITH LOW EARTH ORBIT** CONNECTIVITY FOR RELIEF EFFORTS IN SRI LANKA



Diary Times Desk: Eutelsat, a satellite communications provider, and Airtel are providing Low Earth Orbit (LEO) satellite connectivity to support the Indian Army's relief efforts in flood-hit parts of Sri Lanka, where conventional communication lines have been disrupted. The Indian Army continues to assist with rescue and relief operations in Sri Lanka following Cyclone Ditwah late last month.

According to a Eutelsat press release, its OneWeb LEO services are providing the Army with a reliable way to communicate in areas where roads, phone lines, and other ground systems are not functioning. This connectivity is helping teams share updates quickly and carry out tasks without delays. It is also allowing 24/7 telemedicine support, linking soldiers in the field with specialist doctors who guide emergency treatment for people affected by the floods.

The satellite link has become critical for the Indian Army as it seeks to reach isolated communities. With steady communication, teams are able to check on villages, report medical needs and coordinate rescue movements in real time. The release says that this work shows why strong satellite systems matter during disasters, when other networks fail.

Neha Idnani, Regional Vice President for APAC at Eutelsat, said the company is working closely with Airtel and the Indian Army to keep these lines open. "Eutelsat is deeply committed to supporting the Indian Army's relief efforts with OneWeb LEO connectivity, delivered in partnership with Airtel. The ability to maintain high-quality communications in crisis situations is vital, and we remain committed to equipping organisations on the ground with secure, resilient connectivity required to safeguard lives and enable essential services," she said.

#### **7 HIMACHAL PLAYERS LISTED** FOR IPL AUCTION IN ABU DHABI

Diary Times Desk: Seven players from the Himachal Pradesh Cricket Association (HPCA) have been listed for the 2026 Indian Premier League (IPL) players' auction scheduled to be held on December 16 in Abu Dhabi, Their names have figured on the list of registered players released on the IPL's official website. According to details, the HPCA players who will go under the hammer include all-rounder Mayank Dagar, right-arm fastmedium bowler Arpit Guleria, lefthanded batsman Pukhraj Mann, right-arm fast bowler Divesh Sharma, right-arm fast bowler Raiat Verma, all-rounder Aryaman Singh Dhaliwal and allrounder Mridul Saroch. The base price for all seven players has been fixed at Rs 30 lakh. Among them, Dagar remains the most prominent name, having already featured in multiple IPL seasons. He made his IPL debut with Sunrisers Hyderabad in 2023. In Royal Challengers Bangalore (RCB) traded allrounder Shahbaz Ahmed to acquire Dagar for Rs 1.8 crore. He has also previously been associated with Punjab Kings, making him one of the most experienced domestic allrounders of HPCA in this year's auction pool.

#### **HIMACHAL: LACK OF BASIC AMENITIES IN RURAL AREAS CAUSE OF MIGRATION TO CITIES, TOWNS**

Diary Times Desk: The largescale migration of people from the rural areas of Himachal Pradesh to nearest cities is a matter of concern. One can see hundreds of abandoned houses in villages from where people have shifted to towns and cities. This is happening because even after 79 years of Independence, successive governments in the state have failed to provide amenities like roads, drinking water supply and health services. In Palampur alone, over 300 families have shifted from the lower areas of the city and are either residing in rented houses or have constructed new houses. Information gathered by The Tribune reveals that poor infrastructure and road network, frequent power failures in the rural areas, lack of medical and education facilities and various other factors have led to largescale migration of people from the hilly areas. Successive governments turned a blind eye to problems faced by the people and made no efforts.

#### CONGRESS, BJP IN A WAR OF WORDS OVER CENTRAL AID TO HIMACHAL

Diary Times Desk: A war of words has broken out between the Congress and the BJP following BJP national president JP Nadda's felicitation function in Shimla, where he claimed that the Centre had given Rs 3,789 crore as disaster relief to the state along with funds for other developmental work. Himachal Pradesh Congress Committee (HPCC) president Vinay Kumar has outrightly rejected the claim, saying that the Centre has not provided any special assistance to the state to cope with disaster. Responding to Kumar's contention, senior BJP leader Satpal Satti said the Congress had been rattled by Nadda's clear and factual statements and was resorting to lies and propaganda. "To say that the Centre did not provide any help to the state as disaster relief is a complete lie. The HPCC president is trying to mislead the people through such baseless statements," said Satti. As for the Rs 1,500 crore relief package announced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi a few months back, Satti said the relief package was being processed.

#### TEACHER COUPLE DIES IN MOGA ROAD ACCIDENT WHILE ON ELECTION DUTY, STATEWIDE PROTEST ANNOUNCED

Diary Times Desk: A tragic road accident claimed the lives of a government school teacher couple, Jaskaran Singh Bhullar (47) and Kamaljit Kaur (46), while they were travelling for election duty in Moga. Despite their efforts, Jaskaran Singh died instantly, and Kamaljit Kaur succumbed to her injuries at the Baghapurana government The hospital. postmortem examination was conducted at Moga Civil Hospital, and the bodies were handed over to the family, leaving two children orphaned. Teacher organisations have strongly condemned the Election Commission (EC) and district administration, alleging administrative apathy unsafe deployment practices.

# RAJASTHAN REVIVES ARAVALLI GRASSLANDS TO BOOST HERBIVORES, SUPPORT BIG CATS

Diary Times Desk: In a move that could offer key lessons for neighbouring Haryana, which is planning an ambitious Aravalli Safari project, Rajasthan's Forest Department has begun reviving and developing herbivorefriendly grasslands in the Aravali range to strengthen the region's wildlife ecosystem. The initiative is aimed not only at conserving large herbivore populations but also at supporting apex predators such as leopards and tigers, whose survival depends on a healthy prey base. The Aravallis in Rajasthan are currently home to over 150 tigers, with a significant number inhabiting wildlife reserves and safari zones. The Sariska Tiger Reserve, which has around 50 tigers, has been selected as the pilot site for the grassland restoration project. Reserve authorities have established four grass nurseries at Andheri, Dolada, Umri and Tehla range camps to produce native grass seeds for regenerating barren patches within the forest.

## RAJA WARRING MOVES PUNJAB HC FOR VIDEOGRAPHY OF VOTE COUNTING IN ZILA PARISHAD, BLOCK SAMITI POLLS

Diary Times Desk: Punjab Pradesh Congress Committee (PPCC) president and Lok Sabha MP Amarinder Singh Raja Warring on Monday moved the Punjab and Haryana High Court seeking compulsory videography of the entire vote-counting process for the Zila Parishad and Panchayat Block Samiti elections scheduled to be held across Punjab on December 17. In a public interest litigation, Warring, through counsel Nikhil Ghai, submitted that the public interest litigation was filed "in the interest of safeguarding the purity, transparency, and credibility of the electoral process in elections to Zila Parishads in the State of Punjab". Ghai added on the petitioner's behalf that the counting of votes was an integral and decisive stage of the election process, continuing until result declarations. Despite this being the settled legal position, the counting of votes in Zila Parishad elections was conducted without mandatory videography, "leaving no objective or verifiable record of the most sensitive phase of elections". The petitioner contended that the absence of videography rendered the process opaque and vulnerable to arbitrariness and allegations of manipulation, thereby eroding public confidence in democratic institutions.



### ON-LEAVE HARYANA DGP SHATRUJEET KAPUR SHIFTED, OP SINGH TO OFFICIATE



Diary Times Desk: Two months after Director General of Police Shatrujeet Singh Kapur, a 1990-batch IPS officer, was "sent on leave", and a day before he was due to rejoin, the Haryana Government on Sunday issued his transfer orders, replacing him with 1992-batch IPS officer OP Singh, who has been posted as the "officiating" DGP, Haryana Police, until further orders. Kapur, who was asked to proceed on leave following the suicide of 2001-batch IPS officer Y Puran Kumar, was scheduled to rejoin on Monday. However, late on Sunday evening, the government issued two transfer and posting orders appointing Singh as officiating DGP until further orders. Singh will continue to hold additional charge as Director General of the Haryana State Narcotics Control Bureau (HSNCB).

# PRELIMINARY DELIMITATION NOTIFICATION ISSUED, AMBALA MC POLL ON HORIZON

Diary Times Desk: Earlier in March this year, BJP's Shailja Sachdeva secured victory in the Ambala Municipal Corporation mayoral by-election, defeating Congress candidate Amisha Chawla by a margin of 20,487 votes. With just 10 months of the house's tenure left then, the election saw a low voter turnout of 31.9%. Commissioner of Ambala Municipal Corporation Virender Lather informed that the government has issued the preliminary notification and people can submit their objections and suggestions by December 18 at the Deputy Commissioner's Office or the Municipal Corporation Ambala. The wards will be reserved in the coming days and interested aspirants will start their preparations accordingly. While the BJP leaders claimed that the delimitation was done in a fair.

### CLOCK TICKS FOR AMRITPAL AS PAROLE PLEA PUT OFF AGAIN, PARLIAMENT SESSION ENDS ON DEC 19



Diary Times Desk: Time is fast running out for Lok Sabha member Amritpal Singh to secure parole to attend the winter session of Parliament, with his plea remaining unheard on Monday as lawyers abstained from work. With the session scheduled to conclude on December 19, the matter is now listed for hearing on Tuesday, leaving a narrowing window of barely three working days even if relief is granted. Amritpal Singh has approached the Punjab and Haryana High Court seeking temporary release to attend Parliament, where he represents the Khadoor Sahib constituency. The case could not be taken up on Monday due to the lawyers' decision, pushing the hearing to December 16 and intensifying the uncertainty around his ability to "meaningfully participate" in the ongoing session. Punjab has already mounted a strong opposition to the parole plea, asserting that once a detained MP enters Parliament, neither the executive nor the judiciary can regulate, restrict or pre-condition what he might say on the floor of the House. Appearing for Punjab, senior advocate Anupam Gupta had told the Bench that any undertaking offered by Amritpal Singh regarding the subject of his speech would be legally unenforceable once he entered Parliament. #### The evolution of drones

Drones aren't a recent invention. Britain and the United States experimented with radio-controlled unmanned aircraft during World War I, according to the Imperial War Museum in London.

"We were flying hundreds of drones over North Vietnam during the war," said Russ Lee, a curator in the aeronautics department at the National Air and Space Museum in Washington. During that Southeast Asian conflict in 1960s and early '70s. US forces began using drones for many of the same missions we see today - reconnaissance or carrying munitions, or for use as decoys and psyops platforms, according to the Imperial War

In the heartland of the country's ethnic Tamil minority, a bloody and brutal history is re-emerging from the soil.

But it is difficult to bury the past entirely.

From 1983 to 2009, the South Asian island nation of 21 million endured a brutal civil war between the Sri Lankan army and the separatist militant group the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE). More commonly known as The Tamil Tigers, the group was listed as a terrorist organization by many countries including the United States.

The war was fought along ethnic lines, pitting the majority Buddhist Sinhalese state against the predominantly Hindu ethnic minority rebels fighting for a separate Tamil homeland in the north and east after years of anti-Tamil violence. The Tigers were ultimately defeated. Atrocities were committed by both sides, according to the United Nations, which estimates

others forcibly disappeared. Sixteen years after the war ended, families of the victims and missing are still fighting for justice and accountability.

#### A blue school bag

Just a stone's throw from a main road, the Chemmani gravesite is one of more than 20 mass graves identified in Sri Lanka. Many of the gravesites that pockmark the north and east of the country are believed to contain the victims of atrocities committed during the civil war. Caught between warring rebel fighters and the Sri Lankan army the Tamil community in these regions bore the brunt of the

The military occupied Jaffna from 1995 until the end of the war. Chemmani first gained international attention in 1998 when Sri Lankan soldier former Lance Cpl. Somaratne Rajapakse, who was on trial for the rape and murder of schoolairl Krishanthi Kumaraswamy, confessed that hundreds of Tamils had been buried there after the Sri Lankan army retook Jaffna.

For decades, the mass grave remained hidden until construction workers clearing land in the grounds of a Hindu cemetery in February unearthed human skeletal remains.

Their discovery prompted a court-ordered forensic excavation of the site in May and June, which initially uncovered 19 skeletons. Since then, the bones of hundreds more people have been found.

A baby's milk bottle, a blue schoolbag, bangles and cloth fragments have been uncovered alongside the bones.

More than 90% of the remains had no form of clothing. The bodies were buried in a disordered way, heaped together in shallow graves of 1.5-2 feet, according to the Human Rights Commission of Sri Lanka, an independent national body that investigates violations of fundamental rights

#### A VERY RARE, NEWLY DISCOVERED MICHELANGELO STUDY FOR THE SISTINE CHAPEL CEILING

**Diary Times Desk:** Michelangelo Buonarroti was born in 1475 in Caprese, southeast of Florence, to an impoverished Florentine family of minor nobility. In the sixteenth century, when longevity was exceptional, he lived to eighty-eight, dying in Rome in 1564 as an extremely famous and wealthy man.

Throughout his life, Michelangelo drew constantly. It was through drawing that he planned and prepared his projects, developed his inventions, and refined his ideas.

Unfortunately, the surviving sheets by his hand, numbering roughly six hundred, total only a fraction of the thousands of drawings he must have produced.

Very rarely new drawings have been rediscovered and added to Michelangelo's graphic corpus over the decades. Almost all of Michelangelo's known studies, excluding architectural drawings and the sketches of marble blocks Michelangelo used to send to his quarry masters, are now in public collections. Only about ten sheets, including this newly discovered drawing, are in private hands. Furthermore, no recorded study for the Sistine Chapel has ever come to auction — until now.

In the two decades between 1500 and 1520 Michelangelo was in his physical and artistic prime. At that time, he lived and worked between Florence and Rome, undertaking several of the most prestigious and monumental projects of his career, including a commission from Rome by Pope Julius II della Rovere to paint the enormous vault of the Sistine Chapel in the Vatican.

The enterprise was ambitious, as the surface of the vault measures about 530 square meters (5,700 square feet), yet Michelangelo conceived an elaborate decorative program for it.

He designed a painted illusionistic architectural framework simulating white marble with, at the center of the vault, nine compartments with episodes from the Book of Genesis.

Flanking the biblical scenes are twenty ignudi (athletic nude youths) seated on illusionistic plinths next to fictive bronze medallions with episodes from the Book of Maccabees. Below these figures, seven monumental Prophets alternate with five Sibyls, each seated on a throne around the ceiling.

'When you travel, it exposes you to all kinds of cultures,' she tells Christie's. 'And over time you develop an eye and an appreciation for how all these influences have shaped style around the world.' Today Hoimes is one of the fashion industry's preeminent experts on couture costume jewellery. Recommended by Vogue and frequented by celebrities, her San Francisco shop, MDVII, which operated from 1990 to 2021, became a global destination for collectors of vintage and archival pieces by important designers like Chanel, Dior, Pierre Cardin and Yves Saint Laurent. From rare 1930s Chanel haute couture works to a geometric bib necklace from Karl Lagerfeld's last collection for Chanel in 2019, every piece in the collection is offered without reserve. Costume jewellery, typically characterised by bold designs made with non-precious metals and stones, emerged in the 1700s when glass and later rhinestones were used in place of gems. In the 1920s, the trend reached new heights when fashion couturiers began producing their own designs that elevated the art form. Coco Chanel paved the way when she introduced trousers for women and chose to pair them with bold strands of imitation pearls. Coco Chanel frequently collaborated with Suzanne Gripoix of Maison Gripoix, famed for their poured glass jewellery. A highlight of the upcoming sale is a 1930s blue and green Gripoix glass, Strass crystal and faux pearl statement necklace by Chanel, which Hoimes acquired from her friend, the collector Susan Kelner Freeman.
